

SAFE INITIATIVE LAUNCHED IN KILLARNEY

Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce and An Garda Siochana have come together to launch an innovative and very practical new technology tool to ensure the streets of Killarney remain safe for everyone.

The clever but simple to use SEE Something SAY Something text messaging system will allow members of the public to immediately alert Gardai to any issue that might be of concern and it will enable them to react in a very prompt and efficient manner to any incident reported.

The free text message will be received by the sergeant on duty and it will be acted upon immediately.

Using any model of mobile phone, members of the public can immediately report a crime or any incident of anti-social behaviour by simply texting KILLARNEY and a brief account of the incident and the location to 50555.

The service, developed by Tralee entrepreneur Brian Stephenson, is free of charge and it is completely anonymous with the mobile phone number used remaining confidential.

The system, already successfully introduced in Tralee with hugely positive results, will complement the Purple Flag initiative that is aimed at maintaining Killarney's standing as one

of the safest and most attractive towns in the country at night.

Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce President, Paul Sherry, said while Killarney is well established and highly regarded as one of the safest towns in the country, the SEE Something SAY Something initiative will further safeguard safety and security of locals and visitors.

"The Chamber is delighted to be involved in this fantastic project and we are urging the public to give it their full support as it can

only work well with their involvement," he said.

"This is another tool for the Gardai to use in conjunction with the Purple Flag project and Neighbourhood Watch and Community Alert schemes and the real winner here is Killarney," he said.

Killarney Garda Superintendent Flor Murphy commended and acknowledged the

Chamber of Tourism and Commerce for taking the project on board and for embracing it so enthusiastically.

"SEE Something SAY Something has worked very successfully in Tralee and we are delighted to be able to introduce it to Killarney. It's all about public safety and making

our town and its surrounds better and safer for residents and visitors," he said.

"It is a new, modern and smart wav for the public to communicate with the Gardai without having to formally report incidents and while remaining anonymous with assurance of confidentiality," he added.

"It doesn't take away the traditional methods of fighting crime but it will enable us to work more quickly and more smartly if anti-social behaviour or criminality is reported by text message," Supt Murphy said.

Very distinctive promotional signage

highlighting the SEE Something SAY Something text number – including signs, posters and stickers – will be erected in several high-visibility outdoor and indoor vantage points in and around the town and the public is being encouraged to embrace the initiative to tackle suspicious or illegal behaviour.

The Chairman of the Joint Policing Committee, Cllr Niall Kelleher, who is also Vice President of the Chamber of Tourism and Commerce, has encouraged all businesses to erect stickers with the text details in their premises.

"This is not replacing the traditional method of dialling 999 in the event of an emergency but it is a very valuable cost effective and user friendly tool to ensure Killarney is a safer and happier place for all," he said.

,000 people gathered at Killarney Racecourse in the early hours of last Saturday to walk from Darkness into Light in memory of a young man whose family have carved his name into all of our hearts.

Nathan Carroll from Ross Road was just 14 years old when he lost his life to suicide and since 2011 his parents Marie and Denis, along with his four brothers have held an annual walk in his memory in aid of Pieta House.

Before this year's event a staggering €350,000 was raised at the walk by the family and the committee who help them out each year.

"We are overwhelmed again at the support we have received from everyone from Killarney and beyond", Marie told the Killarney Outlook.

"This year we set off 15 lanterns - in memory of people who have passed away - and were helped in that task by families who have been affected by suicide", she added.

"The atmosphere at the Killarney Racecourse on Saturday morning last was unbelieveable, the support and love of those who did the walk was palpable and we cannot thank everyone enough for their support" Marie said.

"There are so many people and organisations we are so grateful to including our hard working committee, Electric Ireland, Killarney Racecourse, the National Park, Sean Hurley and Dan Devane", Denis added.

Nathan's Walk - Darkness into Light are hoping that an outreach house will be opened in Killarney this year and are working tirelessly towards this goal.

Following practice on the International Track at Mondello, motorcycle racer Kevin Coyne got his weekend off to a great start.



Kerry Youth Film Exhibition will highlight up and coming film talent from Kerry

A Kerry Youth Film Projects Exhibition opens in the Garden Room of Killarney House as part of Cruinniú na nÓg on Saturday 15th June next. The exhibition will run until the 21st June and is open from 9.00am until 5.30pm daily. It will offer a unique opportunity for Kerry Filmmaker in Residence, Mieke Vanmechelen to present a collection of work produced during her residency. The exhibition includes a film installation and a series of "behind the scenes" photographic works. Encompassing the work of over 16 groups of young people from all over Kerry, ranging from mini-documentaries to crime dramas the exhibition showcases the creativity, enthusiasm and imagination of each group.

Mieke Vanmechelen is an artist, filmmaker and farmer from Kenmare and is the Kerry Filmmaker in Residence since 2017. Her main objective in the position is to work with schools and youth groups, enabling creativity and empowering young people to express themselves through the medium of film. Mieke worked with diverse groups of students from around the county and built up a particularly strong relationship with Killarney Community College. The school has had many successes with film productions and screenings, being selected for the Kerry Film Festival in 2018 and reaching the finals of this year's Fresh Film Festival with well attended screenings at Triskel Arts Centre, Cork and the Odeon Cinema, Limerick. Two inspired students, Karolina Gunia and Brian Kelleher are in the process of producing their own short films. Kelleher stated "In March, April and May of 2018 we created a



short film this was an amazing experience and one of my most cherished memories from that year. The experience of making the film further inspired me this year to start a solo project and write and shoot my own short film. I have only Mieke to thank for showing me the skills and possibilities of this area of art".

A recent collaborative film called "It's OK not to be OK" was also produced under the direction of teacher Brian O'Reilly to accompany the school's participation in the Cycle Against Suicide, a national charity event. Students and teachers from Killarney Community College took part in the 4th stage of the Cycle Against Suicide on the 25th of April from Cork City to Killarney a distance of about 100 km. The film was made as a collaborative project by students and teachers at the school and highlights the importance of issues surrounding mental health. It reflected the ethos of inclusion and togetherness that Killarney Community College seeks to provide and encourage.

The residency is funded by Kerry County Council and The Arts Council.

ILLARNEY bid a fond farewell to popular local man Neilie Griffin, who passed away last weekend after a brave battle with illness. Neilie, from Pinewood Estate and formerly of Moulagh, Fossa, Killarney, was a familiar face in Killarney town through his dedicated work with the local council.

He was also well known in sporting circles where he gave tremendous service

to St. Paul's Basketball club for several years. During the nineties and noughties, Neilie was the team manager with the St. Paul's senior mens national league teams that played under the Kerry Spring and Gleneagle Lakers banner. He travelled the length and breadth of the country with the team and was a popular and respected figure among the players and officials. Always reliable and obliging, no job was ever too big or small for Neilie, who was also very instrumental in spearheading various fundraising initiatives for the club.

Neilie and all the Griffin family have given St. Paul's excellent service on and off the court over the years. His wife Mary was a very active member of the club's juvenile committee for many years and one of their proudest moments in basketball was to witness their daughter Diane representing Ireland on the international stage. Their son John was also an outstanding player winning an U-19 national cup with St. Paul's in 1997 and played in the superleage for several years with Gleneagle Lakers. Their other daughters Siobhan and Aislinn also represented St. Paul's at various levels.

Neilie's interest in basketball never waned and he was delighted to see the return of national league basketball to Killarney two years ago after an absence of nearly a decade. Despite battling an unfortunate illness, he was a regular at Scotts Lakers home games in Killarney Sports Centre and always had a kind word for everyone. At Neilie's funeral mass on Monday Fr Jim Linehan described him as a great family man and recalled his outstanding work with the council and his wonderful commitment to St. Paul's Basketball Club.

Neilie's former Work Colleagues in Killarney Town Council and members of St. Paul's Basketball club provided guards of honour as they escorted the funeral cortege from O'Shea's Funeral Home through Killarney town on Sunday evening and at The Church Of The Resurrection on Monday.

Global cyber security chiefs in Killarney

Leading international cyber security specialists convened in Killarney at the weekend for an enlightening Cyber Security Transatlantic Policy Forum.

Industry leaders, policy makers, politicians and law enforcement agencies from the US, Britain and Ireland gathered at The Brehon to share insights and examine available opinions at the inaugural conference.

As well working to improve and expand government, academic and private sector collaborations in cyber security, the event focused on the latest intelligence on how to safeguard against cyber-attacks.

The keynote speaker was Sir Rob Wainwright, Senior Partner for Deloitte's Cyber Practice and the former Director of Europol.

The latest developments and how an increasing dependency on cloud providers could create weaknesses was discussed by delegates, including Richard Browne, Director of Ireland's National Cyber Security Centre and Conrad Prince, Distinguished Fellow and Senior Cyber Adviser, Royal United Services Institute.

The extent that divergence in regulatory and legal frameworks exacerbate vulnerability cyber attacks, how criminals are evolving their capabilities to avoid detection and the most successful investigative tools that can be deployed were also discussed by an expert panel featuring Detective Inspector Alistair Burns of the PSNI; Todd Renner, Special Agent and Assistant Legal Attaché FBI; and James Sullivan of the Royal United Services Institute.

A panel on national security and defence, asking if cyber warfare

CAIRN OF PEACE MONUMENT UNVIELED






PARTICIPANTS WANTED



Good exam techniques will improve your grades in the State Exams



Each subject is answered in an A4 covered booklet. Write in your exam number and subject. Tick the answered through English or Irish box. Write in the make and model number of your calculator, as appropriate. Read the directions on the back cover of the Answer Book. Number each question and sub-question clearly in the left-hand margin of each page. The right-hand margin is for the corrector's use only. Write your answers clearly and legibly between the margins. Work neatly down the page.

Don't split questions by answering a part on one page and the other part further on. If you can't completely answer a question leave a page blank to which you can return. Use diagrams, sketches and illustrations if they enhance your answer. Use decent size diagrams, as they are quicker to draw and allow more detail. A well-presented script will make a favourable impression on the corrector.

The core of any exam is the quality of your answering. Keep the content of your answer relevant to the question. Read each question carefully before deciding which ones to answer. Tackle a good question first to settle you down. List the key points around which you will build your answer. Be concise, accurate and relevant. Waffle and repetition will not impress the corrector. Be familiar with the format of each paper well in advance of each exam session. How is the paper presented? What topics are examined? How many questions must be answered? What styles of question can you expect on any exam paper? Have you a choice of questions on the paper?

Are some questions compulsory or is there an open choice? Be careful with a paper, which is subdivided into subsections. Without prior knowledge of such a paper you could easily fail to address the relevant number of questions. As you do past papers, and again at the exam, read the instructions carefully. Handle a recent past paper in each subject for physical familiarity.

Doing well in any exam involves presenting your answers within the time allowed. Attempt the required number of questions. If you don't attempt a question you can't possibly earn any marks for it. Be familiar with the marking scheme for each paper and work out in advance the approximate time you can spend on each question. The time allocated to each question should be in direct proportion to the marks available for that question. By attempting the required number of questions, you have the best chance of maximising your grade in that subject. When your exam paper is handed to you read the instructions. Spend about five minutes reading the entire paper to get the feel for the paper. This allows you to settle down and gather your thoughts. Stick to your own pre-prepared answering plan and once you have made your choice of guestions, start with a guestion you can answer well. As you warm to your task, you will be pleasantly surprised at the font of information that comes to mind, as you need it.

When you have finished answering each question, reread it to ensure you haven't omitted any part. Allow at least five minutes at the end of the exam to read back over your answers and to check your overall presentation.

In the next article, I will have some advice for parents of exam candidates.

- ✓Be careful with a paper which is subdivided into subsections
- ✔ Handle a recent past paper for familiarity with its physical appearance and colour
- ✓ The time spent on a question must be in proportion to the marks for the question
- ✔ Proper allocation of time allows you to attempt the required number of questions
- ✔Reread the question when you have answered it to ensure you haven't left out a part
- ✓ Remain in the exam hall until the end of each session
- ✓ Examination timetables are available on www.examinations.ie.

Additional ambulance resources needed in Killarney

Fianna Fáil Local Election candidate for Killarney Neily O'Connor is calling for additional vehicles and personnel to be provided to the ambulance service in Killarney.

At the moment there is only one urgent and one transfer ambulance available at the base in the town.

"We urgently need additional ambulances and personnel in Kerry to reduce response times across the county. Lengthy ambulance response times are all too common across Kerry, particularly in more rural areas, and I am greatly concerned that people are being put at risk because ambulances are not arriving with patients within the recommended 19-minute window", said O'Connor.

"This official response time is particularly important in cardiac situations, whereby 8 minutes is the target; but over the past number of years we have seen compliance with that time limit deteriorate.

"Ambulances in Dublin and the commuter counties may be responding within 19 minutes, but there are obvious problems here in Kerry. Missing turnaround targets poses a series of problems – not only does it threaten the recovery of the patient, it also makes it more difficult for the paramedics to respond to other call outs.

"We need to see more resources for our ambulance service - not only more vehicles, but also more personnel, particularly advanced paramedics.

"The Minister must engage directly with officials

from our ambulance services to ensure healthcare workers are listened to and that ambulance services in our county are adequately resourced", concluded O'Connor.

SUMMER EYES...

As the weather gets warmer and the days grow longer, we often think about improving our health and getting into better shape. As you prepare to enjoy the outdoors this summer, don't forget a plan for keeping your eyes happy as well.

Avoid getting"sunburn of the eye."

When sunlight shines off water, sand or other highly reflective surfaces into your eyes, it can cause a very painful condition called photokeratitis. This is when the sun's ultraviolet rays burn the surface of your eye. Pain, redness, blurriness and even temporary vision loss are symptoms of this condition. Prevent photokeratitis by wearing sunglasses that are marked "100% UV protection." Also, wear a broad-brimmed hat for added eye protection.

Prevent "swimmer's eye" in the pool

Pools can be tough on the eyes. Chemicals used to keep the water clean, such as chlorine, can affect the natural tear film that keeps our eyes moist and healthy. The result can be Red, gritty-feeling eyes and blurry vision. Keep eyes feeling and looking good by wearing swim goggles in the pool, and splash your closed eyes with fresh water immediately after getting out of the pool.

Keep dry eye at bay



Spending time outside when it is hot, dry or windy can irritate a common condition called dry eye. A hot, dry environment affects the tear film, drying out the eye's surface. To protect your eyes in these conditions, wear wrap-around glasses to keep wind from your eye's surface. Also, use artificial tears (preferably those that are preservative-free) to keep eyes moist and refreshed.

Don't play around with eye safety

Spending more time outside often means more outdoor work and play. Whether mowing the lawn, trimming weeds or playing baseball, always wear the proper protective eyewear. More than half of all eye injuries occur at home, yet only about one out of every three people wears eye protection when they should. Don't be an eye injury statistic!

Quit smoking

When thinking about getting healthy this summer, think about quitting smoking. Cigarette smoke, including second-hand smoke, not only worsens dry eye, but is a risk factor for many eye diseases, including cataracts, macular degeneration and more. Quitting smoking reduces your risk of getting eye disease and other major health problems.

recognition for all the celebs she has beautified over the years.





Seamie O'Connor thanked his fellow committee members, sponsors and the O'Connor family for all coming together to stage a very successful golf classic to honour Paudie's memory. He also praised the facilities at Killarney Golf Club, where he has been a member since 1974 and said he never saw the Killeen course never looking so well. Proceeds from the golf classic will go towards Scotts Lakers St Paul's national league campaign and the Killarney Cardiac response unit. The winning Tatler Jack team of Joey Sheehan, Richard Ferris, Con Healy and Pat O'Shea received a first prize of a round of golf at the famed Old Head Golf Links, Kinsale.

In his acceptance speech, Joey Sheehan captain of the winning team said he was humbled and delighted to win and acknowledged the presence of the O'Connor family and thanked Seamie for organising the classic.

Joey recalled his own fond memories of the late Paudie and said his first introduction to the great man was was back in 1972 when he was a student in the Presentation Monastery. Paudie was already an established Irish international basketballer back then and coached the local young players in the Mon and the Sem. Joey also mentioned Paudie's prominent role in

introducing the American players to the Irish league in 1979. As his own basketball career gradually progressed, Joey said it was an honour to play alongside the likes of Paudie and his brother Mike and Tim Regan.

"We played, trained and travelled together all over Ireland and the UK. It was an education for many of us as Paudie and the senior players were role models and our heroes," he said.

Joey also recalled four other men who were also associated with the glory days of Killarney basketball and who have also sadly passed on to their eternal reward. Team sponsor Maurice O'Donoghue (Gleneagle Hotel) and Sean Coleman both died in 2001 while Donal O'Doherty and Denis Coffey passed away in 2011.

Paudie O'Connor passed away on May 1st 2018 at his home in Las Vegas at the age of 66. He is still ranked as the greatest Irish basketball player of all time and represented Ireland over 100 times. A former Irish captain, he was the first

and only Irish player ever to be selected on a European All Star first five in 1977. His visionary skills and ambition brought Irish basketball to a new level in 1979 when he brought the first American professional players to the Irish league. He was also a driving force of the popular John Player and Pretty Polly Ladies Basketball Championships that used to attract over 120 teams from all over Ireland to Killarney every Easter in the 1970s and 80s.

The golf classic was one of three different events over the past week remembering Paudie O'Connor. Killarney Municipal District Council and Mayor John Sheahan dedicated a roundabout to Paudie's memory at the junction linking Lewis Road and St Anne's Road in Killarney on Monday. Paudie was posthumously inducted into the Basketball Ireland Hall of Fame at a special ceremony in Croke Park on Saturday. The award was accepted by Paudie's daughter, Morgan, and his brother Seamie.

THE PRESSURE IS NEVER OFF KERRY

Paul Geaney speaks at AIB's launch of the Senior Football Championship for 2019

Q: You play Clare in the Munster SF Championship on June 1st after they played over the weekend. Did you watch them?

A: No. I didn't. We'll get our analysis from the management in the weeks ahead of the game. I don't know you can learn too much off of opposition because they could bring something totally different. We'll look at that over the next couple of weeks but I expect them to be a totally different animal.

Q: You made this year's NHL Division 1 final. Rate Kerry's season so far?

A: It's been mixed - good and bad. We've had good results but I was looking at similarities in the league last year, when we didn't get over the line in some games. The league can be misleading that way. Two points can be a big thing but it can just be one moment in a game that provides you with those two points. This year it fell our way. We accumulated the points and got to a league final but we didn't win it and got a reality check from Mayo in the final.

In a way that was good because we're only a youthful developing team so it was good to get that experience. Unfortunately we didn't get that league medal which you'd always like.

But it's kind of exciting to see the team growing every week, and to see we can get to league finals at an early stage with this group. There's a lot to learn we could all see that.

Q: What did you learn from that League final?

A: It was very obvious there was a difference in physique in the second half. We had a long campaign between injuries and different things. It was hard to get big blocks of work done during the league, it was just rolling from week-to-week. Mayo came strong again at the end of the league after a lapse in the middle of it. We were just down a couple of key players at that stage too. But physically, they looked further along the road than we were at the time, definitely in that last quarter when they kind of blew us away.

We learnt a lot from it though. We will get our house in order and be ready for what's coming down the tracks.

Q: Is it possible to close that gap in physicality between league and championship?

A: Yeah it is. It was just legs. It wasn't the time frame to be doing that kind of work when you had game on game because it was risking more injuries. But I think the league went well and was managed well by the management team.

We've been closing that gap over the last few weeks and are definitely fitter now. The ground is getting harder and harder and that'll help you when you have youthful bodies that are explosive and light. That should help us.

Q: Championship didn't go as well as you'd like last summer but did you learn from it?

A: Yes, most of the panel this year have championship experience from last year, only a few will be completely new to it. That experience is invaluable. The Super Eights was a very new experience last year. We didn't handle it well, that was fairly obvious, so

hopefully we'll learn from that.

The League's helped whereas before we were going weeks without a game because the Munster Championship was so spread out. Having two weeks between games will help. It's all new learnings and the quicker we can learn, the better we'll perform.

Q: Brilliant young players like David Clifford and Sean O'Shea must bring an injection of confidence. Is that contagious?

A: Well they ooze class as well and that's important in a team. Maybe something we've been missing a little bit is having a massive spread of scores but (this year) we were getting them from midfield and the half-backs as well. Even against Dublin it was Peter Crowley who knocked over the winner from the full-back line. We're getting more of a spread of scorers. Having that class in a team gives you a bit of comfort, that when it does get tough you can pull through because you have those players who can do special things at special times.

Q: Kieran Donaghy's loss?

A: He's a big loss in the dressing-room alright, he's a big leader. But that's just left a big void for others to step into. Guys often step up and find a new role in a team. We're a couple of soldiers down now again but I'm sure we'll unearth a few new leaders, like Seanie was in the league. There's plenty more guys like that but Peter Crowley is a huge loss now because he's a big leader so there's room for people to step into that.

Q: The biggest criticism is of your defence. What do you make of that and is it particularly difficult to avoid working in the family pub in Dingle?

A: Sometimes it's warranted, sometimes it's not. I don't take too much notice of it. We only take in

what's in camp but it is a bit hard to avoid it.

I don't agree with it 100 per cent. We've done a lot of work on our defence, on our tackling and on our team defence and I felt we made serious strides in the league and that was fairly obvious until we got to Croke Park where we were opened up a bit. We'll learn from that. You see it in other sports, it's a team effort. It's not about weak backs, it's a weak team if you're conceding big scores, it's a team effort. We've been tightening up on that and doing a lot of work with Donie (Buckley) so by the time the championship starts that will be done.

Q: Is this year a bit of a 'free shot' for Kerry because you're so young and transitional and there's so much pressure on Dublin?

A: I don't think so. I'd like to go along with it but no, the pressure's never off in Kerry. There's our own expectation and the expectations of Kerry supporters. Even though they might be patient, when it still comes down to it they expect us to challenge. Obviously that'll be a mammoth task with Dublin going for the five in-a-row. They're an incredible team and very hard to stop so they'll be back to their very best. We've had a good Munster record but that's because we've never taken the eye off the ball in the province and that's been key to us, but we have to progress that this year.

We face Clare in two weeks' time and we're not thinking any further along the road than that. We have to do our job there first. We've been good at doing that, at taking care of our own patch and we'll stay focussed on that and make sure we're not caught on the hop there.



EMPLOYER PAY AS YOU EARN TAX

If your company or business has employees, you will need to register your business as an employer. Once you are registered as an employer, you business is liable to pay PAYE (Pay As You Earn).

RELEVANT CONTRACT TAX

Relevant Contracts Tax applies where a principal contractor is paying a sub-contractor for carrying out or supplying labour in relevant sectors such as construction, forestry, and the meat processing industry. As a principal contractor, you need to file the contract on the Revenue system.

VALUE ADDED TAX

You will need to register for VAT once you reach the VAT Threshold, €37,500 for services and €75,000 for goods. The rates of VAT are dependent on what service or goods your business provides.

STUDY REVEALS THAT FOOD BLOGGERS' WEIGHT LOSS ADVICE IS 90% FALSE

Social media influencers have huge platforms, with some of them having millions of followers who rely on their advice, be it in nutrition, weight loss, beauty tips or anything else and many of these bloggers reach more people than many dieticians and other qualified professionals.

Now Researchers at the University of Glasgow are warning the public not to follow social media influencers' weight loss advice.

The authors of the study analyzed the nutrition value of Bloggers recipes, as well as the credibility, transparency, and truthfulness of their advice and the results were even worse than they expected. Of all the blogs they analyzed, only 1 was accurate and based on European dietary standards.

The rest either represented their opinions as facts, failed to mention scientific evidence to back their claims, lacked important disclaimers or included meal plans that didn't meet nutritional criteria. The only blogger that passed their criteria was a certified nutritionist.

The study concluded that at the moment, the weight loss advice food bloggers provide may pose a danger to the public. Many people weren't surprised by the disheartening results, as most of these so-called food bloggers are not qualified to give out nutrition advice and share their opinions based on personal experience only.

ONE OF SWEDEN'S OLDEST TREES IS ABOUT TO DIE

An oak tree in the southeastern city of Kalmar that is believed to be well over 1,000 years old has been showing limited signs of life in recent years The tree Called both Kvilleken and Rumskullaeken by locals is believed to be the oldest in all of Sweden and has become a significant tourist attraction, but has been displaying signs of deteriorating health for years to the point where last year just one lone branch grew green leaves.

The historic tree's death was probably hastened in 2005 when an iron ring that was placed around the tree in the 1960s was cut off. A replacement band is believed to have been put back on too tightly, leading to the tree slowly strangling itself. In its weakened state, it was subsequently hit by both a caterpillar infestation that drained it of nutrients and a fungal disease.

While the oak tree's exact age is unknown, tests carried out in the 1930s established that it was around 950 years old back then.

DUCKS ARE A GARDENERS BEST ASSISTANT

Various communities all over the world have use ducks and geese as a weed and pest control strategy. Indeed, there exist studies that have been conducted looking into the efficiency of the strategy in terms of yield, weed control and also pest control. Ducks and geese offer an organic method of controlling pests and weeds. Ducks have a high affinity of consuming seeds made by weeds, snails, a variety of bugs and also the slugs. This is the main foundation of the system and of course you also have the benefit of the eggs.. In addition, as the ducks work on the weeds and pest, their waste is released into the fields thus improving soil fertility resulting in higher yields and decreased costs.

The ducks sleep in an enclosed pen, and are herded out to the vineyards in the day, then for a swim in the dam, and then back to their pen in the late afternoon.

Farmers more so in Asian countries such as China and Vietnam have used this technology especially in the rice plantations and there are Ducks in many vineyards from South Africa to Australia.

As a smaller, lighter duck breed, runner ducks are less likely to smash and damage plants while moving around. Because they don't have the weight to maintain of the bigger duck breeds, less supplementary feed is needed. They are not extremely cold tolerant, but there are few bugs for them to find in winter. Temps below 20°F will have the crew inside in their shed most of the day.

Keep in mind that the size of your flock should be matched to the size of your garden, five does a good job covering over an acre of garden and orchards. For a small garden, a pair of ducks can get the job done without being lonely or getting into too much mischief. Don't get a single duck. They are social birds. They will also need a shed for shelter and safety and water to bathe in.

SCOTLAND TO INTRODUCE A 20P BOTTLE DEPOSIT SCHEME

People in Scotland will have to pay a 20p deposit on every bottle or drinks can they buy from shops under a new scheme unveiled by the Scottish government.

Glass and plastic bottles, as well as aluminium and steel drinks cans sold by any shop in Scotland will be covered by the deposit return scheme, the first national scheme of its kind in the UK.

Scotland's environment secretary, Roseanna Cunningham, said: "There is a global climate emergency and people across Scotland have been calling, rightly, for more ambition to tackle it and safeguard our planet for future generations, this scheme gives people a "clear and straightforward way to do their bit for the environment.

The scheme is set to cover single use bottles, ranging from a 50ml whisky or vodka miniature to a three-litre bottle of cider. Every can or bottle in a multipack of beer, water or cola will also attract the 20p charge.

It will include online retailers too, with only restaurants and pubs selling drinks for consumption on the premises excluded.

THE WORLD ISN'T AS HORRIFIC AS YOU THINK

For centuries, older people have romanticised their youths and insisted that things ain't what they used to be. Well, that's true. Most things used to be worse. This tendency to misremember is compounded by the never-ending negative news from across the world.

It is absolutely true that there are many bad things in this world. The number of conflict fatalities has been falling since the second world war, but the Syrian war has reversed this trend. Overfishing and the deterioration of the seas are truly worrisome. The list of endangered species is getting longer. But while it is easy to be aware of all the bad things happening in the world, it's harder to know about the good things. The silent miracle of human progress is too slow and too fragmented to ever qualify as news - for instance over the past 20 years, the proportion of people living in extreme poverty has almost halved, more countries are democratic, more farmers get titles to land and to sell goods to other countries.

Our instinct to notice the bad more than the good is related to three things: the misremembering of the past; selective reporting by journalists and activists; and the feeling that as long as things are bad, it's heartless to say they are getting better.




