

ollowing his inclusion as a beneficiary in the annual Ring

lan suffered damage to his neck and spine after falling from his bike while cycling with friends in the Muckross area of Killarney National Park, on August 16 last.

Money raised in the Ring of Kerry Cycle will be lodged to the Ian O'Connell Trust set up by the Spa Club. The fund, administered by three trustees, will help meet his ongoing needs and the cost of any necessary adaptations to his home.

Jim Gleeson, who spearheaded that campaign, said they were extremely grateful to the Ring of Kerry Cycle for making lan a beneficiary and urged as many cyclists as possible to take part in support.

"The Spa club's campaign was very generously supported. Like so many people, the organisers of the Ring of Kerry Cycle have also been moved by lan's story and we're now looking for as many fundraisers as possible to cycle on his behalf," Jim said.

He added; "Ian is inspirational, and his attitude is very positive. He's also in regular contact with his peers and this is invaluable to him."






Margaret is a full time carer for her mother, Eileen, who was equally






Dermot remarked: "This exposure is fantastic for Killarney and the Rally of the Lakes and it hugely increases our attraction as an international event for competitors and spectators to enjoy". The three-day event will begin with a ceremonial start in Killarney's town centre at 7pm on Friday 4th May. Plans are at an advanced stage to create a motorsport festival




USING YOUR PENSION TO PAY LESS TAX

Pension contributions provide a way of paying less income tax. Up to Revenue Limits, contributions to a pension qualify for relief from income tax. This effectively means that, where the higher rate of income tax is 40% and you are a higher rate taxpayer, a €100 contribution to a pension will only have a net cost to you of €60 (had you not made the contribution, the other €40 would have gone to the government as income tax).

Pensions carry another tax benefit: they grow free of tax, unlike deposit accounts in Banks etc (which are generally subject to tax on interest in the form of DIRT) or investment in property or shares (where rent or dividends are liable to income tax and gains in value are subject to Capital Gains Tax).

When pension benefits are drawn down, a Retirement Lump Sum can usually be taken either completely free of tax or subject to a beneficial rate. The rest of the benefit, usually taken in the form of a retirement fund or a pension for life, is taxable. However many people will find themselves in a lower tax bracket in retirement than when they were working and making pension contributions, and so will often not pay a lot of tax on their pension income when they retire.



We would like to thank David Rea, producer of Celtic Steps who visited the children and gave them great advice about setting up a business, our secretary Margaret and our parents who also gave great help and support. It has been a great learning experience for the children in how to develop a business. Plan your strategy for the weeks leading up to the State Exams

As exam candidates settle into school for the final weeks before the State Exams, they have already done a fair amount of work. Many exam candidates have worked diligently and consistently throughout the year. Others may have been less focussed and motivated as they travelled the road to next June's exams. But the fact remains that every exam candidate has a foundation of work, however solid or precarious, on which to build over the next few weeks. Efficient and careful use of the remaining time will be enough to get you safely over the finish line. No matter how little work you have done to date, you can still achieve a worthwhile result in your exam if you put your best effort into the final few weeks. It's also important to appreciate that you know a great deal more than you give yourself credit for.

The immediate priority now is to reassess your goals and make a plan of action for the run into the exam. The time for procrastination has well and truly passed. It's essential to have clear goals and an action plan to help you to be successful. If you are to achieve your academic goals they will have to be SMART – specific, measurable, achievable, realistic and timelined. Your focus must now be on your total readiness for next June's exams. Avail of all the help that is at your disposal during the next few weeks to ensure that you are in tip top shape for the challenge of the exams.

The subject teacher at school, who after all is the expert, will guide you through the last few weeks in revision, exam techniques and overall subject strategy. Attend school regularly during the final term and maintain a diligent work schedule to give yourself every possible chance of achieving your goals. Be clear in your own mind as to what exactly your goals

are. Have confidence in your ability to achieve them. Have a plan to accomplish your aim and, critically, execute your plan by doing the necessary work.

Carry out an honest review of your exam programme straight away. Make a decision about the level - higher, ordinary or foundation of the paper you will answer in each subject. Set a target grade in each subject to help motivate you. It's vital at this late stage to set realistic goals. For example, if you feel you may not be able for a higher level paper in a particular subject, are you not far better off taking an ordinary level paper in that subject where you may achieve a decent grade? Consider what you would like to do after the Leaving Cert exam. A singular determination to achieve enough points to get a place in your course of interest is a great motivator. Perhaps, your primary motivator should be to do yourself justice in the exam and to achieve results that reward your ability and effort. Having clear and focussed goals will make your last term more productive and rewarding.

Regard the next few weeks and the actual exam as a challenge that you will meet headlong and with determination. Approach it with confidence and belief in yourself. Take total control of your life and channel your energy in a positive direction. Every time you have a doubt or a negative thought about yourself replace it with a positive one. You will feel better about yourself if you are in control of your situation. To assume that control set aside some time to make out a plan of action. Decide what topics you need to revise between now and the exam. Make out an overall time schedule, a weekly schedule and a daily schedule. Make out that plan of action over the next few days so that

you will hit the ground running.

In the next article, I will take a detailed look at how best to implement the action plan.

GARDENING UTLOOK

FOCUS ON HANGING BASKETS

Using containers, pots and baskets full of summer bedding plants can give you brilliant colour from now right through the summer to early autumn.

There are a wide range of different types of hanging baskets but the main thing to go for is the size because the larger the basket, the more compost you can fit into it, giving the flowers more compost to grow in thus prolonging their lives. When filling a hanging basket the first thing to do is to place a liner at the base of the basket. Then place your basket on top of a pot as this will give you a steady base when planting. Half fill the basket with compost and a slow release fertilizer. Then plant some bedding plants at the base and sides of the basket such as trailing lobelia, pansies and nasturium. All you have to do is to push the root of the plant through the square in the basket, push it through the liner and into the compost. Then fill the basket almost to the top with compost, place your remaining plants around your chosen centerpiece plant such as a geranium or fuchsia. Pick three good trailing plants, like trailing petunia, geranium or fuchsia. Fill in between with other bedding plants such as begonias, busy lizzys or pansies. Some of the plants at the bottom of the basket may look a bit shook after planting but when watered in well they will look perfect in a few hours. Don't hang your basket out in its position for a couple of days after planting and water regularly.

Next week I will focus on filling window boxes and containers.

VAT THRESHOLDS

Value-Added Tax (VAT) registration is obligatory when the VAT thresholds are exceeded or are likely to be exceeded in any 12 month period (except for distance sales). If you are below the thresholds you may elect to register for VAT.

The principal thresholds are as follows:

- €37,500 in the case of persons supplying services only.
- €37,500 for persons supplying goods liable at the reduced or standard rates which they have manufactured or produced from zero rated materials.
- €35,000 for persons making mail-order or distance sales into the State.
- €41,000 for persons making acquisitions from other European Union Member States .
- €75,000 for persons supplying goods.
- €75,000 for persons supplying both goods and services where 90% or more of the turnover is derived from supplies of goods.
- A non-established person supplying taxable goods or services in the State is obliged to register and account for VAT irrespective of the level of turnover.

How is the threshold determined

The threshold is based on your turnover.

For the purposes only of deciding if you are obliged to register for VAT, the actual turnover may be reduced by an amount equivalent to the VAT borne on purchases of stock for re-sale.

HGV Operations and Enforcement of Drivers Hours Rules During the Current Animal Fodder Crisis

The Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport and the Road Safety Authority has agreed to a request from the Department of Agriculture, Food the Marine to continue implementing a pragmatic enforcement approach when reviewing drivers hours compliance applying to animal fodder transport until 30th April 2018. This approach will also be applied to drivers involved in the haulage of animal feed. For the purposes of transport of fodder and animal feed, the daily driving time limit must not exceed 11 hours (the current rule specifies 9 hours daily driving which may be extended to 10 hours but no more than twice a week).

During compliance inspections, the history of the driver's and operator's overall compliance with the rules will be carefully assessed to ensure that any deviation from the driving and resting time rules relates only to the carriage of animal fodder and animal feed.

Any deviation from the driving and resting time rules must be a last resort. HGV operators must put in place contingency measures to cater for emergency and urgent situations and this must be properly documented and retained for inspection. This should be agreed by operators and their drivers. From 1 May 2018, all drivers including those involved with transporting animal fodder and animal feed will be required



to demonstrate full compliance with the driving and resting time rules.

The requirement to take breaks after 41Ž2 hours driving and daily and weekly rest remains and will continue to be rigorously enforced.

Appropriate arrangements must be in place to record any extra driving time being undertaken by drivers in respect of the carriage of animal fodder and animal feed. Drivers must record on the back of their analogue tachograph charts

or digital tachograph print-outs the reasons why they are exceeding the prescribed limits as well as demonstrate that the carriage involved related to animal fodder or feed.

Driver safety or other road user's safety must not be compromised. Drivers should not be expected to drive whilst tired - employers remain responsible for the health and safety of their employees and other road users.



COMPANY MAKING SHIRTS AND BLOUSES OUT OF RECYCLED OCEAN PLASTICS

Stockholm-based fashion brand Gant has announced a new line of clothing made from ocean plastic waste. The company's "Beacons Project" is a line of shirts produced using upcycled plastic reclaimed from the oceans by fishermen in the Mediterranean.

The brand is partnering with fishermen to salvage some of the 165 million tons of plastic that are now floating in the oceans. Afterward, through a collaboration with the fibre brand Seaqual, the reclaimed plastic is upcycled into the yarn.

The "Beacons Project" line will consist of shirts for women and men and all of the garments will come in packaging also made from recycled materials.

DID YOU KNOW?

Working on computers, checking mobile phones and otherwise interacting with electronic devices is shown to place heavy demands on your brain's ability to focus and process information.

Researchers at the University of London investigated the effects of nature to rebalance this technological drain on our cognitive abilities. They took a group of adults hiking in the wilderness for 4 days where they were not allowed to use any technology whatsoever. They were asked to complete tasks that required creative thinking and complex problem solving before the trip, and again at the end. Their performance on the tasks improved by an impressive 50% after spending 4 tech-free days in nature.



Know Your Rights: RENEWING A PASSPORT

OUESTION

I have a valid passport, but it will expire two weeks before I go on holiday. Will two weeks give me enough time to get a new one?

ANSWER

You don't have to wait until your passport expires to renew it. However, if you apply for a new passport before your current one expires, your new passport is valid from when you apply, rather than from when your previous passport expires.

The website of the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade, dfa.ie, lists the current average processing times for different types of passport applications. The quickest way to renew your passport is by using the online application service. You can use this service to renew your passport if it expires any time in the next 12 months.

You must submit a digital photo with your online application. You can get a friend to take your photo with a digital camera or smartphone or you can go to a photo provider, for example a pharmacy or a photographer, who will give you a copy of your digital photo to upload. Alternatively, you can go to one of the Irish photo booth services listed on passportphoto.ie, which will take your photo and provide you with a code. If you enter this code when applying for your passport online, you don't need to upload the photo yourself.

Online renewal isn't available for children's passports, so if you want to renew your family's passports together, you have to use Passport Express, the postal application service. There is an extra charge of €9.50 per application for using Passport Express. However, if you are renewing passports for the whole family you can use the 'Family Application' option for €16, where up to four passport applications can be sent in one envelope. Alternatively, you can renew your own passport online and use Passport Express to renew any passports for children.

Sleep is as important to us as air, water and food. Anyone can suffer from insomnia, which can be frustrating, exhausting and depressing, affecting both our mental and physical health.

Different types of Insomnia:

- Transient insomnia which lasts for a short time period only, typically this can be associated with a stressful event e.g. an exam, a bereavement.
- Chronic insomnia lasting for several weeks, months or sometimes years

Signs of insomnia?

- Difficulty falling asleep common in young people
- Being a restless and light sleeper waking often, lying awake in the middle of the night. In younger people it may be associated with depression.
- Waking early and being unable to get back to sleep.
 Symptoms:

Feeling tired during the day, headaches, feeling irritable or finding it hard to concentrate. Here are some typical causes of insomnia:

- states of mind anxiety, depression, anger, grief, preoccupation with a future event e.g. a child's leaving certificate exams
- Change moving house, new job, end of relationship...
- Environment noise, jet lag...
- Pain
- Medical conditions heart, breathing, stomach, digestive, high blood pressure, arthritis, anorexia.
- Recreational drugs (e.g. hard drugs like LSD) –but this also includes nicotine, caffeine.
- Other prescription drugs including some contraceptives, diuretics, slimming pills, beta-blockers, stimulants.
 Suggestions: Consider...

Your Environment: You need a comfortable bed and a room that's quiet, not too cold or too warm and dark enough.

Your Lifestyle: Cut down on all stimulants. These include: coffee and tea, alcohol, nicotine, fizzy drinks, food additives, 'junk food', slimming pills or appetite suppressants. Try to avoid heavy, rich foods within two hours of bed. Get regular exercise. Aim for 30 minutes or more of daily activity, but not too close to bedtime. Avoid stimulating activity and stressful situations before bedtime. This includes vigorous exercise, big discussions or arguments, or catching up on work. Turn off screens one hour before bedtime. The light emitted from TV, tablets, smartphones, and computers suppresses your body's production of melatonin and can severely disrupt your sleep. Instead of using technology try listening to a book on tape, a podcast, or reading by a soft light.

Seek Professional Help

If you are still having trouble getting the sleep you need, a doctor or counsellor may be able to help. Seek professional help for insomnia if:

- Your insomnia doesn't respond to self-help as mentioned above.
- · Your insomnia is causing major problems at home, work, or school
- You're experiencing symptoms like chest pain or shortness of breath, (contact you General Practitioner immediately).
- · Your insomnia occurs almost every night and is getting worse
