


Skellig Hotel for the celebrations following the ceremony.


Wearing a stunning fitted dress with a train and lace sleeves, Céitilís and Colm posed for pictures in front of the Crib at the church where they tied the knot.

The vaccination campaign across Kerry has ramped up again in recent days and weeks, the HSE has confirmed.

The vaccinations roll-out across Kerry is run jointly by the South South West Hospital Group and Cork Kerry Community Healthcare.

As the booster campaign intensifies, the Tralee vaccination centre in Monavalley is adding to their staff numbers and extending their opening hours.

All vaccination centres continue to schedule as many appointments as possible. The 60-plus age-group is now almost complete ie most eligible people in this age-group have received their booster vaccination or have been offered an appointment. We are making good progress on the 50-59 age-group, with appointments scheduled across this week at all three centres.

Before travelling to a vaccination centre, we urge the public to check that they are eligible for a booster vaccination. Details are at hse.ie/findvc Details for Kerry vaccination centre, Monavalley, Tralee, V92 HT21:

- The centre is vaccinating more than 800 people a day.
- A walk-in vaccination clinic will take place there on Saturday, 8.30am to 4.30pm. This walk-in clinic will offer booster doses to eligible people aged 50 and over.
- We are vaccinating by appointment on weekdays this week, with groups including people aged between 50 and 59; cohort 4; cohort 7; and people who recently registered for first and second doses of a

WALK IN VACCINATION CLINIC PLANNED FOR THIS WEEKEND

Covid-19 vaccination.

As well as walk-in clinics, all centres are:

- offering outreach clinics to vaccinate housebound people at home.
- offering appointments for booster vaccinations to eligible people aged 50 and over.
- offering appointments to any remaining healthcare workers yet to receive a booster.
- offering appointment to people in vaccination groups 4 and 7.
- travelling to residential centres to vaccinate any remaining residents who haven't been in a position to receive a booster vaccination earlier in the campaign.

Appointments are a key focus of the campaign, and have allowed us to reach a position where the majority of eligible people in their 60s have received their boosters, and substantial progress has been made on the boosters for those aged between 50 and 59.

"We would also like to thank and acknowledge the GPs and pharmacies across the region who are supporting the vaccination roll-out by offering booster vaccinations",

We ask people to take their appointment when it is offered if at all possible, and if not to let the HSE know if you do not wish to take up your appointment

The public have three options to cancel appointments are as follows:

- Text message stating NEW (if you want to reschedule) or REJECT (if vaccinated or do not want to take up the booster)

The Kevin Bell Repatriation trust aims to alleviate the financial hardship of bereaved families repatriating the body (bodies) of loved one(s) who have died abroad in sudden or tragic circumstances back to Ireland.

Declan and Jennifer along with the support of the Barraduff Community Field Organisation, will see 6×40 minutes spinning classes being held with all donations on the day going towards this wonderful charity. The reward for those who wish to participate will not only be supporting a worthy cause but tea, cakes, and lots of treats available afterwards.

A coffee morning is also being organised as part of the fundraiser, open to everyone that morning – not just spinners! Our key concern is that participants and supporters on the day stay as safe as possible. We will be adhering strictly to government guidelines and all necessary precautions will be in place throughout the venue.

Kevin Bell Trust was founded in 2013 following the tragic death of Kevin Bell, aged 26 years, in New York. Costs per repatriation can cost up to GBP12,000 depending on the circumstances of the death, local charges, and hospital release costs.

"KBRT have now repatriated 1195 loved ones to their families in Ireland, with 32 of those being to Kerry alone, from countries worldwide such as Australia, Argentina, South Korea, USA, Canada, Ecuador, Cambodia, India, Uganda to name just a few. The Trust repatriates approximately 15-20 loved ones back to Ireland per month."

"We are asking as many people as possible to participate in this fun event to help raise funds for this charity which has touched so many people's lives. If you can't make the event itself there is an opportunity to donate via the iDonate fundraising page and all contributions are gladly welcome. astleisland Community College received the Tidy Towns Sustainable Development Goals Youth Award. The Transition Year students of last year 2020/21 were the main group involved in addressing these goals. Tidy Towns received a grant from Community Foundation Ireland to work on a biodiversity plan for the town. The Transition Year students worked with Tidy Towns members and Brendan Kirwin (Ecologist). The students designed bilingual bee signs, bat signs and swift bird signs that have been placed along the river walk.

The Transition year group worked with the Irish Health Foundation and designed a Slí na Sláinte sign for the school in April 2020. This illustrates walking routes on the school grounds for all the community to enjoy. The committee also organised a food appeal for the Tralee Soup kitchen in December 2020.

They worked with past pupil Lee Mangan of Madden and Mangan Construction and they designed a sustainable home for 'A Home for Everyone' National Competition which

they won in May 2021! The students researched the physics of bees and physics in nature-balunga whales, pig and chameleon. They won national awards for their work in the National Sophia Physics 2021 Competition.

The committee took part in the international Globe Air Quality Campaign and it undertook the air quality experiment for schools in April 2020 that is run by the Environmental Protection Agency The readings for the school were excellent with one of the lowest readings nationally.

Thanking the children for their incredible efforts, Recovery Haven Kerry's PR & Marketing officer, Marisa Reidy, said they were a credit to their families and school.





€2.3 MILLION IN MINOR WORKS FUNDING

FOR KERRY SCHOOLS

Minister for Education and Kerry TD Norma Foley has announces funding of €2.3 million euro in minor works grants for primary, special and post-primary schools in Kerry.

Minor works grants totalling €62 million nationally will be issued to primary schools and special schools, including a one-off Covid-19 minor works grant of €17 million for post-primary schools.

Minister Foley said: "I am delighted to confirm this significant increase in funding for schools in Kerry. This announcement will enable schools to address both their minor works requirements and also to address small-scale ventilation improvements as a short-term mitigation measure, should they require to do so. Given that each school setting is different, individual schools are best-placed to decide how best to use this funding to address their particular needs."

The works that can be undertaken under the minor works scheme

include maintenance and small-scale improvements to school buildings and its grounds.

It also creates provision for improvement or replacement

of mechanical and electrical services, the purchase of standard furniture and physical education equipment, the purchase of floor coverings and window blinds along with the purchase of IT-related equipment.

This funding is important in continuing to support the operation of schools in a Covid-19 environment.

Arrangements are now being made for the payment of these grants to schools.

TOY SAFETY DIRECTIVE MUST BE REVIEWED

TO ENHANCE SAFETY FOR CHILDREN

- MEP KELLEHER



Ireland South MEP, Billy Kelleher has said that the future revision of the Toy Safety Directive is essential to ensure the safety of children and that it should include further efforts to apply EU safety standards to products bought online from websites outside the EU.

Kelleher was commenting as the Committee on the Internal Market and Consumer Protection approved a new report this week.

"We must see effective enforcement of rules at a national level to make sure toys sold in the EU do not put children at risk.

"Enhanced cooperation between online marketplaces and market

surveillance authorities is also needed to ensure the speedy removal of products deemed to be a risk to children.

"As the world gets smaller due to globalisation and digitalisation, we also need to address the problem of consumers buying products on websites that appear to be based in the EU, and supposedly selling products that comply with EU standards, but are in fact outside of the EU.

"This is a major concern for me and for many parents across Ireland. They want to buy products that are safe for their children but it is clear to me that the EU and national authorities have very limited mechanisms for dealing with them as they come in from outside the EU.

"Of course, buying on the high street is the safest way and easiest way of ensuring toys comply with EU rules but in many cases, it can be cheaper to buy online, or there may be greater choice available to consumers online.

"Our sole priority must be the protection of children and of their welfare. The review and revision of the Toy Safety Directive is an ideal way of catching up with the digitalisation of toy sales in recent times," concluded Kelleher.

PEOPLE IN KERRY ENCOURAGED TO

SPEND THEIR CHRISTMAS BONUS LOCALLY



A 100% Christmas Bonus is being paid this year to 41,000 people in Kerry, according to Deputy Government Chief Whip, Brendan Griffin TD.

The Christmas Bonus is paid to long-term social welfare recipients such as pensioners, carers, people with disabilities and lone parents. This year, Social Protection Minister Heather Humphreys announced changes to the criteria, meaning more people will benefit.

For example, the qualifying period for people in receipt of an eligible Jobseeker's payment was reduced to 12 months from 15 months.

In addition, long-term recipients of the Pandemic Unemployment Payment (PUP) are receiving this year's Christmas Bonus.

And time spent on the PUP by customers who have since moved to a Jobseeker's payment will count towards reaching the

12-month requirement.

As we enter the Christmas period, Deputy Griffin has urged people in receipt of the Christmas Bonus to spend it in their local communities.

Deputy Griffin said: "We all know that the Christmas period can be a very expensive time of year for families.

"I therefore really welcome the fact that we are once again in a position to provide a 100% Christmas Bonus this year.

"For me, it's really important, where possible, that people spend their Christmas Bonus locally.

"We all know the difficult year that businesses in Kerry have endured due to Covid-19.

The rollout of the National Broadband Plan continues to ramp up as homes and communities begin to be connected in Intervention Areas across the country. NBI contractors have been on the ground across the country for more than twenty months and over 280,000 premises nationwide have been surveyed to date. This involves physically walking the routes and documenting images, notes and measurements of the poles, cables and underground ducts in each area. These vital survey works enable "Fibre-to-the-Home" network designs to be completed for each of the over 550,000 plus premises in the Intervention Area, as identified by the Department of the Environment, Climate and Communication (DECC).

In Kerry, there are approximately 27,000 premises in the Intervention Area (IA), which includes homes, farms, commercial businesses and schools. This equates to 30% of all premises in the county. Under the National Broadband Plan, Kerry will see an investment of €107M in the new high speed fibre network. This will enable e-learning, remote monitoring of livestock or equipment, e-health initiatives, better energy efficiency in the home, and facilitate increased levels of remote working.

NBI crews have made substantial progress in Kerry, where the following

areas have been surveyed: Tralee, Killarney, Kilduff, Faha, Coolnagarrehy, Knockreagh, Knockbrack, Stradbally, and Previously Kilcummin. crews have advanced the project work in areas including Rathmore, Mounthorgan, Knocknacopple, Kilquane Upper, Barraduff, Cloonteens, Gneevegullia, Tureenamult, and Renasup.

These initial works pave the way



for the next stage of deploying fibre on poles/ducts and includes the erection of poles, unblocking of ducts, and the insertion of sub duct into existing ducts, for the fibre to be installed.







WHY SHOULD YOU REVIEW YOUR PENSION?

"My late father Jim Healy started the business in 1981, when he left a secure pensionable job with General Accident Insurance Company.

"I am not sure the title of start-up entrepreneur existed back then but perhaps it should have as Dad took a risk on starting his own business"

The business went from strength to strength over the years, always adapting and evolving and has earned a reputation for professionalism integrity and excellent customer service in all its business dealings.

Sparks fly as Wildcats fall:



CROKES CROWNED O'DONOGHUE CUP **CHAMPIONS**

O'Donoghue Cup Final: Dr. Crokes 3-9 Spa 2-9

At times this year Dr. Crokes' status among the elite clubs in Kerry was under severe threat. Killarney Legion were the reigning O'Donoghue up champions. East Kerry had taken over as kingpins of the County Championship. The Club Championship, traditionally not a particularly happy hunting ground, started off well with a convincing win over Spa, but turned into disaster and they ended up in relegation. A good run in the County Championship settled them - in fact they were very, very unlucky to lose the semi-final by a single point - and a superb Relegation Final display against their closest rivals Legion and a East Kerry Semi-Final win over a very good Rathmore team sent out the message that Crokes were and ready to take back the Dr. Paddy Cup.

Not that Spa had any reason to baulk. They had fought Crokes to a draw in an outstanding county league game (the winners would have reached a league final). They won the Intermediate, having knocked on the door for so long. Crokes hande them a stinging lesson in the Club Championship, but Spa went on to beat Kenmare and draw with Templenoe. They bowed out in the first round of the County Championship to Legion - there was hardly a kick of a ball between the teams, and were steadily impressive in the O'Donoghue Cup. There was always going to be plenty of respect, but no fear, in the Stadium last Sunday.

There was also plenty of wind and rain, not unexpected at this time of year, and both sides deserve credit for serving up some scintillating, free-flowing football in the circumstances. Eddie Walsh helped with sensible refereeing; contests were full-blooded but honest.

Crokes served notice early on of their

intentions, with James Devane having to react fast to deny them a goal at the very start. It was Spa who opened the scoring, though, as Evan Cronin slotted a free and Dan O'Donoghue sent a great effort over. Tony Brosnan was already looking dangerous, and he curled over to open Dr. Crokes' account. In the 11th minute James Devane made another great save to deny David Shaw (he was absolutely immense), but this time it was deflected into the path of Evan Looney, who made no mistake (Looney has been a real find for Dr. Crokes, having only debuted at senior this year). 1-1 to 0-2.

Niall McCarthy, who had a great game, claimed a mark to trim the gap, but Micheál Burns burst in on the Spa goal and made no mistake to raise another green flag. Spa trailed by 2-1 to 0-3 at the water break despite having played well, and things looked ominous for them. Unfortunately from their perspective, things were only going to get worse. Tony Brosnan slotted over another point before Dr. Crokes unlocked the Spa defence with some really good inter-passing, with David Shaw producing a powerful finish. The impressive Ryan Carroll and Michael Foley pointed for Spa, but David Shaw was in top form here and split the posts twice.

FOCUS ON TREES

Trees are beautiful in any garden and their long life makes them a wonderful garden feature. A tree should be the first think you plant in your garden after the hedging they can be under planted afterwards with bulbs and shrubs. Trees are interesting in all four seasons with attractive unfolding of leaves in spring, full foliage in summer, good Autumn colour followed decorative bark in the Winter. The first and most important think you need to know when buying a tree is what's the height and spread going to be when it is mature. There are many varieties of trees to choose from and there is a tree suitable for most areas. Trees can be planted all year round but as with hedging, trees can be planted when they are dormant between November and March.



When planting your bare rooted tree, dig the hole big enough that you can spreads out the roots all around the hole. Then drive your stake into the hole roughly about 6 to 8 inches below the bottom of the hole, place your tree and spread the roots out well. If possible place your stake on the side of the prevailing winds as this will ensure that the tree is blown up against the stake when the wind is high. Fill in the soil mixed with compost around the roots and firm in with the heel of your foot. Lastly place your tree ties on - one near the top and one at the bottom with a spacer in between to stop the bark being damaged by the

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS

Q. As an employee, what are my entitlements in relation to Public Holidays?

A. Most employees are entitled to paid leave on public holidays. There is an exception for certain part-time employees

If you qualify for public holiday benefit, you are entitled to one of the following:

- A paid day off on the public holiday
- An additional day of annual leave
- An additional day's pay
- A paid day off within a month of the public holiday

You can ask your employer at least 21 days before a public holiday, which of the alternatives will apply. If your employer does not respond at least 14 days before the public holiday, you are entitled to take the actual public holiday as a paid day off.

Q. As a part-time worker, what is my entitlement to in relation to Public Holidays?

A. You are entitled to a day's pay for the public holiday if you have worked for your employer at least 40 hours in the 5 weeks before the public holiday and the public holiday falls on a day you normally work If you are required to work that day you are entitled to an additional day's pay in lieu of the day off.

If you do not normally work on that particular day, you should get one-fifth of your weekly pay. Even if you are never rostered to work on a public holiday, you are entitled to one-fifth of your weekly pay as compensation for the public holiday.

Q. This year Christmas falls on the weekend. What does that mean for my entitlement to time off for public holidays?

A. This year, each of the 3 upcoming public holidays fall on a weekend day:

- Christmas Day, Saturday 25 December 2021
- Saint Stephen's Day, Sunday 26 December 2021
- New Year's Day, Saturday 1 January 2022

When a public holiday falls on a day which is not a 'normal working day' for that business (for example, on Saturday or Sunday), you are still entitled to benefit for that public holiday.

For example, you may get an extra day of annual leave, or an additional days pay, or a paid day off within a month of the public holiday. However, you do not have any automatic legal entitlement to have the next working day off work.






Welcome back dear student of God's Word, as Christmas approaches I encourage you to 'make room for God'. When Joseph and Mary arrived in Bethlehem for the census, there was no room available for them (Luke 2:1-14). People had longed for generations for their Saviour to come and deliver them. But when He did arrive they didn't recognise Him because they were otherwise distracted with things that seemed good, but really didn't matter (Mark 7:1-15). Also He didn't come as they expected Him to - clothed as a magnificent conquering king, but instead came wrapped in swaddling — a humble Child (Isaiah 9:6-7).

At this time of year there is often a sense of fluster in the air as people are rushing around, with lists that need to be ticked off and what is it all for? You see signs everywhere saying 'XMAS' this or that, which is an offence to God's love. I get it that the word Christmas has a lot of letters taking up space on a line, but the mentality is bananas. Really it exposes an underlying anti-Christ spirit deceiving people into squeezing Jesus out, leaving him once again with no room (1 John 4:1-6). Christmas is supposed to celebrate the birth of Christ (which means Messiah and Anointed One) yet very little of what goes on involves Him. Jesus is THE reason for the season (Matthew 1:20-25).

People struggle to find the money as well as the time to pay for and get everything they want. However, if everything failed tomorrow, it's not what we want that would matter, but what we actually need. This is the time of year when we show others how much they mean to us by buying them gifts and writing cards, but a question dear friend - why can we not tell people how loved they are the rest of the year? I often think of the movie 'Waking Ned' when the man about to give the eulogy for the deceased has to think on his feet so as not to give the game away (if you haven't seen that movie you should, it's really funny). So he speaks instead about his great friend who is sitting among the mourners. This friend then gets to hear his own eulogy, about how much he means to the one speaking about him. Everyone should get to hear their own eulogy before they die, not after, for what use is it then? Anyway back to Christmas...

"Seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness (His way of doing things), and all these things will be added unto you" (Matthew 6:33) Jesus gives a key here to getting everything done in order. Put God first! When we obey God's Word and honour the Lord with our first and best, He will then take care of everything else and it will all fall into place (Read Proverbs 3). But the reality is most times God is put last in the queue, if He even gets put in the queue at all. Jesus later put it this way....."These people honour Me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me." (Matthew 15:8). This Christmas 'make room' for Jesus — put Him first, and see the difference.
