



HOLLYWOOD superstar Michael Fassbender is to be honoured in Killarney with the greatest accolade the town he grew up in can bestow. He will be inducted to the Order of Innisfallen in recognition of his remarkable achievements in the film industry which has seen him nominated for Academy Awards, Golden Globes and BAFTAs.

The 39-year-old actor will be feted by the town's Chamber of Tourism and Commerce and the Killarney Municipal Area for helping to boost Killarney's profile on a world stage by achieving great success in his chosen field.

The award will be presented to the star of such movie blockbusters as 12 Years A Slave, Hunger, Steve Jobs, Prometheus, Frank, Shame, MacBeth and Jane Eyre at a reception in Killarney on Friday, October 7.

The event will be followed by the inaugural Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce gala black tie ball in the Europe Hotel and Resort close to Michael's family home in Fossa, where his parents, Josef and Adele, still reside. Details of that event are currently being finalised and will be revealed at a later date.

Michael was once an altar boy at the nearby Prince of Peace Church in Fossa and he attended the local national school before going on to St Brendan's College and, later, successfully chasing his dream to become one of the world's most in-demand actors.

He was bitten by the acting bug when he

joined the Bricriú Theatre Company, run by local man Donie Courtney, in Killarney, and he later moved to London which is still his base. The Order of Innisfallen is presented annually to recipients who have made an significant contribution to the economy of Killarney. Previous recipients of the include singer Daniel O'Donnell who attracts thousands of fans to his concerts in Killarney every year, Isolde Liebherr whose family has been a premier employer

HALL OF FAME AWARD FOR ST FINAN'S ROWING CLUB

A group of oarsmen representing the most successful era of the now defunct St Finan's Rowing club were accorded the Hall of Fame Award from Killarnev Regatta club at a special function in the East Avenue Hotel this week. After its formation in 1952 St Finan's achieved much success at the local regatta winning both Junior, Senior and Ladies races in the mid 1950's. However, after winning both the Junior Mens and Ladies sixes in 1962 the club went into a period of gradual decline which also coincided with a decline in interest in the sport. It was to be five years before the annual regatta was revived in 1967.

Victory the Ladies sixes in 1968 managed to keep the club colours on the Lake but conscious of the fact that thirteen long years had elapsed since The Hospital won a mens race led to the club taking stock of its future in Killarney rowing. After a specially convened meeting to address what was regarded a critical situation a programme of winter training under the excellent tutelage of Gerald O'Connor was developed which was to prepare the new group of oarsmen physically and mentally for the rigours of training on the Lake later in the season. The training programme comprised gym work combined with training on the roads to be followed by a twelve week training schedule on the Lake prior to the annual regatta. This was an unprecedented approach to rowing in Killarney a trend that was to be followed by other clubs in subsequent years.

TOURISM GRANT INFORMATION SESSION

BADGER SETS AND BEE HIVES ENTICE KIDS TO SUMMER CAMPS



The chance to watch badgers at a sett, at night somewhere in the woods at Muckross awaits those who take part in one of the Summer Camps run by the Killarney National Park Education Centre.

The Centre has been running Environmental Camps for children for many years now and all of the staff and volunteers who help run them are very experienced and Garda vetted. Usually the ratio of children to adults is about 6:1, so there is plenty of supervision and lots of direction.

The main aim of the camps, both the Junior Rangers (residential) and the day camps are for the children taking part, to have as much fun as possible while making new friends and exploring the National Park and learning about many of the plants and animals that live there. The day camps run from 9.30am in the morning until 3.00pm in the afternoon, Tuesday to Friday and are based at Knockreer House. The children play a whole host of ecologically themed games, do scavenger hunts, pond dipping, set trap, use microscopes and they might even bring home a few things that they have made, such as a nest box or bug hotel!

The Junior Ranger Camps are for slightly older children and are based in the Arthur Vincent House, out on the Muckross Peninsula. Both venues are ideal for camps for children as they are in such safe and self-contained environments, while also being within easy reach of the woodlands, fields, lakes and rivers which the children will be able to explore and get to know while on the camps.

During the Junior Ranger Camps the children will get the chance to watch badgers at a sett, at night somewhere in the woods at Muckross. They'll also use bat detectors to listen for bats at roosts and get the chance to help inspect bee hives to see how honey is made. They'll also do some foraging for edible wild plants and maybe even cook some on the camp fire! The camps are a very good way of getting children out-doors and helping them to appreciate and understand a little bit more about the wildlife and the habitats around us. They also help the children realise what impact their actions can on the environment, whether this is not dropping litter or helping to make space for nature!

It was hardly the best kept secret in Kerry but Cllr Maura Healy Rae's hopes of becoming Cathaoirleach just three months in as a Councillor became unravelled as councillors voted 6-2 to elected long time serving and a 4 term

elected councillor Brendan Cronin in her place. It was understood by Cllr Healy Rae that a pact with her father Danny and Fine Gael and Fianna Fail, while in the council would see him as Cathaoirleach but when he departed for the Dail, all bets were off by the other councillors. Healy Rae was proposed by Cllr Donal Grady "she is a new girl, a young girl, a school teacher and would be excellent as Mayor" and she seconded he nomination but Cronin was nominated by Fianna Fails Niall Kelliher who cited his experience "Cllr Cronin was elected in 1999 and has served four terms" while Cllr John Sheahan of Fine Gael seconded Cronin saying he was "a very safe pair of hands"

Following the vote Cllr Cronin clearly emotional said it was a very special day for his family "I remember my wife saying would you ever be Mayor of Killarney and I saying, that will never happen for me". He went on to remember his late father PJ Cronin whom he said was "certain to be looking down, as well as all those who decided to back and support him over the years. It's very easy to go with the herd but we always stuck to our principals".

Cllr Healy Rae congratulated Cronin on his

election but departed with a shot across the bows of other councillors "I extend the kind words of other councillors to you Cllr Cronin and I hope that their words will have a true meaning behind them, as they seemed to forget their promises to my father very easily"

The meeting however started on a light note as departing Cathaoirleach Bobby O'Connell arrived just on time for the meeting declaring the waiting councillors that he was "staying on".

As Killarney Athletic kicks of its 40th 7-A-Side, Mike O'Sullivan takes a look back at the history of the club.

HISTORIC 40TH YEAR OF 7-ASIDE



As the 2016 seven-a-side kicks off, it is remarkable to think that this is the 40th consecutive year that Killarney Athletic has run the tournament. Having been part of the organising committee in the first 7-a-side in 1977 it is fantastic to see the competition reaching this milestone year.

Through the founding of the club in 1965 and the formation of the Kerry District League in 1972, Killarney Athletic had run 7-a-side competitions in the Half Moon and also in the Áras Phádraig pitch prior to 1977. But the '77 tournament was planned and organised to ensure that soccer would reach a higher level of promotion in Killarney and in the surrounding areas. The tournament was also the starting point for many players before playing or entering clubs in the Kerry District League. The competition also provided many people with the opportunity to manage a soccer team for the first time and all of the local clubs today are fortunate to have such committed club officials and volunteers who gained an interest in organising teams through involvement in the 7-a-side at underage or senior level.

Teams with players from Ballyhar, Mastergeeha and Kenmare were all keen competitors in the 7-a-side and of course the majority of players who played with the Killarney Albion team that were runners-up in the 1977 final joined Killarney Rangers to form Killarney Celtic in the 77/78 Kerry District League season.

The dawn of the first underage 7-a-side tournament in 1978 became a nursery for young players in Killarney and surrounding areas, while the first Ladies 7-a-side in 1990 proved to be a major success, displaying and promoting the excellent female footballing talent that exists in Kerry. An over 35s competition followed in 1993, becoming very popular by allowing the 'ageing stars' to continue to show off their skills and prove that 7-a-side football can be enjoyed even when the joints and limbs have slowed down.

SUCCESS OF THE TOURNAMENT: There is no doubt that there were many contributing factors as to why the 7-a-side became such a popular local sporting event over the years with participation and a sense of community to the fore. The hosting of the tournament in the Áras Phádraig pitch from 1977 to 1998 with the support of the Franciscan community was key to the tournament's popularity, growth and success. The venue in the heart of Town ensured a 'buzz' in the area throughout the summer months with friends and work colleagues forming annually into teams with all sorts of colourful names. Supporters too added to the atmosphere in the Áras as many just came to watch and were entertained with the efforts of players that varied from 'silken skills' to 'honest endeavour' with a few attempting to emulate the superstars of the professional game. The format of the tournament starts

out with teams in groups ensuring a minimum number of games for each team. The more serious competition begins with the knock-out stages with teams thereafter competing for the Premier and Reserve Cups. The 'no off-side' rule also makes 7-a-side soccer more enjoyable for players and spectators and makes the referee's life a little easier. The small group of referees who officiated the multitude of games over the years can also look back with pride at the contribution they have made to the event.

EARLY YEARS OF THE 7-A-SIDE: The 1st seven aside in '77 had 20 teams entered with each team restricted to only two registered club players from the Kerry District League. This rule forced teams to gather players who were not playing soccer in the Kerry League at the time while also encouraging work colleague and friends to form teams. This rule changed after a few years with the increase of players registering and playing in the KDL thereafter. Work firms such as Tuf Shoes, Scotts Tools and Liebherr all entered teams into the '77 tournament with many other notable firms competing in the following years and to the present day. Sponsored teams from the Laurels,

Tatler, Sweeneys, Corkerys, Belvedere and Old Kentucky were all to the fore of competition in the early years and some still endure to the present day. Ryans and The Castle Heights Hotel also entered teams in the '77 event while a competitive team from Scartaglin were the first 'out of town' team to challenge for the Killarney Autos sponsored cup. The event also had the added attraction of prize money for the winners and runners-up and this was first sponsored by Con O'Leary of the Laurels Bar. As well as promoting the game locally the club also donated a contribution of funds raised to a number of local charities with St Marys of the Angels in Beaufort being a beneficiary of the early tournaments.

SUPPORT OF THE LOCAL MEDIA: The coverage and support of the local media also contributed hugely to the growth of the tournament over the years as the event got massive exposure as an annual local sporting community event. This media exposure also encouraged the local business community to support the event through sponsorship of the tournament and competing teams. The support and sponsorship of the tournament was also a major contributing factor that allowed the club to purchase and develop its own pitch facility in Woodlawn in 1993.

END OF AN ERA IN THE ÁRAS PHÁDRAIG PITCH: The 1998 seven-a-side was to prove to be the last staging of the competition in the 'Áras Pitch' as the Lewis Road ground was purchased in 1999 by the Urban District Council so as to provide another Bus and Car Park for Killarney. This indeed marked the end of an era for the tournament but the years of 7-a-sides in the Aras at underage and senior level with the sporting and social outlet it provided will always remain in the minds of those who enjoyed the pleasure it brought.

The moving of the 7-a-side to the club's ground in Woodlawn in 1999 represented a major change for the tournament but to the credit of all who organised, promoted and supported the event over the years it continued to prosper in the new venue. This year's tournament also marks the 18th year of the 7-a-side in Woodlawn. Little did those of us who were in the organising committee of the first 7-a-side back in 1977 think that we would see the tournament run annually for the following 40 years but the credit for its longevity is ingrained in the spirit it captured through the support of the whole community and something that we all can be proud of. 



GETTING STARTED

7. NUTRITION AND HYDRATION: Never run on an empty tank. Consume a light carbohydrate snack about an hour before your runs and be sure to adequately hydrate. Drink plenty of fluids, but make sure you drink at least16 ounces two to three hours before your run. Plan to drink 7 to 10 ounces of fluids every 15 minutes during your run and eat a light carbohydrate and protein snack soon after the run if possible. Monitor your hydration by weighing yourself before and after the run, making sure you drink enough fluids after your run to replace the weight lost.

Don't fall into the trap of overeating after your runs. Telling yourself lve earned this slice of cake because I have ran for a half hour is only going to pile on the pounds or maintain the weight you're at, and if your trying to loose weight this isn't a good outcome. At most in a 30mins jog you will burn approx. 300-400 calories (depending on your size, age, pace etc) this will easily equal one slice of cake so next time you treat yourself ask yourself was it really worth it!!! Sometimes don't get me wrong it is but not all the time. Strike a healthy balance with your nutrition and your body will start reflecting the hard work you are putting in. No point in having a nice lean toned physique under layers of



Know Your Rights: STATE PENSIONS AND OUALIFIED ADULTS

OUESTION

I am retiring from work when I turn 66 and will be eligible for a reduced-rate State Pension (Contributory) of €198.60. My husband is getting his full State Pension (Contributory) of €233. He thinks we would be better off if he claimed for me as a qualified adult on his pension. Is he correct? If we do this, will all the money be paid to him?

ANSWER

If your husband claims for you as a qualified adult on his pension, then his pension will consist of €233 plus an increase of €209 – a total of €442. The increase is automatically paid directly to you (although you can request that it is paid with your husband's pension). If you decide to claim a reduced rate contributory pension then the total for you both will be €431.60. Therefore, it would appear that you are indeed better off being a qualified adult.

However, there are other factors that you should take into account. While your husband's pension is not means tested, the Increase for a Qualified Adult is means tested. This means that any income you have in your own right from employment, selfemployment, savings, investments and capital (for example, any property except your own home) is taken into account. If you have joint savings or investments with your spouse, half is taken into account.

You also need to look at the tax situation. Your husband is entitled to claim a PAYE tax credit (€1,650) with his pension. Even though the Increase for a Qualified Adult is paid directly to you it is not a social welfare payment to you so you cannot claim a PAYE tax credit of €1,650. However if you claim a social welfare payment in your own right (for example, your reducedrate pension) you can claim a full PAYE tax credit.

You should analyse both options carefully and do detailed calculations, taking all the factors that affect how much you receive into account. After you do the calculations, you may find that you are better off claiming the reduced-rate contributory pension in your own right.







FOCUS ON HYDRANGEAS

Hydrangeas are a very popular garden shrub with delicate heads of flowers that come in shades of white, pink or blue and they flower from late Spring to late Autumn.

The mophead and lace cap hydrangeas are well known for the ability to change colour in different soils.

Hydrangeas thrive in moist but well drained soil, in a cool, semi shady part of the garden. Try to avoid dry sunny situations and east facing areas.

Feeding your hydrangeas once in late Winter or early Spring is probably enough for the year as too much feeding will only encourage too much soft leafy growth and this will lead to the hydrangeas not developing a lot of flower buds.


Pruning Hydrangeas is usually done in late Winter or early Spring, although the climbing hydrangeas should be pruned after flowering in Summer.

KERRY FACE STERN TIPP TEST IN MUNSTER DECIDER

GAA CORRESPODENT KERRY O'SHEA LOOKS FORWARD TO SUNDAY'S MUNSTER FINAL CLASH

KERRY V TIPPERARY

Sunday 3rd July - Fitzgerald Stadium Throw in 3.30 pm

Fitzgerald Stadium, Killarney, hosts this Sunday's eagerly-anticipated Munster SFC decider between Kerry and Tipperary. Munster final day is always a very special occasion. This year's renewal is unique in the sense that Tipperary, who are Kerry's opponents in the Senior game, are there on merit. The Premier County will be contesting their first Munster decider since 2002 and will be meeting the Kingdom for the first time in a final since the 1998 game in Thurles when Maurice Fitzgerald and Declan Browne stole the show.

Gaelic football is currently enjoying an upward curve in Tipperary. The county won an All-Ireland Minor Football Championship title in 2011 and contested an All-Ireland U21 final last year when Tipperary were defeated in controversial circumstances by Tyrone. To get to the decider, Tipperary defeated Waterford 1-15 to 1-7 in May and followed this up with a memorable 3-15 to 2-16 win over Cork in the semi-final on June 11. Kerry, meanwhile, defeated Clare 2-23 to 0-17 to advance to yet another decider.

Tipperary, who have won nine titles at senior level previously, are going for their first Munster SFC crown since 1935 while Kerry are going for title number 78 and are hoping to win their fifth title in six years and with a four

"James is back, full steam ahead and looking good. He wasn't ready for the first (Munster championship) game but he's played a couple of club games since.

"He's trained with us and he's in contention now. This was the plan all along, we were just hoping he'd be a couple of weeks earlier. "We are delighted James is back. Other injuries have cleared up also which has strengthened the squad. We need our full squad if we are going to be winning trophies." Fitzmaurice also told the media gathering that injury victims Alan Fitzgerald, Brendan O'Sullivan and Denis Daly (O'Sullivan and Daly are both long-term) will play no part in Sunday's decider.

Johnny Buckley, who missed the semi-final win over Clare, is expected to be back in contention for a starting place as is Aidan O'Mahony who missed the Clare game due to

Since taking over in Tipperary last year, Liam Kearns has had to work with a depleted panel as injury and emigration have robbed him of some of the county's best players, including Colin O'Riordan, now in Australia, Steven O'Brien and Seamus Kennedy who have committed to the hurlers for this year while Liam Casey, Jason Lonergan and Kevin Fahey are spending the summer months in the USA. Kearns, who is originally from Tralee, took the opportunity of his press briefing to criticize some media pundits whom he said gave his side little or no chance against Kerry.

"They feel that if Cork had come through that Kerry would get tested at least, even though they'd expect the Kingdom to beat Cork as well I'm sure.

"I know that's exactly what the players will be hearing from their supporters, that Cork and Kerry in Killarney provides a really good day out for everybody because Cork supporters usually travel in large numbers for that fixture while many of them don't travel for other matches, and the big occasion is now gone as they will see it.

"We wouldn't be popular with the boys who run the pubs down in Killarney I suppose! "But, at the end of the day, we can't concern ourselves with what Kerry are thinking and what they're about."

This decider will be a stiff test for the Kingdom as Tipperary will have absolutely nothing to

The Premier County have some fine footballers and two of the best in the country in full-forward Michael Quinlivan, whose late goal in that Minor final in 2011 won the day, and the much acclaimed Peter Acheson. The Gaelic football hinterland in Tipperary is in the South of the County but much work has been done at underage level to promote and

spread the game throughout the County and this has yielded some spectacular results. Liam Kearns is a very experienced Gaelic football coach at this stage, having managed Limerick and Laois in recent years. He worked closely also with John Evans during Evans' last year in Roscommon.

Kearns will know every blade of grass in Fitzgerald Stadium. It will be very interesting to see how he sets Tipp out against Kerry. Remember in last year's Munster semi-final in Thurles, Tipp pushed Kerry all the way. It will be tight, very tight.

HOW TO KEEP BIRDS FROM HITTING WINDOWS

As bird activity is peaking, you've probably noticed birds colliding with your windows; this is a common but huge problem that takes the lives of millions of birds annually.

Window collisions occur when a flying bird sees the refection of the garden or sky in the glass and flies into it. Anything that will reduce or eliminate these reflections in the glass will reduce bird collisions.

Some people hang shiny streamers or fine screening on the windows during peak periods. Others cloud the glass with soap. If the house is under construction, the windows can be installed tilting downward slightly to reduce reflections.

Locating feeders on or near the windows will reduce the speed at which birds hit the glass. Approximately only one out of ten collisions is fatal, usually the bird is stunned, falls to the ground, and begins a period of recovery that may take up to an hour.

During that recovery period, the bird is vulnerable to house cats, or weather conditions etc. To protect a stunned bird that has hit a window one suggestion is to cover it with a large kitchen strainer. The bird is less visible and is confined, allowing it time to recover. When the bird attempts to leave the strainer, it has recovered enough to be

4,380,000 PEOPLE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE FOR THE FIRST TIME THIS IN THIS YEARS U.S. ELECTIONS

Malia Obama the first daughter of the first Black President in the United States of America will be 18 on July 4th.

Nearly 12,000 Americans turn 18 every day. Blacks were given voting rights under the Fifteenth Amendment ratified in 1870. Hiram Rhodes Revels (Republican/Mississippi), elected in 1871, was the first Black Senator. Although Black men and women ran for President under third parties or as Independents, it was 137 years after Revels' election to the Senate before a major party had a Black candidate for President in 2008. Voting rights for women took another 40

years. Women didn't get the right to vote in

federal elections until August 1920. Hattie Ophelia Wyatt Caraway (Dem/Arkansas) was the first woman elected to the Senate in 1932. She was appointed to complete the term of her husband after his death in late 1931 and wasn't expected to actually seek election. After all, she was just a convenient place holder. Although several women ran for president in the late 1800's and early 1900's, the first woman to actually be placed in nomination at a party conference was in 1964: Margaret Chase Smith (Repub/Maine, also the first woman to be elected to House of Representatives and Senate).

From being granted voting rights to nomination as presidential candidate of a major party: 146 years for Black men and 96 years for all women. A long time coming, but now both Black and female presidents may occur sequentially.

The daughter of the first Black President might cast her first vote for Hillary Clinton, the first woman President.

WELL DONE TO LONDONS MAYOR

London's mayor, Sadig Khan, may have secured his position as a feminist hero by eliminating advertisements from the city's public transportation that "conform to unhealthy or unrealistic body images." The change goes into effect in July and fulfills Mr. Khan's promise to address the Tube's advertising network after a campaign last April against a body shaming ad. The ad that sparked the initial controversy came from Protein World and featured a very thin model in a swimsuit with the words, "Are you beach body ready?" Hundreds of people filed complaints with the Advertising Standards Authority, claiming the ad promoted unrealistic body standards and could have negative impacts on body image.

MARGARET'S RAMBLINGS

The campaign resulted in protests and a petition with more than 70,000 signatures, but Protein World still didn't seem to understand the backlash. "As the father of two teenage girls, I am extremely concerned about this kind of advertising which can demean people, particularly women, and make them ashamed of their bodies," said Mr. Khan. "It is high time it came to an end." Mr. Khan has recommended Transport for London, which controls the 12,000 ad spaces in question, set up a steering group to ensure compliance with the ban and eliminate any ads that could cause body confidence issues.

WIN FOR THE OREGON SPOTTED FROG

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service have designated 65,038 acres and 20.3 river miles of critical habitat for Oregon spotted frogs in Oregon and Washington. Once abundant from British Columbia to California, spotted frogs have disappeared from 90% of their former range. Today there are fewer than 100 known sites where the frog still survives and it is likely eradicated in California. Most remaining populations are in Oregon. The Oregon spotted frog is 4 inches long and calls while under water. It is a highly aquatic frog and needs clean water and stable flows for egg-laying, tadpole development and adult overwintering. The species is threatened by loss of wetlands, poor river management that forces artificial flows, reduced water quality, drought, invasive species and other threats. Amphibians have been on the planet for millions of years but worldwide, more than one-third of amphibian species are threatened

TOWN HAS TO PAY BACK THE DESTITUTE PEOPLE IT **JAILED**

with extinction.

Colorado Springs will pay back destitute people it illegally jailed because they couldn't pay court fines, the city has announced.

The city will also discontinue its debtor's prison policy, which violated both the U.S. Constitution and a 2014 state law in Colorado. More than 60 victims of the city's debtor's prison policy are getting repaid with interest under the \$103,000 settlement with the state's American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) chapter. Under the city's previous "pay or serve" sentencing policy, people who couldn't afford fines for non-criminal violations like begging near highways, jaywalking, violating park curfews, or drinking in public. Were forced to spend one day behind bars for every \$50 the court said they owed. The settlement sets compensation for 66 pay-or-serve victims at the rate of \$125 per day they were jailed. That translates to an \$11,000 payout for one

homeless man who was imprisoned for more than 90 days at significant taxpayer expense under multiple pay-or-serve sentences for begging. "I was told over and over that I either had to pay or go back to jail," the man said in a statement. "Without a home or a job, the cycle kept repeating." Debtor's prisons are banned by the U.S. Constitution, as the Supreme Court established in the early 1980s.

Chimpanzees are among the world's most intelligent and social beings, making it even more tragic that hundreds of them are confined in research laboratories. Despite gaining more protection by changes made to the Endangered Species Act in late 2015, nearly 700 chimpanzees are still awaiting release from research labs — many currently living in isolation. Sign our petition to support Save the Chimps, the world's largest chimpanzee sanctuary, in their mission to help all research chimpanzees receive the peaceful and dignified retirement they deserve. HOVERCRAFTS TO TURN THE RIVERS OF FRANCE INTO AN ALTERNATIVE TO THEIR CLOGGED ROADS

Little hydroplaning cabs with flippers, called Sea Bubbles, are about to be tested on the Seine in Paris this summer. If all goes well with the debut, the plan is for 3,000 to 5,000 of them to travel the rivers of France by 2018. They look like a giant sea turtle, with a round body and four curved "flippers" underneath that act like the wings of an airplane, creating an aerodynamic lift above the water, which reduces drag. The vehicle is powered by electric propulsion via two small motors and rechargeable batteries, and emits zero CO2, no noise, and leaves no wake.

Alain Thebault the creator who in 1994, codesigned the Hydroptere, a sailing vessel that exceeded 50 knots thanks to its hydrofoil technology, says his daughters encouraged him to "invent a zero emission cab" to alleviate the air pollution in big cities, and since many large cities have waterways Mr. Thebault decided the best way to introduce a new form of transportation would be to create a watercraft that could ease some of the existing street traffic.

He envisions the "vehicles" being driven by a professional driver initially but, at a cost of about €29,000 they can be purchased by individuals as well and there is already more than a hundred people on the waiting list.

Though Paris will be the site of the first test run, a number of other cities have expressed interest in setting up fleets if the French trial is successful.

THAILAND STOPS ACCESS TO ISLAND PARADISE OVER TOURISM THREATS TO ENVIRONMENT

The turquoise blue waters and white sands of Koh Tachai island off Phang Nga province, is part of the Similan National Park in Thailand but despite its designation as an ecologically

sensitive "primitive zone," the island has been inundated with tourists.

Because of increased threats from tourism both local and international, officials have made the unusual decision to cut off access to the island's picturesque shoreline, beaches and coral reefs. "We have to close it to allow the rehabilitation of the environment both on the island and in the sea without being disturbed by tourism activities before the damage is beyond repair,"Tunya Netithammakul, director of the Department of National Parks, Wildlife and Plants Conservation said.

Most of Thailand's marine parks close for the monsoon season and reopen around Oct. 15th, but Koh Tachai will remain closed.

26 MILLION TREES HAVE IN CALIFORNIA DIED FORESTS IN JUST ONE YEAR

The latest survey from the United States Forest Service revealed that an additional 26 million trees have succumbed to drought, a devastating bark beetle infestation, and hotter temperatures in 2015.

That brings the number of trees that have died in the Sierra Nevada to 66 million since 2010. "These new numbers really show that the tree die-off is spreading at an astronomical rate," said Amy Head, a Californian Fire education officer. "It's unprecedented, and it's changing the landscape of whole ecosystems in California."The new figures are based on a May aerial survey assessment that found millions of new dead trees across the state. The southern portion of the Sierras - from Tuolumne County down to Kern County - shows the most severe tree mortality rates per acre. The issue is the persistent drought. Bark beetles have been having a field day on the state's weakened trees. Typically the trees are strong enough to withstand the beetles' attack, using sap, or "pitch," to keep the tiny pests from infiltrating the wood, planting larvae, and cutting off the tree's flow of nutrients from the leaves to the trunk. But with ever-increasing temperatures and less water, the stressed trees can't put up a fight. Last year Gov. Jerry Brown declared a state of emergency during the fire season and an extra \$32 million in funding was dedicated for forest restoration work, including removing more than 77,000 dead trees located near urban centres and homes.

BATTERY BREAKDOWNS

Most common cause of breakdown at any time of year but particularly in winter

Battery faults are the most common cause of breakdown.

Batteries can die at any time of year but it's more likely in winter when cold temperatures hit car batteries with a triple-whammy:

- power output drops
- ability to accept a charge drops, so the battery doesn't recharge as quickly when you're driving · load increases – lights, blowers, wipers, heated
- seats, rear-screen heater etc are all used more. Add in the fact that many cars stand unused over the Christmas holiday and it's no surprise that the first day back to work after New Year is

always one of the busiest of the year for the AA. Battery problems can be avoided:

The garage that services your car should check that clamps and connections to the battery are secure and free from corrosion, but there are a few simple tips you can follow to reduce the chance of your battery letting you down in the depths of winter.

If the battery is more than five years old and there's any sign of it struggling to start the car, get it replaced. Some will struggle on for a bit but many won't. It's much better done at your convenience than as a roadside emergency.

If you mostly do short journeys or leave the car standing for days at a time, invest in a modern battery conditioner/intelligent charger. These can be left connected to the battery indefinitely and can prolong its life without overcharging it.

Check that everything electrical is turned off when you park up - even an interior light, boot light, or radio left on overnight can kill a battery when it's cold.

Give the battery a chance:

Switch off everything electrical and dip the clutch to reduce the load on the battery when you start a cold car.

SAFETY FOR PERMIT HOLDERS

HOW LEARNER DRIVERS CAN ENSURE THEIR DRIVING EXPERIENCE IS A SAFE AND **ENJOYABLE ONE**

Safety for Permit Holders: To ensure your safety and that of other road users, learner drivers are bound by certain laws.

Driving alone: You can't be alone in the vehicle when driving, regardless of how long you have been driving and how many learner permits you have held. And the person who's with you must hold a full driving licence for the category of vehicle you are driving for a continuous period of 2 years.

The only exceptions to this are when you are: Driving a work vehicle (eg, agricultural tractor or JCB), unless it has been adapted to carry a passenger, and the passenger holds a full driving licence for a work vehicle for a continuous period of 2 years.

Riding a motorcycle, if you obtained your first learner permit on or after the 6 December 2010 you need to carry a Certification of Satisfactory Completion with your permit in order to drive. Accompanying other learners: You may not act as an accompanying driver, ie, holder of a full licence, for a person driving on a learner permit. The Certificate of Competency you receive on passing your driving test does not qualify - you must hold a full licence to be an accompanying driver for a continuous period of at least 2 years.

'L' plates: Your vehicle must display an 'L' plate front and rear. The plate should consist of a red 'L' on a white background.

Motorways: No driving on motorways even if you possess a certificate of competence.

Trailers: If you hold a learner permit to drive vehicles of categories B, C1, C, D1 or D you may not drive the vehicle when drawing a trailer.

Passengers: No passengers can be carried for payment or other reward.

Vehicle safety Safe driving alone does not ensure road safety. The vehicle you are driving must also be fit to be on the road. In fact, it is a serious offence to drive an unsafe vehicle on a public road.

Laws exist to enforce vehicle standards. One of the most important of these is that your car, must undergo a regular health-check called a National Car Test (NCT).

As a driver, it is your responsibility to ensure your vehicle is in good working order. You must ensure that the steering, brakes, front and rear lights, reflectors, rear view mirrors, safety belts, speedometer, tyres, windscreen wipers, horn and silencer are all checked regularly to ensure they are in good condition and working properly.

BASIC CAR CHECKS

HERE'S A SIMPLE WAY TO REMEMBER WHAT TO CHECK. Rain or shine, it pays to give the car a good check over every couple of weeks you could prevent a breakdown and perhaps a large, unwelcome bill.

Fuel: Top up when you pass a filling station rather than delay looking for one until the fuel light comes on – particularly if you're driving in an unfamiliar area.

Lights: Clean all exterior lights regularly and check for blown bulbs and cracks in the lens.

Oil: Cars can consume as much as a litre of oil every 1,000 miles. Check the oil level regularly (your handbook will show you how). Don't wait for the red oil pressure warning light to come on - engine damage may already have occurred by then.

Water: Overheating is a common cause of breakdowns, especially in hotter weather. Check the coolant level regularly (the handbook will show you how) and if the level always seems low, check for leakages. Top up the windscreen washer fluid too.

Electrics: Battery problems are the number one cause of breakdowns at any time of year. Renew an old, tired battery before it lets you down. Also make sure that your electric radiator cooling fan starts running when the engine gets hot - you can check this by running the engine with the car stationary.

THINKING ABOUT FEELINGS



When someone comes along to counselling and begins to talk about what is troubling them, one of the difficulties that sometimes emerges is their sense of having feelings that nare 'bad' or 'wrong'. Perhaps they have been experiencing feelings of anger, or frustration,

or maybe sadness, or regret. They may see such feelings as negative or self-pitying, and not compatible with being a good and kind and positive person. They wish these feelings would just go away. But, however much they try to wish them away, the feelings stubbornly persist. So then they experience shame and anxiety about having what they see as such negative feelings, and this shame and anxiety gets added to the mix, and just makes everything worse.

Counselling can offer us time and space in which we can talk about, and think about, all the different aspects of our emotional life, without using labels like positive or negative, right or wrong, good or bad. Instead, the counsellor provides a non-judgemental relationship, in which all aspects of our emotional experience can be heard and thought about. If we can slow things down a bit, begin to make sense of our feelings, and see them as an unsurprising response to aspects of our life experience, they are much less likely to cause us anxiety.

Gradually, we become more able to manage our feelings and get on with our lives, instead of our feelings managing us, perhaps by making us anxious or irritable or unconfident or withdrawn. We learn to accept that, if we face difficult and challenging situations in the future then, naturally, we are bound to experience difficult and challenging feelings within ourselves. And when we have to bear particularly difficult circumstances or events in our lives, there is no shame in seeking support to work through our feelings about them.

A counsellor is able to sustain an open and accepting attitude to another person's feelings, without anxiety getting in the way, because, through their own training and personal development, they accept that having emotional responses to life's events is a part of what it is to be human. Perhaps then, the more accepting and tolerant we can be towards our own emotional life, the more kindly and accepting we are able to be towards the feelings of

TAX Matters with



TAXATION — FORESTRY

Ireland has a very favorable tax regime towards forestry.



The profits or gains arising from the occupation of woodlands in Ireland, managed on a commercial basis and with a view to the realisation of profits, shall not be taken into account for Income Tax purposes.

INCOME TAX

All profits from forestry including grants, premiums and timber sales are exempt from Income Tax.

CAPITAL GAINS TAX

Gains on the sale of standing trees are exempt, however the underlying land is liable.

All profits and premiums are liable.

STAMP DUTY

Purchases of afforested land are subject to Stamp Duty on the land value and not the standing crop.

CAPITAL ACQUISITION TAX (CAT)

Woodlands inherited and gifted are liable to CAT but are eligible for agricultural relief which could reduce the taxable value by 90%.






