reyWind have recently released their Gnew single, "Desolate," which was the featured song on the Home Grown Hero segment on Today FM's Dermot and Dave show last week.

GreyWind will be playing a headline show in Whelan's, in Dublin on December 12th, before their debut hometown show at the INEC on

December 29th where they will support the Coronas.

Paul explained that growing up their house was very musical, "Our mother was always singing and our father would be listening to Queen and Thin Lizzy." Paul said that upon leaving school both he and Stephanie knew that a conventional career path was not for them. Paul added, "all we ever wanted to do was play music, it was our biggest dream, we put everything into it, we did not want to go to college, we just wanted to form a band."

Paul confirmed that the band name GreyWind originates from Game of Thrones. In the show GreyWind is Rob Stark's direwolf. Paul explained, "that it was almost like a "Eureka" moment as both he and Stephanie felt the name perfectly encapsulates our style of music." Paul added that both he and Stephanie are close and they share the same musical tastes.

Paul explained, "that growing up in Killarney, we could never find other members to form a band and we felt we could not wait anymore, so we booked ourselves into a studio in Belfast in 2014 and recorded our first song, "Afterthoughts."

Success was instantaneous. The day after posting it online all the major studios were eager to sign GreyWind. Paul admits that this was very unusual and at the time it was a bit surreal. However Paul attributes their success to "hardwork."

GreyWind recorded their debut album "Afterthoughts" in Texas. The album charted in the official UK rock charts. Since then GrevWind have gone from strength to strength, playing some of the biggest festivals in the world, including Reading, Leeds and Isle of Wight.

Paul revealed, "that I did not start playing guitar until I was 18, but Stephanie and I honed our craft with a lot of practice and effort." Paul added that their greatest motivation, "is to inspire people," and he believes that their own meteoric rise is proof that people can achieve their dreams.



Point. The resultant 'Atlantic Discovery App' is now available for download.

The 'Atlantic Discovery App' contains rich community derived location specific information such as sites of interest, walks, activities, current events, and amenities. It also guides you to your next stop along the WAW while highlighting points of interest along the intervening route.

A line of cones wont stop a speeding cap, but you can'

Council launches campaign to improve safety at roadworks sites.

Kerry County Council has launched a new campaign to promote awareness of the responsibilities of motorists approaching or driving past roadworks which are underway on the county's roads.

Dangerous driving at roadworks where a onelane system or diversions are in place can endanger the safety and lives of council staff or those contracted to carry out works on behalf of Kerry County Council.

The awareness campaign is aimed at reminding motorists of the need to approach roadworks with care, to drive past roadworks slowly and carefully and to heed advisory signage and the presence of traffic cones at roadworks locations. Safety Officer with Kerry County Council, Tim O'Sullivan said motorists should observe four simple principles when approaching roadworks: Adhere to the speed limit on display; follow the temporary road signage in place; stay alert for roadworkers and machinery; and keep a safe distance from the vehicle in front.

"At any given time, there are multiple road repair and maintenance works taking place around the county with varying numbers of workers at different locations. To all intents and purposes, these working location constitute the workplace of those individuals and they are entitled to carry out their work in a safe environment.

"Part of ensuring that these workplaces are

It is understandable that delays caused by roadworks can lead to frustration, but we are asking drivers to drive past roads workers as if they were family members. They might not be the driver's family, but they are someone's.

"A significant problem can be motorists breaking red lights at roadworks where temporary traffic lights are in place. This endangers the safety of the motorist themselves, other road-users and

done.

"With the patience and cooperation of all roadusers, we can ensure that motorists and workers alike avoid accidents, injury or worse. So, our main message is: A line of cones won't stop a speeding car, but you can," he added.

The publicity campaign will take place on Kerry County Council's social media accounts over the coming weeks.







The Probationary period – a guide for employers

Most permanent contracts of employment should provide for a probationary period, usually of six months in duration. The purpose of a probation period is to allow the employer a fixed period of time to evaluate the suitability of the new employee for their role based on performance and behaviour.

KEY POINTS FOR SUCCESSFUL PROBATION MANAGEMENT:

- Plan your probation period as part of the On-boarding process for all your new hires.
- Include in the employees contract that employment is subject to a probation period.
- Ensure you have clearly set out the length of time for the probation period and that the probation can be extended, and for how long.
- Have procedures on how you will manage issues during the probation period specifying how you will implement your disciplinary procedures during this period or have a separate probation procedure.

· Have regular review points during the probation period to give feedback and guidance on performance or company standards.

Whatever your defined procedures are, ensure you apply and follow them fairly during the probation period, this may well come under scrutiny if it is examined afterwards.

Document and file each stage of the process, where applicable; meetings, warnings, extensions, confirmations, terminations.

· Manage the probation process in a timely manner -- if the period of probation passes and you have not confirmed anything with the employee, it may be too late to commence probation procedures a month or so after the probation end date.

During 2019 a number of volunteers from St. Brigid's, Killarney, Holy Cross Mercy, Presentation Castleisland, Fossa N.S. Currow N.S & Cordal N.S. visited EmbulBul. They spent time assisting at the feeding program, visiting homes of families in need, and experiencing life in Bro. Beausang School. In August the highly successful Summer Camp continued with 30 boys and girls from the slum village engaging in a range of fun activities and educational pursuits.

well as primary and secondary schools the project continues to help people in a number of ways. The school sponsorship program is helping a large number of children achieve an education, the feeding program provides a hot meal to 80 boys and girls each weekday evening at cost of 650 euro per month, the furniture program, supported by Electric Aid Ireland is providing beds and furnishings for needy families. A number of students continue to be supported in further education, in April 2020 Charles will graduate with a Business degree thanks to a bursary received from K.E.P. Eliud is now in second year of teacher training, and Lucy is due to graduate in September with a science degree while Jecinta now employed continues her secretarial studies. Recently some money was donated to help complete a hostel for girls on the grounds of the school.

CC launches Social Farming Course

or the past three years Kerry farmer Breeda O'Sullivan has been participating in social farming with her namesake, Breda O'Sullivan. Every week for the past three years Breda travels to the farm in Glencar and spends time with the O'Sullivan family and the animals on the farm.

Now a course to up skill farmers to work with people with disabilities on their farm has been launched by University College Cork (UCC).

UCC's Adult Continuing Education and Applied Social Science departments in conjunction with the Skellig Centre for Research and Innovation came together to offer a Certificate in Practice Support in Social Farming. The oneyear programme will provide students with the

skills to work with people with disability both on social farms and in a community setting.

"We listened to the farming community and they wanted a course that gives them the confidence to work with people with disabilities" commented Belinda Gascoigne, Manager of the Skellig Centre for Research and Innovation. "We are half way through our first course and it is inspiring to see the interest and community being grown around social farming in Ireland."

"Rural Ireland has been getting lonelier and lonelier and as one thing after another closes, social farming has drawn our community together. Breda has become part of our family and you just have to look at the scrapbook she keeps of her visit here to see how much it means

to her. Every week I participate in UCC's new course and it has helped build my confidence and understanding."

The course was officially launched by the Minister for State at the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport, Brendan Griffin TD.

Social Farming Ireland has grown out of a cross-Border project in which farmers from six counties in the Republic trained with farmers in six counties in Northern Ireland to become social farmers. Social Farming has seen growth across Ireland and it currently operates in farms in Kerry, Tipperary, Carlow, Kilkenny and Waterford.



Sunday will give Dr. Crokes to put some clear daylight between themselves and the rest of the winners of the Kerry county championship when it comes to the leader board of Senior County Football titles.

Currently sitting on 13, the Lewis Road outfit are already ahead on the all-time leader board of Austin Stacks with 12 while Laune rangers, John Mitchel's and South Kerry all have 10 each. Crokes who won their first title in 1901 when they defeated Cahirciveen 1-2 to 0-2, have a habit of collecting their titles in bunches. They won three in a row between 1912-1914. They then had to wait 77 years before they collected their 5th title in 1991 and added their 6th in 2000 and waited another ten years for title number 7 in 2010. That win led to them winning four in a row in a run that ended in 2013. Having watched Austin Stacks win in 2014 and South Kerry in 2015. It was time for another big run, which could end with another four in a row on Sunday, having won in 2016,

2017 and 2018.

Meanwhile their opponents East Kerry who currently have 7 county championships look to end a big drought of 20 years on Sunday as they last won the Bishop Moynihan in 1999. That win ended a three in a row run having won 1997 and 1998.

That was their second three in a row record having won in 1968, 1969 and 1970 previously. Their first title was won in 1965.





THE MORE THINGS CHANGE THE MORE THEY STAY THE SAME

Dr. Crokes will be seeking their eight county title in ten years on Sunday. Donal Barry spoke to selector Niall 'Botty' O'Callaghan and team captain Brian Looney ahead of Sunday's County Senior Football Final.



It has been such a long road for Brian Looney in the Dr. Crokes jersey that it does not jump out at him that he will lead his team out for the last county championship final of the decade having already secured victory as captain in the first year of the decade.

"I haven't thought about it in that way, but it is a great honour to be bestowed upon you especially in a team that is full of great leaders. The captaincy does not change my approach to games. That win in 2010 was the 'monkey off our back' after trying so hard in the late noughties. South Kerry were our big obstacle at the time, so it was great to get over that hurdle."

The more things change the more things stay the same and Dr. Crokes have a great knack of replacing great players with a fresh current crop. Two big names from the first win of the decade have gone from the dressing room and Looney once a young player has now taken on a leadership role that was once the jobs of Eoin Brosnan and Colm Cooper in particular.

"It's a small adjustment especially when they were heroes of yours growing up. I was privileged to share a dressing room with both for 14 years and they were a big part of both the dressing room and the team. They have stepped away from it, but we are now looking at the younger fellas in the dressing room and those who have been around a bit longer to step up. Colm and Eoin are missed in their own way with the qualities they brought to the team, but I don't think it has had a massively negative impact on the group. It's a bit unusual for them as well I suppose to be on the outside looking in on the sidelines. We have fellas there that will step up when we need them and that is the



Calling players out is a sentiment that is shared by team selector Niall "Botty" O'Callaghan as he speaks about handling a dressing room full of experienced players.

"You have to look at the serious job that Edmund O'Sullivan has done in keepina it seamless because you have an experience dressing room. So if it is not right the players will tell you it is not right. We have a culture of setting the bar very high. It creates the hunger within the group. We want the challenge. Our fellows need the challenge. They need to get up for something. To be the best is what challenges these fellows at this stage. This is probably the toughest obstacle we have faced through East Kerry. They are a serious outfit, well coached and well drilled." Some of that credit O'Callaghan offers with a smile could be down to the Dr. Crokes themselves. "the killing thing about it is Vince Cooper is the local GDA in being an ex Crokes player and he is doing a phenomenal job and he impacts on all the local clubs in East Kerry and he is doing such a fabulous job that there is phenomenal talent in East Kerry.

In saying that O'Callaghan is an admirer of his opponents next Sunday.

"They are producing the goods, they got caught last year. I do not thing they will never get caught like that again. David Clifford has taken his game to a new level. What can you say about Paudie Clifford. If you were picking a team of the championship, he would certainly be one of those. You have two teams in the county final next Sunday and there is only one starter on the Kerry team. It says a lot abbot the talent around this county. These fellows are chomping at the



bit; it sets up well for Kerry in the future but for our point. East Kerry bring pace. They have all played with Kerry at some level. They won Kerry under 21's. The thing I would give them is pace; they have pace at every level on the field."

So what would a win for Dr. Crokes mean on Sunday for O'Callaghan.

"look It is the old dog for the long road against the new bucks coming up. It promises to be a great one. From a Crokes point of view if we can get over next Sunday it will probably be the best win in the last ten years that we have been involved."

EAST KERRY NOT LOOKING BACK BUT LOOKING FORWARD

East Kerry are back in a county final for the first time since 1999 with a team who were largely toddlers at the time they were last Kings of Kerry football. Donal Barry caught up with their manager Jerry O'Sullivan and player Jack Sherwood ahead of the big day for their thoughts about it.

East Kerry manager Jerry O'Sullivan leads his side into next Sunday's County Senior Football Final and insists that he is enjoying the role having brought the Divisional side back to the final after three attempts. Having taken on the role in 2017, O'Sullivan has been edging closer with each passing year and has enjoyed success along the way with two under 21 county titles. O'Sullivan points to the commitment of his players as a key ingredient in getting down to the last two.

"You still have to go and ask a fellow do they want to be involved and are they willing to put in the commitment and are they willing to come down training when they are in College when the club season is over for some of them. So you still have get commitment from the players and in fairness these bunch have been exceptional to the point that you just tell them when training is on and they just show up, they won't give you an excuse." Along with the commitment East Kerry are developing a culture of winning and this sets them up for a crack at the big one.

"These guys know how to win. Be that at Schools level, minor level or under 21 level either with Kerry or with East Kerry. These boys are jovial heading into games. You'd be saying to yourself are these guys ready for a game at all. The culture has changed around this; they just deal with it and get on with it.

It is a culture that leads to an enjoyment that is seen both on and off the field by the Firies man especially now as they play their first final in 20 years.

"It is there to be enjoyed. You have to enjoy these things. Sometimes you might not be there for another twenty years so you have to enjoy it when they (Finals) come along. Football has to be serious to a point but you have to enjoy it. If you do not enjoy it you will not perform and if you will not perform you will not do not win. If you don't win you are not here at all."

Another person who is enjoying it is returned Kerry Star Jack Sherwood who admits that his performances with East Kerry in 2018 opened the door to his Inter County return. Something he believed had passed him. He will line out on Sunday as almost a "daddy" like figure at just 28 years, such is the youth that East Kerry process. It is a role he is relishing and is quick to praise his manager Jerry O'Sullivan.

"I have played with him with Firies since 2008 with the seniors and I know him very well. He is a great man to bounce ideas off and has a good relationship with all the lads. Every fellow respects him. He is clued in because he has been involved with Limerick under 20's, so he knows the mind set of these young lads and he can tell them what they need to know and bring them on. He is on their wavelength."

Last year's abrupt end to the East Kerry journey was hard to take for Sherwood and it has been used as a motivation, that and every loss along the way.

"Last year's semi final was a sickner. It was very upsetting especially as we hit such a good run of games. We beat Dingle fairly comprehensively earlier in the year and then you always give yourself a bit of a chance. Kilcummin had such a strong team and they gave us a few experienced lads, so we definitely gave ourselves a good chance. The first day we probably left in too many goals. We brought it back from nine points. It was a killer especially when you get so close. We lost the rally to Mid Kerry in 2011 and they went onto win it. So when you get to the semi final they are the worse games to lose .Winning last weekend was only about that winning. Scraping over the line. We got motivation from a lot of last two years games. We played Stand Road a few years ago in Austin Stack Park and they gave us a nice touch. We had Dingle this year who had beaten us last year. So we used that motivation and we had Brendan's last weekend who beat us already and we used that as well. So every game we have lost in recent times has given us motivation"

Unlike many of his teammates Sherwood is still awaiting his first county medal at any grade and Firies men will hope to end that wait on Sunday.







Margaret's Ramblings

COFFEE STAIN REMOVAL TRICKS:

*To remove coffee stains on your furniture start by soaking up as much of the spilled coffee as possible with paper towels. Then put a few drops of ordinary laundry detergent onto a sponge and rub the stain in a careful circular motion so the stain doesn't spread any further. If it is an especially persistent stain, just clean the sponge and get to work with the detergent again until it's faded. Then wipe the area down with a fresh wet sponge.

*To remove coffee stains from a carpet blot the spilled coffee with paper towels. If the stain has already dried out, add a little warm water and then blot with a dry cloth. Mix 1 tablespoon of white vinegar with an equal portion of washing up liquid in two cups of warm water, rub the stain from the outside to prevent the spreading of the stain, until it is gone completely. This will also clean car seats.

*To get rid of fresh coffee stains from clothing firstly sprinkle the affected area with table salt so the stain cannot spread. After a minute or two, brush off the coffee-absorbed salt with a paper towel. Run the back of the stain under cold water for about 15 minutes, then treat with small amounts of laundry detergent. Finally, apply a little white vinegar onto the stain and scrub with a toothbrush. After that, let the garment sit for fifteen minutes and then put it in the washing machine.

For old dried in stains dab the stained part of the garment with an extremely small amount of lemon juice. After the lemon juice has dried, rub some laundry detergent onto the affected area until the stain is removed. Then, rinse the garment with warm water and after it dries, it will be suitable for a normal wash in the washing machine.

*To removing coffee stains from a kitchen counter that have become a cold, brown, and almost-solid mess, crack an ordinary egg, very carefully into a dish, and separate the white of the egg from the yolk. Using a cloth, apply the yolk generously to the stained area and let it sit for a minute or two until it is semi-dry. Then rinse the area thoroughly.

ENGLISH ANIMAL LOVING SENIOR CITIZEN IS SAVING OTTERS:

82-year-old Daphne Neville has spent the last forty years of her life raising rescued otters so she can raise awareness for the furry water dwelling animals.

An actress by trade, she adopted her first otter in 1980 after a friend remarked on how her 18th-century converted water mill offered the perfect conditions for their care. She says she, her husband, and three children didn't know anything about otters. "We were just a normal family. But then we wanted to raise awareness about their future, we fought so hard for their safety. Clean water is pivotal for the future of otters and all living creatures and she campaigned tirelessly alongside big names such as the legendary Sir David Attenborough in order to urge water companies to clean the country's rivers. They had become so polluted with the PCB chemical (polychlorinated biphenyl) that the wild otter was almost extinct; however, their actions prompted

Michael Meacher, then environment minister under Tony Blair, to announce plans to phase out PCBs and since then the rivers have visibly improved.

Rudi is just one of her successful rescues and he even goes with her to the shops—but people don't mind she says because he always looks "cozy and happy". Now 14 years old, the docile Asian small-clawed otter has been living with Ms. Neville since his mother abandoned him when he was about three weeks old. "I've shown people you can have incredible bonds with these creatures. We do shows all over the place. People come from miles away—especially from Australia and New Zealand because they don't have otters there."






