



#### LOCAL CREDIT UNIONS LAUNCH NEW AGRI LOAN PRODUCT

Six Credit Unions in the Kerry/Cork region have come together and launched a new Agri Loan product called Cultivate.

The Credit Unions involved are Listowel Credit Union, Killarney Credit Union, and Cara Credit Union in Kerry and Ballincollig Credit Union, Bantry Credit Union and Kanturk Credit Union in Cork.

The new Credit Union farm lending offering is branded under the name "Cultivate" and was officially launched on the 20th March 2019 by IFA National Chairman - Farm Business, Martin Stapleton. The Credit Union farm lending project is modelled on a pilot initiative by four Credit Unions in County Galway who launched the Cultivate brand in 2017. Since then 20 credit unions throughout Ireland have introduced the Agri loan product to members. Since its introduction, Cultivate has proved very popular with farmers with nearly €20m in loans issues to farmers. The Cultivate farm loans are for a wide variety of purposes,



everything from working capital, cash flow, farm development, livestock purchase, farm machinery purchase, rural enterprise funding, and start up farm finance.

Brendan Heneghan, former Regional Manager with Teagasc, is the project manager of the Cultivate brand stated "We are delighted to officially launch the Cultivate Agri loan products to credit union members in Cork and Kerry area. We have been working hard

on this project for the past number of months. Credit Union Agri loan staff have completed a bespoke 5-day course on Farm and Finance organised by Teagasc in association with Pallaskenry Agricultural college. Credit Unions are now open and ready for business" he concluded.

The Cultivate farm loan package will offer loans up to €50,000 for a variety of purposes. The loan rate is a competitive loan rate. The term of the loan can be up to 7 years. Loan protection insurance is also provided on the loan at no additional charge.

Mark Murphy, CEO, Killarney Credit Union stated "We hope that farmers will look to their local credit unions as an alternative for farm finance. After all, credit unions are embedded in their local communities and are in a position to lend to those living or working locally. Our loans are unsecured and we can offer a variety of repayment schedules to suit farmers needs". 












## PRES GIRLS BUILD A BANK IN DUBLIN

# Funds Raised for Divine Retreat Centre


Last year, local woman Aideen O'Connor responded to the call for help from the Divine Retreat Centre, which is situated in the South Indian state of Kerala. Aideen raised a fantastic €537.00 which went to the centre after a devastating flood had killed nearly 500 people and caused an estimated \$7 million worth of damage at the centre alone. The Divine Retreat Centre is the largest Catholic Retreat centre in the world run by the Fathers of the Vincentian Congregation and it sees an average of 3000 people every week, looking

after those suffering with mental illness, HIV p patients, and destitute women and children. The extensive damage at the centre, saw their charitable homes submerged in flood water, and the loss of vital machinery, electricity supply boards, generators, elevators, material, farm animals, and housing. Aideen was in contact with friends who were keeping her updated on the tragedy, and she took it upon herself to help them by setting up a bank account to raise the much needed funds. Fr. Augustine of the Divine Retreat stated that

after the floods their priority was to clean up in order to restart the retreats, this took an entire month to complete. His Eminence Cardinal George Alencherry blessed the whole Centre taking out a Eucharistic procession in the campus. Any items that could be salvaged were sent to be repaired, and with the help of charitable donations they were able to purchase some animals, machinery and to start rebuilding their bakery. Fr. Augustine said that in the days after the flood they did not know where to start however people like Aideen have given them hope and allowed them to rebuild , they would like to thank people for their generosity in helping them and he will keep you in his prayers and asks that you do the same for them.



#### **SHOULD YOU BE CONSIDERING SWITCHING YOUR MORTGAGE**

Yes, because some of the Irish mortgage lenders have much lower mortgage interest rates compared to others. There has been a lot of discussion recently in the media recently as regards mortgage switching this is because there can be a very substantial difference in interest rates and monthly repayments between lenders. For example on a mortgage of €200000 over 30 years based on a property value of €300000 and comparing current fixed interest rates one lenders 2 year fixed rate is as slow as 2.30% (3.90% APR) which costs €770 per month whereas another lenders 2 year fixed rate is as high as 3.30% (APR 3.96%) monthly repayment €876 per month. The monthly repayment for the lender with the higher rate is a staggering €106 per month more expensive. Over the term of the mortgage you could pay €38,277.60 (approx) more in interest, assuming the interest rates don't change over the term of the mortgage. Of course you would need to qualify for the mortgage with the new lender and also there are many other considerations and information you need to know before proceeding further. 8,000 BAGS OF LITTER collected across the county last year

Last year, some 5,500 volunteers were out and about on the day with the support of Kerry County Council and KWD Recycling as well as local organisations like Kerry GAA, Kerry IFA, and Kerry ICMSA, each of which are joining in the effort again this year. Colm 'The Gooch' Cooper will also be lending a hand on the day and is helping to promote the initiative.

The Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr Norma Foley, launched the event at Ballygarry House Hotel in Tralee to coincide with a seminar for Tidy Towns groups in the county:

KWD Recycling will again provide cleanup packs to groups which register at www. Single-use drinking containers were the most common item of litter retrieved!

countycleanup.com and collection points will be designated around the county to ensure that all litter gathered is disposed of.

Noel O'Reilly of KWD Recycling said: 'KWD Recycling is delighted to support yet another County Clean Up for the eighth year in a row. This is a very important initiative – not only does

it get our highways and byways looking great, it also gets communities together helping to raise awareness of the effects of littering, which in turn deters people from throwing rubbish on our roads in the first place. It's a great testament to the people of Kerry and shows how proud we are of our county.'

A record 5,500 volunteers took part in the Kerry County Clean Up in April 2018 which saw 8,000 bags of litter collected, the highest ever tally in the seven years in which the environmental and community initiative has existed. KWD Recycling and Kerry County Council completed an analysis of the litter collected which revealed that single-use drinking containers were the most common item of litter retrieved from locations across the county, followed by sweet and chocolate wrappers.

# WHAT IS MEIBOMIAN GLAND DYSFUNCTION (MGD)?

The normal tears of the eye are made up of three layers – an oily (lipid) layer, a watery (aqueous) layer, and a sticky (mucous) layer. MGD is when the glands that make the oily layer of the tears are not working properly and this allows the watery layer of the tears to dry out.

The Meibomian glands are inside the eyelids, and the openings are on the edge of the eyelids. The outer oily layer stops the watery layer of the tears from drying out. When the glands become blocked, the oily part of the tears cannot be released. This causes the watery tears to dry up more quickly which results in the eye becoming dry and can make it feel sore. It is not usually a serious condition, but can cause discomfort and sometimes blurry vision. If it is not treated, the glands may stop working permanently.

MGD can cause dry eye. It is common to have a combination of MGD, dry eye and blepharitis.

Risk factors

MGD is a common condition and can affect anyone. However, it is more likely to happen after the age of 50, if you have diabetes or oily skin conditions and it is also more common in women.

Symptoms

The eyelids can become sore and swollen as the glands become

blocked. As the eyes become dry, they can feel itchy or gritty, as if there's something in the eye. The eyes may be red, and if they're sore, may be watery, which can cause vision to become blurry.

#### TREATMENT

Treatment involves releasing the oily tears from the glands using hot compresses. You need to get a face cloth, or cotton pads, soak them in hot (not boiling) water, close your eyes, and hold the hot cloth onto your eyelids. Wet the cloth again with hot water and keep applying the compress for at least five minutes. Repeat every day until the condition gets better. You can also use products known as 'heat bags' that are specifically designed for this condition. These bags make it easier to direct the heat and are much more effective than a hot cloth. To help stop the glands from blocking up again continue the treatment every day for a few minutes. Massaging your eyelids can also help to release tears.If the hot compresses or heat bags don't work, referral for further treatment may be required.



Students from Killarney Community College attended the Peer Education Programme Celebration evening in the Muckross Park Hotel last month. The Peer Education Programme involved five students from the school working with Jigsaw Kerry to be trained to deliver a presentation to 1st year students. The presentation called 'It's Time to Start Talking' builds awareness of youth mental health, explores what kind of things help and hinder our mental health, and emphasises the importance of seeking help when feeling down, worried or stressed. The three Killarney secondary schools piloted the programme in 2018, with the programme extended to the three Castleisland schools in 2019. Donal Barry watched Kerry suffer their first defeat under Peter Keane this season as Mayo struck late to take the points in this round six Allianz National Football league tie.

erry suffered their first defeat in the Allianz National Football League at the hands of Mayo last Saturday night before a crowd of 10,218 at Austin Stacks

In many ways, the odds were high that it would have been a Mayo team that would end a five game unbeaten record come to an end, considering that the Westerners have now, not lost a league game on Kerry soil for a decade.

With atrocious conditions to contend with, wind advantage to both teams proved crucial but it was James Horan's men who made the better of their turn with this advantage. Still Kerry fought well throughout despite a poor return in their scoring returns especially in the first half when they only converted eight of their 17 chances created.

Still In the end the decisive moment came down to a 67th minute goal when Matthew Ruane ran onto a through ball with Adrian Spillane trailing in his wake to shoot past the returning Brian Kelly, who was making his first start of the season.

Kerry won the toss and took the wind advantage from the off but it was Mayo that seemed the more composed and led the home side 0-3 to 0-0 inside the opening seven minutes.

While Kerry added, James O'Donoghue to the mix late on, it was the Mayo bench loaded with experience that made the bigger impact with the likes of Lee Keegan, Colm Boyle and Andy Moran all ensuring that the Mayo side would not be defeated for the third weekend in a row. Peter Keane's side took up until the 20th minute to find their groove. Mayo controlled the contest 0-4 to 0-2 on the scoreboard but the home side finally found their feet hitting five unanswered points to take the lead at the break 0-7 to 0-4.

Kerry would have gained some solace in keeping the Mayo side to just a single point inside the opening ten of the second half and when substitute Diarmuid O'Connor restored Kerry's three point lead, it certainly gave hope to the home supporters that another great escape could be on.

However on this occasion, it was Mayo who found greater compose and on the hour mark, they regained the lead 0-9 to 0-8 but Sean O'Shea hit back to get Kerry back level.



### **HEALTH EXPENSES**

You can claim relief on the cost of health expenses. These can be your own health expenses, those of a family member or any individual's, as long as you paid for them. You cannot claim relief for any amounts that you have already received, or will receive

- any policy of insurance
- a public or local authority, for example, the Health Service Executive (HSE)
- any other source, such as a compensation payment.

You generally receive tax relief for health expenses at your standard rate of tax (20%). Nursing home expenses are given at your highest rate of tax (up to 40%).

### How do you claim health expenses?

You can claim relief on health expenses after the year has ended. You should wait for your P60 statement to arrive before claiming. You must also wait for the P60 statement from your spouse or civil partner if you are jointly assessed.

You can only claim for expenses that you have receipts for. You can claim relief on the last four year's health expenses.

### How to claim if you are a PAYE taxpayer

The quickest and easiest way is using our online service myAccount to complete a Form 12. You can do this by following these steps:



### TODAY IS WORLD WATER DAY

March 22nd each year is global World Water Day. Officially assigned in 1993 by the United Nations General Assembly, it is a means of focusing attention on the importance of freshwater and advocating for the sustainable management of freshwater resources. The theme in 2019 is 'Leaving no one behind'.

When the 2030 Agenda was adopted in 2015 by the UN, all countries and stakeholders set out an ambitious agenda envisaging a world free of poverty, hunger and disease. A world where all life can thrive and where no one is left behind. But today, billions of people are still living without safe water - their households, schools, workplaces, farms and factories struggling to survive and thrive. Marginalized groups women, children, refugees, indigenous peoples, disabled people and many others - are often overlooked, and sometimes face discrimination. as they try to access and manage the safe water they need. This World Water Day is about tackling the water crisis by addressing the reasons why so many people are being left behind.

### CREATE A LOVE OF READING

It's never too early to start reading to your baby. Take a book with big, clear pictures of animals and read it to your children. Point to each animal, say its name and mimic the voice it makes. For example, point to the cow and say "moo," point to the dog and say "ruff ruff," and continue to do so with the other animals. Reading is an excellent activity that exposes your baby to new things and develops their ability to connect sounds to visual images.

### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Fabric softener damages the fibres in towels and creates a layer on top of the material which will prevent the towel from absorbing water as easily. It also means your towels will get rough more quickly, since the fibres are damaged. If you want to add a nice scent to your towels, go for a natural fabric softener from a nature shop. Drying them in the tumble dryer seems to make them nice and soft, but it actually causes them to absorb water less easily. They also get damaged guicker this way, which means you'll have to buy new ones sooner. You're better off drying them outside in the wind. The movement of them waving in the wind will cause them to remain soft. If you really want to dry them in the dryer, put it on the coldest setting.

### RARE CONDITION CAUSES CAT'S FUR TO GO FROM BLACK TO ALMOST COMPLETELY WHITE IN JUST ONE YEAR

Vitiligo, a condition that causes the loss of skin colour in blotches, affects around 1% of humans and is even rarer in animals. Elli, one of the few known cats suffering from Vitiligo, was born with a mostly black coat, but just one year after being diagnosed with this mysterious condition, her fur is almost completely white.

Nicole, the cat's owner, found Elli and her sister on a farm in Germany, when they were only fourmonth kittens. They were both in poor shape and in desperate need of medical attention, so Nicole adopted them and nursed them back to health. Both cats were black with white spots on their chests, which made them look like they were wearing fur tuxedos, but one day, Elli's tux started losing its colour. It was just a tiny white spot at first, but as months went by, her black coat turned into a black and white mosaic.

Over the next few months, more small white spots appeared on the cat's black coat, so Nicole took her to the vet to find out what was going on. She was surprised to learn that Elli was suffering from Vitiligo, but luckily the effect is purely aesthetic, so it doesn't bother the cat one bit and despite the radical change of colour, Elli is a healthy, happy and very playful pet.



### ON THIS DATE - MARCH 22ND

1969 - Sean Dunphy topped the Irish charts with The Lonely Woods of Upton.

2001 - The Government declared a national emergency in a bid to contain the Republic of Ireland's first foot and mouth outbreak in 60 years.

2002 - A 43-year-old woman living in Great Britain who was paralysed from the neck down and kept alive for more than a year on a ventilator won the right to have her life support switched off so she could "die with dignity".

The first thing you expect to be able to do when buying a swimsuit is swim in it, but that doesn't apply to the Gucci Logo Swimsuit, a €340 designer swimsuit that the company specifically stated should not come into contact with chlorine. The high-end one-piece swimsuit featured Gucci's iconic logo across the bust, cross-over straps, and had a vintage air to it. But since it's made of 80% and 20% elastane, two materials that just don't get along with chlorine, you wouldn't have wanted to be caught anywhere near a pool in this swimsuit.

By last September the swimsuit was sold out by all its online and most of its High Street stockists and apparently was on display far more at poolside's than beaches, which just goes to show that a brand name is more important than functionality by people with more money than sense.

### ZEPPELINS CAUSED A SAUSAGE BAN IN GERMANY

Zeppelin airships were a key weapon for the Germans during the 1914 to 1918 war but production placed a huge demand on cow guts, used to make gas holding cells. In order to manufacture the gas-holding bladders used in dirigibles, enormous amounts of cow intestines were needed and to ensure they could meet the war's demand, Germany and the countries it occupied were forced to halt all production of sausages. Nearly a quarter-million cows went into each Zeppelin and Military police were sent out to butcher shops, demanding the intestines of every cow in Austria, Poland, Northern France, and Germany.

Welcome back dear reader continuing on the Holy Spirit, Who is also our Counsellor. No-one gives coursel like Him. It's great to get help with issues from a counsellor or friend, or, if you have legal problems, you get counsel from your Solicitor, but the counsel the Holy Spirit gives goes way deeper than human wisdom. When a person repents of sin and confesses Jesus the Son of God as Lord, the Holy Spirit comes and lives inside of you and your human spirit is re-created and re-connected with God. You are changed (or born again as Jesus put it in John chapter 3) and have access, as a child of God born of the Spirit, to the Father and all His resources. In Jeremiah 33:3 God tells us that when we call upon Him, He will show us great and mighty things which we have not known. As we get to know the Lord through reading His Word and meditating on it, the Holy Spirit reveals God's truths into our spirit and transformation occurs within us. So where previously a person maybe was beset by terrible fears, as he or she learns what God promises in the Bible, that fear is driven out when they realise that God loves them and that He is for them so who can be against them? (Romans 8:31; 1st John 4:18) Do you know that God is for you friend? You may be for one football team and me for another - but God is for us! He is for you and not against you! You may not like where your life is right now, but circumstances are subject to change. It is pointless for you to do the same thing you have always done and expect different results. Call upon the Lord Jesus and ask Him to come into your life and heal you and He will forgive you of your sins (Romans 10:9). Holy Spirit will lead you and guide you (Romans 8:14), and you will begin to get to know God as the Good Father He is, and you will make better decisions based on God's wisdom founded upon His Love for you. 'You will hear a voice behind you saying this is the way walk in it whether to the right or to the left' (Isaiah 30:21). Receive the Spirit of God and be victorious!

This week we examine how to heal when trust is broken, or when betrayal happens. There are examples throughout history and in every religious script of serious betrayals, and many great pieces of literature contain betrayal as the main story. This occurs between individuals, e.g. Jesus and Judas; between countries, too many to mention and between religions e.g. Hindu and Muslim. So we all have a clear picture of what happens when betrayal occurs but how do we recover or heal from betrayal. For most of us this is not so easy to do. especially if it has happened in our lives more than once, or if the same situation or person keeps hurting us.

Everyone is different, so any guidelines for how to heal or forgive when betrayal has happened must fit for you, there is no one size fits all. Research in restorative justice, which means what justice helps the person wronged heal, and the person who has done wrong learn and accept the consequences in the most constructive way, has shown that some key steps or issues must be addressed. These steps are quite helpful to think of in terms of healing in relationships as

- The person who has betrayed or broken trust must acknowledge her behaviour has caused hurt or pain directly to the hurt person
- · The hurt or wronged person must face this person that hurt him and say what the effect of those actions has had on him
- · Sorry is a good start, but not enough, the person has to actively say what he is going to work on to do things differently in the future, and where or what help she will seek to ensure that this does not keep happening
- . The person who betrayed or hurt has to ask the person what will help to make it better as well, and accept whatever the wronged person asks for, within reason of course.

Now all of this sounds quite ideal, if not a bit confusing, but these are steps to start not end with. Good communication is the key, and a hurtful situation can be the opportunity to change a pattern.

Often the person who caused the hurt is no longer in our life, and then a way to begin the healing process is to imagine or actually write that person a letter, telling him or her all the pain it caused, then imagine or actually write a letter to yourself from that person asking for forgiveness. By forgiving others we start to heal ourselves.
