



Dermot J. O'Connell told the Killarney Outlook. Needless to say messages of support soon started to flood in from police forces all over the world, offering their personalised messages to Ceejay, referring to him as their colleague and wishing him all their best wishes. Ceejay started to become a little celebrity mascot for police forces all over the world.

An Garda Síochána also took Ceejay under their wing. Ceejay now has his own official Garda uniform, custom made to fit him and earlier this year he "graduated" from the Garda college

MILLTOWN PROJECT SHORTLISTED FOR AWARD

An inspirational Kerry project has been shortlisted for a share of funding from Bright Ideas, KBC Bank Ireland's €100,000 community support initiative.

For the first time this year, KBC's Bright Ideas also features a dedicated award for the most innovative environmentally friendly initiative, and the project shortlisted for the Special Green Award is the Grow Ourselves food project in Milltown, Co. Kerry.

The overall winner of this award is set to receive €2,500 funding, to be decided by a KBC judging panel. The Grow Ourselves project will make use of neglected spaces in Milltown to grow food, beautify abandoned spaces and grow fresh produce. The project will promote community interaction and knowledge sharing in the community through the preparation of a site for spring planting and installing a poly tunnel to allow winter growing.

There was also good news for another project from Kerry, which caught the attention of the judges for its creativity and passion and has been shortlisted to go forward to the National Final –National Learning Network Tralee's Outdoor Gym project at the NLN Centre, Clash Industrial Estate in Tralee.

National Learning Network's Outdoor Gym pro-



ject at the NLN Centre, Clash Industrial Estate in Tralee received €4,200 in funding. The outdoor gym will help people with physical, intellectual, sensory and mental health difficulties to get active and energised. By having access to an outdoor space for exercise and socialising, the learners will benefit from exercise and relaxation to relieve stress and anxiety, thereby promoting positive mental health, improving attention and learning outcomes. The funding will go towards the purchase of outdoor gym equipment with seating and paved areas for relaxation.



Bright Ideas is part of KBC's Brighter Futures programme which encompasses all KBC's activities which touch communities and organisations across Ireland, ensuring KBC helps customers, staff and communities share in a brighter future. A new EU funded project "Fish Trail", aimed at promoting and developing angling tourism in Kerry, was launched by Munster MEP Seán Kelly this week. The project has been secured for the county by South Kerry Development Partnership Ltd. (SKDP) and has project partners based in Slovenia, Denmark, Portugal and the UK. It is funded under the COSME funding stream and will run through 2017. It is supported in Kerry by Kerry County Council and Inland Fisheries Ireland as will involve working with all the key angling groups in the county. The project will also be supported by

the Film and TV Production course under Brian Nolan which is run through the Kerry ETB.

SKDP Project Manager Seán de Buitléar said the key aim of the project is to encourage anglers from the partner areas and beyond to visit Kerry for a fishing holiday. "We will develop a series "know how" videos for prospective anglers to provide them with key knowledge they need to enjoy the many different angling experiences they can find in Kerry" Seán said. "Our key goal is to ensure a potential visiting angler knows that there is always somewhere they can go fishing in Kerry, regardless of the conditions"

he added. "We will undertake a number of marketing and angling development initiatives including a fishing festival in conjunction with all Kerry partners, linking with our partner regions over the course of the project" Seán told the Killarney Outlook.

CEO Noel Spillane said that SKDP were delighted to secure another EU funded project for the county. "SKDP has a strong track record in applying for and securing EU funded projects that have brought many positive benefits to the region over the last number of years and I am sure this project will help develop the potential of angling tourism that exists in Kerry" Noel

MEP Seán Kelly said he was delighted to support the Fish Trail project and congratulated SKDP on securing the funding of just over €40,000. "There are significant funding opportunities available through Europe for development projects in Kerry and beyond and SKDP have been very pro-active in securing such funding and in developing links with similar organisations across Europe which I greatly welcome" Seán said. He added that projects such as Fish Trail have the potential to make a significant contribution to the economic development in Kerry through developing opportunities that exist in areas such as angling tourism".

IFI Director Seán Long welcomed the project for Kerry and said that they are delighted to be involved with such an initiative to promote and develop angling in Kerry.

KCC Tourism Officer John Griffin said that activities such as angling tourism have the potential for significant growth in Kerry and they would be working with SKDP to help maximise the benefits of the Fish Trail project for the county.

On 21st October Cllr. Niall Kelleher will be sleeping out on the grounds of Cork City Gaol to shine a light on the issue of homelessness in Ireland today.

"I am joining others to raise funds to support the vital work of Focus Ireland and their aim to end homelessness in Ireland", he told the Killarney Outlook. Family homelessness has reached historic proportions in Ireland with more than 2100 children living in emergency homeless accommodation in Ireland often unable to get to school, rarely getting a home cooked meal and sinking into darkness.

"I don't want to accept this as todays landscape in Ireland so I'm joining my peers to make a difference", he added.

"As a member of a local authority dealing with housing applicants that struggle to find homes to rent due to our rent caps and the lack of property to rent, people are couch surfing with the help of family and friend this is something

that nobody should find themselves in this position. I hope to highlight this issue while at the same time raising much needed funds for a charity that deals

KERRY AMATEUR RADIO GROUP GO TRANSATLANTIC FOR **HISTORIC LINKUP**

In commemoration of the 150th anniversary of the Transatlantic Cable from Valentia Island to Hearts Content, Newfoundland, the Kerry Amateur Radio group (KARG) established a HF (high frequency) linkup with the Radio Amateurs of Canada, operating with callsign VO1TAC, as part of their AGM on Saturday 10th Sept. The Radio Amateurs of Canada AGM was being held in conjunction with the Hearts Content cable station 150th anniversary Hamfest. The Hearts Content cable station is the site of the first permanent transatlantic cable coming ashore from Europe in 1866.

Cyrus Field IV, an ancestor to the famous Cyrus West Field, was in attendance at the AGM, and was part of the transatlantic cable radio link-up between Hearts Content and Valentia Island. Cyrus West Field was the person responsible for the success of the transatlantic cable in 1866.

This historic event by KARG was a resounding success, with several two-way contacts made with VO1TAC Hearts Content cable station. Many other two-way contacts were also made during the event stretching from Indonesia to west coast USA. KARG also contacted a visiting US radio amateur John, all the way from California, operating from his car on Inch beach just across the water from Valentia, on the Dingle peninsula.

KARG would like to extend thanks to the Valentia Island Development Group for allowing the use of the cable station for this event, and look forward to making the anniversary of the transatlantic cable an annual event. Kerry also had two other cable stations, which came after

the Valentia station, one in Waterville and one in Ballinskelligs, which makes this region very significant in communication history. Many people may be unaware that the very first East-to-West voice communication across the Atlantic was made from the Marconi station in Ballybunion in March 1919 to Cape Breton, Nova Scotia.

KARG will also be running an event in 2017 to celebrate and promote the Wild Atlantic Way (WAW), in conjunction with the other eight counties along the west coast. Reply: Following consultation with the Killarney Access Group, it is intended to provide one disabled parking space adjacent to the Cultural Centre. Works will commence this week.

When will work begin on the new extension to Old Kilcummin Cemetery.

Reply: The extension to Old Kilcummin Burial Ground will commence before the end of 2016. At the recent Killarney Municipal area meeting Councillor Michael Gleeson asked that the Council in consultation with relevant organisations would actively pursue the development of Fishing Stands along the banks of the River Flesk.

The Council replied that it has recently concluded the purchase of lands adjacent to the River Flesk and that it will actively progress this project over the coming months.

Councillor Gleeson welcomed the positive response and said that he hoped that the development[s] when completed would enrich the lives of many people."


MILLTOWN COMMEMORATE 1916

What is seen as a tradition and an integral part of supporters chance to welcome back their footballing heroes failed to materialise last Monday evening.

Twenty four hours previous the Kerry minor team had won their third All Ireland minor title at this grade defeating a fancied Galway side in a game which despite the score line remained a battle until the closing stages.

The Kerry GAA released a statement via their website stating, "The victorious Kerry Minor Team return home this

evening. Their achievement of completing an historic 3 in a row of All Ireland titles for Kerry will be recognised by the County Committee during the County Senior Football Championship double bill in Fitzgerald Stadium on Sunday October 2nd." Despite this clarity of the situation it left many local fans fuming and airing their views at what was seen as a disappointment of a decision.

On Monday Cllr Mike Kennelly whose late brother Tim won five Senior All Irelands medals as well as captaining the 1979 side, called on the County Board of the GAA to explain its decision not to hold a homecoming event for the three in a row All -Ireland winning Kerry minor team.

On Tuesday a homecoming did go ahead as Kenmare GAA led the way with up to 5,000 people heading to Kenmare. Team captain Sean O Shea told the crowd "It was a night he would never forget" as he thanked his club Kenmare Shamrocks and the local clubs for turning out in numbers



IT'S CARBON MONOXIDE AWARENESS WEEK

Here are the top six tips for staying carbon monoxide safe in your home.

- 1. Know where it comes from: CO can be produced by any fuel when burned - coal, turf, oil, gas or even wood.
- 2. Service appliances: Have fuel burning appliances serviced annually by a Registered Gas Installer, Registered Oil Technician or a qualified service technician for your fuel type.
- 3. Chimneys, flues and vents: Keep vents and flues clear and make sure that rooms have proper ventilation. Ensure chimneys are swept annually.
- 4. Know the danger signs: Staining, sooting

or discolouration around appliances or condensation or dampness on walls and windows in the room once the appliance is lit.

- Symptoms: Unexplained headaches, dizziness, nausea, drowsiness, particularly when a fuel burning appliance is on could be the result of carbon monoxide. Other clues include others in the property (including pets) suffering from the same symptoms and symptoms improving when you are away from the property.
- 6. Alarm: Have at least one audible carbon monoxide alarm installed in your home and anywhere else you burn fuel, to protect you and your family. Carbon monoxide alarms are available in most hardware or DIY shops.

Ensure your family and friends know the dangers too and help spread the word during Carbon Monoxide Awareness Week.

- Eating slowly and savoring your food.
- Trying to taste both the flavor and the texture; imagining how the texture changes as the food is slowly broken down by your saliva.

- Remove white pasta and white rice and replace with wholemeal pasta and brown rice.
- · Remove pre-made meals in cans, packages and frozen forms and replace with the ingredients that go to making that item from scratch.
- Remove processed desserts and replace with fruit, yogurt and healthy dessert choices.







TAX Matters with



TAXATION OF SOCIAL WELFARE AND OCCUPATIONAL PENSIONS

In general, all income arising from pensions in Ireland is subject to taxation. There is no mechanism for taxing social welfare pensions at source.

The most common situation is where a pensioner has both an occupational pension and a social welfare pension. If the occupational pension is paid from within Ireland, it is taxed in the same way as a wage or salary. This means that you are allocated tax credits in the normal way.

In order to tax your social welfare pension your annual tax credits are reduced by the tax arising on your social welfare pension. For higher incomes, the standard rate cut off point will also be reduced. You then effectively pay tax on both the pensions, but it is collected from the occupational pension. The same arrangement applies if you have income from a job and a social welfare pension.

If your other source of income is not taxed through the PAYE system, for example if you have an occupational pension from abroad or you have investment income, then you are required to complete a tax return and your tax is payable annually by 31 October each year.

This is certainly a golden age for underage football in the county as three All-Ireland Colleges titles (PS Chorca Dhuibhne in 2014 and 2015) and St Brendan's College Killarney) have won a hat-trick of All-Ireland Colleges senior titles while Peter

Keane's Kerry minors claimed their county's 14th All-Ireland Minor crown and a second hat-trick of title, the first achieved between 1931 and 1933.

The first of these magic moments of brilliance came in the 28th minute of the first half when David Clifford, with a spectacular one-handed catch, turned provider to set up full-forward David Shaw for his goal and Kerry's second of the game.

Then with 50 minutes gone on the clock, the Fossa teenager received a wonderful crossfield pass from Dara Moynihan, Clifford 50 yards out from goal used his considerable pace and skill to leave Galway's Adam Quirke and Sean Mulkerrins trailing in his wake and had only one thing on his mind as he rifled an unstoppable ball to the top corner of the net. Kerry who were never headed throughout the tie, were now five points clear and on the road to victory but Galway must deserve credit as they pushed Peter Keane's charges all the way. In the first half, the Connacht champions had the majority of the possession but couldn't transfer this onto the scoreboard.

The westerners missed a great goal chance in the ninth minute when Kerry keeper Billy Courtney, somehow managed to get a foot to John Maher's fisted effort having initially thought that the ball had gone out of play. Galway, who are noted for traditional, open football, adopted a defensive set-up with full-forward Sean Rafferty sacrificed as the sweeper.

Kerry had stars in defence in particular David Naughten who kept a tight leash on Galway's marquee forward Rob Finnerty while Michael Potts, Daniel O'Brien and Michael Foley were outstanding in the half-back line.

Dara Moynihan worked tirelessly for the cause and was a worthy Man of the Match. The Spa



youngster added two fine points to Kerry's total and worked effortlessly throughout the

It was a fairy-tale ending too for Cormac Linnane, who missed last year's campaign through injury. The Beale youngster played his part in Kerry's road to the final, scoring in the last four games.

The Connacht champions succeeded in frustrating the Kerry forwards who found scores hard to come by as did their opponents. Kerry had registered just two scores by the 18th minute while Galway had to wait until the 20th minute of the first half for their first score, a point from Des Conneely.

Sean O'Shea from a free, opened Kerry's account in the 2nd minute, while Diarmuid O'Connor was on hand to fist Sean O'Shea's point attempt to the net for Kerry's goal. This score came totally against the run of play. Despite a point from Galway's Cein Darcy, it was Peter Keane's charges who led 2-2 to 0-2 at the break despite the westerners dominating the possession and the territorial stakes. A physically strong, manly Galway resumed in determined fashion and points from Adam Quirke and Rob Finnerty, (2) cut the gap to three but Kerry hit back with a fine individual score from full-back Niall Collins.

Galway were beginning to dominate and had the Kerry defence in trouble. When Ryan Forde and Man of the Match Dara Moynihan exchanged points, just a goal separated the sides. Rob Finnerty, from a free, and Des Conneely added points for the Tribesmen and at this stage, Galway looked set to record a famous victory.

Then came Clifford's second moment of magic in the 52nd minute which turned the tide and pushed the Kingdom five clear.

Rory Cunningham added a point for Galway but Kerry ran out winners with points from

Dara Moynihan, Sean O'Shea (free) and sub Cormac Linnane. It was a memorable day for this young Kerry side, their manager Peter Keane (who took over from Jack O'Connor at the start of the year) and his selectors Tommy Griffin, James Foley, Chris Flannery and Padraig Murphy It was an extra special day for the seven members of the panel from that famed football nursery St Brendan's College Killarney who added an All-Ireland medal to the All-Ireland Colleges title they won earlier this year.

This game between Galway and Kerry was a joy to watch the tension all through was palpable and felt on the stands but on the field of play both teams played excellent football.

Full credit to the Kerry Supporters Club who were there in numbers to cheer on their team, despite the fact that many loyal members, who travel to games all over the country, had to stay at home because they were unable to secure tickets on this occasion.

LONELINESS IN OLDER ADULTS



At SouthWest Counselling Centre we are meeting more and more elderly people who are feeling isolated and alone. What strikes me is that whilst there is a lot of emphasis on help and support for

younger people there is less awareness of the availability of supports for older people. As we all know, life is an ongoing journey that can present challenges at any stage along the way. Bereavement, loneliness, declining health, fear of crime and loss of loved ones through emigration are issues that many older people are dealing with. Counselling can provide a clear space to do this and offers support and gives us a fresh perspective on things.

Many older people are feeling lonely and isolated due to a lack of social contact and connection. Social isolation has been shown to have a detrimental effect on health and well-being. It is vital therefore that we stay connected, and whenever possible reach out to others and remain actively involved in life. As social beings, most of us feel the need for social contact and relationships. Therefore I would encourage someone who is feeing lonely to establish what opportunities for social connection already exist in their community. It doesn't matter initially whether they get anything out of the actual activity, as they may meet someone of like mind and it is a great opportunity for social connection.

There are many activities in which they can join. Adult education classes can be a great way to meet like-minded people whilst also acquiring new skills. They can also help to boost our confidence and make social interaction more pleasurable. Getting involved in Community Action Groups, Local History Groups or Sporting Activities can all be very enjoyable. Participating in local church activities, organised outings or book clubs can also help to feel more connected to others. Treating ourselves to massage or reflexology can also help to relieve loneliness. Another useful activity is letter writing, perhaps for a worthy cause - such as Amnesty International. Technology forums such as the internet may provide relief from boredom and loneliness. Perhaps you could enlist the help of a young person to learn these skills. If you are feeling lonely, reach out and talk to someone today.

Know Your Rights:

NEW EARNED INCOME TAX CREDIT

I am self-employed and make a tax return each year. What is the new tax credit for self-employed people? How do I apply for it?

ANSWER

From 1 January 2016, a new Earned Income tax credit of €550 is available for self-employed people (in addition to the normal personal tax credits and other reliefs). Proprietary directors who are not eligible for the PAYE employee tax credit can also claim this credit.

This Earned Income Tax Credit is calculated at 20% of your self-employed (or earned) income. It does not include any earned income that is taken into account for the PAYE employee tax credit. Note that if you also qualify for the PAYE tax credit, the combined value of both tax credits cannot exceed €1.650.

The maximum relief for 2016 is €550. However, if your earned income is below €2,750, the tax credit is restricted to 20% of the income. For example, if your total earned income is €2,000 your maximum tax credit is 20% of this or €400.

As a self-employed person you pay tax under the selfassessment system. Under this system (known as "Pay and File") you must file your return, complete a self-assessment, and you must pay the balance of tax outstanding for the previous year. At the same time, you must pay preliminary tax (an estimate of tax due for your current trading year) for the current year. When you pay preliminary tax for 2016 you can include the Earned Income tax credit in your calculations. However the new Earned Income tax credit is not available for the 2015 tax year.

The date for payment of tax and filing of returns is 31 October each year. For 2016, if you file your tax return online using the Revenue Online Service (ROS), the due date is extended to 10 November 2016.

SOWING HARDY ANNUALS

It may seem a long time away, but sowing some hardy annuals now will give you a very impressive display in early spring. Most hardy annuals can be sown in autumn and will overwinter quite well.

Hardy annuals are plants that will grow and flower for one year

When sowing your seeds, dig the soil over well, to about a spades depth, then rake it over and firm it down, and make sure it is weed free. A good idea before sowing your seed is to mark it out by sprinkling some sand on the on the area you're going to sow the seed on. Also don't sow the seed into soil that is too rich, as this will only encourage too much leafy growth and not enough flowers. If the soil is rich there is no need to use fertilizers.

You can also scatter the seed over the whole bed, and try and leave about a 1/4 of an inch between them and cover them lightly with some compost and water well, but make sure there is a fine rose on your watering can. There is a range of hardy annuals to choose from so make sure you know the heights and spread and, of course, the colour.

HELP YOUR SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENT TO HELP THEMSELVES:

If as parents, you continuously do everything for your children, it could lead to them becoming completely overwhelmed by the world once they reach adulthood. The following are some basic life skills – continued from last week - that "experts" believe they should have by the time they reach 3rd level education:

*If your child is aged 12 upwards, have them go to the local supermarket and pick up five or six things for you. This will teach them to navigate through such stores on their own, and get used to which sections they need to find the things they want.

*The moment you feel that members of your child's age group are responsible enough to look after themselves at a matinee film or in town is the right moment to allow your child to plan an outing. Have them walk you through what they have in mind, taking care not to project your fears for them in such a way that they become fearful of the world. Planned outings with friends will allow them to spread their wings and explore the world around them safely and responsibly.

*Refrain from packing your teenagers backpack for him or for her. After all, that backpack will become a work bag or briefcase one day. If they manage to do this without you intervening at all, then the likelihood is that they'll have no problem organising themselves when they're on their own at college or preparing for a new day at work.

*With 3rd level education or work facing your teenager in the not too distant future, it's inevitable that there'll be dates and outings with friends, girlfriends or boyfriends sooner rather than later. That's why they need to practice ordering their own food in a polite, respectful manner. Looking like a self-entitled jerk with a credit card is never a good look.

*Teach them to talk to strangers - While this point might seem like the polar opposite to what we normally teach our children, it actually isn't. Think of how to teach them to filter out (and avoid) the few very creepy strangers from the vast numbers of relatively normal ones that they're likely to encounter throughout their daily lives. You can get the ball rolling in this regard by sending your teenager to a shop that's within walking distance of your home, and have them ask the sales clerk for specific help.

*Gradually start allowing your teenager to use public transportation to get to and from places in your local area (providing that it is safe enough to do so). Practice over the years will allow them to be completely self-sufficient in this regard by the time they're about start college.

TODAY IS NATIVE AMERICAN DAY:

Many thousands of years before St. Brendan discovered America or Christopher Columbus' ships landed in the Bahamas, a different group of people discovered America: the nomadic ancestors of modern Native Americans who hiked over a "land bridge" from Asia to what is now Alaska more than 12,000 years ago. In fact, by the time European adventurers arrived in the 15th century A.D., scholars estimate that more than 50 million people were already living in the Americas. Of these, some 10 million lived in the area that would become the United States. As time passed, these migrants and their descendants pushed south and east, adapting as they went.

By the time the first explorers and settlers arrived from Europe, Native Americans had populated the entire North American continent, from the Atlantic to the Pacific, and from the Gulf of Mexico all the way to the northern reaches of Canada and were relatively settled hunters and farmers.

After European contact and especially after Spanish colonists brought horses, Native Americans became much more nomadic. Groups like the Crow, Blackfeet, Cheyenne, Comanche and Arapaho used horses to pursue great herds of buffalo across the prairie. The most common dwelling for these hunters was the cone-shaped teepee, a bison-skin tent that could be folded up and carried anywhere. By the end of the 19th century, white sport hunters had nearly exterminated the area's buffalo herds. With settlers encroaching on their lands and no way to provide food for their families, the natives were forced onto government reservations.

The 4th Friday in September is set aside to honour and celebrate All Native Americans, still commonly referred to as American Indians, the term "Native Americans" has been used in recent years as a sign of respect and recognition that they were indeed the first people to populate that great nation.

DOCTORS REATTACH HEAD OF BOY DECAPITATED IN CAR CRASH IN MEDICAL MIRACLE:

16 months old Jackson Taylor nearly died after a car accident more almost a year ago. He was travelling with his mother and nine-year old sister in their car when their vehicle collided head-on with another car.

Jackson's older sister was hurt, but he sustained a far more serious and potentially fatal injury. The force of the impact caused his head to be internally decapitated.

Medics airlifted the toddler to a hospital in Brisbane, Queensland, where X-rays revealed the child's head was brutally pulled from his neck internally. His spinal cord was damaged, but it fortunately survived. It was the worst injury of its kinds that his doctors have seen.

"A lot of children wouldn't survive that injury in the first place," said Geoff Askin, who is known as the godfather of spinal surgery in Australia. "And if they did and they were resuscitated, they may never move or breathe again."

In a six-hour long operation, Mr. Askin and his team attached a halo brace to the child's skull and completely immobilised his neck, head and shoulders. The medical team also had to make sure that the toddler was completely still because the rest of the operation involved reattaching the vertebra with a tiny sliver of wire and then using a piece of the boy's rib to graft the two vertebrae together.

It is expected that Jackson will be able to lead a normal life, without disability.

TWO FRIENDS **GIVE** HOMELESS **PEOPLE** THE DIGNITY OF FRESH **SHOWERS EVERY WEEK:**

When you're homeless, you don't have much. You don't even have a reliable way to make yourself clean and presentable.

As filmmaker Carlos Miller sat in a coffee shop in Palm Beach County one day he noticed the perpetual problem homeless customers had with getting service. It seemed to be caused mostly by their unkempt appearance. Then he had an idea that he thought might help with that problem and got together with his childhood friend, Chris Bentley, who leads a nonprofit group called Live Fresh Palm Beach

MARGARET'S RAMBLINGS

County. Together, they set a plan in motion that's changing lives.

They wanted to create a mobile shower service that could travel around the county, offering those in need a way to get a regular shower or bath at least once a week. It's such a great idea, the proposal won \$100,000 in funding from a philanthropy group called Impact the Palm Beaches. The funding represented \$1,000 each, donated by 100 women.

That money bought a brand new mobile hygiene centre. It's a 29 1/2 foot long trailer, air conditioned for summer comfort and with heated floors for the winter months. It contains six private shower/bath areas, three to a side. Each contains a sink, toilet, changing area and shower. Towels and toiletries are available for use, as are clean, donated clothing.

The trailer can hook up to water and sewer, where available. Where they aren't available, tanks provide enough water for up to 75 showers. Someone is always present to assist those using the facilities. In addition, a local community health organization offers health screenings for STDs and HIV for anyone who asks.

A Silverado 2500 pickup truck transports the trailer to various pre-designated locations throughout Palm Beach County on a regular, rotating basis. Live Fresh also hopes to arrange to bring the mobile unit to special events where it might be needed.

Mr. Miller and Mr. Bentley's motivation for taking on this mission is simple, they believe cleanliness is a fundamental human right.

THE SICHUAN GIANT PANDA SANCTUARIES IN **CHINA HOLDS MORE THAN 30%** OF THE WORLD'S PANDA **POPULATION**

The beautiful Giant Panda Bears have more than 2 million acres to roam, snack and play in a World heritage site and reserve in the Qionglai and Jiajin Mountains that contains 7 nature reserves, 9 scenic parks and the Wolong National Nature Reserve which is also the most important breeding site for pandas who are infamous for being difficult breeders in captivity,.

A panda baby is born pink, blind and without any teeth and weighs about 100-200 grams (3.5 to 7 ounces) at birth and are about 15-17 cm (6-7 inch) long. After a few weeks, the skin will turn gray, and by the time a month passes, the cubs are covered in extremely fluffy black and white fur. A panda cub will weigh about 100 pounds (45 kilos) by the time it is one year

The giant panda has a very large paw with 5 fingers and an added 'thumb' for climbing and holding on to bamboo while eating, and when fully grown can eat as much as 9-14 kg (20-30 pounds) of bamboo shoots every single day, on average, live to about 20 years in the wild and about 30 in captivity. A panda will always sit or lie down to eat. Most wild pandas spend all day feeding, sleeping or looking for food. However, unlike other bears from the same kind of climates, they do not hibernate in winter. Pandas are the most expensive animal by far for zoos, up to 5 times more than an elephant, the next most expensive animal.

The sanctuaries are also home to other globally endangered animals such as the red panda, the snow leopard and clouded leopard. They are among the botanically richest sites of any region in the world outside the tropical rainforests, with between 5,000 and 6,000 species of flora in over 1,000 unique species.

DOG TAKES A 4-MILE WALK INTO TOWN EVERY DAY JUST TO VISIT NEIGHBOURS:

About a dozen years ago, a man pulled into the driveway of Debbie and Larry LaVallee's home in Longville, Minnesota, holding a squirming little puppy. He told them he had found their lost dog. The pup wasn't theirs, but they couldn't resist the stray, who they believe had been abandoned. They took in the dog and named him Bruno.

But Bruno had other ideas and soon started wandering. Nearly every day, the dog makes the four-mile trek into town and has become a fixture with area residents who have dubbed him the town dog. He stops at city hall and the library, a couple of real estate offices and the ice cream shop, and of course the grocery store where his pals at the deli meet him at the back door with meat scraps they've put aside for him.

Sometimes people will give the aging dog a ride home at the end of the day if they see him ambling home. After all, at 12, Bruno's gait is a little stiff and it takes him a little longer to make that four-mile walk back after a day of visiting and accumulating treats and pats from his town family.

Although the town ambassador may not be around for much longer, he has already been honoured for his work as faithful mascot. Last year, the town erected a carved wooden statue in Bruno's honor in a park on the city's main street.

He also has his own Facebook page where people share Bruno sightings and photos of themselves with the unforgettable town visitor

GROVE OF 1,000-YEAR-**OLD TREES DISCOVERED IN GREECE:**

Researchers studying a remote section of the Pindos mountains in northern Greece have discovered a grove of ancient trees untouched for more than 1,000 years. The dozen millennium-old trees, all Bosnian pines, include one specimen that first set down roots at least 1,075 years ago.

That makes the tree nicknamed "Adonis" the oldest officially dated tree in all of Europe. Adonis is a practical youngster when

compared to the Great Basin bristlecone pine (5,000 years) in California's White Mountains or the Sacred Fig (2,300 years) in Sri Lanka.

FRANCE SAYS GOOD-BYE NON-BIODEGRADABLE PLASTICWARE: By 2020, all disposable dishware, utensils

and cups sold in France must be made of "biologically sourced materials" that can be composted. The country's ban comes after a plastic bag ban went into effect in July 2016. The decision is environmentally based and aims to reduce "the energy consumed and waste produced by the plastic processing industry, as well as the pollution caused by plastic litter." These new compostable products don't need to break down in a home compost system, though. They only need to break down in an industrial compost system. The people of France will still need to make sure these biodegradable plastics end up in the right place.

Not everyone is happy about the ban. Some people are concerned about the loss of jobs this ban could cause. Others argue the French countryside will be littered with plastic because people might think they can just leave their biodegradable plates and cups behind to become one with nature. Yet others say it is an "anti-social" measure because "families struggling financially make regular use of disposable tableware.

Of course for all of us, the best-case scenario to reduce one-time plastic use products would be for individuals, families, schools and businesses to make the choice to drastically cut back on their use without government intervention.



TAKE CARE ON THE ROADS AS DEER POPULATION GROWS

No matter where you drive – from rural roads to suburban streets – the threat of a collision with a deer is real.

Deer collision accidents are on the rise, partially because the deer population is growing.

Drivers who ignore deer warning signs or drive at speed along rural roads at this time of year make themselves an endangered species.

Deer collisions are most likely to occur during deer breeding season – from October through early January.

Prime times to find deer near the roadside are around dawn and from dusk to late evening. Deer are pack animals. So if you see one, be assured that others are usually close by.

Deer Season Driving Tips

ALWAYS WEAR YOUR SEATBELT – Sixty percent of fatal animal crashes occurred when the driver was not wearing a seatbelt.

KNOW THE LIKELY DEER-CROSSING ZONES

– Whether or not a road is marked with a Deer Crossing Sign, be especially alert for deer when driving on roads on the outskirts of town and in rural areas – especially where roads divide farm land from wooded land. Use your high beams – When driving at night, especially during peak hazard times, use your high-beam headlights when there is no on-coming traffic. This won't necessarily deter the deer from entering the roadway, but it will increase visibility so that you can more easily spot the deer sooner.

Know when deer are on the move – Be especially careful between 5AM and 8AM and between 5PM and midnight.

DON'T RELY ON DEVICES – Items like deer whistles, deer fences and reflectors have not been proven effective at deterring deer crossing roadways.

Brake firmly if you notice a deer near the road – Slow down and stop if necessary. Be careful not to swerve out of your lane either into oncoming traffic or off the shoulder and into a ditch.

KEEP YOUR DISTANCE – If you do strike a deer, don't approach it. An injured deer is frightened and can injure you as well as further injuring itself. If the deer is blocking the roadway, it poses a threat to other drivers; so call the authorities immediately.

CONTACT YOUR INSURANCE AGENT – If you strike a deer and have damage to your vehicle



or damage to some else's property, notify your insurance representative as soon as possible and provide the necessary details.

Drivers who find a deer caught in their headlights face an instant and impossible dilemma: do they swerve and risk a more serious crash, or do they suffer the trauma of killing a deer and severely damage their cars?" says Andrew Howard, the AA's head of road safety.

"Their best bet is to heed the warning signs, put up where accidents have happened or animals are known to cross, and to always drive at a speed that gives you time to react to what may suddenly appear in the road.

Drivers need to understand a little about deer, to think about how they can change their driving to avoid them, and to understand what to do if they do hit and injure one."

If you understand a little about deer then you can think about how you can change your driving to avoid them and know what to do if you hit and injure one.

- Accidents involving deer peak in May, October andNovember.
- Worst times of day are around sunrise and between sunset and midnight.

- Some areas have bigger problems than others.
- Deer accident hotspots include roads on the edge of the Killarney National Park.
- •'Deer' or 'wild animal' signs warn you that deer accidents happen in that area.
- A deer can appear almost instantly nature makes them hard to see and they don't follow the green cross code!
- Use high beam head-lights when it's dark, but dip them if you see a deer, otherwise it may freeze in your path. Don't dazzle other drivers though.
- If a deer appears suddenly it's safer to continue on your normal track rather than swerve or brake hard to try to avoid it. Sudden manoeuvres can result in a loss of control and increase the risk of hitting a tree or another vehicle.
- If you do hit a deer, try to stop somewhere safe. If you can't then do your best to ensure that your accident isn't hit by other vehicles.
- Report the accident to the police who will contact someone who can help the injured deer
- Bear in mind that if you miss the deer (or any other animal), but hit something else, it will be very hard to prove that the deer ever existed.
