Areas awarded the Purple Flag are recognised for providing a vibrant and diverse mix of dining, entertainment and culture while promoting the safety and wellbeing of visitors and local residents.

Chairman, Frank Doran, attributed the success to the quality and commitment of the working group and the businesses in Killarney town who operate in the night-time economy.

"In order to retain the Purple Flag, we must all continue our work with all evening and night-time businesses to further develop the entertainment, food and hospitality offering," he said.

Killarney will be subject to another full assessment in 2023 and the committee is looking forward to working with local businesses and key stakeholders to help promote the area to the widest possible audience.

Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce President, Niall Kelleher, said it is a great endorsement for the town that it has retained its Purple Flag status every year since it was first awarded in 2014.

#### **O'SULLIVAN'S CASCADE**



O'Sullivan's Cascade on Sunday was running on water - not whiskey. But after one of the wettest Octobers ever, there was plenty of "spirit" in the fountain with spray emanating on all sides. The small waterfall is always known by the more elegant "cascade" which to me means it falls gracefully over its rocks - perhaps a bit more gracefully than the better known Torc, a roaring and at times angry waterfall.

O'Sullivan's tumbles into a pool that looks like something you might come across in a rain forest before slipping directly onto the western side of the lake at Lough Leane.

Traditionally, the principal way and a very popular way in Victorian times was to go by boat to view it. But the new 800,000 euro road and car park means more of us now can wander through the lovely oakwoods of Tomies before taking the long steep and sensibly rope aided steps down to the bottom of the fall.

There is perhaps a need for more assistance at the end for people with vertigo, but on the whole the NPWS have done an excellent job with this new access.

It is popular . On Sunday afternoon all but one of the 26 spaces in car park at the wood were taken up with the lower car park also practically full.

The NPWS have a good blurb on the cascade on one of its websites. It talks about how legend has it "this waterfall once ran not with water, but with whiskey".

The Chieftain of the Fianna, Fionn MacCumhal, resided above the Cascade on Tomies Mountain. It was here that he kept his personal supply of the finest uisge beatha . "O'Sullivan of Tomies was lucky enough to share this delightful drop, being the only man bold enough to stand up to Fionn. Unfortunately when the Sassenagh (The English) invaded Ireland, it changed into water and became known as O'Sullivan's Cascade," it goes.

It is well worth keeping an eye on the fall in case it changes back! But on a more sober note, the walkway is an example of how there are many hidden treasures all over the national park and the more pathways are opened the more we will all enjoy them. Sometimes there is too much pressure on Muckross and Torc, especially at the weekends. More walkways is the way to "dilute" the over-crowded areas.

#### NOT A SINGLE HOUSE BEING BUILT

More land is needed to deliver housing in Killarney and elsewhere and the residential zone land tax will assist in bringing lands onto the market, the monthly county council meeting in Tralee was told on Monday.

The situation in Killarney is particularly grave. Killarney, where there was a lack of

there was a lack of available land, was one

of "the highest need areas and had the lowest delivery rates to 2026," senior managers said. Councillor Donal Grady who made the point that not one house is being built in Killarney currently."They are building houses elsewhere, so they can put the people of Killarney into other towns. We are hunting people out of Killarney," he said.

Many people had to refuse the houses in Rathmore and Milltown because they could not drive, he said.

Now more than 14 acres north of the bypass would be no longer landlocked with the new roadworks, he added.

There followed a very good motion by Councillor Brendan Cronin to consider modular housing which is being fast-tracked for refugees.

The Government was proceeding with "at least 500 modular houses to try and cope with the refugee crisis." The Kerry planning department should give "favourable consideration to people in Kerry that apply for permission to construct appropriately designed modular homes", Cllr Cronin said.

This type of preconstructed housing which lasted for about 60 years and came in a variety of materials now.

It could be a solution in the light of " significant increase in building costs on standard houses", and "the struggle" people have trying to secure a mortgage.

"It offers people an opportunity at a much reduced cost to get a key to their own property," Cllr Cronin said.

But "a change in mentality" was needed and design guidelines limiting finishes to painted blockwork and such needed to be revised, the councillor said.

Kerry County Council management has said it is open to the idea of modular housing for locals.

However, the "general planning exemptions" brought in under EU regulations for the construction of modular homes for Ukrainian refugees for the period of the crisis, will not apply to such applications. And modular homes

for locals will have to go through the normal planning process.

#### LISTOWEL WRITERS' WEEK

Listowel Writers' Week is one of the great treasures of this county. It's as much a treasure as buildings or parks. It grew up organically, as it were, in a town where talking, writing, "a way with words, stories, humour and history" to paraphrase the voluntary committee, which has been discontinued for the moment, are quite extraordinary and continue to this day.

These are things that cannot be learned, nor can they be taught in the ordinary sense. Nor can they be imposed.

Yet Writers' Week actually attempted to share their rather unique gift and has done so successfully. I am one of many journalists and writers to owe something to Listowel. A workshop I did on journalism at the age of 15 is largely responsible for a career and a way of life too.

Listowel was the first of the Writers' festivals. There are now over 50 such events from Dalkey to Donegal, all imitating a good idea. It is a pity there is a row that may threaten it. This is still a unique festival - because there is still such a rich love of theatre, reading and story telling still in Listowel.

The disbanding of the long-standing voluntary committee, which set the agenda for Listowel with 52 years, who to invite and which performances to schedule and so on has caused a lot of upset. That kind of work is now to be done solely by a professional curator, is the plan.

Apparently the restructuring is in order to comply with "governance" rules for the Arts Council and other bodies. To be sure, there are aspects also that are a local row.

But the wider question, and the one that was raised in the Seanad is about creeping professionalism. Are we becoming overprofessionalised? Is too much ruled and regulated?. As Senator Ned O'Sullivan said, over regulation especially of artistic events "stifles" and has "a chilling effect" on creativity. The wider question about regulation the Listowel row has raised and put out in the public forum is important. We remember Paddy Kavanagh's great and ironically short poem, "Epic" with just three verses. And how Kavanaghy says even the Trojan War was really about "a local row". Let's hope the Listowel row gets resolved soon - but also that the broader implications of too many rules and regulations are looked at.

# SEVEN STAGE KILLARNEY HISTORIC RALLY LAUNCHED

Killarney and District Motor Club unveiled further details of its December 2 and 3 Rentokil Initial Killarney Historic Rally at the Gleneagle Hotel, on Sunday afternoon.

In his address to the large audience, clerk of the course Anthony O'Connor outlined some of the new initiatives for this year's event.

"A huge effort is going on behind the scenes to organise, what I believe, is the best one-day rally Ireland has to offer," he said.

"Entries will close in just a few days and, as ever, the rally has received a large number of entries with some of the highest quality machines and drivers already signed up to take on this challenging event.

"In a Killarney Historic Rally first, the iconic Molls Gap stage will be run on three occasions across the day, which has received nothing but positivity since that was announced. A large number of spectators are expected to congregate on the iconic left-hand turn on the main Killarney to Kenmare road. The rally will consist of seven stages in total, with two runs through the scenic Ballaghbeama stage and the technical and twisty sections of Kilgobnet, which is enough to test the best drivers in the world."

The rally has attracted a star-studded entry list including entries from all corners of Ireland, Britain and the USA.

#### LEADING LOCAL ENTRIES

Alan Ring leads the very strong Kerry entry in his Subaru Legacy RS. He and co-driver Adrian Deasy finished second overall last year.

Fergus O'Meara will have British Championship runner-up Mikie Glavin in the hot seat in his Ford Escort.

Todd Falvey is also competing in a Ford Escort and all three local drivers are in contention for the historic award in the Kingdom of Kerry Rally Championship.

Craig Breen has coaxed Paul Nagle out of retirement for next month's Rentokil Initial Killarney Historic Rally.

The Aghadoe man made the announcement at the rally's official launch at the Gleneagle Hotel in Killarney on Sunday.

Nagle announced his retirement from the World Rally Championship in October.

He was in Japan this week to complete the handover to Breen's new co-driver James Fulton and returned to Ireland on Sunday just in time for the launch.

The 2022 event winners will drive the Ford Sierra Cosworth that Frank Meagher drove to victory on the 1992 Circuit of Ireland Rally.

The late Tipperary driver was Breen's childhood rally here and he recently completed a full restoration of the Sierra. The Killarney will be the car's first appearance since the restoration. "We are looking forward to going out for a big battle with some local drivers, "said Nagle.

Monaghan's Michael Carbin makes his first foray into historic rallying. He finished fifth in the recent Banna Beach Resort Kerry Winter Rally in a Mitsubishi Lancer, but he will drive a Ford Escort RS1800 in Killarney in just under three weeks.

Racing driver Michael Cullen will compete in a BMW M3 E30. His co-driver Sean Hasset is better known for the behind-the-scenes social media work he does for Craig Breen on the World Rally Championship.

# **NEW SCHOOL OF VETERINARY MEDICINE TO BE LOCATED IN MUNSTER**



#### 

#### **NEW VET SCHOOL**

A Veterinary Work Group has met Taoiseach Micheál Martin, Agriculture Minister Charlie McConalogue and Further and Higher Education Minister Simon Harris with a view to having a new School of Veterinary Medicine established in Munster. University College Dublin (UCD) is the only college in Ireland offering a degree course in Veterinary Medicine, making it extremely difficult for a young person to become a Veterinary Surgeon. UCD offers 82 places on its undergraduate degree course and just 5 places in its graduate entry Vet course. Demand for these coveted places is so competitive, that the 581 CAO applicants who had veterinary medicine as their first-choice course on the CAO form in 2022, needed a staggering points' total in the Leaving Cert exam between 601 and 625 to secure a place.

#### SHORTAGE OF PLACES

Despite the need for Vets, it's well-nigh impossible to get a place on the UCD course. Indeed, many aspiring Vets don't even include the UCD Vet course on their CAO application form, due to the high points required and the prohibitive cost of studying in Dublin for five years. There is an acute shortage of college places to cater for those with a passion to become Vets.

#### INTEREST

University College Cork (UCC) and the University of Limerick (UL) were fast off the blocks to express an interest in providing the Vet school. Public Representatives in Limerick and Cork consider it a straight fight between the two city colleges for the prestigious new Vet school. That view, in my opinion, is wide of the mark and designed to frighted off competition from other Munster colleges. MTU Kerry in Tralee can make a much stronger case for the new Vet school than UCC and UL.

#### MTU KERRY EXPERTISE

MTU Kerry has the ambition, the expertise and the infrastructure to develop an excellent School of Veterinary Medicine. A Vet school in Tralee will be based in a county with an

established reputation in the agricultural and animal industries. The school will have back-up from outstanding Vets in practice throughout the region. Kerry is the home base of Kerry Group plc, one of the biggest food companies in the world. From a small dairy company launched in Listowel in 1972, Kerry has grown to a global multinational in 50 years. Its journey under the dynamic leadership of Denis Brosnan tells a story of how belief and vision created a unique company from humble beginnings. Mr Brosnan is a recipient of an Honorary Fellowship from MTU Kerry.

#### LESS COSTLY

Tralee town and surrounds will comfortably accommodate 100 or more veterinary medicine students per annum at far less cost than Dublin, Cork and Limerick. Tralee will enable many deserving young people to fulfil the dream of a career as a Vet. Candidates who fail to get a Vet course place in UCD are forced to look to Eastern Europe. Currently, about 300 Irish vet students are based as far away as Warsaw in Poland, Budapest in Hungary and Kosice in Slovakia.

#### TRACK RECORD

Back in its days as a Regional Technical College (RTC), the current MTU Kerry initiated pioneering work in the agricultural area. Kevin Woods and his colleagues were quick to provide progressive agricultural courses. Today, MTU Tralee offers courses in agricultural engineering, agricultural science, veterinary bioscience, wildlife biology, biology and environmental studies. A degree course in Veterinary Medicine is a very natural next step in courses expansion.

#### **GOLDEN OPPORTUNITY**

If Jimmy Deenihan, Chairman of the Governing Body of MTU Kerry – Educationalist and former Minister for Rural Development and Food - and Professor Maggie Cusack, President of MTU, are prepared to compete with the big two of UCC and UL for the new Vet school, they will have the backing of the entire county. Minister Norma Foley can be depended upon for wholehearted support. Former Tánaiste, Dick Spring, himself a 

recipient of an Honorary Fellowship from MTU Kerry, is a good friend to the college and has been central to its development.

#### A-Team

This A-Team of advocates for a School of Veterinary Medicine in Tralee will have the everlasting gratitude of generations of Vets and Veterinary Nurses, if they deliver the goods. It's a golden opportunity for Tralee and Kerry. Let's go for it as opportunities like this don't present themselves too often. Nothing ventured nothing gained. Carpe Diem.

# PIONEERING KERRY TEACHER REMEMBERED IN KILLORGLIN

The pioneering work and achievements of a Kerry teacher who was a leading trade union activist in Ireland are to be celebrated at an event being organised on the 50th anniversary of her death.

The Kerry Branch of the Teachers' Union of Ireland is to honour the memory of Patricia Hurley, a teacher from Killorglin who was a prominent trade union leader until her untimely death in a car accident on 10 November 1972.

Ms Hurley, who taught at Killorglin Technical School made history by becoming the first ever female vice-president of the Vocational Teachers' Association (VTA), a forerunner of the modern-day TUI. She was one of the first women to occupy a senior position in any trade union in Ireland. She was also a passionate advocate for vocational and adult education. 'Patricia Hurley made a profound make on Irish education despite dying tragically at the young age of just 34 years,' Joe Brennan, Kerry Branch Chairman of TUI, one of the organisers of an event to honour Ms Hurley. A plaque will be unveiled by the Minister for Education, Norma Foley, at Killorglin Community College on Friday, 11 November to ensure that Patricia Hurley's contribution to teaching and trade union activism is permanently remembered. 'Patricia Hurley made history by becoming

ching and trade union ntly remembered. e history by becoming vice-president of the union in 1971. She was a vocal advocate for vocational education and despite being a full-time teacher in Killorglin, she travelled the country working with branches of

the union. 'It was on her return from a union meeting in November 1972, during which she was supporting strike action by teachers in County Wexford, that she was sadly killed in a road collision near Enniscorthy,' Anne Doyle, Kerry Branch Equality Officer.

A native of Ardeevin, Killorglin, Ms Hurley was also a member of the Irish Congress of Trade Union advisory committee on the Commission on the Status of Women and sat on the Department of Education committee on the Junior Certificate examination in the early 1970s. She also represented the Kerry Vocational Education Committee (VEC) at a conference on adult education in Denmark a few weeks before she died.

# DELIGHT AT THE OPENING OF THE INSPIRED DAY SERVICE

The much-anticipated opening of the Inspired day-service located at Brandon Court, Basin Rd, Tralee took place on Monday November 7th.

Inspired is a not-for-profit organisation, dedicated to empowering adults with intellectual disabilities and the organisation has gone from strength to strength since 2014. The building owned by the Byrne family and formally known as the Brandon Court Hotel was renovated by Inspired during the pandemic. Even though the organisation moved into the building in 2021, due to Covid-19 restrictions they were unable to host the celebratory opening until now.

Minister for Education, Norma Foley said "It is a great pleasure and a privilege to officially open the magnificent new Inspired Centre in Tralee. As both a teacher, and as Minister for Education, I recognise the importance of inclusive education for all. It gives me immense pride and joy to see that ethos and spirit of inclusion is not only alive and well but thriving here at Inspired".

Participants treated guests to a tour of the centre, with some serving food and refreshments while others were eager to deliver their views and opinions on what Inspired has meant to them so far. Chairperson of Inspired, Kay McCarthy explained that "the organisation was founded in 2014 by a group of parents who believed that people with intellectual disabilities should be an integral part of society, having equal rights to participate in education and employment. Kay who spoke on behalf of the board, management and staff said that "they will continue the mission and vison of Inspired and will continue to develop a service where self-advocacy and social inclusion were prioritised".

Patrice O'Neill, Day Services Opportunities Manager Kerry HSE, commented on the Inspired journey and how it has embraced the New Directions approach in every sense. She remarked on the availability of choice and the focus on ability instead of disability.

Liz Maher, Manager of Inspired spoke of the dedication extended to Inspired by the team of architects and building professionals who worked in one of the worst conditions during the renovation period. Liz also remarked on the dedication of the Inspired staff and volunteers who worked endlessly during Covid-19 and commended and applauded their work on successfully and seamlessly transitioning all participants back into the service which remained fully open during the pandemic. In addition, funders, and stakeholders such as the HSE, NEWKD, Bon Secours Hospital Tralee and Kerry ETB were thanked for their financial contributions and huge support.

Paddy Clancy was keen to emphasise the

importance of language, narrative and how we reference disability in general, saying "I hate clicking the word disabled person, its not how I see myself and we need to change this".

The organisation reiterated its commitment to providing exceptional person-centred supports guided by a Human Rights model. Manager Liz Maher stated that they would do this "by empowering people with intellectual disability to become self-determined valued members of the community, while enabling them to enjoy the good things in life like every other citizen". Management and staff agreed that they would continue to focus on individual ability, enabling participants to achieve their full potential, by encouraging personal choices, interests, and advocacy.

# GIVE YOUR HEAD SOME SPACE WITH THIS MINDFUL EXERCISE!

This exercise is a great way to create some space in your head, especially if you have been thinking about a stressor over and over. It is calming to the nervous system, whilst stimulating the blood flow to your head.

1. Start with your thumbs on your temples; fingertips resting in the middle of your forehead. Your hands will be slightly curled at this point.

2. Apply firm pressure and slowly pull your fingers apart, stretching the skin across your forehead until your fingers get to your hairline at the side of your forehead. Make sure you breathe deeply – in through your nose and out through your mouth. You can repeat if this feels good (which it usually does!)

3. Move your fingers up and place your little finger at your hairline, with the other fingers above it. Repeat the stretch. Work your way across the top of your head, fingers always at the centre line and stretching the skin apart. Continue until you reach the base of your neck.

4. Move down to your shoulders, push your fingers in and hold. A lot of stress can be held in our shoulders, so you may find it tender here. Pull across your shoulders towards your front. Hold your hands there until it feels right, then release and drop your hand and arms.

# **DRIVING AND VISION**

It is important that you can see clearly to be able to drive safely. Conditions that may affect your visual field and driving include strokes and brain tumours, as well as eye conditions such as diabetic retinopathy and glaucoma (if you have them in both eyes).

Make sure you have regular sight tests and if your optometrist tells you that you must not drive, you must stop all driving immediately. Driving when you are medically unfit to do so is a criminal offence, and you may be prosecuted if you are involved in an accident.

Driving glasses

If you have been advised to wear glasses for driving, make sure you wear them, even for short trips – and keep a spare pair in the car. Choose glasses with thinner sides for driving as they won't block your side vision as much as thicker ones. If you wear contact lenses, keep a pair of glasses in the car in case you need to take your lenses out. Even if you don't need to wear glasses all the time, you will probably find they are particularly helpful when the lighting is poor, and for driving at night.

Headlights of oncoming traffic can be dazzling when you

are driving at night or in poor weather conditions. Special driving lenses designed with a specially-developed glare filter and a contrast-enhancing filter can help reduce reflections and uncomfortable glare from oncoming traffic.

If glare is an ongoing problem for you, make sure your windscreen and headlights are thoroughly cleaned and free from grime and dirt. If you wear glasses, and don't forget to keep them clean too. If you find that problems with glare at night persist, make an appointment to have a sight test. Sunshine can be dazzling too, particularly when the sun is low in the sky. If you wear glasses, you may find it helpful to have a pair of prescription sunglasses in the car, or to wear clip-on sunglasses over your prescription glasses. Polarised sunglasses are great for driving in bright conditions. Polarised lenses are lenses with a special built in filter to reduce glare and improve vision in bright conditions

### **>CONDOLONCES** DAN FAVIER RIP

Dan was born in Curraglass, and he was child No 5 of 9 to Joe and Mai Favier of Glenflesk Post Office. This is where his grá and affinity for the Post Office began. At the age of 18 he went to Dublin working with the Department of Post and Telegraphs where he spent 10 years working and living it up with the Dubs but thankfully, he never acquired the Dublin accent and kept on to his strong Kerry accent. He then returned to Killarney where he spent the next 25 years working in New St Killarney before returning home to Headford and Clonkeen where he spent his time until retirement marking 43 years with An Post. During his time working here he became an integral part of every household on his delivery routes. He was known for answering phones and taking messages in the owners' absence. Dan the postman often got the blame for babies' bottles and soothers going missing in the van, as parents were trying to wean them off them. He was known to often fill the kettle and help himself to cups of tea. He was an active member of the Communications Worker Union within An Post Killarney and South Kerry. He was a lifelong member of the Pioneer Association, something which he was extremely proud of. His faith played a significant part of his life, and he even had his own seat down at the back of the church near the sacristy, where he could keep an eye on all proceedings. He was an active member of Glenflesk Parish Council for many years. There wasn't a committee in Glenflesk that Dan was not a member of- GAA Bord Na Nóg & Senior Board, Glenflesk Community Games, Glenflesk Athletic Club, Comhaltas, Glenflesk Carnivals, GAA Lotto & was could regularly be spotted with the yellow bib picking up litter locally. He was a member of the Board of Management of Glenflesk NS for 16 years. While he never kicked a football he served as an administrator for many years with Glenflesk Board na Nog, Senior Board, East Kerry Scor a Nog & Scór Sinsear Boards. He was extremely privileged and proud to have served his time during one of the most successful eras of Glenflesk GAA Club when they won numerous O Donoghue Cup Finals and that great year in 2000 when Glenflesk won the Millennium Cup represented Kerry in the Club Championship in Munster where they reached the Munster final against Nemo. Could An Ghaeltacht deal with Ryan, or with that multiplicity of threats?

The simple answer early on was no, not really. Chrissy Spiers and Dara Ó Sé swapped early frees before John Moynihan nudged Rathmore in front with a well-worked score. Ryan and Spierrs combined straight from the kick-out to put Moynihan through on goal – he just doesn't miss thgose kind of opportunities. 1-2 to 0-1. Chrissy Spiers notched another free before Moynihan took his tally to 1-2. To say that An Ghaeltacht were trying to snatch at shadows is putting it mildly – Rathmore were swift and sure with every ball.

The next score was absolutely crucial, and it fell to the right man for Rathmore as John Moynihan split the posts. Paul Murphy added another and Gaeltacht neededa c goal. Their opponents, on the other hand, had won ten tough games to get out of Cork and had a tough Munster semi-final to boot.

Danielle had a shot just barely saved in the first minute and Amy O'SSullivan pounced like a flash on the rebound to goal. Two minutes later Danielle squared it for O'Sullivan to goal again. Aughabullogue had the wind but Kerry, with the likes of Sara Murphy, Patrice Diggin, Rachel McCarthy, Kate Lynch, Jackie Horgan, and Danielle O'Leary in top form, stayed with them. Diggin had a penalty saved late in the first half but pointed the rebound to give Clanmaurice a 2-5 to 0-5 half-time lead.

Aughabullogue's Cliona Healy was a superb player herself, finishing with 1-6. She got 1-2 of that straight on the restart to cut the gap to a single point. A Killarney based veterinary laboratory is encouraging students to consider a career in animal diagnostic testing. Agri Diagnostics has delivered a short training course to students from Munster Technological University showing them the latest methods and testing techniques.

# FOCUS ON HERBACEOUS PERENNIALS

What we mean when we call a plant an Herbaceous Perennial is that in most of them the stems are soft, succulent and green as opposed to being brown and woody. With most Herbaceous Perennial they will sprout growth from ground level in spring and will grow and flower right through the summer and into the autumn. With most Herbaceous Perennials, in late autumn and early winter they start to look a bit ragged. But depending on the severity of the winter, some will hold on until the first real cold snap. The maintenance for most Herbaceous Perennials isn't a lot really. During late autumn, early winter cut the majority of the stem down to ground level and mulch over with some compost. Some Herbaceous Perennials such as Lupins and semi hardy Fuchsias will have woody stems because of the milder climate here so when pruning back cut right back to just a couple of inches above ground level.

#### Herbaceous Perennials are a valuable plant in the garden for a number of reasons. 1. Because of the length of time they flower for.

2. Because of the short length of time it takes them to grow to the maximum height and spread.

When planting an Herbaceous Border always remember to plant the taller ones to the back or middle and the smaller growing ones to the front. When choosing your plants pick one plant that you can repeatedly plant in the border to create a sense of continuity to the planting scheme. Herbaceous Perennials flower from April until October/November so you have a wide range of flowering times and colour to choose from. The secret to having a good flowering Herbaceous Border is every few years in the winter to lift and divide the plants that are suitable for this.
