

You can still help the Irish Cancer Society at the offices of Killarney Outlook where all merchandise has been reduced to half price.


JOHN-JOE'S **SHOWBAND SHOW**

More than 150 people came together at The Porter House, Killarney on Tuesday, March 31st to launch Nathan's Walk/ Darkness Into Light event with Electric Ireland. Taking place on Saturday, May 9th, Darkness Into Light is a unique, early morning experience which begins in darkness at 4.15am as thousands of people walk or run a 5km route while dawn is breaking.

JOHN O'LEARY LAUNCHES POLITICAL MEMOIRS



JOHN O'LEARY.

For thirty-one years without breach. John O'Leary represented Kerry South as a Fianna Fáil TD Dáil Éireann, making him the longestever serving Dáil deputy for that constituency. He was

Minister of State at the Department of the Environment from 1977 to 1979.

Successfully contesting ten elections, and heading the poll on eight of those occasions, O'Leary holds the record for the highest percentage of the first preference vote ever received by any candidate in Kerry South.

From the mid-1960s to the mid-1990s, he observed at close hand the most turbulent episodes in Irish politics from the Arms Crisis to phone-tapping, from the leadership heaves in his party to the rift with Des O'Malley and Fianna Fáil's transition to coalition governments with the Progressive Democrats and Labour.

Serving under four different party leaders – Jack Lynch, Charles Haughey, Albert Reynolds and Bertie Ahern – O'Leary was an eye-witness to the infighting and bitter feuds within Fianna Fáil as well as their many electoral triumphs.

Now an elder figure in the party, O'Leary casts a cold eye over the decline of Fianna Fáil in recent years drawing on his extensive experience of delivering for the party time and again.

Published by Irish Political Memoirs, On the Doorsteps: Memoirs of a long-serving TD' A valuable addition to the catalogue of political memoirs in Ireland, O'Leary's chronicle sheds new light on the key national political events over three decades as well as colourful insights into the iconic election battles in the cauldron of Kerry politics.

The book will be launched by the former Taoiseach, Brian Cowen on Friday, 17 April 2015 at the Gleneagle Hotel, Killarney at 7.30pm.

KILLARNEY VET ISSUES URGENT WARNING

A Killarney Vet has issued a warning to dog owners in the area to be extra vigilant when out walking with their dogs.

Danny O'Sullivan who runs the All-Care

Veterinary Clinic on the Park Road has come across three cases of suspected Strychnine poisoning in the past two weeks even though the deadly poison has been banned in Ireland

for the past 25 years. One of the dogs has died with one recovering slowly and in two of the cases the dogs had been walking in the Killarney National Park.

It is possible that a bird dropped a poisoned carcass and that could be the cause of the poisoning. The onset of strychnine poisoning is fast. After eating the poison, which Danny thinks may be scented to attract dogs, clinical signs can appear within 30 minutes. Early signs, which can often be overlooked consist of apprehension, nervousness, tenseness and stiffness. Severe tetanic seizures may appear spontaneously or may be initiated by touch, sound or bright lights. If you suspect your dog has been poisoned – treat it as an emergency and get treatment as quickly as possible.

"Dogs should be kept on a lead at all times while out walking in public areas and if your dog is the type to forage then make sure he is wearing a muzzle which will prevent him from ingesting anything suspicious" said Danny who has been a vet in Kerry for over 30 years has been practicing in Killarney since 1997.

If you notice any of the symptoms above take instant action and report any unexpected deaths in pets to your local vet.



TRALEE'S Bon Secours Hospital has Ireland's highest hand hygiene levels for the second time in a row according to the latest Health Protection Surveillance Centre Survey of 54 Irish hospitals.

The survey is carried out by the HSE infectious disease watchdog every six months.

The Bon Secours Hospital Tralee is 95% compliant which is 10% above the HSE target.

BRASSIL GETS THE FIANNA **FAIL NOMINATION**

Cllr John Brassil collected the Fianna Fail golden ticket at last Sundays evening Dail convention in Tralee when 80% of the Fianna Fail membership cast their votes at two separate polling stations in Killarney and Tralee before a tense count saw Brassil come from behind to defeat Cllr Tom McEllistrim.

Of the seven declared candidates a week previous, only four took to the line as Cllr Niall Kelleher and Senator Mark Daly pulled out because South Kerry had less than one third of the total voting power and Cllr Norma Moriarty followed suit prior to the convention. Milltown's Cllr Michael O'Shea was affectively the only South Kerry based candidate and despite a good showing, he brought up the field at the first count behind poll topper Tom McEllistrim just 10 ahead of Brassil with Tralee's Norma Foley on 223. Foley closed the gap somewhat from O'Shea's transfers and it was ultimately Foleys transfers that decided Brassils

victory with more almost 60% of her votes heading to Brassil.

Brassil, the current Mayor of Kerry will now hope to win back a Fianna Fail seat in the new Kerry 5 seat constituency, which sees Kerry lose a TD with the amalgamation of Kerry South and Kerry North and West Limerick.

Afterwards Brassil said he would welcome and work with a second candidate but would not be drawn on any particular choice and said it would ultimately be the issues that would decide the election and he intends to campaign on them and as soon as possible

In the new five-seat constituency, Fianna Fáil is being strongly tipped to take a seat based on the likely quota and their recent opinion poll ratings, which give them 18% of the popular vote.











GRIFFIN "A WELCOME RELIEF TO KERRY FAMILIES OF **CHILDREN WITH DO WN** SYNDROME"



SELF-ACCEPTANCE II

Last week we highlighted our tendency to be self-critical and extremely hard on ourselves. Self-acceptance on the other hand means accepting ourselves just as we are whilst acknowledging that there is always room for improvement. This can be very difficult however and requires a change in how we view and what we tell ourselves. By developing a 'selfaccepting' voice we focus on validating ourselves rather than paying heed to the automatic negative thoughts. Instead of listening to the thought that says 'I'm not good enough' or 'I'll never get it right' we validate ourselves (much as a parent might a child) saying something like 'I know your feeling useless right now. It's Ok. This is challenging and difficult and frustrating. But you are capable. How about taking a break and coming back to it later" Despite the feelings of guilt, self-criticism and negative put downs, we can start by telling ourselves, that we've done the best we could do.

We need to look at what is it within ourselves that we don't accept - and begin to bring more compassion and understanding to those aspects of ourselves. Perhaps there is a part of us that we are rejecting based on the internal programming (and not the actual reality) that we received as a child. Sometimes our lack of self-acceptance is due to our unwillingness to feel or experience uncomfortable emotions. At other times unrealistic expectations can lead to lack of self-acceptance. When we are unable to forgive ourselves for our 'humanness' then it is very difficult to develop selfacceptance.

Practicing mindfulness can be a great way to begin to become aware of the negative, self-judging thoughts we continuously tell ourselves. It becomes like watching a movie - where you are having these thoughts but these thoughts are not who you are.

Self-acceptance isn't about fixing anything in ourselves. Instead it is affirming who we are (warts and all) at this point in time. It's not that we ignore our faults or weaknesses we just view them as not relevant to our overall sense of acceptability. We accept ourselves today, just as we are, regardless of our shortcomings. Whilst we can commit to make changes in the future that will enrich our lives - it's about being Okay right now. The only thing we need to change at this moment in time is the way we view ourselves. FUNGAL NAIL INFECTIONS

WHO GETS FUNGAL NAIL INFECTIONS?

Between 3 and 8 out of 100 people in Ireland will have a fungal nail infection at some stage of their lives. Toenails are more commonly affected than fingernails. It is more common in people aged over 55, and in younger people who share communal showers, such as swimmers or athletes.

HOW DO YOU GET A FUNGAL NAIL INFECTION?

- Spread from a fungal skin infection. For example, athlete's foot is a fungal skin infection of the toes. This may spread to the toenails if the skin infection is not treated early.
- Fingernail infection may occur after a toenail infection has become established. The fungus may spread to a finger if you scratch your itchy toes and toenail.
- Fingernail infections are also more likely to occur if you wash your hands frequently, or have them in water a lot. For example, if you are a cook or a cleaner. Constant washing may damage the protective skin at the base of the nail. This may allow fungi
- A nail that has recently been damaged is also more likely to become infected.
- You have an increased risk of developing a fungal nail infection if you have various other conditions. For example: diabetes, psoriasis, poor circulation, a poor immune system
- Smoking also increases the risk of developing a nail infection.
- In some cases there is no apparent reason. Fungus germs (fungi) are common and an infection can occur 'out of the blue'.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF A FUNGAL NAIL

Often the infection is just in one nail, but several may be affected. At first the infection is usually painless. The nail may look thickened and discoloured (often a greeny-yellow colour). Commonly, this is all that occurs and it often causes no other symptoms. However, it can look unsightly.





Know Your Rights: JOBSEEKER'S ALLOWANCE TRANSITIONAL ARRANGEMENT APRIL 2015

OUESTION

I've been getting a One-Parent Family Payment but I will no longer qualify when my youngest child turns seven. What is the Jobseeker's Allowance transitional arrangement and how do I qualify?

ANSWER

If you no longer qualify for a One-Parent Family Payment because your youngest child is over the age limit, you may be eligible for the Jobseeker's Allowance transitional arrangement (often called JST). This is a social welfare payment that aims to support you into the workforce while also acknowledging that you are parenting alone and caring for young children aged between 7 and 13. JST allows you to work part-time and still receive a partial payment (depending on your earnings).

The rules that apply to Jobseeker's Allowance (JA) and JST are very similar. The means test is similar and the maximum weekly rate of payment is the same. The main differences between JA and JST are that on JST:

- You do not have to be available for and genuinely seeking fulltime work. This is to allow you to meet your caring responsibilities. There are childcare supports available if you do find work.
- You must be capable of work but you do not have to be fully unemployed for 4 out of 7 days. This means that you could work part-time for 5 days and still receive a payment (subject to the means test). For example, you could work mornings only while your children are in school. Income from work is assessed with a €20 earnings disregard per day of employment (up to a maximum of €60 per week). Any earnings above that are assessed at 60%.
- You cannot cohabit with another person while you are getting JST. You must continue to parent alone.

When you start getting JST you will be scheduled to attend an activation meeting with a case officer. The purpose of this meeting is to identify and access supports (such as education, training and employment schemes) that will prepare you for full-time employment. If you do not participate in this process, you may be paid a reduced rate of JST (a penalty rate) or you may be disqualified from your JST payment.

If you were getting a Fuel Allowance with your OFP you can keep this when you go onto JST.



TRAFFIC COLLISIONS LEADING CAUSE OF CHILD MORTALITY IN **IRELAND** OVER 36% OF ALL CHILD DEATHS HAPPEN ON ROADS

Road traffic collisions account for 36.7% of all child deaths, and road deaths are the leading cause of child mortality in Ireland, the RSA's Annual International Road Safety Conference heard yesterday, Thursday 2 April 2015. The conference took place at Dublin Castle and focused on children and road safety.

The child safety theme was particularly relevant as it's mid-term break for schools and given the fact that the number of children killed on our roads almost tripled last year. 14 children under the age of 15 lost their lives in 2014. Seven were passengers, seven were pedestrians.

While child fatalities have decreased by 89% and serious injuries by 75%, from 1997 to 2012, a total of 262 children were killed and 1,115 seriously injured in that period*. The

greatest danger a child faces each day is when using the road: when travelling as passengers in a car, walking, or cycling. Just under half of all children who die do so while walking and almost 2 out of 5 children killed are passengers. Garda reports into collisions indicate that 1 in 10 children were not wearing a seatbelt or using a child restraint.

ROWING TO RIO

The Monika Dukaraska Blog. The story of a **Professional Athlete**



Tough is the word that best describes the week I had. After trials I had a day off which flew by very quickly. I travelled to

Killorglin to see my family and although I'm only 90minutes away from home the volume of training makes it quite difficult to get home on a regular basis. Getting up at 5:30am to get to training in Cork for 7:30am does not support good recovery hence the trips home are limited.

After the trials the focus shifts back to long mileage and technical work. Myself and Leonora have made some significant improvements in paddling. We are becoming more and more comfortable in the boat while our timing and positioning has become more synchronised. It has resulted in quicker paddling speeds which will hopefully translate into faster boat speed at a race pace. The second part of the week I had spent indoors. The weather took its toll and I had to cover the mileage on the rowing machine and the bike. I have over 60km on the ergometer under my belt. We also had a number of side by side racing pieces scheduled for Wednesday and Saturday. Unfortunately Saturday's pieces had to be done on the rowing machines. We were in fact side by side but the nature of the racing was different. We had to do 3 by 2,000m pieces based on the PB (personal best) split for our 5,000m test. The aim was to get a lactate hit and improve on each 2,000m by at least 1 second per 500m. Although it was a tough session, I have achieved all of the objectives, reaching 192 bpm heart rate. Having completed the entire training I feel a bit tired but I'm very satisfied with the work I have done.

The combination of aerobic and anaerobic training will prepare us well for the Piediluco Regatta on the 10th to 12th of April. We are departing on the 8th of April and I will race in the Women Pair event. There is a possibility of 4 races over the weekend, two heats and two finals. Hook forward to seeing the entry list.

During the week we also spent some time on mental training, ensuring that our pre-race preparation enables us to perform to our full potential. Some tips: make sure to evaluate your performance whether it's good or bad (learn from it), write things down (it's hard to remember everything) and focus on things within your control. Delivering a good rowing performance starts way before you line up on a start line

WHERE ARE THEY NOW

This week I caught up with former underage star PJ O'Leary when I travelled across the border to Bandon in County Cork. PJ who hails from Fairhill in Killarney is the eldest son of Eileen and the late Patrick and has three brothers, Timmo and Donal who are both still very active with the Legion club and John who is involved with neighbouring Spa. PJ is gone from Killarney since 1982 but only moved to Bandon in 2003 where he is married to local lady Sarah, having lived in Cork for the previous twenty one years. It was down at Bandon Gaa grounds that I met up with PJ and it was great to catch up as we were classmates many years ago, both in the "Mon" and the "Sem" and our chat brought back a lot of memories for both of us. As we talked, we also kept an eye on his son Edward who was training with the U12 hurling team and although, a different code, you could see that the apple hasnt fallen far from the tree. He also has two daughters Alice 17 and Rachel 15. I asked PJ if he gets home to Killarney very often and he admits that not as often as he would like but he does say that the town is almost unrecognisable from the days when we both grew up. I asked him what, if anything that he misses about Killarney and he says that he actually misses everything about it except the rain and the Crokes but before any of you Black n Amberites get up in arms, there was good reason for his response as PJ says that his local rivals broke his heart on an almost annual basis at juvenile level, losing many finals to them, having only ever in fact once been on a victorious side in this local derby and that time it was only in a "B" final. But despite all the dissapointments, PJ really enjoyed his days playing football and he says that he

was privileged to play alongside the likes of Diarmuid O'Donoghue, Kevin Murphy, Richard O'Brien and Tomas Lyne and also against Pa O' Donoghue, Connie Murphy and Spa star Mike McAulliffe. PJ also played a small bit of soccer at the time but this was still somewhat frowned upon at the time but it was at football that PJ excelled and he got his due reward when he was selected on the Kerry minors in 1982 when they won the Munster final beating Cork and went on to contest the All Ireland final only to lose out to Dublin that September. This period was a busy time in PJs life, as in or around this time, along with playing football at both club and county level, he started his college life in UCC studying law and after graduating, he attended Blackhall Place in Dublin which set him up for the career that he is still in today as a partner with PJ O'Driscoll &sons solicitors. During most of these years, PJ tells me that he didn't play much football as he was just too busy with his studies but he took up playing again in his late twenties when he joined Nemo Rangers but never really played at a top level anymore which I could sense he slightly regretted but nevertheless he enjoyed it as a form of exercise. Nowadays to stay in shape PJ plays a bit of what he refers to as "Fr Ted" style 5-a-side soccer. Our conversation drifted back to his early playing days and he remembers that it was Mickey Culloty who roped him into the club initially and always held him in high esteem along with Pat Healy who he recalls had the nickname "Platini" at the time, and he says that Mike Murphy and Padraig Brosnan were inspirational, especially when it came to the big games. As we chatted, inevitably some funny stories were recalled and one in particular was high on his list.....

"My favourite was a game in Glenbeigh in a howling gale with only one ball between the teams. At half time, after playing against

the wind (which was blowing out to sea) we were about 20 points down. Our spirits were raised when Weeshie came up with a master plan!" Lads, if it looks like we won't beat them with 10 minutes to go, I'll give the signal and I want ve to kick that ball into the sea to get the game abandoned"! We never got the signal but despite having a virtual hurricane behind us, we lost the game! At least the club didn't lose the ball..." Of the present set up at Legion , PJ says that he gets regular updates from his brothers and is delighted that the club name is now well recognised in his new hometown. and just then with Edward emerging from the dressing room with his hurley under his arm ,PJ finishes up with "The present and future of the club looks better than our unsuccessful run in the team. Still, the disappointments help you to deal with the tests in life that await us all and we learned the skills of a great game. I still quote Weeshie's instructions at training one night when he roared out the orders to the tired troops for the next drill" right lads, I'm going to pair ye off in threes for this one" - Priceless, pure passion, commitment and love of club, where else would you get it?"

Next week, after a two week sabbatical at local level, we take to the skies again and head back to the new capital of Ireland... Perth, in western Australia.

MCMANUS POWERS MONAGHAN PAST WASTEFUL KERRY

Kerry O'Shea reports from Austin Stack Park

Kerry's hopes of a semi-final spot in this year's Allianz NFL and their prospects of staying in Division one of the Allianz FL are hanging in the balance as Monaghan produced a famous win in the penultimate round of this year's competition in Tralee on Sunday.

Kerry needed the win to guarantee a semi-final spot but they now face a potentially tricky tie against old foes Tyrone next Sunday knowing that a win in Omagh will guarantee their topflight status.

One has to ask the question whether it was wise for the Kingdom, who won the toss, to play with the advantage of the gale-force wind in the first. The Kingdom posted 11 wides in the first half, and four in the second, while Monaghan were more economical up front from limited possession.

Monaghan with Ciaran McManus in outstanding form and posing endless difficulties for the Kerry defence, were full value for their four-point win. Monaghan manager Malachy O'Rourke got his tactics spot on as the Northerners engaged in a first half of damage limitation having lost the toss, and kept their opponent's interval lead to a very manageable three points, 0-7 to 0-4. The Northerners also played the blanket defence, which frustrated their opponents.

With Kieran Donaghy well shackled by the close attention of the Wylie brothers Drew and Ryle, Monaghan were dependent on the classic smash-



and-grab counter-attacking tactic for the bulk of their scores and it worked a treat for them.

The Kingdom got off to a good start and were 0-5 to 0-0 clear after 17 minutes. Monaghan opened their account when Ciaran McManus pointed a minute later. The Farney County added further scores from McManus and goalkeeper Rory Beggan who kicked a superb long-rage pointed free from almost 60 yards out in reply to a Paul Geaney pointed free as Kerry held a three-point advantage.

Ciaran McManus, with his third point of the game, reduced the margin to two as the Kingdom lost Alan Fitzgerald to a black card, but Jonathan Lyne gave the home side a three-point cushion going into half-time when he curled over a diagonal point to make it 0-7 to 0-4.

Monaghan turned over in confident style and backed by their large travelling support 'The Farney Army', soon clicked into top gear.

Points from McManus, Malone and Duffy had the

visitors level within six minutes of the resumption but Johnny Buckley put Kerry back in front again when he pointed from play a minute later following a Barry John Keane crossfield pass.

Then disaster struck for the Kingdom when a sweeping Monaghan move resulted in Owen Duffy finding the net to put the visitors 1-7 to 0-8 clear.

Monaghan were now rampant and further points from Finlay, McManus and outstanding midfielder Hughes pushed them five clear with nine minutes to go.

David Moran and Barry John Keane from frees added points before the finish as Monaghan fans in the 6,133 crowd celebrated their first win on Kingdom soil since February 1987 in style at the finish.

rommys Farming

The "Class of 1984" was a movie that I remember very little about. It was also the name chosen to grace the cover of our yearbook in Agricultural college. The movie came out in 1982, our yearbook obviously was the real deal. There was one other seismic event in farming life in 1984, milk quotas were introduced in the then EEC. I may have missed the discussion through lack of interest but I have absolutely no recollection of quotas being mentioned during my entire year in Pallaskenry. But then I have no recollection of milk quotas being mentioned anywhere else either before they became a reality. Some years later when working on a farm in the Netherlands, the farmer told me he had milked every animal he could get his hands on in 1984.


We were new to the community, we were not aware of the significance of this new regime perhaps, we were, quite possibly, not aware of it at all. Continental farmers were more clued in it seems. For some the pain was intense. plans had been prepared, money was loaned and borrowed on the intention of increased production, it was not just farmers who had failed to do their homework.

The dairy class that left Ag college in the year of 1984, have spent their entire working life governed by milk quotas. We have bought it, leased it, overproduced it and underproduced it, we have planned our farming operation around it for over thirty years and this week finally it is no more. After 31 years it is difficult to imagine a Europe without a supply quota. There is, in fact a niggling suspicion that some other fetter will be put in its place. When Europe introduced the quota, the food trading world was a very different place, the intervention guaranteed EEC milk price was not far off our current price but world prices were less than half those achieved at home. Highly profitable in Ireland, it was a no brainer to increase output as quickly as possible and we were not alone in Europe. Phrases like milk lake and butter mountain were everyday parlance.

The surplus European production was exported onto that depressed world market with direct aid thereby distorting the world price even farther.

It could not go on. The decision choices were lower the support structure or limit production. Europe went with the latter, leaving an Irish industry just finding its feet, after fifty years of stagnation, hamstrung. Our partners in Europe were at a different stage in development. Better prepared and more amenable to the concept. Ostensibly we were told it was a social policy, to protect small producers. Today we have approximately 20% of the dairy farmers we had in 1984.

Much has changed in 30 years, a massive increase in wealth in developing countries, an increased demand for better quality protein and a convergence of world milk prices has changed the landscape completely. In 2013/14 world milk prices matched EU prices, a situation first reached almost a decade ago now. Quotas were now a clear liability to European farmers and an unnecessary piece of bureaucracy. The wheels of government grind slowly and unaccommodating to the very end. With a record superlevy fine in the offing many farmers will not forget the milk quota regime for some time to come.







KELLY WELCOMES THE ABOLITION OF MILK QUOTAS

Seán Kelly MEP welcomed the longawaited abolition of milk quotas 30 years after their introduction.

Ireland is the tenth largest dairy exporter in the world and with a predicted 50 percent growth in exports expected over the next five years due to milk quota abolition, Ireland will continue to grow its economy.

"Global dairy demand is rising and the EU has already increased its export volume by 45 percent over the last five years. Now, with the abolition of the milk quota system and the implementation of market measures to address price volatility, Irish farmers will be supported in increasing production and that will have a

positive effect on job creation and growth in rural Ireland," said Mr Kelly, speaking from Brussels today.

"Our agricultural exports are reliant on strong trade ties with other countries. Russia is still one of our biggest trading partners, but with the EU Russian dairy ban in place since last year affecting agricultural trade, our currently negotiated agreements with South Asian countries and other regions will enable Ireland and the EU to retain their influential export status."

However, the Fine Gael MEP cautioned EU leaders against an overly liberal trade deal with New Zealand: "As the only Irish member on the International Trade Committee in the European Parliament, and a member of the ASEAN Delegation (Association of South East Asian Nations) I am delighted that the EU's trade agreement with Vietnam should be concluded by this summer. Vietnam holds great potential for agricultural exports.

"However, New Zealand, a top agricultural and dairy exporter to the Asian market, has been pushing for a trade agreement with the EU. While I welcome the EU's continued commitment to trade in South Asia, any deal with New Zealand must not be at the expense of the Irish dairy sector," Mr Kelly added, Leader of the Fine Gael delegation in the European Parliament.

FARMERS CONCERNS OVER PUBLICATION OF PAYMENTS


IFA President Eddie Downey said farmers have genuine concerns around the release of confidential information on payments that could eopardise security.

He said the publication of payments is an unnecessary distraction, "We have never made a secret of the EU funds that support agricultural production in this country. The overall level of support has always been available."

"We have continually stressed the importance of CAP payments in allowing agriculture and food production to make an important contribution to our economy. We fail to see how the individual breakdown will add anything to what is generally known about the farming sector."

"The EU Commission has a role

to play in communicating to the public the benefits of CAP", Downey concluded.

CHOCOLATE - A GIFT FROM THE GODS

Sunday is Easter Sunday and no doubt thousands of chocolate Easter Eggs will be consumed around the Country but did you know that once upon a time it was known as a gift from the gods?

In today's society, chocolate is a commonly available food product, and comes in many forms, including blocks, paste and powder. Several centuries ago, however, chocolate was considered a luxury item, and came only in one form - as a drink.

Chocolate is produced from the cacao tree, which is native to Central and South America. Based on chemical analysis, the earliest known consumption of cacao may be dated back to between 1400 and 1100 B.C. At that early stage, it was not the cacao seeds, but the pulp of the fruit that was used. The 'bitter water' was consumed by nobles and warriors, in a ritual with purpose and solemnity. It was believed the plant was of the gods, associated by the Aztecs with Quetzalcoatl.

It was only later on that the cacao seeds were used. Cacao seeds were fermented, roasted, and ground into a paste. The cacao paste would then be mixed with water or wine, ground maize and a variety of flavourings including chili pepper, vanilla, all spice and honey. The mixture would then go through a process called frothing, in which it was poured back and forth from pot to cup until a deep foam was formed on the top.

When the Spanish conquistadors came into contact with the Aztec civilization, they also came across the cacao drink and brought it to Europe, the drink was transformed by an ingredient not available to the Aztecs sugar. This made the taste of the drink more appealing, and became popular among the Spanish nobility, it was much later that chocolate became popular in other European courts. In France, for instance, the marriage of Anne of Austria to Louis XIII in 1615 popularised the drink among the French aristocracy, as the

queen was a chocolate enthusiast.

Eventually, the craze for chocolate also hit London and several 'chocolate houses' sprang up, where the elites of society could gather.

Not for everyday consumption by the less well off, cacao was of great value, symbolically and economically. Pods were used in trade to the point where they were sometimes counterfeited by filling the plant pods with

It was during the Industrial Revolution of the 18th and 19th centuries that a change in the way people consumed chocolate occurred. Firstly, the invention of hydraulic and steam chocolate mills in France in the 18th century allowed chocolate to be processed faster and at a lower cost. Then, in 1828, the cocoa press was invented by Coenraad Johannes Van Houton. This machine removed the fat from the cacao seeds to produce cocoa powder, the basis for most chocolate products today. These technological advances also resulted in a higher demand for raw cocoa in Europe. Soon, cocoa trees were planted as a cash crop in British, French and Dutch colonies near the equator, where the natural conditions were suitable for these trees.

HOW TO PROTECT **PETS** FROM **BECOMING** BAIT **ANIMALS**

For instance Australia's racing industry has been using live cats, pigs, rabbits and possums as bait to train its greyhounds to run, the undercover footage, shot by Animal Liberation Queensland and Animals Australia, shows the bait animals tied onto an apparatus that swings them around the track, screaming and squealing. The animals are used to invoke "bloodlust" in the dogs, who often maul them to death. The footage provoked the RSPCA to raid several racetracks and suspend 22 trainers for live baiting.

- Offering any pets Free To A Good Home is always a risk, as studies by animal charities have shown that these animals can often fall in to the wrong hands and suffer terribly as a
- It is better for animals to be re-homed through reputable rescues that do thorough checks of adopters. If this is not possible, then to minimise the risk, do extensive checks into the people who want to take the pets, if in any doubt visit a Vet and put the pet to sleep, heart-breaking in the short term but the animal will not be tortured in the future. People are often not what they seem and will put up a very respectable front and put on a good act. Even if the person who initially takes your pet has good intentions, the simple fact is that, once a pet is no longer in your care, you have absolutely no control over who it gets passed on to, or what fate it may meet.
- It is best to keep all animals in the house. When they are in the garden, supervise them at all times, as they could be taken in a blink of an eye.

- If you must keep animals in your garden, use security measures to make sure they are as safe there as possible. Make sure your garden is secure so nobody can reach or climb in to it, or enter it, without you letting them. Also make sure there is a lock on the gate.
- Cats are more difficult to protect, unless they are house cats, as they like to roam freely.
- There have been many cases of rabbits and other pets being taken from hutches in gardens, even when they have been padlocked. The only really secure option is to keep animals inside.
- Never leave your dog outside a shop and do not let your dog out of your sight if outside.
- Make sure your pets are micro chipped and wear a tag.

CARPENTER **FIRED FOR** RESCUING RACOON

THE MOST POPULOUS CITY ON EARTH IS ALSO THE **SAFEST**

If you want to walk around the streets in the middle of the night, Tokyo is a good bet, according to the latest Safe Cities list, which ranks the top 50 cities in the world.

Tokyo topped the list, and its neighbour, Osaka, came in third. Southeast Asian citystate Singapore was second and European hubs Stockholm and Amsterdam rounded out the top five.

Tokyo is at the centre of one of the world's



largest metro areas. The city proper is home to 13 million-plus people, but the sprawling metropolis has more than 35 million inhabitants. Despite all these people living together in relatively close proximity, the crime rates are extremely low. The biggest problem in the Land of the Rising Sun is bicycle theft: 6.6 riders per 100,000 found themselves wheel-less after their bikes were stolen.

The top 5 cities all share economic wealth and social services. Everyone in Singapore has access to affordable public housing, Stockholm has an extensive welfare system that leaves hardly anyone homeless or in dire poverty for example.

A TIP FOR KEEPING YOUR PETS HAPPY & HEALTHY

Many of us are guilty of simply refilling the water bowl when it gets close to empty, but the water that sits around will form a slimy residue that hosts dangerous bacteria and fungus that can begin to grow. Some pet guardians may not even notice that their pet will start shying away from a dirty water bowl and become mildly dehydrated or, worse yet, seek water from unsafe areas indoors or out. And what about the food dish? No, licking the bowl 'clean' isn't a possibility. Please be kind. Food and water bowls should be cleaned daily but do not use harsh cleaners that can leave behind residue and odour.

If you have bowls that are already beyond salvaging, why not start fresh with a new set of bowls and choose from one of these easy daily washing techniques.

- Wash and thoroughly rinse with dish detergent and a clean abrasive sponge to release all organic material from the sides of
- Try scrubbing with a mix of equal parts baking soda, salt and warm water.

HOW TO IMPROVE ENERGY EFFICIENCY WHILE COOKING

 Minimize the area that needs to be heated. In other words, don't heat up the entire oven

to cook a single piece of fish; Take advantage of having the oven on. Cook double amounts so that you have leftovers; it takes less energy to reheat than to cook. For instance If you are roasting fish or baking pasta, then I roast vegetables alongside.

 Don't put a small pot on a large element, a 6" pan on an 8" electric burner wastes more than 40% of the heat produced by the burner. However, choose the smallest appropriate pan to do the job since it requires less energy to

If possible, invest in high-quality cookware with sturdy bottoms. A pan with a warped bottom can use 50% more energy to boil water. An electric element is significantly less efficient if the pan does not have good contact with the element.

Glass and ceramic are more efficient in the oven than metal. Copper-bottomed pots also heat up faster.

- Keeping a stove and microwave clean can help with efficiency. When burners in the oven or cooker top fill up with food waste, this absorbs heat and reduces burner efficiency. If they're shiny, they reflect the heat back up to the pan. Microwaves work best when there are no food particles inside.
- Make sure previously frozen foods have defrosted fully and that meat has come to room temperature before cooking. This helps with even cooking and speeds up the process. If roasting vegetables, cut smaller to cook faster.
- Cut the heat early, especially if you use an electric cooker and oven. The residual heat will continue to cook the food. An oven will keep baking if you resist the urge to open the


On Tuesday night last, Bishop Ray Browne celebrated a Chrism Mass at St. Mary's Cathedral.
