### **DIABETES AWARENESS:**

## 43% have never been tested for diabetes

Figures from a new study released reveal that 33% of people in Ireland have a family member with Diabetes. One in five people (21%) have a family member with Type 2 diabetes and overall, three in four people (77%) know someone who has diabetes. Diabetes or Diabetes Mellitus is a disorder characterised by hyperglycaemia (high blood glucose levels).

**DESCRIPTION:** When the food we eat is digested, most of it becomes glucose (sugar), which the body uses for energy. In order for this to happen, the glucose must leave the blood and enter the body cells. The hormone that helps glucose enter the cells is called insulin. It is produced by an organ called the pancreas. In Diabetes, the pancreas either doesn't produce insulin, or the body is unable to use the insulin properly. This causes glucose to build up in the blood instead of entering the cells, a process called hyperglycaemia.

#### THERE ARE 2 TYPES OF DIABETES:

**TYPE I** – Insulin Dependent Diabetes. In this type of Diabetes, the pancreas produces little or no insulin.

**TYPE II** – Non-insulin Dependent Diabetes. In this type of Diabetes, the pancreas produces insulin but the body does not use it properly. This is called insulin resistance. Diabetes is a condition requiring life-long management. There is no cure, but symptoms can be controlled with careful attention to diet and medications. Poorly controlled Diabetes may lead to serious complications.

#### COMPLICATIONS OF DIABETES INCLUDE:

- A progressive loss of vision that can lead to blindness
- Nerve damage that can cause a loss of sensation in the lower limbs and may lead to foot ulcers, joint problems and infections.
- Kidney disease
   Heart disease

#### Signs and symptoms (May include the following):

- · Feeling thirsty all the time
- Urinating more frequently
- Blurred vision Lack of energy
- Numbness and tingling in the feet or legs
- Recurrent infections

**PREVENTION:** Type I cannot be prevented but can be controlled with careful management




## **BREDA'S TAKE ON THE WIT & WISDOM OF KERRY**

MANY of us who have had the pleasure of enjoying a visit to our local nite club or pub will identify with the often uncomfortable sensation of a ringing in the ears for a period of time afterwards.

A good night's sleep is usually enough to overcome the annoyance of the ringing. But imagine having to endure that, not only that ringing feeling, but also a buzzing or hissing sound in your ears morning, noon and night. It would be quite difficult to live with such a noise, yet 10% to 15% of the population experience this perceived sound.

Such a condition is called Tinnitus which is a perceived sound in the absence of an external stimulus and the sound is usually unformed, such as buzzing, hissing, whistling, rushing, whining, hissing, grinding and rumbling, while some liken it to that of industrial machinery, a vacuum cleaner or a jet engine.

Tinnitus is caused by potentially reversible changes in the brain, not the ear itself and the main risk factors for tinnitus are hearing loss,

increasing age and gender, predominantly men.

Patients with tinnitus and hearing loss often report a varying severity of psychological problems: frustration, annoyance, distress, irritability, anxiety, depression, insomnia, poor concentration. Currently there is no cure for tinnitus.

The team at Audiology Medical Services (AMS) in the Bon Secours Hospital and Scotia Clinic Tralee are now offering some hope for people living with tinnitus.

Their audiologists have been trained in tinnitus assessment and management and treatment focuses on symptom reduction and the management of the psychological consequences of tinnitus.

Jessica Lewis, Audiologist with AMS Tralee, said: "Tinnitus can be a distressing, even disabling, condition that has a major impact on sufferers' lives. It is often caused by the brains response to auditory deprivation, and has a clear physical cause. Studies indicate that fitting a hearing aid can reduce tinnitus severity by up to 50 %".

Each patient is provided with a well-structured individual management plan that is tailored to their tinnitus, hearing loss and lifestyle needs. This approach encourages the patient to self-manage their reactions to tinnitus to help improve their quality of life.

The Audiology Medical Services clinical protocol for a tinnitus assessment includes:

- A comprehensive case history
- Referral to other medical specialists if necessary
- Audiological assessment
- Specialized Tests (Tinnitus Pitch Masking/ Tinnitus Loudness Match)
- Tinnitus Questionnaires

The Components of the tinnitus management protocol may include:

- Sound Therapy and Enrichment (hearing aids, noise generators )
- Education and counselling
- Relaxation therapy
- Psychological Intervention (e.g. cognitive behavioural therapy)

GPs should consider referring a patient with tinnitus to a hearing care professional or audiologist for hearing tests. Studies indicate that tinnitus and hearing loss often occur together. Long term management could involve a multidisciplinary team compromising the GP, an ENT specialist, a psychologist/psychiatrist and a hearing care professional. # KERRY GENERAL HOSPITAL TO RECEIVE NEW EMERGENCY TECHNOLOGY

Kerry General Hospital is going to receive a new 24-hour a day, seven day a week emergency stroke service which, according to Deputy Michael Healy-Rae, will save a number of local lives

Kerry General has taken delivery of a new telemedicine stroke machine which will for the first time ever ensure that the hospital has one of the best possible emergency stroke services in the world, states Michael Healy-Rae. The new teledoc stroke machine is one of seven which until recently was stored in Cork waiting to be rolled out to hospitals throughout the country. Deputy Healy-Rae has lobbied about this matter in the past and had been seeking the installation of these machines in hospitals which did not have, until now, a full emergency stroke service. Deputy Healy-Rae stated this machine will now link hospitals with the top stroke experts in the country. Proper diagnosis of a stroke victim's situation is of paramount importance as the first issue to be determined is if the person has a clot or a bleed in their brain. This machine will ensure an immediate diagnosis that will lead to the correct treatment being given to the patient. The machines will become fully operational in the near future and they are not just for the treatment of strokes, but to fast track treatment for patients in intensive care as well as for burns, rheumatology, orthopaedics, dermatology, and neurology patients.

## **BRAVE GER'S JOURNEY TO SUCCESS**

WHEELCHAIR ATHLETE GER DALY TELLS THE KILLARNEY OUTLOOK ABOUT HIS AMAZING JOURNEY....

They say that the longest journey starts with a single step. Well, as a wheelchair-user, my journey to achieving a degree of fitness that I was happy with didn't start literally with a single step, but with a VERY short push on the road near my home.

It was July of 2012. I was thirty years old, and the closest I had come for many years to being physically active was watching a game of soccer on the television or attending a Kerry football game. Sure, I had thrown the odd basketball at a ring at the back of my house as a youngster, or played my own brand of soccer with friends (using my fists to control the ball and "shoot"). I had even broken my wrist around the age of eleven or twelve when I fulfilled the role of goalkeeper while my older brother and a friend of his took pot shots at me at home. But, as local children of my age began to drift away as the years passed, I found that, due to a lack of independence, I became increasingly isolated in the remote community where I lived. No physical activity, little or no regular interaction with the outside world. There were times when, as I look back on it now, I know depression set

I was living at home with my parents, where virtually everything was done for me, and I had never really taken any notice of, or pride in, my physical appearance. When I reflect on it now and see photographs of myself from those days, I can see that it would have been obvious to others that I was making little or no effort to consciously keep myself healthy. I just didn't really concern myself with such things, for whatever reason. Looking at those photographs now, it is embarrassing to see the state I was in.

I didn't know it at the time but I weighed at least eighteen stone, if not more, and was only going in one direction - the wrong way. In some ways, in terms of maintaining my general health and in particular my weight, I was up against it on two fronts. Not only did my disability and lack of an opportunity to engage in physical activity deprive me of an outlet to maintain some degree of physical fitness, but my parents also owned a small country shop, where I basically had free rein to plunder all manner of sweet treats whenever I wanted, as often as I wanted. It was a "perfect storm" of circumstances that was never likely to yield positive results.

Had events turned out differently, I would probably still be in that rut. In fact, had events turned out differently I could easily have found myself in a very precarious situation. But, as the saying goes: "It's an ill wind that doesn't blow some good."

My memory would not be the best, so in terms of tying down the exact sequence of events I couldn't swear that this is exactly how my journey to fitness started, but it is generally accurate. In the late spring/early summer of 2012 my mother, on whom I was heavily reliant (I still am if I am honest), went to hospital in Cork to have a procedure carried out in connection with a medical condition she has lived with for many years. While my mother was in hospital I suffered from a fungal infection on my toes which required a visit to my GP. During my visit, the subject of my weight and fitness came up. and my GP described me as being borderline diabetic. When you hear a medical professional referring to your physical state in those terms, you would have to be an idiot not to at least make an effort to do something about it. So I did. In July of 2012 my Dad helped me to weigh myself using an industrial weighing scales that he had kept since his days of running the country shop, when it would have been used to weigh bags of animal food stuffs. I had to sit on this weighing scales, and from where I was I couldn't see the gauges where he was calculating my weight, so I had to take his word when he told me what it was (and this would become an issue in the ensuing months when I sometimes wondered if he was telling me my actual weight or leading me to believe that I might have been a couple of pounds over my actual weight in order to keep me working



hard). On that first day I weighed exactly eighteen stone, at least according to my Dad! I had asked my GP and also a dietician he had referred me to, who I admittedly only attended once because I wouldn't be great for following the advice of someone like that, what my ideal weight should be but unfortunately neither seemed able to do so. At least, that is how I remember it. So I set myself a target of getting down to fourteen stone. Why fourteen? I have no idea. It was just something to aim for. Completely unrealistic, but a target nonetheless.



## **FOCUS ON 'GAP GIRLS' IN TG4 SERIES**



'Gap Girls,' the fourth programme in a new TG4 series 'Tríd an Lionsa', presenter Pádraic Ó Neachtain looks at the birth of photography in Ireland and delves into the stories behind six iconic images that played a singular role in the country's social, political and cultural past.

This programme brings Padraic to Kerry, where he speaks to local guide Con Moriarty and Kerry photographer Don MacMonagle about a series of seven striking images taken of young Irish girls in the Gap of Dunloe in the late 1800s.

The girls are photographed barefoot, backed only by a rock face, and the images prompt some unsettling questions. What was the photographer's motivation in taking the photographs the way he did? And why did he chose these girls, who eked out a living selling poteen and goat's milk to tourists, to be his subject?

The seven images also play a part in the story of Killarney's fledgling tourist industry and the arrival of stereo photographs. The 3d effect images had a big impact on the numbers of Victorian visitors visiting the town, lured by the untamed, spectacular scenes they witnessed through stereoscopic reproductions. As the tourism industry boomed, so too did all the myriad side industries created by Irish people trying to eke out a living in any way they could

By the 1890s the girls had begun to sell postcards of themselves, thus cutting out the middle man and exploiting their image for their own gain. Contributing to the programme are Patricia O'Hare, archivist Muckross House, Killarney photographer Don MacMonagle, Con Moriarty and Johnny McGuire of Bricín

The Irish Heart Foundation estimates that sudden cardiac death (SCD) kills more than 5,000 people in Ireland each year, including around 100 people under the age of 35.

Very many community groups and sporting and social clubs, who do so much to enhance the welfare of community, wish to purchase Defibrillators. The elimination or reduction or refund of the VAT charge would acknowledge the invaluable work of those groups and make the purchase of the machine less onerous.

The Motion to the Council was unanimously agreed and forwarded to Government.



#### UNDERSTANDING THE LANGUAGE OF YOUR EMOTIONS

An emotion is a message with a feeling. Every single emotion we have tells us something about where we are in our lives and how we feel about where we are. All emotions are valuable and have important messages to be heard and felt. However, in today's society much emphasis is placed on only wanting to have positive emotions. 





## O'SULLIVAN'S LAST-GASP EQUALISER RESCUES LEGION

KERRY O'SHEA REPORTS FROM LAST SUNDAY'S GARVEY'S KERRY SFC FINAL BETWEEN KILLARNEY LEGION AND SOUTH KERRY

#### SOUTH KERRY 0-09 LEGION 0-09

Killarney Legions' 69-year wait for a second Bishop Moynihan Trophy must wait at least another week following their draw with South Kerry in the Garvey's Kerry SFC decider at Fitzgerald Stadium last Sunday.

Following discussions with Munster GAA chiefs, the Kerry County Executive announced late on Sunday evening that the replay will now take place at Fitzgerald Stadium on Sunday, November 22nd, which means that St Mary's Munster Club IFC game against Corofin will go ahead this weekend as planned while Killarney Legion meet Nemo Rangers in the Munster Club SFC semi-final also this weekend.

The game finished on a controversial note as referee Seamus Mulvihill was escorted from the field by Gardai and Stadium Stewards.

Seamus Mulvihill allowed an additional two minutes of stoppage time to the two already announced on the public address system.

South Kerry appeared to have won the game when Greg Gibson, a second-half substitute for Brendan O'Sullivan scored what looked like the winner. However, Legion surged forward and man of the match Jamie O'Sullivan pounced to level the scores in the 64rd minute.

Overall, it was a very poor decider. The heavy pitch conditions did not help the flow of the game and both managers opted for a sweeper system which limited the attacking options of both sets of forwards.

This was a day when the four midfielders, Shaun Keane and Jamie O'Sullivan for Legion, and Bryan Sheehan and Brendan O'Sullivan for South Kerry, stood out.

Between them, this quartet accounted for a staggering 13 points out of the combined scoring tally of 18 which reflects the vice-like grip in which both attacks were held.

In fact, of the 12 forwards that started, two, Legion's James O'Donoghue and Conor Keane, made the scoresheet, while South Kerry's six starting forwards failed to raise a flag of any description.

## **COUNTY FOOTBALL RELEGATION BATTLE**

### O'RAHILLY'S SURVIVE BUT STACKS AND ARDFERT ARE IN THE DROP ZONE

10-time Kerry SFC champions Laune Rangers are on the brink of losing their Kerry Senior Football Championship status following a loss to Tralee's Kerins O'Rahilly's in the first round of the controversial Garvey's SFC Relegation play-offs.

The sides met in a double-header in Castleisland on Saturday afternoon with the Tralee side emerging six-point winners. Kerins O'Rahilly's rising star Jack Savage turned in another man of the match performance and finished the game with a personal tally of 1-6. The Tralee side were always in control and led 0-7 to 0-3 at the interval. Rangers asked plenty of questions of Barry O'Shea's side but with Barry John Keane contributing well on the scoresheet, O'Rahilly's had ready answers. ### **CLUBS GIVE U-17 NATIONAL** ENTRY RINGING ENDORSEMENT

The Kerry District League were given a ringing endorsement at a meeting on Monday night by the clubs of the county, to press ahead with their plans to explore entry in the newly formed U-17 National League, due to commence in March 2016. KDL Chairman Sean O'Keeffe outlined the pros and cons involved in entering a team in the National U-17 Competition, with the cost being a major consideration, but the need to provide a pathway for emerging talent was considered to outweigh any negatives on how it might be funded. Delegates spoke about the need to provide a pathway for the brightest young talent emerging from the Schoolboys League, so that they would have somewhere to play at a higher level, within the

county, rather than being forced to travel to neighbouring League of Ireland Clubs in Munster.

A KDL Sub-Committee under chairman Sean O'Keeffe and Secretary John O'Regan have been mandated to explore the matter further with FAI officials, Fran Gavin and Pat Duffy and then the KDL Executive will decide whether to enter the U-17 League, as there are other entities in the county interested.

The League will then, have to have its application approved by the FAI, and at that point, it would then appoint a management team, make out a business plan for funding the venture and set about signing players and commencing training in early January.

### **FLAT TYRES**

#### How to change a wheel safely - PART ONE

To save space and weight, many new cars have a punture repair kit - sealant and compressor - rather than a spare wheel. If you don't have a spare it's a good idea to familiarise yourself with the kit provided so you'll know what to do if you do get a puncture.

If your car does have a spare it's a good idea to practise changing a wheel at home in the daylight when the weather's warm and dry. Then, if you do suffer a puncture you'll be able to cope more easily, even if it's dark, cold or wet. Given a safe environment, the right tools and some basic knowledge, changing a wheel on any vehicle should be fairly straightforward. Check the handbook first as this might include vehicle specific advice.

Where the handbook and our advice appear to be in conflict, follow the advice in the handbook.

### FOR YOUR OWN SAFETY

- Don't try to change a wheel on the hard shoulder of a motorwayor at the side of a road. Turn off or pull over well away from the traffic and call for help.
- Don't try to change a wheel on soft, loose or uneven ground.
- Don't try to change a wheel with passengers still in the car. Move everyone to a place of safety, well away from the vehicle and carriageway.
- Don't work under a car while it's raised on a
- Don't try to use the jack anywhere other than at the specified jacking points – attaching the jack in the wrong place can cause damage to the car and/or risks it collapsing when lifted.

#### WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- handbook showing where to attach the jack
- spare wheel with adequate tread and correctly inflated
- vehicle jack
- wheel-nut wrenchwith extension bar and locking wheel nut adaptor if fitted
- at least one wheel chock
- gloves the wheel/tyre will be dirty
- something to kneel on the ground will be
- sharp knife or cutters to remove cable ties if these are used to hold wheel trims in place

### **BUDGET 2016 – TAX EXEMPTION ON** START UPS

An exemption from Corporation Tax for the first three years of trading applies to certain new start-up companies.

BUDGET 2016 has extended this relief for companies commencing to trade before

The tax relief is linked to the amount of employers PRSI that the company has paid. The maximum credit that can be claimed is  $\in$ 5,000 per employee.

The maximum amount of corporation tax relief is €40,000 per annum for 3 years.

The following companies are excluded from the relief: companies dealing in land, petroleum and mineral activities, professional service companies, companies in fishery / aquaculture sectors, companies trading in the primary production of agricultural products and companies in the coal sector.

# **Know Your Rights:**

# **MICROCHIPPING** OF DOGS

### OUESTION

Our puppy has an identification disc on her collar. Does she need this, or should we just get her microchipped? What are the rules?

### **ANSWER**

No, the Under the Control of Dogs Acts 1986 and 1992, dogs must at all times wear a collar with the name and address of the owner inscribed on it or on a plate, badge or disc, so you are right to have an identification disc on your puppy's collar. However, you must also get her microchipped and registered on an authorised database under the Microchipping of Dogs Regulations 2015.

Since September 2015, all newborn pups must be microchipped and registered. From 31 March 2016, the Regulations will apply to all dogs. Even if a dog has already been microchipped (for a pet passport, for instance) it will now have to be registered on an authorised database as well.

The microchip can only be implanted by a vet, a veterinary nurse or a person who has been trained by one of the authorised databases. The microchip contains a unique 15-digit number. When you register with an authorised database, this number will be recorded on it along with your name and address details. This means that, if your dog goes missing and is found, you can be identified as the owner and be reunited with your dog.

If you move house, you will need to update your contact details on the database. If you plan to buy a new dog, the seller will have to give you its certificate of registration and you should forward it to the relevant database to get the details updated.

The Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine has published a list of authorised databases, along with a set of Frequently Asked Questions on agriculture.gov.ie.

# **DEALING WITH**

In their book, 'Depression, an emotion not a disease', Tubridy and Corry describe depression as an emotional state in which one is overwhelmed by feelings ranging from hopelessness to despair and desolation. Many people feeling this way believe that nothing they do can make a difference, which in turn makes change very difficult. However, by focusing less on one's feelings and actively putting in place behaviours which bring about an opposite feeling, we begin to believe that we can do something to make a difference. Doing activities such as exercising, having a massage or yoga can all help to change our old mindset and lead to feelings of selfmastery, hope and control.

Many of us are all too familiar with the inner judge or critic that enslaves us by constantly beating us up, telling us that we're not good enough or will never amount to anything. From the time we are very young we have been receiving these messages so that eventually we internalise this voice and automatically think 'I'm no good'.

A very helpful exercise can be to begin to rate the severity of your own critic on a scale of 0-10. Counselling can help us to do this. Before we can release ourselves from the stranglehold of the critic, we must first become aware of its presence. Once we become aware and mindful of the critic we can begin to cut ourselves loose from its grip. Having developed this awareness, we begin to be less hard on ourselves and more self-compassionate.

A fundamental law of consciousness is that whatever we give our attention to, will grow in our mind. Thus if you continue to think 'I'm useless, nobody cares, life's too difficult' then these thoughts will grow in your mind, leading you only to seeing what's wrong with your life. Whatever is to the forefront of our mind is what we will perceive in the World around us. In the words of Shelly, The Mind Becomes that which it perceives. Thankfully, the opposite is also true. Thus is you consciously decide to focus what is working in your life, you can begin to change your mindset.

When we are depressed our mind has foreclosed on any new ideas – and we filter our thoughts, feelings and behaviours through a mindset that is helpless and bleak. This leads us to repeating the cycle of misery and tormenting thoughts rather than taking in any new information. When our minds are closed in this way we have only one way of seeing things - we construct the world from behind our eyes.

Next week we will continue to look at how our minds work when we are depressed and ways in which we can change this.

# **Health Matters....** With Dr. Michael Moloney

### TESTICULAR CANCER

#### Continued

#### ASSESSING THE EXTENT AND SPREAD

If you are confirmed to have testicular cancer then further tests are usually advised to assess if the cancer has spread. This assessment is called staging of the cancer and aims to find out:

- Whether the cancer has spread to nearby lymph nodes and lymph nodes in the abdomen.
- Whether the cancer has spread to other areas of the body (metastasised). By finding out the stage of the cancer it helps doctors to advise on the best treatment options.

### WHAT IS THE TREATMENT FOR TESTICULAR **CANCER?**

Treatment options which may be considered include surgery, chemotherapy and radiotherapy.

**Surgery:** Surgery to remove the affected testis is normally advised in all cases. This alone may be curative if the cancer is in an early stage and has not spread. If the cancer has spread then further surgery may also be needed for some men after radiotherapy or chemotherapy, to remove any cancer cells present in the lymph nodes of the abdomen or chest.

#### Chemotherapy

Chemotherapy is a treatment of cancer by using anti-cancer medicines which kill cancer cells, or stop them from multiplying. Your doctor will advise if you should have chemotherapy in addition to having the affected testis removed. Whether you need chemotherapy and the length and type of treatment schedule depends on the type and stage of the cancer when diagnosed.

### Radiotherapy

Radiotherapy is a treatment which uses high-energy beams of radiation which are focused on cancerous tissue. This kills cancer cells, or stops cancer cells from multiplying. Again, your doctor will advise if radiotherapy is needed in addition to having the affected testis removed.

### What is the prognosis (outlook)?

The outlook is usually very good. Treatment for testicular cancer is usually successful. During the last 40 years, testicular cancer has become a curable cancer in over 95% of cases.

- If your testicular cancer is diagnosed and treated at an early stage, you can expect to be cured. Most testicular cancers are diagnosed at an early stage.
- Even if the cancer has spread to other parts of the body, there is still a good chance of a cure.

It is important to remember that most testicular lumps are not cancerous. It is advisable for men to become familiar with what is normal for them and for any worries to be discussed with their GP.







### DOG TRAINING TIPS

- Petting, talking to, playing with, and even scolding a barking dog, reinforces the dog to bark. Do not give a dog attention while they're barking. The best remedy to a Barking dog is the cold shoulder. And don't forget to praise the peace and reward the dog when she/he is being quiet!
- Those big eyes peering at you from under the table can be pretty hard to ignore. It can be especially hard when you find a warm, fuzzy face in your lap. Do yourself, and your guest, a favour and never feed your dog from the table. You are wrong if you think your pet won't remember you giving them that piece of steak fat during last night's dinner. It only takes one time!

Not feeding your pet from the table doesn't mean your pup can't enjoy some healthy human scraps every now and then–it simply means that your pup doesn't get to enjoy them at the table or while you are eating. Reward your dog for staying away from the table during mealtime and consider teaching your dog "Place." Ask your dog to go to their bed, or "place," and provide them with a treatfilled toy or their own dinner once they're lying down. Teach your pup that it is more rewarding to be away from the table during mealtime, rather than under it.

If your dog finds food on the counter, it won't be long before he comes back looking for more. Prevention is key here. Reward your dog for staying out of the kitchen when you are home, and keep the kitchen closed off when you aren't around to monitor your pup. Keep food out of paws reach by storing it in a press or in the fridge. If you have children, remind them not to leave their half-eaten snack or dirty dishes on the counter.

• Dogs need an outlet for their energy. If you aren't providing one, your dog will provide one for himself and, odds are, you won't like whatever they choose. Make sure you are giving your dog plenty of exercise. A large majority of dog-related problems can be attributed to your dog not getting enough stimulation or exercise. If your dog is running around the house and has a bad case of the zoomies, it's time to take them out to play.

# U.S. SUFFRAGETTES USED COOKBOOKS TO PUBLISH THEIR MESSAGE

Between 1886, when the first American suffragist cookbook was published, and 1920, when the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution granted women the right to vote, there were at least a half-dozen cookbooks published by suffragette associations in the country.

The suffragette cookbooks included propaganda for the Great Cause: the fight for getting women the right to vote and Recipes ranged from basic guidelines on brewing tea and boiling rice, to preparing meals for the upper class and occasionally, a startling entry, such as that for Emergency Salad: one-tenth of an onion and nine-tenths of an apple with any salad dressing. But the bulk comprised a soothing flow of soups, gravies, breads, roasts, pies, omelettes, salads, pickles and puddings. Up to and including most of the 19th century, a woman had no control over her own money, her own children or her own destiny, and suffragettes, were described as neglectful mothers, kitchen-haters and busy politicking while their children starved.

On Dec. 13, 1886, America's first suffragist cookbook, The Woman's Suffrage Cook Book, was launched at a sold-out fundraiser at the Boston music hall. The hall was decorated with a white banner bearing the Massachusetts Woman Suffrage Association motto, "Male and female created He them, and gave them dominion." Members included the novelist Louisa May Alcott, who would become the first woman registered to vote in Concord. Though she hadn't contributed a recipe, Ms. Alcott had just published Jo's Boys, the final book of her Little Women series, into which she had slipped in a description of a statue of Minerva, the goddess of wisdom, sporting a "Women's Rights" slogan on her shield and a helmet ornamented with "a tiny pestle and mortar" — a nod to the compatibility between cooking and voting.

Recipes were contributed by regular housewives who carried a "Mrs." before their name, as well as a parade of prominent suffragists who didn't.

In 1891, the Equal Suffrage Association of Rockford, Ill., published The Holiday Gift Cook Book. At the time, the state's constitutional law stated: "Idiots, lunatics, paupers, felons and women shall not be entitled to vote."

Recipes were interspersed with pro-suffrage quotes by famous people such as British politician William Gladstone, abolitionist author Harriet Beecher Stowe and Clara Barton, founder of the American Red Cross who was a legendary Civil War nurse known as the "Angel of the Battlefield," she wrote, "When you were sick and wounded I toiled for you on the battlefield. Because of my work for you, I ask your aid. I ask the ballot for myself and my sex. As I stood by you, I pray you stand by me and mine."

Sold at fairs, bazaars and women's exchanges, these cookbooks not only raised funds for the suffrage movement, but also helped women network, and gain new skills in the fields of publishing, advertising and sales.

### **BLOODY SUNDAY ENGLAND**

Between 1886 and 1887 Trafalgar Square became a rallying point for protests against economic hardship by the poor of London. Here, in the Square, the poor of London's East End came face to face with the politically powerful and wealthy West End. These protestors were supported by middle class socialists who were campaigning for greater equality for the working class.

On November 13th 1887 the Metropolitan Police conducted a savage attack on an unemployment demonstration, marchers moving in columns from different parts of London were separately assaulted on the approaches to Trafalgar Square. They were beaten with truncheons and staves and driven into side streets. Their banners were seized, the poles smashed, and their flags torn up by policemen. Those who ran towards the square were charged down by police horses. Those few reaching it faced Life Guards with fixed bayonets. There were many arrests. Two men died later from their injuries.

It was seen as a turning point for the new socialist movement for it introduced a harsher and more brutal dimension to their activities. The movement was young. The Democratic Federation had only been founded in 1884. It had soon become the Social Democratic Federation (SDF) and in 1885 had suffered its first split when a group including William Morris, Eleanor Marx and Tom Mann had founded the Socialist League (SL). Members of both organisations also belonged to the Fabian Society, also formed in 1884. Nonsocialist Radicals, Irish Nationalists and even some members of the Liberal Party were also involved with both parties.

### IT'S SOMETIMES AMAZING WHAT CAN BECOME TOURIST ATTRACTION

Seattle's gum wall in Pike Place Market, which has been collecting wads of chewed gum for 20 years, will be cleaned back to the brick shortly. A contractor with an industrial steam machine will use 280-degree steam to melt the gum, which will then be collected and weighed.

The area's Preservation and Development Authority says the wall has attracted 1 million pieces of gum, spread eight feet high by 54 feet wide, and the gunk is six inches thick in spots, and though it's cleaned every second month with a light steaming, officials say it's time the gum is removed to preserve the Market district's historic buildings.

The attraction actually started accidentally, when audience members waiting in line for a late night show at the Market Theatre found the wall was a great place to leave their gum.

### NOT THE BEST WAY TO GET TO SCHOOL ON TIME

A student in South Africa who was worried about being late for a maths exam got himself in trouble with the law when one driver finished his shift and his replacement failed to show up. The 20 year old found the keys in the bus, started it up, and began driving himself and his classmates to school and had nearly made it before a police officer pulled it over and fined the student about €330 for driving without a license, but all students on the bus made it to their exam on time.

When word spread of the stunt in the student's hometown, residents began a campaign to pay the fine and former police chief plans to represent him at a school disciplinary hearing.

### ONE OF AMERICA'S MOST TOXIC PLACES

The former lead and zinc mining boomtown of Picher, Oklahoma, had a population of approx. 14,000 residents when bullet demand rose during both World War I and II, when most of the lead found in bullets used by America during those wars came from the town. Chat (a white grit that results from lead extraction) hills contaminated with lead, zinc and other metals rose as high as 150 feet and as wide as four American football fields. But even after the EPA declared the town a Superfund site (a fund designed to clean up sites contaminated with hazardous substances as well as broadly defined "pollutants or contaminants") in 1983, residents continued to let their children play on the chat hills and up to 20 years ago 63% of children were experiencing lead poisoning. In 2005, the government relocated some residents, paying them an average of €50 per square foot for their property on the condition they moved out and a tornado destroyed much of what was left of the town in 2008. The police and town government stopped operating a year later and also in 2009 eleven students graduated from Picher-Cardin High School last class.

3 individuals are said to be still living in the town but looters have raided anything of value left there, Zinc poisoning is believed to be the cause of the deaths of approx. 1,000 migrating birds found in Pilcher earlier this year.

### **WOMAN WITH A HEARING** LOSS TAUGHT HER DEAF CAT SIGN LANGUAGE

When Kim Silva retired from teaching at the American School for the Deaf, she decided to start teaching sign language to her cats; it all started after setting sights on a deaf cat named Bambi.

In 2009, after losing another beloved pet, Ms. Silva and her husband, John — who are both deaf — were ready for a new feline companion. They fell in love with Bambi who was at a rescue shelter in Texas and as it would take a while before she could be brought to Connecticut, where the Silva's live, Ms. Silva decided she might as well get started with the cats she already had, even though both of them could hear.

Ms. Silva's previous teaching experience was limited to humans, but she was optimistic as a lot of deaf dogs have learned Sign Language and groups like the ASPCA say training cats in general is possible. "Bobcat immediately understood but my other cat, Bear, was very old and was not interested. Bobcat learned one sign after another until he learned the new vocabulary," Ms Silva says. Bambi picked up the signs even more easily, since as Ms. Silva explains, she had "peer reinforcement and copied Bobcat."

The cats have a delightfully expansive vocabulary. Among the words they now know are: "come," "more," "sit," "stay," "shake," "high five," "sleep," "circle," "shrimp, "play," "canned food," and "finish". They also know "off," but The Silva's must spell that out, letter by letter to be obeyed.

### U.S. COAST GUARD RESCUED MAN IN AN INFLATABLE **HYDRO-BUBBLE**

A longtime endurance runner and peace activist whose goal was to reach Bermuda in a homemade floating "Hydro Pod" was rescued by the U.S. Coast Guard when he began suffering from fatigue.

The man who had protein bars, bottled water, a GPS and a satellite phone, on board with him refused to comply and continued on his way with the Coast Guard keeping tabs on him.






