



# Orla Honoured at Memorial Scholarship Awards Ceremony in DCU

he memory of Killaney native, Orla Benson,, was honoured at a Memorial Scholarship awards ceremony in The Helix at DCU this week.

17 students at the University received awards named in honour of 13 individuals who have played a key role in the life of Dublin City University and in Irish society.

The Orla Benson Memorial Scholarship was

established at DCU in 1996 by friends and family of Orla to honour her memory. Orla completed her BSc in Biotechnology at DCU in 1995 before sadly passing away that summer whilst working in Boston. The scholarship is awarded annually to assist a postgraduate student with their research in the field of biotechnology.

This year, the Orla Benson Memorial Scholarship was presented to Arun Decano, a PhD candidate in DCU's School of Biotechnology. Arun's research focuses on discovering new infection control approaches to combat the increasing global rates of infectious diseases. Her scholarship funding will enable Arun to further her research by working with researchers at the Wellcome Trust Sanger Institute in the UK.

Nathalie Walker, CEO of DCU Educational Trust told gathered attendees, "This year we have awarded scholarships to 17 students whose talent and dedication are a tribute to those we remember today. Orla Benson shone brightly in her own life and so it is fitting that her legacy will be honoured and live on in a bright and gifted researcher like Arun Decano."

The 17 scholarship recipients were selected based on their talent and dedication but also according to specific criteria set by scholarship donors. Eleven scholarships were presented to undergraduate students supported by DCU's Access Programme which makes third level education accessible to students from disadvantaged socio-economic backgrounds and provides financial, academic and personal supports to help students succeed in their studies. A further five scholarships were awarded to support students engaged in postgraduate research or study in fields as diverse as Law, Biotechnology, Marketing, Journalism and International Relations.

The event, which was established in 1932, is the longest running major competition in the Irish dance calendar.



Qualification for the World Championships is something that every dancer aspires to as it inspires them to be among the best dancers in the world.








### Mayor's Ball Revival planned for St. Patrick's Weekend

Mayor Kelleher is certainly pulling out all the


stops as the master of ceremonies and after dinner guest speaker for the evening will be none other than accomplished comedian and satirist Oliver Callan.

The announcement was made when the PSO service was renewed this week.

The airline capacity will be increased by up to 50% with larger aircraft on Kerry Dublin route with Sobart Air investing up to €6.7 million in its fleet, providing further comfort and convenience for passengers on popular Kerry route

The airline welcomed a study this week looking at the economic impact of tourism on Killarney which found that the industry is worth over €400 million to the town annually, attracting 1.1 million visitors per year Stobart Air, the operator of Aer Lingus Regional, has invested in its fleet as the airline's contract to operate the Dublin-Kerry Public Service Obligation (PSO) route has been renewed.

The announcement comes following a report by the Killarney Chamber of Commerce released this week on the economic impact of tourism in Kerry, and the need for improved transport and accessibility. The report found that the industry is worth over €400 million to the town annually, attracting 1.1 million visitors per year.

Stobart Air, operating as Aer Lingus Regional, has operated this route, on behalf of the Irish Government, since 2015 and the renewed contract will run until 31 January 2022.

The airline has invested up to €6.7 million in its fleet to operate the PSO service over the period and will deploy a larger aircraft (ATR72) to operate the Kerry route, increasing



capacity by up to 50% on Kerry services in 2018. More than 51,000 passengers used the service to fly between Kerry and Dublin in 2017. This number is expected to grow significantly over the duration of the contract. Last year, Stobart Air announced a €25-million investment in the airline, to include the creation of 60 new jobs and the addition of jet aircraft to its fleet.

Commenting today, Graeme Buchanan, Managing Director of Stobart Air - operator of Aer Lingus Regional - said that regional connectivity between Kerry and Dublin is key and he is keen to continue to operate and develop this vital route:

Commenting on the news Chairman of Kerry Airport, Denis Cregan, said:

"Kerry Airport sees as positive the confirmation from the Minister for Transport, Tourism and Sport, that the contract has been awarded to Stobart Air to operate the Public Service Obligation (PSO) air route linking Kerry Airport with Dublin for the next four years. The contract, which began on 1 February will allow the existing twice daily flights between Kerry and Dublin to continue uninterrupted until 31st January 2022. Passengers booking flights with Aer Lingus Regional (via www.aerlingus.com) between Kerry and Dublin will ultimately benefit from Stobart Air's familiarity of the route while the continuation of the PSO will be a major positive step for both Kerry Airport and the business and tourist interests of the county. "


### **USING YOUR PENSION TO PAY LESS TAX:**

Pension contributions provide a way of paying less income tax. Up to Revenue Limits, contributions to a pension qualify for relief from income tax. This effectively means that, where the higher rate of income tax is 40% and you are a higher rate taxpayer, a €100 contribution to a pension will only have a net cost to you of €60 (had you not made the contribution, the other €40 would have gone to the government as income tax).

Pensions carry another tax benefit: they grow free of tax, unlike deposit accounts in Banks etc (which are generally subject to tax on interest in the form of DIRT) or investment in property or shares (where rent or dividends are liable to income tax and gains in value are subject to Capital Gains Tax).

When pension benefits are drawn down, a Retirement Lump Sum can usually be taken either completely free of tax or subject to a beneficial rate. The rest of the benefit, usually taken in the form of an ARF or an annuity, is taxable. However many people will find themselves in a lower tax bracket in retirement than when they were working and making contributions, and so will have made a net gain from tax relief.

erry as a location for the film industry is being promoted by a new steering group which been established by Kerry County

Led by Kerry County Council and chaired by council chief executive, Moira Murrell, the group brings together many agencies as well as experts from across the industry with a view to promoting Kerry as a film destination and helping to nurture the sector in the county.

The Council's Strategic Policy Committee with responsibility for the arts, chaired by Cllr Sam Locke, asked that Kerry County Council consider a more proactive approach to attracting film to Kerry. In keeping with the stronger national focus on interdepartmental support for creativity which forms part of the Creative Ireland programme, the new expert advisory group was given the following remit To investigate the most effective ways to capitalise of the international interest in Kerry as a location for film To investigate the potential business case for a film studio in Kerry

They have been meeting in recent months to

draw up a work programme, and co-ordinate activities and pool knowledge as well as exploring the viability of film studios in Kerry. Kerry County Council identified each film group member based on their expertise and experience relevant to film development in Kerry. Agencies that support film were invited to the group, as were individuals working in a professional capacity in the film sector. The group is working with the Kerry Education and Training Board which offers one of the best film, TV and digital media training courses in the country.

Kerry County Council, working with the Irish Film Board, acts as the county contact for incoming film, TV and commercial productions. The Council's Arts Office, with support across the departments of Kerry County Council, has functioned as the Kerry Screen Commission since 2001. This work has seen the local authority support many productions from commercials to The Lobster and Star Wars and it is hoped the new Film Steering Group will help to achieve more in this regard in the

years ahead. study of the economic impact of tourism on the town of Killarney was launched this week by Minister of State for Tourism and Sport Brendan Griffin.

The report, which was commissioned by Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce and compiled by strategic research consultants W2 Consultants, showed that tourism generates €410m annually and supports 3,100 jobs, however the report also raised concerns about seasonality and regionality.

The Killarney Tourism Economic Impact Review (TEIR 1) report revealed that the tourism industry supports 3,122 jobs locally and brings 1.1 million annual visitors to the

Launched at the Aghadoe Heights Hotel on Monday, the report predicts growth of 30% for tourism in Killarney between now and 2025. But to achieve this, two issues must be dealt with - 'regionality' and seasonality.

The review involved an examination of the economic contribution of tourism, attitudes of visitors to the town and areas for consideration to promote further tourism growth. The timeframe for the tourism industry research was August to October 2017, with all data supplied based on 2016 performance indicators.

The report which was supported by the Bank of Ireland, along with Failte Ireland, Kerry Convention Bureau, Kerry Airport, IHF, and the Chamber, found that Killarney is delivering for tourists, with 41% of visitors stating it had exceeded expectations and 57% that it had met expectations. The town also scored strongly in terms of value for money, with 77% rating Killarney either 'very good' or 'good' value compared to 61% for Ireland.

The average room rate for Killarney was €113 compared to €139 nationally. Its monthly average room rate peaked in August at €126, compared to €117 nationally - one of only two months of the year when the town had a rate higher than the national average. However, Killarney's rate was still lower than Dublin's rate (€139) during August.

It also reveals that North American market remains the most lucrative for the Irish tourism industry, with the US/Canadian guest spending 80% per day than domestic tourists. North American visitors have an average daily spend of €191.50 - 30% more than UK tourists and more than double that of Mainland European visitors.

However, two key challenges stand out for the town - regionality and seasonality. The former emerged in results on occupancy

rates, with the annual average for Killarney at 64% and 74% nationally. Killarney has, however, twice the national average of beds per head of population.

Nonetheless, seasonality remains an issue for the tourism sector in Killarney, with an average occupancy of just 20% in December - its weakest performing month - compared to 48% in the (South West) region, 71% in Dublin and 60% nationally at that time.

Another issue is the low level of business tourism, with only 7% of visitors coming to Killarney for business, in keeping with Co. Kerry's ranking as the lowest of all Wild Atlantic Way counties for IDA jobs per capita and less than half the national average.

Commenting on the results, Killarney Chamber of Tourism & Commerce president Paul O'Neill said, "This report has been enlightening. It has quantified just how important tourism is for us and the figures are hugely impressive. We most definitely have the capacity, with in excess of 10,000 beds in the town; we have a unique product in terms of what we offer in the town itself and immediate hinterland but also what we offer as a gateway to both the Ring of Kerry and Dingle Peninsula. And according to this report, visitors are having their expectations more than met.

"The report does, however, raise some issues, particularly with regard to our regional location and seasonality. While these are challenges we must address, we believe that with the right approach and investment we can turn them into an opportunity. This is also very much recognised in the Fáilte Ireland strategy to address regionality and seasonality and the County Kerry Tourism Strategy & Action Plan 2016-2022 objectives." Among the key recommendations outlined in the TEIR 1 report are:

- A national and international 'Killarney' digital marketing campaign
- Supporting direct international access to the west coast
- Investment in road network to Kerry, particularly the Macroom and Adare by-

passes, and broadband in Kerry

- Preparing for the Brexit challenge by building on Killarney's strong appeal within the North American and Mainland European markets
- Enhancing the product mix in the town, including indoor attractions, to build its capacity to attract and retain visitors
- Investing in key products or segments that will address the seasonality challenges faced by Killarney and the wider Kerry area, including completion of Gap of Dunloe Greenway, Fossa Way and Lough Leane Loop

Said Conor Hennigan, Development Manager, Killarnev Chamber of Commerce and Tourism: "Tourism is hugely important to Killarney, as this report illustrates, but there are indicators

within the report that confirm the economic imbalance on this island. The fact that Dublin is the destination most frequently visited by tourists after their time in Killarney suggests that not enough of our visitors are spending time elsewhere in Co. Kerry or on the Wild Atlantic Way. The report also raises concerns about the low percentage of beds being booked for business reasons, mirroring the fact that Kerry has the second lowest number of IDA jobs on the Wild Atlantic Way. There's clearly a perception that all is well in Kerry because of tourism but this report indicates that while we have an amazing product that is delivering on tourists' expectations, there are areas we need to address."



## Protecting O'Malley's legacy of free education for all young people

Retiring NUI Galway President, Dr Jim Browne recently fired a parting shot across the bows of those of us who believe that education is a right not a privilege. Compared to the late Donogh O'Mallev's egalitarian vision, Dr. Browne's call for higher fees and a student loan scheme is very regressive. As a lifelong advocate for the education entitlements of young people, I believe that education should be based on ability to learn rather than ability to pay.

Donogh O'Malley is fondly remembered in Kerry for his marriage to Dr. Hilda Moriarty of Dingle, who inspired Patrick Kavanagh's poem Raglan Road, which was set to music by Luke Kelly. "The School Man" will also be forever revered as a dynamic Minister for Education (1966/68), who fifty years ago opened the portals of knowledge and opportunity to the youth of Ireland by introducing fee-free post-primary education and a free school transport scheme. He introduced Regional Technical Colleges (RTC), now Institutes of Technology, in areas where there was no third level college in proximity, as well as National Institutes of Higher Education (NIHE) in Limerick and Dublin, now UL and DCU, respectively. He launched means-tested third level grants which gave easier access to less well-off students.

O'Malley's steadfastness

withstanding the conservatives and mandarins who, either wanted to retain elitism in education or complained that the country couldn't afford it, has provided Ireland with the best educated and most productive workforce in Europe. beneficiaries of O'Malley's plan for equality of opportunity have repaid the country a thousandthrough employment, taxation, volunteerism and nondependence on welfare. Thirty years later, Niamh Bhreathnach, Minister for Education (1993/97) abolished third level tuition fees and would undoubtedly have introduced further equality reforms had she not lost her Dáil seat in 1997.

Further and third level education is very expensive. The financial burden is somewhat eased for students who qualify for partial or total state funding. The maximum maintenance payable to students whose college is 45 km (28ml) or more from home is only €3025. In addition, means testing of applicants for grants is so restrictive that thousands of students in higher education are ineligible for any financial aid. Capping the gross annual income level for grant eligibility at €39,875 ignores spiralling living costs. The price of rental accommodation, alone has reached an all-time high in the cities.

Thousands of students who are

ineligible for grants need about €12,000 annually to maintain themselves away from home or about €4000 if living at home. The student contribution of €3000 must also be paid. Many college students do up to 15hrs of work part-time and/or depend on their parents to make ends meet. Indeed, 60% of parents get into considerable debt to cover college costs. Parents have to save for years on end to finance their children's college education and family budgets are adversely affected by the €3000 student contribution.

Despite Dr. Browne's views, the Government must ease the financial burden on hard pressed families. Abolish the €3000 student fee contribution altogether. Restore the minimum qualification distance between home and college for the nonadjacent grant from 45km (28ml) to its pre-recession level of 24km (15ml). Increase the standard maintenance grant from €3025 to €5000 and all other grants on a pro rata basis. Increase the annual income level for standard grant eligibility to €40,000 NET from the current gross level of €39,875.

The insidious threat to reintroduce tuition fees linked to a student loan scheme is dangling over the heads of financially pressed families. If enforced, it will impoverish generations of young people for years to come and

will prevent thousands of young people from ever getting a third level education. It's high time to end this threat and protect O'Malley's legacy of equality of access to education for all young people of the nation.

# **Health Matters...**

### GLANDULAR FEVER (INFECTIOUS MONONUCLEOSIS)

### What is it?

Glandular fever is a viral infection, caused by the Ebstein-Barr virus (EBV). It is passed from person to person by close contact (especially kissing). It can also be spread by sharing drinking and eating utensils. It can take up to 6 weeks for symptoms to become apparent after the person has first been infected. It can affect people of any age but is most common in young adults and teenagers.

Sore throat — This can be mild or severe and can present with just a very red inflamed throat or a throat with a pustular eruption on the tonsils. Swallowing can be painful and people may avoid even swallowing their saliva.

Swollen glands- The lymph nodes or 'glands' in the neck serve as part of your immune system and so by trying to fight the virus they can become very large and tender. Lymph nodes elsewhere can also be affected albeit less commonly. These include lymph nodes in the axilla (armpit) and inquinal region (groin).

Flu like symptoms -Like all over viral infections glandular fever can cause a high fever, muscle aches and pains and headaches.

Eye swelling- About 1 in 5 people will develop swelling around the eyes or puffiness. This resolves spontaneously.

Spleen or Liver enlargement-The spleen is an organ under the left lower rib cage and serves as part of your immune system. During an attack of glandular fever it can become enlarged and cause pain in the upper left portion of the abdomen. The liver sits at the end of the right lower rib cage and can also become inflamed and enlarged during the illness.

Subclinical infection-This occurs when the person becomes infected with the virus but does not develop any symptoms. This is more common in young children and in those aged over 40 years old.

### Diagnosis

After becoming infected with the EB virus your body makes an antibody to it to fight the infection. This is tested for in a blood test to confirm infection. You can get a false negative if taken too early in the course of the illness as it can take 10-14 days for the antibody to be detectable in your blood stream. It is not possible to grow the virus on a standard throat swab as this tests for bacterial infection.

### Complications

Rash- A widespread non itchy rash can occur. This is red and blanching (fades with glass test) and usually resolves quickly without treatment.

Spleen injury- This is serious but rare. As the spleen expands it no longer is fully covered by the rib cage and extends in to the upper abdomen where only a muscle layer over lies it. This gives much less protection. Also a swollen spleen is more fragile and easily injured. For this reason people are advised not to play contact sports for 6-8 weeks after EBV infection.

Malaise/Fatigue- Some people can experience several weeks of fatigue afterwards which can last for variable periods.

### Treatment

Rest is crucial to facilitate recovery. Patients should maintain a good fluid intake (even if painful) to avoid dehydration and use paracetamol to control any fever. The theory of using steroids to reduce inflammation remains unproven and so they should not be used.

Avoiding alcohol is also strongly recommended as you often feel much worse than usual after drinking alcohol as glandular fever can affect your liver's ability to function and

Antibiotics have no role to play in uncomplicated EBV infection. They can be used if you develop a secondary bacterial throat infection.

Nearly all affected individuals will not suffer another infection.

### **CIIr. Gleeson queries Reed Bed completion**

At the recent Killarney Area Municipal Meeting, Councillor Michael Gleeson asked that: "Kerry County Council would state if the completion of the Reed Bed Treatment facility in the western Demesne, Killarney is still being actively considered by Uisce Eireann, the NPWS and Kerry County Council".

Kerry County Council replied that the inclusion of an Integrated Constructed Wetland in the wastewater treatment options to be considered for Killarney Town has been suggested to Irish Water in the context of the Drainage Area Plan which Irish Water intends to prepare for the town. Irish Water has been favourably disposed to the use of Integrated Constructed Wetlands in circumstances where these have been feasible and Kerry County Council said it will continue to advocate consideration of this option.

Councillor Gleeson welcomed the reply and stated that The Integrated Wetland facility on completion could greatly benefit the overall water quality of Killarney Lakes. He further stated that such a plant is being developed in Lixnaw at present and that similar type plants are functioning very well at a number of location throughout the country including Castle Leslie in Monaghan."

Cllr. John Sheahan is delighgted to announce that East Kerry is to receive a new water supply from the Loughguittane Reservoir.

"This will surely put an end to the "foul tasting water" suffered by people living in Rathbeg, Rathmore", Cllr. Sheahan told the Killarney Outlook.

"This is very welcome news and a big saving for families having to resort to buying bottled water", he added.









# **TAX MATTERS**

#### P60 CERTIFICATES

Your employer must give you a P60 within 6 weeks of the end of each tax year. It is a statement of your pay and of the tax, USC and PRSI deducted by your employer during the year. It also records your Local Property Tax (LPT) deductions (if you choose to have the LPT deducted from your pay). The P60 is an important document. If you are claiming a benefit, you would send a copy of it to the Department of Social Protection as evidence of your paid PRSI contributions. If you are not working on 31 December you do not receive a P60.

#### **Employer's PRSI obligations**

Your employer is responsible for deducting your social insurance contribution from your wages and paying it together with the employer's contribution to the Revenue. The deduction is written on your pay slip. If the amount paid to Revenue is not correct the employer is responsible for making up the deficit. Your employer keeps a record of the insurance contributions you make and is obliged to give you a P60 at the end of each year





### COMPASSION

Compassion is an essential component of human existence. If we are to accept our humanness then we need to develop compassion. What do we mean exactly by compassion and where does it originate. Compassion can be understood as the emotional response when we perceive suffering, and it can involve an authentic desire to help. It literally means to suffer together. The latest research findings from a number of scientists has shown that our brains are "wired up to respond to others' suffering". Nancy Eisenberg, is a leading academic in the field of Compassion who has published widely and has found that compassion is part of our basic human nature. This means that our temperament or what we what we are born with, the way we self-regulate our emotions and what we experience from our parents in their parenting practices all contribute to the way we develop our empathy, compassion and helping behaviour. In other words we are born with empathy for others, the recognition that if we see upset in others we will respond with kindness and the concept compassion takes that further by wanting to help alleviate the suffering and pain in the other.

The Dalai Lama captures this beautifully when he says "So long as we are human we need compassion. Compassion brings inner peace and whatever else is going on, that peace of mind allows us to see the whole picture more clearly. So, in our education we need lessons about developing warmheartedness and finding inner peace."

We all understand compassion for others, but an essential ingredient for increased mental health is compassion for self. In the same way we recognise someone else's suffering and we want to respond by making it better, the next level is to have compassion for ourselves, to recognise our own pain and to understand our own humanness. A question that is very useful to ask ourselves is if someone else told us this story, the story about being angry or hurt or disappointed would we have compassion for them? Then why not for ourselves? A good question indeed.

Some of the ways to develop compassion for oneself are to literally feel warm to oneself rather than hurting oneself with self-criticism. Remembering the common humanity which means we acknowledge our suffering and personal failure is part of the shared human experience. And lastly, developing self-compassion requires that we take a balanced approach to our negative thoughts without trying to suppress or deny them. The key here is balanced, so if we do have a negative thought about ourselves, we develop the habit to balance it with a forgiving thought, a more compassionate one. Remembering that it is in our mind that we can be developing the more compassionate thoughts.

#### HOW TO LIMIT EYE FATIGUE WHEN **WORKING AT A COMPUTER ALL DAY**

\*Looking at a screen encourages us not to blink while aggressively holding one focus for long periods of time. To an eye, that is exhausting. To prevent eyestrain, look at something that is at least 20 feet away (not a screen) for at least 20 seconds every 20 minutes. Once an hour, take a bonus break. Get up, stretch your legs and walk around for a few minutes. Not only will you feel better but you'll be saving your eyes in the long

\*You don't need your display on full brightness. Dim it down to a level where you can feel your eyes relax. Also make sure you've customized your text size preferences so that you aren't squinting and struggling to read important documents on your screen.

\*When you are zombie-ing in front of a screen, it is hugely important to make sure you get outside into some daylight at least once throughout the day. When using a computer for long stretches, turn overhead lights down or off and close the curtains to minimize computer glare. You want to keep the surrounding area soft and about half as bright as your screen.

\*If you have to do all of your work, day in and out, on a screen, you need to consider ditching the screens when you get off work. Instead, listen to music/podcasts, read a book or magazine, play a game with your family or do some journaling and keep screen nights a treat more than a habit.

#### A MAIZE GARDEN IN MILDURA HELPS **BURUNDIAN REFUGEES CONNECT TO NEW HOME AND EACH OTHER**

On the outskirts of Mildura in north-western Victoria, Australia a small plantation notable for its tall fields of African maize grows. Tending the corn crop are refugees from Burundi, many of whom were farmers in their home country.

The public garden, a gesture of friendship and welcome from Sunraysia non-government community groups, was donated more than a year ago to people who had fled the civil war that has raged, almost unabated, in the East African republic since its independence in 1962.

Mildura's Burundian Community Farm became a reality in 2016 when the combined efforts of Sunraysia Local Food Future, Food Next Door, and the Sunraysia Mallee Ethnic Communities Council procured 0.4 hectare of land to be managed as a traditional Burundian food garden.

Irrigation was installed and a farm management plan devised, all dependant on Mildura's 100-strong Burundi population and volunteers. "Last year we harvested 300 kilograms of corn, and we expect more this year because it was a better year," Burundian Community leader Joel Sindayigaya says. "This project has a really big impact on our community. It helps us to have a connection. We can meet here at the farm and work together and connect that way. This is our connection to this land and the people."

"It became apparent to us that if we could only get some land for the Burundians, who have amazing farming skills, they would just be so much more satisfied being in Australia,



and that's really come across from what the Burundians have told us — that they have improved wellbeing, feel a sense of belonging in the community, and that it's really given them a purpose to stay" Food Next Door vice president Sevilla Furness-Holland said.

There is talk of machines that will help them to package maize flour and sell it nationally, and as news of the project spreads, the local goodwill is overflowing.

'We've had another four acres donated to us, but we were not able to farm that land as we didn't have enough water for the plantation, so we have put that on hold until perhaps next year" Mr Sindayigaya concluded.

# **Know Your Rights: MATERNITY LEAVE**

#### **OUESTION**

I recently started working in a new job on a part-time basis. I have just learned that I am pregnant – will I be entitled to maternity leave?

#### **ANSWER**

If you are pregnant while in employment, you are entitled to take maternity leave. The entitlement to a basic period of maternity leave from employment applies to all female employees (including casual workers), regardless of how long you have been working for the organisation or the number of hours you work per week. You are also entitled to additional unpaid maternity leave. The Maternity Protection Acts 1994 and 2004 provide your statutory minimum entitlements in relation to maternity at work, including maternity leave.

You are entitled to 26 weeks' maternity leave together with 16 weeks additional unpaid maternity leave, which begins immediately after the end of maternity leave.

Your entitlement to pay and superannuation (pension payments) during maternity leave depends on the terms of your contract of employment. Employers are not obliged to pay women who are on maternity leave. You may qualify for Maternity Benefit from the Department of Employment Affairs and Social Protection (DEASP) if you have enough PRSI contributions. However an employee's contract could provide for additional rights to payment during the leave period, so that, for example, the employee could receive full pay less the amount of Maternity Benefit payable.

If you have a dispute with your employer about maternity leave or if you have been dismissed due to a matter connected with your pregnancy or for claiming your rights under maternity leave legislation, you may make a complaint within six months of the dispute or complaint occurring. You must use the online complaint form available on workplacerelations.ie. The time limit may be extended for up to a further six months, but only where there is a reasonable cause which prevented the complaint being brought within the normal time limit.

You should apply for Maternity Benefit at least six weeks before your baby's due date. Apply to the Maternity Benefit Section of the DEASP.

#### **FOCUS ON TREES**

Trees are beautiful in any garden and their long life makes them a wonderful garden feature. A tree should be the first thing you plant in your garden after the hedging – they can be underplanted afterwards with bulbs and shrubs. Trees are interesting in all four seasons with attractive unfolding of leaves in Spring, full foliage in Summer, good Autumn colour followed by decorative bark in the Winter. The first and most important thing you need to know when buying a tree is what's the height and spread going to be when it is mature. There are many varieties of trees to choose from and there is a tree suitable for most areas. Trees can be planted all year round but as with hedging, trees can be planted when they are dormant between Novemeber and March.

With these bare-rooted trees you will still have a few weeks left to plant them. If you plant beofre the end of March, it will give the tree a better chance of rooting into the ground that bit quicker. When planting your bare rooted tree, dig the hole big enough, that you can spread out the roots all around the hole. Then drive your stake into the hole roughly about 6 to 8 inches below the bottom of the hole, place your tree and spread the roots out well. If possible place your stake on the side of the prevailing winds as this will ensure that the tree is blown up against the stake when the wind is high. Fill in the soil mixed with compost around the roots and firm in with the heel of your foot. Lastly, place your tree ties on – one near the top and one at the bottom with a spacer in between to stop the bark being damaged by the stake.


