

BUSINESSMEN INDUCTED INTO THE ORDER OF INNISFALLEN

Two entrepreneurs who have built up an empire creating thousands of jobs, from very humble beginnings, have been honoured in recognition of the enormous contribution they have made to the economic and social fabric of the community in which they live.

Brothers-in-law Donal Ring and Michael O'Donoghue were inducted into the Order of Inisfallen at a reception in historic Muckross House in Killarney on Wednesday afternoon.

The awards scheme, a collaboration between Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce and Kerry County Council, was initiated in 2005 to recognise outstanding contributions by people to the economic development of the town and, in particular, its tourism industry.

Donal Ring is the founder of Munster Joinery and the O'Donoghue Ring Hotels Collection. He and his brother, Patrick, since deceased, established Munster Joinery in 1973 with a small operation at the rear of their family home in Ballydesmond, on the Kerry-Cork border.

The company has since grown to become one of the largest manufacturers of windows and doors in Europe and next year Munster Joinery will celebrate a landmark 50 years in business.

The family-run company employs in excess of 1,800 people with a further 900 on the payroll in the UK.

Close on 50 years after setting up the company, Donal Ring is still at the helm and continues to oversee all aspects of the business.

In 1978, he and his wife, Noreen (née O'Donoghue) purchased the property then known as the East Avenue Hotel – now the 66-bedroom Killarney Avenue Hotel.

Noreen's brother, Michael O'Donoghue, then a qualified electrician, joined them in the hospitality business at that stage and became one of the tourism industry's most successful and respected operators for over 40 years.

The company expanded in 1989 with the purchase of the Killarney Towers Hotel, with 182 bedrooms, and the 52-bedroom River Island Hotel in Castleisland before the flagship Killarney Plaza Hotel and Spa opened in 2002 with 198 bedrooms.

Michael was at the helm as managing director of the O'Donoghue Ring Collection until his recent retirement and the O'Donoghue Ring Collection is now one of the largest employers in Kerry.

Donal and Michael also expanded into the UK hospitality market with Centre Island Hotels which now has hotel properties based in Liverpool, Manchester and Birmingham.

At the induction ceremony in Muckross House, President of Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce, Niall Kelleher, said both Donal Ring and Michael O'Donoghue are prime examples of what can be achieved in life through hard work and sheer determination and they have set a great example for future generations to follow.

"Wherever and whenever you see a very successful business, it is always

"Donal Ring and Michael O'Donoghue are a wonderful example of how such courageous decisions can pay off so handsomely," he said.

Deputy Mayor of Killarney, Cllr John O'Donoghue, remarked: "There is scarcely a family

in Killarney, or indeed its hinterland, who have not benefitted from the work of these two men, be it through employment or the services they provide"

He added: "We are extremely fortunate here in Killarney to have them both to the fore of social and economic life within our town".

MC at the ceremony, Geraldine Rosney, said Donal Ring was a remarkable businessman whose contribution to the community has been "absolutely enormous".

"He has every right to be proud of what he has done and achieved and for what he continues to do and achieve.

"May the next chapter in the Munster Joinery story be as successful as the story has been so far, under your visionary leadership," she remarked. She said when Michael O'Donoghue commits himself to something, he does so totally and when he dreams, he dreams big.

"What he has achieved, what he has done and what he has contributed to the overall benefit and well-being of Killarney and Kerry is spectacular," she added.

Previous Order of Inisfallen recipients include actor Michael Fassbender, former Taoiseach Enda Kenny, industrialist Isolde Liebherr, Charles, the former Prince of Wales and now King of England and entertainer Daniel O'Donnell.

Inisfallen Island is one of Killarney's best-known and most historic heritage sites. It began as a place of healing and became a major centre of learning where the Annals of Inisfallen, the oldest contemporary source of the history of Munster, were scripted.

AN UNEXPECTED PRESENT FOR CHRISTMAS



Fine Gael TD Peter Burke has given Kerry an unexpected Christmas present.

The protracted row over wind energy in Kerry and the attempts to limit the number of turbines in a county already saturated has thrown up an unexpected Christmas present. This has been delivered by a minister of state and a Fine Gael TD.

Some people understandably around Scartaglen . But the reality is the minister for local Government and planning, Peter Burke, has rejected the advice of the independent Office of the Planning Regulator (OPR) who wanted to zone almost one sixth of Kerry for wind turbines. Instead, Mr Burke TD has reduced the area open to wind to a dot, comparatively.

The OPR recommendation was to zone for wind across 736 kms square, an area stretching from Killarney across the county to the north and the east, to Abbeydorney and to Rathmore and beyond.

Just 59 sq. kilometres in Kerry adjacent to the high voltage 200 Kv &110kv network in north & east of the county are now zoned as open to consideration for wind, following the final and surprising directive by Peter Burke. In other words, the efforts by the planning regulator last April and June to revise Kerry's wind energy policy, to bring it into line with national policy, have all but been rejected. The move represents "a seismic shift" from the last county development plan and from the minister's initial stance which was in line with the recommendations from the OPR.

Minister Peter Burke also rejected the OPR's advice to reclassify wind development to "permitted in principle", a standard much more favourable for a go ahead in planning. He left it at open to consideration which is a far higher bar to cross in terms of planning applications.

Certainly the minister's change of heart when he published his intentions last August comes after some 785 hundreds of public submissions.

Some including the local Greens, effectively Government partners of the minister,

favoured the larger OPR zoning. The Kerry Greens in fact said Kerry should remain a leader in wind production.

No one anticipated the turnaround.

We must give credit where it is due - the turn around is also down to the sterling work of senior planner Damien Ginty and his team and this was acknowledged by members.

Chief executive Moira Murrell's report was also considered especially persuasive. It pointed out how the views of the council were "unanimous" in relation to wind energy policy and this was the case on three separate occasions. And how detailed analysis had been undertaken.

Scartaglen as the Healy-Raes pointed out will not be happy and have gained nothing and this is true. But the legal advice - hundreds of thousands of euro will be wasted in a judicial review - seems to have been taken on board by the council as a whole. We will see. Meanwhile, this is a triumph for Kerry.

Without entirely throwing the planning regulator office under the bus, the minister also accepted technical analysis and process followed by the council planners as more thorough.

Chief Executive Murrell said "the minister acknowledges our contribution as a county and the sensitivity of the county".

"Just one per cent of the landmass of Kerry is open to consideration, no more no less than that.This is huge progress that has been made by applying the process, " Ms Murrell said.

Compared to the previous 2015 - 2021 county development plan where 546 km2 was open to consideration for wind, there had been "a seismic shift",she said.

A judicial review, the only mechanism which might overturn the directive, would cost hundreds of thousands of euro and would not succeed, councillors were told.

OLD GOATS AND NEW COATS



I follow the Old Irish Goat Society on Facebook and there are some wonderful pics of the goats with their winter coats. Apparently, Irish goats, old and new, grow a special underbelly of cashmere for the winter and this keeps them warm. I kid you not! We in Kerry are seeing plenty of pictures of deer and sheep and few of our wild goats. Deer too put on a special coat for the winter and grow an underbelly too. It is doubtful if this is cashmere. Still, their dark winter coats and layers of fat are keeping the cold at bay, rangers assure me. But should there be a moratorium on hunting? Dramatic pictures are emerging of deer in snow and deer in beautiful landscapes. I took a few myself during the week in Muckross, particularly of the red deer.

LIGHTS AND CHRISTMAS

There is one lane that is especially lit up in Killarney and deserves our attention. Last week we mentioned the lack of Christmas lights in lanes and suggested the council and the chamber might look at the case for putting a bit of Christmas colour into our much used lanes, perhaps next year. In the meantime the Ross Hotel has taken its own steps for the second year running. It has put up an entrancing green and white overhead display which combined with red outdoor tables makes for a stunning scene.

With the stained glass window of the Church of Ireland to the side, the Ross Lane, or Church lane as it was once known, would make a great Christmas card.

Speaking of which, Christmas cards are not as plentiful this Christmas with lots of people telling me they are sending cards only to a few people. There may be reasons for this, including the cost of stamps, or even something to do with the environment. The environment is a catch all excuse now for not doing things. In the way of health and safety ! At the same time we read of an interesting study in University of Limerick about how sending Christmas Cards is associated with lower symptoms of depression. In addition it is an effort to sit down each year and think of people particularly if you haven't touched base in a while. But it is also a case of "to receive you have to give", if you like getting Christmas Cards, as I do.





NPWS ACQUIRES STRATEGIC LAND

The National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) has announced its latest strategic land acquisition at Derrycunnihy in Killarney.

The acquisition consists of over 70 hectares at Derrycunnihy, a site completely surrounded by Killarney National Park lands. It is a hugely important addition to the Park as it is an area of high conservation and ecological value, and all of the lands are part of a European site of nature conservation, Macgillycuddy Reeks ጼ Killarney National Park SAC (site code 365). The habitat here consists of dry heath, oak woodlands, pockets of blanket bog and an oligotrophic lake, a true reflection of what lands in a National Park should be.

These lands are close to Derrycunnihy church, an important architectural feature within Killarney National Park. This iconic structure, one of the most beautifully situated, scenic churches in Ireland recently undergone has conservation works and is home to a number of protected species including the lesser horseshoe bat.





Declan O'Donoghue, a teacher at St. Brendan's College will be joined by three students from the school on Tuesday December 20th when he will undertake a 10km charity swim


"Like most families we have experienced the loss of family members to this illness.", Declan told Killarney Outlook.

BLEPHARITIS

WHAT IS BLEPHARITIS?

Blepharitis causes eyelids to become red, swollen and inflamed. It doesn't normally cause serious damage to the eyes, but it can be very uncomfortable. It tends to be a long-term condition, which means you're likely to need ongoing treatment. Severe cases do have a risk of causing long-term damage, but fortunately these are quite rare.

TYPES OF BLEPHARITIS

There are two main types of blepharitis anterior and posterior. Anterior blepharitis

When the front (anterior) part of the eyelids becomes sore, this can be caused by an infection, allergy or a general sensitivity to bacteria present on the eyelids. It can also be associated with some scalp conditions, such as very dry or oily skin and dandruff.

Posterior blepharitis

Also known as meibomian gland dysfunction (MGD) is when the glands that make the oily part of your tears become blocked. Both types of blepharitis can cause dry eye or make it worse if you already have it. Many people will have a combination of blepharitis, meibomian gland dysfunction and dry eye.

RISK FACTORS

Blepharitis is more common in people over the age of 50, but anyone can develop it. This is often because the glands that make the normal tears, particularly the oily part of the tears, tend to become less effective as you get older.

SYMPTOMS

Blepharitis can cause crusting and white scales may stick to the roots of eyelashes. Your eyelid edges may become red and your eyes will feel gritty, burning, sore or itchy. If you experience these symptoms, make an appointment with your optometrist.

TREATMENT

There is a range of products designed especially for treating blepharitis, such as sterile pads, individual moist wipes and separate cleaning solutions.

As part of the treatment, you need to remove all the crusting and debris from the edge of your eyelids and from between your eyelashes. You should use a special lid cleaning product. Treatment of blepharitis is a long-term procedure. You may not see any improvement for several weeks.

Continue the treatment twice a day for at least one month, then less often as it starts to get better. You will probably need to continue to clean your lids at least twice a week to help prevent the blepharitis from returning.





The stiffest test of the season so far lies in wait for St Pauls Womens when they entertain the Portlaoise Panthers this Saturday December 17th with a 4:30pm tip off. That's because the only team in the League with a 100% record is a bit like Santa, coming to town. The Panthers have been devouring every team they have met so far with an average winning margin of 21 points. Siofra O Sheas return to the hardwood after injury is gathering pace while the re-emergence of Denise Dunlea can only but strengthen their options. Aisling O Mahony, Cassandra Buckley, Seodhna O'Donoghue and Jessica Quirke are all live options as a strong bench rotation is always needed to keep the match intensity at a top level.

LAKERS SUFFER LOSS DUE TO I NJURIES SCOTTS LAKERS 91 MOY TOLKA ROVERS 102

If you ever wanted evidence that a full strength squad is needed to compete at the top end of the InsureMyVan.ie National Basketball League look no further than this game. For the third game in succession the Lakers were shorn of some important personnel and there's no doubting that the absence of Mark O Shea(injury), Rui Saravia(family commitments), David Gleeson and Jamie O Sullivan deprived them of really putting it up to the slick Tolka Rovers side. But to give them huge credit also they played very close to their potential but it seemed that any time they threatened the Glasnevin based side, either Matthew Tracey, Ramanas Ramanauskas or Conor Liston came up with a riposte and there was to be no denying Gerard Kennedys side the victory. Tolka now sit hot on the heels of table toppers Limerick Sport Eagles while the Lakers are now sitting two thirds of the way down the table. A win against SETU Waterford Vikings this weekend is imperative, if only to give them a much needed confidence boost and you could argue that its a win their recent performances may deserve.

Tolka were quick into their stride with veteran Michael Bonaparte and hot shot Matthew Tracey and Ramanas Ramanauskas getting their eye in early. Ronan Collins , returning to the Lakers lineup hit five early points but Tracey was on fire inside and out and the visitors were 25-8 ahead with 3-12 to go in the first quarter. The Lakers were now in the all too familiar territory of trying to reel back an early deficit but the two Jacks, Ferguson and O Sullivan, got their engines revved up and the lead was cut to 11, 29-18. A late three point play by Zachary Bates pushed that lead to 14 at the end of the first. This is something Coach Jarlath Lee was left to rue. "Once again offensively we've made a poor start which isn't ideal when you have a depleted squad. With GAA and other commitments it looks like it maybe the New Year before we have a full deck".

Onto the second quarter and Eoin Carroll brought his youthful enthusiasm to the floor, his two successful free throws spurred a scoring run with Aron Walker hitting a big three to bring the lead back to 6, 34-28 within three minutes of the restart. Senan O Leary then got in on the act to cut the gap further but the mailman Tracey delivered another three followed by two Conor Liston baskets. Marko Bencic was also prominent for the Lakers at this juncture but his rapid fire six points only served to leave the half time gap at 14, 55-41.

One thing about the Lakers is they never throw in the towel, and it would have been easy to do so but instead they redoubled their efforts and they cut the gap to eight. 93-85 with 3.40 remaining. Jack Ferguson again picked up the baton, he hit a season's best eight three pointers, and with Collins and Walker also chipping away could there be a grandstand finish? Unfortunately not as Tracev and Conor Liston answered with a defiant no and even though Bencic and O Leary would land late baskets it was not to be and the Dubliners headed back to the capital with the spoils on a 102-91 scoreline. It wasn't all doom and gloom though for Coach Lee. "We scored 90+ points against a top team and you could argue we left maybe another ten points after us. And we got caught out with a few second chance rebounds too. But we must keep going and it's always about the next game which is at home again".

Jack Ferguson was excellent with 38 points, Aron Walker was on 17, Senan O Leary and Ronan Collins shared 18 points equally, Marko Bencic had 8, Jack O Sullivan(4), Paul Clarke(4) and Eoin Carroll clocked out with 2 points.

Matthew Tracey was tormentor in chief with 41 points, Conor Liston and Ramusnas Ramanauskas had 16 each while Rory Howe and Michael Bonaparte both struck 9.

The Lakers welcome the SETU Waterford Vikings to Killarney this Saturday night and will be targeting this game as a must win. They possess an excellent record against the South Easterners doing the double over them last season. Earlier this season Jack Ferguson led the way with a 34 point salvo with Ronan Collins , Rui Saravia and Marko Bencic also scoring freely in a 99-71 win. But the Vikings, boosted by a recent big win over the Cougars, will be no pushover and in Freeman Brou they possess a serious weapon. Backboned by the Kvanagh brothers, Jay and Dale, Denis Miculescu and Scott Dunphy they will travel to the Kingdom looking to plunder the points. Tip off in the Killarney Sports and Leisure is 7.30pm as usual.

MUNSTER CLUB FINALS

Three Kerry clubs returned from Mallow last weekend with three Munster titles in their grasp. The old saying about 'an rud is annamh is iontach' applies to a certain extent, especially at Intermediate and Junior grade. Kerry clubs have won 15 out of 19 Munster Intermediate club titles and claimed six All Ireland titles along the way since Seán Kelly as Uachtaráin CLG introduced the All Ireland Club Championships – his own Kilcummin lifted the All Ireland in 2018. Clyda Rovers of Cork in 2013 is literally the only time since 2006 that the Kerry champions didn't go on to win the province.

The numbers are similar at Junior, with Kerry clubs lifting 18 of the 21 titles on offer since the competition was introduced and 10 of the All Ireland titles on offer.

You can understand a certain amount of unease in other counties at the fact that Kerry are so dominant in these competitions. That's especially true when you consider that other counties tend to have 16 clubs in their senior championship, whereas we have eight clubs and eight district teams. In short, Kerry's Intermediate champions are the ninth best club team in Kerry, competing against the 17th best club team from other counties, and that further applies at junior level.

I honestly can't understand why other counties don't copy our model. I have a lot of sympathy for Cork - I think a lot of Kerry people don't understand exactly how huge the number of clubs and the distances to cover in Cork are. Even with district teams, it's a massive challenge to get a decent schedule of games played, and that's before you factor in the amount of dual clubs in Cork. But Limerick, Clare, Tipperary, Waterford? There is room for divisional teams in their domestic competitions if there was sufficient interest and it would help their clubs to aim for a higher standard of regular championship games. I think it's fairly obvious by any metric that it helps competitiveness at the inter-county level. To me that's a win/ win scenario all round. Instead of complaining about Kerry's system, why not just emulate it?

MUNSTER SENIOR CLUB FINAL Kerins O'Rahillys 2-6 Newcastlewest 1-8

Rahillys joined a roll of honour that includes Shannon Rangers, East Kerry (3), Dr. Crokes (8), Castleisland Desmonds (2), Laune Rangers (2), Austin Stacks (2) and An Ghaeltacht. They made very hard work of it though, arguably harder cthan it needed to be. Certainly they will have to be sharper and more clinical in possession and I would argue that they7 need to be a lot more direct with the ball to win an All Ireland. This was poor enough fare in the first half. I suppose it's easy to criticise when I was watching it at home on tv - I'll make no apologies for being weary of the roads and minding myself with the skinning cold last weekend. Ah, no, Newcastlewest leadibng by 0-4 to 0-3 and Rahillys failing to score from play for the entuire half has to count as fairly poor fare by any judgement. Gavin O'Brien did well to win an early free to open Rahillys' account but Eoin Hurley replied in kind after Cian Sheehan was fouled – Sheehan and Coprmac Coffey shared a great due. Shane Stack scored a good point from play. Hurley from long distance and Jack Savage exchanged further frees. The truth is that Newcastlewest were actually the better side, but labouring to put it on the scoreboard. Tommy Walsh always looked dangerous – why Rahillys eschewed long ball into him remains a complete mystery to me. When they did try it, he very nearly blasted a great goal - credit to centre back Jmaes Kelly for a great block. lan Corbett has been Limerick's talisman for several years now and showed why with a brilliant scoire, but Tommy Walsh gathered a great mark and pointed to close out the first half scoring. Newcastlewest led by a point, 0-4 to 0-3, and it could and should have been more. It was already likely that they would rue those first half chances.

Ben Hanafin had Rahillys level quickly. They looked a vbit sharper now and another long ball into Tommy Walsh saw him gather from Jack Savage to pivot and finish and finish to the net. Cormac Coffey made it 1-5 to 0-4. Cian Sheehan had a shot off the post in reply, but Newcastlewest's own big man Mike McMahon was guick to slot home the rebound. Again though Rahillys posted a rapid reply. O'DONOGHUE CUP PREVIEW



It's a repeat of the 2020 Final (actually played last year) between Dr. Crokes and Spa. Dr. Crokes won out on that occasion, having taken command with three first half goals. Spa actually closed the gap to a single point but just couldn't quite get over the line.

There's no doubting the different pedigrees here. Spa haven't lifted the O'Donoghue Cup since September 24th, 1989, when they beat Gneeveguilla by 1-8 to 2-3 in a replay. Spa had trailed by 1-2 to 0-4 at the break, having played with the wind, and a second James Brosnan goal ten minutes into the second half had Gneevequilla in control. However, veteran Seánie Kelliher came off the bench to score a great gaol in the 53rd minute and Spa finished strongly to take the title. For the record, that Spa team lined out as Joe O'Leary, Denis Cremin, Dermot Cronin, James Cahill, Michael O'Leary, John Cahill, Philip Coffey, Mossy Cronin (0-1), Dan Kennedy, Francis Doherty, Maurice Cronin, Pat Cronin (0-1), Paul O'Donoghue (0-1), Jer Morris, Michael McAuliffe (0-4). Dr. Crokes have won the East Kerry

Championship a whopping eighteen times since that 1989 game and 31 times in total, including an unbeaten run from 2006 to 2013. Eoin Brosnan and Colm Cooper head the roll of honour with twelve titles, with Kieran O'Leary bidding to join them and Mike Moloney, John Payne, and Brian Looney all looking to win an eleventh medal this Sunday.

Both sides are likely to miss key players – fairly inevitable after a very long playing year. Fionn Fitzgerald, Gavin White, and Cian McMahon are very unlikely to play any part, while Michael Potts is also a serious doubt for Dr. Crokes. Micheál Burns did come on against Killarney Legion in the semi-final, while Tom Doyle is expected to return to action.

For Spa Liam Kearney played 45 minutes against Gneeveguilla successfully, while Niall McCarthy, Eoin Fitzgerald, and Dara Moynihan all came off the bench to telling effect. Mike 'Stam' O'Donoghue didn't come on but was togged out and ready. David Spillane came off with an injury and, like Kaerney and Moynihan, hasn't trained since but will hopefully see some action.

It will be a very tight game. There's very little between the sides at the moment. Crokes won the corresponding league game, but neither side as anywhere close to full strength for that one and it won't have any real bearing. Crokes, with Tony Brosnan and Mikey Casey in shorting form at the moment, will probably go in as very slight favourites, they have the experience to see out tough games like this. They'll probably need it all, though, the likes of Dan O'Donoghue, Shane Cronin, Liam Kearney, Evan Cronin, and Michael Foley form a very formidable Spa spine.

The two teams have met before in finals. The first time they met in the final was in 1968, whehn the honours fell Dr. Crokes way as they won their tenth O'Donoghue Cup in thirteen years.

The game was played on September 6th, 1968 in the Fitzgerald Stadium. Spa, with Mick Gleeson in top form, made the better start, but that was before his Kerry team-mate Tom Long cut loose. Jackie Foley could only parry a Long rocket that Con Clifford deftly fisted to the net. Tom fielded the kick-out and drove through for a goal himself before adding a point. That gave Crokes a half-time lead of 2-1 to 0-5.

The second half followed a similar pattern as Spa closed the gap with good scores, only to be caught again by another brilliant Tom Long goal. Con Clifford slotted a penalty and, although Spa never gave up, they could never quite close the gap. Three of the best players on the day were Donie O'Sullivan and Mick Gleeson for Spa and Eamonn Fitzgerald for Dr. Crokes. All three had travelled together down from Dublin in Donie's car for the game. It was Jackie Looney's 10th O'Donoghue Cup medal. The game was refereed by Seanie Burrows of John Mitchels, whop had played both with against many of the players on both sides and was himself a Kerry player in both football and basketball.

SOCCER World Cup

It's been manna from heaven for a lot of sports writers, but I'm not so convinced that it's been top quality bin terms of actual soccer. A lot of journalists had great fun commentating on what a disgrace it was that Qatar were hosting the World – they would have been a lot more credible if they weren't actually broadcasting from....Qatar. We shall gently pass over Gianna Infantino's meandering speeches and selfjustifications.

Cristiano Ronaldo's uncomfortable departure from Man United and his relegation to the bench for Portugal was a big talking point. I'm less convinced - Ronaldo has been one of the greatest goalscorers in the history of the game, but he has always operated in a free role. He doesn't press and never really did - the same is very true of Lionel Messi, Barcelona was built around their fulcrum. I can see parallels between Ronaldo for Portugal and Aidan O'Shea for Mayo - great players who don't suit their team's style of play. He was great, but 'was' is the operative word. That said, attempts at a narrative of this tournament being all about young players or ac changing of the guard have been blown apart by the likes of Lewandowski, Giroud, Messi, and Luka Modric. The Croatian midfielder has been genuinely sensational (Morocco are everybody's favourite underdog story, and with good reason, but they remind me of Greece in 2004. Ultra compact and hardworking, but you had your work cut out to make a highlights reel of their games. Leicester famously won a Premiership by inviting teams on and counter-attacking with ferocious pace; that's the best Morocco can hope for. It would be sensational if an African team were to win the World Cup and the rattling of traditional superpowers like Italy (who didn't qualify) and Germany (who didn't get out of the group) could pay long term dividends. But it hasn't been done by playing the 'beautiful game' in any beautiful way; personally I'd like a bit of flair and imagination along the way. Germany in particular came in for a lot of schadenfreude after their initial protests about human rights violations by the hosts were shut down. Supposedly that's why they lost soccer matches - I don't actually see any connection myself. I put it down to the two second half goals scored by Japan in their opening game that ultimately cost Germany, not anything else, unless some commentators are actually trying to suggest that Japan or Spain were somehow inspired by the deaths of migrant workers? It's just bizarre, you could make an equally cogent argument that their horoscopes were out of alignment. The joy of sport is that each game

is a meritocracy in its own right. Germany didn't qualify from the group stage of a soccer tournament because they didn't win enough soccer games. Quod est demonstratum.

The last sixteen was worryingly predictable for the most part. The Netherlands saw off the United States, no surprise there, although the US are improving rapidly in soccer terms. Argentina beating Australia...again, no surprise. England beat Senegal and looked good doing it; I was starting to think that England could be real contenders here. Croatia got past Japan on penalties, and I didn't really expect Croatia to go too much further (shows what I know). Brazil won comfortably against South Korea, I think we all had Brazil as overall favourites by this stage. France putting three goals past Poland also raised a few eyebrows; France were making light of their injury list. I did think a more adventurous Morocco would see off Spain, instead a goalless draw went to penalties and Morocco won. In the great and truly fascinating history between those two great cultures, it will make a fine footnote. Portugal destroyed Switzerland, with Ronaldo's replacement stifling a lot of debate by scoring a hat-trick.

Quarter-finals. This is basically where metal meets meat and things get really serious. All the chaff has been swept away by now, every remaining country has a real chance of seizing immortality.

Croatia and Brazil looked like the best tie of the round. Brazil looked better and made the breakthrough in extra-time, a superbly controlled finish by Neymar. Croatia held their nerve and forced an unpretty but vital equaliser and went on to nail every penalty superbly and go through. A very tough result on Brazil, but arguably deserved, they had been caught fairly. That only incentivised other teams. There were reports of Argentine players celebrating – well, of course they did. Wouldn't you in their position?

Argentina looked in control against the Netherlands and a Messi penalty put them into a 2-0 lead. Frankly, I was amazed that the Netherlands got in for two goals to equalise. Is it just me, or did Argentina look tired in the

latter stages? Once again it went to the lottery of penalties; it's a truly awful way to decide any game. I'd honestly prefer a simple coin toss. Anyway, Argentina through and smelling blood in the water now as they draw nearer to the big prize. They were obviously fairly bitter in the immediate aftermath - Messi was frankly petulant. Some gods have feet of clay - I think it's a mistake top dwell on anything after you survive a test like that. Remote impassivity is the wisest approach, but sure it's easy to talk on the sidelines and passions were running high. Morocco dismissed Portugal 1-0 to become the first African and Arab nation to reach a semi-final. I think Portugal did very well to get this far, they seem to have been in a slow but discernible decline at the same time as their greatest player.

Last but not least, France v England. Again, there is a fascinating and frequently bloody history between two nations whose stories are incredibly interwtined, but a soccer match is just a soccer match. And this was a very good match. Look, of course I was cheering for France; I couldn't be listening to English commentators if they actually won a World Cup. It's nothing personal to my many English friends and relatives, who generally speak in hushed tones and with sympathy whenever Irish soccer is mentioned nowadays. I remember when Ireland were at least equal to England in soccer – but that is a far distant past now. England have built quietly, cleverly, and carefully, and investment in youth facilities in particular is starting to pay off. Southgate came in after they were beaten by Iceland and basically a laughing stock; in hindsight, it was no bad time to take the reins. Remember the 'golden generation' when they were trying to accommodate Gerrard, Lampard, and Paul Scholes (a truly great player, but a left winger? Isn't fast and doesn't tackle, but he's going to control the flank? Wow). This team isn't that. Southgate admirably resisted pressure to throw the likes of an over-rated Foden (he's very, very good, but he's not ready to dictate a game at this level) or Grealish into this. He's fairly conservative, but there's no harm in that. I was deeply, deeply sceptical of Maguire heading into this tournament, and I still say that's he's brilliant at attacking the ball but poor at turning back onto danger, but he fit perfectly into three at the back for England and he looked far more assured than he does at club level. England gave as good as they got and played very well. Bukayo Saka was a revelation, I had no idea that he was that good at that level. I don't agree with all the complaints about the referee afterwards, anymore than I did in the Argentina game. France did give away a fair few fouls, but they weren't bad or nasty fouls and I wouldn't have been issuing all that many cards either. No harm in getting stuck in, and both sides gave as good as they got. Tchouaméni scored a real cracker of an opening goal, that was precision. Harry Kane equalised from the spot. Giroud scored a second for France (I've always like Giroud, rarely a headliner but always does his business quietly and well at both club and national level) and England just couldn't break them down. That's all that happened. Complaints about the referee....ah, go on out of it. Did Southgate run his subs too late? Well, England were attacking well at the time. I'd probably have brought in Grealish a bit earlier, but that's about it.

I don't get the speculation about Southgate's future. England performed very well and were unlucky to lose. That's after losing the European Championship Final on penalties. It's a young team with genuine potential superstars in the likes of Bellingham, Foden, and Saka. Something about that record makes people think that some un-named figure can do better? I really don't get it.

Argentina, France, Morocco, and Croatia. The latter two appear better at penalty shootouts (not exactly a metric that I'd trust) but the former two will be hoping to finish their respective semi-finals within the ninety minutes.

By the time you read this, you'll know who is contesting the final on Sunday. My heart says Croatia, my head is saying that France should just about have enough to beat Argentina, and and my gut is saying that Morocco are going no further.c



The Club extends its sympathies to the family of Robert (Robbie) O Brien who passed away last weekend. While the involvement of Robbie's family in the club today is well known, what may not be common knowledge is that Robbie himself was an outstanding footballer for the club in his day. He won an East Kerry Minor Title beating Rathmore in the final in 1958 and in the very same year he lined out for the senior team in the O Donoghue Cup Final against town rivals Dr Crokes. He established himself on the senior team thereafter and played a starring role in the 1960 County Championship run which culminated in a defeat to Feale Rangers.

Unfortunately a bad accident put pay to his football career but he remained a Legion man at heart. Having attended and played football also at St Brendans College he worked in the family Building business until he decided to train as a teacher. He then found himself back at his alma mater after spells in Dublin and Castleisland, and taught at the famed school until his retirement. 





FOCUS ON EARLY SPRING FLOWERING SHRUBS

Now is a good time if you are planning a new garden or trying to add some colour to an established garden to plant some early flowering spring shrubs. One of the best known shrubs is the Camellia and these popular shrubs are starting to flower in most places at the moment. The Camellia is a very valuable shrub in the garden as it can give a focal point to any shrubbery all year round with its glossy green leaves and showy blooms from early spring. A lot of people think that Camellias are a difficult shrub to grow, but in fact they are no more difficult than Rhododendrons or azaleas, and most varieties on sale now are hardy. When choosing the spot to plant your Camellia, make sure it is sheltered from cold winds as they can damage the flowering buds, as can frost. When planting your Camellia make sure to mix plenty of moss peat with the earth, rather than on its own around the plant, as it will tend to root out quicker. Camellias in the ground, that it might be small initially but most will grow to the size of a small tree, so allow plenty of room around it. There is very little maintenance with Camellias only to

prune out old dead wood, clean up old blooms that fall to the ground, and to mulch around the base of plants every spring with some moss peat. There are a lot of other good spring flowering shrubs, here is a list of just a few: Forsythia, Cythisus, Corylus, Berberis Darwinii, Ribes, and Skimmia.
