

"We would like to thank our 24 dancers who put in a huge amount of time and effort in preparation for the night and also our choreographer Joe Burkett whose talent and enthusiasm ensured that the show was enjoyed by all", she added. Down Syndrome Kerry Branch is a vibrant voluntary organisation which provides support to over 260 members and their families throughout the county of Kerry. "We in Down Syndrome Kerry believe that all our members have huge potential and our aim is to help them to make their own futures as bright and independent as possible by providing them with education, support and friendship every step of the way". "DSK is financed completely through fundraising. The two main services we provide are speech and language therapy and occupational therapy. We employ 2 speech therapists and 2 occupational therapists who work in several bases throughout the County to ensure all our members are catered for", she said. Down Syndrome Kerry also provide many different services throughout the County depending on the needs in the area. Therapeutic horse riding lessons, therapeutic swimming lessons, cooking classes, early intervention groups, physiotherapy, to name but a few.

'Latch On' is a programme delivered in the Institute Of Technology Tralee which aims at improving adult literacy and political awareness.

Down Syndrome Kerry also run Deenagh Lodge

Tea rooms in Killarney which provides training for our adult members with Down Syndrome in catering skills and their 321 Charity Shop in Tralee which provides training in retail skills. These projects will hopefully lead some of the adult members to full time employment.



The Junior and Leaving Cycle Frameworks highlight how religion and religious education contribute to the spiritual and moral development of young people. The speakers for the evening addressed how Religious Education plays a vital role in supporting young people as they begin to ask significant questions and formulate their own way of living and also addressed the place of R.E. in the revision of the Junior Cycle Framework.

The guest speakers for the afternoon were Dr. Amalee Meehan and Mr. Declan Coyle:

Dr. Amalee Meehan works with CEIST in the area of faith leadership and governance and teaches part-time in Mary Immaculate College, Limerick. Her address will explore the situation regarding the increasing loneliness and lack of resilience documented among young people and the ongoing spiritual hunger prevalent in Western culture. a vital function in addressing identity and rootedness, in discovering who and whose we are. The address will conclude by showing how religious education can contribute significantly to the vision and values of the Junior Cycle Framework.

The second speaker, Declan Coyle, is an internationally known management consultant, motivator, and mentor, with a

background in theology. Declan will address the Red and Green Platform system, a system of leadership and motivation which has revolutionised leadership thinking in companies. In addition to being the director of Andec Communications, Declan has worked with government ministers and departments, multi-national companies and charities.

CHRISTMAS TREATS FOR CYCLISTS



The Killorglin Cycling Club's annual Christmas Hamper Ride takes place this Sunday, December 11th starting at 10am at the Sports Complex. Sign on opens at 8.45am for one of the most popular annual pre-Christmas rideouts with a fee of €15 for Cycling Ireland licence holders and €17 for non-members.

THE EVENT: Riders have the choice of a 50km or 75km route both of which are ridden at a controlled speed until the pace pulls away and dash for home begins. The first three riders home over the longer distance and the first rider from the shorter distance will take home hampers. However there are plenty of prizes left to be shared out by raffle between the rest of the riders! This will take place in the Killorglin Community Centre where refreshments, hot food and showers will also be provided after the ride.

THE ROUTE: The 50km route takes the riders on a relatively flat loop from Killorglin through Killarney, Farranfore, Firies, Milltown and back to Killorglin and is also suitable for u16 who are not allowed on the longer route.

MESSIAH TO RAISE THE ROOF OF FRIARY

A performance of Handel's magnificent Messiah will be given by the Kerry Chamber Choir and Orchestra and solists Aisling O'Carroll (Soprano), Martha O'Brien (Contralto), Patrick Hyland (Tenor) and David Howes (Bass) and Vivienne Johnson (Trumpet) under the baton of Aidan O'Carroll directing from the keyboard in the beautiful surroundings of the Franciscan Friary Killarney on Sunday, December 11th at 8pm.

The Messiah's fame and enduring popularity arise from the dramatic and thrilling music of movements such as For unto us a child is born, Glory to God, He shall feed his flock, The trumpet shall sound and, of course, the Halleluja Chorus. It appeals to all music lovers, not just classical buffs. For many it is the highlight of the Christmas festival. "We have assembled a superb multi award winning team of young soloists - all professional singers" says Aidan O' Carroll "and the Chamber Choir can sing Messiah standing on it's head."

Handel was invited to Dublin, the empire's second city at that time, by the Lord Lieutenant to give a series of concerts. While in Dublin he set about writing the Messiah in the form of a sacred oratorio - an un-staged opera. Legend has it that the work was written in a fever of invention in nineteen days. Its premiere was on April 13th, 1742 in Neil's Music Hall, Fishamble Lane, Dublin, close to Christ Church. Its success was immediate and a large number of extra performances had to be arranged. Gentlemen were requested in the broadsheets of the time to "leave off their swords" and ladies their hoops so that the maximum number of places might be created for the eager public.

Kerry Chamber Choir and Orchestra made their debut in April 1992 with a sold out performance of the Messiah at Siamsa Tire. They have since performed it on many occasions in Tralee, Killarney, Cahersiveen and Listowel and have recorded two DVD's of the work. This 25th Anniversary performance is also being recorded and excerpts will be broadcast on Radio Kerry on Wednesday, December 21st from 6-8pm.

NO IMMEDIATE PLANS TO CARRY OUT A DEER CULL IN KERRY

Minister for State at the Department of Arts, Heritage, Regional, Rural and Gaeltacht Affairs Michael Ring TD has recently in a reply in a Dail Question to Michael Healy Rae stated that his Department carries out localised annual deer counts on State lands such as the National Parks. Where appropriate, and depending on the annual count and instances of damage caused by deer to habitats, especially woodland, culls may be carried out to ensure that deer populations do not reach levels that would have negative ecological consequences. Control of deer on private property is the responsibility of landowners, who may apply to my Department for a permission under section 42 of the Wildlife Acts to cull deer where this is necessary outside the annual open seasons. These permissions offer a facility whereby a person can obtain a permit, on a case by case basis, to prevent serious damage caused by individual deer on specific lands. Permissions are only issued where there is evidence of such damage.

Michael Healy Rae TD asked the Minister about putting more fencing in areas of high incidents with deer, The Minister stated "With regard to calls for increased fencing in relation to incidents of deer presence on public roads, my Department has no plans to fence the National Parks. Deer, albeit larger, are like other wild animals in this country and it is not part of the remit of my Department, nor indeed would it be generally possible, to cordon them onto specific areas of land. Moreover, fencing the National Parks would not be a viable solution and would not achieve the desired results or

serve any practical purpose in terms of wild deer control or management"

The Minister stated "My Department is of the view that improving sight lines for motorists as well as improved (and possibly larger) signage is likely to be the most effective measure to assist motorists to be vigilant when driving through areas where populations of deer can be expected. Officials from my Department have discussed this approach with the relevant County Council and I understand that it has prepared a scheme of works, which includes a number of measures such as the trimming back of overhanging tree branches and enhancement/relocation of roadside signs In relation to deer policy in general, my Department, together with the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine, published Deer Management in Ireland – A Framework for Action in 2015, which recommends a series of actions on deer management and conservation in a number of areas, including addressing the impact of deer in places where they are widespread. An Irish Deer Management Forum has been established to implement the various actions listed in the Report. The Forum itself comprises representatives from the main stakeholder areas such as landowners, forestry, hunting and conservation organisations, as well as representatives from both Departments" Michael Healy Rae says " I condemn the Departments lack of action in this very important issue and more needs to be done with this urgently".

KILLARNEY MUNICIPAL DISTRICT MEETING

Cllr. Brendan Cronin submitted the following **Noticees** of Motion to the Killarney Municipal District Meeting recently.

NoM 9. Cllr. B. Cronin: To request the TII to recognise the high traffic volume on the

N72 Beaufort to Ballymalis Road and to provide adequate funding to properly resurface this section of a major tourist route.

Reply: This section of roadway the N72 from Beaufort Bridge towards Ballymalis is due to be overlaid in early 2017 and extensive drainage works will be carried out as part of this overlay. Currently the works are at the procurement stage.

NoM 10. Cllr. B. Cronin: When will road reinstatement take place following mains replacement on the road from Muckross Church Junction through the Black Road and North past Loretto National School. This section of road is in a deplorable condition and now has 87 new manholes. Can Kerry County Council ensure that when an allocation is made for mains replacement, that enough money is included to properly repair the road.

Reply: The entire width of the roadway at Black Road and North past Loretto School will be upgraded in the 2nd Quarter 2017 following the water mains replacement. The patching unit will carry out works on these sections of roadway this week so that they are maintained until the final road surfacing works take place next year. It is expected to fund these works with a combination of the Irish Water's reinstatement monies and the Restoration Maintenance monies. Irish Water allows appropriate funding to reinstate the trench only, but do not include funding to restore the entire roadway.

NoM 11. Cllr. B. Cronin: Is there adequate funding to reinstate the roads from Flynn's Forge to Aglish, and Faha School towards Rockfield following completion of recent water mains replacement.

Reply: Kerry County Council intend to upgrade

those sections of roadway, the L-7039, Flynn's Forge to Aglish and the L-11007, Faha School towards Rockfield following the watermain replacement in the 2nd Quarter 2017. It is expected to fund this work with a combination of the Irish Water's reinstatement monies and the Restoration Maintenance monies. Irish Water allows appropriate funding to reinstate the trench only, but do not include funding to restore the entire roadway.

Q14. Cllr. B. Cronin: Can the dangerous lags from Finnegan's Cross towards Lisroe be repaired.

Reply: Repair works will be carried out on the on the lags from Finnegan's Cross towards Lisroe this week.

TODAY IS INTERNATIONAL ANTI-CORRUPTION DAY

International Anti-corruption Day was launched on October 9th 2003 by the General Assembly of the United Nations as a way of raising awareness of corruption and highlighting the role of the United Nations Convention against Corruption in combating and preventing it.

Corruption could be one of the biggest tragedies of mankind for the simple reason that it is ongoing and extremely difficult to combat, forcing the poor into ever more hopeless conditions while the select few in power get ever richer and more powerful. Bribes prevent chosen criminals from ever having to take responsibility for what they've done, politicians employ all of their cronies as as soon as the get into office, police officers cooperate with drug dealers, and anyone who dares object is either blackmailed into silence or "mysteriously" disappears. In 2014, some of the most corrupted countries in the world were Haiti, Iraq, North Korea, Venezuela, Somalia and Afghanistan.

Some of the ways in which governments around the world, private businesses, non-governmental organisations, the media and the general public can get involved are by organising creative activities, reporting incidents of corruption, using the UN's anticorruption logo on publications and at events, and spreading the message through social networks such as Twitter and Facebook. A 9 YEAR OLD HERO AND A WARNING TO PARENTS

Tila Levi of South Florida was distracted for just a few seconds, but it was enough time for her infant son to fall off his nappy changing table. Ms. Levi was getting ready to put her five children to bed. She was changing the nappy of Eitan, one of her 11-month old twins, when she turned around to help another son, Zion, with his homework. Eitan was lying on his back on the nappy -changing table, about 4 feet high, when he rolled off and began falling. His 9-year-old brother Joseph ran, stretched out his arms and lunged to catch the baby in mid-air, much like a soccer goalie trapping a ball. His impressive catch, which happened on Sept. 29th, was recorded by a security camera in the twins' bedroom in the Levi home in Bal Harbour. "I was getting everyone ready for bed. I was home alone with the kids. Really, I am not proud of what happened. When you're taking care of a lot of things at the same time, sometimes you don't pay attention and you mess up," Ms. Levi said. "First I was embarrassed. I am a good mother who takes care of her kids, and I just turned away for a second. I wasn't ready to share this video until now. But I realised that this is a truly miraculous story, that I was lucky to have lived it, and that it could happen to anyone," said the 35-year-old mother.

The first thing she said to Joseph was that he was a hero, "I told him, 'You saved your little brother. You saved his life." Ms. Levi added. "Joseph was not even in the room. He came in to ask me a question, saw the baby and ran to catch him." Ms. Levi said she decided to share the video with the news media to keep others from making the same mistake. "It could happen to anyone," she said. "Obviously, I am more careful now, but things can happen in one second. Our lives can change in one second".

EVER THINK OF ADOPTING A NEW CHRISTMAS TRADITION?

Deb Mills and her family started a new Thanksgiving tradition 16 years ago. On a tablecloth are the names of everyone she's shared Thanksgiving with in her home during that time. Each year she uses a different colour pen, it has scribbles of grandparents and special messages, grandchildren have handprints from their first holidays, close family friends sign and she says there are so many cherished memories tied into this.

She then she embroiders the names each year,

along the edge is a key of what colour goes with what year. Ms. Mills says the table cloth is a treasure to her and she is so grateful to have the signatures of those who have died especially.








GARDENING JUTLOOK

FOCUS ON HARDWOOD CUTTINGS

Hardwood cuttings are a pretty easy and a very reliable method of propagating a wide range of deciduous shrubs, climbers and fruit bushes,

Most deciduous shrubs are ideal for taking hardwood cuttings, for example Buddleja (Butterfly Bush) Ribes (Flowering Current), Viburniums or Forsythia and the same applies to a lot of deciduous climbers like honeysuckles and Jasmine plus fruit bushes like black currants and gooseberries.

The best time to take hardwood cuttings is when the plant is dormant which is from about mid Autumn until late Winter but the ideal time would be just after the leaves fall off the plant or just before the buds start to burst in early Spring.

These types of cuttings may be slow to roots however it is very successful.

Do you find yourself repeating similar patterns in different relationships or in a particular relationship over time. Perhaps you often feel lonely or jealous in your relationships. Maybe you try to earn the other person's attention by being overly nice or giving without paying heed to your own needs or desires. Do you fear rejection or being abandoned? Could it be that you choose partners who are distant and can make your feel and/ or believe that you're not good enough. Do you focus so much on your partner that they feel stifled? Often these patterns can reflect our inner experiences and our beliefs about ourselves and our emotional availability to others.

Psychologist John Bowlby defined attachment as a 'lasting psychological connectedness between human beings' and attachment theory can help us to understand the ways in which we connect with others – particularly those who are emotionally significant to us. We develop our attachment style in childhood – and the way in which our parents and/or caregivers responded to us will impact on our relationships.

For example, a child who believed that the only way he/she could be loved was when they were doing something for others, may grow up believing that they need to earn the attention and love of others. Adults who believe they are inadequate and unworthy of love may have learned this in their early years - which will inevitably lead to difficulties in their relationships. They may believe that the other will leave them or that they are going to disappoint the other – leading to them clinging to the relationship and/or getting jealous easily.

However, the good news is that with awareness we can discover our own attachment style and learn to cultivate healthier relationships. Some of the ways in which we can bring more awareness to our relationship patterns include the following:

- 1. Bring your awareness to your bodily sensations. How do you feel in your body? Being aware of this can help you to understand how you are feeling and/or thinking.
- 2. What thoughts are you thinking about you/ the other? How do these thoughts impact on your feelings and emotions?
- 3. Which emotions do you struggle with how do these emotions affect your thoughts and beliefs about yourself?
- 4. Are you overly self-critical? Can you show yourself some selfcompassion, support and care the way you might a close friend or a small child?
- 5. Learn to communicate more directly about your thoughts, feelings and needs. Once you become aware of what these are then you can express them more fully to others.

Next week we will focus on the importance of communication and how counselling can help us to find our own voice, and become more confident as we make ourselves known to another person.

IMPORTANT DATES REMINDER

REFUND CLAIMS DEADLINE

Remember that there is a four-year time limit for claiming income tax refunds. Your Tax Repayment Claim for 2012 must be received by Revenue no later than 31 December 2016.

So if you have paid medical expenses that are not covered by the State or by private health insurance, you may claim tax relief on some of those expenses. These expenses include the costs involved in nursing home care. You can claim tax relief on medical expenses you pay for yourself and on behalf of any other person.

You can claim tax relief on fees paid for approved Third Level, Foreign Languages and Informational Technology courses in respect of any person as long as you have paid the qualifying fees, which include Tuition fees and Student contribution (post 2011). Income tax relief is not due on administration fees, examination fees, or registration fees and any part of the fees that are covered by grants, scholarships, an employer or otherwise.

IT'S TIME TO PAY YOUR CAPITAL GAINS TAX


If you sold, gifted or transferred an asset between 1 January and 30 November 2016, or if you received capital payments from such assets, you must pay any Capital Gains Tax due by 15 December 2016.


