Know Your Rights:

APPEALING YOUR LEAVING CERTIFICATE RESULTS

OUESTION

If I think my Leaving Certificate papers have not been marked correctly, can I have the marks rechecked?

ANSWER

Yes, if you are not satisfied with the marks in one or more of your Leaving Certificate exams, you can appeal them to the State Examinations Commission (SEC). Before you make the decision to appeal a result, you can view your exam paper. The SEC will send your school personalised application forms for you to view your exam papers and to appeal your results. (For external candidates, these forms are enclosed with your examination results.)

VIEWING: If you decide you would like to view a particular paper, you mark the form accordingly. There is no charge for viewing your papers. You must return the completed form to the school where you sat the examination by 19 August 2014. The Organising Superintendent appointed by the SEC will assign you to one of the viewing sessions. These will take place on 29 and 30 August 2014 in your school or examination centre.

APPEALING: If you decide to appeal your results, you indicate the subjects you wish to appeal on the appeal application form and you pay the appeal fee. Your application to appeal your 2014 results must be received by 3 September 2014.

Your paper will be re-marked by an appeal examiner, who will be different from the examiner who originally marked your work. The same marking scheme is used for re-marking. Your result may be upgraded, left the same or downgraded as a result of an appeal.

There is further information about the appeal process on the website of the State Examinations Commission, examinations.ie.

If you are not happy with the outcome of your appeal, you may request a review by the Independent Appeals Scrutineers. Application forms for an appeal review are provided with your appeal results.



BARRIERS TO SUCCESS

Do you ever feel that you have more potential that you are realising? Perhaps it seems as if your plans never come to fruition - or you sabotage your own success. Perhaps you lack confidence in your own abilities and doubt your capacity for success. Do you tend to procrastinate or find your great ideas never see the light of day? Then it may well be that you are creating your own psychological barriers to success?

Many of us carry around limiting beliefs and negative habits which hinder our success. These beliefs and behaviours are sometimes so well developed that we don't even realise they are there - and when we do, we don't have the skills or tools to overcome them. Typical barriers to success include: Fear of success and/or fear of failure, low self-esteem, negative thinking, reluctance to seek help, negative past experiences that continue to create emotional blocks, difficulties relating to others, depression, self-doubt and/or lack of self-belief. However we pay the price for these negative thoughts and

Bring to mind something that you've been wanting to do - and write it down on a sheet of paper. Now think of all of the reasons that stop you from doing this - and write these down. Next review the list and cross off those that are simply not real or true (it may be helpful to enlist the help of a friend

Now look at the negative beliefs on your list that can be substituted with something more positive. The brain cannot hold two contradictory beliefs simultaneously - thus try replacing a negative belief (e.g. I could never go to college) with a more positive one (I have the ability to go to college). Better still, write the positive affirmation in the present tense as if it is already happening (I am studying in College and loving every minute of it). Write down your affirmations and put them on your desk or bathroom mirror, repeating them as often as possible. Notice when self-doubts crop up.

When self-doubts and limiting beliefs sneak in - do a reality check and ask yourself 'Is there a rational reason to believe them?' If so, what can you do to change this? Is there something practical we can do to? Sometimes our doubts and negative self-beliefs are rooted in earlier life experiences or childhood traumas. If this is the case, perhaps you could seek the help of a counsellor or coach to overcome these.

Next week we will continue to look at our own personal Psychological Barriers to Success and discuss ways in which these can be overcome.

WARTS AND VERRUCAS

WARTS are small rough lumps on the skin. They are caused by a virus (human papillomavirus) which causes a reaction in the skin. Warts can occur anywhere on the body but occur most commonly on hands and feet. They range in size from 1 mm to over 1 cm. Sometimes only one or two warts develop. Sometimes several occur in the same area of skin. The shape and size of warts vary, and they are sometimes classed by how they look.

VERRUCAS are warts that occur on the soles of the feet. They are the same as warts on any other part of the body. However, they may look flatter, as they tend to get trodden on.

ARE WARTS CONTAGIOUS? Yes, but the risk of passing them on to others is low. You need close skin-to-skin contact. You are more at risk of being infected if your skin is damaged, or if it is wet and macerated, and in contact with roughened surfaces. For example, in swimming pools and communal washing areas.

You can also spread the wart virus to other areas of your body. For example, warts may spread round the nails, lips and surrounding skin if you bite warts on your fingers, or nearby nails.

TO REDUCE THE CHANCE OF PASSING ON WARTS TO OTHERS:

- Don't share towels.
- · When swimming, cover any wart or verruca with a waterproof plaster.
- If you have a verruca, wear flip-flops in communal shower rooms and don't share shoes or socks.
- To reduce the chance of warts spreading to other areas of your body:
- · Don't scratch warts.
- Don't bite nails or suck fingers that have warts.
- If you have a verruca, change your socks daily.

TREATMENT: Without treatment, about 3 in 10 warts have gone within 10 weeks, and most warts will have gone within 1-2 years, and leave no scar.

SALICYLIC ACID

- You need to apply each day for up to three months. This acid burns off the top laver.
- Every few days rub off the dead tissue from the top of the wart, with emery paper (or similar). Gradually the wart is burnt off and rubbed away.
- It is best if you soak the wart in water for 5-10 minutes before applying acid.
- You should not apply acid to the face because of the risk of skin irritation which may cause scarring.
- Try not to get the acid on the skin next to the wart, as it may become irritated.

TREATMENT (CRYOTHERAPY): Freezing warts is a popular treatment. Many GPs are skilled at this. Liquid nitrogen is commonly used. The nitrogen is sprayed on or applied to the wart. Liquid nitrogen is very cold and the freezing and thawing destroys the wart tissue. To clear the wart fully it can need up to 4-6 treatment sessions. One recent research study reported that freezing treatment was more likely to be successful at clearing warts compared with acid treatment. Also, freezing treatment tends to be quicker to get results.

TAPE: There is mixed evidence to support the use of taping alone to remove warts.








CUSTOMER SERVICE ENHANCEMENTS TO THE NCT

New customer service enhancements are being introduced at the National Car Testing Service from 28th July 2014:

1. Voluntary Early Testing of Vehicles: Vehicle owners who wish to present their vehicle for inspection earlier than 90 days before their NCT due date will now be allowed to do so.

Where this happens the vehicle will receive a 2 year (or 1 year for 10 year old and older vehicles) certificate duration from the date it passes the test. Vehicles presenting for their first NCT at 4 years will be subject to the same rules as any other aged vehicles. Note this is a change from the current rule which allowed vehicles presenting for their first test at 4 years to be presented up to 6 months (180 days) early and to receive a certificate duration dated from the anniversary of their first date of registration. Vehicles presenting for an NCT younger than 2 years can be tested but will not receive a certificate and their next NCT due date will remain the 4th anniversary of the first date of registration.

In order for a vehicle to be considered as presented voluntarily early, it must currently have an in-date, valid NCT test certificate or be younger than 4 years-90 days.

This change is being introduced as members of the retail trade have lobbied for it as they see an advantage in being able to sell a vehicle with a full two year (or 1 year) certificate.

Finally, there is a potential advantage of this change for owners of vehicles due their 10th anniversary inspection, if they present earlier than 90 days before their due date, they will receive a 2 year certificate from the date they pass rather than a 1 year cert from the anniversary of the registration date if they wait until they are due.

- 2. Odometer Readings Printing and Verification by the Presenter: Odometer Readings captured after July 28th, 2014 will be printed on the NCT Certificate. Up to a maximum of 3 previous readings can be printed on the Certificate. This is being introduced as an aid to consumer protection.
- 3. Management System for Test Centre **Bookings:** Customers wishing to have a full test conducted in a vehicle without a pre-arranged appointment must be a member of the NCT Trade Scheme or provide other identification



as specified by the Authority.

After July 28th, only a Trade Fob or a Driving Licence will be deemed as acceptable forms of identification in order to receive a short notice booking made in the test centre.

This measure is being introduced to bring greater transparency to transactions carried out in the test centre. The NCT Trade Scheme is for NCT purposes only.

NOVICE PLATES

The Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport has announced changes to the driver licensing system that apply to newly qualified novice drivers and first time learner permit holders.

These changes are important road safety measures that form part of the Graduated Driver Licensing (GDL) system, one of the key actions in the current and previous Government Road Safety Strategies aimed at improving how we train, test and licence learner and novice drivers.

THE CHANGES ARE AS FOLLOWS:

A person granted a first driving licence on or after 1st August 2014 must display N-plates on the vehicle for a period of 2 years, and during that period display N-plates on any other vehicle in respect of which they get a driving licence. Where the vehicle is a motorcycle, the rider must wear an N - tabard.

The novice period applies only once ie someone who holds a driving licence for a category of vehicle and who after a period of two years becomes entitled to drive another

category, does not become a novice in respect of the new category.

Non-display of N plates is an offence under traffic law and is punishable by a fine not exceeding €1,000 for a first offence. On becoming a fixed change the failure to display an N-plate will carry 2 penalty points on payment of a fixed charge, or 4 on conviction.

A lower threshold of seven penalty points leading to disqualification will apply to any driver who is granted their first learner permit on or after 1 August 2014 while they drive under a learner permit, and subsequently during the first two years while they drive under their first driving licence.

There is no requirement for novice drivers to have an accompanying driver - this is still only the case for learner drivers. However, a novice driver may not act as an accompanying driver for someone who holds a learner permit

The purpose of the GDL system is to reduce the number of collisions, deaths and injuries among learner and novice drivers, particularly among the high risk 17 to 24 year olds, during

the learning to drive period and period immediately after they pass their test.

Research tells us that novice drivers are most likely to be killed on our roads in the first two years after passing their test due to their

In fact, UK research has revealed that 1 in 5 newly qualified novice drivers has crashed in the first six months after passing their test. Furthermore, available evidence suggests that a driver is considered to be inexperienced until s/he has driven 100,000 kilometres.

Therefore, these measures are designed to protect our most vulnerable road-users so that they can become safe, competent and confident drivers, helping to ensure we have fewer collisions, fatalities and injuries on our roads.

Novice plates, or similar systems, are in place in many other EU countries, and these measures will help to bring Ireland closer into line with Northern Ireland, the UK and other EU jurisdictions.








IFA MEET LAMB PROCESSORS ON PRICES AND INCOMES

The lamb price cuts over recent weeks were excessive and seriously damaged sheep farmers' incomes. Lamb prices can rebound based on market returns and must be maintained to restore confidence to the sector. These were the strong messages delivered by the IFA President Eddie Downey and National Sheep Chairman John Lynskey in a meeting with all of the major lamb processors and Meat Industry Ireland in Dublin this week.

Eddie Downey said sheep farmers need a return of at least €100 per lamb and the combination of price and weight has to be adequate to deliver this type of return and maintain confidence in the sector, "With up to 50,000 additional new season lambs already moved over recent weeks and higher prices in both the UK and France, there is an opportunity to restore and stabilise returns here." The IFA President told the factories price cuts of over €1.00/kg or €20 per lamb in a 2 to 3 week period cannot be justified and it is clear the price cuts raced ahead of the market. He said based on current UK and French market returns, processors could lift price to Irish farmers.

IFA National Sheep Committee Chairman John Lynskey said there was a major overhang of income problems on sheep farms from last year, with Teagasc recently outlining an income fall of 39% to just €11,160 for 2013. He said sheep farmers must be given the opportunity to recover this year and strong lamb prices are essential to returns. He added the recent price cuts were very disappointing and a major shock to producers. John Lynskey said with the excellent grass growing conditions farmers should select their lamb carefully to maximise returns and avoid selling under finished or overweight lambs. In addition he called on the factories to make the adjustment on carcase weights up to 22kgs sooner rather than later. The IFA sheep farmers' leader said the store trade has already kicked in and the good grass growing conditions were helping the trade. There was a good return for store lamb finishers last year on the back of New Zealand shifting greater volumes out of the EU to China. John Lynskey said a large volume of ewe hogget's were killed earlier this year and combined with the strong ewe trade, this should help drive the demand for ewe lambs this season.

At the meeting with MII it was also agreed to set up a working group between IFA, the lamb processors, Teagasc and Bord Bia on the light lamb trade.

20% REDUCTION IN INPUTS PRICES JUSTIFIED WITH FALLING FARM GATE PRICES

IFA Inputs Project Team Leader James McCarthy said that it is imperative that agricultural input manufactures and suppliers reduce their product prices to reflect the negative farm income situation that many livestock and grain farmers are facing this year. He said input prices need to fall across the board by between 15 and 20% if they are to reflect the new reality of depressed grain and livestock farms. "Livestock and grain farmer incomes. will fall significantly this year due to a combination of falling product prices and rapidly escalating costs. Input prices particularly for fertiliser, plant protection products and feed are increasingly out of line with producer prices. There is an onus on agricultural input manufacturers and suppliers across the full supply chain to substantially reduce input prices to reflect the new reality. Failure to address the imbalance of high input prices with low farm product prices will undermine farm family viability and could lead to serious world food supply issues in the near future. Plant protection suppliers have done particularly well out of tillage farmers in the past few years and Mr. McCarthy called on them to provide rebates of at least 20% on this year's purchases. Historically fertiliser prices in the case accounted for approximately 17% of variable costs for grain production but today this is closer to 35%. The operation of fertiliser price cartels among some of the bigger manufacturers has removed real competition from the market.

European and world leaders must tackle this situation as a matter of urgency if they are to avoid a major food supply shortage as a result of land abandonment as farm families exiting production. Merchants must force manufacturers and suppliers to deliver significant rebates that can be passed back to farmers. Similarly, on the feed front feed manufactures must reduce the price of compound feed to reflect the substantial fall in feed ingredient prices.

There is a longer term issue at stake here as any farm business that is not generating enough profit to allow for reinvestment is not sustainable. Input suppliers in many instances had hiked product prices in recent years on the back of rising farm product prices. This must be addressed now.

EXTENSION OF PRSITO ASSISTING SPOUSES OF SELF EMPLOYED A POSITIVE MOVE

IFA Farm Business Chairman, Tom Doyle has said that the recent extension of PRSI eligibility to partners of self-employed, such as farmers, who assist in the business, is a positive move. This group can now make PRSI contributions in their own rights.


Mr Doyle said, "IFA has always argued that that access to the Insurance contributory system should be open to all. Where possible, individuals should be entitled to make PRSI contributions which would qualify them for their own individual future benefits, such as the Contributory Pension. Over many years, IFA fought to ensure that spouses of self-employed would be eligible to qualify for and make contributions to the PRSI system. Prior to this, spouses of self-employed farmers who assisted in the farm work, but who were not operating a partnership structure, did not qualify to make PRSI contributions. From 2014 on, this group will be entitled to make PRSI contributions, provided their income from all sources exceeds the minimum insurability threshold of €5.000."

Mr. Doyle added: "This will be

of benefit for individuals who between now and their turning 66, can make sufficient contributions to bring them up to a minimum of 10 years of contributions, thereby qualifying for a contributory pension. It is critical that the rules for participation are straightforward and accessible for those to whom this extension applies. However, the continued exclusion of spouses of self-employed farmers who are employed in the PAYE system on the farm is unfairly excluding a category of individuals from the Social Insurance system and IFA will continue to pursue this issue."

IFA Farm Family Chairman, Maura Canning, said, " As a future investment, it is critically important for farm families that they keep up to date with their PRSI contributions, including voluntary contributions where the farm income in any year falls below the minimum PRSI threshold. IFA will be producing an information leaflet on the PRSI system and how it applies to farm families in the coming weeks, to ensure that individuals are aware of how to safeguard their future income."

FARMS BENEFIT FROM FALLING PRODUCTION COSTS

In its mid-year assessment of likely farm profitability in 2014, Teagasc economists have highlighted falling production costs as the main driver of farm incomes in 2014.

Speaking on the release of the Teagasc. Mid-year Outlook for Irish Agriculture 2014, Teagasc economist Trevor Donnellan said; "Following two high production cost years in 2012 and 2013. Irish farmers are finally now seeing a reduction in their input spending."

With generally good grass growing conditions to date in 2014, the main driver of the fall in production costs has been reduced expenditure on concentrate feeds, which have now reverted back to a level which would be considered normal. Compared with this time last year, feed prices are also lower, bringing additional savings to livestock farmers.

So far this year, farmers have also experienced reductions in their fertiliser and fuel bills, while inflation in other costs continues to remain low.

As a result of these falling production costs, dairy, sheep and cattle rearing farms should see an increase in their gross margins in 2014.

However, Dr Kevin Hanrahan, Teagasc economist said; "It is not all good news. with the fall in the costs of production being insufficient to offset the fall in the price of cattle received by beet finishers, whose margins are now forecast to decline in 2014."

With a large global crop harvest now forecast for 2014, it would appear that cereal prices this year will be lower than those of the 2013 harvest. Nevertheless cereal producers will also benefit from a reduction in their costs, although not to the same extent as grassland farmers.

Dr Fiona Thome, Teagasc economist said; "Even if yields in 2014 are to exceed average trend yields as indicated by crop growth and early harvest indications, it is unlikely that this would be sufficient to overcome the impact of lower cereal prices and therefore cereal margins in 2014 are forecast to be lower than in 2013".






TODAY IS THE FIRST DAY OF AUTUMN IN THE CELTIC CALENDAR:

August was originally Sextilis, the sixth month in the Roman calendar and consisted of 31 days. It became the eighth month with a length of 29 days around 700 BCE when January and February were added to the year. Julius Caesar added two days to the month around 45 BCE. It was later renamed to honour Augustus Caesar

August is the eighth month of the year in the Julian and Gregorian calendar and is the seasonal equivalent of the final month of winter in the Southern hemisphere.

August does not start on the same day of the week as any other month in the year, but ends on the same day of the week as November every year. During leap years, August starts on the same day as February and still ends on same day as November.

Lúnasa is a Gaelic festival marking the beginning of the harvest season that was historically observed throughout Ireland, Scotland and the Isle of Man. Originally it was held on the 31st July – 1st August, or approximately halfway between the summer solstice and autumn equinox

The festival itself is named after the god Lugh. It involved great gatherings that included religious ceremonies, ritual athletic contests (most notably the Tailteann Games), feasting, matchmaking and trading.

AGING WITH ATTITUDE:

Barbara Beskind's favourite piece of advice for her older peers is, "Find out what you can do to make life better for others."

At 90, Ms. Beskind is by far the oldest member of a dynamic team working on what's known as human-centered design for food, packaging, electronics and, most recently, aging. She is also one of the newest designers at IDEO. She started last July after applying to be part of the firm's design challenge for products for older adults. That challenge is over, but Ms. Beskind's stint is not. Every Thursday, she travels by train from her San Mateo retirement community to the IDFO offices

"I've retired five times, but it's like a vaccination that doesn't take," she says. Among her careers: 44 years in occupational therapy, 20 of those in the Army. She set up the first freestanding occupational therapy practice in the U.S., launched a lampshade replacement business and has written several books.

At present Ms. Beskind is working on a revolutionary type of walker that is much more dynamic than the ones on the market today, this walker inspires the user to maintain a vertical position.

She is also most excited about planning a separate living quarters that would go behind an existing home, for elderly people to live in independently or to be in for end of life or hospice care. There are some on the market, but she has ideas that would be an improvement. Ms. Beskind would have an entire panel behind the bed and a plug-in where there could be oxygen availability and blood pressure monitoring.

It would be prefab, the family could assemble it. It would have a chemical toilet, with water and electricity drawn from the house. The company that leases it would have to get all the permits. As soon as the person dies, the family would have to remove the structure.

Ms. Beskind gets her ideas from sitting in the hall of her retirement community and watching people to see how many improvements are needed and also takes a long daily walk using a pair of ski poles she adapted for the job.

CLEAN WHERE IT COUNTS: 3 SURFACES THAT MATTER:

Some surfaces are more problematic than others in terms of harbouring germs, that's especially important if you're living with someone who has an autoimmune disorder, cancer, pneumonia, or who is taking medications that compromise immunity.

If you can't manage a complete housecleaning every week try just focusing on these oftenneglected surfaces:

- 1. The touchables This includes all those surfaces you touch without thinking about them. Wipe down doorknobs, remote control devices, phones (including smartphones), and keyboards.
- 2. Key kitchen tops Routinely clean kitchen countertops -- but also get to those kitchen surfaces that are often forget about, like cutting boards and knives.
- 3. Key bathroom surfaces Most people think about wiping the countertop. But while you're at it, wipe down the taps, toilet flush lever, and light switch. Keeping portable disinfectant wipes in the room will make the job easier. Tip: Shutting the toilet lid before you flush prevents sprav.

GOOD NEWS:

More than 60 counties, cities, and states – and some corporations in the US - are reducing discrimination against former offenders by 'banning the box' from job applications.

Nearly 70% percent of those released from prison in the United States will be arrested again within three years of release. Unemployment is a huge barrier to their success outside prison

Many return to their communities with no more skills and resources than when they were arrested and imprisoned and for many, during their time behind bars technology has changed so much that the skills that they do have might

"Ban the box," was a phrase coined in 2003 by All of Us or None, an organisation founded by formerly imprisoned people who faced barriers to employment. The "box" refers to the little square on job applications that potential employees are asked to check if they've ever been convicted of a felony.

"Ban the box" policies aim to remove this question from job applications and reduce the employment discrimination faced by former offenders through policies that prevent employers from asking about an applicant's criminal record, at least in the early phases of the process, the policies do not stop potential employers from conducting criminal background checks, but instead delay the process until an employer has had the opportunity to get to know the employee's qualifications first, usually through at least one face-to-face interview.

Minnesota Governor Mark Dayton signed a statewide "Ban the Box" bill into law on Jan. 1, 2014. That day was a triumph for TakeAction Minnesota, the network of unions and progressive groups who led the movement to develop and pass the legislation.

DID YOU KNOW

*Ligers are the cross of a male lion and a female tiger, and they are the largest of all living cats and felines. Their massive size may be a result of imprinted genes which are not fully expressed in their parents, but are left unchecked when the two different species mate. Some female ligers can grow to 10 feet in length and weigh more than 700 pounds. Ligers are distinct from tigons, which come from a female lion and male tiger. Various other big cat hybrids have been created too, including leopons (a leopard and a lion mix), jaguleps (a jaguar and leopard

mix), and even lijaguleps (a lion and jagulep mix).

*A zebroid is the offspring of a cross between a zebra and any other equine, usually a horse or a donkey. There are zorses, zonkeys, zonies and a host of other combinations. Zebroids are an interesting example of hybrids bred from species that have a radically different number of chromosomes. For instance, horses have 64 chromosomes and zebra have between 32 and 44 (depending on species). Even so, nature finds a wav.

*Grolar bears are the offspring of a grizzly bear and a polar bear, a grolar bear is one beast you don't want to meet in the woods. Interestingly, unlike many hybrid animals, grolar bears are known to occur naturally in the wild. Some experts predict that polar bears may be driven to breed with grizzly bears at an increased frequency due to global warming, and the fact that polar bears are being forced from their natural habitats on the polar ice.

*A Wholphin is a cross between a false killer whale and an Atlantic bottlenose dolphin, wholphins are hybrids that have been reported to exist in the wild. There are currently two in captivity, both at Sea Life Park in Hawaii. The wholphin's size, colour and shape are intermediate between the parent species. Even their number of teeth is mixed; a bottlenose has 88 teeth, a false killer whale has 44 teeth, and a wholphin has 66.
