

MEMORY TREE TO SPARKLE AT CHRISTMAS

The spectacular memory tree project that illuminated Killarney last Christmas is to be a fantastic feature in the town again during this year's season of goodwill. The project, undertaken by the Holy Cross Mercy National School, is a wonderful way for the public to remember deceased relatives and friends at a very special time of the year. The school will light up the festive season with a beautiful cluster of trees, on which 5,000 individual bulbs will sparkle, on the grounds of the school on New Road. The initiative, which is an important

fundraiser for the school, will see those who make a suggested donation of €5 for a light receiving a high-quality, inscribed memory card which they can send to the relatives of those in whose memory the bulbs will be lit. It will inform them that a light shines on the tree just as their memory shines on in the hearts of those that loved them and miss

them. The touching community initiative was devised last year by Rhonda Daly, a teacher at Holy Cross Mercy,. The official switching-on ceremony and carol recital will take place on Thursday, December 17 and at the school's annual Christmas Mass in St Mary's Cathedral the following day, the names of all those being commemorated will be brought to the altar. The tree will be lit nightly, between 6pm and 10pm, from December 17 to January 6. KERRY GROUP SUPPORT FOR NEW KERRY MOUNTAIN RESCUE TEAM LAND ROVER

Kerry Mountain Rescue Team [KMRT] have taken deliver of a new Landrover Defender thanks to the generousity of Kerry Group among others.

The group operate a fleet of 4 Land Rover Defender vehicles and these have proven to be best suited to accessing rugged, remote mountain tracks. The oldest of the vehicles was a 2003 model; a commercial model having capacity to carry no more than 2 persons and its operational usefulness was compromised to some degree. As Land Rover is discontinuing Defender production in 2015, KMRT decided to bring forward the scheduled upgrade of this 2003 vehicle.

While the Department of Transport, Tourism & Sport [DTTAS] had made available a one off capital grant of €200,000 to Mountain Rescue Ireland [MRI]; the final sharing of this sum among the 10 mountain rescue teams south of the border translated into a situation where not

all teams were able to raise the required level of co-funding for vehicle purchase – the most pressing agreed priority. KMRT along with some other groups decided to step back from the national purchase scheme to allow seven other teams the "wriggle room" to progress and purchase vehicles on this grant.

KMRT approached Kerry Group for support and they responded generously allowing – with the support and goodwill of other non statutory agencies – the purchase & fitting out, to required rescue standards, of a new Land Rover Defender. This vehicle was formally "launched" at Kerry Group headquarters in Tralee on Friday last

The generosity of Kerry Group allied with the broader community support from within Kerry has enabled progress, a progress that KMRT are delighted to publicly acknowledge & appreciate.

BISHOP LAUNCHES NEW BOOKLET

Planning a funeral is a difficult process that bereaved families have to endure.

With this in mind Bishop Ray Browne has just

launched "Celebrating the Funeral Liturgy", a resource for parishes and people preparing the funeral of a loved one. It is an amended version

of a resource used throughout the diocese. This new version contains an explanation of the Christian symbols used in the funeral liturgy, a wide selection of scripture readings and a variety of some "Prayer of the Faithful", as also a selection of appropriate hymns.

This booklet is very attractive because it is easy to use. It is of great help to bereaved families, giving them clear choices of scripture reading, prayers and hymns. Bishop Ray Browne said "that this booklet will be one of the most used publications in our diocese. Death touches all families and no matter how prepared we are for the death of a loved one, we are still searching for help and open to assistance during those difficult days. This publication will be a great resource for priests and for ministers in our parishes who support the bereaved."

O'FLAHERTY MEMORIAL FOR VATICAN CI

Plans are well advanced to erect a memorial to Monsignor Hugh O'Flaherty within Vatican City on May 8th 2016, the 71st anniversary of the end of the war in Italy.

Monsignor Hugh lived in the Teutonic College (German College) within the Vatican City from 1938 to 1960. It was from his apartment within the College that he ran the Rome Escape Line organisation, helping to secure the safety of some 6500 people during WW2.

To coincide with this planned unveiling, a 3rd O'Flaherty Rome Tour is being organised from May 5th to 9th 2016. As usual, the tour will include visits to all of the important O'Flaherty related sites in Rome as well as other major Roman historic sites. The trip will also include a Mass in the Crypt of St Peter's and an optional visit to the Vatican Museums and the Sistine Chapel.





Santa has informed the Christmas in Killarney committee that there is still time to make the nice list if you are on your best behaviour for December.



SOUTH KERRY V LEGION

Killarney Legion and South Kerry return to Fitzgerald Stadium to renew acquaintances in Sunday's Garvey's Supervalu Kerry SFC Replay (throw-in 2.30pm). This is the 19th occasion since 1890 that the Kerry SFC final has gone to a replay which is also the first consecutive replay in the history of the competition which dates back to 1889.

A lot of comment has been made as to the staging of the concluding rounds of Kerry's premier GAA competition so late in the year. Surely, there is a much better way of handling these games which are so important to both the clubs and the divisional sides.

The suggestion by Padraig Duffy to bring the All-Ireland football finals forward to the start of September in order to facilitate the early conclusion of club championships is a proposal GAA fans from all over the County will converge on Fitzgerald Stadium to witness both Killarney Legion and South Kerry renew combat.

The drawn game was notable for the remarkable statistic that of the combined scoring tally of 18 points, 13 from the four midfielders. Of the 12 forwards that started, just two made the scoresheet, Legion's James O'Donoghue.

Both respective managers Peter Keane and John Sugrue are hoping that their forward divisions will produce a much better scoring dividend next Sunday.

This will be Killarney Legion's third consecutive Sunday in action, as they have played a Munster Club semi-final against Nemo Rangers in between their two County Finals, while South Kerry's Bryan Sheehan has played on 10 consecutive weekends since the All-Ireland

In the drawn encounter, Legion's Conor Keane, normally a lethal marksman in front of goal, was well held, while James O'Donoghue was shackled by his Kerry team mate Killian Young. Killian Young will almost certainly pick up O'Donoghue on Sunday and their clash will have a major say on the eventual destination of the trophy.

Bryan Sheehan's influence was very important in the drawn game as he was South Kerry's principal scoring threat. Sheehan is big, strong and accurate. What more could you ask from a player who is at the peak of his career.

Legion's lack of discipline against Nemo Rangers cost them dearly and was also evident against South Kerry in the drawn game.



BRAVE GER'S JOURNEY TO SUCCESS

WHEELCHAIR ATHLETE GER DALY TELLS THE KILLARNEY OUTLOOK ABOUT HIS AMAZING JOURNEY....

Runners in Kerry are getting behind Ger's bid to buy a new purpose built sports wheel chair by holding a fundraising run in the Killarney National Park on Sunday December 6th at 2pm. Register on the day at The Play Park on Port Road. Entry fee is €10 and there will be tea and coffee afterwards in the Towers Hotel along with some Craic agus Ceol.

PART TWO:

So it was that around this time I embarked on that VERY short push that I mentioned at the beginning. I planned to push myself to a neighbour's house and back, a round trip of about 400 metres. I didn't make it. I got home after about fifteen minutes with my tail between my legs. As I was unemployed at the time I was able to dedicate a lot of time to trying to get fit and persistence eventually paid off and I got to a point where I was pushing myself to the nearest town land and home again, a distance of about 8 or 9 kilometres, maybe two or three days a week. I was lucky in that I lived right on a four-cross roads and each road offered varying degrees of difficulty so I was able to try one road for a few months until I started to find it too easy and then move on to travelling on another road. All of this was done using my regular everyday wheelchair, which at that time I had already owned for nine years. I weighed myself weekly, usually on a Thursday, and in early August 2013 I took a major step in my evolution. I travelled the forty-four kilometres to Annascaul to participate in my first ever 5km road race, using my everyday wheelchair. I completed it in approximately fifty-seven minutes and followed it up with the best-tasting lunch ever in Tom Crean's pub, The South Pole Inn. Celebrating the beginning of my adventure in the home of another adventurer! I even had dessert, my reward for the effort I had put in! I reached my goal of fourteen stone in May 2013, having lost four stone in nine-and-a-half months. I then reassessed my target and decided to aim for twelve stone, simply because if I reached that point I would have lost one-third of my body weight, which I thought would be a pretty cool thing to be able to say! I achieved this is May 2014, after twentyone months of hard graft. I had been using the athletics track at the An Riocht Athletics Club in Castleisland on-and-off for exercise and through my use of their facilities I started to become aware of other fun-run and road race events around the county. I have competed in

road races held by An Riocht over the last two years, as well as the Feet First and Gneeveguilla Athletic Club's 5k series. At the beginning of 2015 I had completed twenty-three races in seventeen months and as the year progressed I set myself a goal of doubling this tally and having forty-six races completed by the end of the year. Unfortunately it looks like I may just fail to achieve this as some of the events I had planned to compete in have recently been postponed. At the time of writing, I have now completed forty races, including four 10ks, and I completed my first 10-miler in Killarney in late September in just over two hours. My exercise regime has tailed off significantly since I went through the process of trying to lose six stone and, as I am now working and don't have as much free time for exercise as I used to, I am now doing one 5km push per week, as well as any races that I take part in. However, my hope is that a wheelchair that is designed for racing will encourage me to put more effort into it again, as it will make it far easier than using a twelve year old chair that was not designed to be used for exercising. Considering that I have completed a 10-miler in the chair I am currently using I would be hoping that using a specialist racing chair will broaden my options in terms of the length of races I could compete in.

FLAT TYRES

Continued:

BEFORE LIFTING THE CAR

- 1. Plan the job so that the vehicle is raised for the minimum amount of time.
- 2. Switch off the engine and turn on the hazard
- 3. Apply the handbrake and engage first gear (or 'P' if an automatic).
- 4. Chock the road wheel diagonally opposite the one to be replaced.
- 5. Remove the spare from the boot/carrier a carrier under the vehicle may be rusty and difficult to move.
- 6. Lay the spare on the ground where it will be convenient for fitting.
- 7. Remove the wheel trim (if fitted) you may have to cut cable ties and/or lever the trim off.
- 8. Place the iack in the recommended lifting point closest to the wheel to be removed. Ensure that the jack head engages correctly (as shown in the handbook) and extend the jack until it just starts to lift the car on its springs. Don't lift the car any further yet.
- 9. Slacken off the wheel nuts/bolts (most turn anti-clockwise to undo) using the vehicle's

wheel brace and locking wheel-nut adapter if required. (There might be a protective cover over locking wheel nuts).

10. Keep your back straight and body weight evenly distributed on both feet. Apply effort downward and in a controlled way so that when the nut finally 'breaks' you won't lose your balance or fall over. You can achieve greater efficiency by applying controlled effort through the foot, but only if you can support your upper body.

PART TWO LIFTING THE CAR

Raise the jack to lift the vehicle sufficiently so that the wheel is just clear of the ground.

Remove the slackened wheel nuts/bolts while keeping the wheel in position on the hub using a knee or toe - leave the top one until last so that both hands are free to lift the wheel away from the hub.

FITTING THE SPARE

Fitting the spare is the reverse of the removal procedure - secure the wheel by refitting the

top bolt/nut first, and tighten all the nuts by hand first in stages and in a diagonal sequence. Don't oil the bolts/nuts before refitting them, as this will make them more likely to work lose. Carefully lower the wheel to make contact with the ground before fully tightening the wheel nuts - again in diagonal sequence.

Stow the damaged wheel safety. Replace it in the carrier or boot well.

AND FINALLY

If the spare is a temporary-use 'skinny' spare, note any restrictions on use - they're typically limited to 50mph and should be replaced with a normal tyre as soon as possible. Some dashboard lights may come on while a space saver spare is used because systems like ABS, traction control and some automatic gearboxes can be upset by odd tyre sizes.

- check/adjust the pressure in the 'new' tyre as soon as possible
- get the wheel nuts tightened to the correct torque figure as soon as possible
- replace or repair the damaged tyre as soon as possible.

WINTER BREAKDOWNS

CAR PROBLEMS CAUSED BY EXTREME COLD

Battery faults are far and away the most common cause of breakdowns at this time of year but such extreme weather throws up some unusual types of breakdown as well.

FROZEN SCREEN WASHERS: Not really a breakdown, unless you keep running the pump until it burns out and blows a fuse affecting something like the immobiliser system! Use a screenwash additive all year round - undiluted in winter.

FROZEN WIPERS: Trying to operate windscreen wipers stuck solid to the glass can lead to blown fuses affecting other more vital systems. If low temperatures are forecast make sure that automatic windscreen wipers are turned off – so they don't try to operate when you turn the ignition on. Make sure the wipers aren't stuck to the glass, before setting off too. **FROZEN ENGINES:** Due to lack of anti-freeze. Make sure you get it checked regularly and topup using a mix of the correct type of anti-freeze. Stripped teeth on cambelt causing engine

damage. Try to start a car with a frozen waterpump and you could strip the teeth off the timing belt leading to expensive internal engine damage.

FROZEN DOOR LOCKS AND DOOR SEALS:

A squirt of a water-dispersant like WD40 in the locks will help as will a light smear of Vaseline or silicone polish on the door seals. If snow falls clear it from the car while still soft rather than leaving it for days on end – the car will turn into a block of ice.

FROZEN IGNITION LOCKS: It's hard to keep the inside of the car completely dry when it's cold and wet outside but it'll help avoid this rare but annoying problem - don't leave wet clothes or boots in the car overnight.

WINDOWS FROZEN TO THEIR FRAME:

Windows can become detached from the mechanism inside the door if you try to power them down while the windows frozen in the frame. Best left until the car's warmed up and the ice melted.

ELECTRONIC PARKING BRAKE NOT RELEASING: If the driven wheels are on an icy road and can't grip it's possible that an automatic parking brake won't release.


FROZEN REAR DRUM BRAKES AND HANDBRAKE CABLES: It's good to clean your car regularly through the winter to remove corrosive road salt but not if you use a hose or pressure washer and blast water inside brake cables or drums and the temperature drops. A drive after cleaning can help but it's best to take care when hosing wheel arches or wheels. FROZEN ALTERNATORS: Fortunately very rare, but poor design of under-bonnet drains can lead to water from the windscreen getting into the alternator and freezing the rotor. A screaming noise from the 'fanbelt' accompanied by smoke, a burning smell and a battery warning light on the dash will tell you there's something wrong.



EMPLOYEE VOUCHERS - TAX FREE



The Minister for Finance confirmed this month that the Government's small benefits relief the Benefit In Kind allowance - will be increased from €250 to €500 in time for Christmas 2015. This gives businesses the ability to reward their employees up to €500 in non-cash benefits (e.g. vouchers) completely free of PAYE, USC and PRSI.

The important criteria to be aware of is that it must be a once-off annual payment. For example you cannot give one voucher for €100 and later give a second voucher for €150.

Know Your Rights:

ENFORCING EMPLOYMENT RIGHTS

What are the new employment rights structures? How can I make a complaint about my employer?

ANSWER

Since 1 October 2015, the organisations involved in employment rights enforcement are the Workplace Relations Commission and the Labour Court.

The Workplace Relations Commission (WRC) is where all complaints are first made. All hearings are now heard by a single WRC adjudicator. The Labour Court deals with all workplace relations appeals, so you may appeal to it against the decisions of an adjudicator.

If you wish to make a complaint about breaches of employment legislation you must use the online complaint form available on workplacerelations.ie. You use the same form to make complaints about breaches of equal status legislation. However, for equal status complaints, you must first (in writing) notify the person or organisation that you are complaining about that you plan to lodge a complaint against them.

When you fill out the form you will be asked for contact and other details for yourself and your employer. You will be asked to indicate the general area in which the complaint falls (for example, pay, hours of work and so on). Then you will be asked to select the nature of the complaint. For example, under pay it may be non-receipt of a payslip. You will be asked for some other details. You will need to set out your complaint in your own words. When you have completed the form you can submit it electronically to the Workplace Relations Commission.

You can read a list of frequently asked questions about making a complaint on workplacerelations.ie.

If you need information about employment law and your employment rights you can contact the Workplace Relations Commission's Information and Customer Service.

EALING WITH EPRESSION



streaming through our minds which in turn can impact on how we feel and how we behave. These thoughts can be friendly positive thoughts or hostile, critical and negative ones. It makes sense therefore

that we would try to reduce the negative ones as much as possible. Just as we wouldn't allow any stranger to just enter our house and take over, we need to be just as vigilant with our thoughts. We need to take more control over what we allow into our minds and what we prohibit from entering. We have much more choice than we realise – and therefore rather than just reacting to every thought we begin to take more control over our mind. Slowly we begin to realise that just because we think something it doesn't mean it's true!

By examining our thoughts as they flow through our mind, we begin to increase our awareness of how our minds are focused. Then we begin to allow these thoughts – whether they are positive or negative, exciting or boring – to just flow through our mind stream without reacting or responding. This is the basis of mindfulness.

For many people experiencing depression they can create an endless cycle of 'If onlys' and 'what ifs' in their mind. There is an underlying non-acceptance of the past as they constantly think how their lives would be different 'If only I hadn't taken his advice', 'If only I hadn't behaved in that way'. This all leads to feelings of anger, hopelessness and mistrust of others. Accepting how things are right now- not as we wish they were, but as they actually are - is quite a radical step. It can however mark the starting point from which we can come to terms with past events and begin to move forward. Just as there are many paths leading to feeling depressed, there are also many routes out of it. We don't get depressed as a result of an adverse event or experience - but in how we respond to it. When our emotional needs go unmet this can lead to considerable mental distress and depression. If we were to consider depression as a means of drawing our attention to an underlying problem, we must ask ourselves what is the message my feelings of depression are trying to tell me. Counselling can provide a great support as we explore what this underlying message might be. Counselling helps to find contentment and peace of mind through fostering a healthy, non-judgemental, loving relationship with oneself. Next week we will continue to look at ways we can deal with depression.







U.N. LAUNCHES APP TO FEED THE HUNGRY

Your pocket change could help to end world hunger - but the traditional model of soliciting donations by mail means that what amounts to a daily donation of 50c doesn't cover the cost of stamps and paper.

Instead of costly letters, return envelopes, and stamps, a new app called Share the Meal is billing itself as the first mobile crowd funding app to end global hunger. U.N. leaders hope to use this low-overhead means to help Syrians fleeing the current conflict and other refugees in the future. The free app is available for iOS and Android.

As the app mentions upon login, "Smartphone users outnumber hungry children by 20 to 1," and its goal isn't just to get people to help feed hungry children via the World Food Programme - first in Lesotho and, once the funding goal is met there, other hunger-ravaged countries - but to get people to give and keep giving

Test runs in Germany, Austria, and Switzerland gathered 120,000 users to donate the equivalent of 1.7 million daily rations to children in Lesotho.

SAVING THE UNICORN

While some freshwater resources are obtained naturally, through seasonal streams and pools, communities in arid regions extract water more frequently through artificial means: wells, dams, underground aquifers and, more recently, desalination plants. Freshwater resources are depleting rapidly with the rise of the human population. "Saudi Arabia's water demand has increased from 2.3 million cubic meters in 1980 to 30 million cubic meters in 2000" due to increases in population and development (National Commission for Wildlife Conservation and Development, Saudi Arabia 2005). As of 2011, the United Arab Emirates became the second largest producer of desalinated water in the world, pumping a total of roughly 1.7 billion cubic meters per year.

Still experimental in much of the world, solar powered desalination plants are already being used by countries in the Middle East for habitat rehabilitation and irrigation. Abu Dhabi has installed a series of 30 many of which were built at Arabian oryx (Oryx leucoryx) reintroduction sites, as part of a pilot project. Before the mammals are released, the desalination plants help rehabilitate the landscape by producing watering holes and vegetation that provides food and shade for the animals.

The Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi created an Arabian oryx habitat rehabilitation project to reintroduce the vulnerable species into protected areas in Abu Dhabi. The conservation project occurred between 2007 and 2012, with 100 individuals released per year for five years into large sanctuaries. This species of oryx had been hunted to extinction in the wild by 1972 for its horns.

The oryx is one of the largest mammals in the Arabian Desert, and its natural range extends across the Arabian Peninsula. This species, adept at enduring temperatures of over 100 degrees Fahrenheit (37 degrees Celsius), can survive for weeks on the water gleaned from dew and vegetation by reducing its metabolism and water loss. It is believed to be the model for the mythical unicorn because, if viewed a certain way, the horns appear to come together as one, resembling a unicorn horn. For decades, however, drought, groundwater extraction, and overgrazing of livestock have damaged the oryx's desert potentially habitats. jeopardising rehabilitation effort.

THE WORLD'S MOST LOYAL DOG



Decades have passed since a dog named Hachiko's incredible story of love and loyalty came to an end and slipped into the realm of legend. But now a new photograph of the faithful dog has been discovered — offering a rare glimpse at his heart breaking vigil for a fallen friend.

Hachiko's story dates back to 1920s Toyko, where every morning he accompanied his owner, Ueno, to the train station to see him off to work. Afterward, without fail, the dog would then sit patiently until the end of the day to greet him upon his return.

This routine continued until 1925 when, sadly, Ueno died unexpectedly at his office — leaving Hachiko waiting, watching the trains for a reunion that would never come. Days turned to weeks, and weeks into months, with no sign of his owner, but still Hachiko refused to leave the spot without him.

For the next 10 years, the loyal dog held vigil at the station, earning the sympathy of passersby until his own death in 1935.

Few photos exist to put a face to the dog's legendary show of loyalty, which makes the recent release of a previously unseen photograph of Hachiko, taken around 1934, all the more significant for folks around the world who have been touched by his story.

MARGARET'S RAMBLINGS

In it, Hachiko is seen resting on the ground in front of the train station, scanning the faces of passersby in hopes of spotting his owner's among them. His eyes look visibly tired after what then would have been nearly 10 years of waiting, but there's still a palpable sense of hope behind them.

In the 80 years since Hachiko's death, he's come to be known as "the world's most loyal dog." Over the decades, interest in his story has yet to wane, with Hachiko making numerous appearances in popular culture, including the 2009 film "Hachi: A Dog's Tale," starring Richard Gere.

Although Hachiko never did see his owner again in this life, a statue unveiled this year has symbolically reunited the pair forever, standing as a fitting testament to the depths of love dogs have for their humans.

THE ROW BOT

The goal of the team of academic researchers in Bristol was to create a machine that could forage, like a wild animal, so it wasn't dependent on humans to constantly recharge it.

The result is the row-bot, which paddles about on the surface of water, funneling waste and pollution into its bacteria-rich stomach and receiving electrical power in return. It's self-sufficient, made to bob in the sea and eat tiny bites of waste until there's nothing left.

For flotation, the machine has four little stabilizers. To move, there are two paddles in the middle of its body, which have flexible flipper joints to make sure they move efficiently and minimise drag. Powering the row-bot is a bacteria-filled fuel cell. In the cell, bacteria digest organic waste, and produce carbon dioxide as a by-product, as well as the protons and electrons needed to get the electrical circuit in the cell flowing.

103 YEAR OLD WOMAN TAKES CARE OF THE UNWANTED

When Fannie finds a hungry stray cat meowing at her door, she doesn't hesitate to help. Though Fannie is 103 years old, she takes a lively interest in caring for animals.

Fannie lives in a rural area and cats that have been dumped or don't have humans to care for them wander up to her home, where she feeds and cares for them. Her big heart knows no bounds, all are welcome at Fannie's house and throughout their lives, Fannie is dedicated to caring for her cats like family.

BEING POOR IS EXPENSIVE

One of the most frustrating causes of the perpetuation of poverty is poverty itself. This

is because just being poor is expensive. While it might seem simply logical that when you're poor, you'll buy things that are cheaper, there are many instances in which the fact that you're poor raises the price that you have to pay. The most obvious example is your bank account. Many banks charge fees if you do not have enough money in your account. Many people who are strapped for cash end up overdrawing their accounts, for which they are hit with overdraft fees. Often, if an individual overdraws too often, or is unable to pay back the money with the additional fee, the bank will close the account. This makes it very difficult to open an account somewhere else. It might seem simple to avoid spending money you don't have, and never overdraw on your account. But when you're struggling to make ends meet, not overdrawing your account might mean not buying groceries, or the overdue electricity bill, or for car repairs.

If you don't repair your car, you might not be able to get to work. But paying for your car means overdrawing your account, which could leave you without a bank account. Making these kinds of choices can seem nearly impossible, and this is exactly what is so difficult about poverty.

A quarter of households in poverty do not have convenient access to the internet. Internet access isn't cheap, so this is understandable, but the internet can be very useful for educating oneself, finding new jobs, and finding the cheapest prices for the things one wants to buy. Though there's usually internet access at a local library, this hardly matches the exceptional benefit it is to have access to the internet from home.

False economies also pose particular challenges for the poor. A "false economy" is an action that seems like the frugal choice at first, but over time reveals itself to be more expensive than viable alternatives. Some cheap clothes fall squarely in this category; and inexpensive shirt may begin to fray at the seams in just a month or two, which requires you to purchase a new shirt. Had you spent more money on the clothes initially, you would have saved money in the long run.

It's important to note, however, that those choices aren't necessarily made out of ignorance. Sometimes, you can't avoid false economies because you just don't have enough money on hand to buy the more expensive option.

Hopefully, if we understand the structural forces the keep people impoverished, we will stop blaming the poor for not figuring out an ingenious way to escape poverty, and recognize that sometimes everyone needs a hand up.

295 BEARS KILLED IN JUST 2 DAYS

Florida's first bear hunt in 21 years, which was supposed to last for a week in late October, was cut short by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission after just two days of hunting killed 295 bears across the state. Black bear hunting had been banned in the state since 1994. This year, the hunt suddenly was allowed to start again so Florida can supposedly "manage" its bear population, but

some people point out the state doesn't even have an up-to-date count of what exactly that population is: The latest statewide tally, according to one columnist, occurred 13 years ago.

Floridians against the black bear hunt gathered at the Marathon Community Park in early November to pay respect for the black bear that were slaughtered late last month.

GOOD NEWS

The Netherlands is the world's fourth-largest producer of mink fur. The country has 160 fur farms that raise about 6 million minks per year. Animal rights groups have long argued that these farms are cruel and unsafe. Reports from People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals say the mink are crowded into small, confined cages where they have little ability to move. Mink are solitary animals that normally have ranges of hundreds of miles in the wild. Confined minks often go cage mad, pacing endlessly and mutilating themselves, according to activists. Animals are often poisoned or electrocuted to kill them without damaging their fur.

The Dutch senate agreed with animal rights groups and banned the industry in 2012 after discussing the issue for 13 years. At the time mink farms were given until 2024 to phase out their operations. Farmers were offered 28 million euros to compensate for the transition. Fur farmers sued, and the courts overturned the law in 2014.

Last week's appeals court ruling placed the law back on the books. The industry will still have until 2024 to close down.

The Dutch fur industry has vowed to appeal the ruling to the country's highest court but hopefully, the business of raising thousands of mink to slaughter and make into fur coats is at and end in Holland.


MEATLOAF RESCUED A PUPPY FROM BEHIND A DUMPSTER


