TOWN TURNS BLACK AND AMBER AS DR CROKES WIN 11TH SFC TITLE

The town of Killarney turned black and amber a on Sunday last when Dr Crokes clinched the Garveys Supervalu Senior Football Championship crown on Sunday last with a seven point victory (2-16 to 1-12) over divisional side Kenmare District at a very wet Fitzgerald Stadium Killarney on Sunday last.

Hundreds marched through the town to celebrate the win.

With experienced players of the calibre of Eoin Brosnan, Ambrose O'Donovan, Colm Copper and Brian Looney in their ranks they had the perfect mix of youth and experience in abundance and they controlled the game for long periods. In contrast, their opponents were young and inexperienced at this level of football and while they brought a breath of fresh air to this year's championship with

their youthful enthusiasm that endeared them to many football followers, in the tough conditions that prevailed on Sunday last they were always going to be up against it, against a side, over a dozen of whom, had featured in the 4-in-row winning sides of 2010 to 2013. The winners had many fine performances on the day with Colm Cooper in particular delighting the attendance with an overall display of class that brightened up a dark afternoon. Cooper was afterwards named the Garvey's Supervalu Man of the Match, an accolade he also won back in 2010 at the start of the 4-in-a-row odyssey. Kenmare District, while not managing to secure the ultimate prize, can look back with pride on their performances in this year's championship. Their refreshing style of play was a shot in the arm to the game of football in the county and they will know that success at this level will only come with experience. They coped admirably with the burden of having to prepare for finals at senior and intermediate level and there is certainly a bright future ahead for this talented group of players.

So Dr Crokes move up to third in the Roll of honour on 11 titles one ahead of John Mitchels and one behind Laune Rangers and Austin Stack who are joint top.

KENYA KEEPS CALLING FOR EDDIE

After another successful year of fundraising and volunteering in the village of EmbulBul Kenya, Eddie Sheehy, founder of the Kenya Education Project has returned home after another action packed trip.

Speaking to the Killarney Outlook Eddie said that without the support of the people of Killarney the work he does would not be possible. "I would like to thank everyone who generously supported the project again this year. The annual table quiz, Church appeal, schools support and individual and business donations continue to help the project to work among poor families in the village of EmbulBul", he said.

This year the project was able to support 50

young people through school sponsorships, paying their school fees and ensuring they receive a hot meal each day. This year some past pupils returned to Brother Beausang school to share their experiences with final year students. Their accounts of struggles to achieve an education were truly inspiring. "One boy, Christantus was 14 years old in first class in primary school, persevered with his studies and now at the age of 28 is in second year of teacher training college", Eddie said.

Some past pupils are being sponsored to pursue further education and will hopefully gain employment to provide much needed support to their struggling families.

"Visiting the homes of the poor and marginalised is a central part of the work of volunteers who visit Kenya. We see at first hand the harsh, challenging living conditions families face in trying to feed and educate their offspring. Shoes, baby clothes, adult clothes were given to needy families as well as financing the purchase of beds for 4 families living in terrible overcrowded conditions. On each visit a food parcel containing rice, biscuits and maize flour was donated to families and young children. This work is organised by local SVDP volunteers who do Trojan work in supporting the marginalised", he added.

In February, Killarney footballer Ambrose O'Donovan spent a month working in the primary school helping with PE classes and coaching of school teams.

In July volunteers Sharon Courtney and Denise Collins purchased new school uniforms

and shoes for a large number of primary school students and paid school fees for some deserving families which helped ease their financial burdens. In September Katie O'Connell spent time visiting the parish feeding programme as well as volunteering in the school. At the feeding programme she befriended many of the children and listened to sad life stories from orphans, children with HIV and children of single parents. The project is financing the purchase of a new wood burning stove which will help in the preparation of food each day as well as conserving supplies of timber which cook the large containers of maize and beans.

To all who help and support the project each year thank you for your continued support and generosity Asante Sana.

more money be given to provide extra Home Help hours to assist elderly people who want to remain in their homes for as long as possible. I asked that money be allocated to open the closed ward in Kerry University Hospital to curb the trolley crises. I also asked that the new mental health facility in St. Margarets Road Deer Lodge Killarney be opened and staffed and that the closed wards in Kenmare and Dingle Community Hospitals be opened.

I also highlighted my disappointment that the Macroom Bypass Programme has been bypassed again as it is vital that we get this programme under way to attract investment into Kerry and for all those travelling from Kerry to Cork for employment and for access to primary health care.

I am also very disappointed that no funding has been provided for Local Improvement schemes.

HSE MEETING

Deputy Danny Healy Rae & Cllr Johnny Healy Rae are having a meeting with the HSE on this Friday morning the 21st October asking that the same services for the people who attend Lantern Lodge will be provided at the new facility at Leewood House which is opening in the next few weeks, we have asked continuously that meals, shower facilities, etc., will be made available at Leewood House but to date the HSE have failed to agree to these requests, Lantern Lodge and the staff gave an excellent service to all the people who attending there back over the years and it is not acceptable if the same care and facilities will not be provided in Leewood House.

DENTAL WAITING LISTS FOR CHILDREN

Nationally there are 15,014 children waiting to be assessed for Dental Treatment and 24,283 are awaiting treatment following on from being assessed

In a recent Dail Question Deputy Michael Healy Rae asked the Minister for Health how many children are currently on the waiting list for Dental treatment in Kerry and Nationally. In his reply the Minister confirmed there are currently 150 children waiting to be assessed for treatment in Kerry and 15,014 nationally.

The below is a table the Minister has issued to show how many children are waiting for treatment following on from assessment In County Kerry.

Orthodontic waiting list Less than 6 months - 20

6-12 months - 34 12-24 months - 55

Greater than 24 months - 197

Deputy Michael Healy Rae states that this is a disgrace that children have to wait this long for treatment. He states " everyday I get calls from parents saying how upset they are that their children have to wait so long but they cannot afford to go privately and it is heartbreaking to think of children being upset and embarrassed about their teeth. It is ridiculous that the average waiting time for routine orthodontic treatment is currently less than 4 years".

As part of a waiting list initiative for patients waiting up to four years for orthodontic treatment, the HSE has undertaken a procurement of orthodontic services with a

number of private service providers nationally.

The HSE is committed to offering a transfer of treatment from the HSE to private service providers, for those patients who have been waiting the longest. Therefore those MICHAEL HEALY-RAE TD. patients who have been



waiting over four years have been contacted first, followed by those waiting three years or more. This initiative commenced in April 2016 and they are currently working on 2012 list.

John Quinn who has had a lifelong interest in birds and is Professor in Zoology at UCC. After researching oyster catchers and roseate terns in Dublin Bay in the late 1980s as a young student, John worked at the Wildfowl and Wetlands Trust in the UK Slimbridge, an organization that was set up by Peter Scott to promote the conservation of wildfowl and their habitats. He did his PhD at Oxford on the remarkable relationship between red-breasted geese and birds of prey like the snowy owl in the Russian Arctic. At Oxford John became increasingly interested in understanding how predators affect the behaviour of birds, and of the role that personality and intelligence plays in determining how individuals survive in the wild. John moved back to Ireland in 2012 where he began to study puffins and shearwaters around the Irish coast. Recently his team deployed 400 nest boxes on the Muckross peninsula in Killarney, which he hopes will reveal a fascinating insight into the life of small birds in one of Ireland's most iconic woodlands

10 IMPORTANT HOME SECURITY TIPS

Harney LockSillins Simply installing a home alarm system doesn't automatically mean you should ignore security in your home.

- A good test is to lock yourself out of the house and try to get back in (without a key). If you can do it, then there is no doubt that a professional or even an unprofessional burglar will be able to also.
- Dogs act as a great deterrent to burglars. While security is not a good enough reason to get a dog, if you actually like dogs it is always an option.
- Install lights in all outside entrances. You could consider sensor lighting but make sure it's not the type that switches on every time someone walks by your house. It can be annoying and have no impact if it is always switching on and off.
- 4. If you are out and about in the evening time, always leave a light or two on to make it look like someone is home. An unlit house with no car in the driveway is an open invitation to thieves. It's also a good idea to leave the radio on.
- When you buy new appliances such as a flat screen TV, dispose of the packaging carefully. Don't leave the box outside your house. You may as well put up "rob me" sign.
- Close all curtains when your holiday home is unoccupied. If you are away, then get a friend or neighbour to do this each evening.
- Don't leave any valuables such as cash or jewellery lying around or hidden in obvious places. Make sure they are securely stored. Always take photos of valuable jewellery for insurance purposes. Ensure you have adequate insurance cover for valuables.
- Use of gravel on your driveway or pathways to your property can act as a deterrent to burglars. Always keep hedges and shrubbery well clipped as they can act as a hiding place for burglars.
- 9. Try to stay on good terms with your neighbours as they are more likely to look out for you and your property. You should also give a spare key to a trusted neighbour rather than "hiding" it under a doormat or a potted plant in the garden.
- Ensure that all doors and windows have strong locks. This is especially important for patio doors, which are notoriously easy for burglars to access.







a. There is a "sensor" in our brain (in the hypothalamus) that needs about 20 minutes to get activated (give or take a few minutes for individual differences). Digestive and hormonal processes need to take place before our brain realizes we are not hungry anymore; we could feel bloated and still be hungry before this recognition of satiation is set off.

9. If you feel still a little bit hungry after this, stop anyway. Drink a little bit more water. This is where you will need to use a little willpower and to recall your motivation and visualizations. In five more minutes, you won't want to eat more, even if food is delicious, because you will feel satisfied and full.

a. Use distractions if visualization on your reason for eating slowly fails at this point. Go for a walk, watch a favorite TV show, write a poem, call a friend on the phone, go for a swim, knit a sweater, feed an animal, groom your pet, wash the car, change the sheets, etc.

b. Having a hot drink can help to overcome residual hunger feelings. Try a coffee, tea, warm water with lemon, etc.

c. If you're still feeling hungry after eating slowly, you might have nutritional deficiencies or an illness; there may also be continuing underlying psychological problems. It is wise to speak to your doctor about this if it's still the case for you



TAX Matters with



LOCAL PROPERTY TAX (LPT)

If you are the liable person for the residential property on 1 November 2016 you have to pay LPT for 2017. If you (as an owner) sell your residential property after 1 November 2016 you will be liable to pay LPT on the property for 2017, even if it is sold before the end of 2016.

The amount of LPT due for 2017 depends on the value declared for the property on 1 May 2013 and the LPT rate applying to your property for 2017. Some local authorities have adjusted the LPT rate for 2017. Kerry County Council has not adjusted the LPT rate for 2017.

You can confirm how much LPT is due for 2017 on your property by accessing your LPT record online using your PPSN, Property ID and PIN.

If you wish to avail of a **phased payment** option such as Direct Debit, Deduction at Source or regular cash payments through a Payment Service Provider, you should confirm your payment method by **25 November 2016.**



GARDENING OUTLOOK

with John O'Sullivan

FOCUS ON FILLING WINTER CONTAINERS

Now is the time to start filling your winter containers, pots and baskets. First thing to do is empty your pots of the summer display including compost and give it a quick wash inside. Then put some gravel around the drainage hole at the bottom of the pot. Now add some new compost and fill it about 2 inches from the top of the pot and firm it down but not too hard.

Next it's time to choose what plants you're going to use, first plant what will be your centre piece, which could be anything from a conifer to a grass, such as a phormiumn or if it's a very large pot or container you could choose something like a pyramid or a standard bay-tree which is a bit more expensive but you will have them for a long time.

Next plants to choose would be something trailing such as ivy or a Vinca and plant three of them like a triangle in the pot, in between these you can plant some primroses, polyanthus, winter pansy, cyclamen, etc and also you can plant some tulip or daffodils as well.


After planting remember to water in well.

SENIOR FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP FINAL

KERRY O'SHEA REPORTS ON LAST SUNDAYS SENIOR COUNTY FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP SEMI FINALS.

CROKES COMFORTABLE AS THEY CLAIM 11th CROWN

DR CROKES 2-16 **KENMARE DISTRICT 1-12**

Twenty-five years ago, a little-known red haired young boy Colm Cooper was the team mascot as Dr Crokes set out in quest of County Championship and All-Ireland honours. Twenty-five years later that young boy is now recognised as the finest forward in the land. Injury may have affected him over the last two seasons but he was back to his brilliant best as he helped his beloved club to claim another Garvey's Kerry SFC title as Crokes defeated Kenmare District in front of 6,713 at Fitzgerald Stadium.

In doing so, Pat O'Shea's side climbed back to where they belong-at the summit of Kerry football and proved yet again just why they are the best Kerry side to win this competition in recent years as they won a 5th title in seven years and an 11th title in all to move second in the Roll of honour.

This was vintage Colm Cooper at his brilliant best, as he scored seven points, four from play and secured yet another Man of the Match title as Crokes were in almost complete control.

The Killarney side were only behind on one occasion as they dominated the game despite the efforts of a Kenmare District side who could never repeat their excellent semi-final show as goals in either half from Kieran O'Leary and Johnny Buckley cemented their domination of the game.

Crokes had other heroes too in Kieran O'Leary, David Payne, Michael Moloney and Brian Looney, who chipped in with four excellent points from play, all had their moments as did substitutes Jordan Kiely and Michael Burns who got their names on the scoresheet as well.

Kenmare District manager John Galvin's tactic of deploying Tadgh Morley didn't work as Colm Cooper's influence on this game proved too much for the challengers.

Kenmare's day got worse when they lost key defender Patrick Clifford with a recurrence of a shoulder injury late in the first half. Adrian Spillane, Killian Spillane and Tadgh Morley were at the forefront of much of Kenmare's good work but this was not their day.

Colm Cooper had the honour of opening the scoring with a fine point after 40 seconds but Paul O'Connor landed a brace for the District side who were playing into the Lewis Road end in the first half.

Crokes hit back with fine scores from Colm Cooper and Kieran O'Leary and when Killian Spillane levelled scores were tied at 0-3 apiece after 14 minutes.

Cooper punished a poor Kenmare kickout to put his side in front and when Shane Murphy slotted a '45 shortly afterwards as the Killarney side gained the upper hand.

Paul O'Connor's place-kicking kept Kenmare in touch but Ambrose O'Donovan, Colm Cooper (f) and Kieran O'Leary in between a Paul O'Connor point from a free for Kenmare left the Crokes leading by two with ten minutes of the first half remaining.

Crokes, hopes received a major boost in the 26th minute when Kieran O'Leary finished a Fionn Fitzgerald delivery to the net for the game's first goal but Paul O'Connor, again from a free, closed the first-half scoring with Crokes 1-7 to 0-6 clear at the short whistle. Adrian Spillane gave Kenmare an early tonic with a point within the opening minute of the second half but Michael Burns, introduced at half-time for Alan O'Sullivan, cancelled this out at the other end. Then Crokes struck for their second goal in the 33rd minute when Gavin White placed Johnny Buckley who finished to the net in style.

Kenmare bounced back with a goal of their own through Teddy Doyle but Crokes hit full throttle with a string of points from Brian Looney (3), Looney was to score four in all and a double from Cooper pushed Pat O'Shea's team 2-13 to 1-8 clear with 13 minutes of the 2nd half gone.

Kenmare's hopes were slowly ebbing away and they needed goals now. They almost got one in the 47th minute only for the intervention of the woodwork to deny Paul

O'Connor as Crokes continued to hold sway. Looney, with his fourth point of the game, Colm Cooper and Jordan Kiely added points to close off Crokes scoring while Kenmare District had points before the finish from Paul O'Connor, Killian Spillane and Adrian Spillane. This was a special day for Dr Crokes manager Pat O'Shea and his family as Pat's son Gavin who was on the starting 15, now joins his father in a unique club of fathers and sons who have won County SFC honours in Kerry. 

Removing unused or unwanted medicines from the family home can reduce the risk of accidental poisonings (particularly in children), overdose suicide attempts, inappropriate sharing of medicines and damage to the environment. The DUMP campaign is running in participating pharmacies until the 20th of November 2016.

KITCHEN SCRAPS CAN HELP TO FEED BIRDS (Part 3)

As regular readers will have seen over the past two weeks birdseed, suet and nectar aren't the only suitable foods you can feed the birds: there are many different kitchen scraps that can augment more traditional food sources. If used wisely and sparingly, kitchen scraps can easily become a part of your backyard birds' diet without harm.

• Grated mild cheese can be added to a feeder or thrown at the back of flower borders for robins, wrens, dunnocks and starlings.

• Save the leftover crumbs from your sandwich and/or bagel and add to your scraps,

• Buy own brands of sultanas, shredded wheat and cereal oats and chop up very finely if you think they are good value.

• Remove the bad bits from an apple, pear etc and cut it in two with the skin still on, hang it up and the birds will really enjoying it.

• Save the crusty ends of bread and cut up small for the crows, jackdaws, and magpies and feed from the roof of a shed.

• Blitz cooked root veg to a puree with oats, flour, nuts, bread crumbs, cooked rice, tomatoes etc in a blender.

 Make up a batch of food in a food processor from what you have in the house. This can be made from bread, peanuts, leftover scraps of cheese and an apple. Lard can also be added, but birds can get soft fats on their feathers and it's not easy for them to get off so they lose the insulation of the feathers and can get too chilled and die in cold weather.

Kitchen scraps can spoil quickly, and while birds' tastes are less refined than humans', unappetising food will not be consumed. Don't leave any form of food hanging around in feeders for days to go mouldy. Birds can be forgiving if a feeder is empty for a few days, but a feeder that is consistently empty won't attract many birds. While wild birds grow to depend on feeders as a food source. Refilling feeders promptly will attract a wider variety of birds and will help keep the feeder clean and in good repair. All feeding areas must be clean to keep bird populations healthy so remove old or damp seed from beneath all feeders and rotten fruit from trees where birds feed and keep birdbaths and other perches clean. Above all please make sure birds have access to fresh, clean drinking water. A light ball floating in the water will be moved by even a gentle breeze, and should keep a small amount of water ice-free by day, line the bath with a polythene sheet that you can lift out along with the ice in the mornings.

YOUR DOG'S SENSE OF SMELL IS 60 TIMES MORE POWERFUL THAN YOUR OWN

Dogs are incredible scent detectives, able to tell time, predict weather, identify dangerous substances, and even detect cancer with their noses. Their two nostrils can operate independently of one another, they inhale through their nostrils and exhale through slits at the side of the nose, creating a circulation of air and scent molecules that lets them smell far more than we can even imagine. You know how your dog spends so much time sniffing telephone poles and trees? These doggy landmarks are aromatic bulletin boards, carrying messages of who's been by, what they've been eating, and how they're feeling. Your dog's ability to identify hormones and pheromones also explains how she/he knows to be extra-attentive when you're feeling sad or sick. Alexandra Horowitz of the Dog Cognition Lab at Barnard College theorises that dogs can track time throughout the day by the odours circulating in their environment just as we if we sit in the same room all day, we notice the light changing as the hours go on, and feel the change of temperature on our skin. Dogs notice similar changes, but with scent. It's tempting to hurry your dog along when he/she is lingering over a particularly odorous patch of sidewalk, but according to Dr. Horowitz, pulling dogs away from smellrich environments can cause their sense of smell to diminish. If you pressure your dog to live in "our visual world," she says, "they start attending to our pointing and our gestures and our facial expressions more, and less to smells."

MAN USES PIZZA DELIVERY TO CHECK UP ON HIS GRANDMOTHER AFTER HURRICANE

Claire Olsen's phone lines were disconnected following the wake of Hurricane Matthew,

TWITTER PHOTO SAVED THE LIFE OF A MAN AND HIS DOG

A videographer was just taking his drone for a spin over the flooding and damage from Hurricane Matthew – he wasn't expecting to save any lives. But after he posted a photo of a suburban neighbourhood in Hope Mills, North Carolina almost entirely underwater on Twitter, he received an incredible message.

Aspiring photographer Quavas Hart was contacted by a man in Austin, Texas saying that the flooded house in the photo was where his twin brother Chris Williams was trapped inside with his elderly dog Lana.

Chris had already tried to call 911 twenty or thirty times with no success because of the overwhelming amount of rescue help needed after the storm. Mr. Hart was about to prepare his boat for rescue when he noticed a Federal Emergency Management Agency boat nearby. He used his drone to get their attention before saying that they should follow the robot to where a man was trapped in his home.

MIXED MARTIAL ARTS FIGHTER GIVES WINNINGS TO OPPONENT IN NEED

Angel Cruz was in dire need of a fight so he could make some money for his family - but even though he lost, he still received the \$2,000 bonus. That's because his opponent, John Castaneda, understood the financial struggles that come from working in mixed martial arts. Mr. Castaneda delivered a punishing victory to Cruz in the second round of their Combate Americas bantamweight fight. However, his triumph didn't taste as sweet as it should have knowing that Mr. Cruz was desperate for the money that came from winning the match. Mr. Castaneda had met his opponent's two daughters at their weighin several days earlier. Since he had taken the fight with only five days notice due to the previous competitor dropping out at the last minute, Mr. Cruz thanked him for rising to the occasion, saying he needed the finishing bonus to feed his family. Since the Hungarian posted the video to Reddit, there have been dozens of comments from other backpackers and skiers relating similar experiences with the village cat that has become an internet star overnight.

STUDENTS CROCHET PLASTIC BAGS INTO SLEEPING MATS FOR THE HOMELESS

Honour students are turning plastic shopping bags into "miles of mats" to keep the homeless warm during the cold Michigan winter - and keeping the bags out of landfill. The teens at Three Rivers Community Schools cut up the bags, then crochet the strips together to create insulating sleeping mats. It takes 500to-700 bags to make each one, and they say they won't quit until they've made a mile-long line of the six-foot by four-foot mats. The local chapter of the National Honour Society plans to make 880 of the mats using about 616,000 plastic bags and are also seeking pledges of \$200 for each mat they create, with a goal of raising \$176,000 over the course of "Miles for Mats" to fund this and other community projects.

DIABETIC BOY FINALLY GETS BELOVED SERVICE DOG

4 years ago, Aiden Heath discovered that he had type 1 diabetes – and that he could get a service dog to help him manage it. Even though certified service dogs usually cost up to \$15,000, Aiden's mother Jenni told him to start saving his pennies and he would be there in no time. In April 2016, the 8-year-old boy had saved \$6,000 in change. His inspiring story, however got him national coverage. Before he knew it, strangers had crowd funded another \$20,000 for his dream dog. That's when they adopted Angel, a chocolate Labrador who had passed all of her service tests. With Angel by Aiden's side, she will be able to smell his blood sugar drop thirty minutes before a meter would ever register the change – she is also the best friend a boy could ask for. "Aiden looked at me and said, 'This is a dream," Jenni said. "We have been so amazed by the outpouring of support; there are no words to express our gratitude."

BOB DYLAN AWARDED 2016 NOBEL PRIZE FOR LITERATURE

Born Robert Allen Zimmerman, the 75-yearold legendary American folk singer songwriter and poet has not only created 37 studio albums ranging from rock and roll to acoustically crooning serenades, but he has also written a whimsically mysterious collection of poems called Tarantula and Chronicles – a flowing, autobiographical memoir detailing his rise to fame and his musical trials in New York City. He has also published an encyclopaedia of all of his lyrics from 1961-2012. When he wrote 'Blowing In The Wind' in ten minutes he never realised it would become an anthem for the Civil Rights Movement - he sang it at a voter registration rally in Greenwood, Mississippi. Peter Yarrow sang it during the march from Selma to Montgomery. And the trio, Peter, Paul and Mary played it on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial during the March on Washington; just hours before Martin Luther King Jr. stood before thousands and declared "I have a dream." His song 'A Hard Rain's A-Gonna Fall' was written in 1963 about the war in Vietnam and forcibly dispatching young men off to war and the lasting effects of that on America, in 2009 ahead of the Copenhagen climate change conference, the UN adopted the song and released a video to highlight the dangers of global warming. Bob Dylan's list of thought provoking songs just goes on and on.

FAMOUSLY TURKISH CAT GETS BEAUTIFUL MEMORIAL STATUE

Tombili was already a beloved friend of many in Istanbul, but after someone snapped a contemplative photo of the cat, he became internet famous. In the picture, the portly pet is leaning against a stone wall staring off into the distance, seemingly lost in thoughtmaintaining an air of relaxed refinement while he ponders. Since his passing in August, his friends and fans insisted that he be honoured in some way for his famous countenance as the friendly feline was the epitome of a neighbourhood cat, always lounging about outside. He was even captured in Google Maps. With more than 17,000 people signing a Change.org petition, the city complied and local artist Seval Şahin recreated the cat's most iconic pose in a pensive bronze statue which was unveiled on October 4th - World Animal Day - in Ziverbey, Istanbul.




