

Following their morning wins over Ballinasloe and Rathfarnham, Killarney and Corrstown went to battle in the AIG Men's Junior Cup final. Corrstown looked strongest of the two, having overcome their quarter and semi-final opponents well, while Killarney had flirted with tie holes on both occasions. However it was Killarney who went out the fastest, and were up in 4 of the 5 matches through 6 holes.

Jason Arthur was first to finish, winning 5&4 against Derek Burke of Corrstown. All other matches were leaning in favour of Killarney so it seemed like only a matter of time before the title would be heading for the Kingdom.

Alan MacSweeney secured his point on the 17th green before Dave O'Donoghue sealed

the deal with a superb birdie on the same hole moments later.

It's been 19 years since the club have tasted All-Ireland success on the men's side and Donal Considine, Team Captain has a personal connection to that win in 2002.

"My father-in-law was Team Captain when we won it last, so that brings us even!" laughed Considine afterwards.

"I'm delighted, we're thrilled. It's been a long summer, there has been lots of travelling but they're a great team so we thought we had a great chance from the start."

"We looked comfortable from 5 or 6 on, we were up in most games so I was a little more confident than I was in this morning's or yesterday's matches for sure."

n Sunday last, the members and supporters of Muckross Rowing Club gathered at the club's boathouse for a special and momentous day in the club's long history. The club's newest racing boat, a Janousek coxed four, was officially launched in honour of Kathleen Murphy, a lifelong supporter of the club. The event was made all the more special as it had been so long awaited by the club. While the boat was purchased prior to the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, a launch event at the club was not possible until the recent easing of public health restrictions.

Among the crowd gathered at the club were members of the extended Murphy and Kenny families as well as many of Kathleen's neighbours and friends from Mangerton Road and beyond. Kathleen (nee Kenny) was born in raised in Muckross and has enjoyed close family ties with the rowing club from childhood to the present day. The Kennys of Muckross and their extended family have long played a central role in the club extending to over a century, reflected in the names of boats

named and launched before in honour of other family members including Micheal Kenny and Jack O'Shea. Kathleen has long been among the most prominent and recognised club's supporters at the annual Killarney Regatta, proudly sporting the club's yellow colours while cheering on crews at all levels from Juvenile to Senior and Veteran. Together with her late husband Jerry, Kathleen has also played a central role in fundraising for the club with countless tickets sold weekly for the local Muckross Lottery since its launch in early 1990s. Both Kathleen and Jerry were previously recognised for their contribution to the club and both named as Vice Presidents. Kathleen and Jerry's children and grandchildren continue the family tradition both on the lake and onshore, contributing to the club's success and development as active rowers, coaches and committee members.

Presiding over the launch was Club Chairman Sean Daly and the blessing of the boat was carried out by Fr. Kieran O'Brien. The club was also delighted to welcome Emer Corridan, General Manager of the Cahernane House Hotel - whose sponsorship of the club supported the boat's purchase. The ceremonial popping of the champagne cork was carried out by Kathleen's granddaughter Aine and after a sprinkling of the bow, the boat was formally launched on the water by five of Kathleen's grandchildren - Aine and Shona O'Sullivan, Daniel, Jack and Katie Murphy. The special launch event was an emotional day for the family and club with many memories of Kathleen's late husband Jerry, whose anniversary was recently observed, in addition to family members gone before. Speaking on behalf of Kathleen, her son Kieran spoke of the great honour for Kathleen and her family to have one of the club's racing boats named in her honour. Kieran expressed the family's gratitude to the club, its committee and Chairman Sean Daly, President Maurice Coffey and Vice Presidents and to all the members, supporters and friends in attendance. The ceremonial proceedings were followed by refreshments outside the club's new boathouse.

## SET TO REAR FIVE ANGUS CALVES

IN UNIQUE SCHOOLS
COMPETITION



A ta special event at the National Ploughing Championships in Ratheniska, Co. Laois RTE broadcaster Carl Mullan revealed the six schools that will progress as finalists in the Certified Irish Angus school's competition. Among the finalist groups challenged to rear Angus calves were Abbie Daly, Kate Donoghue and Alanna Brady from St. Brigid's Secondary School, Killarney.

The initiative organised by Certified Irish Angus in association with its partners ABP and Kepak has increased in popularity in recent years with schools excelling from both urban and rural schools with farming and non-farming backgrounds. The unique competition sees the student groups actively involved in the rearing of five Irish Angus cattle in order to allow them to gain an understanding of the care and attention that is required to produce top quality Irish beef under a sustainable family farming system.

Over the next 18 months, Abbie Daly, Kate Donoghue and Alanna Brady will rear five Irish Angus calves while carrying out research on an important topic. The group will focus on 'Improving farm outcomes through education, highlighting the importance of farm planning, the positive effect of education on farmers mental health & farm safety, and how to enhance farm income & quality beef production.

The Kerry group join students from St. Louis' High School, Rathmines; Holy Rosary College, Mountbellew; Ardscoil Phádraig, Granard; Abbey Community College, Boyle; Ursuline Secondary School, Thurles as the successful finalists for this year's competition.

Speaking about the event Charles Smith, General Manager for Certified Irish Angus said,: "We are honoured to be welcomed back today by the National Ploughing Association for this special event, allowing the school's competition finalists to meet their Angus calves for the first time. Standards were extremely high once again this year, with brilliant applications received from students of all backgrounds – inner-city schools and groups with rural and farming backgrounds.

We are delighted to reveal these six schools as worthy finalists today. During the interview stages, these groups stood out to the judges for taking great interest in the agri-food industry and for bringing new perspectives, ideas, and findings to the competition. The next 18 months will be exciting, challenging and rewarding for these students as they navigate their way through the competition."

The competition organisers are looking for enthusiastic Transition Year students across Ireland to be the next finalists of the popular competition. Each finalist group will receive a once in a lifetime opportunity to rear five Angus calves for 18 months, while preparing a research project on a relevant topic. The project themes will cover the important topics of Improving Animal Genetics, Sustainable Agriculture, Farm Health & Safety, Increasing Consumer Awareness of the Quality of Irish Food and in Particular Irish Beef.

Each of the finalists will receive the financial benefit involved in the selling of the animals on completion of the project. The winning students also receive an additional grant of €2,000 for their further education.

## Tribute to a

#### LARGER THAN LIFE PERSONALITY

Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce has led the tributes to the late Donie Sheahan, a true legend in Killarney business, sporting and community life, who has passed away at the age of 95.

He has been described as a larger than life personality who contributed enormously to the business life of the town where he ran a very busy pharmacy at 34 Main Street since 1953.

Chamber President Niall Kelleher said Donie was enormously popular, loved by everyone and he played such an active part in everyday

"Sheahan's Pharmacy is a real landmark in Killarney and Donie was always a welcoming presence behind the counter where his experience and expertise helped many people, in so many ways, for close on 70 years.

"His son, Liam, and grandson William, are still providing that wonderful service to the local people and to visitors and our thoughts are very much with the extended Sheahan family at this sad time," the Chamber President said.

Mr Kelleher noted that in addition to his business life, Donie played an

integral part in the growth and success of his beloved Dr Crokes Club, East Kerry and Kerry teams and in the developments at Fitzgerald Stadium which he overlooked from his home on Lewis Road.

"He was also famous for his involvement in horse racing and he enjoyed nothing more than when

of the racehorses he owned competed in Killarney or in his native Listowel, often with great success," he said.

The Chamber also acknowledged the fact that Donie was hospital pharmacist for the Killarney District Hospital and St Columbanus' Home for many years and he played a leading role in the commercial development of the town.

"Above everything else, Donie Sheahan was a true gentleman, a warm personality and a great wit and so many people loved meeting him on his travels. He will be greatly missed," Mr Kelleher said.

## Killarney is one of the TOP 5 BEST PLACES TO LIVE IN IRELAND

killarney has been named as one of the five Best Places to Live in Ireland 2021.

The competition judges praised its stunning location, its vibrancy, and its culture of friendliness.

The other places to make the Top 5 are Clonakilty, Galway City, the village of Glaslough in Co. Monaghan and Waterford City.

The Irish Times 'Best Place to Live in Ireland' competition, began in June when members of the public were invited to nominate their favourite place to live for the award.

Over the course of the summer, more than 2,400 members of the public nominated 470 locations in every county in Ireland for the title. Two weeks ago the long list of Best 20 Places to Live in Ireland was published and now Killarney has made it through to the Best 5 short list. The overall winner will be named next weekend.

Each place was judged on criteria including, natural amenities; buildings; community initiatives and spirit; presence of clubs, societies and activities; good local services; diversity; a welcome for outsiders; transport links; employment opportunities; the price of property and housing supply; cost of living; digital links for distance working; safety and security.

While the number of nominations was a factor in the selection of the top locations – Killarney received 31 - the quality of the place itself was the chief consideration.

The panel of five judges – which includes Mayo County architect Simon Wall, Monaghan GP Dr Illona Duffy, RTE Nationwide TV presenter Zainab Boladale and Irish Times journalist Rosita Boland – spent hours reading and debating the entries, before selecting the Top 5.



Here's what the judges had to say about ! Killarney.

"In a stunning location, Killarney is a lively, bustling town, full of cafes, restaurants and bars. And because it is accustomed to visitors, it is part of the culture to be extra helpful to strangers. Everyone speaks to each other on the street. All the amenities, both natural and man-made, are impressive. It's easy to see why people are proud of the area."

And this is what Sandra Dunlea said about the town in her nomination.

"Killarney is a unique place to live, we have a wide range of schools, job opportunities and access to very good transport links, train, airport and great primary roads for bus and car. We live in the midst of 26,000 acres of protected

national parkland, have a beautiful art school, a variety of dance and stage schools, GAA, soccer and water sports. We have a lovely town which has visitors through the year. We have a huge number of volunteers who dedicate their time to keeping our town and park clean and beautiful."

The competition, which is supported by Randox Health, last took place almost 10 years ago in 2012 in the midst of the financial crisis. On that occasion Westport was selected as the overall Irish Times Best Place to Live as it met so many criteria and displayed a remarkable community spirit that was evident in its 90-plus voluntary organisations. Due to its previous win Westport could not be nominated for this year's competition

## Moving On: Calling women who are LOOKING FOR WORK IN KERRY

VI programme or women in Kerry, matching women who are looking for work with employers looking for staff. Moving On offers women free training, support & links with employers. It also gives women the opportunity to update their digital skills.

Over 200 women have participated in the programme so far and the feedback has been extremely positive. The Moving On programme is coordinated by Lisa Fingleton and Lisa O Flaherty. Both have extensive experience in recruitment as well as working with women and employers.

The programme adapted quickly to the pandemic and all the training has been running online since. This year it is hoped to run the 10 week programme over 2 mornings a week as a blended programme (both online and in person - subject to covid guidelines). According to Lisa Fingleton "The last year and a half was a steep learning curve for us all but we are here to support women even if it is their first time doing training online. We had an amazing response last year with large groups of women participating virtually in talks and events. It enabled us to work with inspiring women such as Dr Nadia Ramoutar who delivered a 'Mastering your Mojo' course for us without having to leave her home in Wicklow. What the pandemic showed us is that we can work more flexibility and sustainably with a better work life balance".

"Remote working became a reality for many people within weeks. You can work in New York or Cork from Castleisland and this creates real opportunities for people living in rural communities", says Lisa.

Noving On is an innovative employment: A lot of women come to Moving On after a number of years working in the home. According to the latest CSO statistics there are 445,000 women taking care of the home/ Ireland. It can be very challenging to make the transition from home back into the workplace. As one of the participant's Helen said "I felt lost and didn't know what to do with my life. I really felt invisible. Moving On has shown me that I have choices and a lot to offer. I have also made so many friends and feel part of something now".

> Women sometimes lack confidence after being at home for a number of years but the programme shows them that they actually bring the necessary 21st century 'new collar skills' that employers need, such as reliability, flexibility, team work and problem solving.

> According to Lisa O Flaherty, "The response from businesses has been fantastic. They are realising the benefits of being more flexible with their hours and offering part time work options. By doing this, they are tapping into a huge resource of skilled workers".

> Moving On runs an 'Inspiring Women' series of talks by influential and enthusiastic women in business and the community covering topics from climate action, dress to impress, creative women and mental health. Mary Beary, career coach focuses of networking skills and often surprises women by saying that "80% of the jobs are found through networking".

> Moving On is currently recruiting for the new programme starting at the end of this month. To be eligible women need to be not currently working, looking for work and not on job seekers/PUP payments.

#### MINSTER FOLEY WELCOMES OVER

The ANC scheme provides payments to people farming land in designated disadvantaged areas.


It aims to support the continuation of farming in these area by compensating farmers for the additional costs involved in farming such land.

In total payments worth just under €182 million are issuing this week to almost 85,000 farmers nationwide. Minister Foley said: "I welcome this funding which will provide a timely boost to for farmers across Kerry. The ANC scheme provides crucial supports to the Kerry farming industry and the first tranche of payments to be made under the scheme and will be issued to eligible applicants this week."

Regular pay runs will continue in the coming weeks to ensure cleared cases are processed for payment as quickly as possible. Farmers should submit any outstanding stocking evidence in support of their application to the Department's Portlaoise Office as soon as possible to facilitate the early release of payments.

#### **Leaving Certificate** 2021

State Examinations and Accredited Grades

he past two years of Leaving Cert exam assessment uncertainty caused by the pandemic was nerve wracking for the respective Leaving Cert cohorts. The loss of class time, remote learning and restrictions on normal living wreaked havoc in their young lives. Desperate measures, such as calculated and accredited grades, were called for in desperate times. The decision of the State Examinations Commission (SEC) to have no involvement with the calculated grades process in 2020 caused a great deal of confusion and dissatisfaction. The SEC was back at the helm this year to monitor the dual system of written exam and/or accredited grades but the inflated grades have driving college points requirements sky high.

While acknowledging that the SEC made a commendable effort in 2021 to provide an assessment of sorts, considerable fault rests with the exams authority for producing results, which deviated alarmingly from standard norms and for distributing high-grades with rare abandon. It's now time to restore the integrity and reputation of an exam that has served the young people of Ireland well since

The traditional Leaving Cert exam has stood the test of time. It's not perfect but in comparison to the shambles of the subjective prediction of the past two exams, it's a perfectly oiled machine. What has been confirmed beyond dispute during the past two years is that an objective test of achievement cannot be replaced by a subjective estimate of ability. The unprecedented grade inflation this year proves that standardisation goes out the window when the checks and balances are ignored. What one actually achieves in an exam is always more credible and prestigious than a 'guestimate' of one's potential to achieve. Every effort must be made by the SEC to provide a comprehensive written exam in June 2022 as well as the related course work - projects, orals, practical exams, etc.- that make the traditional Leaving Cert exam so thorough.

The traditional Leaving Cert is a valid, reliable, impartial and fair psychometric instrument that has provided an accurate record of achievement for almost 100 years to young people at the end of the post-primary school cycle. In the rush to fix something that isn't broken, let's hasten slowly lest we throw the baby out with the bath water! Of course, concessions like more choice of questions and less syllabus content should be retained to compensate for lost class time in 5th year but calculated and accredited grades should be consigned to history.

Meanwhile, by closing time for accepting a CAO Round One college offer on Monday, 13th September a clearer picture began to emerge. A record number of 84,526 applied to the CAO this year for a college place. 77,356 applied for an honours bachelor degree (Level 8) while 42,161 applied for an ordinary bachelor degree/higher certificate (Level 7/6).

On the 7th September, CAO issued a record 82,175 offers to 55,221 applicants. The offers consisted of 49,358 at Level 8 and 32,817 at Level7/Level 6. Offers are issued independently in respect of the two lists (Level 8 and Level 7/ Level 6), so that 26,954 applicants received two offers, one from each list. When an applicant receives an offer from each list simultaneously, s/he is entitled to accept only one of the two offers.

A total of 40,607 accepted a Round One offer - 35,925 at Level 8 and 4,682 at Level 7/6. Therefore, almost 75% of applicants who were offered a course in Round One have accepted that offer. Surprisingly, a significantly large number of 14, 614 or 25% declined the offer of a place.

CAO issued Round Two offers on Monday, 20th September. The reply date for acceptance was Wednesday, 22nd September. CAO will continue to offer any remaining places on a weekly basis with Round Three available from 10am on Tuesday, 28th September.



### **CORRIB OIL ACQUIRES KERRY'S H2 GROUP**

ADDING 13 RETAIL SITES TO ITS PORTFOLIO

Corrib Oil, one of Ireland's leading service station and oil distribution providers has entered an agreement to acquire Kerry's H2 Group it was announced this week.

While subject to approval by the competition regulator, this deal will see Corrib Oil acquire 13 high quality retail sites based across the south and east of Ireland, expanding the Corrib Retail footprint to 33 stores in total.

The new sites are located in Listowel, Co. Kerry; Kildare; Limerick; Tipperary; Dublin; Laois; Offaly and Cork.

Corrib Retail currently operates 20 convenience stores with forecourts; while Corrib Distribution, a leading distributor of heating oils and fuel, operates through 21 depots across 14 counties. Having maintained a 22-year relationship with BWG Foods, all Corrib Retail convenience stores are branded as Spar, while all forecourts are branded Circle K or Texaco, with instore



partners including Insomnia and Chopped. The Corrib Distribution business supplies home heating oil, road fuels and lubricants from 21 distribution sites, operating a fleet of 78 road trucks and 69 service vehicles across the country.

On conclusion of the acquisition deal, Corrib will operate across 54 sites in 16 counties in total - 20 Corrib service stations, 21 oil distribution depots and 13 H2 Group retail sites. Currently employing 700 people, the addition of H2

Group to Corrib Oil will bring total employee numbers to over 1,000 people.

Founded in 2004, the H2 Group operates 13 retail sites, 11 service stations and one convenience store, with the thirteenth to open in Kenmare, Co. Kerry next month.

The business operates its service stations under the Texaco and Top brands, while all stores are Spar branded. In store partners include Insomnia, Apache and Subway.





3. What pension provider is your pension with and how much do they charge you? Charges are very important because you need to make sure that your pension charges are competitive on a like for like basis with other pension providers.



#### MAKING FUN FAMILY TIME AT MEAL TIMES

This topic came up a few times this week with clients in our Nutrition clinics. Many are now reporting that meal times are stressful, rushed, and often parents not having time to join in on the meals with kids as they are rushing about.

I think we are all guilty of this with kids or no kids, so when I discussed it this week with clients I thought "where has the fun in meal times gone". "Have we lost sight of the enjoyment that should come from food". I think the most powerful fact to consider is that the food habits and meal time experiences we create with kids at a young age will most likely stick with them through adolescence and adulthood. And sometimes I even see parents negative behaviours and battles with food filtering down to kids and presenting itself with behaviours like "fussy eaters" and kids that just won't eat certain foods.

Now I don't proclaim to be an expert in this field at all but I always like to offer a few suggestions to parents or an opportunity to "think outside the box" ... so here are a few tips I suggested for clients to get out this week.

- make more time for mealtime. Don't just pack it in for 15mins and expect the kids to enjoy it when your rushing around stresses off your head. Go through your diary and make sure you have no other distractions and make that space and time for this celebration of food.
- This is a big pet hate of mine... being on your phone at dinner table...PUT THE PHONES AWAY AT MEAL TIMES. Your child will learn from you so if you are at the dinner table scrolling away on your phone and not being present. They will follow suit and copy by example. Being present is so important. You will be able to listen to your kids conversations, taste the food you are eating and enjoy and slow down the rush rush and go go of a busy life. Think of meal times and a quiet safe space where you can be present and nothing else matters only the moment with your family.

#### **BLURRED VISION**

When you have blurred vision, your eyesight is less sharp and objects, images and words seem to be out of focus.

### Who is affected by blurred vision?

Anyone can be affected by blurred vision. It could be a sign of getting older and/or needing new glasses, tiredness, or too much sun. But there are many other causes, and it could be one of the symptoms of a range of conditions including:

- · Short-sightedness (myopia), longsightedness (hyperopia), astigmatism and presbyopia
- · An eye injury which may have scratched the cornea
- Foreign object in the eye
- Eye drops
- Dry eye
- Cataracts
- Age-related macular degeneration
- A migraine

Blurred vision can also be a symptom of non-optical conditions such as a diabetes, a stroke and preeclampsia (a condition caused by high blood pressure in pregnancy).

#### What are the symptoms of blurred vision?

Blurred vision is hazy and unfocussed, as though you were looking through an oily film and you feel you need to rub your eyes to get things back into focus.



It can affect your entire field of vision or your peripheral vision (the edges of your vision), and can occur in one eye or both. You may not realise that you have blurred vision in one eye until you do something that requires shutting your other eye for example, doing your make up. This is because your brain provides compensation.

### How do you treat blurred vision?

As blurred vision has many possible causes, the treatment will depend on the condition. If the blurring is recurring or ongoing, you should book an eye examination. This will investigate the cause and recommend suitable treatment or refer you to an appropriate specialist.

If you think it may be one of the symptoms of a serious medical condition such as stroke or preeclampsia, you should seek urgent medical help.

IMAGINE if the Ryder Cup was played in Kerry, home to some of the best golf courses in the world, it would be difficult to choose one venue for the biennial battle between Europe and the United States

Kerry Airport Ireland has come up with a solution by asking former professional golfer Graham Spring from Tralee to combine 18 holes from around the county to create the perfect Kerry Ryder Cup Course.

Just when Ryder Cup fever grips both sides of the Atlantic ahead of this year's competition in Whistling Straits, Graham has compiled a collection of Par 5s, 4s and 3s in Kerry worthy of Ryder Cup status.

Memorable holes in Waterville, Tralee, Ballybunion, Killeen and O'Mahony's Point in Killarney, Dooks, Castlegregory and Dingle have all made the cut to feature in Graham's Perfect Ryder Cup Course.

The Chief Executive of Kerry Airport, John Mulhern, said: "We are blessed to live in such a beautiful part of the world which is famous for its scenery, hospitality and achievements in the world of sport. The Irish Open has been staged in Kerry on five occasions so far and hopefully a sixth in Waterville in a few years from now.

Graham Spring knows the value of golf to the tourism industry in Kerry. He has drawn from his playing experience and his knowledge of the magnificent courses in the county to produce the perfect Wild Atlantic Kerry Ryder Cup Course."

Graham represented Ireland at amateur level, became the first Kerry man to compete in the British Open in 1998 and he is a member of the Club Managers Association of Europe.

Graham Spring, who recently took on the role as Director of Golf at Killarney Golf & Fishing Club, said: "This was a difficult task because I had to put on my thinking cap and reflect on all the holes I've played down through the years and come up with my selection. There's great credit due to Kerry Airport for coming up with this project and it offers them a great opportunity to publicise Kerry golf throughout their destinations. Kerry Airport is a gateway to the county to visit our great golf courses."

Killeen Course, Killarney Golf & Fishing Club – 8th and 17th Holes

O'Mahony's Point, Killarney Golf & Fishing Club – 18th Hole

## Jimmy Greaves RIP

I never saw him play. In fact, I didn't realise that he had even been a player for a long time. I knew him as an avuncular commentator

g an ntator

spoke substance and gave incisive analysis. Not the rubbish that's spouted nowadays. There has been a definite dumbing down of soccer commentary. Neville, Carragher, Keane....arrah, would ye stop clowning around and trying to play up to caricatures of yereselves? Graeme Souness strikes me as a good commentator and Micah Richards has potential if you could take the other lads away from him. It's as if they think the game is more important than themselves. I genuinely believe that 'Match of the Day' became some sort of comedy soap opera where the games were

incidental. As for 'Soccer AM'....RTE was actually a lot better, even if Eamonn Dunphy often couldn't resist himself. Let the sport make the headlines. That was Greaves.

Ask most people who had the best goal to game ratio in English soccer and they'll be guessing at Rush, Cole, Shearer, Henry, Nistlerooy, Kane..... nope. Not even close.

Jimmy Greaves. At fifteen years of age he scored 51 goals for Chelsea Youths, a remarkable feat. A year later he scored 122 Ted Drake had an abundance of young talent at Chelsea (remember, these were the days when players wages were capped, a grossly unfair system but one that prevented super clubs controlling the best players). The young Chelsea side were known as the 'ducklings', and one of them took to the water instantly. 132 goals in 169 games for Chelsea. After a brief stint at Milan, where he didn't settle (the truth is that Jimmy was living a life of stardom at the time and it didn't suit him) he came back to London, joining Tottenham. 266 goals in 379 games. Believe me, Harry Kane doesn't even come close.

Greaves wasn't big. He wasn't a good tackler (let's be honest, wet paper bags could have skipped out of his way). He wasn't all that accurate from long range. He rarely scored brilliant goals. He scored easy ones. All of the time.

He was on England's 1966 World Cup squad, but picked up an injury in the group stage and Alf Ramsay opted the harder working Geoff Hurst. He was finally given his World Cup medal in 2009 – he immediately had to sell it to pay for an operation. Such is the gratitude of nations!

No-one, not Messi, not Ronaldo (the only player to score more goals in European soccer than him), not Maradonna, not even Pele, had his positional sense in the box. An easy-going man by nature, he was as deadly a predator as the game has ever seen. I would tip Robbie Keane just ahead of Don Givens as Ireland's best striker (Givens was remarkable, given that he got far less scoring chances and fewer games). But he wouldn't even have laced Jimmy Greaves boots.

Himself and Ian St. John were the first great soccer commentators. I would argue that they are also among the last.

### **CYCLING**

### **Dan Martin Retires**


Back in the '80s, Seán Kelly and Stephen Roche were the kings of the cycling world and household names. Roche was dash and flair, winning every honour available including the Tour de France. But there was something more identifiable to the Irish psyche in quiet countryman Seán Kelly, the 'King of the Mountains' and arguably the most consistent rider over a decade. Rarely first past the line, but always up in the top ten.

Nicholas Roche took up his father's mantle – his newspaper columns were invariably candid and revealing about the inner world of the peloton. It was of particular interest here in Kerry – our tradition of cycling goes back a lot further than the eighties. I've mentioned Iron Man Mick Murphy before, and will again, le cunamh De. The most fascinating sportsman Kerry, and probably all Ireland, has ever produced.

Unfortunately, the exposure of Lance Armstrong as a drug cheat did a lot of damage to the sport and the cover-up by the authorities (and it must

be said that certain Irish officials did not cover themselves in glory in the matter, whereas Irish journalists did) took much of the lustre away from cycling. Too many of the headlines were too negative for too long.

Less heralded than Nicholas Roche but a more consistent rider, Dan Martin was Ireland's best cyclist for a decade, but this week he has announced that he is finally stepping away from one of the most gruelling sports of all. Two stage wins in the Tour de France. Three top ten finishes. Two Vuelta a Espana stage wins and top ten



finishes. The Liége Bastogne classic. Il Lombardia classic. Earlier this year he won a stage in the Giro dltalia (it's actually a more interesting race than France, tactics are crucial). Dan is 35 years old and the truth is that cycling is hard. It's a constant grind for very little reward.

Very few worked as hard or as constantly as Dan. I never spoke to him, but I've always admired his ability to get his head down and do the work nonstop regardless of setbacks. I wish him well as he moves forward.

## FOCUS ON AUTUMN **GARDENING**

There is a lot of work to do in the garden at this time of the year, so you can reap the rewards later on and during the spring and summer.

You can start by giving your herbaceous plants a tidy up. Some of them are obviously in full flower and looking good but there are also a lot that have finished flowering for a while, so its best with these to remove all the dead stems.

### TRANSITION FROM PRIMARY TO SECONDARY SCHOOL WHAT CAN PARENTS DO?

The transition from Primary to Secondary school can be a difficult one for many children and this year will bring additional challenges. The change from being the most senior student to suddenly becoming a junior again may bring many challenges for your child. They are leaving behind a familiar world and entering a whole new domain with new teachers, subjects, classrooms, class mates, an increased workload and a longer day. As this change also tends to coincide with the onset of puberty, is it any wonder that it can be so daunting for your child? This can also be a difficult time for parents. The school day is longer and your child will be taking on more subjects. Some of these subjects are ones you may not be familiar with which may mean you won't be able to help out with homework. There are also more teachers involved in your child's schooling. Your child's social circle is widening and you may not know who their friends are.

As your child moves through this transition, your job as parent is to support them to negotiate the challenges posed. First and foremost it is important not to pass on your own fears to your child. Remember, children are extremely resilient and adaptable and before long these new surroundings will be familiar and comfortable for them.

When talking to your child about the expected transition let them know that you have trust and confidence in their ability to master these changes. Tell them about your own experiences and ways that helped you to cope. Talk to them about the change in routine and the possible change of classroom and teacher every 40 minutes. To make this transition as smooth as possible, particularly in the early days, try to be as supportive and encouraging as possible.

Ensure they eat well, sleep well and stay tuned for any signs of distress or difficulty. Listen to them when they relay stories from school and show an active interest in their friendships, the school. their teachers, their activities and their subjects.

As parents, we can often feel a little helpless - our role is to be supportive, interested and encouraging. Always keep the lines of communication open and if you have any concerns please contact

the school. No one knows your child better than you. As your child moves through their teens remember they are involved in a major life change. Your job as a parent is to nurture their confidence and enable them to become well-adjusted and fully functioning adults.

Next week we will focus on what young people can do to help make this transition easier.


Welcome back dear reader the suffering Job endured was enormous. Satan attacked him in every area of his life — his family, his finances, and ultimately his health and physical body. His wife, no doubt horrified at his suffering, counsels Job to "curse God and die". Things couldn't get worse. But they did. Job's friends came to 'comfort him' and offered their counsel as to why all this had befallen him, and dragged him down further - kick a dog when he's down. Job questioned God, wondered where He was in the midst of all this anguish, but refused to curse God. Then God spoke to Job in the storm and put him right on Who He was and where all this had come from. He told Job "I have questions for you that you must answer". Job's situation eventually turned around when he humbled himself and repented for his pride and ignorance and not only was Job restored and healed, but God used him to pray for his friends so they also could be restored (Job 42:1-17).

Job's story is still relevant today. When one is going through suffering, grief, or pain it can be so much easier to be angry at God, question Him and blame Him. But friend, evil, sickness and turmoil do not come from God (James 1:17). Often though, He is the first One to be blamed in ignorance. When one is feeling weak and helpless it is a lonely, lonely place to be. What often happens is that people run away from God because they are offended at Him, when what should happen is that we RUN TO Him for help.

Religion teaches people that sickness or trouble 'is a cross for you to bear because you are specially chosen by God to carry it'. This is an abomination to the sacrifice that God's Son Jesus made at the Cross. If sickness and trouble is a special prize from God, then why are those people going to doctors or therapists for help to overcome it? Because deep down we know that this is not how we are to live (John 10:10). If someone doesn't know that it is the devil that brings attacks against them they are in the dark. The devil likes to keep it that way. It makes his day when people blame God or others for their circumstances, totally unaware of who is really behind it. What better way for an enemy to overpower his prey — when the prey doesn't even recognise him? Instead his prey is distracted to fight a battle with the One Who is not their enemy, but rather their life source.

For many who have been through the fire and come out the other side — they, like Job, have met God in the midst of it, and have a new relationship with Him grateful that Jesus brought them through and protected them. God desires to dwell within you in peace dear friend. His name is Emmanuel which means 'God with us' (Isaiah 7:14; Isaiah 9:2-7; John 3:16). He is with you, so call upon your Deliverer Jesus today.


