
The Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr Jimmy Moloney thanked all those who participated.

Presently Kerry Hospice Foundation has to raise €400,000 annually to co-fund the running of the new inpatient unit in conjunction with the HSE. Additionally, it costs €100,000 to fund our remaining services. Since the Kerry Hospice Foundation was founded in 1990 the people of Kerry have been very generous supporters, donating in excess of €11 million to our fundraising activities. The magnificent palliative care facilities, now available at University Hospital Kerry, are a testament to their generosity. As our late departed county fundraiser Chairman, Ted Moynihan, used to say "You may never need the Hospice, but the Hospice needs you".



KILLARNEY GREENWAYS NEEDS THE GO AHEAD

The Lough Leane Greenway - circling two of the lakes of Killarney- is on amber if not quite a green light, going by the council works programme meeting of last week.

Kenmare Greenway along the old rail route: Fair dues to Cllr Niall O'Callaghan and others for raising the matter of "the Killarney lakes greenway".

As Niall put it, this project is as old as the former town council which was abolished in 2014. So in effect, the Lough Leane Greenway is the oldest greenway idea in the county.

"It has stalled and not moved," is how O'Callaghan said directly to the town management.

"The greenway round the lakes of Killarney needs to crack on!" he also said.

Cllr Brendan Cronin had been driving it at county level, Cllr Niall acknowledged and there was support from others including Cllr Donal Grady who pointed out the car park in Tomies was it small.

The Lough Leane loop as it was once known five years ago grew to include the Muckross Lake with Killarney town as the start and finish of the circle.

There was actually a strong enough and positive response from John Kennelly, senior council engineer to one part of Niall's proposals.

Mr Kennelly said that "Lough Leane is a priority for everyone."

"We are looking to secure funding," the engineer continued.

That will be welcome news to the people of Lakeview and Lismongane who have seen the grass grow back over work carried out pre-Covid!

Now onto Killarney to Kenmare a potentially spectacular run by the old railway at Loo Bridge and down by Kilgarvan there was less of a commitment and management said they

were not sure.

The Killarney to Kenmare Greenway also needed to be looked at, Cllr O'Callaghan stated in no uncertain terms.

But this is of course an excellent idea and one Cllr Niall, the Chambers of the two towns Killarney and Kenmare and others ought to pursue.

POOR STATE OF KILLARNEY FOOTPATHS



The footpath on Ross Road, one of the most popular walks in Killarney needs upgrading.

Amid dire warnings that the cost of materials and fuel because of the war in the east of Europe would drive the price of all road schemes up, the poor state of Killarney footpaths is being raised.

80,000 Euro has been allocated for the Killarney to do up the paths, but no list has been drawn up yet.

Mayor of Killarney Marie Moloney said some were in a poor state and councillors should have an input into which ones should go on the list. Maura Healy-Rae made a similar contribution as did Cllr Grady and others.

The money can be topped up by councillors allocations was the response from management who conceded that yes, they would accept submissions from councillors, review the submissions from councillors and then decide on a list of works.

In other words, if the footpath near you needs to be done, now is the time to put pressure on your public representatives!

WOMEN CAN APPLY TO BE A LAY MINISTER

It may have slipped under the radar of most publications, but the decision by the Diocese of Kerry to launch its lay ministry programme and to open it to women as well as men is actually quite a major step.

Close to one quarter of parishes in the large fifty-three parish diocese which includes parts of west and north Cork are now without a resident priest and most priests are over the age of fifty.

The parish of Kilgarvan as well as that of the

Liberator Daniel O'Connell associated with Catholic Emancipation last year lost their resident priests.

With Anne Lucey

The Kilgarvan TD Michael Healy-Rae likened the loss of a priest to the closure of a small industry in financial terms.

The new role of volunteer Lay Pastoral Leader will take on some of the roles "traditionally carried out by priests", depending on local needs, the Diocese said.

These will include the preparation for sacraments and liaising between home, school and parish.

Other roles might include visiting the elderly and the housebound and those in nursing homes.

The lay ministers will also be involved in the liturgy of the mass.

A spokeswoman for the Diocese confirmed the new role will be open to women, as well as men

Given the usual careful wording of the Church, their statement about the new ministry taking on some of the role of priests, and then confirmation it is to include women, one wonders if it can be long before the Church in Rome reconsiders its attitude to full priesthood or ordination for women.

Whether the lay ministry open to women in Kerry is inspired by Rome of Kerry is not clear. Women under Pope Francis have been climbing the ladder,

While synods have always been an exclusively male forum for clergy to discuss the church's pressing issues, in 2015 Sister Alessandra Smerilli, an Italian economist, was appointed councilor of the 2015 synod on youth before she rose in the ranks.

Last year Pope Francis appointed a biblical scholar, Sister Nuria Calduch-Benages, as secretary of the Pontifical Biblical Commission.

In Kerry, People already involved in community and parish work are asked to consider completing an expression of interest.

The ideal candidates will work well with others and be willing to commit up to four hours a week to the role for five years.

It will be interesting to see how many women do apply, and if so, how many are selected. The expression of interest form has been be put on the Diocesan website and there will be gatherings in May to explore the role, Francis Rowland diocesan pastoral team said.

Training will commence in September.



FÁILTE IRELAND'S AUTHORITY MEETS LOCAL KERRY TOURISM REPRESENTATIVES

TO DISCUSS THE RECOVERY OF KERRY TOURISM

The Authority (Board) of Fáilte Ireland held its March meeting in Killarney and afterwards took the opportunity to meet directly with representatives from the local tourism industry.

Discussions focused on recovery of tourism both nationally and in Kerry. They discussed Fáilte Ireland's work on the national issues facing the industry like the impact of the war in the Ukraine on the Irish tourism sector and staffing challenges in the industry. They also addressed how locally Fáilte Ireland can continue to build excellent visitor experiences in collaboration with tourism operators across Kerry.

Fáilte Ireland's Board meeting in Killarney coincides with the staging of Meitheal, Fáilte Ireland's longest running flagship trade event taking place over two days (31st March and 1st April) at the INEC. Meitheal has returned to an in-person format for the first time in two years. A major part of the Authority's agenda for its meeting was to hear directly from local tourism leaders and businesses about their challenges,

opportunities, and outlook for the season ahead and beyond. In turn the Authority's message to the representatives was one of collaboration, action and support for

the local Kerry tourism industry. In addition, a preview of Fáilte Ireland's new Killarney Destination Experience Development Plan (DEDP) was presented to the industry representatives ahead of its formal launch in the coming weeks. This Plan is one of four such strategic development plans being rolled out in Co. Kerry by Fáilte Ireland along with local industry Kerry County Council and other key stakeholders. Other DEDPs include Dingle Peninsula DEDP, launched 2020; Skellig Coast DEDP, launched 2017; The Cliff Coast DEDP, which is expected to launch in December 2022) and the West Cork Three Peninsulas & Kenmare, which is expected to be launched in May.

The local tourism stakeholders meeting with

KILLARNEY GROUPS AND PROJECTS BENEFIT

FROM 2022 COMMUNITY SUPPORT FUND

St. Patrick's Festival Killarney and the Wander Wild Festival have received funding from Kerry County Council.

The local authority has announced details of the allocation of €750,000 in funding support for community groups and projects across the county under the Community Support Fund for 2022. A total of 178 groups and projects received grant aid worth €385,000 this year while a proportion of the fund, totalling €365,000, is being retained to leverage funding from other funding streams for strategic projects at Municipal District level.

The fund, which is in its eighth year, has now supported 1,778 projects since 2015 to the value of €6m since its establishment. As occurred in previous years, some of the Community Support Fund will be used this year to target strategic projects in the five municipal districts and to co-fund projects which are in receipt of grants from other sources.

Councillors in the five Municipal Districts met during this week to decide on the allocations and unanimously welcomed the provision of support to the recipients. Councillors congratulated all the community groups and acknowledged the tremendous voluntary work that these groups do.

The Community Support fund is again successfully animating and empowering communities through projects, as groups across the county try to reconnect and recover

from the impact of the COVID 19 pandemic. The fund provides confidence to communities as we work together to rebuild and reconnect communities. For 2022, the fund will build on this and target funding under four categories of support:

THE MOST AMBITIOUS LEAVING **CERT REFORMS**

SINCE MINISTER DONOGH O'MALLEY'S 1967 FREE SECOND LEVEL EDUCATION



he demand for an overhaul of the Leaving Cert has been growing for some time. Minister Norma Foley has certainly answered the call with a progressive and exciting package of reforms called 'Equity and Excellence for All: where the student is at the centre of their Senior Cycle experience.'

When these reforms are implemented, the students' educational experience will be enriched, their wellbeing will be safeguarded, their stress levels will be reduced and their good mental health will be protected. The reforms will result in a much broader curriculum and nurture the students' interests and skills. The new Leaving Cert will provide a multifaceted assessment process, which will better prepare students for third level, further education, apprenticeships, traineeships and, ultimately, the world of work.

The reformed Leaving Cert will include new subjects and revised curricula for all existing subjects, with a significant emphasis on additional assessment components outside of the traditional final written exams. The issue of teachers assessing their own students will be difficult to sell, but hopefully a resolution, satisfactory to all stakeholders, can be arrived at. The proposed reforms are based on the Senior Cycle Review Advisory Report prepared by the National Council for Curriculum and Assessment (NCCA), based on extensive research over four years.

The reforms aim to enrich students' educational experience by providing choices to match their interests and by enhancing teaching and learning. They are designed to reduce the pressure on students by utilising on-going assessment in addition to a terminal exam at the end of two years of study.

The reforms are designed to better support students, to reduce pressure while maintaining standards, to keep pace with the changes in practices internationally and to better prepare young people for the world ahead. A selection of schools, representative of the different types and sizes of schools, will become "network schools," which will be given the opportunity to participate at an early stage in revised curriculum and assessment arrangements. These schools will receive support through a variety of forms to enable their participation.

The published document has set out a vision and programme of work which encompasses the following:

- new curricula for subjects across senior cycle and updating subject content
- new subjects, providing greater choice for students to better reflect their range of interests and to support the development of a wider range of talents and skills. Two new subjects - Drama, Film and Theatre Studies and Climate Action and Sustainable Development, will be ready for students in network schools starting in 5th year, 2024
- changing the assessment procedure to significantly reduce reliance on final exams and introduce teacher-based assessment components
- · Leaving Cert subjects will have assessment components worth 40% and a terminal written exam worth 60% of the total marks
- the State Examinations Commission (SEC) will externally moderate all school-based forms of assessment
- the initial tranche of new and revised subjects will be available in September 2024, when students entering 5th year in "network schools" will study updated subject curricula, with updated assessment models in the optional

subjects of Chemistry, Physics, Biology and **Business**

- · Leaving Cert students entering senior cycle in September 2023 will sit Paper 1 in English and Irish at the end of 5th year
- Oral exams and the Music practical performance will take place during the first week of the Easter break of 6th year, as is the case this year
- Leaving Cert Applied (LCA) students will have improved access to Mathematics and Modern Foreign Languages from September 2022, broadening the options for LCA
- · a new qualification will be introduced at levels one and two on the National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ) to provide an appropriate level of assessment to some students with special educational needs, building on the equivalent programme at Junior Cycle level
- a revised Transition Year programme will be established, and greater access to Transition Year for all students will be encouraged
- A Senior Cycle Programme Delivery Board will be established which will have responsibility for overseeing the achievement of actions forming part of this suite of reforms.
- · A detailed implementation plan will be developed through ongoing collaboration and co-creation and consultation with education partners, including teachers, students, school leaders and parents



ETB's also have

 A dedicated register of ICT devices (laptops, notebooks, tablets, and other mobile devices) to facilitate eLearning.


Kerry ETB's Further Education & Training (FET) service will play a key role in the delivery of ESOL (English Speakers of Other Languages) providing

What do you need? A roadworthy bike, a cycling helmet and a willingness to have a go!


What does it cost? The first 3 spins are free, thereafter participants will need to join the Killarney cycling Club Cycling Ireland.







MONEY MATTERS



If you haven't exercised in a long time, begin slowly with a low-impact aerobic activity that raises your heart rate, such as swimming.

For overall heart health, the American Heart Association recommends 30 minutes of aerobic activity 5 days per week, and 2 days per week of strength training. If a half-hour a day sounds daunting, think small. Even a 10-minute walk is a good start.

Exercise doesn't have to mean taking up a new sport. But if there's an activity that you enjoyed doing when you were younger (say, tennis or volleyball), look for a way to get back to it.

Myth 2: Ill hurt myself.

Not if you know what you're doing and work within your limits.

First, talk to your doctor before beginning an exercise program. They can tell you which activities to try and which ones to avoid.

When you get started, work with a pro who can show you exactly what to do. That way, you'll stay safe.

Remember, the more physically fit you are, the less likely you are to get injured. Improving your balance by doing things like yoga and tai chi may also help you avoid falls in your everyday life. So will strength training, which you can do with hand-held weights, machines at a gym, or even your own body weight (think pushups and lunges)

CONTACT LENSES

Most people who need to wear glasses can wear contact lenses.

There are two main types of contact lenses.

- · soft lenses which mould to the shape of your eye
- · rigid gas permeable lenses (RGP lenses) which are fitted closely to the shape of your eve and are less flexible. Most contact lenses fitted in Ireland are soft lenses. They are available as single-use daily, fortnightly and monthly disposable lenses, and more specialist lenses that are designed to last for longer.

Which type of contact lens is best?

The type of lens that is best for you will depend upon several factors. These include how often you want to wear your lenses – for example do you want to wear them just for certain activities such as sport, or do you want to wear them most of the time, instead of glasses?

As soft lenses are initially more comfortable than RGP lenses, they are ideal for people who only want to wear lenses occasionally. RGP lenses are a little more uncomfortable than soft lenses at first, so they take a bit more getting used to

Are contact lenses safe?

Modern contact lenses are very safe, as long as you follow advice about how to wear and look after them, and have regular check-ups. It is possible that anything that touches your eye



could introduce an infection.

I need to wear different glasses for distance and reading - can I have bifocal or varifocal contact lenses? When you reach your forties it is common to find that you need a different prescription for reading than you need for distance.

There are three main options to correct presbyopia with contact lenses:

- · You may choose to have contact lenses to correct your distance vision, and wear reading glasses over the top when you need them.
- · You may have multifocal contact lenses.

• You may wear lenses to have one eye corrected to see in the distance and one eve corrected for near vision. This is called monovision.

Each of the different options has advantages and disadvantages and we can help you decide which is best for you.



KERRY DAZZLE IN CROKE PARK CONFINES

National League Final: Kerry 3-19 Mayo 0-13

Well, I wasn't expecting that! I think most of us had Kerry as very slight favourites - I think Mayo are timing their run into the Championship slighter tighter than us, and the late changes and absence of the likes of Oisin Mullen, Paddy Durcan, and Diarmuid O'Connor and late cameos by Kevin McLaughlin and Cillian O'Connor are not factors to be overlooked in assessing this one - but that was a sublime Kerry performance. I don't place a lot of value in a League title in and of itself, it's not the trophy that people will talk about in later years, but that's no bad marker to lay down in Croke Park. Mayo opened the scoring, a good kick by Michael Plunkett. Pádraig Ó hÓra had already moved onto David Clifford, and that was a duel I was looking forward to. Ó hÓra is tight, sticky, has guick acceleration, and most especially is one of the few defenders with the actual muscle to match David. But it was made clear very fast that he was in for a tough afternoon, with David opening Kerry's account with a brilliant score under pressure. Stephen O'Brien's runs posed problems for Mayo all afternoon; he quickly doubled our tally. Paudie Clifford almost got in on goal, but Rory Byrne did well to save it. Mattie Ruane scored a class effort - Mayo were dangerous from distance, with Ryan O'Donoghue also unlucky with a shot off the post. Significantly, Kerry's defence mopped it up comfortably – it isn't that long ago that a stray ball like that in our square would have been like a fox in a henhouse for panic stations. They now look far more assured. Tadhq Morley, who was awesome in controlling the play, worked the ball up close before hand passing across – David was just a fingertip away from fisting it in, but Jordan Flynn did well to pressure the chance and it went wide.

Kerry upped an already high tempo. Adrian Spillane – again heroic in the trenches – fired over. Paul Geaney was only denied by hawkeye, and David was just an inch away from goaling from his brother's pass, but he was fouled in the build-up (I thought it was a harsh call on Mayo) and calmly converted the free. Paudie got in on the scoring act a minute later - Mayo couldn't handle the buzzing energy and multiplicity of threats by Kerry. 0-5 to 0-2.

Mind you, we got a let-off when another Mayo ball crashed down off the best to Conor Loftus, he just couldn't quite control it under pressure. James Carr fired over a great point from distance - Carr impressed me.

Paul Geaney and Jordan Flynn traded points. Kerry were hitting top gear now, though, and Mayo couldn't really live with us at this pace. Jack Barry worked hard to create and execute a score from a tight angle. David was denied by hawkeye. Then the goal which had always been threatening finally arrived, courtesy of a trademark lungbursting run by Gavin White. He slipped it on to Paul Gaeney, who did well to reach out his foot to tip it over the advancing defender. leapt highest to

fist it home - it took bravery as well as skill, he took a hard accidental knock from Ryan O'Donoghue in scoring it. Ó hÓra is giving David Clifford everything he can, including a fair amount of verbals and jostling – it's water off a duck's back to David as he fires over. Ryan O'Donoghue - he's not in the same category, but he's a super talent in his own right - replied and James Carr found a rare gap in the Kerry defence to add another. Conor Loftus fisted over a point to make it three in three minutes – are we in trouble?

Not really. There was no doubt about which team was on top, as Paudie Clifford forced another good save out of Rory Byrne. His brother angles over from the right – Ó hÓra had done everything right, and still couldn't stop him. Shane Ryan kicked a long distance beauty from the sideline, one of the best scores on a day that had a lot of them.

Ryan O'Donoghue teed up Michael Plunkett for the opening score of the second half, but a foul on Stephen O'Brien saw Paul Geaney reply. Aidan O'Shea, who worked very hard defensively for Mayo (he dissipated too much of his energy fighting fires; he's a great player but doesn't suit Mayo's fast-paced strategy) did well to block Dara Moynihan, but Paudie Clifford converted the resultant '45.

O'Shea is fouled on the burst, with Ryan O'Donoghue slotting over. Jack Barry is lucky enough to get away with a yellow card for a late challenge - that could easily have been black, to be honest. David Clifford can feel aggrieved, though, as he and Ó hÓra go into the notebook – it's obvious that the Mayo man is the aggressor all day. 

I suppose I'm starting to get a bit cynical in watching these things. This was glorious entertainment. A real old-fashioned shootout in glorious sunshine. Beautiful football to watch.

And there's a reason why the top teams don't indulge in shootouts any more. Winning, sadly but truthfully, is about efficiency more than daring. I don't like the harsh truth of it, but it's a possession game nowadays. Both Roscommon and Galway played with glorious abandon, but without guile. I do admire them....I just wouldn't fear them. I suppose we'll find out next year, with both sides meeting us in Division One.

It was 0-9 apiece at half-time, with Galway's Conor Flaherty pulling off a great save and the Tribesmen hitting the crossbar at the other end. In the second half Roscommon came flying out of the blocks - historically it was Galway who had a plethora of good shooters, but on this occasion Roscommon had a range of attacking options, not least of them Listowel Emmet's Conor Cox. Galway were surprisingly dependent on Paul Conroy's booming monsters from midfield – he was outstanding. Damien Comer had been well marshalled for the most part, but he cut loose as Galway really stepped up a gear. Once upon a time that would have led to Roscommon losing their way; they have a different steel about them now. The climax was fascinating, and it proved to be Roscommon who had the greater depths when it was most needed. That was a superb goal by Diarmuid Murtagh, straight out of the top drawer. Again, though, the cynic in me says that he got past no less than five defenders, all of whom seemed to expect some-one else to deal with the danger. Frankly, I'd be deeply unhappy if we gave that one away.

Galway face Mayo in their first outing in Connaught. Right now, even though Galway lost a very tight contest and Mayo were handed their heads by Kerry, you'd suspect that Pádraig Joyce has a bigger hill than James Horan to climb. Roscommon are perpetual dark horses, never top rank, but never easy.

It was a good weekend overall for Munster football. Tipperary and Cavan were provincial champions just two years ago and contested All Ireland semi-finals - granted, the one-off nature of the covid championship played a part, but their victories were merited. Both counties hit nadirs fairly soon after those zeniths, though - dropping to the fourth tier of the National League was a big fall in grace in the circumstances. Both have stabilised, though. Cavan deserved their win here - I've always been sceptical of the old adage that goals win games, but on this occasion it was perfectly correct. Paddy Lynch's two goals were the difference. Nonetheless David Power, who famously guided Tipperary to an All Ireland minor win back in 2011 (Shane Murphy and Tadhg Morley are the only remainers from the Kerry panel that they beat along the way) can look forward to the Munster Championship with hope, if not exactly confidence just yet.

PAIRC UÍ RINN

It's a huge talking point at the moment, understandably so. Unfortunately, most of the talk seems to be taking a circular route. Look, there's less blame to apportion out in this situation than a lot of commentators seem to think. Everybody involved has my sympathy,

because nobody has actually done anything wrong here. This is a confluence of events, almost a perfect storm. Given the enormous cost over-run of the revamp of Pairc Uí Caíomh, the GAA are perfectly right to plan fundraising concerts to offset that debt; they would be negligent in my view if they failed to maximise revenue for a stadium that is going to be filled maybe five times a year (allowing for the league format of the Munster Hurling Championship). That Ed Sheeran concert had to be moved because of covid – perfectly understandable. They fixed it for a date where it would be normally be fine to host it.

And then the GAA voted for a split county/ club season, which I absolutely support as the correct decision. Which moved the normal inter-county schedule forward on the calendar. Nobody planned for this to happen. Of course the GAA would not have fixed a concert to roughly coincide with a big GAA match in the stadium. No-one decided that the revenue was more important than the game.

The pitch would not recover in time after such a huge event, and I'm glad that reality is acknowledged. I remember Kerry playing Meath in the 2009 semi-final after such an event in Croke Park – players were slipping all over the place.

Pairc Uí Rinn as a venue was always going to present a problem. When renovations are completed, it will hold 11,000 spectators. Kerry and Cork in recent years has generally drawn double that, almost triple it in Killarney. The Munster Council will lose a lot of revenue here. Moreover, and possibly more important, a lot of genuine supporters won't be able to see the game live.

The Munster Council decided to move the game to the Fitzgerald Stadium, which could and often has hosted it. The Cork County Board didn't seem to protest the decision initially, but the players and management did come out and state that they would not send a team to Killarney for this. I can sympathise with it. They were looking forward to home venue to offset the big disadvantage that they are facing - let us remember what happened the last time they met at a Cork venue. I'd want my home venue for a game like that as well. They are the ones out training week after week, listening to criticism during a hard league from heroes on the terraces, trying to represent their communities and county with little enough hope of reward. They aren't getting anything out of Ed Sheeran's concert, you can be sure of that!

There are absolutely no villains here. None. Everybody is doing their best, but it's hard to see a solution. And the fact is that following on from 'Newbridge or nowhere', it looks like a precedent will be set one way or the other. The GAA want the bigger games in the bigger stadia; counties want to play on their home ground (it's a huge advantage in field sports). Kerry are quite right to stay completely out of it. Draw no enemy fire. We'll play them wherever the game is fixed, and that's all we need to concentrate on. We'll be hoping to focus on bigger battles down the line.

HURLING

Cork and Waterford is always a cracker, and so it proved once again. Waterford took the Division One title despite the absence of Austin Gleeson, and they look well primed for summer. Limerick will be favourites, of course, but Waterford have all the tools needed to match them. Including muscle. That for me was the key difference between Cork and Waterford last weekend. Cork have superb first touches. They are accurate, and they are fast. But hurling is very much a physical game now, and Cork simply lost out in too many of the fifty/fifty battles in that regard. They are very much on the right road, but I think they are still a year or two away. Could Waterford be the latest hurling county to break their long famine and lift Liam McCarthy? I'm not saying they will, but they will certainly be in real contention.

I couldn't help watching Westmeath v Down with a sense of what might have been. Westmeath were always in control of that one and were very worthy champions, but we really should have beaten Down to qualify for that final, and we would have had a cracking game against Westmeath – there's nothing between us, really. Of course, promotion is a poisoned chalice. The last two promoted sides, Offaly and Antrim, played in the relegation decider and it's Offaly who take the tumble back down to Division Two, having taken some severe hammerings en route. Hurling has a very competitive top tier, but there's a long drop down to tier two.

IRELAND'S FIRST BOXING OLYMPIAN PASSES AWAY


In 1952 John McNally was a raw but tough 19 year old. He had won the Irish Bantamweight crown a few months earlier, but actually had to win a box-off – Ireland's boxing authorities were worried that his lack of experience would come against him in Helsinki. They didn't know their man – yet.

He answered any doubts very quickly, overwhelming Alejandro Ortuosto. That put him into the quarter-final, where the experienced Italian Vincenzo Dall'Osso was hot favourite. McNally fought a clever fight, picking his shots and never letting Dall'Osso in close. That guaranteed him at least a bronze. The semi-final was a good fight, but a second round knock down by McNally gave him the win over his Korean opponent Joon-Ho Kang.

It was the home favourite Hamalainen in the final, and....well, in Olympic boxing, once the home boxer gets to the final, the result is practically a foregone conclusion. Hanalainen was cautioned eight times – eight times! - by the referee for hitting with the inside of the glove and for a head butt, but it made no difference. McNally was furious about the decision for years afterwards – it wasn't the most unjust decision in Olympic boxing, but it must be right up there on the list.

McNally went on to win bronze at the 1953 European Championships before turning pro and enjoying a successful career at the highest level, winning fourteen and drawing two of twenty five fights. He was inducted into the Irish Boxing Hall of Fame in 2008.

John McNally passed away peacefully at his home in Belfast last week. May he rest in peace.

Welcome back dear student, what is going on in Ukraine is utterly distressing. What is also upsetting is seeing the indifferent response of other nations against it. Last year, I heard the Lord ask 'where are the David's?' I believe He is still asking that - in the church, marketplace, governments and the nations (Psalm 2). David was a young man who, to natural eyes, looked like he was going to be destroyed, yet he bravely ran out onto the battlefield to take on the giant Goliath, without armour or battle weapons. All the experienced warriors of Israel cowered as this wicked giant came out every morning and evening to curse them - challenging them to fight him. No one dared because they were afraid. David dropped supplies to his older brothers who were in the army and heard the giants words, but instead of being intimidated by his size and bullying behaviour, a righteous anger rose up in David at the audacity of this giant to curse God and frighten His people.

Without a second thought, David volunteered to fight the giant! Everyone laughed at him — his brothers were embarrassed by him. King Saul, who had long since lost the anointing of God's Spirit because of disobedience (1 Samuel 15:22-26), decided to allow David to go out and fight Goliath. But David refused to wear Saul's armour. Instead he ran to meet the giant with only his slingshot and five stones he picked up from a nearby stream. He knew that God had anointed him and was with him, and he was motivated to defend the honour of the Lord of Heaven and Earth from the taunts of His enemies (1 Samuel 17:31-44). Goliath cursed David and mocked him as he came towards the giant, but David shouted back "you come to me with sword and spear but I come to you in the name of the Lord of Heaven's Armies - the God of the armies of Israel, Whom you have defied. Today the Lord will conquer you, and I will kill you and cut off your head. And then I will give the dead bodies of your men to the birds and wild animals, and the whole world will know that there is a God in Israel! And everyone assembled here will know that the Lord rescues His people, but not with sword and spear. This is the Lord's battle, and He will give you to us!" (1 Samuel 17:45-47 NLT)

As the giant came close it must have been frightening, but David carried something inside that Goliath knew nothing about. He had experienced the goodness of God while shepherding his father's sheep. God had delivered David from danger many times, and His Spirit ministered to David so that he knew God as his Friend and Protector (Psalm 23). The giant may have been bigger and better armed, but that was merely human strength which is no match for the Power of Almighty God (Psalm 18; Psalm 27; Psalm 28). David pulled one stone from his pocket and slung it at the giants head. It hit him right between the eyes with such force that it knocked him down and out. David took the giants own sword and killed him. We pray that the people of Ukraine will call upon the Lord Jesus who rescues from the lion and the bear and prevail over their enemy, in Yeshua's name, amen (Psalm 91:15-16).

FOCUS ON CONIFERS

For colour all year round you can't go wrong with conifers amd there are lots of different types to choose from.

When choosing a conifer they are usually classified under four sections. Dwarf which will grow from 1.5ft to 15ft. Medium 12ft t 50ft. Tall- anything over 50ft and finally ground cover or prostrate growing from about 2ft in height to a spread of anything from 2ft to 6ft. When choosing a dwarf conifer it is very important to remember that it can mean two things. It may describe a slow growing variety which will grow to about 2 to 3 ft after 10 to 12 years or it may mean that it will grow to its maximum height in a quicker time frame.

An ideal dwarf conifer to choose is Juniperus Communis Compressa which will not grow

more than 2 to 3 ft which makes it ideal for a rockery. There is also a big choice when it comes to medium confers.

So remember before you choose find out the mature height and spreads. Medium conifers are ideal for shrub beds as they will give you a good focal point and colour all year round whether it is green, gold or blue- grey. Tall conifers speak for themselves and are ideal for a large garden. Prostrate conifers are ideal for ground cover but make sure to remember that there are different varieties, dwarf, medium and large. Conifers are also ideal for centerpieces in pots and containers.
