



"This is a cause that helps to protect children 24 hours a day", she added.

Childline receives the majority of its 2,300 calls and messages per day after 6pm each evening, when most other support services are closed. This part of the service was nearly closed down because of a lack of funding.

Childline receives just 10% Government funding which means that 90% of its costs have to be raised through the generosity of individual donors and corporate supporters. 100 minds is providing a platform for Irish students to raise money for this vital service. Every donation will make a difference.

"Anyone who knows me knows how much I love children, and so, helping in any way I can to keep these services running means the world to me", Marion said.

Childline's inspiring vision is to see an Ireland where all children are heard and valued.


**CALAMITY JANE**


# **GET YOUR COPY OF THE KERRY 2016 PROGRAMME**

Killarney Cardiac Response Unit are looking for volunteers. The voluntary community service went live with the National Ambulance Service (NAS) in August 2015 and so far have attended almost 60 emergency cardiac calls.

Killarney Cardiac Response Unit is a voluntary community service that provides Killarney town extending up to 6KM out with two on call Cardiac First Responders (CFRs). These CFRs will be activated once a Cardiac call is made to Ambulance Control (999/112). The responders will have a pager on them which will be linked in with a control phone through the National Ambulance Service. The idea is not to replace the ambulance service more so to compliment them by providing care to the patient before the National Ambulance Service (NAS) arrives on scene. The responders on call will have an AED and other Life Saving equipment that will

give the patient every fighting chance until the ambulance service arrives.

"KCRU is such a worthwhile organisation to join. With the core values of saving people's lives at the heart of the operation we truly do make a difference to the people of Killarney", Scheme Coordinator Damien Baker told the Killarney Outlook.

"We are a completely voluntary service and is manned with approx 40 volunteers but are always on the look out for more" he added.

No experience is necessary, in fact all training will be given by the Response Unit to all members regardless of qualifications.

"Responders will have to meet our training team standards before they will rostered for calls", Damien added.

With approximately 60% of the calls taking place between 8am and 8pm and 40% between 8pm and 8am the average response time by the KCRU is 10.64 minutes.

The Killarney Cardiac Response are hosting a coffee morning in the Plaza Hotel at the end of February in an effort to both raise funds and awareness.

"We would be delighted to welcome as many as possible to our coffee morning. As a voluntary community funded group we are always trying new ways to get funding and we would be delighted to see as many people supporting us as possible", Fiona McMahon, one of the Volunteer Responders told the Killarney Outlook.

The coffee morning is due to take place between 9.30am and 11.30am in the Killarney Plaza Hotel and some of the responders will be on hand to answer any questions about what it is that KCRU do.

# DARREN RECEIVES THE GIFT OF LIFE FROM HIS DAD

A father and from Tralee are both recovering having undergone a successful kidney transplant at Beaumont Hospital. 19 year old Darren Burns



was diagnosed with Polycystic Kidney Disease when he was only nine years old. His condition began to deteriorate in recent years and only four months ago doctors declared that a kidney transplant was the only way to save young Darren's life.

Mike Burns, who is originally from Sneem selflessly gave his son his kidney on January 4th in a four hour transplant operation at Dublin's Beaumont Hospital. The operation has been declared a success and in a couple of months Darren will feel the full benefits of the life saving operation. His weight has already increased and he no longer needs dialysis.

# SENATOR RAISES CONCERN AT DEER ROAMING

Deer roaming onto the road at Ballydowney Killarney and causing serious accidents and even deaths has been highlighted by Senator Marie Moloney. Speaking in the Seanad on Wednesday 13th January, she said that "there is a stretch of road at Ballydowney, where there is no ditch or fence and deer are free to roam. This has been the site of many accidents including three fatalities. The Gardai in Killarney confirmed that they receive between 70 and 100 calls a year about roaming deer".

"The Minister will appreciate that if a farmer had livestock he would have to have a fence to stop them wandering onto the road, where

interest of safety for motorcyclists, pedestrians or cars, either by a ditch or a fence. Previously, there was a wall at this point, but now the deer are free to roam. More warning signs needs to be erected, with a higher impact, and at more prominent locations."

In a reply delivered on behalf of Minister Heather Humphries, she stated that the erection of a fence on this scale could impact on the sensitive habitats within the Park. She said that improved sight lines in the area will

benefit the motorist and additional or relocated signs or both may also be provided.

The Minister also stated that she will try to ensure that the issues raised in my debate are addressed in the interest of protecting motorists at Ballydowney.

Senator Moloney said "The wildlife in this country is protected under the Wildlife Acts, but who protects the people?"





### Mediterranean Pitta

Serves 1 - (Each serving contains approx 306 calories.)

### Ingredients

- 1 wholewheat pitta
- 30g washed spinach
- 2 tablespoon light cream cheese
- 1 tomato, sliced
- 1 egg



### Method

- 1. Place egg in a pot of boiling water and boil egg for 8 mins. Once cooked, remove from pot carefully. Remove shell and slice.
- 2. Place pitta in a toaster and toast as desired.
- 3. Carefully remove from toaster and slice open when cool. Pitta may be hot, so be careful doing this.
- 4. Spread light cream cheese in the pitta and layer with spinach, sliced tomato and boiled egg.
- 6. Top with tuna and serve.

### Pesto Chicken

Serves 2 - (Each serving contains approx 520 calories.)

### Ingredients

- 250g chicken breast, sliced into 1cm strips
- 2 tablespoon of basil pesto
- 50g light cream cheese
- 100g wholewheat spaghetti
- 160g mushrooms, sliced
- 1 yellow pepper, sliced
- 1 tablespoon rapeseed oil



### Method

- 1. To a pot of hot water, add the spaghetti. Bring to the boil and reduce to simmer until cooked.
- 2. Place wok over medium to high heat and add oil.
- 3. Add chicken and cook for 5-10 minutes.
- 4. Add pesto and cream cheese and stir until chicken is coated.
- 5. Now add mushroom and peppers and continue to stir occasionally until the chicken is cooked through.
- 6. Serve the chicken mixture over the cooked spaghetti.

This serves two adult portions.







### "Apply" - The CAO interactive online application is the way to go by 1st February

(By Billy Ryle)

Almost all applications to CAO are made via "Apply," the interactive online application facility, which remains open until 1st February on the CAO website, www.cao.ie . "Apply" is user friendly and easy to follow, particularly as CAO provides an 'Interactive Demo' to enable you make a trial application. The fee is €25, if



Log into "My Application" by entering your CAO application number, date of birth and password. Under "Qualifications and Assessments" provide the additional information about the qualification and assessments that you selected. If you are applying on the basis of Leaving Cert (1985-2016) results, which is the case with the vast majority of applicants, enter the name and address of your second level school(s) and the years attended. If you are a Leaving Cert 2016 candidate tick the box provided. If you have previously sat the Leaving Cert, provide your exam(s) number and the year(s) in which you sat the exam.

If you intend to apply for a college grant, indicate this on your CAO online application form. CAO will then provide your identification, contact and offer/ acceptance details to the grant authority, Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI). Later in the year, you will also have to submit a grant application to SUSI at www.susi.ie or www.studentfinance.ie by 1st August.

If you wish to disclose a Disability/Specific Learning Difficulty (SLD) and to apply to the Disability Access Route to Education (DARE) click the "Modify Disability/SLD and DARE Application Status" button and follow the instructions provided. Further details about Disability/SLD and DARE are on pages 10/11 of the Handbook.

If you wish to apply for the Higher Education Access Route (HEAR), which is a third level alternative admissions scheme for school leavers from socioeconomically disadvantaged backgrounds resident in the Republic of Ireland. click the "HEAR Application" button and follow the instructions provided. Further details about applying for HEAR are on page 9 of the Handbook. Add your Level 8 and Level 7/6 course choices by 1st February. To do this, click on "Add Level 8 course choices" and/or click on "Add Level 7/6 course choices." You may apply for a maximum of ten course choices on each list. List your courses based on your genuine order of preference. At the offer stage, you will receive an offer of the course highest up on your course choices list(s) that you are deemed eligible for, if any.

Check your course choices immediately via the "My Application" facility to ensure that they are correct. Use the online change courses facility on the CAO website if you need to amend or add courses. This facility is free of charge until 31st January. You may also use the online change of course choices facility from 5th February to 1st March on payment of an additional processing fee of €10. From 5th May, you may use the change of mind facility (free) to make course changes online at www.cao.ie. You can use the free online change of mind facility as often as you like until 1st July. List your courses in your order of preference on the new list. Check that your courses have been updated by using the "My Application" facility by 1st July.

"Apply" is now the standard method of applying to CAO. It's a secure and safe way of applying for your courses and it allows you to submit your application from the privacy of your own home.

# **Know Your Rights:**

# THE MINIMUM WAGE

### **QUESTION**

I heard that the minimum wage has increased to €9.15 an hour. My employer says that this only applies to adults and that, as I am under 18, he won't be increasing my hourly rate of pay. Is that right?

### **ANSWER**

No. Since 1 January 2016, the statutory minimum wage for an experienced adult has increased to €9.15 per hour. Under the National Minimum Wage Act 2000, there are also pro-rata increases for those aged under 18 and for trainees. The new rates are as follows:

	Minimum hourly rate	% of minimum wage
Experienced adult worker	€9.15	100%
Aged under 18	€6.41	70%
First year from date of first employment aged over 18	€7.32	80%
Second year from date of first employment aged over 18	€8.24	90%
Employee aged over 18, in structured training during work:		
In the 1st one-third period	€6.86	75%
In the 2 <sup>nd</sup> one-third period	€7.32	80%
In the 3 <sup>rd</sup> one-third period	€8.24	90%

If your employer is not paying you the appropriate minimum wage, you can make a complaint to the Workplace Relations Commission (WRC) using the online complaint form available on workplacerelations.ie. In the complaint form you have two options. You may either request an inspector from the WRC to investigate a claim that the national minimum wage is not being paid or you may refer a dispute to a WRC adjudicator.

However, you can only refer a dispute if you have requested a statement from your employer outlining the calculation of the average hourly pay.

You can get more information on the minimum wage and your employment rights from the WRC Information and Customer Service (Lo-call 1890 80 80 90 or workplacerelations.ie) or from the Citizens Information Centre below.







### EXTRA CARE NEEDED AS WEATHER DETERIORATES

Winter is the worst time of the year for driving. Shorter daytime hours, poor visibility, icy road surfaces can make driving dangerous especially by night or in the early morning. This week alone we have gone from flood alerts to icy roads and black ice forecast. The RSA (Road Safety Authority) strives to reduce accidents and make roads safer for everyone. Some people blame the condition of the roads for accidents but the biggest killer on Irish roads is speed. During the winter months stopping distances are further due to wet road surfaces or worse still black ice. There are a few ways to ensure a safer journey in winter. Before setting out on your journey, check the weather forecast and if there are severe weather warnings, don't drive unless it is absolutely necessary. If however you have to drive, proceed with caution and give yourself plenty of time to reach your destination.

#### **RSA WINTER DRIVING CHECKLIST BEFORE** SETTING OFF:

- Weather forecast. Is it safe to drive?
- Tyres. Check threads depths.
- Visibility. Can your car be seen? Check all bulbs, brake lights, fog lights and hazard warning lights.
- Have an ice scraper handy and a de-icing spray can be useful in freezing conditions.
- Watch out for black ice, it forms in the shadows or under trees. It looks like a pool of water but do not be fooled, it is very dangerous so be alert.
- Give yourself a brake. If you get into a skid, you need to know if your vehicle has ABS (Anti-lock Braking Systems). After you step on the brake the ABS begins cycling-you will feel pulses in the pedal or hear the system working. Remember- Step, Stay and Steer. Step on the pedal, Stay on the pedal, Steer around the obstacle.
- Be aware of other road users; remember stopping times increase in wet or icy conditions. Pay attention to pedestrians, be aware that the surface is dangerous and that people can fall or trip onto the road ahead.
- Allow plenty of room when overtaking motorcyclists, cyclists or pedestrians.
- Do not tailgate; keep a safe distance from the car in front, especially when road conditions are slippery. And when travelling close to other



cars at night please remember to dip your headlights.

Kerry roads had 9 fatalities last year alone, this is the second highest mortality rate in the country. Most accidents can be avoided through taking more care and being extra

AA Automobile Association also provides info for drivers on their radio link AA Roadwatch available on many radio stations throughout the country. In their online advice here is some of the AA's advice for driving in winter.

- Slow down, leave yourself more time to complete your journey
- When driving in foggy conditions use your dipped headlights, reduce your speed and drive a safe distance from the car in front.
- Avoiding Skids: Look out for potentially dangerous skid traps, namely; wet leaves, shady spots, black ice and frost especially at night and early mornings, on exposed bends, underneath trees and bridges, be aware and slow down when the roads are like this.

Weather conditions can change in Ireland on a daily basis - going from snow and ice to flooding.

The AA offers this advice when you hit floodwater.

Paddy Finn of AA says, " All drivers, including those of local knowledge, can be caught out by heavy downpours as even the most modern road surface is still susceptible to standing water. This presents an aquaplaning hazard

as well as significantly reducing visibility. Drivers should take it easy and if the steering becomes unresponsive due to rain, ease off the accelerator and slow down gradually".

If drivers come across floodwater they should only drive through if they know it's not too deep and maintain a steady, slow speed to avoid causing a bow wave. The danger lies in the air intake being low down at the front of the car and it can take just an egg cupful of water in the combustion chamber to ruin your engine.

48% of winter crashes are caused by skidding, simply by drivers switching to winter tyres these figures could be drastically reduced.

The AA has advice for drivers who find themselves skidding:

Don't break fast whatever the circumstance if it's too late and you have already braked, release them immediately, and then reapply, quicker but gently.

Reduce acceleration but don't take your foot off the accelerator completely.

Use the highest gears possible under the conditions and as you gently break, move down in your gears to come to a gradual halt. Any movement becomes exaggerated in a skid so react accordingly, try to remain calm and keep some control of your car.

Make sure a trip is absolutely necessary before taking a chance in unfavorable conditions. The best thing to do during extremely bad weather is to stay in, no point taking unnecessary risks with your life or the lives of other road users.



### **CLAIM YOUR ENTITLEMENTS: 4 YEAR RULE**

If you are entitled to additional tax credits or reliefs that you have not yet claimed, you should claim your entitlements on a timely basis. There is a 4 year time limit for claiming tax refunds. This means that if you have a claim for 2012, revenue must receive it by 31 December 2016. Items on which you may be entitled to claim a tax refund include:

- health expenses
- nursing home fees
- flat-rate expenses
- · tuition fees

#### **HOW TO CLAIM YOUR CREDITS OR RELIEFS**

You can claim tax relief online using Revenue's PAYE Anytime service. For more details go to www.revenue.ie.


You can use Medical form MED1 to claim tax relief on all general medical expenses (including dental expenses). You can only claim for medical expenses if you have receipts to prove your claim.

Do not send your medical receipts (this includes MED 2) with your MED 1 form. However, you must keep your medical receipts for six years because Revenue may investigate your claim.

A medical form MED2 is a receipt to prove your dental expenses. Your dentist will normally have a supply of MED 2 forms and should complete it for you.

As social beings, we are hard wired to connect and most of us feel the need for rewarding social contact and relationships. Loneliness is the feeling we get when our need for this type of contact is not met. Loneliness of course is not the same as

being alone. We may choose to be alone and live very happy lives without much contact with others. Or indeed we may have much social contact, be constantly surrounded by people, and yet feel very lonely. Loneliness can have a significant impact on our mental health and can contribute to mental health problems, such as anxiety and depression. Loneliness can have many different causes and affects people in different ways. Some people feel lonely due to their personal circumstances (e.g moving to a new area, loss or bereavement). For others however, loneliness can be a deeper more constant feeling that comes from within.

Connecting with the World around us can be a great way to combat loneliness. This may be having a small conversation with the cashier when we pay for our groceries or saying hello to someone we meet in the street. Phoning or sending an email to family and friends can be a good reminder that we do have people in our lives.

Our brain can try to make sense of the feeling of loneliness by telling us things such as 'It is because nobody loves me' or 'There is something wrong with me' These thoughts are not facts and can make us feel worse. Thus it is important to accept how we are feeling without overreacting. When we feel lonely, the tendency might be to withdraw into ourselves and this can be counterproductive. The healthiest thing to do if we are feeling lonely is to reach out and cultivate friendships. Reaching out can be difficult and at times we will resist it. However, think of it in the way you might approach exercising - whilst we may feel tired or lazy it is a beneficial thing to do.

We need to tackle loneliness one step at a time. It may involve finding a new hobby or joining a club or exercise class. Another skillful way to combat feelings of loneliness is to volunteer as it's a great way to meet new people and also to learn new skills.

Loneliness is a profoundly human emotion and a signal that our need for connection is going unmet.





### IF ONLY EVERYONE COULD SEE THE WORLD THROUGH THE EYES OF A CHILD WHAT A WONDERFUL

WORLD IT WOULD BE

When an eight-year-old Australian girl saw a photograph of a toddler in the newspaper just before Christmas, she asked her mum who the "cute girl" in the picture was. The child was told how the Australian-African three-yearold had run away from people trying to hurt her: how she has spent months hiding from them; and how, although she has the right to come to Australia, her mother does not. She wasn't told about female genital mutilation, the barbaric procedure the young girl's family are trying to force on her. But she was still troubled by the story. In a letter to the federal government, the child from Victoria asked that Fatoumata Binta and her mother be brought to "our country", offered to share her toys and she promised to be nice. "I have lots of toys, CDs and clothes that I can share, and I have a big bed and Fatoumata can sleep with me and her mum can sleep with my mum," she wrote. "I promise that I will be so nice to them and my grandma is a really nice cook, they must be hungry and grandma can make food for them straight away." Pressure is mounting on the Australian government to do more to help Fatoumata Binta, who remains in Africa with her mother. Almost 30,000 people have signed a Change.org petition calling on Foreign Minister Julie Bishop to urgently bring the pair to Australia. It follows Labour and the Green's calls for immediate action and a statement from the Australian Human Rights Commission detailing the government's responsibility under international treaties to do everything in its power to protect children at risk of female genital mutilation.

The mother and daughter crossed the border from Guinea to Sierra Leone after escaping from relatives who tried to kidnap the toddler and force her to undergo the ancient ritual, they were initially put up in safe house organised by the Australian government.

Fatoumata Binta is an Australian citizen by descent on her father's side but it is understood there are complications because her mother, who is also a victim and has few rights after fleeing from her family, does not have a visa. The cost of their flights and accommodation were paid for with money raised through a crowd-funding campaign

launched in Australia. Advocates have been inundated with calls pledging support for the family, with offers of food, furniture, clothing and accommodation if they are brought to Australia. Now the fate of Fatoumata Binta seems to have vanished entirely from the International Headlines.

# PROSTHETIC LEG WITH HOOFED FOOT DISCOVERED IN ANCIENT CHINESE TOMB

The 2,200-year-old remains of a man with a deformed knee attached to a prosthetic leg tipped with a horse hoof have been discovered in a tomb in an ancient cemetery near Turpan, China. The excavators found that the left leg of the male occupant was deformed, with the patella, femur and tibia fused together and fixed at 80 degrees. The man couldn't straighten his left leg out so the prosthetic leg, when attached, allowed the left leg to touch the floor when walking. The horse hoof at the bottom of the prosthetic leg acted like a foot. The prosthetic leg was "made of poplar wood; it has seven holes along the two sides with leather tapes for attaching it to the deformed leg," the archaeologists said. "The lower part of the prosthetic leg is rendered into a cylindrical shape, wrapped with a scrapped ox horn and tipped with a horsehoof, which was meant to augment its adhesion and abrasion." "The severe wear of the top implies that it has been in use for a long time," they added.

Researchers estimate that the man was about 5 feet 7 inches (1.7 meters) tall, and between 50 and 65 years old when he died and also found evidence that the man was infected with tuberculosis at some point in his life. They think that inflammation from the infection may have resulted in a bony growth that allowed his knee to fuse together or it could also have been caused by inflammation in or around the joint, rheumatism or trauma. Radiocarbon dating indicates that the tomb in Turpan dates back around 2,200 years. The only other known prosthetic leg in the world that dates to that time was part of a bronze leg found in Capua, Italy. That leg was destroyed in a bombing raid during World War II. Prosthetic toes, dating to earlier times, have been found in Egypt.

# GOOD AND NOT SO GOOD NEWS

The elephant, a symbol of Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus for over a century, will no longer be featured in the organisation's acts. Executives from Feld Entertainment, Ringling's parent company, said in a release that the 13 elephants currently traveling with its circus units will be retired in 2018. They will join the 40 elephants currently living at the 200-acre Ringling Bros. Centre for Elephant Conservation in Florida. Executive Vice President Alana Feld said "There's been somewhat of a mood shift among our consumers," she said. "A lot of

people aren't comfortable with us touring with our elephants." The President of Feld Entertainment added that animal welfare ordinances targeted at elephants, have been difficult to fight or even keep track of. He says the time has come to take those financial resources and put them to better use in helping the elephants. Unfortunately the circus will continue to feature other extraordinary animal performers, including tigers, lions, horses, dogs and camels.

# COULD THIS HAPPEN IN IRELAND?

Colorado is using some of its higher than expected marijuana earnings to fund college scholarships: Colorado has legalized marijuana and In November, Pueblo voters approved an excise tax on marijuana cultivators to fund college scholarships and various other community projects by a 60 to 40 percent margin. The scholarships will be applicable to students graduating from Pueblo high schools "who have been admitted to colleges and universities located within Pueblo County and will be attending those schools the succeeding fall. The county expects \$3.5 million to be raised at the 5% rate, under Taxpayer's Bill of Rights estimates. The money generated from the tax will be split between two separate funds in Pueblo County — the Pueblo County Scholarship Fund and the Infrastructure and Community Development Fund.

# COYOTE STEALS A BALL TO PLAY FETCH BY HIMSELF

A YouTube user ran across a charming little scene while getting ready for work recently. On a hill in the distance, a creature that could aptly be described as the world's happiest coyote was spotted enjoying a lively game he'd apparently just invented — solo fetch, with a stolen ball, no less. "It's pretty rare to see a coyote this close to the house at all, and totally unexpected to see one playing with the neighbour-dog's ball in broad daylight!" the man wrote. This isn't the first time a wild canine has discovered the joy of playing with an unsuspecting dogs stuff. A couple of years back, a little Chihuahua named Lupe had one of her cherished toys commandeered by a fox, who proceeded to prance around the front yard with it. Footage from that incident shows her watching from the window, yapping at the happy thief in vain. Sadly these animals still have much to fear about us. Coyotes and Foxes continue to be shot and hunted to death as well as trapped in the wild and a stripped of their fur, which is then used as lining for winter wear by popular clothing makers.

# MOSUL DAM FOUNDATION DISSOLVING

Iraq's largest dam was built on a foundation of gypsum rock salt, a salt of calcium and sulphate which is less soluble than sodium chloride (table salt) but dangerously soluble for the foundation of a dam. Mosul dam has required constant high maintenance since it was built with hundreds of workers working 3 shifts a day 6 days a week needed to maintain the dam, but occupation by ISIS disrupted the ongoing injection of grout to seal channels continuously forming in the dam's foundation. Engineers have found extensive evidence of the connection of new channels formed by rock dissolution to ancient natural channels in limestone. The clay that was plugging those ancient channels may be washing away as the water flowing under high pressure erodes it and pushes open the channels. The Islamic State controlled the dam for a little more than a week in August 2014, but its fighters did not damage the structure. After it was retaken later that month, however, many of the Iraqi workers never returned and the Iraqi government did not resume regular maintenance. The Iragis also lost their usual source of clay grouting material, which was produced by a factory in Mosul, now under the control of the Islamic State. Mosul, a city of 2 million people below the dam could be hit by a 66 foot (20 meters) wall of water. The state department warns that half a million people could die and a million left homeless when the dam fails. Even if the people can be evacuated in time to save half a million lives, a city of 2 million people may be destroyed by a massive flood. Right now there is no alert system in place. The Iraqi government claims to have an evacuation plan, but ISIS controls much of the higher ground below the dam so the plan may be impossible to implement. And Baghdad and millions more people live further downriver. The water would continue along the Tigris, which runs by Tikrit and Samarra down to Baghdad, potentially knocking out bridges along the way, according to the administration's analysis. As the water travelled south, debris, pesticides and corpses would become part of the flow, threatening the country's supply of clean water and its irrigation system.


### DID YOU KNOW?

In 1845, steam engine manufacturer, Peter Cooper of New York - who built the Tom Thumb, the first American steam locomotive - concocted a powdered gelatin dessert. (Gelatin is made from the connective tissue proteins of cows or pigs.) In 1897, cough syrup maker Pearle Bixby Wait of LeRoy, New York trademarked this gelatin dessert... which his wife Mary called Jell-O. Pearle made a granulated form of the gelatin and he and Mary added flavouring. The first four Jell-O flavours were lemon, orange, strawberry and raspberry. The Waits didn't have much success with their product and, in 1899, sold the formula, patent and trade name to their neighbour, Orator Frank Woodward, who owned the Genesee Pure Foods Company (which eventually became the Jell-O Company). It made Woodward a wealthy man.
