

VOLUNTEERS HELP KEEP THE PARK CLEAN




WALKERS RAISE OVER €35,000 FOR CANCER RESEARCH

The Kerry Way Cancer Research Walk, which took place in Kenmare from 18 to 26 July 2015, attracted over 330 walkers from across Ireland and raised over €35,000 for cancer research programmes at Breakthrough Cancer Research.

Breakthrough Cancer Research is leading the way with research into cancers with poor

prognosis such as ovarian, pancreatic, lung and oesophageal. From their research laboratory, the Cork Cancer Research Centre in University College Cork, they have already seen five treatments progress from the laboratory to clinical trial. They work closely with multiple hospitals to ensure their research is responding to the needs of patients with cancers that do

not respond to conventional therapies. The Kerry Way Cancer Research Walk is an annual fundraising event that has gone from strength to strength over the last ten years and has raised over €635,000 to date for cancer research in Ireland.



We know that gyms don't suit everyone and it's important to remember that exercise can take any kind of activity such as walking or cycling, washing the windows, or vacuuming around the house. You may have heard about new medications that claim to help with weight loss. While a small number of these have been shown to be effective in supporting weight loss among obese individuals, this is only in combination with changes in lifestyle, for example eating less and being more physically activity.

One simple way to reduce calorie intake is to try and eat smaller portions of foods. Switching from fatty foods to lower-calories foods like wholegrain breads and cereals, and plenty of fruit and vegetables can also help.

Eating meals at regular intervals throughout the day can help with any hunger pangs don't forget to drink plenty of water

TO KEEP ON TRACK WITH A WEIGHT LOSS PROGRAMME, TRY TO:

- weigh yourself once a week
- keep a diary of your progress.
- keep a food diary of what you eat each day it's a really handy way to focus on what you are eating

and prevent you going back to old habits.

get a friend or family member involved as it will motivate you both!

If you don't have success with these changes, consult your GP, practice nurse or dietitian for more detailed advice. Fad diets and quick-fix pills are not long-term solutions to weight loss; think of small steps you can achieve over time and adopt these lifestyle changes for good.


SOUTH KERRY 4-13 CROTTA O'NEILLS 2-13

KILLARNEY **ATHLETIC -FOCUS ON RONAN** MURPHY

As we move into our final few articles this week we focus on another outstanding young player who was capped for Ireland and also in the Nottingham Forest Academy for a season. We also recall other activities and the achievements of the club up to 2010.

MURPHY CAPED **RONAN IRELAND**

Ronan became the 6th Athletic schoolboy player in 2011 to be capped for Ireland when he was part of the Irish under 16's team that travelled to Brussels to take on Belgium in an International friendly that year. Incidentally Ronan was the third Beaufort native along with Brendan Moloney and Bryan Murphy to achieve such an honour as part of Killarney Athletic. Ronan joined the club as an 8 year old in 2002 and was under the coaching guidance of Jerry Doyle for the following 8 years that saw him thread a similar path to his fellow Beaufort native Brendan Moloney. Jerry Doyle was running the under 10's coaching academy when Ronan joined and recalls, "we had Ronan playing in our under '10 teams when he was only 8 as he was a powerful young fellow and well able to play. We were also very fortunate to get his father Frank on board as he along with Sean Slattery were a fantastic support in the management of the team throughout".

KENNEDY CUP FINALIST

Ronan was one of only a very few Kerry players that played on the Kennedy Cup team for 2 years as he was on the team in 2007 and also a member of the 2008 team that were narrowly beaten in the final of that year. The Athletic and Kerry keeper that year was Steven Cahillane and he too contributed a huge amount to the team's success. Ronan says "looking back on it we could have won that final we had a great team and we had a huge amount of possession and dominated the game for a long period".

FOREST OPPORTUNITY

Although the Kerry boys did very well in the tournament and a few got trials afterwards none of them really got the opportunity to make the breakthrough into the next level of the game. However Ronan did benefit from the link-up that Athletic had with Nottingham Forest as a result of the signing Brendan Moloney in 2005. Jerry remembers the under 15's team trip to Forest in 2009 and says "it was a fantastic experience for the players and ourselves to be invited to the Forest Academy and to see what it was like on the ground there. We also played 2 matches while we were there against an Academy and a local team and all the people in Forest were very welcoming and good to us when we were there. And it was also nice to meet Brendan there as a full professional and 1st team player with the club.

The whole trip was very successful from a club

point of view and Ronan was selected and invited to join the Forest Academy in 2010".

FOREST AND STOKE EXPERIENCE

Ronan recalls "my first trip to the Forest Academy was during the mid-term break and I went over on different occasions after that also during school holidays. I was then invited to join the academy squad for the pre-season training at the start of the 2010/11 season. The training was very tough but I enjoyed it, we also played some games against other English league academy teams. There were some good players in the squad at the time. Patrick Bamford was in the academy and he presently plays with Crystal Palace and was named as the Championship Player of the Year last season.

I got a call-up for the Irish under 16 team also in 2011 for a friendly International match against Belgium in Brussels. I played at centre-back and although we lost the game it was a fantastic experience and a great honour to play for my country. The whole Forest experience was very good and I learnt a lot in the year I was there. I also spent a week on trial with Stoke City at

the end of the season and that was good too. However I decided that I would come home as I felt pursuing the life of a professional footballer was not really for me at the time".

It should be said also that Ronan is a multitalented sports person and has achieved great things with the Kerry minor and under 21 teams in the last 3 years and was also a national road race champion at under 14 level in 2008. Parents Teresa and Frank and sister Rachel can be well proud of his sporting achievements while Killarney Athletic hopes he will not be the last player from the club to be capped for Ireland or achieve what he has achieved as a voung player.

THE TEAM OF 2005/06

The club fielded many very good sides throughout its history at both underage and senior level and the Athletic senior squad of 2005/06 represented all that was good in the club. The team was made up mainly of players who had played up along at all ages levels for the club, and the team management of Eddie Doolan and Don Fennell were also long serving Athletic 'auvs'.

The side contested the 3 major KDL finals at

the end of a very successful season. Their first final saw them win the Castle Bar Cup when they defeated Tralee Dynamos on a 3 nil score line. John O'Donoghue played a big part in the Athletic win with a hand in all 3 goals. Martin Crowley was credited with the first and a brace of goals from Mark Pyne ensured an Athletic victory. However the tougher tests were to come against local rivals Killarney Celtic in the League and Greyhound Bar Cup Finals.

The Kerry league was split into two groups at the time and the top four teams played off in a semi-final knockout basis. True to form Athletic and Celtic who both finished top in the group stages met in the league final decider in Tralee and it was the 'hoops' who took the spoils for a deserved 2-1 victory. Two former Athletic underage players Steven Hayes and Peter McCarthy were on the score sheet for Celtic while Athletics' goal was scored by the outstanding Nicholas Murphy.

Celtic completed the double when a single John McDonagh goal separated the sides in the Cup final in a game where Athletic enjoyed most of the possession but could not break down a solid Celtic defence dominated by another former Athletic player David Hayes.

PITCH REDEVELOPMENT

The club was definitely a hive of activity during the first decade of the New Millennium both on and off the pitch. Catering for so many teams during the season as well as running the club's annual 7-aside required the club to expand the playing areas to cater for 2 full-size pitches in Woodlawn. As a result of this work the 2008 7-aside tournament also had to be moved and played in the Community College pitch through the generous support of principle.

CHANGE OF THE GUARD

With the near completion of the Woodlawn development plan Vince Casey passed the baton of club treasurer on to the able hands of John O'Donoghue while Don O'Donoghue took over as club chairman from Mike O'Sullivan in 2008. Don was a player in the Athletic teams that played in the Desmond League back in 1965 to 1970 and got involved again in the club in the '90 when he became a club delegate in the Kerry District League and remains a member of the KDL.

BE SAFE - BE SEEN WHILST TRICK OR TREATING:

BE SAFE: Parents need to accompany young children while they are trick or treating.

Note that the Road Safety Authority advises that no child under the age 12 years should be allowed cross the road or cycle on the road without adult supervision.

To prevent falls, make sure your child's costume fits well, isn't too long and does not have too much loose fabric. Face painting is often a safer choice for trick-or-treaters than a mask which can block or obscure vision make sure your child is not allergic to any of the face paint ingredients. Dress for the weather, so your child and you are comfortable and warm. Consider 'trick-or-treating' in a group and staying together. Don't forget to: stop, look, listen and look again before crossing the road. BE SEEN: It is important that motorists can see you clearly. Parents and children should wear bright costumes/clothing made of flameresistant material with reflective tape, or carry light sticks or a flashlight.

Stay on footpaths and driveways. Stay off lawns and gardens. Avoid poorly lit areas. Check treats thoroughly:



Before eating treats, make sure that they are all checked by a responsible adult.

Discard treats that aren't in sealed packaging or look suspicious. Does your child have any allergies? When in doubt, throw it out!

CHOKING: Choking occurs most frequently among children under two years of age, but choking can happen at any age.

Do not give children under five years of age popcorn, boiled sweets, nuts, or rubber balloons.

When eating sweets, parents should have children sit down - remember eating while playing, running, jumping, etc can lead to a choking episode.

Budget 2016 - Farming

Budget 2016 presented a number of taxation measures for farmers:

- A new Farm Succession Transfer Partnership Model is being introduced. It is proposed to include an Income Tax credit of up to €5,000 per annum to the partnership for up to five years. This will enable an existing farmer to enter into a partnership with a younger farmer so that knowledge and control of the farm can gradually be transferred with the aim of having the entire farm transferred to the younger farmer within a period of ten years.
- In a move to begin equalising the tax treatment of the self-employed with employees, farmers along with other self-employed individuals will receive a new Earned Income Tax Credit of €550 from 1st January 2016.
- Forestry income has been removed from the 'High Earners Restriction' for forest owners who manage their plantations on a commercial basis.
- Extension of the General Stock Relief for young trained farmers for another 3 years.
- Relief on the transfer of Agricultural Assets has been retained at 90% for active farmers and for individuals who are not active farmers but who lease out the land on a long-term basis.
- Young Trained Farmers Stamp Duty exemption has been extended for another 3 years.

Know Your Rights: DEFINITION OF REFUGEE

OUESTION

I'm not very clear on the difference between an asylum seeker and a refugee. Can you explain?

ANSWER

The term refugee is commonly used to describe several categories of people. These categories of people may have different legal statuses and, as a result, they may have varying rights and obligations. The 1951 Convention relating to the Status of Refugees (often called the Geneva Convention) is the key legal document in defining who is a refugee, their rights and the legal obligations of states.

A refugee in Irish law is someone who "owing to a well-founded fear of being persecuted for reasons of race, religion, nationality, membership of a particular social group or political opinion, is outside the country of his or her nationality and is unable or, owing to such fear, unwilling to avail himself or herself of the protection of that country..." (Section 2 of the Refugee Act 1996 which mirrors Article 1 of the Geneva Convention).

- An asylum seeker is a person who seeks to be recognised as a refugee.
- A convention refugee is a person who has been granted refugee status under the terms of the Geneva Convention.
- · A programme refugee is a person who has been invited to Ireland under a Government decision in response to a humanitarian request, usually from the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR).

You can read updates on resettlement and relocation programmes on the Department of Justice and Equality's website, justice.ie.

Someone who is applying to be recognised as a refugee may also make an application for subsidiary protection. A person eligible for subsidiary protection is someone who does not qualify as a refugee but who would face a real risk of suffering serious harm if they returned to their country of origin. A person who does not fully meet the requirements of the definition of refugee may be granted leave to remain in the State for humanitarian or other compelling reasons. Leave to remain may also be granted to people who have been refused a declaration as a refugee and are not eligible for subsidiary protection.

HEALTHY OUTLOOK



UNHEALTHY RELATIONSHIP PATTERNS

Do you find yourself repeating similar patterns in different relationships or in a particular relationship over time. Perhaps you often feel lonely or jealous in your relationships. Maybe you try to earn the other person's attention by being overly nice or giving without paying heed to your own needs or desires. Do you fear rejection or being abandoned? Could it be that you choose partners who are distant and can make your feel and/or believe that you're not good enough. Do you focus so much on your partner that they feel stifled? Often these patterns can reflect our inner experiences and our beliefs about ourselves and our emotional availability to others.

Psychologist John Bowlby defined attachment as a 'lasting psychological connectedness between human beings' and attachment theory can help us to understand the ways in which we connect with others – particularly those who are emotionally significant to us. We develop our attachment style in childhood – and the way in which our parents and/or caregivers responded to us will impact on our relationships.

For example, a child who believed that the only way he/she could be loved was when they were doing something for others, may grow up believing that they need to earn the attention and love of others. Adults who believe they are inadequate and unworthy of love may have learned this in their early years - which will inevitably lead to difficulties in their relationships. They may believe that the other will leave them or that they are going to disappoint the other - leading to them clinging to the relationship and/or getting jealous easily.

However, the good news is that with awareness we can discover our own attachment style and learn to cultivate healthier relationships. Some of the ways in which we can bring more awareness to our relationship patterns include the following:

- 1. Bring your awareness to your bodily sensations. How do you feel in your body? Being aware of this can help you to understand how you are feeling and/or thinking.
- 2. What thoughts are you thinking about you/ the other? How do these thoughts impact on your feelings and emotions?
- 3. Which emotions do you struggle with how do these emotions affect your thoughts and beliefs about yourself?
- 4. Are you overly self-critical? Can you show yourself some selfcompassion, support and care the way you might a close friend or a small child?
- 5. Learn to communicate more directly about your thoughts, feelings and needs. Once you become aware of what these are then you can express them more fully to others.

Next week we will focus on the importance of communication and how counselling can help us to find our own voice, and become more confident as we make ourselves known to another person.

MOTOR NEURONE DISEASE

WHAT IS MOTOR NEURONE DISEASE?

Motor neurone disease (MND) causes a progressive weakness of many of the muscles in the body. There are various types of MND.

Nerves (neurons) are like wires that carry tiny electrical impulses (messages) between the brain, spinal cord and the rest of the body.

In motor neurone disease (MND), motor nerves become damaged and eventually stop working. Therefore, the muscles that the damaged nerves supply gradually lose their strength the muscles tend to become stiff as well as weak at first.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF EARLY **MOTOR NEURONE DISEASE?**

This disease affects different people in different ways. The cause is not known. It is thought that certain chemicals or structures that only occur in motor nerves are damaged in some way. The reason why the nerves become damaged is not clear.

Hand and arm symptoms. At first you may notice that your grip is less strong. You may drop things, and find it difficult to open bottle tops, turn keys, etc. You may also notice that the muscles in your hands (especially at the base of your thumbs) become flatter with time.

- Feet and leg symptoms. At first you may start to drag one leg or tend to trip easily. You may find it more difficult to climb stairs or rise out of low chairs. You may find you are much more tired after walking.
- Bulbar muscle symptoms. You may not be able to shout or sing. Your speech may become slurred. There may be a change in the quality of your voice. You may experience some difficulties with swallowing as the muscles which coordinate swallowing become affected.
- · Other symptoms that may occur include: muscle cramps, tiredness, twitching of weakened muscles (fasciculation), and jerking of an arm or leg whilst you rest.

The rate at which the disease progresses varies from person to person. Muscles weakened by ALS-MND do not recover. However, weeks or months may go by where the disease does not seem to progress. Eventually, severe disability develops.


















PROTECTIONS FOR MACAWS

Two bird species, the military macaw and the great green macaw, have both been listed as endangered under the U.S. Fish and Wildlife's Endangered Species Act. Both are endemic to Central and South America and were found to be in decline. The main threats to the two birds are habitat loss and poaching. It's estimated between 1,000 and 3,000 great green macaws are left in the wild, and 6,000 to 13,000 military macaws. With the designation, importing or exporting the birds will no longer be allowed in the U.S.

resurfacing, in 2013, governments, businesses, and donors invested \$12.3 billion in naturebased solutions to protect and restore watersheds across an area larger than India. The National Water Authority of Peru, for instance, has approved spending \$23 million on so-called green infrastructure. Projects are likely to include the repair of a 1,500-yearold water management system created by a pre-Incan civilization called the Wari. Canals etched into the Andes Mountains siphon off river overflow in the wet season. Over several months, the water filters down through the mountains and emerges from springs during the dry season. By repairing the Wari's work, the city of Lima would cut its dry-season water deficit by up to 40%. Another proposed project would restore high-altitude grasslands that were degraded by excessive animal grazing. Chinese government agencies accounted for the lion's share of the billions of dollars invested worldwide in natural watershed projects in 2013. For example, two-thirds of the Miyun watershed that supplies Beijing lies in neighbouring, poorer Hebei province. To protect the Miyun watershed, Beijing Municipality channelled more than \$103 million between 2000 and 2014 to local governments in neighbouring rural areas, reforesting 119,000 acres of land and compensating local farmers for reducing water and fertilizer use over 255,000 acres.

CUDDLING CATS **KFFPS** THEM HEALTHY

Scientists recently found that interactions like petting, brushing, and talking to your cat not only make her purr when you spend some quality time together, but they also help to

ensure she'll be around to do so for many years to come. In the study 96 shelter cats were split into two groups. In the first group, each cat got positive interaction from the same person 10 minutes at a time, four times a day, for 10 days. The control group, meanwhile, spent the same time every day with a researcher simply standing in front of their cage with eyes averted, much like you might experience at a typical animal shelter. At the onset of the study, all participating cats had been deemed healthy. However only the cats who had experienced regular gentling had maintained their content dispositions. Also, they were far less likely to get sick. In fact, 17 or the 49 cats in the control group wound up with upper respiratory disorders, compared to only nine of the gentling group.

PREVENT HEAT LOSS IN YOUR HOME

- Hanging up a thick set of curtains can protect your home from losing heat from the windows. You can invest in a set with thermal lining, and if you don't want to buy a new set, you can simply add lining to your current curtains. Buy a cheap material like fleece and sew it on. This trick also works for doors that lead to outside, which can also make your home lose heat. Hang a curtain in front of these doors, or pin a thick blanket over the back of the door.
- Make use of sunlight during the day as this is a natural source of free heat. Keep your window shades and curtains open during the day and when dusk falls, close the curtains as this maximizes your home's ability to retain
- A draft excluder can be any piece of material or clothing stuffed with insulating materials. Purchase one, or if you feel like a DIY project, make your own by stuffing a pair of tights with socks, rice, lentils or even gravel and place at the bottom of doors to prevent warm air from escaping through the bottom.
- Cold could be entering through the smallest of spaces, creating a mini-draft. The main areas to consider are letterboxes, wide keyholes in older homes, and dog or cat flaps. To cut out the air from your letterbox, install an extra barrier with a door brush. For drafts from keyholes, you can buy a keyhole cover that slips over the top of the hole. Pet flaps can be easily insulated with wool insulation or a small blanket.

REFUGEES LEARN SMALL-**BUSINESS SKILLS** AND SUSTAINABLE FARMING IN THE U.S.

In 2009, the International Rescue Committee, a New York-based international NGO that brings aid and relief to refugees, started the New Roots programme. IRC works with local municipalities in the U.S. to turn unused land into small-scale community farms where refugees can grow produce. In 2013, the programme took it a step further and created the MicroProducer Academy, funded by Chipotle's Cultivate Foundation. Chipotle granted New Roots \$200,000 to launch a school for refugees where they could learn practical skills toward turning farming into a small-business venture. In 2014, it renewed the grant, this time worth \$500,000, to cover costs until 2016. Aside from bringing African farmers closer to their agrarian roots, the program hits two key issues: fresh food for low-income refugee families and new avenues for livelihood. Classes at the academy cover everything from understanding the U.S. food system and sustainable farming techniques to food preparation and marketing tactics for selling crops at markets and to restaurants. Since the academy's inception, 150 MicroProducers have graduated from the program. New Roots maintains urban farms and community gardens in 22 cities around the U.S., while the MicroProducer Academy operates in eight cities and focuses on developing agricultural skills of refugees who had similar jobs in their home countries

SEAL DISCOVERED BY HERD OF COWS

Celebration the seal pup was just a few days old when she became separated from her mother back in July and ended up stuck in the mud in Britain's Frampton Marsh nature reserve, where a herd of 30 cows found her and gathered around to investigate the strange new arrival. Ian Ellis was bird-watching when he spotted the unusual grouping of cows. He pulled out his telescope to take a close look and was shocked to see a seal pup in the middle of the curious bovines. Rescuers guickly arrived on the scene and, when it became clear her mother was nowhere to be found, they took the little pup in for care. She was underweight and dehydrated, and soon developed a lung infection. But she found a temporary home at Skegness Natureland Seal Sanctuary, which helped to raise her and provided medical care for her infection. She also found a friend in a seal named Charlie who came in around the same time she did. On October 13th Natureland decided she and Charlie had finally put on enough weight to return home. The team from Natureland brought Celebration back to the ocean, which she hadn't seen since she was a tiny pup. But as soon as the doors to their cages were raised, she and Charlie immediately began to waddle back to the waves that they call home.

CACTI ARE **ALSO ENDANGERED**

Despite their ability to thrive in conditions many living things find unbearable, cacti are in decline. Like many plant and animal species that are inching towards extinction, loss of habitat is a major factor, particularly


as wild spaces are converted for agricultural purposes. But the member of the plant family Cactaceae faces another big threat: the unscrupulous collection of live plants and seeds for horticultural trade and private ornamental collections. In a recent study 1,478 species of cacti were evaluated, 31% were found to be threatened. A high concentration of threatened and endangered cacti can be found in southern Brazil's Rio Grande do Sul and Uruguay's northern Artigas region. The threats cacti face vary somewhat by region. In coastal areas of Mexico's Baja California and in parts of the Caribbean, residential and commercial development is also a major threat. Collecting cacti for the plant trade is more concentrated along the coasts of Chile and Brazil.

AN OFFICE FARM

Imagine going to work in an office, except instead of a cubical, your space is partitioned by lemon trees. The hallway to the conference room is lined with rice paddies, and orange trees sway from the executive balcony. For the workers in Tokyo's Pasona building, this is the reality. Created by Kono Designs, the office building is a lush working space that uses both soil and hydroponic methods to grow everything from squash to tomatoes. Automatic water and temperature systems means that caring for the food takes up little time. However, under the supervision of an agricultural specialist, all employees help out when the food is harvested. The fresh fruits, vegetables and grains are then brought to the cafeteria where they are used to create healthy, organic meals for the office employees.


The Pasona building is covered with vines and trees in the middle of one of the most bustling cities on our planet and is a giant leap forward from rooftop gardens. Rooftop and terrace gardens began to take off in 1990s Havana during a massive food shortage. Every bit of unused land was utilised for food creation. Seeing the good it was doing, the government soon got involved, helping fund and facilitate the use of these urban farms. By 1998 there were over 8,000 officially recognised gardens in Havana – from individually run plots to large State-run estates – all organic and producing about 50% of the country's vegetables.
