# **ON THE HUNT FOR HEROES**

#### Calling all Humanitarian Heroes!

Nominations invited for the 6th Annual Hugh O'Flaherty International Humanitarian Award As part of the 7th annual Hugh O'Flaherty Memorial Weekend, which will take place from November 14th to 16th in Killarney, The Hugh O'Flaherty Memorial Society are inviting the public and companies to nominate the person or organisation they feel is doing outstanding humanitarian work and most deserving of the 2014 Hugh O'Flaherty International Humanitarian Award.

Last years winner was presented posthumously to Donal Walsh, that brave young man who despite his own imminent passing at such a young age, reached out to those who were troubled by thoughts of self-harm or suicide. His selfless and incredibly touching message resonated throughout Ireland and indeed the wider world. Previous award recipients included the Darfur based Goal aid workers Sharon Commins and Hilda Kawuki in 2009, Columban Missionary Fr Michael Synott in 2010, Trócaire's Regional Director for Latin America, Sally O'Neill in 2011 and, Sr Agnes Hunt of the Irish Council for Prisoners Overseas in 2012.

Monsignor Hugh O'Flaherty, who was from Killarney, was dubbed the Scarlet Pimpernel of the Vatican for his exploits during World War II. During the course of the war he was instrumental in saving the lives of more than 6,500 Jews and American and British soldiers by hiding them from the Gestapo in a number of safe houses throughout Rome.

"The posts can be about anything, your experience on a jaunting cart, a hike on Ireland's highest mountain, a pint of Guinness with friends - the opportunities are endless."

"Visitors are more likely to visit Killarney if they see or read about real people enjoying real life experiences. When people create and share beautiful or fun pictures or posts of Killarney they're endorsing the town."

This is not a new concept tourism giants like Tourism Australia and Destination British Columbia have already rolled out similar campaigns to great effect. ## SOUTHWEST COUNSELLLING AGM

The annual AGM meeting for SouthWest Counselling Centre was held on Tuesday April 1st at the Centre premises in Lewis Road, Killarney. Two new Directors, Mickey Ned O'Sullivan and Fr. Padraig Breheny were welcomed to the Board of Directors. SouthWest Counselling Centre will be marking its 20th Anniversary this year and are delighted to be offering such a vital service to the community especially following on from another extremely successful year in 2013.

The centre supported 1510 individuals in 2013, an increase of over 200 from the previous year. In the past five years there has been an increase of 33% in the actual number of people accessing counselling services and needing support. The addition of Kerry LifeLine and the support of Suicide Awareness and Prevention have also impacted on the demand for our services. The Centre was delighted to expand its services in the last year by introducing a variety of Workshop and Seminars in the local community to schools, sports clubs as well as a new Bereavement Support group. Dr Geraldine Sheedy, Centre Director stated that "the centre is seeing more people presenting in crisis and/or feeling suicidal. However whilst we continue to witness this increase in demand for the service, government funding is on the decline. We have never been more dependent on fundraising to ensure the sustainability of the service. Kerry LifeLine - which provides free Counselling and Support for suicide prevention and intervention receives funding no Government - and is entirely reliant on our fundraising efforts" SouthWest Counselling Centre remains indebted to the local community, our fundraisers, supporters and friends of SWCC who have contributed time, expertise, and money to providing this vital service.

The Centre also wishes to thank the Franciscan Friary, staff of SWCC and The Board of Management for their



## RTE'S LAZY STYLE TO GIVE OPENING FOR NEW IRISH TV CHANNEL.

According to the Irish Independent, An Taoiseach Enda Kenny will launch a new TV Channel for the Island of Ireland and will have a worldwide audience. Irish Tv is the brainchild of husband and wife team Pierce O'Reilly and Maireach Ni Mhaoilchiarain, and



the station will feature 50 home-produced programmes a week and will create 150 new jobs. The couple, backed by Mayo-born multi-millionaire John Griffin, have bought Sky Channel 191, but the programmes will also be available on Freesat, in the US on Public Broadasting Service and online at IrishTV.ie and IrishTV.com. Mr Griffin, who recently sold the UK's largest minicab service, Addison Lee, for  $\in$ 360m, is chair of the new  $\in$ 15m project. A spokesman said the new company will focus on community news. "Each of the 32 counties will have their own half-hour 'County Matters' show once a week, produced by IrishTV's own nationwide production network. We are putting three-person teams in place in each county to produce them. "He said the station will take news and politics from RTE Digital, but the home-produced programmes will include everything from cookery and country music to fashion and farming, sports, childrens' programmes, golf and entertainment. Musically, the focus will be on the successful country and Irish format, with stars such as Nathan Carter and Mike Denver and singing sensation Lisa McHugh presenting a prime time Saturday night show. "At the moment, we are in Finglas making a classical music series with up and coming young Irish talent - musicians who have never got a minute on TV before"

Its a costly business producing home produced programmes. We are paying RTE €3 million a week to produce Irish programmes and the Irish people are getting a very poor return. We like to hear about the crisis in the Ukraine but not 24 hour coverage – seven days a week. This is lazy journalism. Ireland is full of talented people doing amazing things and the majority of this is been ignored by the RTE.

# NEWS DESK TARMAC BATTLE RESUMES IN KILLARNEY

With entries still open for the Cartell.ie International Rally of the Lakes over the May Bank Holiday weekend, over 90 crews have entered and the stage is already set for battle royal in all classes and categories of the 35th Rally of the Lakes.

The event gets under way with a ceremonial in Killarney town centre on Friday evening with competitive motoring kicking off on Saturday morning to tackle a loop of three stages at Molls Gap, Beallaghbeama and Caragh Lake before returning to Service at the Liebherr Container Cranes factory in Fossa.

A second loop of these three classic stages follows, with a further visit to Service before

tackling the final stage at Kilcummin, which is a shortened version of the stage which featured as the finale of the Killarney Historic Rally for the past two years.

The first day's stages will be familiar to most Rally of the Lakes regulars but there are some variations such as a hairpin right at the end of Molls Gap and Beallaghbeama reverting to the longer version which was a feature of the earlier years of the Rally of the Lakes.

Sunday sees the cars tackle Molls Gap for the third time and then it's on to a loop of three

stages which have not been used for ten years in the Rally of the Lakes,

The first of these, Borlin, is actually a combination of two old classics, Sheen River and Borlin, and takes the rally over the county bounds into County Cork.

The second is the fabulous lakeside stage at Lough Allua, which was a regular feature of the Circuit of Ireland up to the eighties and of the Rally of the Lakes from 84 until 2004.

In recent years the stage has been associated with the Cork 20 International but the Cork 20 version generally runs in the opposite direction to the Lakes format, starting in Ballingeary and finishing in Kilmichael.

Fuhiry, which starts outside Ballingeary, brings the rally back over the County Bounds, past Creedons at the Top of Coom, the highest pub in Ireland, and finishes on a fast downhill section towards Kilgarvan.

Service in Kenmare Mart is followed by a further trip over the same loop of three and, after a final service in Kenmare, the rally concludes a run over Moll's Gap back to Killarney.

Last Saturday saw the most successful KWD Kerry County Clean up yet with the largest number of volunteers and the most roads covered since its inception in 2012.

130 groups registered with over 2,800 volunteers, who received 13,000 bags between them in an effort to tidy the highways and byways of Kerry. This event is the only one of its kind in Ireland with other county's now looking to host similar events – such is the success of the KWD Kerry County Clean up.

People were out on roads all over the county at different times of the day and many groups also took part in the tidy up in the days leading up to the official cleaning.

Next year the aim is to have everyone out on the actual day as the large number of volunteers can make the solid and visible statement that we do not accept littering on our Kerry roads.

An example of the improvement over the years comes from news that members and friends of KWD Recycling collected nearly 60 bags of rubbish from the main Annascaul to Dingle road. Three years ago they would have expected a much larger amount of bags on a similar stretch of road and were delighted to see how much it has improved in such a short period of time.

In general roads were visibly better this year and the amounts collected were down on the last 2 years which only goes to prove that people are changing their habits when it comes to litter awareness – this is due in no small part to the "KWD County Clean up"

globally by Red Bull, is the first event in which the entire world can race together, simultaneously. This ground-breaking race format means that on the 4th of May 2014, at 11am GMT, and equivalent times across the globe over 200,000 competitors will start to run in 35 countries across six continents; all trying to stay ahead of a 'catcher car' for as long as possible. The 'catcher car' takes off 30 minutes after the starter gun at 15km's per hour, accelerating by 1km every hour. Entrants keep running until they are caught by the car. The route begins at the Kings Bridge entrance to Killarney National Park (opposite St. Mary's Cathedral) in Killarney, before heading west towards Killorglin and continues anti-clockwise around the Ring of Kerry. Entrants can set their own personal goal on the day to jog 5km's, run 10km's or maybe beat the catcher car to a half or full marathon.

Organisers anticipate that the best ultramarathon runners will make it somewhere between Cahirciveen and Waterville before being caught by the Honda CR-V catcher car.

Seamus Moynihan commented, "The run is a great challenge for me. I've done some adventure racing in the past but my goal is to get 10 to 15km's of running in before the car catches me and it's all the better that we are running for a higher purpose."



#### GEARING UP FOR THE RING OF KERRY CYCLE (By Cora Carrigg, Kerry Recreation and Sports Partnership)

#### WEEK 1 - WEEK BEGINNING APRIL 14TH -PREPARATION/TRAINING CONCEPT

Are you considering doing the 2014 Ring of Kerry Cycle? If so, now is the time to get your gears in motion! With exactly 12 weeks to go, and the evenings getting longer, now is the time to start clocking up the mileage.

This weekly column is aimed at the novice leisure cyclist, interested in increasing their fitness and physical activity levels, whilst motivated to raise funds for this years Ring of Kerry very worthy charities.

As we countdown the weeks, always remember to yourself, that "the more mileage I clock up before the Ring of Kerry, the easier it will be for me on the day!" The ultimate goal is to gradually increase 'my' mileage each week leading up to the cycle. So every week a mileage guide will be issued, which is based on the Ring of Kerry Cycle Training programme. By doing it this way, not only will you be able to help avoid injury, burnout and fatigue, you will be able to detect any issues with your body or your bike that you need to fix before July 5th. A much better approach than deciding to start training a forthnight before the Ring!

So again the important goal is to build this mileage around your own personal schedule.

People find it easier to do the longer spins at the weekends, interspersed by rest days during the week. Or perhaps as an idea, you might decide, where possible, to cycle to and from work one or two days a week so as not to encroach on family time.... It is entirely up to you. Start with slow rides on easy routes for a couple of weeks and then in time we will be moving on to more intensive work.

The best way to learn tips, such as hydration, nutrition and training is to learn from and cycle with people who have cycled before. That said you could certainly do it on your own.

As you start aim to do your best to reach the targets set out in the Ring of Kerry Cycle training programme. It shows the distance of the longest ride each week, typically a Saturday or Sunday, as well as the total distance per week.

We were privileged to have Mr. Jim Breen come to Killarney Community College on Friday 11th April to reiterate the message of the campaign "it is really OK not to feel OK and that its more than OK to ask for help".

The student leaders from each of the three secondary schools have been liaising and these students were involved in the organising of the event in May. Training took place once a week after school for the past 8 weeks in Killarney Community College with their 40 students. They cycled between 45 and 50 kilometres on those occasions.

## FOOD DUDES ON THE WAY

Preparations are underway at both the Black Valley NS and Holy Family NS Rathmore as pupils and teachers alike pave the way for the introduction of a new healthy eating programme. The objective of the Food Dudes programme, run by Bord Bia, with funding from the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine and the EU School Fruit Scheme, is to encourage children to eat more fruit and vegetables both in school and at home. The programme is currently being introduced to primary schools nationwide.

The Food Dudes programme focuses on three factors: taste exposure, peer modeling and rewards. Children are given the opportunity, through videos, to watch peer models – a group of slightly older children called the Food Dudes – gain superpowers from eating fruit and vegetables.

The national roll out of the Food Dudes programme began in April 2007. To date, almost all of the primary schools in the country and some 465,000 pupils have participated in the programme, with a further 250 schools to be completed by June 2014. In an independent evaluation carried out by University College Dublin, 99% of the teachers surveyed found the programme to be beneficial to participating children. In addition over 95% of the parents surveyed said the children enjoyed the programme and almost 94% found their children eating more fruit and vegetables both in school and at home.

The intake of fruit and vegetables in Ireland is below international guidelines and the national target of 500g or 5 portions a day.

## HOME GPS CO-ORDINATES CLLR TOM DOHERTY

That This Council contact the HSE and other relevant authorities to equip all ambulances and emergency vehicles with satellite navigation equipment. A campaign should be put in place to ensure that households are aware of their GPS co-ordinates so they can relay this vital information in an emergency situation.

These Co- ordinates can be stored alongside other vital contact details such as South Doc, the fire service and other emergency numbers. This list could be placed on a central household point such as the fridge door. With the centralisation of emergency ambulance controls far away from rural communities there is need for real local geographical knowledge in an emergency situation. Therefor having GPS co-ordinates readily available in a stressful situation gives peace of mind to the caller of the emergency and the patient in need of medical attention. It also gives confidence to the ambulance driver that they are heading to the correct address in the shortest possible time. We are already aware of many stories of emergency ambulance going to the wrong address so just like a vaccination campaign the relevant authority will highlight and promote the need for access to this life saving data. Cllr Tom Doherty requested that the Council erect seating at the Grotto in Rock Rd.

The grotto is a long established landmark in Killarney. It is a place to meet and centre of reflect. It is also a place frequented by our senior citizens on a regular basis. The council will erect seating at the Grotto within a few weeks.

Killorglin is long overdue as members of the public including elderly people with hospital appointments, mothers with small babies, locals and tourists alike had to stand waiting for buses under appalling weather conditions and this is not acceptable in this day and age'. The Local Councillor said Killorglin is one of the larger towns in the county and serves the entire Mid Kerry area and is on the most famous tourist route in the country, the Ring of Kerry and should have a Bus Shelter. The Acting Director of Services also assured Councillor Cahill at yesterday's meeting that works would commence in the near future.

The announcement was also welcomed by Kerry Independent TD Tom Fleming who had raised the matter in the Dail with the Minister for Transport, Tourism and Sport.

### KERRY COUNTY COUNCIL NOTICE OF MOTION

Councillor Michael Gleeson proposed the following Notice of Moiton at the April 2014 monthly meeting of Kerry County Council:

"In view of the rapidly deteriorating quality of the surface of the N22 from Killarney to the County Bounds, that this Kerry County Council calls on the National Roads Authority (NRA) to undertake the work necessary to ensure that this vital road into our county returns to the required standard for National Primary Roads". Kerry County Council replied that the National Roads Authority (N R A) is currently prioritising pavement and minor improvement schemes on a national basis. The condition of this section of the N22 National Primary Route has been brought to the attention of the NRA. During previous discussions the Council has been informed that the funding available to the NRA for pavement schemes will be limited in 2014 due to financial constraints and it is unlikely on this basis that a significant improvement scheme on the N22 will progress. However, targeted repairs may be possible through maintenance funding.


Councillor Gleeson stated that the N22 is a vital artery to out County, particularly so for tourists and freight carriers. If it continues to deteriorate the economic life of Kerry will inevitably suffer. He asked that the Government would as matter of urgency be informed of the importance of this road to the job retention and prospects for the county.

### **MOBILITY SCOOTER USERS**

Kerry County Council Candidate, John O'Shea has highlighted the hazards faced daily by mobility scooter users from the moment they leave their front doorstep.

"Mobility scooter users in busy Killarney housing estates are being forced to drive along the roads because the footpaths around their homes can't accommodate them", explains John O'Shea. "Mobility Scooters are used by people with mobility problems as a means of independent transport. They are designed solely for use on footpaths and pedestrian walkways and are not designed for use on public roads."

"This is an accident waiting to happen and needs to be addressed as soon as possible. As a councillor my aim is to have remedial works carried out which will address this problem. On paper, the solution is simple, sloped verges which allow easy access to the footpaths. Knowing exactly where this needs to be done is the hard part. I know the neighbourhoods from my work both as a postman and as a community activist. As a councillor I will make sure this work happens."

If elected I will see that remedial work is carried out in the housing estates where users of mobility scooters live. This would enable them to use the footpaths instead of having to go out on the public roads and get around the vicinity of their own homes.

## MOLONEY WELCOMES WORLD-CLASS GREENWAY FOR KERRY


Labour Senator Marie Moloney has welcomed today's announcement by Public Transport Minister, Alan Kelly, of a major new and worldclass greenway as part of a national €11 million funding for cycling infrastructure. The centre-piece of the funding will go towards construction of one of the world's most dramatic scenic greenways – running along an old railway line, over viaducts through mountainous tunnels overlooking the Atlantic Ocean and Ring of Kerry.


"Having been involved in this initiative for Kerry from the beginning, and after organising meetings between the Department and Council, I am so pleased that €3.4 million will go towards the construction of 26 kilometres of Greenway from Glenbeigh to Caherciveen. 
"An additional benefit of this development will

## OUTLOOK ON THE STATE EXAMINATIONS

## Plan your approach in the final term

#### (By Billy Ryle)

As they face into the final school term, it's reasonable to assume that every exam candidate has already done a certain amount of work. Many students have worked diligently and consistently throughout the year. Others may have been less focussed and motivated as they traversed the road to next June's exams. But the fact remains that each and every exam candidate has a foundation of work, however solid or



precarious, on which to build over the next few weeks. It's absolutely vital to appreciate that effective and judicious use of the remaining time will be sufficient to get you safely over the finishing line. No matter how little work you have done to date, you can still achieve a worthwhile result in your exam if you are prepared to put your best effort into the final few weeks. It's also important to realise that you know a great deal more than you give yourself credit for. The immediate priority now is to reassess your goals and set out a plan of action for the run into the exam. The subject teacher at school, who, after all is the expert, will guide you through the last few weeks in revision, examination techniques and overall strategy. If you do your share by regular attendance at school during the final term and by rigorous attention to your work schedule, you are giving yourself every possible chance of achieving your goals. In order to achieve those goals you must be clear in your own mind as to what exactly they are. You must have belief in your ability to achieve them. You must put a plan in place to accomplish your aim and, critically, you must execute your plan by doing the necessary work.

Before you return to school for the final term review your exam programme. Make a decision about the level – higher, ordinary or foundation – of the paper you will answer in each subject. Set a target grade in each subject to help motivate you. It's vital at this late stage to set realistic goals. For example, if you feel you may not be able for a higher level paper in a particular subject, are you not far better off taking an ordinary level paper in that subject where you may achieve a decent grade? Consider what you would like to do after the Leaving Certificate Examination. A singular determination to achieve enough points to get a place in your course of interest is a great motivator. Perhaps, your primary motivator should be to do yourself justice in the exam and to achieve results that reward your ability and effort. Having clear and focussed goals will make your last term more productive and rewarding. Regard the next few weeks and the actual exam as a challenge that you will meet headlong and with determination. Approach it with confidence and belief in yourself. Take total control of your life and channel your energy in a positive direction. Every time you have a doubt or a negative thought about yourself replace it with a positive one. You will feel better about yourself if you are in control of your situation. To assume that control use the holiday period to make out a plan of action. Decide what topics you need to revise between now and the examination. Make out an overall time schedule, a weekly schedule and a daily schedule. Make out that plan of action over the next few days.

## In the next article, I will take a detailed look at how best to implement the action plan.

## **PLANT AN EASTER BOWL**

When planting a colourful Easter bowl choose your bowl from either terracotta or plastic but make sure to get a saucer underneath when purchasing. Then put some gravel around the base surrounding the hole and add compost mixed with slow release fertilizer.

Fill your bowl to about one inch from the top as this will make it easier when watering afterwards. When choosing the plants start with the centre piece. An ideal plant for this would be an evergreen grass. This is an ideal plant as when you are finished with the bowl, the evergreen grass can be planted outdoors.

There are a huge range of plants with colour to fill around the centre piece. Some of the most popular to choose from are trailing variegated ivys, heathers in flower, primroses, polyanthus, forget-me-nots and you will also still be able to get some potted daffodils and tulips.

When finished planting make sure to water the plants in well, and if you decide to keep the Easter Bowl indoors make sure that the saucer is underneath. Keep the finished Easter bowl in as much light as possible and this will flower well into the time for Summer bedding. As certain flowers go off before others, don't be afraid to remove them as this will keep your bowl looking good for longer.

## **CYCLE SAFETY**

With preparations underway for among other things, the Ring of Kerry cycle – Outlook Magazines takes a look at cycle safety.

Motorists should always be conscious of cyclists, giving them plenty of space because of their vulnerability. Drivers of larger vehicles, in particular, should always be on the look-out for cyclists and take extra care whenever they encounter them.

You should be doubly vigilant around younger riders and always remember the 'Look Twice' advice at junctions and when using mirrors before turning, changing lane or overtaking. Only overtake if there's a safe opportunity to do so and do not drive too close to cyclists before overtaking. Think how you would want motorists to drive near you or your loved-ones when cycling.

Cyclists should ensure they are visible to motorists and other road users at all times by wearing bright-coloured clothing. In dark or low light conditions you should always wear reflective clothing and ensure you have effective, working lights. Remember it is generally good advice to wear a cycle helmet. Always be mindful of the speed of other vehicles and consider using cycle lanes when available, and if appropriate.

It is also important to choose your routes carefully and to consider the experience of your fellow cyclists. For example, never ride more than two abreast and be prepared to recognise that on many roads this is not a safe way to ride. In addition, you should always match your cycling style to the road condition, just as you should when driving.

Motorists and cyclists are equally subject to the

laws of road as- every road user is expected to abide by these rules.

THINK! advice for when you're driving

1. Look out for cyclists, especially when turning - make eye contact if possible so they know you've seen them

2. Use your indicators - signal your intentions so that cyclists can react

3. Give cyclists space – at least half a car's width. If there isn't sufficient space to pass, hold back. Remember that cyclists may need to manoeuvre suddenly if the road is poor, it's windy or if a car door is opened

4. Always check for cyclists when you open your car door

5. Avoid driving over advanced stop lines – these allow cyclists to get to the front and increase their visibility

6. Follow the rules of the road including 'stop'

and 'give way' signs and traffic lights

THINK! advice for when you're cycling

1. Ride positively, decisively and well clear of the kerb – look and signal to show drivers what you plan to do and make eye contact where possible so you know drivers have seen you.

2. Avoid riding up the inside of large vehicles, like lorries or buses, where you might not be seen.

3. Always use lights after dark or when visibility is poor.

4. Wearing light coloured or reflective clothing during the day and reflective clothing and/or accessories in the dark increases your visibility

5. Follow the rules of the road including observing 'stop' and 'give way' signs and traffic lights

6. **THINK!** recommends wearing a correctly fitted cycle helmet, which is securely fastened and conforms to current regulations.

## REMEMBER 'MORNING AFTER' IF DRIVING OVER EASTER -DRINKAWARE.IE

As thousands prepare to travel on Irish roads over the Easter bank holiday weekend to meet up with family and friends, drinkaware.ie is encouraging people, if socialising with alcohol, to remember the morning after.

The secret to sobering up is TIME – no amount of coffee, energy drinks, cold showers or breakfast rolls will speed up the process. You might feel better but it doesn't mean you are fit to drive. You can find out how many drinks you have on a night out by using the Standard Drinks Calculator on www.drinkaware.ie" said drinkaware.ie Chief Executive, Fionnuala Sheehan She added "Morning After driving is clearly linked to weekend socialising." According to official Garda figures, 124 drivers were arrested for "driving under the influence" over the Easter bank holiday weekend last year. There were also over 400 incidents of "drivers under the influence" between the hours of 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday, Sunday and Monday mornings in the period from January 1st to September 27th 2013.

In that period, on Saturday mornings, a total of 101 such detections were made by Gardai; on Sunday mornings the number was 208, more than five times greater than the midweek detection figure. On Mondays, between 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. over that period, a total of 94 incidents of "drivers under the influence" were reported.

The message from drinkaware.ie is to take responsibility for your drinking this Easter. "If you are having a night out involving alcohol this weekend, do the maths and if you suspect that you might not be okay to drive the morning after, then don't risk it," added Ms Sheehan. "Equally, the message to others drinking over the weekend is not to get in a car with anyone who you think is not safe to drive."

## Know Your Rights: SINGLE PERSON CHILD CARER CREDIT

#### QUESTION

I claimed the One-Parent Family Tax Credit last year because I share custody of my son with my former partner. My notice of tax credits for 2014 didn't include it and I'm told I can't claim it any more if she claims it. Why is this?

#### **ANSWER**

The One-Parent Family Tax Credit (OPFTC) was a credit for people parenting alone that reduced the amount of tax that they had to pay. If a child stayed with each of its parents for some part of the year, then both parents could claim the full amount of the tax credit for that tax year.

The OPFTC was abolished at the end of 2013 and the Single Person Child Carer Credit (SPCCC) was introduced from 1 January 2014.

Only one parent can claim the SPCCC in a tax year. In general, the SPCCC is given to the person with whom the qualifying child lives for the whole or greater part of the year (more than 6 months). This person is called the primary claimant. If both parents have equal custody (by court order), entitlement to the credit is decided by which parent gets Child Benefit.

When the SPCCC was introduced, Revenue automatically allocated the new credit to people who were due to receive a One-Parent Family Tax Credit and were also getting Child Benefit. If you believe that you qualify as the primary claimant but the credit has been granted automatically to your former partner, you should complete Form SPCC1 (available from Revenue) and return it with any relevant evidence in support of your claim. In the event of a dispute you can appeal Revenue's determination to the Appeal Commissioners.

If your former partner is the primary claimant, she can choose to give up the credit so that you can claim it. To do this, she submits Form SPCC1 and you submit Form SPCC2. You must meet the qualifying conditions and your son must live with you for more than 100 days in a year (for the purpose of this limit, it can count as a day if he is with you for most of the day).

You cannot claim the SPCCC if you are: jointly assessed as a married person or civil partner; cohabiting; married or in a civil partnership (unless separated). The SPCCC is  $\leq 1,650$  in 2014. If you get the SPCCC you are also entitled to an  $\leq 4,000$  extension in the standard rate tax band, increasing it to  $\leq 36,800$ .

## DRIVERS CAUGHT TEXTING FACE FINE OF UP TO €1,000

A new amendment signed into law by the Transport Minister Leo Varadkar, means that convictions will result in a  $\in$ 1,000 maximum fine for a first offence. This will rise to a maximum fine of  $\in$ 2,000 for a second or subsequent offence and a  $\in$ 2,000 maximum fine and or up to three months in prison for a third or subsequent offence within a 12 month period. Although sending text messages was previously legislated for, the use of handsfree devices was not specifically covered and the new regulations cover text messages and multimedia messages. The new law will take effect on the 1st of May.

#### NEXT TUESDAY IS EARTH DAY

In the 1960's U.S senator and environmentalist, Gaylord Nelson, tried to galvanise the conservation movement through the

appropriate creation of a national celebration. Mr. Nelson made a lot of efforts in the Congress to pass a legislation which protected the popular Appalachian Trail. He also tried to pass a legislation to ban the use of DDT. In order to organize the first Earth Day, Mr. Nelson sought some help from Denis Hayes, who was a graduate at Harvard University. The first Earth Day was celebrated on 22nd April, 1970. It was specifically designed as an environmental awareness program. Its aim was to educate participants about the importance of conserving the environment. In 1990, Denis Hayes organised a global Earth Day. It was observed in more than 140 countries by 200 million people. In the early 21st century, most of the activities organized during the Earth day revolved around raising awareness about many different environmental concerns. The primary focus was on the threat of global warming and depleting natural resources. It also focused on the importance of renewable energy sources.

Earth Day 2014 is not much different from the other ones. However, this occasion gets better with each passing year. Besides focusing on general awareness about conserving the environment, it will also focus on respecting life on our planet. It will also make sure people are aware about growing problems of water, soil and air pollution. You can celebrate Earth day by picking up roadside trash, planting trees or fruit bearing shrubs in your garden, using reusable containers for lunches and snacks and recycling etc, the list is endless. There are many people who also sign petitions to Governments on this day. These petitions call for immediate and stronger actions to stop global warming, and even reverse environmental destruction.

### EVERYTHING IN NATURE HAS A PURPOSE

The dingo is a dog-like animal about 1.2 m long, including a 30-cm tail, and stands about 60 cm tall at the shoulder. It has short, soft fur, a bushy tail, and erect, pointed ears. Its colour varies from yellowish to reddish brown, often with white underparts, paws, and tail

tip. According to a new study the dingo is a distinct member of the dog family, not a kind of wild dog as previously believed.

The primitive dingoes were associated with hunter-gatherer societies and later with sedentary agricultural population centres where the primitive dingoes were tamed and subsequently transported around the world including from mainland Asia to Australia and other islands in Southeast Asia and the Pacific between 1,000 and 5,000 years ago. To find a specimen of a dingo unlikely to have cross-bred with domestic dogs, scientists from the University of Sydney looked at specimens pre-dating 1900 and examined 69 skull specimens and 6 skin specimens to create a benchmark description of the dingo. The physical features that define the animal were found to be a fairly broad head, tapered muzzle, erect ears and a bushy tail. Relative to similar-sized domestic dogs, dingoes have

longer and more slender muzzles. The 19th century dingoes examined, like wolves do not possess dewclaws on the hind legs. The researchers said dingoes have an important role in conservation through their regulation of species such as kangaroos, wallabies, invasive red foxes and rabbits.

When a homeless man in Thurston County,

Washington, found himself sick and unable to move, he turned to the one being he could count on - his dog. The man wrote a note and attached it to his dog's harness and sent the dog out to find help. Though the dog, named "Buddy," never left his guardian's side, this time, he seemed to know that he had a mission to accomplish. A woman found Buddy near railroad tracks in Tumwater, she could see that a note was attached to the dog's harness and she stopped to see what it said. The note read 'Help," Send Help. No Joke. Cannot walk' The flip side stated: 'Medicine not working. Need doctor." Unfortunately, there was no other information - not a name, a location or a phone number. The woman who discovered Buddy and the note contacted the police, who had heard of a homeless man who had a dog in the area. A search by the authorities led them to the man who was in need of help at his camp which was established in the woods. The man was unable to walk and completely alone. A police spokesperson said the man was taken to a hospital for treatment, and later released, the man and dog were reunited and are living quite happily in their camp.

### FORMER SALT MINE TRANSFORMED INTO UNDERGROUND THEME PARK

About 368 feet below the ground in the Transylvanian underworld lies one of the world's most eerily spell-binding theme parks. Salina Turda salt mine near the town of Turda in Transylvania, Romania was originally carved by hand in the 17th century and is now a veritable history museum of salt mining. The excellent state of preservation of mining and machinery that used to transport the salt that was a decisive factor in the development of this prosperous town from Roman times until today is now a museum and theme park featuring a Ferris wheel, mini-golf, an underground lake with paddleboats, basketball courts, a spa and more. Descending into the defunct mine transports you to an otherworld filled with an air of history and magic with a temperature of approx. 10 °C and humidity around 80% if you are ever visiting the mine you would need to dress warmly. Fairy-like lighting illuminates the caverns, the salt patterns on the walls resemble marble and reflect off the underground lake to give the impression that they descend into infinity. The Mine is also listed in 22nd place of the unbelievable travel destinations in the world.

## SCIENCE FICTION IS WAY BEHIND THE TIMES

The Commute-Case electric scooter, which is expected to hit the market soon, is the product of a new company called Green Energy Motors Corporation. This neat little device weighs 27 pounds and can convert from something you carry into something that can carry you in just a few seconds. After you pop out the wheels, footrests and handlebars, it can scoot along at up to 12.5 miles per hour. That's about four times faster than walking on a busy city street. This briefcase turned scooter can travel up to 25 miles between charges and can be recharged in less than an hour and those 25 miles use just 10 cents of electricity while producing no carbon emissions. The bad news is that the scooter will cost \$5,990. But Green Energy Motors says it is "currently taking pre-orders to help finance production" and people can order a scooter right now at half price (\$2,995) or reserve one for just \$150 (with 10 additional PayPal payments to follow). The company doesn't say when it expects its Commute-Case scooters to be available, but it promises a satisfaction guarantee and a one-year warranty.

However before rushing off to buy one make sure Green Energy is a legitimate company just in case this is yet another scam.

#### A RACIST SWAN!

Warwick University in Coventry, England has erected a fence around a campus lake to stop swan attacks on students. A 4ft tall bird, with an 8ft wingspan, has been accused of behaving aggressively towards foreign students as they cross over a footbridge near its nesting place at the university's Gibbet Hill campus. The footbridge is used by hundreds of students everyday between their accommodation and university buildings. Undergraduates say the swan only appeared to target students from ethnic minorities.

#### LIKE FATHER LIKE SON

A \$26 million donation was recently made to South Africa's Kruger National Park by Howard Buffett, son of billionaire investor Warren Buffett who has himself donated millions of dollars to various causes. The donation will be used to aggressively fight rhinoceros poaching in the sanctuary, and to test new antipoaching methods that could be implemented elsewhere in the world. Kruger National Park is home to 40% of the world's remaining 22,000 wild rhinos, a species in danger of total extinction due to poaching. In three years, over 1,000 of the animals were poached in South Africa alone, as well as another 172 animals less than three months into 2014. Despite the increasing rarity of wild rhinos, the number of animals poached is rising each year. Rhinoceros horns are highly prized in some Asian countries as a status symbol or, more frequently, for use in traditional medicine. Pound for pound, ivory is worth more than gold, cocaine, or platinum in street markets throughout China. The proceeds from this illegal trade often go to fund poaching rings or other criminal gangs. The money donated by Howard Buffett will provide the park with a helicopter and land vehicles equipped with high-tech electronic sensors to help locate poachers. The donation will also allow the addition of specialised rangers and elite canine units, creating an Intensive Protection Zone within the park. This

new technology and additional anti-poaching staff could help even out the losing battle against poachers in Kruger National Park, while trial of Intensive Protection Zones could lead to improved conservation for many species worldwide.

#### **LIKE TO TRAVEL?**

Saint Helena named after Saint Helena of Constantinople, is an island of volcanic origin in the South Atlantic Ocean, measuring about 16 by 8 kilometres (10 by 5 mi) and is one of the most isolated islands in the world it was uninhabited when discovered by the Portuguese in 1502. Saint Helena is a neighbour to Tristan da Cunha and Ascension Island (Well, relatively speaking: they are 1,510 and 810 miles apart, respectively) and is dominated by Diana's Peak, a 2,684-foot-high mountain that doubles as a national park. A little more than 4,000 hardy souls call Saint Helena home, most the descendants of British colonists. Saint Helena residents make their living working for the British government, exporting goods like coffee and prickly pears, and growing New Zealand flax. If you want to travel to Saint Helena, you'll need to vie for one of the few seats available to civilians on a flight operated by the British military or buy a ticket on one of the ships that visits its port about 30 times a vear.

#### DID YOU KNOW ....

It has really only been the last 100 years or so that people have bathed more than once a week (Saturday night baths were the norm for most of history), daily showering is actually not objectively healthier or better; and in fact, one of the most common reasons that people cut down on showering is actually for skin-health reasons, not laziness. As far as being actually physically dirty, most of us who don't work outside or aren't otherwise involved in daily work where we might get covered in dust, dirt or grease probably don't get any real dirt on anything other than our faces and hands most weeks. Many people have found that when they stop washing hair and skin so often, after an adjustment period, the body naturally decreases the amount of oil it produces and less washing is needed. Of course, how often you shower depends on your level of activity, how healthy you are (if you work out often and eat healthfully, you naturally produce less body odour) and what you do for a living, and it depends on the season too.

## SELF-ACCEPTANCE

One of my favourite Oscar Wilde quotes says 'Be yourself, everyone else is taken'. So why is it so difficult for us to do just that? Liking ourselves and being ourselves has to do with selfacceptance. Self-acceptance refers to our ability to embrace all facets of ourselves and not just the positive, acceptable parts. Whilst we may recognize our limitations and weaknesses – accepting ourselves fully means we accept these aspects of ourselves too. We stop judging ourselves and being so hard on ourselves.

Research shows that before the age of eight we are unable to form a sense of ourselves separate from that which was transmitted to us by those who care for us. So often I hear clients say to me that their parents were unable or unwilling to communicate the message to them that they were totally okay and acceptable. In addition to this we may have received much disapproval and criticism from teachers, siblings, other relatives and/or our peers. Is it any wonder then that we come to see ourselves as inadequate in many ways? A consequence of this is that we may go on to regard many aspects of ourselves negatively. We 'beat ourselves up' often telling ourselves the very same thing that an overly critical parent or teacher may have said.

So how then do we become more self-accepting?

Developing self-acceptance requires that we develop more self-compassion for ourselves. The Buddhist teacher Pema Chodron says that "Compassion isn't some kind of self-improvement project or ideal that we're trying to live up to. Having compassion starts and ends with having compassion for all those unwanted parts of ourselves, all those imperfections that we don't even want to look at".

However learning to be self-compassionate and kind to ourselves can seem like quite a new idea and represents a deep change in our attitude and way of being. In order to ensure our survival our brains have been designed in such a way as to give attention to the negative stuff. Self-criticism has in fact played an important role for us. However, this criticism needs to be tempered with kindness and not allowed to be a habit based response formed from patterns laid down in our early childhood. Whenever we criticise ourselves we are triggering the same threat and protection systems in the body and brain that get activated when threatened by other people.

By cultivating more self-compassion we come to like ourselves more and to view ourselves as deserving of love and respect. This in turn can lead us to showing not just more kindness and goodwill toward ourselves but towards others as well.

## Health Matters.... With Dr. Michael O'Doherty

### TRAVEL VACCINATION PART 1

Thinking of travelling abroad...? Have you taught about travel Vaccines...? if so here is some information that may help you get organised.

As you are already aware some destination may require some of the following vaccinations.

**Typhoid Fever:** A serious infection caught from contaminated food or water. It is prevalent in areas where sanitation is poor.

• Typhoid Vaccine (injectable). This is a single injection that helps protect patients for 3 years

Hepatitis A: Like typhoid fever, this disease is spread by contaminated water or food, wherever there is poor sanitation.

Hepatitis A is a single injection followed by a booster dose helps provide long terms protection and lasts for 10 years.

**Hepatitis B:** Hepatitis B is a highly infectious virus spread through blood, semen and other body fluids. Contact even through tiny quantities of an infected person's body fluid can pass the virus on.

• Hepatitis B Vaccine: This is a standard Schedule consists of 3 vaccinations given over a six month period. The first dose at an elected date, the second dose a month later and another 5 months later after that. It is very important that all three doses are received.

**Cholera:** Cholera is a serious bacterial disease that occurs in regions of the world where sanitation and food and water hygiene are inadequate or lacking

**Diphtheria:** Diphtheria is a serious disease spread through droplets contained in coughs and sneezes. This is a significant risk in some parts of the world including Russia and the Ukraine.

**Tetanus:** This is a potentially fatal disease, is contracted when spores in the soil enter the body through cuts or scratches. Tetanus exists all over the world.

**Polio:** Polio can cause paralysis and in some cases can be fatal. Although polio has almost been wiped out in industrialised nations, it is still a risk in some developing countries.

 Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio is combined of a total of five injections that help protect patients for a lifetime. However, a booster dose may be required for persons travelling abroad.

Yellow fever: A potentially fatal disease that is spread by infected mosquitoes. In some areas of the world, you have to carry an international certificate of vaccination as proof of vaccination to gain entry into certain countries (available at designated yellow fever vaccination centres and included in this booklet). This is valid for 1 year from 10 days after vaccination and immediately after Revaccination.

 Vaccinations for yellow fever consist of one injection every ten years.
 The international certificate is valid from ten days after primary vaccinations and for ten years thereafter. It is immediately valid for a further ten years if revaccination is performed before expiry of current certificate.
