





MICHAEL, 103, TO LAUNCH PLOUGHING

He might be older than Ireland but 103-yearold Michael O'Connor from Killarney is still full of energy and continues to lead a hectic social schedule. He has been lined up to officially launch this year's South Kerry Ploughing Championships and Harvest Show which has been scheduled for Fleming's Farm, Grenagh, Fossa for Sunday, September 11. Despite his great age, Michael still drives and he remains an enthusiastic gardener, zipping around his garden on his drive-on mower every chance he gets. And he attributes his long and healthy life to a love of the land and a little bit of mini ploughing of his own. "If you only dug a hole in your back garden today and filled it in tomorrow, you're doing yourself a good turn," he said. The ploughing event has already helped to generate in excess of €60,000 for local organisations and this year's beneficiaries will be the Kerry branch of the Irish Kidney Association, Down Syndrome Kerry, the Irish Pilgrimage Trust and the Kerry-Cork Health Link Bus. It is organised by the Killarney Valley Classic and Vintage Club and there will be several celebrities in attendance on the day, mingling with the thousands of people expected to flock to the venue on the main Killarney to Killorglin road. The event will feature close on 200 trade stands, traditional and modern method ploughing demonstrations, sheep dog trials, sheep shearing competitions, harvesting demos, machinery showcases and traditional farm practice exhibitions - and that's only for starters. There will be two fashion shows on the day with sensational prizes on offer for the most stylish lady and the best dressed man. Two fun zones with rollercoasters and a hugely

MARY MAKES LIFE EASIER FOR CHILDREN WITH THE HELP OF KILLARNEY PEOPLE

A Killarney woman who spent the summer volunteering in Nepal has returned home just in time to start the school year. Mary O'Leary who works at the Naionra in Gaelscoil Faithleann made the trip with the Umbrella Foundation for 6 weeks during July and August. Mary worked in two schools, Gyanodaya School in Katmandu

where over 2,200 children attend aged 2-18 years old and she also worked in three nursery classes with over 90 children. With funds raised in Killarney before her trip Mary ensured that the nursery school classrooms were refurbished with new flooring and lots of new educational equipment like puzzles, books, arts and crafts.

While there Mary also passed on her knowledge and skills demonstrating to preschool teachers montessori and other western methods of teaching for preschool children. "While I was there I spent four weeks on rural school project in Sukute school in a village that was hugely affected by the earthquake which killed over 9,000 people in April of last year", Mary told the Killarney Outlook. "Houses are still being rebuilt with many families still living in temporary accommodation", she added. The group that Mary travelled with, The Umbrella Project has to date closed down 7 corrupt orphanages and has reunited over 400 children with their family. The group also financially supports the education of children in Nepal.

"I would like to thank the people of Killarney for all their support. It was lovely to hear from people through social media, which I am just beginning to master and a special thank you to everyone who contributed to the fundraiser which topped over €17,000", Mary said.

KILLARNEY AGAINST CANCER FOUNDER HIGHLIGHTS THE IMPORTANCE OF EXERCISE

The founder of Killarney Against Cancer is currently in the last week of a 30 day kettle bell challenge. Speaking to the Killarney Outlook Dr. Stack said "Accumulation of fat in the abdominal cavity a condition called visceral obesity is the highest risk form of obesity - even small amounts of excess fat, often seen as a cosmetic disfigurement can in fact contribute to a chronic medical disease".

"When you have two much intradominal visceral fat you have more fat around the heart leading to heart disease and hypertension, more fat in the liver leads to fatty liver and more fat infiltrating the pancreas causes insulin resistance leading to type 2 diabetes. Mellitus and even fat in your kidneys contributing to further exacerbating hypertension", she added. Visceral obesity is now implicated in many cancers including breast cancer in post menopausal women and prostate cancer in men and it is also associated with colon cancer in both men and women.

Osteoarthitis of knees hips and lower back is now becoming more prevalent in patients with this condition.

"Many drugs can also exacerbate visceral obesity including anti depressants and mood stabilisers and it is no longer acceptable that visceral obesity is an acceptable side effect in these patients", Dr. Stack said.

Management by lifestyle and exercise in the key to combating this disease. Target exercise alone and physical activity is know to decrease coronary artery disease by 50 % while a good balanced diet with a good protein intake, consuming less sugar and watching your portion sizes is hugely important.

Keeping physically active and keeping your waist measurements within healthy limits are the key to a healthier lifestyle, Dr. Stack concluded.

Killarney Against Cancer is a new foundation to highlight the importance of prevention and early detection and intervention in the fight against cancer.



SUN SHINES DOWN ON THE OPENING OF KILLARNEY GARDENS

Last Friday morning saw the official opening of Killarney Gardens by the Minister of State for Regional Economic Development, Michael Ring T.D. Kenmare House was originally built in 1726 and demolished by Sir Valentine Browne, 4th Earl of Kenmare, in 1872. In that same year Valentine and his wife Gertrude began construction of the new magnificent Killarney House. The new design by George Devey cost over £100,000 for the house and demesne developments. In 1879, Killarney House was burnt out just shortly after its completion and again in September 1916 the house was destroyed by fire caused by an overheated flue at the top of the building; the house was never rebuilt. Instead of rebuilding the house again, Valentine Browne, 5th Earl of Kenmare renovated the original 18th Century Courtyard from what was the Kenmare Estate. Here is where their family resided, also naming it "Kenmare House".

The Killarney House estate was a remarkable venue for attracting and entertaining guests; most notably, Queen Victoria holidayed in Killarney in 1861 and chose the Killarney house estate as her base. During the 1920's and 1930s, Valentine, Lord Castlerosse, spent much time entertaining guests in the newly refurbished Kenmare House.

In 1957 Mrs Beatrice Grosvenor, niece of Gerald Ralph Desmond Browne, 7th Earl of Kenmare, sold the Killarney House Estate to an American syndicate. However one member of the syndicate by the name of John McShain bought out all the other members and the

estate came into his full possession in 1959. On the death of McShain's wife Mary in 1998, the estate was transferred into the Ownership and care of the State.

Present Day Renovations: Using original plans of the estate, the National Parks & Wildlife Services have been working tirelessly to restore the gardens and achieve the 18th, 19th and 20th century magnificence and bring the gardens into their present day glory. The plans for the Killarney House itself included developing a visitor centre dedicated to the National Park, restoration of formal rooms and using the remaining antique collection still present in the house to regale the history of the house and the lives of those who lived there.

The extension for the new visitor centre will feature cutting-edge technology, a cultural space for events and exciting exhibition space. The project was carefully designed to achieve the full potential of this important landmark while also respecting that this heritage property is managed by the National Parks and Wildlife Service of the Department of Arts, Heritage and the Gaeltacht.

The gardens are open to the public.

HIT 1916 DRAMA 'PATRICK' RETURNS TO THE INEC

The hit drama 'Patrick' returns to the INEC for a one-night-only showing at the INEC on Thursday, October 27th. Written and directed by Aidan O'Connor, the musical drama tells the moving story of the final months of the life of Patrick O'Connor from Rathmore - one of the four Kerry men to die during the six-day rebellion during Easter, 1916. The play sold out six shows earlier this year and over 3,000 people came to see the the production when last staged at the INEC in May.

€750,000 ADDITIONAL CAPITAL INVESTMENT IN KILLARNEY NATIONAL PARK FOR 2016

Over a third of the funding is allocated towards the repair of internal roadways within the National Park, while a fifth of the funding is intended to address the consequences of recent flood damage.

Funding is also being made available to ensure that Dinis Cottage can re-open, and to complete a strategic land purchase at Tomies Wood to facilitate access to that side of the National Park. Deputy Griffin and Cllr. Sheahan said: 'This funding for Killarney National Park is crucial to ensure it remains a vital tourist attraction and local amenity. In particular, we have lobbied hard for funding to improve the condition of the National Park roads and we are delighted that this funding will now help address this issue. We will continue to do all that we can to ensure continued investment in the national park into

NEW ERA AT MUCKROSS HOUSE

Mr Rory D'Arcy, chairman of the board of trustees of Muckross House has welcomed what he described as a new era in the running of historic Muckross House, Killarney.

The new development in the partnership with the National Parks and Wildlife Service has been ushered in with the signing of a fresh agreement for the running of the leading tourist attraction between the State and a local board of trustees. 



FOCUS ON AUTUMN GARDENING

There is a lot of work to do in the garden this time of the year, so you can reap the rewards later on during the spring and the summer.

You can start by giving your herbaceous plants a tidy up. Some of them are obviously in full flower and looking good but there are also a lot that have finished flowering for a while, so it is best with these to remove all the dead stems.

After this is done the flower bed might look a little bare, so now is a good time to start planting spring flowering plants such as wall flowers, primroses and polyanthis and also of course spring flowering bulbs.

A lot of containers, baskets and window boxes are looking a bit tired at this time of the year. Some plants look ok but others not so much. The best thing to do would be to remove the dead ones as it is only taking from the good ones. If you want you can always add a trailing ivy or a cyclamen as this will keep them looking good for another while and you can include them in your winter display.

KERRY CHALLENGE STALLS AS DUBS FINISH STRONGER

KERRY 2-14 DUBLIN 0-22

Another memorable chapter in the enduring rivalry that is the story of Kerry and Dublin was written at Croke Park on Sunday when Gaelic football's greatest rivals played themselves to a standstill in 76 minutes of top class championship fare.

Kerry were attempting to clinch their first Championship win over the Dubs since 2009 and had their chances but in the end, Dublin's finishing power where they scored six points in the final ten minutes to Kerry's two eventually turned the tide.

In Dean Rock, who finished the game with a magnificent haul of 12 points, including 8 frees and 2'45's, Dublin had a go-to man for scores. Rock who is every bit as good a free-taker as his father, punished Kerry's indiscretions with an incredible display of kicking. He was ably supported by Diarmuid Connolly and Kevin McManamon in the attack.

Between them, Dublin's inside line scored 0-16 out of their side's tally, an incredible return, while they were ably supported by Kerry's nemesis in the past, Kevin McManaman who had another profitable scoring return against the Kingdom, with three points to his name. Before a full house and on an ideal day for Gaelic football, Dublin began the game with fire while Kerry were slower and waited until the 14th minute for their opening score. The All-Ireland champions raced into a 0-4 to 0-0 lead after 12 minutes thanks to scores from Diarmuid Connolly and Dean Rock 0-3, one a 45 which came following a Brian Kelly save from Philly McMahon.

David Moran opened his side's account in the 14th minute. Dean Rock, with his fourth point, restored Dublin's four-point advantage. Kerry were on the ropes at this stage it would seem as the outstanding Paul Geaney and Colm Cooper (free) added points but Dean Rock and Kevin McManamon added further scores for Dublin.

Colm Cooper tapped over a free to leave three points between the sides. Following a disastrous attempted short kick-out by Stephen Cluxton, Kerry scored their first goal in the 29th minute when Darran O'Sullivan linked up with Donnchadh Walsh to fire home.

Half-time came at the wrong time for Kerry as Dublin came out rejuvenated and resumed their dominant ways.

Points from Dean Rock (3) and Bernard Brogan in reply to a Colm Cooper free for Kerry meant that the Kingdom led by two 2-9 to 0-13 after 42 minutes. Rock, from a free and Brian Fenton levelled the scores with 49 minutes gone. Kerry enjoyed a period of dominance. Great scores from Barry John Keane a beauty, Paul Geaney and James O'Donoghue moved them three clear with 59 minutes gone.

Dean Rock and Paul Murphy exchanged scores before Philly McMahon stole upfield to boot over another Dublin point.

Rock, with a brace of points and Kevin McManaman added further scores as Dublin led by the minimum.

Stephen O'Brien levelled with a point when a goal looked on before Eoghan O'Gara and Diarmuid Connolly finished off the scoring as Dublin broke Kerry hearts once again. In Sundays game a major talking point came when Peter Crowley was over robustly challenged by Kevin McManamon late in the game. After all the whole of Cork will remember Kerry's own Tommy Sugrue at the centre of controversy when they played Meath in the 1988 final. They still speak of Brian Stafford late equalising point in Cork. Cork lost the replay to Meath

What is an issue however and pretty valid is Goughs closeness to the current Dublin team, when the local St Jude's GAA notes (the same club of Kevin McManamon) congratulate their Under 14 Feile trainer David Gough on being announced as the All Ireland Semi-final ref. This certainly opens the door to all sorts of claims and it would appear that GAA officials took their eye of the ball. Suddenly all of Goughs decisions made on the day have become magnified. The decision to award McManamon a "45" after Goughs own Uncle waved it wide, the decision to yellow card Philly McMahon for abusing the same official when it's sanction is black or red, the infamous Crowley

incident which again featured St Jude's own McManamon, a free awarded against Killian Young in front of the goal, when replays show no contact was made.

These will remain in the ether for a while but back to the playing field and we all know



that it's the scoreboard that decides the victory and Kerry were outscored 0-13 to 0-6 in the second half and Gough had little to do with this, He did not kick a Kerry wide or lose possession and he did not take off Paul Geaney Kerry's most dangerous forward. They are questions for a very different court.

KERRY O'SHEA REPORTS FROM THE ALL IRELAND SEMI-FINAL IN CROKE PARK

Kerry will be bidding to become just the fourth side to win a hat-trick of titles since the start of the minor championship in 1929. To date, Kerry (1931-33), Dublin (1954-56) and Cork (1967-69) are the only minor teams to achieve this remarkable feat.

Apart from the early minutes of the game when Kildare mounted a decent challenge and led by 0-4 to 0-2 by the 11th minute, with corner-forwards Ciaran Kelly and Jimmy Hyland posing problems, Kerry were never seriously threatened.

Clifford, the young Fossa lad who has hogged all the headlines in this year's Minor Championship with some brilliant individual displays, again showed his wonderful and rare talent, finishing the game with a personal tally of 0-8, 0-6 of which came from play. His score taking was sweet and sublime as he scored with both feet and his display will

As a Gaelic footballer with Kerry, John O'Keeffe was known as the 'Prince of Full-Backs'. He won seven All-Ireland Senior Medals in a remarkable career and was a key member

He first came to national attention in 1969 when he captained St Brendan's College to All-Ireland glory.

Johnno's impressive list of other major honours includes; 12 Munster Senior Medals, 6 National League Medals, 5 All Star Awards, 1 Texaco Footballer Of The Year Award, 7 Railway Cup Medals, 6 Munster 1 Combined Universities, 3 Sigerson Cups with UCD, 1 Dublin Senior County Championship Medal, 1 All Ireland Club Medal UCD 1974, 1 Hogan Cup 1969 Capt.

With his Club Austin Stacks he won further honours, including 5 Co SFC Medals, 1973, 1975, 1976, 1979 and 1986, 7 Co SFL Medals, 1 Munster Senior club Medal, 1976, 1 All-Ireland Club SFC Medal, 1977, 1 Minor Co SFC Medal 1969, 1 Minor SHC Medal in 1969.

GREYHOUND RACING BANNED IN NEW SOUTH WALES

The 24th of August, 2016 will be remembered as an historic day in the animal protection movement. Early that morning, after hours of

There were so many groups, individuals, politicians and journalists who've been relentless champions for the animals abused by this gambling industry — and who Animals Australia will continue to work with until greyhound racing is banned nation-wide. This decision reflects a shift in political consciousness. It's irrefutable proof, that politicians are not only recognising, but are prepared to act, on the deep compassion and concern in the community about Australia's treatment of animals. TWO KILO GOLDFISH

Australian researchers are warning of a new, invasive threat to the continent's native wildlife: goldfish that were abandoned by their owners and released into the wild. Most of us think of goldfish as a small and harmless species, but apparently Western Australia's rivers contain just the right conditions to allow the fish to grow into two kilo monsters that wreak havoc on the local ecosystem.

Once they are released into the water, they breed at a rapid rate, taking over the area. Because they can travel quite far, up to 230 kilometres per year, they're incredibly difficult to eradicate, they eat the eggs of native species and they're releasing a nutrient-rich waste into the water column which creates dangerous algae blooms. They're also carriers of nasty diseases that don't naturally occur in Australia's waters.

RUSSIAN WALKED 18,200KM TO VISIT RIO DE JANEIRO

Sergey Lukyanov at the age of 60, embarked on the adventure from Russia's "northern capital" of St. Petersburg on April 1 of last year to follow a childhood dream. Mr. Lukyanov's route ran thorough China, Kazakhstan, Vietnam, Laos, Thailand, Malaysia, and Singapore, where he boarded a plane bound for South America in order to cross the Atlantic Ocean. After he landed in the Chilean capital of Santiago, he continued his journey on foot. The wanderer trekked across Argentina and Uruguay before finally arriving at the Summer

Olympic Games in Brazil's capital and wearing out 6 pairs of shoes on the journey. His journey was made possible thanks to the tremendous support he received from volunteers around the world. Some donated money for Mr. Lukyanov's ticket, while others helped him get visas. People welcomed him everywhere, giving him food and shelter. Mr. Lukyanov's initial goal was to arrive in Rio by the start of the Olympics on August 5th, but unsuspected health problems prevented him from sticking to the schedule, as he had to undergo surgery and lost about 45 days overall. Mr. Lykianov himself is no ordinary hiker, as he is a Russian Master of Sport, as well as Russia's and the USSR's record holder in the 100-kilometer walk. He has competed more than 150 times at various distances during his 50-year career. The Russian plans to finish his journey in the spring of 2017 by walking into St. Petersburg on the final leg of his 32,000 kilometre trip.

NEW YORK JUST BECAME THE LATEST U. S. STATE TO GIVE LAB ANIMALS A SECOND CHANCE

In another victory for animals in labs, New York has become the latest state to pass a law that will give dogs and cats used as test subjects the chance to be adopted. The Research Animal Retirement Act, which was sponsored by Sen. Philip M. Boyle and Assembly member Linda B. Rosenthal, will require publicly funded institutions of higher education, and any institution that works with them, to offer dogs and cats to rescues and shelters for adoption when they are no longer needed. Research animals live their lives being poked and prodded by humans, purposefully made sick to keep us well, and they are deprived of the affection and human kindness that many dogs enjoy. After this long and often tortuous service, they are usually euthanized, ending a miserable existence. 95 percent of the estimated 65,000 dogs being used in labs across the U.S.A. to test drugs, cosmetics and household products are beagles. Sadly for the many companion animals who are used as test subjects, it's typical to kill them once they're no longer being used. However in 2014, Minnesota made history when it became the first state to enact second chance legislation, and it has since been followed by California. Connecticut and Nevada. While animal advocates are continuing to fight for a world where no animals are experimented on, efforts like this will at least help ensure that those who can be saved will get the opportunity to experience an entirely different world.

FIRE FORCES MAN TO SELL GOOD LUCK PEARL, TURNS

OUT TO BE WORTH \$100 MILLION

A Philippines fisherman was feeling down on his luck when a house fire forced him to clear out his possessions and change locations until a good luck charm that he had kept under his bed changed his life. The unidentified man had fished out a giant pearl from the ocean when his anchor got stuck on the rock while sailing off the coast of Palawan Island in the Philippines ten years ago. When he was forced to sell it, he was told that the 77 pound gem that he had kept hidden in his rundown wooden home was the biggest pearl in the world valued at \$100M. The Pearl of Allah which is currently on display in the Ripley's Believe It or Not museum in New York City only weighs 14 pounds - five times smaller than the gem that the fisherman had found. The pearl measuring 1 foot wide and 2.2 feet long is going to be verified by the Gemologist Institute and other international authorities before hopefully going on display to attract more tourists in the little town.

OLYMPIC BUILDINGS TO BE DISASSEMBLED LIKE PUZZLES FOR PUBLIC PARKS AND SCHOOLS

The 2016 Rio Olympics have taken its toll on the city's struggling infrastructure, but the Olympic Committee is taking strides to ensure more efficient social and environmental responsibility by reusing the buildings typically abandoned after the games. Using a method known as "nomadic architecture", several of the Olympic structures can be assembled and disassembled like puzzles - so instead of rotting and taking up space in the city, they can be contributed towards public spaces and projects. Now that the games have ended, construction crews will start the deconstruction of the building for better use. The handball venue known as the Future Arena will be used to build four 500-student primary schools in the city's Jacarepaguá neighborhood while the \$38 million Aquatic Stadium where Michael Phelps dominated his races will go towards creating two community swimming centres. The International Broadcast Centre will become a high school dormitory for gifted athletes; the peninsula that featured several game venues will become host to public parks and private development; and the Tennis Centre and souvenir shop can simply be disassembled for better use. Not only are nomadic buildings better for the city's infrastructure, but they're also cheaper to build and more environmentally friendly since they don't require permanent design and materials.

MIND YOUR BIKE

With ever increasing fuel costs, more and more people are using bicycles for travel purposes. Safety is, of course, paramount and it is very important that bicycles are used in a safe manner. Wear appropriate safety gear at all times. Ensure that the bicycle is kept mechanically safe with good brakes, appropriate lights / reflectors, sound tyres etc. However, it is also important to consider security as bicycles are often an easy target for thieves. Figures for recent years, show that over 2000 bicycles per annum are taken without the authorised consent of the owner. This advice offered can help to reduce the risk of your bicycle being stolen. Basic Precautions When you first get your bicycle there are a number of matters you should attend to -

- Take at least one distinguishing coloured photograph of your bicycle.
- Keep a written record of the make, model and frame number of the bike and any unique features that the bike may have e.g. extra fittings, attachments, markings etc. Remember to also update as the bike gets older it is unlikely that it will still be in pristine condition and will more likely have dents and scratches.
- Security mark your bicycle in at least two separate places. Your security mark should be clearly visible and not capable of being easily removed or camouflaged. You may need, particularly with light-framed (e.g. aluminium alloy) bicycles, to have this done by a specialist or suitably qualified person. Consider also advertising the fact that the bike is security marked with an appropriate label/sticker etc.
- Consider insuring your bicycle, either through a separate policy or through your home contents insurance.
- The owners of very valuable bicycles should also consider having an electronic tracking device covertly inserted within the frame.

 SECURITY AT HOME: When at home, your bike should be kept in a secure location out of public view. Avoid leaving your bicycle unattended in your driveway, even for short periods. Garages and sheds are frequently used and these should be kept locked. It is also a good idea to secure your bike within the garage/shed by fixing or locking to a wall or other immovable object. If keeping outdoors, secure the bike to an immovable object do



not leave it lying around and un-locked. **SECURITY IN PUBLIC PLACES**

When out and about on your bike there are a number of precautions you should take.

- Always lock your bike, even if leaving it for a few brief moments.
- Lock your bike to an immovable object e.g. a metal railing or lamppost. Be aware, if using a lamppost, of the possibility of lifting the locked bicycle over the lamppost.
- Lock your frame and wheels if at all possible.
- Where bicycles parks are available, use them.
- Take all accessories and easily removable objects with you.

Consider replacing quick release levers with normal nuts and bolts or with special locking nuts and bolts.

 Do not leave / park your bike in isolated, dark or dimly lit places •

Try not to leave / lock your bike in the same place every day.

LOCKING YOUR BIKE: There are many different types of lock available that can be used for locking your bicycle. When choosing a lock you should consider how much your bicycle is worth, where you will leave it, how long it will be left unattended and the strength and weight of the lock etc. Most bicycles are locked using the following means - • D locks / U locks • Cable locks • Chain and padlocks, and • Click locks. D locks / U locks - are rigid steel locks in a D or U shape. They are generally heavy and strong, though the strength can vary and is normally

reflected in the price. There are limitations as to where these locks can be utilised e.g. they may not fit around many lampposts. Cable locks are flexible and can be used in many situations. Cables, of course, can vary significantly in both weight and strength. Invariably, cheap and thinner cables can easily be cut and so should not be used as a sole locking method. Chains and Padlocks - will also vary in both weight and strength. Heavier ones can be awkward to carry around and manoeuvre around frames and lampposts or railings. Good quality hardened chains and padlocks do offer good security. It is important, however, to keep the chain and lock off the ground/pavement or against walls when your bike is secured as the chain or lock can easily be broken with a sledgehammer or cold chisel if resting on these areas. Similarly, keep your chain wrapped as tightly as possible around the frame and the immovable object that you are locking it to - this can help to stop thieves from inserting 'jemmy' bars into spaces and gaps and forcing the chain or lock apart. For similar reasons, closed shackle padlocks are recommended in preference to open shackled padlocks. Click locks - are not very common. They are generally fixed to the frame over the rear wheel, under and close to the seat. They lock your wheel to the frame, thereby stopping somebody from simply riding away but offer no protection from somebody picking up the bike and walking away with it.

TAX RELIEF FOR THIRD-LEVEL FEES

You may be able to claim tax relief on tuition fees paid for approved:

- Undergraduate courses
- Postgraduate courses
- Information technology (IT) and foreign language courses.

Lists of courses and colleges approved for relief each year are published on the Revenue

You can claim tax relief as long as you have actually paid the fees, either on your own behalf or on behalf of another person.

You cannot claim tax relief on:

- Examination or administration fees
- Any part of the tuition fees that is met directly or indirectly by a grant, a scholarship or otherwise, e.g. where fees are reimbursed by an employer.

The maximum amount of fees (including the Student Contribution) that can qualify for tax relief is €7,000 per person per course.

Tax relief is given at the standard rate of 20%.

There is no limit on the number of individuals for whom you can claim.

If you pay fees in instalments and at least one instalment is paid in the tax year following the year your course started, then the relief for fees relating to that academic year may be granted either:

- in the tax year the course started, or
- the tax year in which the instalment was paid.

However, relief will only be granted in respect of amounts actually paid and subject to the maximum relief available in that academic year.

TRANSITION FROM PRIMARY TO SECONDARY WHAT TO EXPECT AND WHAT CAN HELP



By the time you reach your final years in primary school, you will be totally comfortable with your school with your school environment. By sixth class, you are one of the most senior people in your school and you are used to being

given responsibility and looked up to by the younger children. However the transition to secondary school means that you have to revert to being the most junior again and have to cope with a brand new environment. Change can be a daunting task for any one of us and can take a lot of adjusting to.

Easily the biggest change when entering secondary school is going from the experience of one teacher all day in one classroom to encountering eight or nine different teachers and subject/ classroom changes every forty minutes or so. A tip to help you cope with this is to write down the name of each new teacher beside the name of the subject and write your own version of

the class timetable. The second big change is the constant movement between classrooms throughout the day. Depending on your subject choices, you will be moving all around the school. Getting lost during the first few weeks will be

inevitable and a good tip is to always stay with at least one other person from the class. Another big adjustment is the number of specific subjects you will be covering. Students in First Year will cover up to sixteen different subjects; many of these will be new to you. Discuss all the subjects at home with your parents and let them know which ones you struggle with. Everyone will have their own favourites and will excel at certain subjects.

Your timetable will take a lot of getting used to and you may need help initially in the organisation of your schoolbag each day. Each student will also be provided with a locker and be sure to use your locker to avoid 'heavy bag syndrome'

Homework time is obviously going to increase. However not all subjects are covered every day and not all subjects involve homework. Learn how to successfully manage your time and don't rule out the possibility of supervised study. Schools reports may also be a new experience that comes with secondary school as regular reports come home from the school. Taking part in games and P.E. is a great way of getting to know more students in your school. Find activities which you and enjoy and try out new activities even if you haven't tried something before, or if you don't know what the activity entails.

If you find yourself struggling with any aspect of this change be sure to talk to someone: Your parents, a friend, a class teacher or school counsellor. This time will fly by, and before long your new school will feel like your second home!!

Know Your Rights:

PAYSLIPS

I started a new job 3 weeks ago. Although I have been paid each week, I don't know if I have paid any tax or PRSI. How do I find that out?

ANSWER

You should have been given a pay slip by your employer when you were paid. Your pay slip can be provided to you either in electronic format or in hard copy. Under the Payment of Wages Act 1991 all employees have the right to a pay slip which shows the gross pay and details of all deductions. A pay slip is essentially a written statement from the employer to the employee that outlines the total pay before tax and all details of any deductions from pay.

Certain deductions from pay are allowed under the Act. They include deductions that are required by law, for example, tax (PAYE), Universal Social Charge (USC) and social insurance (PRSI). Deductions provided for in your contract of employment, such as occupational pension contributions, are also allowed.

You should ask your employer for pay slips for the three weeks that you have already worked. If your employer fails to give you those pay slips and continues to pay you without giving you a pay slip, you may make a complaint to the Workplace Relations Commission (WRC). To do this, you make a complaint under the Payment of Wages Act using the online complaint form available on the WRC website, workplacerelations.ie.

The Workplace Relations Commission also provides information on your rights and entitlements under employment legislation. For further information about your employment rights on pay slips and deductions from wages, you can contact its Information and Customer Service at Lo-call 1890 80 80 90 or through the website, workplacerelations.ie.




