created sleepere d boundary that is full of colour. The playground at Knockreer is a wonderful amenity and in full swing".

"If one stands at the top of the hill off the Tralee road on the road to Aghadoe and

looks down on Killarney one sees a carpet of trees as a canopy covering the town, the only sign of human occupation is the cathedral. A lovely memory as one bids farewell".

Residents can claim with justification that they play their part in having Killarney at its 'pristine best'. 

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION LAUNCH AT LISSIVIGEEN NS

The launch of the new Catholic Preschool and Primary Education Curriculum for Ireland and Religious Education Programme Grow in Love took place in Lissivigeen school, Killarney last week with Bishop Ray Browne, school chaplain Fr. Kieran O'Brien, representatives of the Board of Management and the Parents Association, Principal Michael Mc Auliffe, teachers, pupils, ancillary staff and Primary Diocesan Advisors all in attendance.

Pupils at the school sang and there was a prayer service focusing on the Good Shepard bible story. Bishop Ray Browne launched the Curriculum and the Education Programme Grow in Love.

This is the first time in the history of primary religious education that teachers have been offered, in the form of a Curriculum, a structured outline of religious education as an academic discipline. Prior to this teachers taught religious education from a series of Religious Education programmes, including the Children of God series and most recently

religious education. It has been devised on the basis of the partnership between home, school and parish. It is dynamic, involving a spiralling and progressive life-long movement of faith and life, insight and love.

Speaking about the launch Bishop Ray Browne told the Killarney Outlook about Religious Education in schools.

"This Autumn we have two important new publications: the Curriculum for Religious Education in Primary Schools, and the first two books of GROW IN LOVE, (the new programme from Veritas to teach that Curriculum). We gather in one school in one parish, our thoughts and prayers are with all schools in all the parishes of the diocese of Kerry.

It is a time of great challenge for us all. Handing on the faith and teaching religion is a three-way partnership between, home, parish and school. In the home and in the parish community, children first become aware of God and his

great love for us, and the beautiful world God has created", he said.

"Parents teach children their first prayers. The school provides education in the faith. Thank God for the great work of our teachers. We owe them a debt of gratitude. While at school the children's faith continues to be nourished by their families and their parish. The parish is where all worship. The parish has responsibility for the children receiving the sacraments.

Today is a day for home, parish and school to recommit to working together in partnership. God is calling all of us to dedicate ourselves to strengthening the faith in our homes and communities. It is both our privilege and our responsibility to hand on our faith to our children. May the Blessed Virgin Mary intercede for us, she who taught Jesus his first prayers", he concluded.



KILLARNEY RALLY ACES TO COMPETE IN WORLD RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP IN WALES

Fermanagh's Jon Armstrong with Killarney co-driver Noel O'Sullivan made it three wins from three starts on Saturday's Bushwhacker Rally in Co Tyrone – but it wasn't enough to deny Rob Duggan from being crowned the Carryduff Forklift Road To Wales Champion. Aghadoe's Rob Duggan and his loyal co-driver Ger Conway from Faha, clinched the overall prize of an all-expenses paid drive on November's Wales Rally GB in a Citroën DS3 R3 prepared by David Greer Motorsport. Pre-Bushwhacker, Armstrong/ O'Sullivan knew that to stand any chance of winning the competition they had to make sure of victory on the loose surface meeting. In stark contrast, Duggan had to finish second to his arch rival – and that was exactly how it played out on the six stage Omagh Motor Club meeting.

The action got underway with Armstrong setting the fastest time on the opening test, five seconds ahead of the chasing Duggan. Next up was Omagh's Alan Smyth – the third driver who could also walk away with the prize drive. However, he too needed to win.

Peugeot 208 driver Armstrong maintained his charge on special stage two before the cars arrived at first service in Omagh, his advantage over Duggan mushrooming to 13 seconds, with Smyth a further two seconds in arrears. Following a quick spanner check of the cars and change of tyres, crews returned to the stages where it was 'as you were' for Armstrong who remained at the head of the field. Behind him, Smyth leapfrogged Duggan to claim second place, with some fearing the latter had hit trouble. But as Duggan emerged from the 6.57-mile Lough Bradan test the young Killarney man explained all: "We weren't pushing too hard – we were just trying to keep our noses clean in there."

Armstrong tightened the screw further, managing to put even more daylight between himself and Duggan. Meanwhile, Duggan drove with pace, precision and composure to tactically reclaim second place and with the finish line in sight the 22-year-old Killarney man realised that he was on course to get his hands on one of the biggest – and most lucrative – prizes on offer this season in British and Irish motorsport. Upon reaching the finish, Duggan was overjoyed; "It's an absolute honour to win the title and the prize that comes with it is amazing, so many people have helped make this happen. This was the first running of this championship and it's been a great success, it was so competitive and a great showcase for younger drivers. Wales Rally GB will be a fantastic experience for myself and Ger."

"The fact the championship came down to the final round shows just how close the

competition has been across the seven rounds." Paying tribute to Armstrong, Duggan added: "Unfortunately it didn't quite go Jon & Noel's way today but they have a great partnership and a very bright future ahead – that I'm sure." As the Northern Ireland Championship competition has reached its successful conclusion the focus now switches to November's Wales Rally GB – the closing round of the World Rally Championship. Duggan can now look forward to sharing the world stage with some of the sport's biggest names and best drivers, Ger and Rob will battle it out for supremacy over nineteen high-speed gravel stages through the forests of Wales, two of which will be run in complete darkness. Wales Rally GB takes place from the 12th to the 15th of November. Best of Luck and well done to Rob, Ger and Noel.







DIARMUID MAKES HISTORY

Diarmuid O'Carroll wrote himself, the Kerry Schoolboys League and his original club Killarney Athletic into the history books in July 2003 when he signed a professional contract with Glasgow Celtic. Diarmuid actually signed with the Scottish giants from Home Farm who he spent a season with that same year. The fascinating question of course is how does a player from a modest grass roots club in the Kingdom of gaelic football end up on the books of one of the best known soccer clubs in Europe. There is no doubt that Diarmuid had talent but talent alone won't take a young player to such a level. We hope in this article to recall the many contributing factors that elevated Diarmuid to such a profile that most youngsters could only dream about.

THE O'CARROLL FAMILY As with every achievement endeavour one needs the help and support of those most closest, they being your family. And there is doubt that the biggest reason why Diarmuid became a professional footballer was from the direct encouragement and support that he got at home. The family hailed from the Ross Rd. and father Joe was a talented gaelic footballer with the Crokes and an outstanding oarsman with the Workmen but never took a fancy to soccer.

Diarmuid's mother Eileen was a Ballyhar woman and I'm sure the family there still claim that it was from them that Diarmuid brought his rich soccer talent.

Older brother Anthony was probably the reason that Diarmuid attended his 1st club training session as Anthony was part of a very talented Athletic underage team in the mid '90s. That side included Kerry keeper Brendan Keely and Mickey Joe Grady who also had great potential to play at a higher level.

Edel who was the youngest of the family was in her own right an outstanding soccer player for the club.

Also to the credit of Eileen and Joe they both committed to managing club teams that Edel, Anthony and Diarmuid were part of. Diarmuid had many cousins of course that also played for the club with his uncle Diarmuid well known for his huge contribution as a young player in the '80s through to senior level thereafter and also managed Athletic schoolboy and senior teams.

DIARMUID WAS A YOUNG STAR It is said that the 'stars' of today don't always become the 'stars' of tomorrow but Diarmuid displayed an outstanding ability from when he first joined the club to the time he signed a professional contract.

As under 10s coach at the time I recall Diarmuid 1st day of training on a Saturday morning in Knockreer. "He was kitted out with an Arsenal jersey and playing in a 7 asides match with the older boys he performed an 'overhead bicycle kick' that only a few in the English league would even attempt at the time. Like all good players he could easily play above his age and very few could compete against him on the 1v1s. His talent was nurtured through the 7-aside in the 'Aras' and the FAI coaching camps organised

and run by the club. Diarmuid quickly made an impression in the Kerry Schoolboys league as a very promising young striker that his team mates loved to be on the same side of, while his opponents struggled to mark him.

'A DREAM TEAM' Diarmuid played at a time with the club when it was more prestigious to play schoolboy soccer with Athletic than to play gaelic football with the local clubs, although most players did play both codes. Diarmuid was part of an all-conquering side that captured 4 successive league titles and 3 successive cup titles. Pa Moynihan was first to manage a side that included Diarmuid in its' line-up as he played with two age groups every second week.

After a year of assisting Pa with the team, Ger O'Brien took up the role of managing the Diarmuid's age group team, and it would be fair to say that they became a 'dream team'. They included some outstanding underage players that had huge ambition and massive pride in being part of Killarney Athletic. Jamie Wren was the team captain throughout the period and he showed excellent leadership qualities from a very young age, Kieran O'Leary equally was a star in this team.

NATIONAL CUP AMBITION Although the side dominated the Kerry League at the time, there was a very good competitive standard at schoolboy level by a few of the more established clubs in the county and all set their sights each year on going as far as possible in the National Cup Competitions. Ger O'Brien with the able assistance of Pat Moynihan whose son Adam was a very skilful member of the side reached the quarter-final of the National Cup at under 12s level in 2000. Pitched against Cherry Orchard away Athletic were always going to find it difficult, particularly in the absence of Diarmuid who was out through injury, and the side bowed out of the competition to their Dublin opponents.

KENNEDY CUP The same Athletic team made an early shock exit from the National Cup the following year, but with great ambition for the side and not to be deterred the Wexford man was nominated by the Club for the Kennedy Cup manager's role in 2001. With many Athletic players in the line-up the side enjoyed a great run in the tournament narrowly losing out by the odd goal to a strong Cork outfit in the semi-final, but claimed the 3rd spot after the play-off match. This was also a great tournament for Diarmuid as he showed off his goal scoring ability by netting 5 goals in as many games. The Kennedy Cup was the stage for young players at the time to show-off their abilities to the many scouts that came to watch for any talent on display and the name of Diarmuid O'Carroll was on the list as one to watch-out for in the future.

ATHLETIC MAKE HISTORY IN NATIONAL CUP In 2002 the side made the history books as being the 1st Kerry team to reach the semi-final of the National Cup. The experience of the previous two years convinced Ger that the squad would have to strengthen up if they

were to overcome the big Dublin side who dominated the latter stages of the competition every year. Hence a number of excellent South Kerry players were signed into the squad that included; Liam Sheehan, Killian Young and Liam O'Sullivan.

Athletic were drawn away to Cherry Orchard in a repeat of the 2000 contest again for a semi-final slot, but this time the side had a fit Diarmuid O'Carroll and it was he who scored the decisive winner on a great day for the club and the league.

The team were drawn at home to Lourdes Celtic in the semi-final but the match was played on the Mastergeeha pitch as the Woodlawn ground was in poor condition from overuse and under repair for the annual 7-aside.


Athletic were outplayed by Lourdes on the day with a high tempo game that the Dublin side were more comfortable with from playing at the higher standards of the Dublin District League.

DIARMUID MOVED TO HOME FARM

Diarmuid was hot property and considered to be capable of playing at a higher level of the game. But it was also considered at the time for him to get an opportunity and make a breakthrough and be seen he would have to move to play in the Dublin league (DDSL), so Diarmuid signed with Home Farm for the 2002/03 season. Shortly afterwards he impressed with his new team in an invitational tournament in Glasgow and within a short time thereafter he and the family met with the then Celtic boss Martin O'Neill and was signed in March 2003 on a 4 year professional contract to the Scottish giants.

Diarmuid now plays in Belfast and is a Development Officer with the Northern Ireland Football Association but his roots are still in Ross Rd. and he hold Killarney Athletic as being his club from where he started out 20 years ago.

LOADING YOUR CAR

SAFELY

DRIVING SAFELY AND UTILISING VEHICLE SPACE Whether you're moving house, picking up materials from the hardware store or heading off on a long weekend it's good practice to take your time and organize yourself properly when loading up the car.

You should, adjust your tyre pressures if needed to suit the heavier load. But remember to adjust them back again after the trip.

Drive more cautiously as handling and performance will be affected by the load plus stopping distances will be increased.

Don't exceed your vehicle's Maximum Permitted Weight (MPW). This is the maximum permissible weight the vehicle is permitted to carry based on the capability of tyres, suspension, etc. It includes everything in (including its passengers) and on the car.

INSIDE THE CAR

MAKE SURE EVERYTHING'S SECURE:

Stuff sliding around or tipping over whenever you brake/turn will be both irritating and very distracting.

Empty boxes or plastic crates can be useful in the boot to stop things sliding around your boot. Keep the dash or shelf beneath the CD player and front floor space empty. Items will fall off and roll around could even get lodged under the brake pedal.

KEEP LARGER/HEAVIER STUFF LOW DOWN

Put the bigger stuff in first and then pack the smaller items around the larger items as this will help keep your centre of gravity lower to minimize the effect on handling.

Heavy items in the boot (cases of wine/beer, DIY materials) should be packed tightly against the back of the rear seat to reduce the risk of them bursting through in a crash. This affords better weight distribution and handling too.

CAN YOU STILL SEE?

Avoid packing items above the back seat line so that you see clearly out of the back window. Consider using a roof rack or roof box for lighter / bulkier stuff to leave more room inside.

Passengers come first

If you have to fold seats to get a large or awkward load in the car, simply come back for your passengers later on. This is especially important if the load prevents them from putting their seat belt on.

LEAVE PLENTY OF ROOM FOR CHILDREN

– stuff packed in tight around them is sure to

make for an unhappy journey.

Keep a bag handy for things you might need during the journey.

Plan for a puncture.

Think about how you will get to the spare tyre in an emergency when packing up your car.

ON THE ROOF Roof racks are a great way of carrying very large or awkward items but take care.

CHECK YOUR CAR'S MANUAL to make sure that the load, including the weight of the roof rack itself, doesn't exceed the maximum. This limit tends to be quite low.

Ensure that your load is securely attached and that it doesn't stick out creating a hazard.

Once you're underway, the airflow will be trying to lift the front of any long load so a secure fixing, holding the front of the load down is important.

Under heavy breaking the load will tend to slide forwards – secure fixings to the rear will help prevent this.

Fixings will work loose – stop, check and re-secure regularly.

Don't forget the extra height. Take care, for example, when entering covered car parks.

DISTRIBUTE WEIGHT SAFELY:

If you can, try to put bulky but lighter items on the roof and heavier items low down in the car. This will help keep the centre of gravity down and improve stability.

SAFETY TIPS FOR OLDER DRIVERS

For most, continuing to drive as they get older is important as it helps them stay active in their communities and access essential services. However, as we age there are particular driving risks to be aware of.

ISSUES COMMONLY EXPERIENCED BY OLDER DRIVERS INCLUDE:

- Changes in eyesight
- Health issues
- Medication side effects
- Uncertainty on busy roads and junctions
- Decline in physical strength
- What older drivers do well

While older drivers face more physical challenges than younger drivers, generally speaking they're a lower motor insurance risk compared to other age-groups, especially young drivers.

THIS IS BECAUSE OLDER DRIVERS USUALLY:

- Wear seat belts
- Don't drink and drive
- Don't speed
- Obey the rules of the road when they drive and demonstrate courtesy to other road users
- Drive less kilometers compared to younger drivers and motorists driving to and/or for work
- Because of their physical frailty, older drivers are more likely than other motorists to suffer injury in the event of a car crash. With this in mind, it's important, if you're an older driver to keep up your driver fitness levels.

KEEPING FIT TO DRIVE

- Make sure you have regular eye and hearing check-ups
- Avoid driving when you're tired
- Avoid driving on unfamiliar roads, at night, in bad weather and during rush hour traffic
- Share the driving when travelling longer distances
- Allow yourself longer driver reaction times
- Leave plenty of room between your car and the vehicle in front
- Indicate in plenty of time
- Drive cautiously
- Keep your car well maintained
- Never drive if instructed not to by a doctor
- Be aware of medication side effects and whether or not they'll impact your driving.
- If driving grandchildren around, fit approved child car restraints in your vehicle correctly
- Stay physically active as this'll help with actions such as turning the car's steering wheel and looking over your shoulder
- Know when it's time to consider hanging up your car keys. If you become confused while driving or you're concerned about your ability to drive safely it may be time to consider alternative forms of transport.

HOME RENOVATION INCENTIVE SCHEME (HRI)

HOW DOES THE HRI WORK?

The HRI scheme enables homeowners and landlords to claim tax relief on repairs, renovations or improvement work that is carried out on their houses, by tax-compliant contractors who are VAT registered. Qualifying expenditure (over €4,405 plus VAT) will be reduced for any grant or compensation payment received in respect of the works. The Incentive provides for tax relief by way of an Income Tax credit at 13.5%.

HOW TO QUALIFY?

- Your Local Property Tax must be up to date
- You must be paying Income Tax
- The Contractor must be VAT registered and tax compliant
- Qualifying work must be > €4,405 excluding VAT (max relief is work totaling €30,000)
- In the case of rental properties they must be occupied and the tenancy registered with the PRTB

HOW WILL YOU RECEIVE YOUR TAX CREDIT?

The HRI tax credit can be claimed directly through the online claim system (www.revenue.ie). The credit is payable over the two tax years following the year in which the work is carried out.

EXAMPLE

A Homeowner or Landlord paid a HRI qualifying electrician €6,000 (before VAT) for rewiring their property in 2015. The tax credit is €6,000 x 13.5% = €810. The tax credit received is €405 in 2016 and €405 in 2017.

Citizens Information

Know Your Rights: FREE LEGAL ADVICE

QUESTION

I need legal advice on separating from my husband but I can't afford to go to a solicitor. Where can I get help?

ANSWER

Free Legal Advice Centres (FLAC) is an organisation that promotes equal access to justice for all. You can access basic, confidential and free legal advice across all areas of law in a network of centres around Ireland. These are usually located in the local Citizens Information Centre. Clinics are by appointment only, and you will have to call in advance to book a place. Clinics take place in Kerry as follows;

Tralee 1st & 3rd Thursday of every month - 6pm - 7.30pm.
Killarney 2nd Monday of each month - 6pm 7pm.
Every second Friday - 10.30am-1.00pm.
Listowel. 2nd Thursday of each month - 5.30pm to 7.00pm.

When you visit a FLAC clinic you should bring along any relevant documentation or correspondence. You will meet a volunteer lawyer – either a solicitor or a barrister. You can ask a question on any area of law. However if you have already consulted a solicitor about the same matter, the volunteer adviser cannot offer guidance on that issue.

Your volunteer adviser will help you to establish whether there is a legal solution to your problem, explain what options are open to you and direct you to further assistance where appropriate.

Volunteer advisers cannot provide legal representation, which means they cannot take a case for you or go to court on your behalf. They also cannot refer you to a lawyer in private practice, so you should contact the Law Society for a list of solicitors in your area or for a particular area of law.

If you have a low income, you may be eligible for legal assistance from the State on a civil matter. The Legal Aid Board is responsible for the provision of civil legal aid and advice. Your FLAC adviser can help to establish this and you may then go to your local law centre to apply for civil legal aid. You will then have to undergo a means test and a merits test.

For criminal matters, there is a separate State criminal legal aid scheme, operated through the courts and administered by the Legal Aid Board.

THINKING ABOUT FEELINGS

When someone comes along to counselling and begins to talk about what is troubling them, one of the difficulties that sometimes emerges is their sense of 'having feelings that are 'bad' or 'wrong'. Perhaps they have been experiencing feelings of anger, or frustration, or maybe sadness, or regret. They may see such feelings as negative or self-pitying, and not compatible with being a good and kind and positive person. They wish these feelings would just go away. But, however much they try to wish them away, the feelings stubbornly persist. So then they experience shame and anxiety about having what they see as such negative feelings, and this shame and anxiety gets added to the mix, and just makes everything worse.

Counselling can offer us time and space in which we can talk about, and think about, all the different aspects of our emotional life, without using labels like positive or negative, right or wrong, good or bad. Instead, the counsellor provides a non-judgemental relationship, in which all aspects of our emotional experience can be heard and thought about. If we can slow things down a bit, begin to make sense of our feelings, and see them as an unsurprising response to aspects of our life experience, they are much less likely to cause us anxiety.

Gradually, we become more able to manage our feelings and get on with our lives, instead of our feelings managing us, perhaps by making us anxious or irritable or unconfident or withdrawn. We learn to accept that, if we face difficult and challenging situations in the future then, naturally, we are bound to experience difficult and challenging feelings within ourselves. And when we have to bear particularly difficult circumstances or events in our lives, there is no shame in seeking support to work through our feelings about them.

A counsellor is able to sustain an open and accepting attitude to another person's feelings, without anxiety getting in the way, because, through their own training and personal development, they accept that having emotional responses to life's events is a part of what it is to be human. Perhaps then, the more accepting and tolerant we can be towards our own emotional life, the more kindly and accepting we are able to be towards the feelings of others.

Health Matters....

OSTEOARTHRITIS

Osteoarthritis (OA) is the most common form of arthritis in Ireland. OA mainly affects the joint cartilage and the bone tissue next to the cartilage (shock absorbers in joints).

OA can be considered in simple terms as generalised wear and tear of cartilage and also wear to the underlying bone tissue. It is not fully understood why some peoples joints are more susceptible to wear than others but generally speaking age, weight, genetics, occupation and history of previous injuries may play a role. Women are also at higher risk than men at developing OA.

Any joint can be affected by OA but the hips, knees, finger joints, thumb joints and lower spine are most commonly affected. The shoulders, elbows, wrists, ankles, and toe joints are less commonly affected. In many cases, just a few joints develop symptoms with one or two becoming the most troublesome. In some people, OA develops in many joints.

Pain and stiffness of joints are the usual complaints from patients suffering from OA. Occasionally joints may become slightly swollen and can appear larger than other joints over time. Symptoms vary in severity from person to person from mild discomfort to severely debilitating.

Your doctor can often diagnose osteoarthritis based on your age, your typical symptoms and examination of your affected joints. Tests such as X-rays or blood tests are usually not needed. Quite a number of people have X-ray changes that indicate some degree of OA but have no, or only very mild, symptoms. The opposite can also be true. That is, you may have quite severe symptoms but with only minor changes seen on the X-ray.

PROGNOSIS

The progression and severity of OA is variable from person to person. In many people OA is mild, does not become worse, and does not make you any more disabled than expected for your age. However, in some people, the severity of OA and the disability it causes is out of proportion to your age.

TREATMENT

There is no cure for OA but treatment is aimed to reduce symptoms and improve overall mobility and function of joints. Exercise and weight reduction has been shown to help OA. Closed chain (non impact) exercise as well as swimming is excellent for this. There is some evidence to suggest that orthotics may be helpful in suffers of OA of the knee. Mobility issues can be addressed by the help of walking aids and physiotherapy.

Two incredible things you might not know about these delicious sources of potassium and vitamins: First, bananas are technically herbs and belong to the same "botanical family" as mint or basil. Secondly, in 1950 almost all of the banana species in the world were wiped out by the Panama Disease. Today, most of the bananas sold and eaten around

the whole world are direct descendants of the same Asian breeds that survived the disease.

5. The most hated vegetable in the world is one of the best.

Brussels sprouts reign supreme as the least enjoyable vegetable for children, and also some adults. However, Brussels sprouts are among the most nutritious veggies you can ever find. They have no fat, no cholesterol, hardly any calories and plenty of vitamins and minerals.

RIDDING MOZAMBIQUE OF 171,000 LAND MINES:

Playing outside, walking to school or traveling to visit family is no longer a dangerous endeavour for people living in Mozambique, where deadly land mines that once marred thousands of acres of land have finally been eradicated.

After 22 years of work, de-mining organisation Halo Trust declared the Southern African country free of land mines.

Approximately 10,900 Mozambicans have been killed or injured by land mines, according to the International Campaign to Ban Landmines. The underground explosives are leftovers from wars dating back to the 1960s. Formerly a Portuguese colony, Mozambique fought for its independence in the 1970s but was plagued by a civil war until 1992 that left more than a million people dead—and more than half of the country a hazard to health.

With financial assistance from a host of Western countries, workers from Halo Trust arrived on the scene in 1993. Using massive armoured tanks and manual detectors, the British-based charity cleared 171,000 land mines in 1,100 minefields, detonating the last known mine last month.

Land mines have hindered economic development in Mozambique. Of its 26 million residents, more than half live below the poverty line, according to the latest figures from the World Bank.

The final region cleared of mines houses a railway line that carries goods from Mozambique into Zimbabwe. The track and infrastructure had been neglected since the 1990s, with workers afraid to get too close. Now, the railway line is getting some much-needed upgrades and will soon be able to transport heavier loads into other countries. Without fear of triggering mines, residents can start cultivating land that was once off-limits, planting crops and allowing livestock to graze. As Mozambique celebrates this major accomplishment, workers at Halo Trust want the world to know their work isn't done. As many as 60 other countries—including Afghanistan, Angola, and Cambodia—still have active land mines that kill or injure 4,000 people annually.

DID YOU KNOW?

While spiders in your home should in no way be classed as your first line of defence against

insect transmitted diseases, they can help by virtue of keeping away pests that might bite humans and pass on certain infections. As spiders also feed on insects like fleas, they could be useful for your canine or feline friends if a stray flea ever did make it past your flea control methods.

HOMELESS MAN GIVES EVERYTHING HE HAS TO 7 STRAY DOGS:

A man with nothing has given everything he has to keep seven stray dogs alive.

This man's name is Kamala Lochan Baliarsingh. He's lived in Odisha, India, for the past three decades without any home or source of income. "I just clean the platform by collecting plastic bottles," he says. He uses the money he gets from recycling these bottles to feed seven of the town's stray dogs, who all visit him after midnight, according to the film.

DOG TRAINING TIPS:

*Ensure that "come" works every time by rewarding your dog with a puppy party every time they obey this all-important command. Puppy parties should involve anything your dog finds rewarding—a nice belly rub, a yummy treat, their favourite toy, etc. They most certainly won't want to come when called if they're punished once they get to you.

Never punish your dog for coming when called. Even if your dog is coming back after an hour long escapade through the neighbourhood, they still get a puppy party. Remember to always issue a recall command with a pleasant tone and a smile on your face; no dog wants to come running to an angry tone and a scowling face.

Never call your dog for something he does not like (bath, nail trim, car ride, go in the crate, etc.)

*Do not allow your dog to jump on guests, period. Even if you have a friend that insists "Oh it's okay! I'm a dog person!" don't allow your dog to jump up and greet them. Your pup doesn't know the difference between a twenty-year-old who is a "dog person" and seventy-five-year-old Grandpa who just had a hip replacement.

If you have a dog that jumps, warn your guest before they come over. Ask your guests to turn away from your dog and ignore them until your pup is sitting quietly. Teach your dog that they get lovin' when all four paws are on the floor, and not before.

*Rewarding your dog for going potty outside is an integral first step to house training. A key part of house training your dog, however, is preventing indoor accidents from happening in the first place. Yelling at your dog, rubbing their nose in their mess, or giving them a spanking doesn't teach your dog to potty outside—it teaches him to be fearful of you and to have those accidents out of sight. (And come on, you paid good money for those bath

rugs.)

While house-training, Rex should always be within sight and constantly monitored. Kennel your dog or puppy while you can't monitor them, keep them on a leash, or if they are small, have them in your lap while you are on the couch or at the computer. Don't wait for your dog or puppy to do the potty dance or assume the squat position—set your dog up for success and offer your pup plenty of opportunities to go potty in the right place.

WHALES AND DOLPHINS WIN BATTLE OVER THE USE OF HARMFUL SONAR:

A federal judge has approved a legal settlement that limits the use of sonar and other underwater explosives that can inadvertently harm whales and dolphins.

For marine mammals, the ping of sonar or the muffled blast of underwater detonations can be deafening and even deadly.

The settlement ends litigation brought by environmental groups against the Navy over its use of sonar in important feeding grounds for whales off the Southern California coast near Santa Catalina, San Clemente, and San Nicolas islands, as well as waters around Hawaii, including Maui, Molokai, and the Big Island.

It's the first time the Navy has acknowledged that it is possible to protect marine mammal habitat without hindering its training regimen—abandoning its previous stance that putting limitations on sonar testing and exercises wasn't feasible.

A 2013 Navy report estimated that over the subsequent five years (2014 through 2019), sonar testing, underwater detonations, missile launches, anti-submarine warfare, and ship strikes could kill up to 155 whales, dolphins, seals, and sea lions and permanently injure more than 2,000 animals. The Navy also estimated that 9 million incidents of marine mammal disturbances could alter feeding and breeding activities in the 120,000-square-mile Southern California testing zone.

MORE PEOPLE HAVE DIED THIS YEAR FROM SELFIES THAN SHARKS:

The media hype over shark attacks reached insane levels this year. This led conservationists like Richard Branson, Shark Attack Survivors for Shark Conservation and The Pew Charitable Trusts to support efforts to restore and conserve the world's shark populations—warning against turning an uptick in attacks into "an excuse to kill more sharks." After all, humans kill far more sharks every year—at least 100 million more—than sharks kill people. Earlier this month, a park in Colorado had to close because too many people were getting dangerously close to bears to take selfies. And this was no isolated incident. Wildlife authorities in the Lake Tahoe area, Yellowstone National Park and other recreation areas have repeatedly cautioned visitors against getting too close to bears, bison and other large animals. The latest death by selfie happened when a 66-year-old Japanese tourist died, and his travel companion was injured, after falling down stairs while attempting to take a selfie at the Taj Mahal. The man's death raises the selfie toll this year to 12. To put that in perspective, in 2015 there have so far been eight deaths caused by shark attacks. Other deaths have been caused by distracted photo-takers falling off cliffs, crashing their cars, being hit by trains, and even shooting themselves while posing with guns. It's not clear if the number of daredevil selfies is increasing, but more and more tourists are making headlines because of their dangerous attempts at a memorable photo. Australia has issues with dare devils taking selfies too. They can't get people to stop taking pictures on a rock that is on the verge of crumbling into the ocean, and it's been such a problem in Russia that the government launched a campaign to warn people about the dangers of selfies.


