## SIGNIFICANT IMPROVEMENTS PLANNED FOR FLESK BRIDGE

Flesk Bridge on Muckross Road is set to undergo a facelift in the coming months.

Significant improvements to the bridge will take place as part of a  $\in 2m$  investment in the upgrading of twelve bridges around the county.

Works to the bridge parapets, railing and road surface will be carried out and improvements will also be carried out to the footpath and cycle lane across the bridge. The works, which commence on Monday next and run until mid-December, will require a onelane stop-go traffic system at the bridge to allow the works to be completed as quickly as possible. Motorists are asked to drive with care on the Muckross Road while this enhancement is carried out.

The work on this important tourist route is being carried out during the off-peak season to minimise disruption.

The investment, with the support of Transport Infrastructure Ireland, represents an important enhancement to this wellknown bridge across the River Flesk and is indicative of Kerry County Council's commitment to upgrading infrastructure in the Killarney area.

## THE JUGGLE OF FAMILY AND BUSINESS LIFE STILL A STRUGGLE FOR FEMALE BUSINESS LEADERS

Research findings based on a sample of 150 business women conducted by the Local Enterprise Offices in Cork and Kerry has found that childcare is among the biggest barriers for women starting their own business. It found that more than 70% of female business owners who are mothers find that childcare costs are a major challenge. The research was carried out ahead of a special event for aspiring female entrepreneurs and female-led businesses across the region in Inchydoney for National Women's Enterprise Day on Thursday 12th October

More than half feel that setting up a business as a woman is more challenging than it is for a man with the main reason being that family duties still fall on the woman to manage on a day to day basis. Lack of confidence was also found to be one of the biggest issues facing women wanting to start or grow their small businesses. This is

evident from findings on the LEOs' Women in Business programmes which are run throughout the year. "Open doors to new markets" is the theme of the event on October 12th and will focus on how established and aspiring businesswomen can tap in to Ireland's rapidly growing digital economy which represents €12.3 billion (6%)of Ireland's GDP. With Irish consumers spending €850,000 per hour online, 24 hours a day, attendees will learn from some of Ireland's top female business leaders about building a better business while also learning to deal with and overcome everyday stresses.

Christine Heffernan, Business Adviser with the Local Enterprise Office Cork North and West said, "Childcare has always been a limiting factor for self employed women and is still something we come across every day with our female clients. Not only is the cost of childcare a major issue but maternity leave for self employed women, particularly sole traders, is a bugbear as they must decide whether to return to work early or take the State benefit available to them but essentially close their business for those 26 weeks, which isn't viable for many.

Traditionally it has been the mother to give up work and stay at home, and although this has shifted somewhat in recent years, the juggle of work and home still falls – in the main - on the woman. While we can't change this, we can champion and support female business owners to empower young women and show them that although it might be tough, it can still be done.

She continued, "We will welcome almost 200 women to our National Women's Enterprise Day event in Inchydoney on October 12th where they will learn the importance of branding, retail and online sales and leave feeling inspired and driven which is what



the day is all about."

Among the speakers will be Alina Uí Chaollaí, Marketing Director, Largo Foods, Fiona Gratzer, MD Unislim, Lorraine Higgins, Head of Public Affairs and Communications with Retail Excellence, Sharon Corcoran, Director of Services, Economic Development, Enterprise and Tourism, Cork County Council and Attracta Burke, bestselling author of "The Formula - How to be your very best". A panel discussion with Cork and Kerry SME owners will also be a highlight.

## DERRY SERVES UP A TREAT FOR THE RNLI LIFEBOAT CREW

Last year, RNLI lifeboat crews across Ireland launched 1,136 times rescuing 1,649 people.

Kerry lifeboat stations launched 38 times and rescued 47 people, spending a total of 393 hours at sea on service. The charity relies on donations from the public to continue its lifesaving service.

To raise funds to this worthy cause, Derry Clarke, owner and chef at the famous L'Ecrivain restaurant and star of RTE's Lords and Ladles, turned Valentia Lifeboat Station in Kerry into one of the country's top dining sports today (Friday 29 September), when he treated the volunteer lifeboat crew to a delicious Fish Supper to promote the charity's latest fundraising initiative.

Derry is supporting the RNLI's Fish Supper campaign which is due to take place between the 13th and 15th of October and is calling on people across Ireland to sink their teeth into a delicious fish dish to raise vital funds for the lifesaving charity.

The menu for the lifeboat crew was made up of a number of mouth-watering seafood dishes including cured salmon with

cucumber, apple and dill, seafood chowder, Flaggy Shore oysters and Lambay Island scallops with cauliflower and raisins. Local hotel and restaurant 'The Royal' also got involved when local chef Ryan Walsh added a surprise extra course of fish gratin.

Speaking while cooking Al Fresco at Valentia Lifeboat Station, Derry said: 'It is an absolute pleasure to cook for the Valentia lifeboat crew. I love cooking for the RNLI, and seafood dishes are always a crowd pleaser. I do an annual BBQ for the RNLI with my wife Sallyanne on Sherkin Island and at Courtown in Wexford so it's about time I got out to the West coast. The only issue is that you never know if you have enough food as lifeboat crew are always hungry.'

'I urge anyone who hasn't tried cooking fish before to give it a try, and impress your friends and family while raising vital funds for the RNLI's brave lifeboat crews. We are lucky enough to live on an island with a beautiful array of fish on our doorstep. It's a wonderful idea for a fundraiser.'

The occasion was captured by photographer Jack Lowe, who is travelling around the UK and Ireland photographing RNLI lifeboat volunteers through a Victorian process that captures the stunning images on glass. Jack's visit to Valentia RNLI marked his 100th lifeboat station.

Valentia RNLI Coxswain, Richard Quigley said: 'Our pagers can go off at any time and many a meal has been interupted for a lifeboat launch. Holding a Fish Supper is a great way for people to support us. They can sign up for a free fundraising pack and then enjoy hosting a fun evening with friends and family.' 

## CLLR. SHEAHAN WELCOMES FUNDING UNDER TOWN AND VILLAGE RENEWAL SCHEME

The Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr John Sheahan, has welcomed the announcement of over €868,000 in funding for Kerry under the Town and Village Renewal Scheme. The funding from the Department of Rural and Community Development will allow for the revitalisation of many towns and villages across the county.

Rathmore is to benefit to the tune of €100,000 for enhancement works while Farranfore is another area which will receive €40,000 for Public Realm Streetscape.

"This is great news for Kerry and is a very welcome investment in community, enterprise, infrastructure and social facilities in the county. In all, 13 projects in towns and villages have been approved for investment which will greatly enhance those areas," said Cllr Sheahan.

Chief Executive of Kerry County Council, Moira Murrell, said that through the Community Support Fund of 2017, the council has been in position to leverage and secure

This funding will help to drive the revitalisation of many of our towns and villages across the county," she said.



#### START YOUR OWN BUSINESS RELIEF

The Start Your Own Business scheme provides for relief from Income Tax for long term unemployed individuals who start a new business. The scheme will provide an exemption from Income Tax up to a maximum of €40,000 per annum for a period of two years to individuals who set up a qualifying business; having been unemployed for a period of at least 12 months prior to starting the business. It runs from 25 October 2013 to 31 December 2018.

#### Who qualifies for this relief?

You may qualify for this relief if:

(a) you have been unemployed for twelve months or more, and
 (b) during that period you were in receipt of any of the following:

- b) during that period you were in receipt of any crediting contributions
- crediting contributions
   jobseeker's allowance
- jobseeker's benefit
- the one-parent family payment
- partial capacity payment

Periods of time spent on certain training courses and schemes will be treated as part of a period of unemployment. If you were entitled to jobseeker's allowance or jobseeker's benefit immediately before starting on the training course or scheme, then any allowance paid for attending such a course will be treated as if it were jobseeker's allowance or jobseeker's benefit.

Examples of training courses and schemes would include FÁS training courses, Community Employment Schemes, Job Initiative and Back to Education Schemes.

## **FOCUS ON ROSES**

Planting roses this time of year will give you colour for years to come.

Container grown roses can be planted any time of the year but the autumn and the springtime are the best.

Bare rooted roses can be planted from late Autumn until around mid March.

Bare rooted roses are plants are plants that are dug up straight from the open ground when they are dormant and best planted or heeled into some earth as soon as possible.

Make sure when you are planted bare rooted roses to heel them in well with the heel of your foot to prevent their roots from being moved in the wind.

Roses are hungry plants so make sure when you're planting to add plenty of manure or a rose fertilizer.

pretenders from the West. 



### THIS MAN SINGLE HANDEDLY SAVED THE WORLD FROM A NUCLEAR WAR

Stanislav Yevgrafovich Petrov was born on the 7th of September 1939 and became a Lieutenant Colonel of the Soviet Air Defence Forces, he was the officer on duty at the Serpukhov-15 bunker near Moscow on September 26th 1983, when the Cold War was at a peak. Just three and a half weeks prior, the Soviets had shot down a Boeing 747, killing all 269 people on board. It was Lt. Col. Petrov's responsibility to observe the satellite early warning network and notify his superiors of any impending nuclear missile attack against the USSR. In the event of such an attack, the Soviet Union's strategy was to launch an immediate all-out nuclear counterattack against the United States, as the doctrine of Mutual Assured Destruction required.

At at 00:40 hrs, the bunker's computers indicated that an American missile was heading toward the Soviet Union. Lt. Col. Petrov reasoned that a computer error had occurred, since the United States was not likely to launch just one missile if it were attacking the Soviet Union it would launch many simultaneously. Also, the satellite system's reliability had in the past been questioned, so he dismissed the warning as a false alarm, concluding that no missile had actually been launched by the Americans.

However, a short time later, the computers indicated that a second missile had been launched, followed by a third, a fourth and a fifth. Mr. Petrov still felt that the computer system was wrong, but there was no other source of information with which to confirm his suspicions. In 22 minutes he would know for sure. The Soviet Union's land radar was not capable of detecting missiles beyond the horizon, so by the time land radar could positively identify the threat, it would be too late.

If Mr. Petrov's was disregarding a real attack, then the Soviet Union would be devastated by nuclear weapons without any warning or chance to retaliate, and he would have failed at his duty. On the other hand, if he were to report a non-existent attack, his superiors might launch an equally catastrophic assault against their enemies. In either case, millions of people would die. Understanding that if he were wrong, nuclear missiles would soon be raining down on the Soviet Union, Mr. Petrov decided to trust his intuition and declare the system's indications a false alarm.

Despite having prevented potential nuclear disaster, by refusing to acknowledge the computer system's warnings Lt. Col. Petrov had disobeyed his orders and defied military protocol. He was subjected to intense



questioning about his actions. He was no longer considered a reliable officer and his once-promising military career came to an end. Mr. Petrov retired from the Military and lived his later years in relative poverty, spending his retirement in the town of Fryazino. On May 21, 2004, the San Francisco-based Association of World Citizens gave Colonel Petrov its World Citizen Award along with a trophy and \$1000 in recognition of the part he played in averting catastrophe.

Lt. Colonel Petrov died on the 19th of May 2017 at the age of 77.

### A SHORT HISTORY OF HARVEST FESTIVALS

Harvest is from the Anglo-Saxon word hærfest, "Autumn" and refers to the season for reaping and gathering grain and other grown products. In ancient traditions Harvest Festivals were traditionally held on or near the Sunday of the Harvest Moon which is the full Moon nearest the start of the autumnal equinox. Most years, the Harvest Moon is in the month of September, but around every three years, it occurs in October, as it did in 2017 (it began yesterday October 5th).

In Ireland the pre-Christian traditional harvest festival was known as Lughnasadh, named after the god of craftsmanship, Lugh. Of pagan origin it marked the start of the harvest season. The Celts celebrated the harvest season on August 1st and it was called Lammas, meaning 'loaf Mass'. Farmers made loaves of bread from the fresh wheat crop. These were given to the local church as the Communion bread during a special service thanking God for the harvest. The modern tradition of celebrating Harvest Festival in churches is believed to have begun in 1843, when the Reverend Robert Hawker invited parishioners to a special thanksgiving service at his church at Morwenstow in Cornwall. Victorian hymns such as "We plough the fields and scatter", "Come ye thankful people, come" and "All things bright and beautiful" helped popularise his idea of harvest festival and spread the annual custom of decorating churches with home-grown produce for the Harvest Festival service.

One of the most well-known harvest celebrations is Thanksgiving in the US. Dating back to the early 17th century, it was originally only celebrated in New England by the pilgrims as a thanks for their first harvest. Beginning in 1846, Sarah Josepha Hale wrote to five American presidents over 17 years, to advocate Thanksgiving as a national holiday in the American South. President Lincoln established a national holiday in 1863.

### NASHVILLE MUSICIAN BEFRIENDS THE WOMAN WHOSE NEGLIGENT DRIVING LEFT HIM PARALYSED

Freya Markowski drove through a red light on April 27, 2016, and struck David Francisco on his bicycle. Ms. Markowski, who was off her bipolar meds for the first time in years, says she heard a million manic voices in her head while driving that day. She sped through a red light at 40mph.

David Francisco went to the emergency room with a spinal cord injury that left him unable to move his legs.

"I felt like I'd killed someone," she said. "I remember being in a black hole."

A few months later, Ms. Markowski also went to the emergency room for a heroin overdose. As she recovered, she sent a long apology text to Mr. Francisco.

"Flashbacks of your body covered in blood haunted me," she wrote. "I would've traded places with you in a heartbeat... I lost my soul after the accident. I want you to know not a day goes by without me crying for your pain." "I forgave her at the beginning," he said.

The two formed a friendship based on that forgiveness, and each has been instrumental in the other's recovery since the accident.

"I figured she probably also was going through a lot," he said. "I'd been shown so much support, I wanted to show her some support, it just didn't make sense for me to be angry, as long as it was an accident. I was never angry at her. I was angry at my legs."

On the day of her court date, Ms. Markowski charges were dismissed. "I thought I was going to jail that day. Instead this angel of a man shows up with open arms. David's dad gave me a really big hug," she said. "How is that possible? The dad of the guy who I paralysed?"

After writing and texting back and forth, the two decided to meet in person at a coffee shop in South Nashville., Ms. Markowski ran to him, and the two embraced for nearly a minute without speaking.

"It was a miraculous moment for me, I had been beating herself up since the accident Ms. Markowski said "I forgave myself the moment David held me in his arms."

### NUTMEG THE WORLDS OLDEST CAT HAS DIED AT THE AGE OF 32

Nutmeg, believed to be the world's oldest cat, died in England on September 14th at the age of 32 his owners said.

Liz and Ian Finlay cared for Nutmeg for 27 years after taking him in as a stray when he was 5 years old. The couple said their other cat Spice, who died in the early 2000s, constantly brought Nutmeg into their home before they decided to adopt him.

"We both feel like our hearts have been ripped out. He was our little boy. 'He went downhill so quickly it was unbelievable," Ian Finlay said. "He suffered from a bad tooth and he had rasping breath. We knew that when we went to the vets that he wouldn't be coming home".

A spokesperson for Westway Veterinary Group in Newcastle upon Tyne said he suffered heart failure after coming to us with breathing difficulties.

Mr. Finlay attributed Nutmeg's long life to healthy portions of treats such as tuna, cream and hot roast chicken.

The oldest cat ever officially recorded was Creme Puff owned by Jake Perry of Austin, Texas, who died in 2005 aged 38 years and 3 days.

A Melbourne cat named Teddy could now be the oldest cat in the world at the age of 26. His owner Fran English adopted him when his elderly owner was no longer able to care for him. Teddy likes to bask in the sun, eat rosemary and have a shower every day. His human says "He used to try and get in the shower with me so I decided to let him get in one day and it just took off from there" now it's part of his daily routine, including a dry off and using a ramp to hop into bed.

Teddy's vet Phanuel Mponda says "He's very friendly and outgoing - he always wants to be amongst everything that's going on."

Teddy's birth was officially recorded with the Australian Animal Registry and his human has officially applied to the Guinness World Records.



### POLICE SEEK TOILET PAPER BANDITS

Authorities in Arkansas have turned to Facebook to identify a pair of toilet paper bandits caught on camera taking rolls of tissue from a public toilet in a park.

The Cullman County Sheriff's Office posted a video showing the two men stopping their car and walking into the men's room at Sportsman Lake Park.

The video then shows the men exiting the restroom with large rolls of toilet tissue as well as taking the entire toilet paper dispensers which each cost \$100 to replace.

### ANTS ARE LIKE HUMANS AFTER ALL

Entomologist Daniel Charbonneau from the University of Arizona made a recent discovery that, despite how busy and industrious ant colonies seem to be, 40 percent of the workforce spend most of their days doing nothing.

Analysing the video recordings revealed that a colony breaks down into four main demographics, inactive, lazy ants; so-called walkers that spend most of their time just wandering around the nest; foragers that take care of outside tasks such as foraging and building protective walls from tiny rocks; and nurses in charge of rearing the brood.

In a series of experiments where active and inactive ants were alternately removed from their colonies, the researchers think they've determined the purpose that the laziest ants serve: they're a reserve labour force that only gets called upon when they're absolutely needed. Finally, to see what would happen if the colony lost sizable amounts of inactive members, Mr. Charbonneau did a separate experiment in which his team removed the least active 20%, they found that those ants, unlike their top-performing peers, were not replaced.




