

KILLARNEY BRAND IS PLACED UNDER THREAT

A warning has been sounded that the worldwide Killarney brand, which has taken generations to build, could be destroyed with one stroke of a pen if controversial measures under the terms of the Local Government Reform Act are forced through.

Concerns were expressed by members of the Killarney Local Government Action Group at a meeting held with Kerry TDs and senators

Action Group chairman Johnny McGuire said the changes proposed by Kerry County Council will remove essential services that are required for Killarney to function properly and centralising the majority of local authority services in Tralee would have a devastating impact on the county's premier tourist town.

"There seems to be no recognition whatsoever of just how important and effective the Killarney brand actually is. The whole county benefits from Killarney's success and this is putting it all at risk," he

The Action Group is concerned that services will diminish at a time when commercial rates will multiply and Killarney is demanding its own dedicated budget and executive as well as quarantees on litter control and landscaping policies, resort marketing, the local retention of development levies and that the town be allowed to keep its mayoral status. Killarney also wants a proposed new tourism development unit to be located in the town, as opposed to Tralee, given the importance of the industry to the area.

Senator Tom Sheahan said it made absolutely no sense to locate a tourist unit in Tralee when Killarney is recognised as the tourism capital of Ireland.

"It's a daft proposal. It's just mad and it has to be stopped," he said.

The meeting was attended by two of the three Kerry South TDs and four local senators and they all pledged their full support to the campaign launched by the action group which is a sub committee of Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce.

The public representatives expressed surprise that they were not consulted in advance by Kerry County Manager, Tom Curran, before the proposals were decided.

"We have regular meetings with Tom Curran and this was never mooted or discussed with us," Senator Marie Moloney complained.

"It's up to us now to go out and lobby our own people to ensure Killarney gets a fair deal," she Deputy Tom Fleming said the county council executive would have to realise that Killarney is "the centre of the economy" in Kerry and he said the Oireachtas members were fully supportive of the campaign launched by the action group.

A decision was taken to raise the matter with the local authority following the local elections and to seek support at a national level for Killarney's campaign for parity.

The meeting was also addressed by Deputy Michael Healy-Rae, Senator Mark Daly and Senator Paul Coghlan who all pledged their full support as did MEP Seán Kelly.





CULLINA PUPILS VISIT CRASH SITE

A group of 6th class pupils at Cullina NS School Beaufort last week visited what remains of the engine of the Douglas C 47 plane which crashed in 1943 in the Reeks. On December 16th 1943, five airmen of the US Army Air Forces (USAAF) took off from Port Lyautey, Morroco, bound for St Mawgan in the United Kingdom. They were the first of 12 aircraft from the flight to depart. Over nine and a half hours later, 11 aircraft had reached England. One aircraft, was however missing. The end of one page of an offical USAAF report, dated 10 January 1944, ends with the following statement: 7. As there were no contacts made after take-off, and the route to be flown was entirely over water, it is assumed #0719 went down in the water somewhere between Port Lyautey and St. Mawgan. A search of the route would have been futile because of the distance to be covered, and hazardous because of danger of encountering enemy patrols during day-light. Search for the aircraft in question was offcially abandoned on 29 December 1943.

And so things remained until 3rd February

1944, when a local farmer from the Meallis area of Kerry reported to Gardai, that he had found human remains on the mountains. A search was immediately mounted and a team of military drawn from the 15th Infantry Battalion went up the mountain and found the sad remains of an aircraft and five men. From papers found on the bodies and among the wreckage, five names were identified and these were reported back to the Army superiors. These in turn then were reported to the US legation in Dublin who immediately wired the information to the USAAF. The remains had been found on the towering heights above Lough Cummeenapeasta on the slopes of Knocknapeasta Mountain. The mens remains were first recovered from the mountain by men from the 15th battalion. The men were coffined in a outhouse belonging to a Mr. Cronin from Meallis. They were buried with Catholic and Protestant rites on February 5th, 1944 in the new Cemetery in Killarney. In June 1944 they were moved to permanent burial in the Cambridge American War Cemetery in England.

FOCUS ON SUMMER BEDDING

Filling window boxes and containers

Again there is a large range of different types of window boxes and containers. The most popular ones are the plastic. If it's a plastic window box that you have the first thing you must do is sort out the drainage.

Turn the window box upside down and you will see holes marked out. You can either use a screw driver or a drill to punch out these holes. Turn the box back up and put some small stones or polysterine around the holes. Fill the box with compost and a slow release fertiliser to about half an inch from the top of the box and firm in compost. When choosing the plants for the window box make sure that the taller plants are at the back trailing plants towards the front and medium sized plants for fillers inbetween.

A good example for tall plants at the back of the box would be upright geraniums or upright fuchsias. Good trailing plants for the front of the box would be trailing geraniums or trailing petunias. Other examples of good trailing plants for fillers would be trailing lobelia, bacopa and bidens.

When you box is planted, water in plants well and don't put into position for a few days.

Remember that all window sills slope so when your trailing plants start to grow you will need something to hold you box in position.

Know Your Rights:

SERVING ON A JURY

QUESTION

I've recently been called for jury service and I'd be happy to do it, but I'm not sure who can serve on a jury. At the age of 65 am I too old?

ANSWER

There is no upper age limit for eligibility for jury service, but at age 65 or over you can be excused as of right if you do not wish

There are several other categories of people who can be excused as of right, including members of the Dáil and Seanad, ministers of religion, doctors, nurses, midwives, teachers etc. You can also be excused as of right if you have served on a jury within the last three years or have been excused by a judge at the end of a previous period of jury service.

It is an offence to fail to attend for jury service without reasonable

Every Irish or British citizen in Ireland who is aged 18 or over and who is on the Register of Dáil Electors is eligible to serve on a jury, except for:

- People who are involved in any way with the administration of justice and
- People who are unable to read or who have a longterm impairment so that it is not practicable for them to serve on a jury.

You cannot serve on a jury if:

- You are not an Irish or British citizen
- You have been convicted of a serious offence in Ireland
- You have ever been sentenced to five years or more in prison

or

Within the last ten years, you have been sentenced to three months in prison.

GEARING UP FOR THE RING OF KERRY CYCLE

(By Cora Carrigg, Kerry Recreation and Sports Partnership)

WEEK 5 - Week Beginning May 12th - Basic Skills

Another 90km in the week completed, if not more.... Did you ever imagine 5 weeks ago that you would be cycling 90km in a week?.... Congratulations!!!

The focus of this week's column is some basic bike skills that should be acquired and mastered, which will help you to feel more confident with your bike.

Looking Behind - Practice looking over each shoulder until this can be done without wobbling. This skill should really become second nature to you.

Hand Signals – Practice giving these signals without wobbling or loosing control. It is critical to signal when slowing down, stopping or turning left or right, so that drivers and other cyclists are made aware of your intentions.

Left Turn – extend left arm straight out in the direction of the turn.

Right Turn – extend right arm straight out in the direction of the turn.

Stopping/Braking Signal - extend your right arm directly out to the right horizontally with palm facing down and slowly wave the extended arm up and down. Very many cyclists also call "braking" or "stopping" when doing this, especially if cycling as part of a group where not all participants can see your hand signal.

Braking – Practice using the brakes, both together and separately. Be aware of the different braking styles needed in different situations, e.g. in wet weather, avoid using the back brake only, as this will cause a skid.

Changing Gears – Over time one should become familiar with the gear changes. It should become an automatic reaction to change down quickly through the gears before stopping, as this will allow you to move quickly on restart.

Water Bottle Pick Up – It is important to be able to drink while cycling, rather than lose momentum by stopping the bike to drink, especially on a 180km trip! Spend time getting comfortable taking one hand off the bars while shifting your other hand closer to the centre of the handle bars. Next make sure you have enough speed so that you can coast as you reach closer to the bottle. Your leg closest to the hand with which you reach for the bottle should be fully extended while you reach downwards. Try to keep the motion smooth, as a jerking action, may well cause you to miss the bottle and affect your control of the bike. So master the skill of reaching downwards towards the bottle.

NEW COLLECTIVE BARGAINING LAW APPROVED

STATEMENT BY SENATOR MARIE MOLONEY

Senator Marie Moloney welcomed today's announcement the Cabinet has approved a new law to support the right of workers to participate in collective bargaining with their employers. It will also provide protection against victimisation for those seeking to exercise their rights under the measure, as well as restricting attempts by employers to incentivise people against using collective bargaining.

"The European Court of Human Rights and the International Labour Organisation recognises the right to collective bargaining as a human right. Ireland needs this law to protect workers, some who have been subject to very worrying employment terms such as zero hours contracts and a whole range of other detrimental practices.

"This new law will provide for a right to collective bargaining and will set out a means

by which workers, through their trade unions, may obtain a binding decision from the Labour Court providing for improvements to their pay or terms of employment if the employer refuses recognition.

"As a Senator, I will support the enactment of this law through the Houses of the Oireachtas, the sooner this law is in place the better."

KILCUMMIN SEWERAGE SCHEME FINALLY GETS GREEN LIGHT

Labour Senator Marie Moloney has welcomed the announcement by the Minister for the Environment, Phil Hogan T.D., that funding of €1.3m has been approved towards the construction of the Kilcummin sewerage

"Having campaigned tirelessly since my election on this issue, I am thrilled that the green light has been given to proceed with the works on the Kilcummin sewerage scheme. This news has been long awaited by the people of Kilcummin and I am so pleased that my persistence on behalf of the local community has finally paid off."

"The provision of the scheme will solve a lot of problems in areas such as the unfinished Mountain View Estate, Pairc Cumín and Our Lady of Lourdes care facility where jobs were under threat. The impact of discharges from Kilcummin was also affecting the local environment and Lough Leane and this can now be stopped. The completion of the scheme will also allow for Kerry County Council to then complete road resurfacing works in Kilcummin."

Back in February 2013 Minister Phil Hogan commented: "Senator Moloney has made many representations to me regarding this scheme. I am conscious of the impacts that the discharges from Kilcummin are having on the local environment and on Lough Leane. I am keen to have these issues resolved and I hope the discussions which will take place between the Department and Kerry County Council will resolve the issue to the benefit of Kilcummin community and I hope, as Senator Moloney has advocated, the scheme will proceed."

Senator Moloney comments: "Having worked so hard to secure the funding, I will now ensure that the works are completed as soon as possible and that no more delays will be allowed in this saga."

MEDICAL CARDS CONCERNS

Cllr Tom Doherty claims a review of medical cards for citizens with long term disabilities and illness are causing undue hardship and pressure on families.

A disability dose not disappear when the expiry date for a medical card is up. A more streamline process should be put in place to support the continuous daily needs of individuals. Medication along with occupational therapy, Physiotherapy, language and speech therapy is an ongoing process that cannot afford to take a break. This automatic culling of medical cards defies the individual their right to dignity and independence. I am calling on the Minister for Health to ensure equal advocacy for those members of our society whose voice is not always heard.

SALAD OF NEW POTATOES & SMOKED SALMON WITH A DILL & MUSTARD DRESSING

A great idea for an 'all in one' lunch

Serves 4

INGREDIENTS

- 750g/1½ lbs small new potatoes, cooked and chilled (you could also use leftover potatoes for
- 225g/6oz smoked salmon, cut into thin strips

- 2 tsp. muscovado sugar (if you can't get muscovado, use a good quality dark brown
- 1 tsp. fresh lemon juice
- 2 tsp. Dijon mustard
- 1 tsp. olive oil
- 1 heaped tbsp. mayonnaise
- 2 heaped tbsp. finely chopped fresh dill (or 4

tsp. of dried dill)

PREPARATION TIME

10 Minutes

METHOD

Whisk the muscovado sugar and lemon juice together until the sugar has dissolved.

Add the mustard, oil and mayonnaise, whisking all the time.

Finally, add the fresh dill, season with a pinch of seasalt and freshly ground pepper. Whisk again. This sauce is meant to be fairly runny. If you find it too runny, add a little more mayonnaise. (If you have a blender, put all the ingredients in and whizz for one minute!)

This sauce can be kept for a week in the fridge and actually tastes even better a day old, as it allows the dill to penetrate the sauce even more.

For the meringues Set the oven to 100°C and line 2 baking sheets with parchment. Combine the egg whites, sugar, vinegar and vanilla extract. In the electric mixer, with the whisk attachment, beat the whites into stiff shiny peaks. Using a piping bag, pie mounds of meringue 7cm in diameter and 7 cm high onto the baking sheets. Bake for about 2 hours. Cool to room temperature.

Summer Fruits Prepare the fruit and add half the berries to a medium saucepan, add the sugar and lemon juice and simmer gently for 5 minutes. Process the fruit mixture. Set aside.

A TRADITIONAL and hugely influential Gaelic football nursery, St Brendan's College, Killarney added another major string to its sporting bow when the school clinched the All-Ireland colleges' under 15 soccer championship crown in dramatic fashion.

The Sem registered a fabulous 2-1 victory against fancied Dublin kingpins Templeogue in a monumental encounter held in the magnificent Waterford Regional Sports Centre. The last time the Sem won this particular competition was way back in 2003 and the current team and their mentors were determined to write their names into the sporting history books.

Thankfully, this outstanding group was more than capable of emulating their predecessors with a splendid display of attractive, attacking football.

The first half was a cagey affair with both teams holding their cards close to their chests. Chances were few and far between with the

best opportunity of a breakthrough falling to Templeogue's central midfielder, Darragh O'Shea, who really should have made it 1-0 with a rasping shot from 12 yards that was just off target.

The Sem soon created chances of their own after retaining good possession in the early stages. Spanish star Marcos released Thando Dube with a slick through ball, Dube beat his man for pace and fizzed the ball across the box for the Sem's best chance of the half. But the normally lethal striker Michael Potts was unable to provide the desired finish.

As the first half wore on Templeogue were always looking dangerous and following some nice, intricate passing in and around midfield, their striker was played into space behind the defence and he would have scored only for the ever-reliable Niall Donohue whose fantastic challenge kept Templeogue at bay.

The half-time whistle blew after a few chances were created in the final third and, overall, both

teams had to be happy to go in with it all to play for in the second half.

It began at a snail's pace with neither side showing superiority and the first real sniff of opportunity came from a venomous strike from the Sem's central midfielder Lorcan MacMonagle whose snapshot stung the hands of the Dublin keeper but was parried to safety. Templeogue pushed for an equaliser but to no avail as they were hit with a sweeping counter attack as the Sem powered upfield and Spanish wonder kid Marcos slid it through to Potts who slotted the ball calmly past the hapless keeper to make it 2-0.

OUTLOOK ON THE STATE EXAMINATIONS

Good exam techniques will improve your grades (By Billy Ryle)

Consistent study sets you up nicely for the state exams. However, it's also important to prepare your answering strategy. Candidates who adopt a planned approach to answering the question papers will be successful. Begin with a detailed study of the exam timetable. Obtain a personal copy and highlight the days and times when you are due to sit for a subject. Each subject is answered in an A4 style covered



booklet. Write your exam number, the subject and tick whether you intend answering through Irish or English. Read the directions on the back cover before you write anything. Each page of the answer book contains two margins. Only the number of the question and each sub-question should appear in the left-hand margin. The right-hand margin is for the corrector's use only. Write your answers between the margins and work neatly down the page. Write clearly and legibly. Keep your answers well spread out for easy reading. Number each question and sub-question clearly in the left-hand margin to make it easier for the corrector to follow your work.

Don't split questions by answering a part of a question on one page and then the other part a few pages further on. If you are unable to completely answer a question leave a page blank to which you can subsequently return. Use diagrams, sketches and illustrations if they enhance your answer. Small drawings aren't helpful and may be difficult to interpret. Use decent size diagrams, as they are quicker to draw and allow greater inclusion of detail. While the presentation of your answering won't merit extra marks, a well-presented script will make a favourable impression on the corrector.

The core of any exam is the quality of your answering. The content of your answer to each question must be relevant to the question asked. Read each question carefully before deciding which ones to answer. Tackle a good question first to settle you down. Before answering a question list the key points around which you will build your answer. Be concise, accurate and relevant. Don't be long-winded or wordy. Waffle and repetition will not impress the corrector.

Be familiar with the format of each paper well before the date of each exam session. Know how the paper is presented. What topics are examined? How many questions must be answered? What styles of question can you expect on any exam paper? Familiarise yourself with the choice available on the paper. Is one or more question compulsory or is there an unrestricted choice available to you? Be particularly careful about a paper, which is subdivided into subsections. Without prior knowledge of such a paper you could easily fail to address the relevant number of questions. Over the next few weeks, as you do past papers, and again at the exam, read the instructions carefully. It's a good idea to handle a recent past paper in each subject for physical familiarity.

Doing well in any exam involves not just knowing the course material but also in presenting your answers within the time allowed. Be determined to attempt the required number of questions. If you don't attempt a question you can't possibly earn any marks for it. Be aware of the marking scheme for each paper and work out in advance the approximate time you can afford to devote to each question. The time allocated to each question should be in direct proportion to the marks available for that question. Let me reemphasis that the student who attempts the required number of questions is the one who has the best chance of maximising her/his grade in that subject. So work out in advance, and write down, the approximate time at which you should be completing each question.

When your exam paper is handed to you read the instructions in case there is a change in format. Then spend about five minutes reading the entire paper. This preliminary scrutiny of all the questions gives you the feel of the paper and allows you to settle down and gather your thoughts. Stick to your own pre-prepared answering plan and once you have made your choice of questions, start with a question you can answer well. As you warm to your task, you will be pleasantly surprised at the font of information that comes to mind, as you need it.

When you have finished each question, reread it to ensure you haven't omitted any part. Allow at least five minutes at the end of the exam to read back over your answers and to check your enumeration and your overall presentation.





BOGUS THEORY & DRIVING TEST **WEBSITES RIPPING OFF LEARNER DRIVERS TO TUNE OF €200,000 PER YEAR**

The Road Safety Authority (RSA), National Consumer Agency (NCA) and the Union of Students in Ireland (USI) have teamed up to warn Driver Theory Test and Driving Test applicants to only book their tests through official websites.

The call comes as figures show that unofficial third party websites in the UK could be profiting by over €200,000 each year by charging unsuspecting Theory and Driving Test customers in Ireland an unnecessary extra fee to book their tests.

Last year, one in eight Driver Theory Test candidates in Ireland, approximately 7,000 customers, booked their theory test through these unofficial websites, paying an additional €23 on top of the theory test fee. As a result, the operators of these websites are making between €90,000 and €160,000 annually from Driver Theory Test customers. In addition, over 4,750 people who have applied for their driving test since July 2011 have also been affected, paying an additional €18 per booking, netting these bogus sites over €73,000.

Mr Declan Naughton, Director of Driver Testing and Licensing with the Road Safety Authority

"We are really concerned that customers in Ireland are being ripped off by these websites who are charging customers up to €23 extra to book their theory or driving test for them. These so-called services are making a huge profit at the expense of unsuspecting customers who may not realise that they are paying a totally unnecessary extra cost to book their test. We want to remind customers that when they book their test through the official channels,



there are no hidden extras; they only pay the cost of the test itself. In addition, their data will be stored in accordance with Irish Data Protection Laws."

Explaining how customers may end up on one of these websites instead of on the official test booking websites, Mr Naughton said:

"These unofficial websites advertise to book theory and driving tests online and customers are fooled into thinking that they are the official booking websites. These bogus websites lure customers in by appearing official, using words associated with the driving and theory test and even using our name. The RSA has tried to beat these sites at their own game by advertising the official sites online. However, many customers continue to be fooled into booking their tests on the unofficial sites. The only winners are the bogus sites in the UK who are targeting unsuspecting learner drivers, and companies like Google, who profit from all the advertising." The RSA is also warning learner drivers of the dangers of passing on their personal details, such as their PPS number and driver number, to these sites. While such information is required to book a test, it should only be provided when booking a theory test and driving test on the official RSA Driving Test application website www.rsa.ie and the official driver theory test website www.theorytest.ie where you will only be charged the cost of the test.

Denise McCarthy, Deputy President & VP Welfare, Union of Students of Ireland

commented:

"It is unacceptable that these websites try to trick learner drivers into paying an extra fee to book their test. Students are already under pressure with mounting college fees and expenses and we would urge all students to only book their tests through the RSA's official channels. For many students, the additional booking charge of €20 can make a significant difference when relying on a grant or waiting for their next pay cheque."

The RSA has highlighted the gathering of such personal data by these unofficial websites to the Data Protection Commissioner. However, as these websites are outside of Irish jurisdiction, Irish agencies are unable to bring proceedings against them. The RSA will continue to monitor these websites and explore new ways to negate their online activity.

One feng-shui master says "the zodiac doesn't matter at all, what matters most isn't the year you are born, but the exact time of delivery." For €360 he has been helping couples pick the most fortuitous hours for their planned C-sections. For an extra €100, he will suggest a lucky name and for €2,000, he will rearrange your home's furniture to ensure the best possible future for your child.

ABU DHABI'S FUTURISTIC PARK

The Salama bint Hamdan Al Nahyan Foundation has announced its plan to build a park in Abu Dhabi called the Al Fayah Park, which will essentially be a futuristic covered garden for the public that spans 125,000 square meters. Thomas Heatherwick, the designer behind the Olympic Cauldron for the London 2012 Olympic Games and the UK Pavilion at the Shanghai World Expo in 2010, has been selected to be the mastermind behind the new park. When the Al Fayah Park is complete in 2017, it will feature

play areas, flowers, exercise paths and provide fresh fruits and vegetables to local eateries. The whole project will be covered by a 20 meter high, sand-coloured canopy in order to give off the illusion of a desert from above, the canopy will also provide much needed, partial shade to the garden beneath it. The Al Fayah Park is another step toward building outdoor public spaces in the capital. By 2017, Abu Dhabi hopes to have 130 parks and play areas versus the 48 parks and 37 playgrounds the city has at the moment.

- Bees have straw-like tongues called a proboscis so they can suck up liquids. They also have mandibles so they can chew.
- Bees carry pollen on their hind legs called a pollen basket. Pollen is a source of protein for the hive and is needed to feed the baby bees to help them grow.
- In the summer a beehive can have as many as 50,000 to 80,000 bees. A bee must collect nectar from about 2 million flowers to make one pound of honey. It requires 556 worker bees to gather a pound of honey. Bees fly more than once around the world to gather a pound of honey.
- The average worker bee makes about 1/12th of a teaspoon of honey in her lifetime.
- A single beehive can make more than 100 pounds of extra honey.
- The only continent that does not have bees is Antarctica.

THE DEATH PENALTY

The majority of innocent people sent to death row never have their innocence discovered, according to a ground-breaking study published in the prestigious Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences journal. Study authors say that at least 4.1% of defendants sentenced to death in the U.S. are innocent - more than double the 1.6% that have been exonerated and released. That means it is "all but certain" that at least several of the 1,320 defendants executed since 1977 were innocent. Both President John F. Kennedy and Pope John XXIII who was canonised on April 27th worked together to try and rid the world of the death penalty.

WELL DONE

Sumter South Carolina police officer Gaetano Acerra reached out to Cameron Simmons, 13, after the boy called police following a fight with his mother. The boy told the officer he didn't want to live there anymore. P. O. Acerra learned the 13 year old had almost no bedroom furniture and suffered from back pain because he slept on an air mattress that deflated during the night. "My heart went out to him the Police Officer said I thought the little things that he needed I could give him, to make him a happier kid." P. O. Acerra returned a few weeks later with a bed, a desk, a chair, a television and a game system for the teen that someone had donated after hearing the story. The Police Officer said "I did it because I could. It was the right thing to do and I think people should do things like this."

ASHTRAY THAT AN REWARDS SMOKERS **FOR NOT LITTERING**

Cigarette butts are the cockroaches of the litter world: Their numbers are massive and vou're rarely more than a few feet from one in the urban environment. In America, butts are the most prevalent form of litter on the roadways; worldwide, they're the No. 1 item found littering beaches and waterways. The omnipresence of these butts is a problem, as the chemicals they leach out are harmful to animals and could be contaminating environments with heavy metals. But with the majority of smokers admitting they've tossed butts onto the ground at some point, it's a problem without a glaring solution. Now designers think they've discovered a way to make sure more butts get to the proper receptacles. The creative firm loglo, which has offices in the Netherlands and Istanbul, have built an ashtray called "Fumo" meant to alter the behaviour of serial litterers. Looking like a sleek smokestack rising from the sidewalk, the tray has sensors that when fed a butt respond with all kinds of pleasing stimuli. from blinking lights to a bevy of peppy noises from club beats to novelty car horns. Speaking for myself all I need is a more plentiful supply of smoking boxes in the outskirts of towns, public parks etc, with or without flashing lights, but I would also appeal to fellow smokers to use the facilities provided on streets, there is no excuse for standing beside a smoking box and throwing the butt on the ground.

DRIVER SUES DEAD TEENAGE CYCLIST SHE KNOCKED OVER AND KILLED

A driver who knocked over and killed a teenage cyclist is suing the dead 17-year-old for the "emotional trauma" she has suffered. The teenager, from Alcona in Canada, was out cycling with friends in the early hours of a wet night in October 2012 when he was hit from behind by Sharlene Simon's car. The boy was killed, his friend seriously injured, and another boy sustained scratches. Ms Simon the mother of three says she is suing the boy who died, as well as his parents, his brother who has since also passed away - and the two others boys over the crash. In a statement filed at court, Ms Simon is claiming \$1.35 million in damages because of her psychological suffering, including depression, anxiety, and post-traumatic stress. She claims the boys were "incompetent cyclists who did not apply their brakes properly". The dead boys devastated parents have been left horrified by the claim and his mother added "I'm in shock. She killed my child and now she wants to profit from it?" A lawyer for the boys' families has also launched a law suit against Ms Simon, covering medical expenses for the three boys and funeral costs.

TRAVELLING ECO

Not everyone can walk to work but for shorter journeys of less than a mile, we'd all be healthier if we left the car at home and walked instead. This is particularly relevant for parents who do the school run, and drive their kids to school when they could easily walk. Getting out into the fresh air and walking to school or the shops will not only improve your health it will save you petrol money and help relax you too. Parents who walk their kids to and from school have the chance to chat to them about their day instead of concentrating on the traffic. Some schools near Edinburgh have banned all traffic from streets around the school at the start and end of the school day and if this pilot project is a success, more schools may adopt this strategy in the future.

OCTOPI CAN REGROW THEIR ARMS (BUT ARMS CAN'T GROW INTO OCTOPI)

You might already know this, but it bears repeating: if an octopus loses an arm, she can regrow it, which is a pretty nifty trick. Octopi can actually drop their arms to confuse predators, although this is a plan of last resort since growing new ones takes a while. Thanks to the concentration of neurons in their arms, the detached arm can keep wriggling in a rather convincing way while the octopus escapes to safety. Octopui have a grand total of three hearts. Seem like too many to you? Two of them are devoted exclusively to circulation throughout the body, and the third circulates oxygen through the organs. While octopi swim, this third heart doesn't beat, which cuts down on their stamina, which explains why crawling through the water is preferred to cruising. Octopus ink (along with inks from other cephalopods like cuttlefish) is by no means toxic, it is an irritant. It's designed to confuse enemies not just by clouding the waters, but also mangling the vision, sense of taste, and smell of predators so the octopus has time to get away.

EXAM STRESS

It is important to study in a location where you can concentrate and won't be interrupted. Studying with others or as part of a study group can be helpful, but be careful to keep it from turning into an opportunity to catch up on the latest news and gossip.

Just as we are all different in many other ways, we also have different learning styles - so try out some of the following and use what works for you.

EFFECTIVE TIPS FOR REVISING

- 1. Make Summary Notes: Condense your class notes and reading by pinpointing key terms and concepts and make sure that you understand them. Writing these notes can help you to retain more information. You can recite the summary notes out loud, and even record and listen to them.
- 2. Use Flash Cards: Flashcards are very helpful tools to remember information. You can condense your summary notes into bullet points, keywords, lists, formulas and diagrams and place them onto a card for each topic. They are also easy to carry around so you can look at them anytime.
- 3. Quiz Yourself: Why not make up your own mock exam to test yourself. Write down a list of the keywords or questions and leave room underneath each one. Then pretend to take the exam and write down as much as you know about the topic under each keyword. If you do this with your study group it can even be fun!!
- 4. Practice under exam conditions: Practice going over past examination papers - in the same amount of time as in the exam. Although you are only practicing try writing the full answers to the questions so you can work through the entire thought process. Check your answers so you can assess your strengths and weaknesses and go back and study any area which you feel weak on.

5. Create memory aids such as Mnemonics and Diagrams:

Mnemonics are tools that can help you to remember formulas, keys concepts, definitions etc. Jot down these mnemonics or diagrams before you start answering any question. In that way, you can refer back to your plan when writing your answer, without fear of forgetting what you were going to write next. If you feel stressed or overwhelmed, it is important to speak with the adults in your life. They may not be aware of just how much pressure you are feeling to get everything done. Talk to a parent, teacher or counsellor, and ask for help in dealing with stress.

Health Matters.... With Dr. Michael Moloney

SINUSITIS PART 1

What is sinusitis?

The sinuses are small, air- filled spaces in the cheekbones and forehead. They produce mucus which drains into the nose through small channels. Sinusitis occurs when these spaces become swollen and inflamed. The most common cause of this inflammation is due to infection.

Sinusitis is a very common infection which can develop over a few days. On most occasions the symptoms will go within a week but it is not uncommon for it to last for 2-3 weeks. Sinusitis persisting for longer than 12 weeks is termed 'chronic' sinusitis.

Triggers for sinusitis

In most people sinusitis is triggered by a viral illness such as a cold or flu-like illness which may spread to the sinusitis. Most of these will clear themselves with time. Occasionally bacteria may become involved and thus worsening the infection.

Another common trigger for sinusitis is swelling of the nasal passages due to an abnormal immune response. This can occur in response to pollen (hayfever) or dust mites (allergic rhinitis) as well as many other allergens. The natural immune response can be abnormal in pregnancy as well as conditions such as asthma and sarcoidosis which can all lead to sinusitis. Occasionally sinusitis may be caused as a result of obstruction of the draining canals by a polyp or foreign body. In some cases infection may spread to a sinus from an infected tooth.

Smoking is well documented to increase your risk of developing sinusitis.

Symptoms of Sinusitis

The most common symptoms of sinusitis are pain and tenderness over the infected sinus. The pain is often worse when bending over. Often suffers may complain of a frontal headache. There may also associated symptoms of a blocked and runny nose with decreased senses of smell and taste. Suffers may feel feverish and have other symptoms such as bad breath, toothache, cough, tiredness or feeling of pressure/fullness behind ears.
