



# DELEGATES HAIL SIGNIFICANCE OF FOSTER VISIT

The first ever visit of Democratic Unionist Party leader, Arlene Foster, to Kerry was hailed as a very important and symbolic gesture by delegates at the inaugural Killarney Economic Conference in The Brehon Hotel at the weekend.

Delegates afforded the former First Minister a very warm welcome and she, in turn, remarked: "It is a great honour to be in beautiful Killarney". "I want to congratulate the organisers on this inaugural Economic Conference. I know that a huge effort has gone into arranging this weekend," she said.

"I wish you every success also for the years ahead as you seek to establish the conference in the calendar as a must-attend event," the DUP leader added.

The attendance at the conference felt it was very significant that Ms Foster would accept an invitation to travel to Kerry where she shared the platform with Fianna Fail leader Micheál Martin.

Dr Mary C Murphy of the Department of Politics in UCC remarked: "A Unionist voice in this debate on this side of the border is crucial to us finding a way forward. I was very struck by Arlene Foster's contribution".

She added: "Even the symbolism of the DUP leader addressing the Killarney Economic Conference, in the deep south, was very significant."

During the course of her ground-breaking visit, Ms Foster insisted that she is determined to maintain and enhance the positive relationship that has developed on both sides of the border and she acknowledged that the progress that has been made was hard won.

Ms Foster said when she grew up a few miles from the Fermanagh/Monaghan border, she saw, even during the darkest days, the close economic, cultural and social ties across the border

"Those ties have strengthened since the Troubles ended to the extent that, in recent times, we have enjoyed extraordinarily, unimaginably positive relations between our two states," the former First Minister remarked. "I don't want to lose any of that. I lose none of my unionism by saying that I am proud of that progress".

Ms Foster said while the UK's exit from the EU has the potential to test the progress made, it doesn't automatically mean that everything that has been achieved is or will be undone.

In what was viewed as a strong conciliatory gesture towards the Irish Government, the DUP leader said she considered Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland to be like a semi-detached house.

"The houses may look the same on the outside, but, inside, they look different and we do many things very differently. But no matter how contrasting the interiors are, they are tied together and part of the same neighbourhood and what happens on one side of the fence inevitably has an impact on the other," she

#### stated.

"I know that we are rivals in some respects, but in so many ways success for one of us is success for the other. As we chart a new course for the future, it is not in our interests to see the Republic of Ireland do anything other than prosper," Ms Foster stressed.

She said while the DUP supported the UK leaving the European Union but Brexit is "not about pulling up the drawbridge and building a wall"

# BRASSIL ASKS DUP FOR A SECOND REFERENDUM

Kerry TD John Brassil has urged DUP leader Arlene Foster to back calls for a second referendum on Brexit.

He said because of the DUP's unique position as powerbrokers in the British Parliament, she could use her influence to give the people a second say on such a crucial matter as EU membership.

"That is the very simple solution to this whole mess," the Fianna Fail TD said at the Killarney Economic Conference.

"I would ask you, as a person of influence, to go ahead and demand it," he said to the former First Minister.

"I really believe that the British people voted on something that they didn't realise the consequences of. The debate was more about migration and NHS waiting lists than it was about what Brexit actually meant and now, 18 months down the road, the people realise the potential consequences," he said.

"There is nothing wrong with putting the question to the people again now that they know what they are voting on," Deputy Brassil insisted.

Ms Foster, in response, said there were many reasons why people voted to leave the European Union and, in her opinion, it was a sovereignty issue.

"To be clear, my party has never been in favour

of the European Union. Right from the very beginning we have campaigned against it," she said.

"I totally disagree with you on the second referendum. I would never advocate that. Where do you stop? We would be on a neverending cycle of referendums," she told the Kerry Fianna Fail TD.

Junior Minister, Brendan Griffin, Deputies Michael and Danny Healy-Rae, Senators Mark Daly and Paul Coghlan and Mayor of Killarney, Cllr Niall Kelleher, were also in attendance at the conference in the Brehon Hotel.

# MINISTER FEARS BREXIT IMPACT On Tourism

Fresh fears that Brexit will seriously impact on Ireland's tourism and agri-food sector have been voiced by Agriculture Minister, Michael Creed, who said very few policy, business or financial decisions will be made over the coming months and years that will not be affected by the issue in some way, either directly or indirectly.

The tourism industry – the lifeblood of many counties – could be "seriously affected" and, already, the number of British visitors visiting Ireland is down about six per cent on 2016, he stressed.

The Government is conscious that the decline in British visitors is having a disproportionate effect in some areas, particularly in border locations and in high tourist areas.

"In response to these challenges, Tourism Ireland is targeting the marketing effort in GB through a Brexit lens, whilst at the same time seeking to build on the successful strategy of market diversification implemented since 2014," Minister Creed told the inaugural Killarney Economic Conference in County Kerry last night.

"In the medium term, other Brexit associated risks will threaten tourism and aviation related risks will reduce air access if they materialise,"

he said.

The minister warned that there will be very significant impacts if a hard or "no deal" Brexit ensues and all walks of Irish life will be affected.

"Brexit is a British policy, not an EU policy or an Irish policy, and we believe it is bad for the UK, bad for Europe and bad for Ireland. It presents challenges to our peace, and challenges to our prosperity.

"However, we are where we are and we must now get on and deal with the matter in a way that causes the minimal possible disruption," he told the attendance at the conference gala dinner in the Brehon Hotel.

Minister Creed said most immediate impact of Brexit over the last 18 months has been caused by the drop in the value of sterling, resulting in serious financial losses for many sectors, particularly horticulture and forest products. To help mitigate this and to assist in reducing costs and improving competitiveness, he introduced a range of measures aimed at helping reduce farm gate and business costs.

Despite Brexit concerns, the Government has worked hard at maintaining close relationships with Britain and Northern Ireland to reflect the unique economic, political, cultural and people-to-people links that exist.

"It is our aim, and it will continue to be in all of our interests, to emerge from the overall Brexit process with the closest possible relationship between the UK and the EU. This is particularly the case in the agri-food sector, where we see the highly integrated nature of trade between the UK and Ireland that has been built up over decades," Minister Creed said.

# CALL FOR 60KM SPEED LIMIT IN **GLENFLESK**

Cllr. John Sheahan has called on Kerry County Council to call on the TII to implement a 60km speed zone at Glenflesk Village as soon as possible.

The council replied:

The making of the Byte-laws is a reserved function but the council cannot make byelaws relating to a national road or a motorway without the prior written consent of the National Roads Authority (TII).

As part of the process in reviewing the speed limits for the cunty and preparing revised Bye-Laws, the Council has been actiely engaging with the TII on the proposed speed limits for the national routes. As advised to the members at the December 2017 meeting, briefings are being arranged in January for a presentation of the proposed changes to the speed limits in each Municipal District.

A proposal to apply a 60kph speed limit on the N22 at Glenflesk, is recommended by the TII. Following the briefings to the members, it is proposed to complete the drafing of the Bye

Laws by the end of March to allow for a statutory public consultation process to commence. The prescribed public consultation period is for 30 days, and subject to the level of submissions or objections received, the Council hopes to be in a position to bring the final draft to Council for consideration in June 2018.

# CAR LOAN OR PCP? HOW SHOULD YOU **FUND YOUR 2018 CAR PURCHASE?**

Consumers in Ireland are changing their cars more frequently than before and this trend is set to continue in 2018. The latest Carzone Motoring Report (2017) says that one in two people now change their car every five years, and 60% are planning on buying either a new or used car in 2018. With so many set on a new pair of wheels in the coming months, it's likely that a lot will struggle to decide between a traditional car loan or a Personal Contract Plan (PCP) to help finance the purchase.

For many, headline rates on PCP agreements can at first look more attractive, but these can easily distract from the range of additional charges and a good deal of inflexibility. Essentially PCPs are lease schemes. The buyer has in effect, hired the car for a particular period of time, usually 3-5 years, while they make payments. At the end of the agreement, they will have to make a balloon payment in order to own the car.

In addition, they will need to be conscious of the mileage they are racking up, because the balloon payment, or guaranteed minimum future value (GMFV), of the car will have been calculated with their annual mileage in mind. In contrast, with a credit union car loan, the consumer simply borrows the money to pay for a car, which they own immediately, and they can drive as much as they please. They can also sell the car on at any time they wish, should they need to, whereas they do not have



this option with a PCP.

Killarney Credit Union is reporting a recent increase in gueries about car loans, which could be down to weaker sterling fuelling the increase in cheaper used car imports from the UK, along with media coverage of the inflexible nature of PCPs.

"There appears to be a renewed interest in the traditional car loan due to greater flexibility and more straightforward terms and conditions" Helen Courtney Power continued. "We would encourage anyone considering buying a new or used car in 2018 to pop in or call us at Killarney Credit Union before making any decisions. We are happy to see all our members, no matter how long it has been, and of course we are always happy to chat to anyone who has never been a credit union member."

Speaking in more detail about the differences between car loans and PCPs, Helen Courtney Power, Business Development Officer, Killarney Credit Union said: "If you arrange finance with your credit union before going shopping for a car, you are in a much stronger position. You are effectively going as a cash buyer to the car dealer, and may well be able to negotiate a better deal. At Killarney Credit Union we offer a car loan with an APR rate of 7.8%\* and we also offer car insurance, through the credit union insurance website coveru.ie. Our loan is typically approved within 48 hours."

Killarney Credit Union has also put together a checklist for anyone considering a PCP agreement before they sign the dotted line:

- Be aware that to extend the term of a PCP you may be charged a rescheduling fee.
- Take note of the cap on the number of miles/ kilometres you are allowed to clock up over the period of the contract.
- You may be requested to commit to certain car servicing agreements.
- Ensure you always enquire about additional fees and charges, you are entitled to a list of all additional charges so ask the garage for this before you sign any agreement.

#### DIVERTICULAR DISEASE AND DIVERTICULITIS

#### What are Diverticulum (plural Diverticula)

Diverticula are small outpouches or pockets that can develop in the large intestine as we age. Many people will have a few scattered diverticula that don't cause any symptoms whatsoever and are found incidentally. When you have a large number of them or when they start to cause symptoms it is called Diverticular Disease. If they become acutely inflamed or infected you have Acute Diverticulitis.

Typically Diverticular disease can cause abdominal pain, often in the lower left side and worse after eating. It can be eased by passing stool or wind. You can feel bloated or complain of constipation alternating with diarrhoea or mucus in your stool. When a person develops Acute Diverticulitis the pain become more sharp and severe and can be associated with a temperature, nausea or vomiting and bleeding from the back passage and blood in the

- Age- as you get older the walls of your large intestine become weaker and the pressure of hard stools passing through your intestine can cause the little pockets to develop. Most people will have some diverticula by the time they are 80.
- · Poor fibre diet. Fibre has a stool softening effect which puts less pressure on the bowel wall.
- Smoking, Obesity, Ongoing constipation or frequent ibuprofen use also seems to increase your risk.
- · Genetics- having a close family relative, especially if under 50 increases your risk.

A blood test is unhelpful in diagnosing Diverticulitis but may be used to diagnose infection or out rule other illness like Coeliac Disease. A colonoscopy or a CT scan is required to confirm the presence of Diverticular Disease.

#### Treatment

#### Diet

Eating a high fibre diet can help ease the symptoms of Diverticular disease and prevent acute bouts of Diverticulitis. Fibre rich foods include fresh and dried fruit and vegetables, beans and pulses, nuts, cereals and brown starchy food. Gradually increasing your fibre and drinking plenty of fluids can prevent fibre side effects such as bloating and wind.

In acute Diverticulitis, especially if you have pain, diarrhoea, temperature or bleeding you are best to stick to a 'low residue' predominantly fluid based diet.

#### Medication

Paracetamol can be used to relieve pain. Avoid Aspirin or Ibuprofen due to the risk of stomach upset.


Antibiotics are used to treat Acute Diverticulitis. Often oral antibiotics suffice but occasionally the patient can require admission for IV Antibiotics.

Surgery is rarely required in the management of Diverticular Disease. In a young person with a high number of diverticulum they are usually centred in the Sigmoid colon. In this instance if the patient has frequent exacerbations they may be offered a Sigmoid Colectomy where that portion of the bowel is removed and the 2 open endings are attached to each other.

Fortunately Diverticulitis usually runs a benign /occasionally bothersome course for the patient but rarely causes serious complications. That said these can include a bowel perforation (bowel bursts) and need for an operation to make a colostomy (a bao).

Abscesses can develop from infection that doesn't settle as can fistulas where the bowel makes an abnormal connection with elsewhere in the abdomen.

Diverticular disease is not associated with nor does it cause bowel cancer.





TAKING CARE OF YOUR PETS IN COLD WFATHER:

All pets feel cold, be it a dog, cat, birds, rabbits, hamsters etc. It's better to protect them from being exposed to the chill, lest they catch cold. Ensure that you check before starting the car engine in case your cat or a stray dog or cat has snuggled under the cars. Cold cars pose significant risk to your pet's health. You're already familiar with how a car can rapidly cool down in cold weather; it becomes like a refrigerator, and can rapidly chill your pet. Pets that are young, old, ill, or thin are particularly susceptible to cold environments and should never be left in cold cars

\*If it's frosty when you are walking your dog, stay away from frozen ponds, lakes and other water. You don't know if the ice will support your dog's weight, and if your dog breaks through the ice it could be deadly.

If your pet is whining, shivering, seems anxious, slows down or stops moving, seems weak, or starts looking for warm places to burrow, get them back inside quickly because they are showing signs of hypothermia. Frostbite is harder to detect, and may not be fully recognised until a few days after the damage is done. If you suspect your pet has hypothermia or frostbite, consult your Vet immediately.

During walks, your dog's feet, legs and belly may pick up deicers, antifreeze, or other chemicals that could be toxic. When you get back inside, wipe down (or wash) your pet's feet, legs and belly to remove these chemicals and reduce the risk that your dog will be poisoned after (s) he licks them off of his/her feet or fur.

Odds are your pet will be spending more time inside during the winter, so it's a good time to make sure your house is properly pet-proofed. Use space heaters with caution around pets, because they can burn or they can be knocked over, potentially starting a fire and install carbon monoxide detectors to keep your entire family safe from harm.

### **HANDY HINTS:**

\*After you open the lid of a can, the easiest and safest way to pull the lid out is to use a small fridge magnet.

\*If you want egg in your instant noodles, crack one in while the noodles are part-cooked, and by the time they're done you'll have a perfectly cooked egg. It's a great way to add a little protein to a cheap and easy meal.

\*If you don't have a good food processor, grate your garlic, ginger, etc when a recipe calls for it to be finely chopped.

\*If you're using something sticky like black treacle or molasses, coat the spoon with vegetable oil beforehand so that the treacle will slide right off and it is so much easier to wash the spoon afterwards!

\*Don't throw your pasta water away. Use it to enhance the dish. Use it for thickening the sauces for your pasta, softening your veggies, and/or making a glaze on your meat for the pasta.

### A LONELY BLACK SWAN GOT A NEW **PARTNER:**

When Prince Albert died in 1861 at the age of 42, his wife, Britain's Queen Victoria never again wore anything but black in public. As another sign of mourning, she introduced black swans -

which are native to Australia and New Zealand - to a lake on the grounds of Rosenau Palace. Prince Albert's birthplace in central Germany. The tradition of keeping black swans there has continued to this day, and recently, a female black swan found herself in need of a new companion following the apparent death of her partner.

Caretakers posted a call for help on a German government website, requesting a black swan, of either sex, ideally over three years of age, as a new companion. A breeder in Ingolstadt, about two-and-a-half hours south of the palace, responded within days and provided a nine-month-old black swan to the palace and at present both swans are swimming happily on the lake.

Officials won't know the new swan's gender for more than two years, when it turns three. Though, as they said in the original ad, "The sex of the animal isn't important, we just wanted an end to the loneliness".

### IN ALBERTA THE WEATHER WAS TOO **CHILLY EVEN FOR PENGUINS:**

Penguins are generally recognisable for their tuxedo-like appearance and general inclination toward Antarctic conditions but they are having their outdoor time restricted by the Calgary Zoo in Alberta.

"We just don't want to expose them to too much," Malu Celli, a curator at the zoo said and to keep them safe, we decided to pick a limit to let them out.

The zoo keeps penguins indoors if the temperature dips below minus 25 degrees Celsius (minus 13 degrees Fahrenheit) and the temperatures have averaged minus 28 C since before January 1st, but it felt like minus 40 C with the windchill, they are not wild birds and do not live in their natural environment so that's too chilly even for these penguins Mr. Callis explained.

The Calgary Zoo hosts a range of penguins, rockhoppers including gentoos, Humboldts. It also has king penguins, the smaller cousins of emperor penguins. None of these species, however, are fans of Antarctic conditions and the king penguins prefer subantarctic temperatures.

### TAXATION OF PENSIONS

### Information

In general, all income arising from pensions in Ireland is subject to taxation. Many pensioners do not actually have to pay tax, because their income is too low.

Occupational pensions are not subject to social insurance contributions (PRSI) but if you are aged under 66, you may have to pay PRSI on other income. Occupational pensions are subject to the Universal Social Charge.

If you have a social welfare and occupational pension

There is no mechanism for taxing social welfare pensions at source. Your other source of income determines how tax is levied. The most common situation is where a pensioner (State Pension (Contributory) or Widow's/Widower's/Surviving Civil Partner's (Contributory) Pension) has both an occupational pension and a social welfare pension. If the occupational pension is paid from within Ireland, it is taxed by PAYE in the same way as a wage or salary. This means that you get your tax credits in the normal way. In order to tax your social welfare pension your annual tax credits are reduced by the tax liability on your social welfare pension. For higher incomes, the standard rate cut off point will also be reduced. You then effectively pay tax on both the pensions, but it is collected from the occupational pension. The same arrangement applies if you have income from a job and a social welfare pension. If your other source of income is not taxed on the PAYE system, for example if you

have an occupational pension from abroad or you have investment income, then you are classed as a self-employed person and your tax is payable annually by 31 October each year.




