

A TRUE GENTLEMAN GOLFER...

GARY PLAYER WELCOMED TO KILLARNEY

Killarney Golf & Fishing welcomed a very special visitor this week.

Gary Player, who is considered to be one of the greatest players of all time visited the Killarney Course on Monday where played the Irish Open Course, Killeen but made a special request to play the 18th on O'Mahony's Point, the world famous Par 3 Hole.

Mr. Player previously visited Killarney Golf & Fishing Club 68 years as a young golf professional. On Monday, Lady Captain Kathleen Brosnan was pictured with a Rhino Statue which was a gift from Gary's own club in Johannesburg which is called Killarney Golf Club.

The statue was gifted to Killarney Golf & Fishing Club in July 1952.

During his career, Player won nine major championships on the regular tour and nine major championships on the Champions

Tour. At the age of 29, Player won the 1965 U.S. Open and became the only non-American to win all four majors in a career, known as the career Grand Slam.

Nicknamed the Black Knight, Mr. Fitness, and the International Ambassador of Golf, he is also a renowned golf course architect with more than 400 design projects on five continents throughout the world. Player has also authored or co-written 36 books on golf instruction, design, philosophy, motivation and fitness.

"He loved playing the course and greeted members and visitors who came to watch him golf and we were delighted to host him", Mary MacMonagle from the club told Killarney Outlook.

FUNDRAISER LAUNCHED TO HELP JERRY ON THE ROAD TO RECOVERY

The family of a Barraduff man who has suffered catastrophic injuries following a fall last month has launched an idonate fundraiser to help his family.

Jerry O'Leary was taken to Kerry General Hospital following the accident and from there he was airlifted to the Mater hospital in Dublin where he underwent major surgery. He was critical & spent 2 weeks in ICU attached to a large ventilator and having one to one 24 hour nursing care.

Jerry's sister Kate O'Leary Crowley and along with brother Teddy O'Leary, sisters Hannah O'Connell, Sheila Buckley and his mum Bridie and families have launched the fundraiser to help Jerry, his wife Bina, sons Gearoid and Mikey on Jerry's journey to recovery.

"Obviously Jerry's income is now hugely affected & ongoing medical expenses, rehabilitation & all adjustments needed to support him will prove very difficult financially", Kate said.

Jerry is now communicating with help of a voice box and getting very intense work done by medical team of physio, Speech and language, O.T., Orthopaedic, dietician, psychologist etc.



& on a broad range of medication to help with very debilitating pain.

Jerry is going to be in the Spinal Unit for the foreseeable future while still receiving one to one care until he can be eventually be weaned

off the ventilator and adjusts to food/fluids consumption going forward. The care he is receiving is mind blowing and all the medical team including the amazing nurses are just second to none.

The plan is that hopefully he will be transferred to The National Rehabilitation Hospital in Dun Laoighre to help him make adjustments to his future daily life going forward.

Over a week ago his local community in Barraduff and Glenflesk along with huge numbers from afar came together with Fr. Jim Linehan and Fr. Gérard O'Leary for a beautiful healing Mass followed by a 24hr vigil for Jerry and family.

"The support, concern & love of Jerry shown by hundreds was amazing & so comforting to know how highly regarded Jerry is held. So on behalf of us all we would greatly appreciate any help at all we can give to support our brother, his wife & children through this very difficult time", Kate said.

Killarney at its best

FOLLOWING AN INCREDIBLE WEEK OF FESTIVITIES

After a spectacular week of festivities, Killarney became the undisputed fun capital of the country over the past week with the town playing host to the annual Ring of Kerry charity cycle and the star spangled 4th of July festival.

Thousands of people flocked to the town for the dual festivities with 4,500 people participating in the cycle on Saturday while the streets were packed four deep for the gala Independence Day parade on Tuesday night.

Even the weather played its part for the 175km cycle with no rain recorded although the wind in coastal areas and on Moll's Gap proved quite testing for the charity champions that took to the saddle.

There was a real party atmosphere in the town before, during and after the cycle with a huge demand for the open air screening of the Kerry v Tyrone championship encounter in the Beech Road car park close to the finish line on Mission Road.

Hotels, restaurants and pubs reported a rip-roaring trade for the cycle which has again raised tens of thousands of euro for benefiting charities.

When the bicycles were put back in the rack, Killarney turned its attention to the 4th of July celebrations and what a gala celebration



it turned out to be.

Music and other quality entertainment acts filled the town from early afternoon when the flag-raising ceremony, at which recently elected Mayor of Killarney Cllr Brendan Cronin officiated, took place at the town hall but the undoubted highlight was the bumper parade which wound its way through the packed streets on Tuesday night.

Incredibly elaborate floats, marching bands, cheerleaders, Disney characters and colourful flag-bearers took to the streets and there was a special guest appearance by American footballers from Georgia Tech, including star kicker David Shanahan who hails from Castleisland.

The Orange County Ancient Order of Hibernians pipe and drum band made the long trek from the US to participate and they were joined on the night by the Gleneagle Brass Band and marching bands from Millstreet and Blarney.

This year's 4th of July festival was significantly extended to become a three-day celebration of

Killarney's close and long-established links with the USA.

On Sunday evening there was a high quality dramatisation of the life and times of the McShain and Bourn Vincent families to mark their generosity in donating Killarney National Park, Killarney House and Gardens and so much more to the town.

The event – featuring and highlighting outstanding local talent – was held in the courtyard of Killarney House and close on 150 guests were treated to a feast of music, song and poetry.

On Monday night Killarney House and Gardens also played host to an open air concert featuring hugely popular local band Truly Diverse and that was followed by an open air screening of hit musical Mamma Mia which attracted close on 1,500 people.

Danny and the Deer



Danny Healy-Rae is calling for a serious deer cull in south Kerry, after colliding with a Sika. Danny has not assessed the cost of the damage to his 06 Mercedes car yet. The front passenger side light as well as the area under the bonnet was damaged in the 5 am encounter with Sika on the road near Loo Bridge, off the Cork to Killarney road.

He was returning to Kilgarvan from meeting with people getting onto the cataract bus to Belfast. "My car is one of the many cars damaged by deer on a daily basis on our roads. People are spending a lot of money constantly repairing cars and nobody is responsible for this. This is very dangerous and many people are badly injured as a result of collisions with deer. I have raised this numerous times in the Dail and the Government is doing nothing about it," he said in a post on Facebook.

Two of his sons have sustained thousands of euro damage to their vehicles - including on the N22 itself and he has been inundated with calls from people on the damage to their cars since going public, he said.

He "managed to duck one", but the other deer jumped out from the ditch and collided with him, he told me.

The deer was killed and the county council removed it.

"It's time for a serious cull," he said.

He also hit out at environmentalists saying they needed to highlight the destruction being caused by deer in Kerry.

He was again calling for a deer crossing with traffic lights to be installed near Kilgarvan village - which would detect the presence of deer to warn motorists.

Kerry - Any Room for the Young?

Yeats complained Ireland was no country for old men. Well, Kerry seems to be "bucking" that trend, the poet might be glad to hear.

Just last week, Dingle had the dubious distinction of being the oldest town in Ireland - having the oldest age group, that is. Dingle is not a rent pressure zone and so any property coming on the market is being bought up for Airbnb. And then there is what a local GP termed "the retirement phenomenon" - older people with lots of cash from house sales in cities are moving to Dingle. In fact most of the walking groups in Dingle now are made up of "blow-ins" I have been told.

The average age in Dingle is 44.4 according to the latest census figures. In Kerry as a whole it is 41.5 and nationally the mean age is 38.8. In Killarney the average age is also over 40.

Local GP Dr Peadar Ó Fionnáin says there is an "imbalance". People retiring to Dingle are welcome. But the reality is they also have higher income from city property and can afford to outbid locals.

"And there is the hollowing out of tourist towns so there are only older residents in the towns," Peadar said of the tourist letting.

Younger people are priced out.

The same can be said of Killarney. So what is to be done? The Land Development Agency set up in 2018 to look at State land for housing has all but ruled out St Finan's, it has finally told me.

The HSE owned land bank was not put forward or at least not included in the first report on relevant public land to the LDA.

It would need an enormous push from the HSE and Kerry County Council to have such a monstrous structure included in any upcoming analysis. And so the pressure has to be kept on our authorities.

We can only look on as thousands of homes in Dublin and Cork are coming on stream, now that the LDA is at least the stage of delivery.

"The LDA are engaging all the time with local authorities and State bodies to advance that aim," a spokesman said.

Well, the sooner the better in Kerry, for all our sakes.

Tubs of Money in RTE

Allow me to be a bit underwhelmed by all the anger in RTE and by the NUJ, my own union, which for a number of years I represented voluntarily, back and forth to their London headquarters. (The NUJ here is "a branch" of the UK union.). The public anger, I fully get. As indeed that of worker bee journalists like myself who are paid pittance by RTE for our regular and reliable service. But all this outrage by "colleagues" of Ryan Tubridy? The outrageous high pay in RTE is long known. Most of the "stars" are going around



the country gathering hefty fees for non-journalistic work with years. We learn this week a good few of the non-stars are at that racket too. And there has been no outrage by Emma and co about that - or the low fees to us! Unfortunately, the behaviour by RTE is only part of it. There is a creeping slip in standards.

Traditionally, journalists did not take on commercial work. The best of us still do not, lest we appear compromised. The reality is the PR industry and corporate creep, is choking journalism and press photography.

The grounding principle in journalism is independent objective truth.

Filtering, manipulating the story, or the promotional picture, is never part of the journalist vocation.

That's what the spokesmen and "communication" experts do. And good luck to them! But they are not journalists. And what they are about is not journalism.

Politicians have a large paw in the rot that has set in here with around a decade.

On a par with RTE greed, journalists jumping ship to become highly paid minders for Government ministers has deeply wounded and undermined the profession and democracy itself. This present Government has been shameless in tempting journalists to become their guard dogs.

How can you hold politicians to account one day and work for them the next?

Journalists also need to reclaim the pages. Teachers, working and retired, former and current politicians, party advisors, washed out football and rugby players not to mention "communications experts" are taking up valuable space in newspapers that would provide much needed income for workers. These are dilettantes. They are going for the Sunday drive and putting the car in the garage for the rest of the week! A vigilant and effective union here would put a stop to this - as it does in the UK.

Journalism is the root of democracy. Done properly, and with integrity, it is a public service, regardless of the publication. Those deciding on the licence fee might want to remember that.





JOHN TAKES ON THE RING TWICE


An avid cyclist not only completed the Ring of Kerry twice on Saturday last, he also cycled an extra 60km to clock up an incredible 400km in one day.

CLIMBING 32 PEAKS IN 32 COUNTIES

in memory of Orla

A hospital consultant aims to climb the highest peak in every county in Ireland in a week in memory of his sister-in-law.

Cork-based consultant obstetrician and gynaecologist, Richard Horgan, is training intensely for next month's mammoth challenge, five years after the tragic death of his wife's youngest sister, Orla Gosnell, 38. And he plans to sweep into Kerry on day one to take on Ireland's highest peak, Carrauntoohil.

The funds he raises for Cork University Maternity Hospital through CUH Charity will be used to create dedicated spaces for patients and staff – and a permanent reminder of the social care worker's life.

Orla died in December 2018, five months after delivering her fifth child at CUMH.

Richard's '32 County Peaks in a Week' challenge kicks off on July 16 with a minimum €10,000 target and the daunting task of scaling summits in four-five counties each day, concluding with 918m Galtymore on the Limerick/Tipperary border.

"Failure is not an option," said the determined Cork city dad-of-three and avid hill walker, who conquered Africa's highest peak, Kilimanjaro, in 2011.

During the expedition, supported by a colleague, he will camp overnight at the base of his next peak and climb a combined altitude of 16,000m, almost twice that of Mount Everest.

He hopes to be joined by Orla's husband Robert and other family members on the final ascent on July 22.

Richard's family was plunged into grief when his sister-in-law passed away.

He was based in Dublin's Rotunda Hospital at the time but was appointed to CUMH in early 2020.

A long-held ambition to mark her life came to fruition earlier this year when - inspired by an idea from his nine-year-old son - he decided to grasp the 32-county peak challenge.

It will be a highly-emotional undertaking as he carries treasured memories of drama and singing enthusiast Orla with him.

"She was so dynamic, it was always about the solution rather than the problem with her," he recalls.

"She was never one to leave things slide, she would ask about things and was never one to avoid sensitive conversations if something needed to be said – and I admire that.

"She loved kids, was brilliant with them, loved being pregnant but always wanted to be involved and to know everything about her care. This lives on in her five fabulous kids.

"What has always been to the forefront in my work is the patient's experience, the mother's experience, even in bad outcomes and to make the experience as positive as we can.

"When I walk into the maternity hospital, there are magnificent glass corridors and there's an opportunity to install benches or seats, we have three floors to work with and could do it on all floors.

"It is simply somewhere patients, their partners and staff can go and sit, take a moment, have a chat, take a 'phonecall, have those few minutes." The new space will include a symbol specifically remembering Orla and her many journeys in CUMH.

THINK AHEAD, THINK HOUSING 2023

an annual housing campaign for disabled people in Kerry.

Irish Wheelchair Association has launched Think Ahead Think Housing 2023 it's annual housing campaign for more social housing for people with disabilities in Kerry and across Ireland. Think Ahead, Think Housing is a campaign for disabled people, encouraging them to think about their housing needs and apply to their local authority for housing for the future.

According to Terry O'Brien, who oversees, Irish Wheelchair Association Kerry and is based in Tralee, "Think Ahead, Think Housing is for anyone with a disability who wants to move out of home and begin their independent life or for parents of older children with a disability who want to move out but don't know where to start. Our campaign is encouraging and supporting people to think about social housing and

apply to their local authority for housing sooner rather than later.

Before 2021, it had not been possible for a disabled person to specifically include their accessibility requirements on their social housing application form. Irish Wheelchair Association calling on people with disabilities who want a home of their own to contact their local authority for the new social housing application form. According to Terry, "We are encouraging people with disabilities to also complete the HMD- Form 1 Disability and /or Medical Information Form in order to apply for priority status on the social housing waiting list."



DIOCESAN CHANGES IN KERRY


Bishop Ray Browne has announced new appointments in the Diocese of Kerry.

"This year two priests retire, Fr Denis O'Mahony and Fr Martin Sheehan. I thank them sincerely for their great service over many years. They are fondly remembered by the people of the parishes where they served. I wish them good health and happiness in retirement. I also thank the priests who have readily agreed to uproot and move to new parishes", Bishop Browne said.

"With the two retirements we now will have two more parishes 'served by the priests of their pastoral areas'. This causes change and adjustment in the lives of both clergy and people (especially parish staff and volunteers) in all the parishes of those pastoral areas. It involves an extra workload on the priests. I deeply appreciate the willingness of all to do this. It is important to remember that not only are some parishes without a resident priest, but all priests are no longer fulltime in their own parishes due to their commitments in the parishes without a resident priest. I fully understand that people are saddened by our constant adjusting to fewer and fewer priests. Be aware that this is happening in every diocese in Ireland, Great Britain and most western countries.

WEEKEND MASSES

One of the most visible results of these appointments is change in the number and times of weekend Masses in the parishes of the pastoral areas. Unfortunately, in some situations people will have less choice of Masses. It will require extra effort/sacrifice for people to gather with their community for Sunday vigil/morning Mass.

YEAR OF VOCATION

Throughout Ireland the year 2023, until next Easter, is being observed as a year of Vocation and we pray for the twenty-six adults who for the past eighteen months have been undertaking the diocesan formation programme in 'Lay Leadership' and for the service they will give in their local pastoral area / parish in their years ahead. Within the next year we will seek to have another group commence this programme.

In the context of vocation, we thank God for the vocation to the priesthood of Mark Moriarty who will be ordained priest in the Cathedral on Sunday August 13th. I ask all parishes to have a Holy Hour during their usual weekly time of Parish Adoration, or on the Friday or Saturday night that weekend: in thanksgiving for Mark's vocation; asking God's blessing on his life as a priest; and praying for the fullness of parish life in all the fifty-three parishes of our diocese.

We hope to have a further ordination to the priesthood within eighteen months, and a person commencing his first year of seminary formation in St Patrick's College, Maynooth in the Autumn.

SYNODALITY

In the past two years much has been said and written of 'synodality'. Synodality is most appropriate in this time of significant change and adjustment. We need to hear as many voices as possible as we confront the challenges we face as people of faith, as Christian communities, and as a diocese. The spirit of challenge and hope required is well captured in a quote I used this time last year: "We are going to be journeying together for a significant amount of time. In fact, we are going to be journeying together and learning to journey together perpetually. If we are to learn to listen so that we might truly understand each other, if we are to learn how to rely on the Holy Spirit more than on ourselves, and if we are to learn how to dialogue with others, 'Synodality' is the path expected of us in the third millennium."

SOLIDARITY

A final word to acknowledge the difficulties of the past year. I think first of the awfulness of the war in Ukraine and the suffering of its people. Here in Ireland, I am conscious of the struggle of many people. To give just two instances, so many couples and individuals are finding it impossible to get accommodation that they can call home, and so many households are in debt due to electricity or fuel bills. As Catholic communities we pray and strive for a world, globally and locally, that is more just and fair, a world where all can live in peace.

AMBULANCE SERVICE IN KERRY IS BROKEN

“Our Emergency Ambulance Service is broken” is the stark message from Kerry Fianna Fáil Councillor, Michael Cahill. This follows yet another horror story of a man waiting 3 hours for an ambulance in South Kerry, after suffering serious injuries in a fall.

“The centralisation of the administration of the service has not worked. We do not have enough staff, enough ambulances and we do not have a cohesive plan as to the placement of Ambulance Stations. This is the year 2023 and we continue to have long waiting times for emergency services, coupled with delayed turnover times at our Hospitals due to low staffing levels there also” stated Councillor Cahill.

“None of us can predict when and where we will need the services of paramedics and an

ambulance due to accident or sickness. It surely must be within the brainpower of those in charge to realise that Kerry is a large geographical area, with a narrow, busy road network. Adequately resourced Ambulance Stations must be set up all around the county, strategically placed to minimise waiting times” said the Rossbeigh based Councillor.

“The sight of emergency vehicles making highly dangerous round trips to South Kerry on the Ring, during the busy tourist season is absolutely scary. With strategically placed Ambulance Stations covering remote districts, journey times could be halved, danger averted and lives saved” added Councillor Cahill.

The Fianna Fáil Councillor has highlighted the issue on numerous occasions over the years.



CALL FOR DEDICATED CENTRE FOR TREATING AND TESTING LYME DISEASE



It is hugely disappointing that the Health Service Executive refuse to recognise the need for a dedicated Testing and Treatment Centre for Lyme disease at University Hospital Kerry, according to Fianna Fáil Councillor, Michael Cahill. Councillor Cahill has received a negative response to his call for such a facility from the HSE Area Director of Public Health, who concludes that “a dedicated testing and treatment centre in University Hospital Kerry would not be feasible at this time.”

“In a typically long winded response from the HSE, which gives great detail of the danger posed in contracting Lyme disease, a dedicated Testing and Treatment Centre at University Hospital Kerry is ruled out, due to lack of supporting statistical evidence, in a short paragraph at the end. This is despite the fact that they confirm Deer have been identified as primary hosts of the ticks that carry this disease

and that people may come in contact with them from ‘grassy fronds in particular in infested environments’ stated a frustrated Councillor Cahill.

“Killarney National Park and surrounding areas is home to an extremely large Deer herd, and Deer are recognised as Primary Carriers of the Tick that can spread Lyme disease. It is obvious then that they infest the grass where the Deer live and feed and that they pose a risk to humans who frequent the area. In Kerry, you face a higher risk of contracting Lyme disease due to the presence of large numbers of Deer and all the statistics in the world will not disprove that” said the Rossbeigh based Councillor.

“The Health and Safety Executive need to join the real world and recognise the very obvious evidence, that Lyme disease is at high levels in Kerry, is difficult to diagnose and is difficult and expensive to treat. A dedicated Testing and Treatment Centre in University Hospital Kerry, not alone makes sense but is urgently required there. The effects of Lyme on those infected is horrendous and I will not rest until it is taken seriously” stated Councillor Cahill.

“Deer are today roaming around every corner of our county, North, South, East and West Kerry, therefore everyone who enjoys the outdoors, from our young to our not so young, is at risk of being infected by this horrible disease” added Councillor Cahill.



DELAYS IN PAYMENTS FOR PATIENTS

Complaints continue to reach Fianna Fáil Councillor, Michael Cahill’s office with regard to the delayed or non-payment of expenses to patients availing of treatment abroad under the Cross Border Directive.

“The system is not delivering to the vulnerable users of the Treatment Abroad Scheme when it comes to the claiming of legitimate expenses incurred in getting treatment that is not available at home. Despite a critical report by the Ombudsman, Get Deering, patients are still being left out of pocket for long periods, with some expenses not being covered at all” stated Councillor Cahill.

“I have details of treatments and expenses, where patients have to borrow large sums, in order to access the treatment, only to be left waiting months for reimbursement, or worse still to be told that all expenses are not covered. This is a shocking way to treat people, who are attempting to avail of the benefits of the EU Cross Border Directive, which covers treatments not available in Ireland” said the Rossbeigh based Councillor.

“The Health Service Executive need to comply with European law in this instance and explain why they can reimburse accommodation expenses to some patients and not to others. They appear to be hiding behind a loophole whereby if the Hospital abroad arranges the Hotel accommodation, they reimburse it, but if the patient has to arrange, they do not. This shows a total lack of sensitivity and humanity and some people are in serious financial debt because of it” added Councillor Cahill.



BENEFITS OF EXERCISE

DURING PREGNANCY - PART 1

Over the past several decades a significant shift has occurred in the way we view pregnancy and the role exercise plays during your pregnancy. In the past there was a misconception that pregnant Women should be encouraged to rest, take it easy, put their feet up and "eat for two".

WHAT IS GLAUCOMA?

Glaucoma is the name given to a group of eye conditions where the optic nerve at the back of the eye is damaged. It is often linked with raised pressure within the eye, although the eye pressure can sometimes be normal. When the nerve is damaged, it can start to cause problems with the peripheral vision (side vision) and, if left untreated, can cause permanent damage. With early treatment, further damage to vision can be prevented. Glaucoma may not have symptoms and this is why it is very important to have regular sight tests.



FASTEST RACING CARS EVER SET FOR FESTIVAL OF SPEED

Some of the fastest racing cars ever seen in Kerry are on their way to the Kingdom to compete in the Brian O'Neill Garden Equipment and Trailers Ballyfinnane Festival of Speed.

The July 16 event celebrates 120 years of closed road motorsport in Kerry. Over 50 entries have been received for the speed test element of the festival and as well as a host of local rally cars, several single-seater racing cars are also in the line-up.

It is the first time since the mid-1980s that single-seater racing cars have competed in a closed-road event in Kerry. Kerry Motor Club previously ran a hillclimb on the Castlemaine road out of Tralee in 1985 and 1986. It is 23 years since the club ran a hillclimb. Back in 2000 they shared organising duty with Limerick Motor Club for a two-day event, but those two events were run in the Treaty County and not Kerry.

Among the spectacular cars taking part in the Ballyfinnane event is the Gould GR37 Formula 3 car that Limerick's Ben O'Brien used to win an event in France last month.

Northern Ireland's John Donnelly, a regular hillclimb podium finish in Irish national events has entered his Pilbeam MP62 racing car while Rusell Stanworth has entered in a Reynard Formula Opel racing car.

Organisers Kerry Motor Club have also been in touch with the owner of a 1918 Buick race car and confirmation of its appearance at the event is expected by the end of the week. "There is something for everyone at this spectacular festival of motoring and motorsport," said event clerk of the course Sean Moriarty.

Local rally drivers entered include Colin Nelligan who will make his debut in a new Ford Fiesta. Drivers like Stephen O'Connor, David Griffin and Keith O'Connor, all members of the organising team, have entered their Toyota Starlet, Toyota Corolla and Honda Civic respectively. London-based Killarney man, the chairman of the London Irish Motor Club Mick Smith, will also compete in the event. He will double drive a car supplied by a member of the Kerry Motor Club.

Kerry Motor Club member James Kissane is a regular competitor on hillclimb events. He got a chance to examine the course earlier this week. He said: "A nice bit of road, it looks good for things to run smoothly. The start has plenty of space to que and wide to turn cars."

Road closures will be in place from around 4kms each direction from Ballyfinnane crossroads and admission is by programme purchase – cash only – from the parking attendants at each entrance. Official programmes will go on sale locally this weekend and holders of pre-purchased programmes will be granted access at the entrances.

Due to the long distances between the parking zones at the Firies and Gortalea sides, the organisers will offer a free shuttle bus service to the venue. Parking restrictions will apply on all approach roads to the car parks, particularly the Gortalea side as this is an emergency evacuation zone.





KERRY SPARKLE WITH DOUBLE SCORES ON TYRONE

**All Ireland Quarter-Final:
Kerry 2-18 Tyrone 0-12**

Kerry sounded an early warning note with a dangerous ball into Tyrone's square. In fact, I thought Niall Morgan had slightly misjudged the high bounce and we were about to be gifted an early goal, but in fairness he added a salmon spring to his jump to gather safely. He launched Tyrone into that fast, swarming counter-attack. Except that Kerry were just as sharp and twice as ready. Away back in 2003, one of the most skill-laden Kerry teams of any era, a team that included the likes of Moynihan, Declan O'Sullivan, the Ad an Bhothair brothers, Colm Cooper, ran out onto Croke Park and into one of the great GAA ambushes of all time. Mickey Harte had known that his players could not compete with Kerry in aerial or shootout duels.....so his team played something completely different. Kerry artisans were simply surrounded and crowded out by a unison of fearlessness. Kerry players were turned over repeatedly and cleanly in possession and Tyrone went on to lift the coveted canister for the first time.

Twenty years later, Tyrone brought the exact same game and intensity. Except that Kerry had twenty years of learning. That first attack ran into a wall of well-ready Kerry bodies and it was Tadhg Morley that calmly stuck in the pickpocket's hand to claim it. Tyrone were visibly shocked – it turned out that Kerry had learned how to do everything that they could do and were actually slightly better (and certainly more ready) for it.

That was the story of this game. Tyrone's revolution of twenty years ago had literally changed gaelic football from the ground up, but that revolution had come full circle and now it was their turn to run into a team who could play every bit of that style – and still retain those shooting and aerial skills.

Kerry refused invitations to grow impatient in possession and try and charge through ready tacklers – a trap we walked into far too often in 2020 and 2021, and it was those turnovers that allowed Cork and Tyrone victories in those years. This time Kerry just recycled until Paul Geaney picked off a nice point.

Tyrone equalised through Michael McKernan from cornerback. I remember when that would have raised a lot of eyebrows. Dr. Eamonn O'Sullivan was never quite as tactically rigid as legend has it, but he would have bridled (to him, a shooting cornerback was showing disrespect and lack of trust in his forward teammates). Nowadays no-one bats an eyelid.

Adrian Spillane was the best player on the pitch for at least forty minutes. This was the best I have ever seen him play for Kerry, and he kicked a superb Kerry score. Niall Morgan had a chance from a free, but it wasn't even close and Seán O'Shea lifted a gear to surge ahead for a point. The likes of Jack Barry, Tadhg Morley (Tyrone left Ruairí Canavan inside and Mattie Donnelly didn't follow Tadhg, giving him to freedom to snuff out little pockets of space before they could become any threat), Adrian Spillane and Dara Moynihan were bringing an intensity that Tyrone looked prepared for. And Paudie Clifford? Given his restless drive and energy now, I have to say it. That must have been the most nightmarish toddler in history when he was teething a quarter century ago.

David had kicked a couple of ranging missiles by now. They weren't far off target, but they weren't over. A mark in the 13th minute (I don't like the mark, but I'll happily bank the points) saw him open his account.

Tyrone were making very little headway against a Kerry defence who were so parsimonious that they wouldn't even give you the correct change. Darren McCurry did kick a free, but Tom O'Sullivan replied to that pedestrian enough score with a fantastic kick from distance.

Tyrone were being well outplayed here, but they have plenty of obdurate courage. Adrian Spillane did well to clear a dangerous ball, but a loose pass saw them finally get a counter-attack that yielded a Ruairí Canavan score. His older brother added another. Tyrone, improbably,

were building a head of steam here. Peter Harte and Conor Meyler got it to Ruairí Canavan, who neatly sidestepped and fired over. He's young and a bit raw yet, but you would know him for his father's son.


0-5 apiece. Kerry were the better team, but it wasn't showing on the scoreboard. That was ominous to me.

Paudie Clifford nudged us ahead again. Tyrone went for goal and hit the post. The last time that happened, Cathal McShane got in for a goal. Jack Barry had obviously done his homework and this time he cleared the danger.


Paul Murphy was deemed to have fouled Ruairí Canavan. Harsh enough. That ref missed his natural calling as a parish priest at a school disco in the 1950s. (I'm joking. Brendan Cawley actually refereed very well, but that one was soft). Darren McCurry obliged; 0-6 apiece.

Kerry needed to kick it up a notch and changed gear so smoothly it was barely detectable. David Clifford won an equally soft free – he would have claimed the mark anyway – and fired over. Diarmuid O'Connor was having the proverbial stormer. He gathered from Paul Geaney and fired over. Paudie Clifford won a free and his brother did the business to put Kerry three to the good.

Tyrone had brought on Frank Burns to replace Conor Quinn. I rate Burns, I really do, but that's replacing like with like and was eloquent about how dominant Diarmuid O'Connor, Jack Barry, and Adrian Spillane were out around the middle (Dara Moynihan made one great catch out there as well in a crowd of taller men). Nobody, myself included, had expected that. It also made it clear to me that Tyrone were low on ideas. They simply didn't know how to switch their approach. I honestly don't want to sound harsh or critical, and there was certainly no schadenfreude. Once upon a time Tyrone were a lot better than us.

You have a very narrow soul if you begrudge them that; I certainly didn't. But I knew with absolute certainty the moment I saw Frank Burns take the field, great soldier that he always is, that Kerry would be playing in a semi-final. It was inevitable at that point; the pendulum was no longer swinging.

Half-time: Kerry 0-9 Tyrone 0-6

The third quarter is much quicker and simpler told. Kerry send a quick ball in to Sean O'Shea. He is fouled and David slots over the free. Shane Ryan catches a Tyrone ball dropping short – in his early days, balls in like that would worry a lot of us but Shane is a sure thing under them now and uses his height well. Instead the ball came up the field and David won the free, with Seán converting.

Shane Ryan had to be tall again to scoop away a pass across his goal, stretching to elongate his arm (ludicrously, it reminded me for a second of Peter Parker in full superhero mode) and it led to Adrian Spillane's second score of the day. Double scores, 0-12 to 0-6.

0-13. Tom O'Sullivan made a good break out of defence and it led to a Sean O'Shea score. Tadhg Morley made an even better run forward, really slicing through Tyrone before laying off to Paul Geaney. Niall Morgan deserves a lot of credit; that was a great save. However, Sean O'Shea simply kicked over the '45.

Kerry were eight points clear and should have tacked on a few more to close it out. Hawkeye denied David one score, and hawkeye did not seem sure of itself at all. No need for any dramatic ending here. Let's finish this, not leave them a chink to force a goal and suddenly make us sweat. Then came the moment that everybody will remember.

I know what the defender is feeling. There is David Clifford, slightly off balance, waiting to gather an awkward ball coming to him. Not a 'hospital pass' (a pass so poorly judged that the unfortunate recipient will be going there), but not far away. And you have another defender alongside you, and David is hemmed in on the touchline. He has nowhere to go, and no time to balance himself for the double challenge heading his way. He is going straight out over the sideline and it's going to be a Tyrone

sideline kick. You are about to lose this game – and of course you know that – but your own people will remember you as the man who stopped David Clifford in his tracks just once.

And then you find out just why David Clifford is who he is. Because he doesn't gather the football. He takes one controlling touch and just lifts it over your head with one flick of his boot. And with dawning horror you realise that David knew exactly where you were all along and knew the bit that you had forgotten in your eagerness. The bit about Tony Brosnan – Tony Brosnan, of all players – completely unmarked behind you. By the time you turn your head, the ball is already on its way to the net (actually, Tony very unselfishly laid it off for Diarmuid O'Connor). You are yourself, and that's a thing to take great pride in. But he is David Clifford.

I will say now that David had a great overall game. 0-4 himself, also won at least two for Seán O'Shea, a creative hand in both goals, a number of exhibition passes including that spectacular one. But midfield colossus Diarmuid O'Connor was the man of the match. 1-14 to 0-6. Let us not drag the tale out much further. All the sting is out of it and there is only anticlimax from that point on. Darren McCurry's free is Tyrone's first in 25 minutes. They battled on and picked off a few more scores as Kerry ran their bench. Pride kept them going. On a hard day for a proud county, not a one of them went hiding.

Kerry's second goal was well worked again by David Clifford and Tony Brosnan, with Seán O'Shea applying the coup de grace on this occasion. Twice Tony measured his lay-off to perfection, and twice it resulted in Kerry goals. Kerry were faultless here. Not just good, faultless. There was no apparent weakness. Tyrone could have asked harder questions, but that is still a strong, fast team with plenty of threats themselves and they were never in this contest.

Kerry still have a fair distance to travel to retain their title, but this win definitely shortens the road.

STATE OF PLAY

This year's All Ireland Championship was a slow burner at the start. In fact, 'slow burner' is far too dramatic a phrase. This was staring at a heap of twigs and dried grass and leaves and seeing one tendril of smoke curling up from it. That might be a dying spark, or that might be a tiny flame, but you'll be waiting a long time for enough heat to boil water.

In other words, if you ignored the entire championship, including the provincials, you would have missed two decent Connaught games, three decent Ulster contests, one big surprise in Munster (Clare beating Cork) and nothing of any significance at all in Leinster. Neutrals in Munster have the shocks of the 2021 Covid Championship to look back on – Cork went from Kerry giant-killers to fallen Goliaths to Tipperary themselves. Leinster hasn't had anything to even shake Dublin's pedestal for a long time.

Mind you, the hurling was producing some fantastic games, especially in Munster, but again the very long league nature of it was robbing each game of significance to match the quality.

The group stages were reasonably interesting. That hard rattle off Mayo in the Fitzgerald Stadium was the first time I had real doubts about this Kerry team. I had been quite sure that Jack was using the League to shape the clay, not bake it just yet. Mayo pulverised us that day and ended one of the greatest unbeaten records in the game's history – no harm in that, it was fast becoming a burdensome myth that was framing pre-game narratives in a frankly ridiculous fashion. Mayo, who had been burning coal hard and often right from the start of the year, beating us was no surprise, but doing it so easily – they could have added four more goals easily enough that day – opened a lot of eyes. The Championship needed just such a talking point, to be honest. It's easy in hindsight to say that it was two ships passing in the night, one slowly heading aground, and one heading into the deeper waters of the latter stages. It's just at the time, most of us (myself included) were reading the direction of travel wrong.

The GAA introduced the three stages out of four group qualifying and this 'ore-quarter-final' game between second and third placed teams because of the number of dead rubbers in the misnamed 'Super 8's' of a previous era. I don't like it. Quite simply, it is an absolutely preposterous amount of games to reduce a sixteen team championship down to twelve.

I will say that the unfancied teams, the likes of Sligo, Louth, and especially Taillteann champions Westmeath, have acquitted themselves well in this championship and the three team qualifying situation gives them a real target (just one win can take them into a knockout game).

The system also worked out very much in Kerry's favour as well. The narrative later on will be that we learnt hard lessons from that Mayo defeat. I don't think we did; I think it was more that Mayo timed their peak to coincide with that game whereas we were just on the cusp of unleashing. That's hindsight, of course.

There is no doubt in my mind about the win that was most critical for Kerry along this long journey. And we weren't actually playing in that one at all. Cork beating Mayo gave us a free weekend that I think we needed. We cleared up a lot of niggles and knocks and got some rest into bodies while Tyrone had to battle hard against Donegal after just barely seeing off Westmeath the week before.

That week's break made a difference.

The other quarter-finals were fairly indicative of form as teams come into the final stretch.

Monaghan 0-14 Armagh 0-14

You'd need a heart of stone not to sympathise with Armagh. They lost on penalties in last year's quarter-final to Galway in one of the games of the year. Granted, Galway had been the better side, but Armagh had clawed themselves right into that game, even if they didn't cover themselves in glory in an unsightly scuffle at the end of normal time. They lost the Ulster Final on penalties to Derry – they had been the better team in that game. And they had been one point ahead very deep into injury time here, only to lose on penalties.

Sympathy can only go so far, though. They

were one point ahead at half-time in a poor game but frankly, were far too cautious and by-the-numbers. Donegal used to play Michael Murphy out in midfield because they had to and because they used to have the under-rated McFadden inside. What's Armagh's excuse for playing Rian O'Neill out there? Armagh had possession and a one point advantage late in his game against Monaghan. Did they look to push on and close it out and did they try to hold and hide? I sympathise with Kieran McGeeney in the aftermath – words were exchanged with opposition players but it wasn't the big deal it's being made out to be – and of course the referee can add on the time you are wasting. But the stuff that went on in Hill 16? Let's not kid ourselves. That was genuine and unwarranted violence. That needs to be absolutely stamped out. People need to be arrested, named, shamed, and banned from attending matches. And it may be unfair, and it is certainly unfortunate, but the simple truth is that if people were asked before the weekend to ask at which of the four quarter-finals that was most likely, they would have guessed correctly. That's a problem in itself.

Derry 1-12 Cork 1-8

I was delighted to see Cork get this far after their early mishaps in the championship. A strong Cork is good for Kerry football always; we are each other's whetstone. I knew that the two-time Ulster champions were favourites, but I genuinely felt that Cork had potential for a shock here.

I watched the first half. It wasn't easy, believe. It was hard to watch. Derry parked the bus in front of their own goal and just killed any hope of a football match breaking out stone dead. The most exciting thing to happen in the game was....no, I've got no possible way to finish that sentence. I don't know how many of you remember the infamous game between Dublin and Donegal in 2011 that finished 0-8 to 0-6. The 0-1 apiece after twenty minutes game. The soccer game in Old Trafford was producing more scores.

This Derry Cork game was that. Cork's forwards will actually learn a lot from it but on the day they simply didn't have the little bit of experience to slow down the shots and pick them off.

We play Derry next, and Derry are a fine side on paper. Conor Glass is one of the best players of a generation. Brendan Rodgers has been a

mainstay of that Derry team a long time and always quality, no-one could begrudge him anything. Shane McGuigan, though quiet enough against Cork, is actually a top quality forward and troubled plenty of Kerry teams. On paper, then, their semi-final clash with Kerry should be interesting. On paper, I, unfortunately, will be missing that game, having committed to watching paint dry instead.

It's a shame, because their minors are genuinely fantastic to watch, All Ireland favourites from a long way out. It's not that they have any one star player. They don't have a Mark O'Connor or a Paul O'Shea or a Ciarán Archer or a David Clifford – or a Conor Glass for that matter. They just play a brilliant brand of team football. Monaghan are a good minor side in their own right, but I think their 2018 team was better, and I expect Derry to win the final.

Let's not bother talking the senior game up. This is a banana skin for Kerry only because it looks an absolutely foregone conclusion. I have no interest in going to the semi-final myself. People are already talking about a Kerry/Dublin final. Derry and Monaghan may not like that, and of course it will spark defiant outrage in those dressing rooms. I don't mind Derry being annoyed. I'll respect their football – when they actually show me some.

Dublin 2-17 Mayo 0-11

And so Mayo's juggernaut runs off the rails and crashes for another year. Once more the annual slew of cheap and nasty internet gibes and memes wend their way around the internet from people who don't actually have a sense of humour but have read about the concept. ChatGPT (which is a much over-hyped party trick, not a useful tool just yet) is not replacing Dara O Briain any time soon.

Mayo got most things right this year. They got their timing slightly off and ran fatally out of steam as the group stage progressed. McStay showed great dignity from start to finish. I don't always like his football style, but I like the man himself. Taking off Aidan O'Shea early has been deemed a mistake, but it showed guts on the part of both men (no toys out of the pram by Aidan, either, and it says a lot about him, too). They just ran into a Dublin side who, exactly the same as Kerry, have gotten their timing spot on. That's a serious Dublin team. Fenton and Kilkenny are wonders of the modern age, so realistic that people expect miracles on a daily basis. Instead Dublin could afford to rest Kilkenny against Mayo, with Cormac Costello making the magic happen instead. Dublin forwards are always ambitious and it's great to watch. Mannion has proven that dropping him was a mistake. Even Dean Rock looked his old self; I'd have retired him two years ago, to be honest. I thought for years that Colm Basquel was an honest soldier but limited. This year he is leading the charge. And James McCarthy. He's like a blend of Tomás Ó Sé and Declan O'Sullivan. People tell me that he is not quite the force of old. It's true. He's not. He's actually gotten better.

Dublin will take Monaghan apart. That may sound unfair. Vinny Corey can call on a McManus who is back to his old self and he also

has the likes of Darren Hughes, Karl O'Connell, Jack McCarron. Good footballers. But they aren't going to live one on one against Dublin. It may be jumping the gun a bit, and it is certainly tempting fate, but I think that the only real question left in this year's hunt for Sam Maguire is whether Kerry can live one on one with Dublin, or vice versa.

KERRY COUNTY LEAGUE

The All Ireland has actually been the second most interesting competition of the past couple of months. The understandable absence of the county players for most of the county league does of course artificially skew it, but funnily enough it seems to have a levelling effect. The change to three up/three down has worked wonders in making deals harder to do. Don't kid yourself; plenty of deals do still get done, and I'd be slow to cast any judgements. There's humanity as well as morality to be considered.

Division One

Legion slipped up in their last two games against Spa and Dingle and it looks like Crokes will take the title without a need for a play-off. Fair going by Crokes, who had to call on a lot of B team players (the B team were relegated from Division Four as a result) but they were incredibly consistent. Gneeveguilla at home to Stacks is the crunch game here, with at least one and possibly both going down. Spa have to beat Ballymac and will still be checking other results – they were down a lot of players themselves. Desmonds are definitely gone, and Stacks absolutely have to win. If they do, Gneeveguilla are teetering on the brink. After that, your guess is as good as mine. The quality of this year's Division One was such that it looks like a team is almost certainly going to be relegated on 11 points. I don't remember that ever happening, 8 points usually meant safety.

Division Two

Laune Rangers beating Kenmare Shamrocks was the key game and puts them back into Division One. Glenflesk and An Ghaeltacht join them in promotion. Firies, Currow, and St. Marys go down.

Division Three

John Mitchels v Ardferd is definitely the one to watch. There's a bit of recent history to add spice between those two St. Brendans clubs as well. The winner is going up, but the loser is quite likely to be leapfrogged to promotion, with three teams poised right behind them. A draw would do Mitchels. Ballydonoghue will be promoted if they beat Brosna in the back game, and that would confirm Brosna joining Skellig Rangers and Dromid Pearses in the drop. That will be a hugely interesting game for neutral as well. Annascaul and Reenard play each other and the winner will have a great chance of going up. Churchill and Listy are in the mix. Fossa, even without one set of brothers, might have enough firepower in another – all of the O'Shea's know where the goalposts are.

Division Four

Keel are definitely going up. Tarbert are virtual certainties to join them barring a big slip-up. They effectively saw off their biggest threat with a convincing victory over contenders Beale in their last game. If Cordal can beat Cromane (and that's far from a given; Cromane have played very, very well this year) that will close out the promotion spots. If Cordal lose that, though, then Senans, Beale, and Bally/Foilmore all waiting to pounce. At the other end Sneem/Derrynane were always struggling and Dr. Crokes had too many players called up to their senior team too often to maintain a challenge.

St. Pats/Blennerville look almost certain to go down, and you would have to feel sorry for them, they were just barely on the wrong side of an awful lot of tight games. In general, lucky breaks will average out over a whole season but as far as I can tell, St. Pats just didn't get a single stroke of luck all season.

Division Five

Division Five is quite literally impossible to predict for the simple reason that it becomes a seeded cup competition in the latter stages, so everything is effectively still in play there.

TG4 All Ireland Championship: Kerry 2-21 Cavan 2-5

It would have been some turn-up for the books if Kerry were to win that absolute thriller against Dublin, only to slip up at home to Cavan and let top spot in the group slip out of their hands. It didn't happen. Realistically, it was never going to happen. Cavan are a side that have improved in leaps and bounds, but Kerry in Austin Stack Park were always going to win here. Kerry could even afford to rest top guns like Lorraine Scanlon, Niamh Ní Chonchúir, and Eilís Lynch and still have plenty to spare.

Louise Ní Muircheartaigh with a brace (1f) and Siofra O'Shea had a good start for Kerry, with Aisling Walls and Emma Halton keeping Cavan in touch. Danielle O'Leary made it 0-4 to 0-2 and all was going according to the Kerry script.

Then Cavan's Geraldine Sheridan tore it up by drifting easily behind the Kerry for a goal. Brilliantly executed, but we left the back door wide open and other teams will be taking note of lapses like that at this stage. Aisling Sheridan added another Cavan point and Kerry had work to do. Kerry's captain Siofra O'Shea and talisman Louise Ní Muircheartaigh already had the Cavan defence at sixes and sevens every time they touched the ball and their movement opened the gap for Ciara Murphy to glide in and finish past a hapless Roisín O'Reilly. That goal really ignited Kerry's afterburners. The experienced players really came to the fore, with Louise ni Muircheartaigh, Louise Galvin, Niamh Carmody, and Anna Galvin slotting over. Louise Galvin and Amy Harrington were ruling midfield, while Kerry's pace in the half back line and clever movement up front was simply opening too many gaps for a game but outclassed Cavan.

Aisling Walls pointed for Cavan but two more points from Amy Harrington and Danielle O'Leary had Kerry six points in front, while Siofra O'Shea uncharacteristically couldn't quite get off the finishing shot with a goal open.

Half-time Kerry 1-10 Cavan 1-4

Aisling Gilsean won and converted a Cavan free to start the second half, but Kerry were in full stride now and just reeled off points at will. To be honest, any sense of drama was fading fast before Kerry effectively ended the contest in a whirlwind two minutes. Caoimhe Evan scored her second point and won the resulting kick-out. Sub Fiadhna Tangney spotted Siofra O'Shea inside and sent in a perfectly weighted pass for the captain to attack. The goalkeeper had no choice but to come and Siofra was always going

to win that duel, neatly flicking it over her and into the net for a superb goal.

Rachel Dwyer hit two points on the board as well as a free and Siofra added a beauty from play, while Erica McGlynn had the last point of the day. Cavan, brave to the end, did have another Geraldine Smith goal as an injury time consolation, but their campaign comes to a grinding halt at this stage and I suspect that they will be happy enough with it overall.

Kerry, of course, have understandably higher ambitions of going one step further than last year. Topping the group guaranteed us a home quarter-final, and our opponents tomorrow at 7.30pm are familiar faces – none other than the reigning champions, Meath! That one should be a definite cracker. Meath will have their Aussie Rules players Vikki Wall and Emma Duggan back and are All Ireland double champions for a reason - fierce and unrelenting pace for one thing - but Kerry can win this if they can add a fraction more consistency to their unquestioned quality.



KELLEHER WELCOMES RENEW EUROPE COMPROMISE ON NATURE RESTORATION LAW



- Calls on all Irish MEPs to back it to ensure that progress is achieved -
- Renew Europe uses Council position as basis for compromise

Fianna Fáil MEP Billy Kelleher has said that he believes that the latest proposals from his political group, Renew Europe, on the Nature Restoration Law can ensure a balanced piece of legislation that supports biodiversity and protects farmers and landowners.

Kelleher was commenting after his group committed to tabling the text agreed at Council of Ministers' level, in addition to 13 other amendments that gives enough flexibility to Member States when implementing the legislation.

"Following my strong lobbying within our centrist group in the parliament, Renew Europe, has committed to putting forward responsible and common sense proposals that will protect farmer and landowner interests and also, and crucially, restore lands that have deteriorated over the last 70 years.

"From Ireland's perspective, the commitment to maintain the re-wetting targets as agreed at Council of Ministers level is very important. It will ensure that Ireland will not need to rewet any private lands, and can meet all its commitments using State-owned lands.

"Additionally, at my request, my political group is also supporting a change to Article 9 on the principle of a "No net loss of Urban green space" to ensure that this is a national target rather than a target per city or urban area. This is important to ensure that our cities and towns can continue to make use of land banks to build homes for our citizens. "We will also seek to ensure that there is additional, new funding put in place to support landowners and farmers to support them in meeting restoration targets. CAP money cannot and should not be re-allocated. New money is essential.

"I am calling on all Irish MEPs to back the Renew Europe position. It is, I believe, the only possible avenue towards ensuring a majority in favour of a common sense Nature Restoration Law," concluded Kelleher.



Gardening

**FOCUS ON
BULBS**

Even though its only July, you can start thinking about planting bulbs. Most bulbs are suitable for growing in containers especially the likes of tulips, daffodils, lilies and aliums. When planting up a container of window box with bulbs, plant them at about three times their depth and about one bulb width apart and don't forget to water them especially when the foliage is out and they are growing. When planting bulbs in the garden dig over the area well where you are planting and add some compost. Always plant your bulbs in groups of about six depending on the type of bulbs. If you would like to add some colour to some areas of the garden for Spring and into Summer, it would be advisable to grow your bulbs now in small pots and grow them on until early spring. You can then plant them in their pots in the areas you want and after flowering you can dig them up and keep them until next Spring. A good dwarf daffodil for this is Tete-a-tete.

A Word of Victory

Welcome back dear student "this is what the Lord says "don't let the wise boast in their wisdom, or the powerful boast in their power, or the rich boast in their riches. Last week we quoted a Scripture from Isaiah chapter fifty that tells how God desires to connect with each of us every day, and it's from cultivating that ongoing relationship with Him that healing and restoration comes. The people we spend the most time with are those we know best. Recently we've had visitors to stay. I sure put on a good show. Plenty of nice food with fancy treats galore, rooms spruced up, the smell of bleach emanating from every corner - all glittered and gleamed - totally unsustainable of course, Haha! But when my guests were busy doing other things, I got to withdraw for a while, and slumped exhausted in a chair. I noticed the first thing I did was speak to the Lord. 
