



All Ireland winning football captains of 2014 Fionn Fitzgerald and Kieran O'Leary from the senior team and Minor Team captain Liam Kearney have been announced as this years Grand Marshalls for Killarney St Patricks Day parade. "We are delighted that the Kerry Team captains could lead this year's parade and of course we always love to see Sam Maguire and Tom Markham on the streets of killarney" commented Anne Marie Kennelly, Chairperson of the committee.

"We are delighted with the level of interest and interaction with a host of community groups and sporting groups. We would encourage everyone to get out early on the day of the parade and join in what will be a spectacle for the whole family," she added. "We have had a great response from the local business community both from a sponsorship level to local businesses getting involved with the festival. Our aim is to have one of the biggest and best St Patricks day celebrations the town has ever seen, come along and celebrate with us" said committee member Helen Sheehan.

In consultation with the County Council and the Gardai the committee have drawn up a full safety strategy and traffic management plan for the Parade. Parade floats and Vehicles have to arrive at Mission road from Port road and Cathedral Place side and traffic will not be allowed to travel down Mission Road towards the Cathedral. The route was also announced as follows. Assembly on Mission Road the Parade commences at 2pm up Mission road towards the Plaza, around Kenmare Place, East Avenue road, Fair Hill, College Street, Plunkett Street, Main Street, New Street, Beech road, into Beech Road Car Park where the new Grandstand and stage will be located. Over the four day festival there is a jam-packed programme of events including "Greening" of landmark Churches, St Marys Cathedral, Killarney Friary and St Marys Church. These beautiful buildings will be "Greened" until the 18th March, the Killarney Adventure Race on Saturday 14th also on a Kiddie Treasure hunt in the Town Centre and a Lily of Killarney Boat Cruise 4.30pm special themed lake cruise with storytelling and traditional music.

On Sunday March 15th there will be a Family Treasure Hunt in the Town Centre and a Ceili Mor on Main Street with Deenagh Ceili Band from 3-5pm. From noon on St. Patricks Day

there will be a Funzone in Beech street car park, with bouncy castles and face painters a Storytelling bus from The Original Killarney Ghost Tour along with a Storytelling Train from Killarney Tourist Train. There will be a stage in the Beech Road Car Park with performances from The Killarney Golf Club Male Voice Choir. From 12.45 to 1.45 Celtic Steps (the best of Irish music and Dancing) with the main event of the festival – the St. Patrick's Day Parade taking place at 2pm. The festival wraps up afterwards with a Post Parade Trad Disco with DJ Ollie Mullooly from 3.30-5.30pm.

hairstyling, attending fashion lovers went home with a jam packed goodie bag worth  $\in$ 50.





A beautiful book of photographs of young children with Down Syndrome was launched at Killarney Garda Station on Wednesday evening. The limited edition book was compiled by local photographer Dan Murphy who wants to challenge society's perception of Down Syndrome in Ireland. The book is supplemented with short narratives from the parents of the children.

Members of the Kerry Football team and members of the Gardai Siochana in Killarney attended the launch.

"I am delighted that An Garda Siochana in Killarney are lending support to this very worthwhile awareness initiative. A number of members of An Garda Siochana in Killarney have close family relatives who have Down syndrome and this initiative will go a long way to enhancing awareness and creating a greater understanding of the condition. I am also delighted that local members of the Kerry Football Team are also lending their support to this initiative", said Superintendent Flor Murphy, Killarney.

The book will also be launched on Brendan O'Connor's Saturday Night Show on RTE 1

tomorrow night, March 14th after the 9pm news. It is condition which is close to Brendan's heart as he and his wife Sarah Caden have a daughter Mary who has Down Syndrome.

The book includes seven children from Kerry: Jessica Treyvaud- Killarney; Peppy Fitzgerald -Ardfert; Katie Lyons- Castleisland; Sophie Twiss - Milltown; Amber Donovan - Killorglin; Amy

O'Connor - Castleisland and Grainne Trant -Listowel.



## GLEESON URGES AGENCIES TO ACT ON TELEPHONE NUMBERS

At the March 2015 monthly meeting of Kerry County Council, Councillor Michael Gleeson proposed the following Notice of Motion:

• "That all Government Departments, State Agencies and Local Authorities would be obliged to operate and publish a land line telephone number alongside their "LoCall" e.g. 1850 or 1890 number. Far too many public bodies publish only a "LoCall" number and while this may be of benefit to some, it is unfair to many phone users who have packages with their supplier which allows them a considerable amount of 'Free Talk Time' on local and national calls".

Councillor Gleeson stated that many customers of all phone companies have a contract which offers 'Talk anytime package' giving 59 minutes and 59 seconds free on all geographic calls (01, 021, 064 etc) to all Ireland (32 counties). 1850 and 1890 numbers are part of what is called non geographic numbers and are not classified as national or local calls. Calls to 1850 numbers are charged at flat rate and calls to 1890 numbers are charged per minute and operators generally do not provide these calls in any Free Talk Time package.

If you are on a fixed plan that includes national and local calls then it is best that you use the geographic landline number and this will be included as part of your Free Call minutes.

Councillor Gleeson said that Government Departments, State Agencies and Local Authorities should be obliged to operate and publish the geographic number alongside the LoCall 1850 or 1890 number.

#### SLAN ABHAILE PADDY ENDA WALSHE LOOKS BACK ON HIS FRIENDSHIP WITH THE FLAMBOYANT PADDY TURNER

Long before pedometers were even thought of everyone in Killarney knew who covered the most ground around the town.Trademark denim or leather, lightening speed, sunglasses and a smiling face that honour fell to Paddy Turner. Having being placed in the care of the mental health services in Killarney back in the mid 60s it didn't take Paddy long to find his feet in the town. He worked on a milk round, in Eagers and was never short of a job. To the youth of the town in the 70s and 80s Paddy was seen as a flamboyant dresser with a style very unique to himself. No one could quiet pull it off like Paddy. I particularly remember him coming down the middle of High Street one summers day equipped with a huge radio on his shoulder. I was reliably informed it was a ghetto blaster. Like a scene straight out of a MC Hammer music video.

As a neighbour of Paddy in the most recent years it was then that I found out there was a bit more to the dashing style. His fashion sense mirrored his attitude to life. He enjoyed the crack and the banter. His love of betting on draws in matches, his intricate bets of doubles and trebles which cost  $\in$ 5 and when they came in yielded him  $\in$ 100s. We shared a support of Manchester United. His taste in music had softened to Sean Dunphy, Daniel O'Donnell and more recently Nathan Carter. His love of motorbikes. A recent Christmas present of a toy motorbike meant Paddy enjoyed his own bike fest at all times. He had around Killarney developed many friendships and had a circuit of the town everyday he came down. Indeed one mourner at his funeral told of when he came to Killarney from Asia a few years back the first person who greeted him was Paddy. He came to Paddys funeral because Paddy was his first Killarney friend.

In 2014 Paddy developed an illness which as the year went on you could see was withering him on the outside. But on the inside he remained remarkably strong and his spirit and courage was never diminished. From time to time he may ask you to do him a favour, which you'd gladly do. But the favour never went unacknowledged. A scratchcard or a cream doughnut were your dues.

On Tuesday March 3rd Paddy took the highway to heaven but remarkably he was still active in town till the previous Sunday. Tho visibly failing that day it was almost as if he came to town for the last lap.

Sincere thanks must be given to all his carers throughout the years and though he could be a rogue at times it was clear from the funeral he was much loved. They to the very last day cared for Paddy in both a professional and personal way. The send off he received brought the whole town to a standstill and his wishes for a biker guard of honour were wonderfully carried

out. The spontaneous round of applause which broke out at the top of High Street, a road he must have covered 1000s of times, signalled the last time Paddy would travel that well worn track. It was indeed a true sign of the spirit of Killarney that Paddy, who came to town in harsh circumstances, would leave a mark on so many. Paddy hugged Killarney but more importantly Killarney hugged him back.

He is laid to rest in Aghadoe in a grave as close to the road as you can get. I think that would suit him fine!!



## HEALTHY OUTLOOK



For many of us a great deal of our day is spent in the work place - or thinking about work, therefore it makes sense that we would aim to make our working lives a happy and pleasant experience. However, when faced with various frustrating challenges at work our stress levels can increase and lead to anything from burnout to boredom to distraction. Whilst some levels of stress at work are normal, excessive stress can interfere with productivity as well as our physical and emotional wellbeing. In her book Real Happiness at Work, Sharon Salzberg discusses eight pillars of happiness in the workplace. These include balance; concentration; compassion; resilience; communication and connection; integrity; meaning; and open awareness. Throughout the book she presents formal meditations along with mini meditations and practices for the reader to try out. These exercises are simple, small and practical ways in which we can achieve greater calm and satisfaction.

The following includes some of the advice she gives us to have a more peaceful and happier day at work.

1. Before starting a project, meeting or even a conversation, ask yourself: "What do I most want to see happen from this?" 2. Before starting your day, set an intention. She gives the following example: "May I treat everyone today with respect, remembering each person wants to be happy as much as I do."

3. Try to perform a simple act of kindness every day. The following are such examples: "holding a door, saying thank you in a sincere manner, or listening to someone with a clear and focused mind."

4. Pay attention to your feelings. For example, if you're feeling irritated toward a co-worker, pay attention to your irritation, "not so much the story of why you're irritated, but the actual feeling of it." What does it feel like in your body? Where do you feel it? Identifying irritation as it starts helps you prevent an action you might later regret. "With a more immediate recognition of what we're feeling, we have a choice as to how we want to respond in that moment."

5. Think about the people who make your job possible, such as a housekeeper, caretaker or fundraiser – and thank them. These are just some simple measure we can take to generate more happiness in the workplace. Over the next few weeks we will take a closer look at Stress, Workplace Stress and how we can manage it in our lives.

## HYPOTHYROIDISM – UNDERACTIVE THYROID

#### WHAT IS HYPOTHYROIDISM?

Thyroxine is a hormone made by the thyroid gland in the neck. It is carried round the body in the bloodstream. It helps to keep the body's metabolism working at the correct pace. Many cells and tissues in the body need thyroxine to keep them going correctly.

In contrast, if you have hyperthyroidism, you make too much thyroxine. This causes many of the body's functions to speed up.

#### WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF HYPOTHYROIDISM?

Basically, many body functions slow down. Not all symptoms develop in all cases.

Symptoms that can occur include: tiredness, weight gain, constipation, aches, feeling cold, dry skin, lifeless hair, fluid retention, mental slowing and depression.

However, all these symptoms can be caused by other conditions, and sometimes the diagnosis is not obvious. Symptoms usually develop slowly and gradually become worse over months or years as the level of thyroxine in the body gradually falls.

Who gets hypothyroidism?

About 1 in 50 women and about 1 in 1000 men develop hypothyroidism at some time in their life. It most commonly affects adult women and becomes more common with increasing age.

#### WHAT CAUSES HYPOTHYROIDISM?

The most common cause is due to an autoimmune disease called autoimmune thyroiditis. The immune system normally makes antibodies to attack bacteria, viruses, and other germs. If you have an autoimmune disease, the immune system makes antibodies against certain tissues of your body.

With autoimmune thyroiditis, you make antibodies that attach to your own thyroid gland which affects the glands function. The thyroid gland is then not able to make enough thyroxine, and hypothyroidism usually develops. It is thought that something triggers the immune system to make antibodies against the thyroid. The trigger is not known.


Some people with autoimmune thyroiditis also develop a swollen thyroid gland (goitre).

#### HOW IS HYPOTHYROIDISM DIAGNOSED?

A blood test can diagnose hypothyroidism. A normal test will also rule it out if symptoms suggest that it may be a possible cause.

#### HOW IS HYPOTHYROIDISM TREATED?

The treatment is to take thyroxine tablets each day. This replaces the thyroxine which your gland is not making. Most people feel much better soon after starting treatment. Blood tests are usually taken every 2-3 months, and the dose may be adjusted accordingly. Once your levels become stable a blood test once a year should be sufficient.



#### HOW TO GET THE MOST OUT OF THE FUEL YOU BUY STICK TO THE LIMITS

Drive at or within the speed limit – the faster you go the greater the fuel consumption and the greater the pollution too.

#### **DON'T BE IDLE**

If you do get caught in a queue avoid wasting fuel by turning the engine off if it looks like you could be waiting for more than three minutes.

#### **COASTING - DOES IT HELP SAVE FUEL?**

Coasting - rolling downhill or approaching a junction with the car out of gear - is inadvisable because the driver doesn't have full control of the vehicle, though it used to be quite a common practice to save fuel.

You lose the ability to suddenly accelerate out of tricky situations.

You lose engine braking which takes some of the load off the brakes on down hill stretches and helps to avoid brake fade - overheated brakes require harder pedal pressures to stop the vehicle.

These days, coasting is still inadvisable and changes in vehicle fuel systems mean it won't save you fuel either.

#### **OLD CAR WITH CARBURETOR**

Take your foot off the accelerator pedal with the car in gear and fuel is still drawn through into the engine. Fuel savings could be made by coasting out of gear.

Modern car with electronic engine management - fuel and ignition systems are effectively combined and controlled by one Electronic Control Unit (ECU). Take your foot off the accelerator and the ECU cuts the fuel supply to the injectors anyway so there's nothing to be gained by coasting.

Modern diesel engines - these also have the ability to shut off the fuel when you take your foot off the accelerator.

#### **HOW MUCH CAN YOU SAVE?**

• If you are an operator you must know your legal obiligations and fulfil them. This includes making sure your vehicles and trailers are always roadworthy and safe.

The aim is to see how much you can improve on your current average fuel consumption or the 'official', manufacturer's figure by following the advice above.

If your car has an onboard computer that records fuel economy (kilometers per gallon / KPG) then take a note of the overall average fuel consumption you're getting now and then see how much you can improve it by following the 'eco-driving' advice above.

It should be possible to re-set the computer so it starts recording a new average KPG.

With no onboard computer, you'll first need to find out the official, manufacturer quoted fuel consumption for your car. You may see three different figures quoted, 'urban', 'extra-urban' and 'combined' – it's the third, 'combined' figure that you want.



## ROWING TO RIO

The Monika Dukaraska Blog. The story of a Professional Athlete



The two weeks training camp in Italy is now a distant memory. Ireland greeted me with snow, rain, wind and waves. I surely feel I am home now.

I have now returned to the National Rowing Centre after a slight delay, being caught on the Kerry-Cork border due to snow. I managed to get a training session in at the Killorglin Rowing Club that morning though. It was been great to train in a place where my rowing journey began nearly 9 years ago now. Having made the leap across the county bounds to Cork later that day I began my preparations for the national trials. I have completed most of my weekly training on a rowing machine and on the water in a crew boat.

I finally feel like a rower again. Due to my previous injury, I had to complete a lot of training on a watt bike. Over the last two days, I have completed over 40km on a rowing machine and I covered a lot of mileage in a crew boat, which has been very rewarding. Having to abstain from the boat for so long however has cost me few new blisters on my hands. Gripping the oars proves to be challenging at times and using a spray plaster makes it even worse. The phrase "no pain – no gain" fits in perfectly here. I hope that things will settle soon. The focus over the past week has been on technique and moving together as a crew. Synchronicity is key. It is a pleasure to be out on the water when the weather is nice and the boat is moving effortlessly.

My partner and I, amongst other senior high performance athletes were fortunate to receive a new racing boat for the season, which shows a great confidence in our crew on behalf of Rowing Ireland and the coaching team. For the next two weeks we will work to get used to the boat, we will learn how it runs through the water and will work to gain more speed. We have already completed some high rate pieces and took part in side by side racing showing good speeds in very demanding cross tail conditions.

The coming week will consist of a lot of speed work. We have three training sessions on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday with two training sessions a day for the remainder of the week. The racing on the 21st and 22nd of March will mark our last test before final crew selection and will prepare us for our first international regatta in Piediluco in Italy in early April. Keep your fingers crossed!



## LGFA CONGRESS CHANGES TO HAVE IMPACT ON KERRY CLUBS

The Annual Congress of the Ladies Gaelic Football Association took place last weekend in Clare with plenty debate over the three days. Some of the biggest changes to the rules of the LGFA that were confirmed on the second day of the annual congress included a change to Rule 273 meaning that any players or officials that use threatening of abusive language will serve a minimum of 4 weeks of a suspension which has been raised from the 2 weeks previously.

Changes to Rule 139 sees the introduction of a maximum number of Permission to Play for clubs to be limited to three for adult players with confirmation of the permission needed 4 weeks prior to the beginning of the competition or by March 31st.

A significant change to the structure of provincial councils was also confirmed with Provincial Council Presidents confirmed to serve a 3-year term and that election of provincial president's will take place one year before their terms begin.

County Conventions must now be held no later than January 1st with club AGM needs to be held by December 1st. A further important change sees paid officials prohibited from voting at club, county provincial or central council except in their own clubs if they are not a paid member of staff.

## IMPERIALS AND DEN JOES IN SEMI FINAL ACTION

Having completed the regular season both Kerry sides have made it through to the semi-final stages of the Women's Basketball Division 1 League with both first leg games down for this weekend.

Imperials who squeezed through to the final four with just scoring difference come face to face with the form team of the League Portlaosie Panthers. Imperials could have made it a little more comfortable but were defeated by neighbours and local rivals Team Den Joes in the last game in the regular season 61-60.

Team Den Joes have found some good form in the later stages of the league and finished second in the table. They travel to Dublin to play Oblate. The second legs will take place on weekend of 21/22 March 2015.

## **REBELS YELL LOUDEST IN PAIRC UI RINN**

Cork hammered their old rivals in Sunday's Allianz NFL Round 4 clash when they had 11 points to spare over the Kingdom at Pairc Ui Rinn watched by an attendance of 6,412 on a perfect spring afternoon in Leeside.

The Rebels were dominant in all the key areas and Kerry looked tired as nothing went right for Eamonn Fitzmaurice's charges.

The early dismissal of Paul Murphy on a second black card in the space of a week did not help while a first-half fracas resulted in yellow cards for Kerry's Barry John Keane and Kieran Donaghy and Cork's Michael Shields and Colm O'Driscoll.

Having led 3-7 to 2-6 at half-time thanks to first-half goals from John O'Rourke (2) and Colm O'Neill, in reply to Kerry goals from Kieran Donaghy and Tommy Walsh, the Rebels added a further 10 points to their opponent's three with a wind assisted second half.

Colm O'Neill was easily the man of the match, ending the game with a personal tally of 1-6 which included 1-2 from play.

Barry John Keane was easily Kerry's best performer on the afternoon, scoring five points, three of which came from open play.

The Kerins O'Rahilly's clubman has been Kerry's most consistent performer in this league this season and his overall scoring tally from the four games now stands at an impressive 0-13.

Kieran Donaghy and Tommy Walsh apart from their two first-half goals struggled to get into the game, while David Moran, despite some lovely



high fielding, was wild with his kicking.

Of the Kerry substitutes, it was good to see Alan Fitzgerald from Castlegregory come into the mix scoring 0-2 of Kerry's tally, while Mark Griffin, Peter Crowley and Killian Young did their best to stem the constant flow of Cork attacks in the second half.

Cork could afford the luxury of introducing household names such as Donncha O'Connor, Paul Kerrigan, and Daniel Goulding as substitutes, and O'Connor did his bit, posting 0-4, three coming from play, while five of Cork's six starting forwards made the scoresheet, with a haul of 3-12 between them.

This was not Kerry's brightest hour in the league, but the Kingdom still has a chance of progressing to the semi-finals with home games to come against All-Ireland finalists Donegal next Sunday and Monaghan on March 29th, and an Easter Sunday showdown with old rivals Tyrone in Omagh on April 6th.

Kerry manager Eamonn Fitzmaurice and the Kerry players will be keen to put this game behind them and the visit of Donegal to Tralee in a repeat of last September's All-Ireland final next weekend will certainly whet the appetite and draw a huge crowd to Austin Stack Park.

My parents are Charlie RIP and Mary still hale and hearty. Breda lives in Ballingeary, Margaret in Dublin and Moira in Killarney. I attended the Mon until 1975 and then went to the Sem. After that I trained as a primary teacher in Mary I. Limerick. My earliest memory is of playing an actual match with The Legion against Spa and marking Mike McAuliffe who had his usual goalscoring spree.. needless to say that finished my aspirations as a full back. There were some really good footballers on our teams underage.. Finbarr Kelly, Tom Lyne, Richard O'Brien, Connie Shea, John Doona, just to mention a few. We were unlucky in the fact that the excellent Dr. Crokes team which won the 1992 Club All-Ireland Title faced us each season underage. Players like Johnny Green, Pa O'Donoghue, John Clifford, Liam (Bill ) Hartnett.. grand fellows but heartbreakers where we were concerned. I really enjoyed playing underage and often think back on senior players like Jereome Regan who appeared like a giant to small boys, Pat Healy who trained us, the flying headbanded Connie Carroll and of course two brothers from knockeendubh the very talented Donal and Diarmaid O'Donoghue. The senior team winning the O'Donoghue Cup back in those years was a great lift for the club.

I represented Legion in Scór na nOg in the singing section, (with knees knocking). Siobhán O'Brien was Queen of that particular contest even into adult competitions. The Murphys of the Port Road Padraig and Kevin Matt O' Mahony were handy at the set dancing and not bad at the football either! As youngsters we may not have won alot but we had mighty input and travelled the countryside in cars and mini-buses to playing pitches that may or may not have had a rail carriage or shed to tog out in never mind dressing rooms. Alot of our games were played in the outside pitch of Fitzgerald Stadium so we regularly got to see Legion

seniors and even better, Kerry players who seemed like Gods. More matches and training took place in 'The Mental Pitch' where sheep were seen as the most effective way of keeping the grass short .. Let's just say everyone knew where you'd been when you arrived home. Weeshie Fogarty and the late Bernie O'Connor spent alot of time and expertise and talked to us about skills, kicking the ball with both legs etc. While playing as a minor with the Legion I took up rowing with Muckross for three years and rowed minor and senior with them.

## FARMING OUTLOOK

Tommys Farming Week

Pat and Claire farm in West Cork, until January of this year they lived directly under three wind turbines. This is their story.

"It was said in an advertisement on a national paper that: 'wind turbines and farming can coexist on the same piece of land with little impact on each other'.

The farmer will have little impact on the turbines to be sure. However, there will be huge and irreversible impact on the farmer and his/her family and also of course on all the neighbouring landowners and residents. This is our experience. We are a farming family who live adjacent to a small wind farm which was constructed eight years ago on tillage land. (The nearest turbine to our home is approximately 520m. There are turbines closer to other neighbours.) There are more than 40 homes within one kilometre of the wind farm.

It is very easy to be spellbound by the money being offered and €18,000 for 25 or 30 years is very attractive and must be hard to resist. It is easy to imagine what you could do with all that money. However, it is difficult to imagine the actual size of a turbine until it is before your eyes, taller than 'the Spire' in Dublin. It is difficult to imagine what shadow flicker is until your home is covered by

huge moving shadows that can make you dizzy and disoriented. It is difficult to imagine the level of disturbance caused by the noise. It will be too late when families realise that the noise from these turbines will never stop as long as the wind is blowing. It will be too late when they realise that the low frequency noise from wind turbines penetrates concrete and will always invade their home. This pressure can pulsate in the ears and will more than likely drag people awake more than once in the night. Property prices do fall in an area where there are wind turbines and it is difficult to sell even at reduced prices. Who would willingly move to an area with

wind turbines?


This is our reality and has been for the last eight years. We were assured that the turbines would not impact on our lives and we were naive enough to believe these assurances because we didn't want to 'go against our neighbours' as is the tradition in the country. It was too late when we realised our mistake.

Developers want to convince you that the turbines will have

no impact on your lives. Figures from the latest technology will tell you what they want you to hear. They are just figures, and in our experience bear no relation to real life. Real life for us is that we cannot move our farm away from the noise. Real life for us is that our children will probably not live here in the future and will not raise the next generation next to wind turbines." Pat and Claire left the farmhouse they built for their family about a month ago, they now live a mile away and commute to the farm. They are sleeping better already and hope the tinnitus like effect of the turbines will disappear in time.





## KERRY STUDENTS PUT ON THEIR WELLIES AND TAKE TO THE FIELDS FOR AGRI AWARE'S '2015 FARM WALK AND TALK'

Agricultural Science students and their teachers, from 70 schools across Ireland, are this week closing their textbooks and putting on their wellies. Over two thousand five hundred second level students, are visiting Teagasc colleges and research centres throughout the country, from 2-6 March, to get a day of hands-on learning, via Agri Aware's farm walks.

Agri Aware's 'Farm Walk and Talk' initiative is a key event to demonstrate the practical elements of modern agriculture, to both urban and rural students. The agri-food industry creates over 300,000 jobs in Ireland, yet the current Agricultural Science syllabus for Leaving Certificate students has not been updated for over 40 years. The current syllabus fails to include vital information on important topics such as genetics, farm machinery, sustainability, new animal breeds and farm safety.

The last few years have seen a jump in the number of students choosing to study Agricultural Science. The number of students taking the leaving certificate exam increased from 3,912 in 2006 to 7,912 in 2013. There are currently a total of 14,200 fifth and sixth year students studying Agricultural Science in Ireland.

This week's Farm Walk and Talk is organised by Agri Aware, in association with Teagasc, IASTA and the agri-food industry.

Representatives of ABP, Dawn Meats, Kepak, Liffey Meats and Irish Country Meats will provide educational talks and presentations on meatrelated elements of the Agricultural Science syllabus, while representatives from the Irish Dairy Board, Dairymaster, Lakeland Dairies, Aurivo and Arrabawn will be on hand to provide information about dairy-related elements of the syllabus. ESB Networks will deliver educational talks and presentations on farm safety.

## EFFECTIVE REHYDRATION POST CALVING

Calving is the most stressful time in a cow's life and how we help her will have a marked bearing on how well she performs. Even a relatively straight forward calving is a major physiological event. The greater the calving stress the more reluctant the cow will be to start eating. What we need to do is to inject some vigour into the cow and the proven way is to get her rehydrated as soon as possible after calving.

Cows lose over 50 litres of fluid at calving; a dehydrated cow will be listless, lethargic and reluctant to begin eating. It is not possible to rehydrate a cow with water alone because the loss of fluids will contain a significant amount of electrolytes, notably sodium, potassium and chloride, which are essential for regulating fluid content in the body. ## DAIRY FORUM MUST FOCUS ON FARM PROFITABILITY AND VOLATILITY

IFA National Dairy Committee Chairman Sean O'Leary has welcomed the setting up of a Dairy Forum by Minister for Agriculture Simon Coveney

O'Leary said the Forum must help coordinate the sector's growth strategy for the coming years, and it must focus on farm profitability and managing income volatility. He said IFA would take full part in the Forum to influence its activity in this direction.

"While it now seems that the fall in milk prices and incomes for 2015 may not be as severe as first thought, it will remain a very challenging year of low milk prices, relatively high costs, superlevy fines and hefty tax liabilities. Coupled with farmers' investment commitments, both on farm, and to support the development plans of their co-ops, this year will be very challenging for most dairy farmers," Mr O'Leary said.

"It is crucial that our Minister for Agriculture Simon Coveney and EU Agriculture Commissioner Phil Hogan would work hard in Brussels to obtain the prompt delivery of the proposed 3-year extended payment scheme for superlevy. Commissioner Hogan must also capitalise on his ability to bring forward this proposal to seek political

support for some level of reduction, such as by removing the butterfat corrector from the calculation formula for superlevy. Both men must also initiate a review of EU market supports, to ensure they are revalued to keep pace with production costs," he said.

"The Minister's Forum must also be used to put pressure on banks to provide farmers with investment products with flexible repayments taking account of income variations," he said.

"Lastly, it is vital that Teagasc, as an independent research and advisory service of great value to farmers, be fully and properly resourced to be able to increase its services to farmers to include not only best farming practice at every level, but also financial management training," he concluded.

## BIRD MONITORING TRAINING DAY - FREE WITH BIRDWATCH IRELAND

Have you ever thought about taking part in a bird survey? Well there are two major surveys being run by BirdWatch Ireland and they are looking for volunteers to help with them.

\*The Countryside Bird Survey (CBS) is carried out in April, May and June. Its aim is to keep track of our breeding bird populations. It's easy to do - all you need is a reasonable skill level at identifying our common and widespread birds and plenty of enthusiasm! It involves two early morning walks along designated 1km routes in the countryside. You note down all the birds you see and hear along the way. And it's all over by 9:00am! \*The Irish Wetland Bird Survey (I-WeBS) is carried out from September to March. A whole network of estuaries, lakes, marshes and other wetlands across the country are counted once a month during the autumn, winter and early spring. Most sites are counted in teams, so there is always a chance to learn as you go along. Both these surveys are long-term projects and very important tools for monitoring how our breeding birds and wetland sites are faring.

If you know your birds fairly well and enjoy getting out and about, these surveys are an ideal way to put your birdwatching to good

use. And you don't get thrown at the deep end: Birdwatch Ireland are running a series of training days to get you started. Each will start at 10:00am with an entertaining slide show explaining how and why they do these surveys, with lots of tips on identification. After lunch (provided), they will have a short outdoor field trip to give you a chance to put theory into practice, and they plan to finish by around 3:30pm. The sessions will be very relaxed and easy-going, but also, they hope, informative. All instruction, tea, coffee, biscuits and lunch are free of charge. ## **GOOD NEWS**

One of America's largest circus companies announced on Thursday that it will phase out its elephant act. Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus will retire all of its elephants to the company's Centre for Elephant Conservation by 2018. Alana Feld, vice president of the circus's parent company, Feld Entertainment, cited a change in public sentiment behind the decision saying "A lot of people aren't comfortable with us touring with our elephants."

That discomfort is well-founded. Ringling Bros.' treatment of elephants has been the subject of growing controversy in recent years, particularly for the cruel way in which the animals are coerced into performing under fear of punishment.

Circus handlers regularly use sharpened metal instruments, called bullhooks, to control elephants' behavior, prodding them to act in unnatural ways as a form of entertainment. Bullhooks are widely seen as inhumane, and a growing number of municipalities in the U.S., including Los Angeles, have banned their

## use — effectively ending the possibility that elephant shows could take place.

Ringling's move to end the exploitation of elephants comes as welcome news for animal welfare groups who have been working toward this change for decades.

"We are thrilled that Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus has taken the historic step of ceasing to use elephants in its shows," Priscilla Ma, U.S. Executive Director of World Animal Protection, said and added "Every day, around the world, elephants and other wild animals suffer in the name of entertainment. They belong in the wild, and we hope that this groundbreaking action will inspire other companies to end their use of wild animals for entertainment purposes."

## HOTEL KICKS OUT HOMELESS COUPLE DESPITE ROOM BEING PAID FOR

On Valentine's Day, the temperature in Columbus, Ohio, was nine degrees with wind chill below zero. George and Joyce Gruss were traveling across the state and stopped for dinner at Wendy's, and saw a couple crying. They asked Stephanie and Louis what was wrong, and Stephanie said they were homeless with nowhere to go. Rather than letting them suffer hypothermia, George and Joyce generously bought them three nights at a Motel. But an hour later, the Motel called George back just to let him know they were evicting the homeless couple even if it meant letting them freeze - all because they didn't have ID, and by the way, he couldn't have their money back, either, though the Motel has since refunded George's money.

## **23 YEAR ROAD TRIP:**

Back in 1989, as the Berlin Wall fell, Gunther Holtorf and his wife Christine set out on what was meant to be an 18-month tour of Africa in their Mercedes Benz G Wagon. The German former airline executive has travelled the equivalent of 20 times around the planet in the vehicle which he calls Otto and says he has never had a serious breakdown.

## 5 FACTS ABOUT COCKROACHES

Cockroaches get a bad reputation. Although these creepy crawlies are traditionally associated with dirt, disease and squalor, cockroaches actually have a lot to offer the world. In the very least, they are quite interesting. Like spiders, who are often misunderstood too, cockroaches have some remarkable similarities to us humans. After reading these five little-known titbits about cockroaches, you'll see that we are not so different from these insects, after all. We are even connected and dependent on each other, in a way!

1. Not all cockroaches are pests. In fact, very few cockroach species coexist in human

spaces. Out of approximately 4,000 species of cockroaches on the planet, there are only about 30 of them that can be considered pests; most cockroach species occupy niche habitats that are located in forests, caves, burrows or brush. For that reason, we typically do not come in contact with them; there are thousands of types of this particular bug that are unknown to most people.

2. Cockroaches like to be touched. The cockroach is thigmotropic, meaning they like to feel solid contact touching them against their bodies, and preferably on all sides. They seek out cracks and crevices that will offer them the comfort of a tight fit — so crammed, that the small German cockroach can fit into a crack as thin as a dime. The more sizable, American cockroach, will squeeze into spaces that are no broader than the thickness of a quarter, to seek out the touch that comforts them. Pregnant female cockroaches can even squeeze into a crevice as thin as two stacked nickels, and be perfectly fine with it.

3. Cockroaches are good moms. A mother cockroach will incubate her eggs in sacs or capsules called oothecae and protect them by sheathing them within a thick protective case, called the ootheca. Some cockroach mamas will remain with the ootheca attached, carrying it with them until the eggs are ready to hatch. In other cases, the female will drop the ootheca, or affix it to a substrate for safe keeping of her offspring.

4. Cockroaches get cravings too. Even a little beastie has got to eat, but these tiny creatures don't just consume food, they enjoy it, too. Two Tohoku University Professors, introduced the scent of vanilla or peppermint right before giving the cockroaches a sugary treat. The researchers discovered that the sugary treat caused the cockroaches to drool. Later, when the cockroaches' antennae detected one of the two scents in the air, they would salivate. 5. Cockroaches are environmentalists. The disappearance of cockroaches would disrupt something called the nitrogen cycle, which is undoubtedly integral to us all. Since most cockroaches feed on decaying organic matter, the act of them eating their meals traps a lot of nitrogen. A feeding cockroach has the effect of releasing that nitrogen in their faeces, which then gets deposited into the soil, and in turn is reused by plants. Consequently, the extinction of cockroaches would have a huge impact on forest health and eventually on all of the species that live there.

## **DID YOU KNOW?**

Studland Bay in Dorset, England, is the only place in Great Britain where both native seahorse species - the spiny seahorse and the short-snouted seahorse - breed successfully. In 2008 both species were listed under the Wildlife and Countryside Act as 'threatened. This means that they are legally protected in the same way as bats and otters, and habitats must be protected as well. Along with other rare marine species, the seahorses depend on the delicate eelgrass in the bay. Eelgrass is as important to seahorses as jungle is to orang-utans. This is being damaged by yachts' anchors, putting the lives of the seahorses at risk. The bay needs to be legally protected from this damage by becoming a Marine Conservation Zone (MCZ) with eco-friendly moorings for boats.

## COFFEE CUPS THAT GROW FLOWERS

The world's first plantable coffee cup is made from a blend of postconsumer paper and cotton. It's biodegradable and embedded with seeds. After serving as a vehicle for your caffeine fix, it lives a second life as the decomposing growing medium for a host of plants. The plantable coffee cup is the idea of Californian architecture student Alex Henige, who has developed two prototypes for testing in California, where the diverse ecosystems will allow for experimenting with seeds in a variety of growing conditions. There's the California native seeds cup and a garden vegetable mix, which right now only contains carrot seeds but may eventually include kale, chard, and green onions. The native mix-composed of more than 20 species, including California poppy, lupines, and desert bluebells-is far more diverse.

One of the initial challenges has been determining which seeds will work in the high-temperature environment of paper presses and to-go coffee, where seeds can be exposed to temperatures of 140F degrees or more for periods of 10 minutes at a time. With those conditions, Mr. Henige said, seeds that require fire to germinate - which is the case for many California wildflowers - are most ideal. But once he finds a commercial manufacturer and can begin testing and tweaking the machines, no seed will be off-limits. The early challenge is establishing a standard that will remain: Seeds will always be coordinated with geographical regions, so as not to introduce invasive species.

## Know Your Rights: CHANGES TO THE ONE-PARENT FAMILY PAYMENT MARCH 2015

## QUESTION

I'm getting a One-Parent Family Payment. I know that the age limits for the payment will be changing in July. What's happening and how will it affect me?

## **ANSWER**

On 2 July 2015 the age limit for the One-Parent Family Payment (OFP) will reduce to 7 years for most claimants. This means that a large number of people will no longer qualify for OFP from July 2015 because their youngest child will be over the age limit. If your youngest child is aged under 7 you can continue to qualify for OFP. (There are exemptions to the age limit for people parenting alone who are getting a Domiciliary Care Allowance or who have been recently bereaved.)

If your payment is ending in July 2015 the Department of Social Protection (DSP) will write to tell you the date your payment ends. You may also be requested to attend an information seminar. At this seminar you will get information about the other social welfare payments that may be available to you and help with applying for these. It is very important that you attend the seminar so you fully understand your options and so that you are not left without a payment when your OFP ends in July.

If you are getting Family Income Supplement or a carer's payment this payment will automatically be adjusted when your OFP ends and you will not be invited to a seminar.

You may also qualify for the new Back to Work Family Dividend (BTWFD). If you are getting FIS and your OFP is ending in July 2015, you will be sent an application form for the BTWFD along with the letter explaining the changes to your OFP payment.


If you were getting a One-Parent Family Payment in the last 3 years and your youngest child is aged under 14 you may qualify for the Jobseeker's Allowance transitional arrangement. This arrangement allows you to work part-time and still receive a partial payment.

You can get more information and advice on these changes at your social welfare local office or Intreo centre or your nearest Citizens Information Centre.
