

## TOM TO TEE OFF IN AID OF CHARITY

A Killarney man who was severely injured as a child is holding a charity golf classic to help raise funds for the National Rehabilitation Clinic in Dublin. Tom Doherty is holding the golf classic on Saturday 8th August in Killeen Championship Golf Course and is calling on all Killarney locals and businesses to support this event. The cost for a team of four is €250 and can consist of men, ladies or mixed.

Tom had his accident in the mid 1980's damaging his spinal cord. He was paralysed from the chest down for two weeks before regaining movement. Late last year Tom returned once again to the national rehabilitation hospital for a major check-up and this led to the inspiration for this event. The hard work, new life goals and challenges of the patients to adapt to their new daily living skills is greatly enhanced by the dedicated of the wonderful staff. With the National Rehabilitation Clinic being such a specialised hospital, new and updated equipment is always needed

Speaking to the Killarney Outlook about the charity event Tom said:

"I was completely paralysed from the chest down for two weeks before I started to get movement back starting with my big toe on my right foot. 30 years later I re-entered the front doors of the national rehabilitation hospital. The sounds, the smells, the memories came flooding back in my mind like a tsunami."

The National Rehabilitation Hospital (NRH) provides comprehensive inpatient and outpatient specialist rehabilitation services to patients who have acquired a physical or

cognitive disability as a result of an accident, illness or injury and require specialist medical rehabilitation. The centre holds a very special place in Tom's heart and he knows of many other people and families throughout the County who have been affected with serious injury and have spent time here in the NRH.

"There are no shortcuts in rehabilitation. You have to work hard; the staff have to work hard. It's a team effort. Places like this always need more resources. I know this first hand. Any support for the golf classic would be greatly appreciated", Tom added.

The event has already attracted many sponsors from various businesses throughout the County but Tom is urging as many people as possible to support this event. It's a fun day out for anyone with an interest in golf with an opportunity to play on a world class golf course. As well as that there will be refreshments, BBQ and lots of prizes to be won on the day.

## MUMS HEARTS GLOW AS THEY HAND OVER €18,000

Glowheart 4 Crumlin mothers travelled to Dublin this week to present cheques to the Children's Heart Centre in Our Lady's Children's Hospital in Crumlin and the Ronald McDonald house in Crumlin. Their glowheart4crumlin campaign generated a fantastic €18,000 which they divided evenly between the two charities which is so close to their heart.

The €9,000 presented to the Children's Heart Centre in Crumlin is going to enable the centre to purchase four specially designed physio chairs which will be used to enable children who have undergone open heart surgery get back on their feet faster and in more comfort. The staff and physiotherapists at the centre were delighted when they discovered they would now be finally able to purchase this equipment which is so desperately needed for the centre as it will be of huge benefit to the children in aiding their recovery.

The group then went on to present €9,000 to Marian Carroll the CEO of the Ronald McDonald charity which will go towards funding of a purpose built 53 bedroom new Ronald McDonald house on the site of the new children's hospital in Crumlin. This project is expected to cost in the region of €10.5 million so more fundraising is needed for this home from home haven for parents of seriously ill children in Crumlin. This facility helps hugely in dealing with the traumatic experience of having a seriously ill child. "We want to say a heartfelt thank you to the people of Kerry for their amazing support and donations to our campaign during the last few months", Gillian O'Donoghue, one of the organisers told the Killarney Outlook. "Our campaign will continue and following on from the phenomenal success of our county wide wear red day in March of this year we are planning another county wide wear red day during the national congenital heart defect awareness week in February of

2016", she added.

"Without home help and support of the people of Kerry we would not have been able to do this campaign and we hope to continue to receive this support again during the next year of our awareness and fundraising campaign" said Gillian. The mums and their amazingly strong heart warrior children Gillian and Ella, Jenny and Sadie, Sharon and Dylan, Sinead and Sean, Sonya and Ciarán, Sinead and Oisin want to thank everyone from the bottom of their hearts for continuing to help little hearts glow.



First across the line in the 10K was Donal O'Callaghan in 33m 34 sec, followed closely by the first female Siobhan Daly (40m 59sec). In the Half marathon

# EIRCODES DISPATCHED ACROSS KERRY

'Eircodes' were dispatched to all 72,680 homes and businesses across Kerry last week as the new national postcode system swings into gear.

Letters have been sent to every residential and businesses address in the county, informing them of the new Eircode for that specific address. Homes and businesses across Ireland are being notified of their Eircode over a two-week period.

Labour's Marie Moloney said: "Fresh data shows that 45.5% of premises in Kerry currently share their address with 1 or more properties. This causes all sorts of problems for postal services, businesses and ambulance services when they are trying to locate local addresses.

"Eircode rectifies this problem by allocating every premises with their own unique code, removing the potential for any error.

"From now on, emergency services will be able to find the correct address more quickly, businesses can deliver goods and services more efficiently, while members of the public can shop easier online. It'll also give people that extra bit of confidence that their mail now goes to the correct recipient. In short, it will make life a little easier for people in Kerry.

"I'd urge people in Kerry to look out for their letter and when it arrives this week, to memorise their new Eircode and keep it somewhere handy. It's a seven digit, easy-toremember code that you simply add to the end of your address.

"In the meantime, if people want to log onto eircode.ie there is an online tool available where they can find out their Eircode now.

"The delivery of a modern, efficient postcode system is something which has been promised by successive Governments over the past decade - I am pleased that it has been a Labour Minister, Alex White, who delivered it.

"It proves that Labour doesn't just pay lip service to people but actually delivers on our commitments to support local communities and improve public services."







## BEFORE REGISTERING WITH AN AGENCY, YOU SHOULD FIND OUT:

- Is the agency licensed?
- What services does it offer?
- If you pay a fee, in what circumstances will you be entitled to a refund?
- If you are entitled to Rent Supplement, does the agency have landlords on its list who accept Rent Supplement?
- If you decide to register with the agency, make sure you get a receipt for any money you pay.

#### VIEWING THE ACCOMMODATION

- •Are there any signs of dampness?
- · Do the windows open?
- •What security is available (such as window locks, burglar alarm)?
- Is a smoke detector provided and is it functioning?
- Is there a fire alarm? Check fire evacuation procedures (especially in apartments).
- Who pays for the heating?. What hours is it on, and who controls it?
- Is hot water available all or some of the time?.
- · Are the cooker and fridge clean and in

working order?

- · What sort of condition is the bathroom in?
- Do you have to share the bathroom, if so, with how many others?
- Is there storage for bicycles?
- •Does the property have a parking space?

Threshold recommends that you get confirmation that a parking space is provided with the accommodation in writing from your letting agent or landlord before handing over any money.

- Is there a bus route or other public transport nearby?
- Are there shops and other facilities nearby?.
   BEFORE YOU AGREE TO RENT

Make sure you can afford the rent being asked. If you will be claiming Rent Supplement,



level allowed. Tell the landlord that you intend to claim Rent Supplement since they will need to fill out part of the application form and supply their own details.

Be aware of your rights and your obligations as a tenant and your landlord's rights and obligations. Your landlord, for example, is obliged to provide you with a rent book and to ensure that the accommodation meets certain minimum physical standards. They must also register the tenancy with the Private Residential Tenancies Board (PRTB).



You are not covered by landlord and tenant legislation if you are sharing accommodation with your landlord.

#### INVENTORY

Ask the landlord for a written list of all furnishings and appliances provided. You and the landlord should sign this list at the start of the tenancy to show that you agree on the furnishings supplied and their condition. 

If there are any signs of damage by previous tenants, make sure this is noted too. You could photograph or otherwise record the existing condition of the property and any damage to walls, furniture or appliances. If there are outstanding repairs, ask the landlord to state in writing that they will be carried out.

#### DEPOSITS


HOLDING DEPOSITS: Some landlords or agents may ask you for a holding deposit when you decide to take the accommodation. This is a sum of money you pay to hold the property for you before you sign the lease and enter into a contract with the landlord. You should always get a written receipt for a holding deposit. Holding deposits are often not refundable if you don't take up the accommodation.

SECURITY DEPOSITS: You will be asked for a security deposit before moving into the accommodation. Usually a deposit is the equivalent of 1 month's rent and is held by the landlord as security for any rent arrears or damage beyond normal wear and tear. If you are getting a social welfare payment and are unable to pay the deposit, the Department of Social Protection's representative (formerly the Community Welfare Officer) may be able to help with paying a deposit under the Supplementary Welfare Allowance Scheme. You should get a receipt for any deposit you pay. The amount of deposit paid should be stated in your rent book. You may lose your deposit if:

- · You leave without giving proper notice, or leave before the end of a fixed-term lease
- · You cause damage to the accommodation beyond normal wear and
- · You leave with bills or rent unpaid.

#### **FURTHER INFORMATION AND SUPPORT**

Threshold is a useful source of information and advice on landlord and tenant issues. The Private Residential Tenancies Board (PRTB) helps to resolve disputes between landlords and tenants, including any disputes about retention of deposits.







### **GOOCH MAGIC HELPS KERRY TO MUNSTER THREE IN A ROW**

#### **KERRY 1-11 CORK 1-06**

There is an old myth among GAA supporters that you don't give Kerry a second chance through a replay.

That myth ran true again in Killarney as the Kingdom defeated old rivals Cork in their replayed Munster SFC decider at rain-lashed Fitzgerald Stadium on Saturday evening last. Kerry collected their 77th Provincial title and a third title in four years.

A quarter-final against either Westmeath or Fermanagh now awaits the Kingdom as they continue with confidence the defence of their All-Ireland title.

Kerry manager Eamonn Fitzmaurice clearly learned from the drawn game two weeks ago as his side countered the all of the key Cork challenges.

The game was watched by a fine attendance of 32,233 including GAA President Aogan O'Fearaghil in deplorable conditions but despite the rain, this was a fine, sporting spectacle.

The key differences between this Kerry side and the side which drew with Cork two weeks ago was in defence. Here veteran Aidan O'Mahony justified his call-up to the starting line-up with a dominant performance and Shane Enright, Jonathan Lyne and Paul Murphy also shone.

Indeed Kerry's defence was so tight on this occasion that Cork managed only two second half points despite tremendous effort.

At midfield David Moran and Anthony Maher won the day, while the excellence of Bryan Sheehan, who scored 0-5 from long range frees, the exceptional work rate of Donncha Walsh and the brilliance of Paul Geaney and James O'Donoghue were key factors.

Colm Cooper, too, made a major contribution

when introduced as a second half substitute for Kieran Donaghy.

It was the Gooch's genius in the 50th minute, spotting superb positioning run of Donncadh Walsh, he delivered a sublime pass to Walsh for a drive at goal. This was parried by the Cork goalie but the well placed Paul Geaney picked up the rebound and finished superbly to the net.

That was the crucial score of the game as it put the Kingdom three points clear 1-9 to 1-6 and they never looked back after

Kerry had built up a three point lead by the 32nd minute of the first half when Aidan O'Mahony gave away a needless line ball.

From the line ball Cork mounted a swift attack and the Kerry defence was prized open. Donncha O'Connor found Colm O'Neill who broke through the line and short passed to the swift moving Paul Kerrigan who finished to the net with an unstoppable shot. It was a score that came against the run of play as Kerry had been very much in control up to that point.

Shortly afterwards, Brendan Kealy prevented another Cork goal when he deflected a rasping shot against the upright and the Kerry defence recovered possession and cleared.

At the break, Kerry led 0-8 to 1-4, Bryan Sheehan, flawless again from frees, was responsible for five of Kerry's scores. The other three came from Paul Geaney (2) and Donnchdh Walsh.

Cork's first-half total came from Paul Kerrigan (1-0), Colm O'Neill (2), Donncha O'Connor (free) and Brian O'Driscoll.

Cork took the lead when Colm O'Neill pointed from play early in the second half but Kerry, with David Moran and Anthony Maher giving a midfield tour de force, soon began to take control again.

Jonathan Lyne and Kevin O'Driscoll exchanged points before Geaney's goal in the 50th minute put the Kingdom firmly in the driving seat.

Kerry despite losing Stephen O'Brien to a red card late on, closed out the game with scores from Paul Geaney (free) and the outstanding James O'Donoghue to run out clear winners. Teams and Scorers

#### **DEFENCE ON TOP:**

After all, they have conceded 4-12 in two championship outings. They have an average age of over 32 years, they must certainly be the oldest in the game but it was that experience that shone brightest in a night where all three produced creditable performances, Marc O'Se was very assured while Aidan O' Mahony relished his sweepers role and time and again closed the space for Cork deliveries. However if the elder statesmen of the full back line were enjoying fine games, they were put in the shadow by Shane Enright. The Tarbert man has never put in such a complete performance for Kerry. ### ICMSA WELCOME COMMITMENT TO REVIEW FAIR DEAL SCHEME.

The President of the ICMSA, Mr. John Comer, has today welcomed the commitment in the Review of the Nursing Home Supports Scheme published by the Minister for Primary Care, Social Care and Mental Health, Ms. Kathleen Lynch that the treatment of farm assets under the Fair Deal scheme will be reviewed.

ICMSA, Mr. Comer said, has consistently argued that the current treatment of farm assets is very unfair, inequitable and could render the family farm unviable in the unfortunate situation where a family member has to spend a long period of time in a Nursing Home with the result that the farm may have to be sold to meet the debt. The farm assets are the assets that generate the farm income and it is absolutely essential that this is recognised and that the next generation of farmers

are not burdened with excessive levels of payments that could effectively put them out of business. The announcement of a review of the current assessment today is welcome and it is important that the review is completed as soon as possible and that a new system is put in place to recognise the valid concerns of farm families on this matter, concluded Mr. Comer.







### **DRIVING IN IRELAND - ADVICE FOR TOURISTS**

If you're planning on hiring a car in Ireland, there's a wealth of scenic drives for you and your passengers to look forward to. However before you arrive, it's important to take some time to familiarise yourself with the Irish rules of the road to ensure a safe and enjoyable trip.

#### YOUR DRIVING LICENSE

Most Irish car rental companies will ask to see a full driving license issued by the country in which you live, not an international driving license/permit.

#### **DRIVING ORIENTATION**

The driver's seat in Irish vehicles is on the right hand side of the car and traffic travels on the left hand side of the road.

#### **SPEED LIMITS**

In January 2005, all driving speed limit signs in Ireland changed from miles per hour to kilometers per hour. The maximum permissible driving speed on Irish Motorways is 120km/ph.

#### **IRISH MOTORWAYS**

It's worth bearing in mind that motorway driving isn't currently taught to learner drivers in Ireland and huge numbers of drivers learned to drive in the era before the high-speed modern motorways of today's Ireland. It's not uncommon to see Irish motorists frequently misuse the overtaking lane on motorways, with many motorists cruising in the outer lane for kilometers at a time.

#### **ALCOHOL**

The driver's legal alcohol limit is 0.8% in Ireland (80 milligrammes of alcohol per 100ml of blood) and is set to be further reduced to 50mg toward the end of 2011. Following the introduction of the Road Traffic Act 2006 the Gardaí (Irish police force) now have wider powers to reduce and eliminate the offence of drink driving on Irish roads including the ability carry out random breath-tests.

#### **SEAT BELTS**

The wearing of seat belts in front and rear seats of a vehicle is compulsory in Ireland. There's also an additional onus on drivers to ensure persons under 17 travelling with them are suitably restrained. To view our guide to child safety and use of in-car child restraints clickhere.

#### **BACK ROADS**

Despite the significant enhancement of Ireland's national road infrastructure in recent times, it's worth noting, especially if using a SatNav, that many local roads are still quite narrow and winding, with no hard shoulder.

#### **MOBILE PHONES**

Irish Road Traffic laws deem it illegal use a hand held mobile phone while driving in Ireland. Our advice is to all motorists is to turn it off or put it on silent until you can pull the car in somewhere safe/ you reach your destination.



#### **RECOMMENDED EQUIPMENT**

When hiring a car, it's advisable to double check it has all the equipment you'll need such as a spare wheel and wheel changing equipment, breakdown-warning triangle, hi-vis vest and the car's owner's manual.

#### DANGEROUS DRIVING AND PENALTY **POINTS**

When driving in Ireland you'll be subjected to Ireland's driving penalty points system, a system designed to save lives and prevent injuries resulting from road crashes and collisions.

When driving in Ireland on a foreign driving license, your details will be held on a separate database for the purpose of recording driver penalty points. If you later obtain an Irish driving license, any previously acquired penalty points will be activated on that license.



# Citizens Information

### **Know Your Rights:** FREEDOM OF INFORMATION

**JULY 2015** 

#### **OUESTION**

I believe you no longer have to pay fees when you make a Freedom of Information request. Are there any other changes?

#### **ANSWER**

A number of changes have been introduced to the Freedom of Information (FOI) scheme by the Freedom of Information Act 2014. The FOI scheme provides the following rights:

- A right to access information that is held by a body to which the FOI legislation applies
- · A right to have official information relating to you amended where it is incomplete, incorrect or misleading
- · A right to obtain reasons for decisions affecting you

Previously, you had to pay an application fee of €15 when making a request for information. This application fee no longer applies. The application fees have been reduced for an internal review of a decision by a body on your request and for a review of the decision by the Office of the Information Commissioner. The new fees (which do not apply in the case of personal information) are as follows:

- Internal review, €30 (€10 for medical card holder)
- Review by Information Commissioner, €50 (€15 for medical card holder)

You may be charged for the time spent finding and retrieving records, and for any copying costs. You will not normally be charged for personal records.

Under the revised scheme, if the cost of search, retrieval and copying is €100 or less, no charge is applied. If the cost exceeds €100, the full charge applies. You cannot be charged more than €500. If the estimated cost is more than €700, the body can refuse to process your request, unless you refine your request to bring the cost below this limit. The new FOI Act widens the scope of the scheme to all public bodies, unless specifically exempt. It also allows the Government to include other bodies that get significant public funds. Under the Act the bodies must publish a wider range of information about their activities than was previously required.

# BARRIERS TO SUCCESS

Do you ever feel that you have more potential that you are realising? Perhaps it seems as if your plans never come to fruition – or you sabotage your own success. Perhaps you lack confidence in your own abilities and doubt your capacity for success. Do you tend to procrastinate or find your great ideas never see the light of day? Then it may well be that you are creating your own psychological barriers to success?

Many of us carry around limiting beliefs and negative habits which hinder our success. These beliefs and behaviours are sometimes so well developed that we don't even realise they are there - and when we do, we don't have the skills or tools to overcome them. Typical barriers to success include: Fear of success and/or fear of failure, low self-esteem, negative thinking, reluctance to seek help, negative past experiences that continue to create emotional blocks, difficulties relating to others, depression, self-doubt and/or lack of self-belief. However we pay the price for these negative thoughts and self-doubts.

Bring to mind something that you've been wanting to do and write it down on a sheet of paper. Now think of all of the reasons that stop you from doing this - and write these down. Next review the list and cross off those that are simply not real or true (it may be helpful to enlist the help of a friend here).

Now look at the negative beliefs on your list that can be substituted with something more positive. The brain cannot hold two contradictory beliefs simultaneously - thus try replacing a negative belief (e.g. I could never go to college) with a more positive one (I have the ability to go to college). Better still, write the positive affirmation in the present tense as if it is already happening (I am studying in College and loving every minute of it). Write down your affirmations and put them on your desk or bathroom mirror, repeating them as often as possible. Notice when self-doubts crop up.

When self-doubts and limiting beliefs sneak in – do a reality check and ask yourself 'Is there a rational reason to believe them?' If so, what can you do to change this? Is there something practical we can do to? Sometimes our doubts and negative self-beliefs are rooted in earlier life experiences or childhood traumas. If this is the case, perhaps you could seek the help of a counsellor or coach to overcome these.

Next week we will continue to look at our own personal Psychological Barriers to Success and discuss ways in which these can be overcome.

# **Health Matters....** With Dr. Michael O'Doherty

### **Travel Vaccination**

Thinking of travelling abroad...? Have you taught about travel Vaccines...?

if so here is some information that may help you get organised. As you are already aware some destination may require some of the following vaccinations.

**Typhoid Fever:** A serious infection caught from contaminated food or water. It is prevalent in areas where sanitation is poor.

• Typhoid Vaccine (injectable). This is a single injection that helps protect patients for 3 years

Hepatitis A: Like typhoid fever, this disease is spread by contaminated water or food, wherever there is poor sanitation.

 Hepatitis A is a single injection followed by a booster dose helps provide long terms protection and lasts for 10 years.

Hepatitis B: Hepatitis B is a highly infectious virus spread through blood, semen and other body fluids. Contact even through tiny quantities of an infected person's body fluid can pass the virus on.

• Hepatitis B Vaccine: This is a standard Schedule consists of 3 vaccinations given over a six month period. The first dose at an elected date, the second dose a month later and another 5 months later after that. It is very important that all three doses are received

**Cholera:** Cholera is a serious bacterial disease that occurs in regions of the world where sanitation and food and water hygiene are inadequate or lacking

**Diphtheria:** Diphtheria is a serious disease spread through droplets contained in coughs and sneezes. This is a significant risk in some parts of the world including Russia and the Ukraine. **Tetanus:** This is a potentially fatal disease, is contracted when spores in the soil enter the body through cuts or scratches.

**Polio:** Polio can cause paralysis and in some cases can be fatal . Although polio has almost been wiped out in industrialised nations, it is still a risk in some developing countries.

Tetanus exists all over the world.

• Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio is combined of a total of five injections that help protect patients for a lifetime. However, a booster dose may be required for persons travelling abroad.

**Yellow fever:** A potentially fatal disease that is spread by infected mosquitoes. In some areas of the world, you have to carry an international certificate of vaccination as proof of vaccination to gain entry into certain countries (available at designated yellow fever vaccination centres). This is valid for 1 year from 10 days after vaccination and immediately after Revaccination.

 Vaccinations for yellow fever consist of one injection every ten years. The international certificate is valid from ten days after primary vaccinations and for ten years thereafter. It is immediately valid for a further ten years if revaccination is performed before expiry of current certificate.

Rabies: Rabies is a fatal disease, which humans can contract from the bit of a rabid animal. It is present in many countries but is higher risk in some developing countries.



# THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF A DOG OWNER

Two week ago I wrote of the common sense responsibility of adults to show children how to act safely with their family dogs or strange dogs they might meet and I am extremely grateful to the reader who went to the trouble of contacting me to say he agreed with everything in the article but would I now do a follow up? I admit I was stumped at the time as I thought I had covered most angles and had to ask him if I had a follow up? and thankfully he suggested that I remind dog owners that they too have a responsibility to keep their dogs under control both for the sake of the public and for the dogs own safety – and I couldn't agree more.

Local authorities are responsible for dog control and licensing. Under The Control of Dogs Acts, they have the power to appoint dog wardens, to provide shelter for stray dogs and to impose on-the-spot fines for offences and take court prosecutions. In addition local authorities can make further bye-laws, such as specifying where dogs must be kept on a lease, or where they're not allowed at all. This is why you might find different rules in different local areas.

• By law you must have a dog license - You have to be over 16 to be issued with a dog license and it costs €20 a year and can be purchased in the Post Office or you can also buy a Lifetime license – this costs €120 and lasts for the lifetime of the dog for which the licence is issued.

If you don't have a licence you can be issued with a  $\leq$ 100 'on-the-spot' fine.

- You must make sure that your dog wears a collar with an attached plate, tag or disc with your name and address on it and from this year it is also a requirement that your dog is microchipped.
- Your dog must be under 'effective' control This means that your dog comes back to you when called, doesn't jump on or generally harass people or other animals, for example. If your dog isn't considered to be under 'effective' control you can receive an 'on-the-spot' fine. If

your dog attacks or injures another animal or person things can get a lot more serious and costly.

- It's an offence against the Litter Pollution Act not to clean up after your dog, and you could be fined €150 'on-the-spot'. Many local walks and parks have pooper-scooper stations with bags and bins available for use. However, you'd be wise to bring your own pooper-scooper paraphernalia with you when you bring your dog out in public.
- Any dog that's in a public place unaccompanied (or not under 'effective' control) is considered a stray. Stray dogs can be seized by the dog warden or Gardaí and brought to the local dog pound. These dogs may be put down or disposed of if you don't claim them within 5 days. If your dog has strayed or is missing, you should contact the local dog pound directly to check whether or not your dog has been picked up. Before you pick up your dog, you'll have to pay a fee and produce a current dog licence.
- The Control of Dogs Regulations 1998 (S.I. No. 442 of 1998) impose additional rules in relation to the following breeds (and strains/cross-breeds) of dog in the Republic of Ireland: American Pit Bull Terrier; American pitbull; English Bull Terrier; British Pit-bull Terrier; Staffordshire Bull Terrier; Bull Mastiff; Dobermann Pinscher; Doberman; Rottweiler; German Shepherd (Alsatian); Rhodesian Ridgeback; Japanese Akita; Japanese Tosa; Bandog etc.

The rules state that: These dogs (or strains and crosses of them) must be kept on a short strong lead by a person over 16 years who is capable of controlling them and must be muzzled whenever they are in a public place and must wear a collar bearing the name and address of their owner at all times. The rules on muzzling do not apply to guide dogs for the blind.

Failure to pay all on-the-spot fines can lead to prosecution in District Court with a maximum fine of €3,000 and €600 per day for continuing offences on Summary Conviction.

All of the above are the law of the land and while I personally believe from experience that I am more likely to get bitten by a poodle or

terrier than a German Shepherd and I would prefer to donate the price of the license to a charity - most of the laws make sense and shouldn't even be necessary. A good dog owner should keep their dog under control at all times and clean up after them in public places.

Despite being a dog owner myself if I walk into dog pooh I direct a lot of unprintable language towards the unknown owner - not to mention the health hazards to children. On numerous occasions I have been approached by loose dogs in parks, the beach and towns - I don't know how many of these lovely friendly dogs have strayed from careless owners. I can only pray they will be reunited and not shot or poisoned or put down in the pound. Extension leads are not always the safest option either, I have seen dogs scoot off footpaths into traffic when something attracts their attention or snap at joggers etc if suddenly surprised by them. If you do use an extension lead please keep it locked at the length of a normal lead until you come to wide open space where you can see you are well away from both people and other animals.

\*When President Thomas Jefferson dispatched US Army Captain Meriwether Lewis and his close friend Second Lieutenant William Clark to find a water route across North America and explore the uncharted West, they set out on the amazing expedition across the Louisiana Territory in May, 1804 and faced unknown people and harsh conditions.

Together with a select group of U.S. Army

volunteers they began the journey from near St. Louis on the Mississippi River, making their way westward through the continental divide to the Pacific coast. The primary objective was to explore and map the newly acquired territory, find a practical route across the Western half of the continent, and establish an American presence in this territory before Britain and other European powers tried to claim it.

The campaign's secondary objectives were scientific and economic: to study the area's plants, animal life, and geography, and establish trade with local Indian tribes.

\*\*York was William Clark's childhood companion and was devoted to him before being sold to another 'master'. As an adult Clark continued the family tradition of being slave holders and York was left to him in a will. York was not his servant, he was his slave. He was a great help to the expedition because he was such a curiosity. American Indians who had seen white men had never seen an African American before and there's a famous Charley Russell painting in the Mandan lodges of the Mandan chief trying to rub the black off of York's skin. The American Indians had great respect for York when they discovered he was just a man, their way teaches us that just because you're different, doesn't mean it's

York was treated equally in the expedition and had his own rifle and voted on proposals. he made invaluable contributions to the expedition on many occasions. Risking his life to save Clark in a flash flood on the Missouri River near Great Falls in present-day Montana. Going out and hunting and bringing in the game. Putting up the captain's tents, managing the sails, plying his oar, doing all the things that everyone else did.

But when the expedition was over and York had seen what freedom meant he returned to slavery though eventually Clark arranged for York to be "free" in a world surrounded by racism and slavery.

### WORLD RECORD HOLDER

The Holstein cow named Blosom who held the world record for the world's tallest, was measured to be a full 6-foot-2 inches tall (190 cm) from hoof to withers.

Guinness officials had awarded the bovine beauty an official world record in August of 2014 while visiting her owner's farm in Orangeville, Illinois, to verify that a cow could really be that tall.



Sadly, she held the title of "tallest cow living" for less than a year, Guinness announced that Blosom had died in May at the age of 13 after sustaining an irreparable leg injury.

Her place in the record book as the tallest cow living is no longer accurate, but after performing further research Guinness found that Blosom was worthy of an even better title: the tallest cow ever recorded.

"Blosom was born to two normal-sized parents" Patty Meads-Hanson, who has owned and cared for Blosom since she was an 8-week-old calf said. Always friendly with her owners, Patty treated Blosom like any other household pet and loved nothing more than spending time with her out in the field. "As long as she had her oats, and daily chin rubs and ear scratches. Blosom felt life was good" Patty added.

#### A BRILLIANT IDEA


The Pacific Garbage Patch and landfills around the globe are overflowing with plastic waste, and you can circle the earth at the equator at least four times with all the soft drinks and water bottles thrown away every year. But if an experiment from a Netherlands-based company proves successful, there could be a new use for all that plastic trash: road construction.


The company, VolkerWessels, is working with government officials in Rotterdam on PlasticRoad a project it hopes will result in the construction of streets from the recycled material.

As a result of the material's durability which can withstand temperature extremes of over 38°C to below zero and is more resistant to corrosion than traditional road-building materials, the company estimates PlasticRoad surfaces will last three times as long as the traditional materials used and when a section of a street does eventually break down, because the modular pieces that make up a PlasticRoad will be premade in a factory, the damaged segment can be snapped out and quickly replaced with a new unit.

said, "no-one had focussed on the town's name, we're taking up that challenge ... this makes a deep connection between Church and Town." Revd Simon came to Killarney from the Peak District National Park where he ran a project for the Churches and the Tourism Sector to engage with tourists. He brings this experience to Killarney. He said, "we want to interest them in the spiritual history of this place and people", he added, "we want to reach into their hearts from our hearts". Being a tourist is not just about knowledge and enjoyment, it's also about inspiration and wonder. The Celts thought of the river of the soul that "flows between heart and mind". The tourist experiences the same. When they look at the view from Aghadoe, hear our music, and enjoy our welcome, they feel it too. This project will benefit the wider community of Killarney. There will be economic value. There will also be a renewed sense of integration. It is hoped to extend the project to other Churches and use them as links in pilgrimage and spiritual trails across the West of Ireland and into the midlands. Killarney is home to Innisfallen and the great monastery on Loch Léin (Lake of Learning). Also Muckross Abbey and the ancient spiritual centre at Aghadoe. The land was of great significance to the early

inhabitants. The Sloe berry comes from the Blackthorn tree. The tree was important to the ancient people. It has spiritual significance not just in pagan mythology but also in Christian tradition. Revd Simon said, "it's the ideal visual motif for connecting that old sense of the sacred with the tourists sense of awe and wonder" #lovekillarney #churchofthesloes
