












KILBREAN PARK TO HOST FAI SEMI FINAL

The Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr Michael O'Shea and his wife Susan have enjoyed an action packed trip to Boston and New York to celebrate Dt. Patrick's Day.

The couple were joined by Kerry County Council's Tourism Officer, John Griffin for the

In New York, Cllr O'Shea presented the new Kerry Tourism Strategy, 2016-2022 to Billy Condon, Vice President of Tourism Ireland North America and met with Seamus Carroll, Vice President of IDA Ireland.

Cllr O'Shea visited the Irish Permanent Representative to the United Nations, Tim Mawe, to discuss securing UNESCO world heritage designation for the Valentia TransAtlantic Cable Project. He presented Mr Mawe, whose grand uncle taught in Valentia National School, with a section of the historic trans-Atlantic cable mounted on Valentia slate. It is hoped that Ireland and Canada will submit a joint application to UNESCO for World Heritage status for their respective cable station sites.

The Cathaoirleach attended the St Patrick's Day breakfast hosted the Mayor of New York, Bill de Blasio, in Gracie Mansion and met a number of prominent Irish-Americans including the New York Police Commissioner, Phil O'Neill. Later that afternoon he marched with the Kerry Association and Kerry Pipers in the New York St Patrick's Day Parade down Fifth Avenue.

Cllr O'Shea travelled to Boston on Saturday

The scenic ancient pathways of Killarney National Park welcomed 1000 competitors in heavy weather taking part in the very testing and enduring conditions the Quest Adventure Killarney at the weekend.

The event is part of St Patrick's Festival, Killarney and the endurance driven athletes cycled through the famous Black Valley, where they ran a section of The Kerry Way, along Cummenduff Glen, through O'Sullivan's Farm, the last house in the Valley. Then a tough incline onto The MacGillycuddy's Reeks to Curraghmore Lake, before turning back to complete their trail run

transition at Casey's Farm yard, a final bike ride through the Black Valley, along the challenging Kenmare Road to the finishing line at the Gleneagle Hotel, Killarney. The race included a 55Km Expert challenge and a 33Km and 28Km race of strength and great fun.

It was Mark Nolan, who powered through the landscape winning the overall race in an incredible new record time of 02:23:56, in second place was Michael Buckley in a time of 02:27:20, shaving a minute his time from last year. Third home was well known Cork, triathlete Mark Wolfe in a time of 02:30:04. Regina Sheehan was the First Lady home in the Expert 55Km in an amazing time of 02:27:24. Second place was Ger Kelly, 03:04:06

Race organiser, Oliver Kirwan from Quest Adventure said "Records were broken, the weather was very challenging for the athletes. We witnessed magnificent racing on Saturday, but without the support of the residents of the Black Valley, staff at Killarney National park, the Gleneagle Hotel and local volunteers, the event could not happen. The atmosphere, good humour and banter among the athletes and hard working organisers added to the great success of the day. It's all part of the Quest Adventure Experience"

A DREAM COME TRUE FOR IRELAND'S YOUNGEST GARDA

With a little help from Gardaí in Killarney, four year-old leukemia patient Ceejay McArdle's dream came true as he spent a St Patrick's Day to remember with the New York Police Department. Ireland's youngest garda from Castleblayney in Co Monaghan, has always been fascinated with the gardai and travelled to see the NYPD at the weekend. Our local gardaí here in Killarney organised a well attended fundraising coffee morning last September to support Ceejay and the money raised went to a fund to send the brave boy and his parents, Susan and Marcus, to New York so that he could

take part in the St Patrick's Day parade with members of the NYPD and An Garda Siochana. Ceejay has always had a huge interest in police work and wants to be a Garda when he grows up. His parents contacted the gardai and police units around the world and asked them to send Ceejay messages of goodwill, but the gardai went one step further and raised funds to help the little boy. They also arranged for Ceejay to be fitted for his own custom-made Garda uniform and he graduated from the Garda Training College in Templemore when he was made an honorary member of the force by Garda Commissioner Noirín O'Sullivan. Ceejay could hardly contain his excitement as he made

the trip to New York and was welcomed by the Emerald Society - the police and fire fighter's division for members of Irish heriatge. The NYPD officers said they were proud to welcome him to Manhattan and they ensured Ireland's youngest Garda had the time of his life.

"To everyone in Killarney that donated to our coffee morning, you can now see first-hand the happiness you brought this little man. Many thanks," said Garda GillianO'Donoghue who is based in Killarney and who was the organiser of the coffee morning last September in the Killarney Plaza Hotel.

In a post shared on Facebook, the NYPD showed how Ceejay marched down Fifth Avenue for the St Patrick's Day parade. Captain Megan O'Malley of the NYPD said: "The most amazing thing about his trip to New York is that it was funded entirely by his garda colleagues back home." EDDIE PLANS HIS 15TH TRIP TO KENYA

Fossa man, Eddie Sheehy will be hosting the annual fundraising table quiz for the Kenya Education Project on March 30th at 8:30pm in the Castlerosse Hotel. Eddie, a retired teacher and guidance counsellor, first visited the east African country in 2003 and has since made the trip annually. The project helps people in a poverty stricken area called Embulbul, located near the city of Nairobi in Kenya. Each year he spends a number of weeks teaching in the local secondary school, many of whose students are sponsored by money raised locally in Killarney. It costs €200 to sponsor a student in secondary school and €100 to sponsor a student in primary school. Some past pupils of

the school are also helped to continue their education and training by paying college fees as well as travel and subsistence allowances. To date the project has helped students to obtain training in childcare, computing, journalism and social work which is a major boost to their families in their dream of obtaining a job to ease the financial burden on their families. The project also supports a feeding programme in the village which provides a hot meal for 140 orphans each evening. Many of these poor children live in severe poverty catered for by neighbours and grandparents who constantly struggle to provide food on a daily basis. One of the success stories of the project is

the development of a soccer academy in the village to engage teenage boys and girls in a positive project which brings great pride ot all involved. The young team are very disciplined and focused and are achieving great success. The success of the project is due to the generosity of people in Killarney and Kerry who have supported the project since 2003, Eddie would like to say a big thanks to all the business people in Killarney who support the table quiz each year and to all the people and groups for their generous donations. 

Dr. Crokes, All Ireland Club Champions – sounds great; feels great; is great. Finally, the Hillary Step behind us and the summit of GAA football conquered. What do I remember? Just moments... special moments. The day is not a film in my memory... just snapshots of moments... special moments.

The butterflies of anticipation fluttered around the tummy, as we took our seats on two special trains to Dublin. How would we feel on our return? And later, when Croke Park suddenly appeared outside our window, a spontaneous roar reverberated through the entire train. It wouldn't be the last roar heard from the Crokes' supporters. Every street we walked, every restaurant, every pub we visited - the black and amber community were there. It appeared that Dublin was "Crokestown" today. We are used to entering Croke Park to support Kerry. But, today was different. We were here on a more intimate task; here for our own brothers, sons, husbands, fathers, friends; here for the Crokes; the Crokes in Croke Park. It felt right. And all of a sudden, the waiting was over. Johnny led our warriors on to the pitch and ready to do battle for themselves, for their families, for the whole Crokes family, for me. The next generation played their part too. Flag-bearers welcomed the team on to the field, proudly waving the black and amber. A broken leg wasn't stopping Leah from bringing the cup onto the pitch - "See you soon in

Killarney". Shane presents the match ball to the referee. The O'Connors played their music and danced at half-time. And our younger warriors, the next generation of players, got a taste of playing on the Croke Park turf. Many a promise was made to return to play the main event.

The ball is in and the game is on. Points shared; goals shared; a red card; heavy tackles; bodies on the line; some more points; playing keepball; sideline kick; final whistle; it's all over; All Ireland Champions, again.

Colm's reaction at the end of the game was so moving. A primal roar, eminating from deep within seemed to exhale, expel and exorcise that long-held hunger and need for this moment; finally finding that missing piece; all the hurt, all the disappointments, all the pain and suffering had finally been justified. And in this turmoil, the flood of pride, achievement, satisfaction and relief must was slow to abate that roar. And as he looked skywards to finally release the anguish of previous missed opportunities, his late mother and father must have been in his thoughts. Moving to see and it felt somewhat voyeuristic to watch such a personal, intimate and important moment.

Johnny climbs those magical steps and raises the Andy Merrigan Cup in triumph to his extended family, Dr Crokes. And one by one, the rest of the players have their well-deserved moment with Andy, particularly Club stalwarts Eoin and Colm. The raising of the cup would not be complete, without Stephen Brosnan having his turn. Then finally, Club Patron, Donie Sheahan, raises the cup above his head. Pride.

The players descend the steps to find their immediate family, to share the moment. Proud mothers hug their sons, as fathers pat them on the back, some finding it difficult to hold back the tears.

Under the Hogan stand, in the warm-up area, Pat gathers his men. They form a circle, the cup in the centre. A circle of men, who had climbed the highest peak; a circle of men with a special bond that can never be broken; kindred spirits; private words were spoken, passionate words, words that will be long-remembered with pride and fondness in old-age.

A snapshot of moments... special moments. But the most special, never to be forgotten, was when young Amy O'Connor, unusually, came "down" the steps of the Hogan Stand to raise the Andy Merrigan Cup; the chants of "Amy, Amy Amy..."; the roar, as she hoisted the cup; her infectious smile. As Johnny, so well called out, what an inspirational and exceptional girl. This Crokes team will inspire the players of the future. But Amy inspires us all. Her bravery, resilience and outlook is something we can all take inspiration from. This was THE moment for me... that moment that will linger... that most special moment.

The concept of eating slowly as a means to avoid overeating and ultimately help you loose Body fat, is based on the simple fact that your brain needs about 20 minutes to get the "signal" that you are not hungry anymore and that you can stop eating. 1. Reprogram your mind. Do not even attempt to acquire the habit of eating slowly before mentally rehearsing it in your mind for at least 21 days.Relax and use your imagination to create mental images, virtual pleasant experiences that your brain will register and remember. As part of this visualization process, imagine yourself lean and fit and:

Eating slowly and savoring your food.

Trying to taste both the flavor and the texture; imagining how the texture changes as the food is slowly broken

See a glass of water to drink before, with and after your meal to get the sensation of fullness in your stomach. Be sure to visualize a desired end result such as a lean, fit and energetic body. Also see in your mind the end result: how you are going to look in that dress or those jeans, suit, etc.

Consider keeping a food journal during this time, to map out the triggers surrounding your hunger. Note where you are, what you're eating, how fast you've consumed and how you feel after eating it (especially how hungry or otherwise you feel). This will be a useful source of information to draw on, as each person's hunger triggers and set points differ.



THERE'S NO SUCH THING AS FAILURE!



It is a well known fact that what we eat and drink can affect our mood. Our body and mind responds to what we digest not just on a physiological level but also on an emotional level. Capital Acquisitions Tax (CAT) - Treatment of gifts by children from their parents

Lifetime Parent to Child Exempt Threshold.

Capital Acquisitions Tax (CAT) is a tax that imposes a charge on individuals who receive gifts and inheritances where the value of the gifts and inheritances exceed that individual's lifetime tax-free threshold. A child is entitled to a life time tax-free threshold of €310,000 in respect of gifts and inheritances taken from his or her parents. Where the aggregate of the gifts and inheritances received by a child from a parent exceeds €310,000, only the excess is charged to tax.

Small Gift Exemption.

In addition to this €310,000 tax-free threshold, the first €3,000 of gifts to a child in any year is exempt from CAT under the annual small gifts exemption. This means that each parent can give a gift to a value of €3,000 to a child (or to anyone else) each calendar year without any CAT charge arising. So, two parents can make gifts to a child to the value of €6,000 in any year free of CAT. Indeed, two parents could, if they wished, gift €12,000 in total each year to each son or daughter and their respective partner (e.g. fiancée, fiancé, daughter-in-law, son-in-law) free of CAT. There is no obligation on a beneficiary of a gift to spend it in the year it is received. Gifts can be accumulated by the child after receipt to meet future expenditure e.g. to meet a deposit on a

Gifts which qualify for the small gifts exemption do not reduce the parent to child tax-free threshold of €310,000 — gifts in excess of the small gifts exemption reduce the threshold after taking the exemption into account.

Before a capacity attendance, Kerry can consider themselves extremely unlucky they didn't hold out for the win which on the balance they would have deserved.

The Saturday night football fever certainly gripped Tralee as the ground filled up long before the 7pm throw-in.

Kerry led by four points at one stage in the second half and with time running out they were clinging on to a one-point lead.

Deep into stoppage time, the Kingdom were awarded a free out for a heavy challenge on Peter Crowley. Paul Murphy's stray pass was intercepted by Kevin McManamon who set Paul Mannion up for an equalising score for the Dubs to preserve their unbeaten record. Kerry had opportunities and chances to win this game but spilled turnovers and mistakes were to prove costly.

Still, Kerry manager Eamonn Fitzmaurice will be happy with the spirit and determination shown by his side, especially the younger players such Tadgh Morley, Ronan Shanahan, Jack Barry and Kevin McCarthy who stood up to the challenge.

Barry had one of the most difficult assignments in keeping tabs with Dublin's star midfielder Brian Fenton.

The Na Gaeil man did his job to perfection and nullified Fenton's influence on the game, while Shanahan kept Dublin's key forward Ciaran Kilkenny scoreless throughout.

In our preview last week, we stated that any frees which Kerry conceded would be severely punished. In Dean Rock, Dublin have one

of the best free-takers in the modern game and the fact that Rock converted nine scores all from placed balls, within scoring distance, is something which will no doubt worry Eamon Fitzmaurice and his backroom team.

Tyrone referee Sean Hurson had difficulty in keeping tabs with the many off-the-ball incidents which threatened to boil over. Dublin's Ciaran Kilkenny was dismissed on a second yellow card very late in the game and a number of others could consider themselves extremely fortunate that they did not see red. Kerry who got off to a good start and they enjoyed a 0-3 to 0-1 lead with 12 minutes of the first half gone thanks to well-worked scores from Peter Crowlev

Kerry were winning vital breaking ball at this stage and had Dublin under the cosh however, Dean Rock settled the visitors with a point from a free in the 12th minute. The outstanding Conor McHugh reduced the arrears before Brendan Kealy converted a 45 which was won by David Moran. Dublin were coming slowly into the game and three Rock frees meant that they led against the run of play in the approach to half-time. Know Your Rights: CAO LATE APPLICATION

The closing date for applying to college was 1 February. Can I still apply?

ANSWER

You apply for almost all full-time undergraduate courses through the Central Applications Office (CAO). This includes, for example, university and institute of technology undergraduate courses such as Higher Certificates at Level 6 and degrees at Levels 7 and 8.

The closing date for 2017 CAO applications was 1 February 2017. However, late applications are allowed up to 5.15pm on 1 May 2017.

There is a fee to apply for courses through the CAO and late applications are subject to an increased fee. Late online applications cost €50.

You may change the courses you picked or the order of courses on your application. This Change of Mind facility is free. It opens on 5 May and closes on 1 July 2017 at 5:15pm. If you are a mature applicant who wants to be assessed on mature grounds, or if you want to be considered for the HEAR and/or DARE schemes, most colleges will require you to have applied to the CAO by 1 February 2017. There are also some restricted courses which cannot be applied for after 1 February 2017.

The CAO provides a handbook that lists all the courses on offer and gives information on how to apply.

Decisions on offers of places are normally made in August and September, after the results of the Leaving Certificate have come out. A detailed schedule of the offer rounds is in the CAO handbook.

EARTH HOUR IS THIS SATURDAY:

In 2017, World Wide Fund for Nature (WWF) is celebrating 10 years of Earth Hour and 10 years of progress on changing climate change. Earth Hour started in Sydney, Australia, in 2007. This event saw 2.2 million homes and businesses turn their lights off for one hour to make their stand against climate change that year, in 2016 178 countries and territories participated, over 12,700 landmarks switched off and 2.4 million people got involved to show support for action to protect our amazing planet.

Businesses and government organisations, as well as community and political leaders also take part in Earth Hour. It's about giving people a voice on the planet's future and working together to create a sustainable low carbon future for planet earth.

Our actions on climate change will shape the future for children everywhere. They know more about climate change than any other generation. And they have extraordinary views on what they want for their planet.

On this Saturday the 25th of March, please switch off all unnecessary electric lights and equipment between 8.30pm and 9.30pm to support progress for the next generation and to stop the degradation of the Earth's natural environment. We must act now to protect our amazing planet.

SUMMER TIME:

Its summer time and the living is easy – unfortunately not yet, but at least we will have an hours extra daylight in the evenings to look forward to from this Sunday March 26th - so before you go to bed on Saturday night remember to set the new time on all watches, timers etc by putting them forward by one hour.

THIS SUNDAY IS MOTHERS DAY:

Mother's Day, or Mothering Sunday, to give it the official name is a special day to celebrate mothers of all ages and nowadays falls exactly three weeks before Easter in the Christian calendar in Ireland, Great Britain and parts of Europe, though the earliest Mother's Day celebrations can be traced back to the spring festivities of ancient Greece and Rome.

Early Christians celebrated a Mother's Day of sorts during the festival on the fourth Sunday of Lent in honour of the Virgin Mary, the Mother of Christ. In England the holiday was expanded to include all mothers. It was then called Mothering Sunday.

In the 1600's this was the day during Lent, when parishioners returned to worship in the church where they had been baptised. In the large homes of the wealthy, servants were given the day off to observe the practice of attending church and visiting family afterwards. So it became a tradition that mothers were brought gifts on Mothering Sunday. Suitable presents of the day could include a homemade cake or a bunch of hand-picked wild flowers.

The custom of celebrating Mothering Sunday had died out almost completely by the 19th century; however, the day came to be celebrated again after World War II, when American servicemen brought the custom back to Europe. Anna Jarvis is recognised as the Founder of Mothers Day in US. To begin with Anna, send Carnations (her mother's favourite flower) each year for the church service in Grafton, West Virginia to honour her mother. Later Anna along with her supporters wrote letters to people in positions of power lobbying for the official declaration of a Mothers Day holiday. The hard work paid off. By 1911, Mother's Day was celebrated in almost every state in the Union and on May 8, 1914 President Woodrow Wilson signed a Joint Resolution designating the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day.

Ms Anna Jarvis, who had devoted her life for the declaration of a Mothers Day holiday was so deeply hurt by the huge commercialisation of the day that she deeply regretted ever having been the driving force behind the foundation of the special day.

Today for many families, the day is about making their mother feel like the Queen she is, by spoiling her rotten but for other families whose mother has passed away it can be a very sad day and many people visit their mothers grave with gifts of flowers.

TODAY IS "INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR THE RIGHT TO THE TRUTH CONCERNING GROSS HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS AND FOR THE DIGNITY OF VICTIMS".

In 2006 the UN confirmed that people had the right to know the truth about gross human rights violations and serious violations of human rights law. Furthermore, this right was linked to governments' duty and obligation to protect and

guarantee human rights, to conduct effective investigations and to guarantee effective remedy and reparations.

In December 2010, in a bid to promote human rights, the UN proclaimed March 24th as the "International Day for the Right to the Truth concerning Gross Human Rights Violations and for the Dignity of Victims".

The purpose of the Day is to:

*Honour the memory of victims of gross and systematic human rights violations and promote the importance of the right to truth and justice; *Pay tribute to those who have devoted their lives to, and lost their lives in, the struggle to promote and protect human rights for all;

*Recognise, in particular, the important work and values of Archbishop Oscar Arnulfo Romero, of El Salvador, who was murdered on the 24th of March 1980, after denouncing violations of the human rights of the most vulnerable populations and defending the principles of protecting lives, promoting human dignity and opposition to all forms of violence.

*The UN General Assembly, in its resolution, invites all Member States, international organizations and civil society organizations and individuals, to observe the International Day in an appropriate manner.

REFUGEES ARE STRANDED AND STARVING IN CALAIS:

In October, the government of Calais, France demolished the city's encampment of refugees, leaving thousands stranded with nowhere to go. Now, as some try to rebuild what they lost, the city has implemented a policy forbidding charitable organisations and agencies from distributing food to migrants and their families. The refugees seeking temporary safety in Calais are fleeing violence, persecution and political turmoil. They can't just turn around and go back home — some of their homes literally don't exist anymore because of civil war. This policy won't deter these poor people from trying to find refuge.

Mayor Bouchart's ban is a despicable act in an attempt to rid the city of refugees by cutting off the basics for human survival. Refugees are in dire need of shelter, food, clean water and safety. If we're going to properly address the refugee crisis, we need long-term solutions that grant people basic human dignity and safe refuge in cities like Calais.

The refugee crisis isn't just a local issue — it's international. That's why it's so important that we all speak up and cry injustice when it's due, burning down tent cities and stopping charities and agencies from doing their jobs will not help — it only makes things worse.

If you feel strongly on this issue please add your voice to show that you stand with refugees by signing the petition on the Care2 website and tell the Mayor of Calais to stop starving refugees and reverse the decision to ban charities from distributing food.

PEOPLE FORMED A HUMAN CHAIN TO RESCUE A HERO AND A DOG FROM RAGING WATERS:

In Kazakhstan - a Central Asian country - a group of people spotted a dog trapped in rushing waters below a floodgate, one brave man waded in to lead the dog who was frozen with fear back to the ledge from which he had fallen but when the pair got to the steep wall at the edge of the channel, both needed help climbing out.

That's when 3 people on the bank raced to link arms to form a human chain, with one young man holding on to a fence rail with one hand linked to two others in single file who had slid over the edge to try and reach both man and dog - but the distance was too far.

The video shows the man time and again trying to push the dog upwards towards the rescuers but he kept sliding back down – then our hero grasped a helping hand while holding the dog by the collar, the man was pulled upwards but lost his grip on the collar, the rescuers unaware of this kept pulling until our hero succeeded in freeing his hand and slipping back down into the water again, obviously not willing to give up on the dog – on the next rescue attempt an extra brave young man attached himself to the human chain and another man sat dangerously on the edge on top of the channel to lend a hand to both man and dog when they were pulled to the top – and all were successful in the end.

INDIA DOUBLES PAID MATERNITY LEAVE, MAKING

IT 3RD BEST WORLDWIDE:

The Parliament of India has just passed a bill extending nationally mandated paid maternity leave from 12 weeks to 26 weeks.

The bill, which will benefit almost two million women in the organised working sector, will apply to all businesses that employ more than 10 workers.

The policy change also makes India the third best country in the world for paid maternity leave, trailing only Canada with 50 weeks of paid leave and Norway with 44.

However, the extended paid leave will only apply to the first two children. If a mother gives birth to a third, then the time off is cut back to 12 weeks.

"This is my humble gift to women, a day after the world celebrated the International Women's Day," said Labour Minister Bandaru Dattatreya.

MONASTERY RECRUITS CUTE FLUFFY FRIAR TO ENCOURAGE ADOPTIONS:

The friars at this Franciscan monastery in Cochabamba, Bolivia worship St. Francis of Assisi; the patron saint of animals.

So in honor of their practices, they adopted Carmelo the dog – or "Friar Bigoton", meaning "mustache" in Spanish.

Carmelo used to be a stray before he was rescued and has now become a beloved part of the monastery, spreading love, cuddles, and has even taken a liking to his new friar's robes.

"If only all the churches of our country adopt a dog and care for him like Friar Bigotón," the group wrote in a post on Facebook, "we are sure that the parishioners would follow his example."

AT LAST - A REVOLUTIONARY REDESIGN FOR THE IRONING BOARD:

The household ironing board has not been succesfully redesigned since its invention in 1892 – but The Flippr a crowdfunded ironing board is about to change its history.

The new design claims to cut the average ironing time from eight minutes to two minutes by using several features such as a torso-shaped board with 360 degree rotation and clothing clips for keeping pants in place.

The frame also has eight levels of height adjustment and wheels for easy transportation. 632 different backers donated over \$240,000 to the prototype's Indiegogo campaign for the product's manufacturing – pushing it 810% over its goal.

WORLD'S OLDEST GOLFING CLUB TO FINALLY ADMIT WOMEN:

For the first time in a 273-year history, the world's oldest golfing club will finally allow women to become members.

After the issue failed to pass by a narrow margin during a vote in May 2016, members of the Honourable Company of Edinburgh Golfers voiced their disappointment at barring women from becoming members at the club and



playing at the Muirfield Golf Club in Scotland. The issue was introduced for a vote once more recently with 621 members present. This time, however, the decision to allow female members was passed with 498 votes in favour, resulting in an 80% majority.

"The Ladies European Tour is extremely pleased to hear that the Honourable Company of Edinburgh Golfers has voted to include female members and will begin to restore the reputation of the club following the disappointing ballot result last May," said Ivan Khodabakhsh, the Ladies European Tour's Chief Executive Officer. "Sports reflect the values of the society in which we live and today men and women have equal rights. We believe this should be reflected not only in top level international tournaments but also at club level" she concluded.

WATCHING BIRDS NEAR YOUR HOME IS GOOD FOR YOUR MENTAL HEALTH:

People living in neighbourhoods with more birds, shrubs and trees are less likely to suffer from depression, anxiety and stress, according to research by the University of Exeter, the British Trust for Ornithology and the University of Queensland.

The study, which surveyed mental health in over 270 people from different ages, incomes and ethnicities, also found that those who spent less time out of doors than usual in the previous week were more likely to report they were anxious or depressed.

Common types of birds including blackbirds, robins, blue tits and crows were seen by the participants but the researchers did not find a relationship between the species of birds and mental health, but rather the number of birds they could see from their windows, in the garden or in their neighbourhood.

Previous studies have found that the ability of most people to identify different species is low suggesting that for most people it is interacting with birds, not just specific birds, that provides well-being.

University of Exeter researcher Dr Daniel Cox, who led the study, said, "This study starts to unpick the role that some key components of nature play for our mental well-being. Birds around the home, and nature in general, show great promise in preventative health care, making cities healthier, happier places to live."





FOCUS ON CONIFERS

For colour all year round you can't go wrong with conifers amd there are lots of different types to choose from.

When choosing a conifer they are usually classified under four sections. Dwarf which will grow from 1.5ft to 15ft. Medium 12ft t 50ft. Tallanything over 50ft and finally ground cover or prostrate growing from about 2ft in height to a spread of anything from 2ft to 6ft.

When choosing a dwarf conifer it is very important to remember that it can mean two things. It may describe a slow growing variety which will grow to about 2 to 3 ft after 10 to 12 years or it may mean that it will grow to its maximum height in a quicker time frame.

An ideal dwarf conifer to choose is Juniperus Communis Compressa which will not grow more than 2 to 3 ft which makes it ideal for a rockery.

There is also a big choice when it comes to medium conifers. So remember before you choose find out the mature height and spreads. Medium conifers are ideal for shrub beds as they will give you a good focal point and colour all year round whether it is green, gold or blue-

Tall conifers speak for themselves and are ideal for a large garden.

Prostrate conifers are ideal for ground cover but make sure to remember that there are different varieties, dwarf, medium and large. Conifers are also ideal for centerpieces in pots and containers. Next week I will focus on Climbers.


