





FORMER SEM STUDENTS REUNITE

Over 40 past pupils of St. Brendan's College from 1967, 1968 & 1969 classes returned to their alma mater. Addressed by school principal, Sean Coffey, Head Prefect, Fionán O'Donoghue and Deputy Head Prefect, David Finn, the speakers focused on how life at second level has changed since the 1960's.

Former College student and subsequently Chief Inspector at the DES Eamon Stack also addressed the group reminding them of the unique "sem lexicon" the shared terms and phrases, the columns of student groupings in

accordance with their home parishes. He also drew reference from Sean Kelly's Memoir and his life at St. Brendan's. He also recalled that the high achiever's results in photographs were published in the Kerryman following the Leaving Cert. Noting how education has changed since their time in school he highlighted that the 1968 Leaving Certificate involved a cohort of 12,000 students nationally compared with the figure of 62,000 in 2014. Following the formal element of the reunion the group spent the afternoon tracing their adolescent footsteps on the stairs of the Brosnan building, through the dormitories and most especially in reviewing some of the many hundreds of photographs chronicling their times at St. Brendan's.

After the school visit the reunion continued with dinner at the Castlerosse hotel.

With the College now about to launch its website, www.stbrendanscollege.ie the time is ripe to restructure a Past Pupils Union, providing an ongoing link to St. Brendan's.

€145,000 EXTENSION TO MUCKROSS COMMUNITY

CENTRE

The closely knit Muckross Community are coming together for a street collection in Killarney on Saturday November 1st to raise funds for the €145,000 extension to Muckross Community Centre.

"The extension will double the size of the Centre's hall," Chairman of Muckross Community Centre, Liam Kelly, explains, "as well it will provide essential storage space and disability toilets."

"The new hall will have a folding partition so we can divide it into two separate areas that can be used at the same time," Mr Kelly said this week. "As well we can use the full hall for larger community events."

"This development would not have been possible without a 75% grant from the South Kerry Development Partnership (SKDP)" Mr Kelly says, "we are extremely grateful to CEO Noel Spillane and his colleagues in South Kerry for their constant help and advice."

"Saturday November 1st Killarney street collection will help towards the €36,000 the Muckross Community Association has to raise to pay for the extension," Liam Kelly outlines, "we hugely appreciate the support of the



Killarney native Breda Joy has been a








TIPS FOR MANAGING THE COLD, FLU OR COUGH:

- Drink plenty of fluids, such as water, vitamin-rich fruit drinks and hot drinks containing honey & lemon
- Eat a diet high in fresh fruit & veg
- Avoid alcohol, tobacco and caffeine
- Put a few drops of eucalyptus oil on your bed linen at night
- To protect others, cover your mouth and nose when sneezing or coughing, and wash your hands frequently
- Never exceed the stated dose of your cold, flu or cough remedy
- You can take paracetamol or ibuprofen to relieve headache, aches & pains and fever. Ask your doctor or pharmacist for advice about over-the-counter remedies.
- If you are taking medicines for other conditions, you must check with your doctor or pharmacist before taking other over-the-counter remedies.
- If your symptoms persist or worsen, consult your G.P.

RSA APPEALS TO PARENTS AND CHILDREN TO STAY SAFE THIS **HALLOWEEN**

Call is made as road fatalities among children double in 2014

The Road Safety Authority (RSA) is appealing to parents and children, today 31st October, to 'Be Safe and Seen' while trick-or-treating this Halloween.

The RSA is urging all road users to make road safety a priority this Halloween as 14 children under the age of 14 have died in the first ten months of the year on Irish roads. In 2013, seven children lost their lives, meaning the number of child casualties so far this year has already exceeded the total number of child deaths in 2013. Seven of the children who died on our roads this year were pedestrians and seven were car passengers.

The RSA is also calling on drivers to take extra care on Halloween night and reminding all road users to be vigilant and watch out for children, especially when driving in housing estates and residential areas.

"Halloween is a fun time for children and their parents. But it's important to stay safe, especially visiting friends and neighbours when out trick-or-treating," said Ms Moyagh Murdock, CEO, Road Safety Authority.

The RSA has the following tips for parents whose children are planning to go trick-or-treating:

- It's important that children are supervised by an adult at all times, children will be very excited about getting their sweets and treats, and may dart across the street without checking for cars. The RSA recommends that parents accompany all trick-or-treating children under 12.
- Speak to your child about the importance of staying safe when walking on the footpath or road before you leave the house to go trick-ortreating. Children will often be so excited about



going trick-or-treating that they may not hear or heed your warnings if you bring up safety tips when you are actually out and about.

- Children will be out while it's dark, so it's both hard for them to see and hard for drivers to see them. Consider having your child carry a flashlight, wear an armband or use a glow stick which is a fun and novel way for the kids to be seen. Children will love wearing them too. You could also consider sewing reflective materials onto your child's costume.
- Children often cannot see well when wearing masks, big hats, and other costume accessories that can obstruct their vision. So it's important to be by their side to ensure their safety at all
- Try to avoid costumes that are billowing or too long as they increase the chances your child tripping, especially when crossing the road.

"The clocks went back at the weekend so darkness is upon us much earlier in the evenings now. This means that it will be dusk or dark when children and their parents are setting out to go trick or treating. By following these important safety tips, we can ensure fun is had by all this Halloween and that all children out trick-or-treating are safe on our roads. Finally, we'd like to also appeal to drivers and other road users to be particularly vigilant on Halloween night, watching out for children who will be out after dark, especially when driving in residential areas," concluded Ms Murdock.

ROAD USERS 'ARE YOU READY FOR WINTER?'

There are a number of simple precautions the RSA advises for driving over the winter months:

- Use your lights. As we come into the winter months, motorists are advised to use dipped head lights during the day so you are easily seen. Headlights and taillights should be clean and in working order. Ensure the beam on your headlights is adjusted correctly to avoid dazzling other drivers unnecessarily. Only use fog lights in foggy conditions and don't forget to turn them off after they have been used in fog and mist
- Check your tyres...they are your only contact with the road. Car tyres should be above the minimum legal thread depth of 1.6mm but need to be changed before they get this worn. The RSA advises replacing tyres when they reach 3mm and don't buy second had tyres as you cannot be sure of its history. . The legal limit for motorcycle tyres is 1mm and again should be replaced before they get this worn. Tyres need to be at the manufacturers recommended level to give the motorist the best chance in extreme conditions.
- Safe Distance. It takes longer to stop a car during the winter weather so slow down and allow extra distance between you and the car in front. Remember, only a fool breaks the 2 second
- Understand your brakes. Check your car manual

- and find out if your vehicle has safety assist technology such as Electronic Stability Control (ESC) or Anti Lock Braking System (ABS). Learn how these technologies can assist your driving in harsh weather conditions.
- Make sure you can clearly see. All too often motorists do not de-fog or de-ice windows and mirrors which can compromise visibility. This winter make sure windows and mirrors are clear, and carry a de-icer and screen scraper in the car. Do not use boiling water as this can crack the windscreen. Wipers are especially important for driving this winter; they need to be checked for wear and tear, and replaced if necessary;
- Be prepared. During these winter months it is advised that motorists carry a number of essentials in the boot of their car, should severe weather strike again this year.
- a) High visibility vest
- b) Appropriate footwear in case you need to leave your vehicle e.g. boots
- c) A hazard warning triangle
- d) Spare wheel
- e) Tow Rope
- f) A shovel
- g) De-icing equipment (for glass and door locks)
- h) Spare bulbs
- i) First aid kit

- j) A fire extinguisher
- k) A working torch
- I) A car blanket, additional clothing & some food and water
- m) Its recommend that drivers keep their fuel tanks topped up especially in times of adverse weather conditions!. You do not want to run out of fuel on a journey in bad weather.

In the event of a breakdown. Drivers need to ensure their vehicle is well in off the road so as not to obstruct other vehicles. The driver should also put on their hazard warning lights. If the vehicle breaks down on the motorway pull in as far as you can, alerting traffic behind you with hazard lights. The driver should leave their vehicle, get behind the barrier (on the embankment) and call the Gardaí, on their mobile phone or roadside telephone.

Beware of "Black Ice". Black Ice is one of winter's biggest hazards as it is difficult to see. Watch out for sheltered/ shaded areas on roads, under trees and near high walls.

And most importantly, Keep up to date. Listen to local weather and traffic reports. Pay heed to the weather warnings alerting drivers of unsafe and dangerous driving conditions.



UNHEALTHY RELATIONSHIP PATTER

Do you find yourself repeating similar patterns in different relationships or in a particular relationship over time. Perhaps you often feel lonely or jealous in your relationships. Maybe you try to earn the other person's attention by being overly nice or giving without paying heed to your own needs or desires. Do you fear rejection or being abandoned? Could it be that you choose partners who are distant and can make your feel and/ or believe that you're not good enough. Do you focus so much on your partner that they feel stifled? Often these patterns can reflect our inner experiences and our beliefs about ourselves and our emotional availability to others.

Psychologist John Bowlby defined attachment as a 'lasting psychological connectedness between human beings' and attachment theory can help us to understand the ways in which we connect with others - particularly those who are emotionally significant to us. We develop our attachment style in childhood - and the way in which our parents and/or caregivers responded to us will impact on our relationships.

For example, a child who believed that the only way he/she could be loved was when they were doing something for others, may grow up believing that they need to earn the attention and love of others. Adults who believe they are inadequate and unworthy of love may have learned this in their early years - which will inevitably lead to difficulties in their relationships. They may believe that the other will leave them or that they are going to disappoint the other - leading to them clinging to the relationship and/or getting jealous easily.

However, the good news is that with awareness we can discover our own attachment style and learn to cultivate healthier relationships. Some of the ways in which we can bring more awareness to our relationship patterns include the following:

- 1. Bring your awareness to your bodily sensations. How do you feel in your body? Being aware of this can help you to understand how you are feeling and/or thinking.
- 2. What thoughts are you thinking about you/ the other? How do these thoughts impact on your feelings and emotions?
- 3. Which emotions do you struggle with how do these emotions affect your thoughts and beliefs about yourself?
- 4. Are you overly self-critical? Can you show yourself some selfcompassion, support and care the way you might a close friend or a small child?
- 5. Learn to communicate more directly about your thoughts, feelings and needs. Once you become aware of what these are then you can express them more fully to others.

Next week we will focus on the importance of communication and how counselling can help us to find our own voice, and become more confident as we make ourselves known to another person.

Treatment continued:

Chemotherapy

Chemotherapy is a treatment of cancer by using anti-cancer medicines which kill cancer cells, or stop them from multiplying. When chemotherapy is used in addition to surgery it is known as adjuvant chemotherapy.

Chemotherapy is sometimes given before surgery to shrink a tumour so that surgery may have a better chance of success and also a smaller operation may be performed. This is known as neoadjuvant chemotherapy.

Chemotherapy may also be used for some women to treat breast cancer which has spread to other areas of the body.

Trastuzumab (Herceptin®)

Trastuzumab (also known as Herceptin®) is a treatment that may be given to women who have a large number of HER2 receptors in their cancer. It is a type of medicine called a monoclonal antibody. It works by attaching to HER2 receptors on the surface of breast cancer cells, thereby stopping the cancer cells from dividing and growing.

Screening for breast cancer

In Ireland Breast screening is carried out through the BreastCheck Programme. BreastCheck is a Government-funded programme providing breast screening and invites women aged 50 to 64 for a free mammogram on an area-by-area basis every two years. The aim of BreastCheck is to reduce deaths from breast cancer by finding and treating the disease at an early stage. Mammography is a special X-ray test and aims to detect breast cancer at an early stage when treatment is most likely to be curative.

Genetic testing and mammography screening (and preventive treatments in some cases) may also be offered to younger women with a strong family history of breast cancer. See your doctor if you feel this applies to you.

All women of every age should be breast aware. That is, get to know how your breasts and nipples normally look and feel. Try to recognise any changes that occur before and after your periods. See your GP if you notice any changes, lumps, or other abnormalities in your breasts or nipples. Don't wait until your next scheduled screening appointment.



2014: ANOTHER GOOD YEAR FOR DAIRY FARMERS

(BY TOMMY ROCHE, CASTLEISLAND)

Dairy farmers will look back on 2014 with affection; the record milk price of 2013 continued into this year and has slowly eased back towards normal. The winter and early spring was extremely wet, April/May was average and then from June through September nobody worried about the weather. Farm work is easy when the sun shines, it still has to be done but the stress is taken away when you are no longer chasing a few dry hours. It rained just enough to keep the more pessimistic individuals quiet and in the warm sunshine nature poured forth its bounty. Silage and hay stocks are replenished for the winter and every farmer has a little extra for the next bad year. The wisdoms of generations gone by are always relevant and the saying 'old hay is old gold" is still to the forefront. of every mind following the spring of 2013.

October is a peculiar month on a dairy farm. Grass is still at the centre of the cow's diet, she is still milking as she has done since spring but the urgency is gone out of the daily chores. Field work is all but finished, yard work for the winter is generally under control, barring a specific project but it is still an important month to "get right". Most farms now stockpilegrassduringSeptember, this

"bank" is then eaten during October and November as grass growth rates slip below daily demand. This is a task which takes years of experience to get right. Too much grass grown and it will rot at the base and the cows will reject it, too little and cows will have to be housed sooner on a winter diet. This adds to expense and workload hence a special effort is made to plan the supply in advance. Getting the cows to eat this grass is not plain sailing either, in wet conditions they will turn up their noses at the idea of cleaning up their allocation, not unlike a child with his cabbage or carrots. A battle of wits then ensues, it may take a few days, but as creatures of habit they will eventually accept a regime of daily allowances and peace resumes. Better to stay out of their way as much as possible during those days though, a herd of cows can make a lot of noise when they don't agree with your plans. Why worry about a little waste you might ask. The other side of this equation is the grass plant, if it is not properly grazed now and dead material is left in situ for the winter then it will not grow as effectively next year. So measuring how much grass you assign every 12/24 hours is important, too little equals hungry cows, too much and 2015 suffers. This is where the fun starts, each cow will eat approximately 15kgs dry matter in 24 hours, and each hectare will contain somewhere between 1500 and 2500 kgs of available grass dry matter. Calculator, walking boots, strip wire and good electric fence required. There is more to feeding grass than just opening the gate.





HOW WILL BUDGET 2015 IMPACT ON FARMERS

Budget 2015 introduced a range of measures focused on rebalancing the market in favour of long-term land leasing:

Income thresholds for relief from leasing income have been increased by 50% e.g. for leases greater than 10 years the exemption increases from €20,000 to €30,000.

New income tax threshold of €40,000 for leases greater than 15 years.

Incorporated farm companies allowed as an eligible lessee and lower age threshold of 40 years removed in order to be a qualifying

The abolition of stamp duty on agricultural leases between 5 and 35 years to active farmers.

To support the transfer of farms to the next generation the following measures were introduced:

CGT Retirement Relief - Land which has been leased for up to 25 years will now qualify for relief (previously 15 years).

CGT Retirement relief for disposals outside the family - Land let on a conacre basis will now qualify provided land is disposed of by 31 December 2016.

The definition of farmer for CGT Agricultural relief narrowed such that only "active" farmers qualify or someone who leases the agricultural assets on a long term basis to an active farmer.

Stamp Duty relief between certain close relatives extended to 31 December 2017.

The combined impact of the increase in the long term leasing tax exemption limits and the CAT Agricultural relief could mean that, for example, a person who received a gift/inheritance of farm assets could benefit from 90% Agricultural relief and up to €40,000 of annual exempt rental income.


Further changes introduced were:


Change to income averages allows farmers to average their taxable income over a five year period (extended from three years). By increasing the period to 5 years the impact of price fluctuations and the impact of weather may be lessened

The farmers' flat rate addition for farmers not registered for Vat will be increased from 5 per cent to 5.2 per cent from January 1st.





HALLOWEEN IS GETTING NEAR

The shops are stocked with all sorts of scary masks and costumes and news items lately have been taken up with stories of giant and scary spiders roaming into homes throughout the country, despite the fact that now is the time for spiders to reach their maximum adult size. They especially grow large when they have had plenty to eat and, being insect predators, they have grown fat on the full and wholesome menu of all those flies and bugs that nice, warm, sunny 2014 provided and that would otherwise have bothered us.

There are over 370 species of spiders in Ireland and all spiders are venomous that is how catch their insect prey - by injecting venom down hollow fangs into their victims. But they don't really bite humans. We are much too big and taste foul.

Only about half-a-dozen can open their mouths wide enough, and have fangs long enough to deliver a venomous nip that feels like a wasp sting and it can become infected and ooze pus but so can a scratch from a thorn. Deaths from spider bites still hover around the zero mark.

Now for another form of fangs - A "vampire grave" containing a skeleton with a stake driven through its chest has been unearthed by Professor Nikolai Ovcharov and his team of archaeologist while excavating the ruins of Perperikon, an ancient Thracian city located in southern Bulgaria, close to the border with Greece

The skeleton, thought to be of a man aged between 40 and 50, had a heavy piece of ploughshare – an iron rod, used in a plough – hammered through its chest. The left leg below the knee had also been removed and left beside the skeleton.

The find is the third such discovery in Bulgaria, and bears a strong similarity to two previous graves discovered in 2012 and 2013 in the Bulgarian seaside town of Sozopol, 200 miles to the east of Perperikon, which were nicknamed "the twin vampires of Sozopol".

Regardless of whether you are waiting up

to become acquainted with Dracula and his relations or to listen out for things that go bump in the night – if you are an animal owner, try to keep them as calm as possible and above all please ensure that they cannot escape if they become terrified of the bangs and hisses of the illegal fireworks which no doubt will be around.

THE TOILET IS NOT THE DIRTIEST PLACE IN THE HOUSE

Toilets, have only 50 faecal bacteria per square inch, according to a study by Dr. Chuck Gerba, a microbiology professor at the University of Arizona.

Here are some surprising places and objects that frequently contain large amounts of bacteria that could make you sick.

- CUTTING BOARDS: They have about 200 times more faecal bacteria than toilet seats, coming from raw meat, particularly animal insides where faecal bacteria originates. To clean, run plastic cutting boards through the dishwasher if you do not have a dishwasher cut the meat on a plate instead. Never cut meat on a wooden board and when you use them for chopping or cutting other produce, scrub well and make sure you let wooden boards dry completely before storing.
- KITCHEN SPONGE: This must-have cleaning tool has 10 million bacteria per square inch, and its dishcloth cousin has 1 million per square inch. You can clean them by running them through a dishwashing cycle or placing a wet sponge in the microwave for two minutes.
- MAKE-UP AND FACE CREAMS: In order of most to least contaminated, according to a study of bacteria in beauty products: Face creams (70% of those tested), mascaras (37%) and eye shadows (23%). Changing beauty products every three months will cut down on contamination.
- MOBILE PHONES: It's not hard to believe that your phone, which you breathe on, is a bacterial playground. Once a week, clean with

alcohol-free disinfectant wipes.

THE WORLDS MOST ENDANGERED WHALE

A genetically distinct group of whales—possibly an entirely new species—has been discovered off the coast of Florida's Panhandle region.

Scientists discovered the genetically unique set of about 50 whales during recent research in the Gulf of Mexico. The whales, which are members of the Bryde's family, live year-round in the Gulf. They reside in an underwater canyon near Florida's west coast, an area highly susceptible to offshore oil spills.

The whales' home, DeSoto Canyon, is adjacent to the canyon where the 2010 Deepwater Horizon oil spill occurred. The whales don't migrate from the Gulf, and have more in common genetically with Pacific Bryde's whales than with their Atlantic cousin, according to the study.

Blowing out 100 birthday candles is more possible than ever. According to the U.S. National Institute on Aging, we're on the brink of a watershed moment in history. Quite soon, there will be more people on Earth who are 65 than 5.

And longevity is reaching new records. The oldest documented person in 2012 was 116 -- 73 years old when the first man walked on the moon, and already 93 when the Berlin Wall fell. So what does it take to live to 100? According to study conducted by the Journal of the American Geriatrics Society, it's mostly a matter of genes. But science is also showing that even small efforts toward taking care of our health, such as exercise and diet, can have a striking effect on how long we live. To help boost your own odds, be sure to take advantage of 7 tips that'll help you live to 100.

- Wake up each day and just get busy.
- Don't dwell on the tough times.
- Find a good doctor.
- Decide to be content.
- Serve others.
- Dance.
- Forgive.
- Exercise in the fresh air.

SHELTER DOGS HELP TURN TROUBLED TEENS TURN THEIR LIFE AROUND

Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Los Angeles (spcaLA) in cooperation with The Juvenile Division of the Los Angeles Superior Court and the Los Angeles District Attorney's Office, is re-instilling empathy into teens with a revolutionary approach to curing violence – the Teaching Love and Compassion Program for Juvenile Offenders (jTLC).

MARGARET'S RAMBLINGS

In a two-day, court-mandated course - a condition of probation for some juvenile offenders – teens are paired with shelter dogs and offered intensive sessions designed to help at-risk youth identify and break the cycle of violence.

For the last two years, spcaLA has pilot-tested the jTLC programme with juvenile offenders from communities like Long Beach and Sylmar. 80% of the offenders have avoided trouble and not reoffended. jTLC is unique to spcaLA and Los Angeles County.

"As an animal lover, retired Police Sergeant and currently Los Angeles County District Attorney Juvenile Offender Intervention Program (J.O.I.N.) hearing officer, I knew from experience and studies that the direct correlation between animal cruelty and domestic violence, child abuse, bullying and school fights is factual," said Lianne Osendorf. "The cycle of abuse will continue unless there is intervention to break the cycle. The collaboration of the LA DA and spcaLA to bring awareness and intervention to these minors is a major step in doing just that. Thanks to Melanie Wagner, Director of Humane Education, and her staff and some very caring District Attorneys the program has been a phenomenal success. With few exceptions the minors that participate come away from the experience with new found respect for animals and people. The weekend class focuses on teaching minors how damaging abuse can be not only to animals and people but also to the person inflicting the abuse."

jTLC attendees range from teenage girls who were convicted of bullying to an animal abuse offender who, at 8 years old, was bullied by his brother to injure a rabbit. Now at 14 years old, he was sentenced to jTLC for hitting a dog in the head with a brick.

TLC has helped over 500 at-risk youth exhibiting behavioural problems or anti-social tendencies. The programme is designed to prevent animal cruelty and in turn prevent violence toward people. The TLC program helps students identify and break the cycle of violence through positive feedback, building self-esteem and increasing respect for all living creatures.

Quisling entered the army in 1911 and served as military attaché in Petrograd (St. Petersburg; 1918–19) and in Helsinki (1919–21). He assisted in relief work in Russia under the famous Arctic explorer and humanitarian Fridtjof Nansen and later for the League of Nations. In the absence of diplomatic relations between Britain and Soviet Russia, he represented British interests at the Norwegian legation in Moscow (1927-29). As minister of defence in an agrarian government (1931–33), he gained notoriety for repressing a strike by hydro electrical workers. He resigned from the government in 1933 to form the fascist Nasjonal Samling (National Union) Party, which stood for suppression of Communism and unionism, but he never gained a seat in the Storting (parliament).

At a meeting with Adolf Hitler in December 1939, Quisling urged a German occupation of Norway; after the German invasion of April 1940, he proclaimed himself head of the government. He was held responsible for sending nearly 1,000 Jews to die in concentration camps. After the liberation of Norway in May 1945, he was arrested, found guilty of treason and other crimes, and executed.

WEED DATING

Bet you thought I had misspelt the headline, can't say I blame you, but weed dating actually exists, naturally is began in the US when it first made an appearance at a Northeast Organic Farming Association in Vermont in 2010 and since then other farmers have organised their own meet-ups as far away as New Zealand. In addition to providing some volunteer farmhands, the events have been used as fundraisers, neighbourhood mixers and outreach for the host farm. As for the event itself, there's very little required besides a turnout and some weeds to pull.

In weed dating instead of sitting across from

each other at tables, you meet each other in bed — a garden bed, that is. Here's how it works: Lines of men and women face each other across a row of vegetables in need of some TLC. They weed and get to know each other. After a set amount of time, either the men or women move down to the next partner. Depending on the attendance and weeding logistics many host farmers have weeders work in small groups that are broken up and reformed until everyone has met each other.

A DOG WHO'S ALLERGIC TO PEOPLE

A friendly stray dog who was found to be suffering from a mysterious skin condition is being given a new chance at a normal life thanks to the tireless dedication of his rescuers. When Robin Herman, who runs Lucky Dog Retreat Rescue, Inc. in Indianapolis, Indiana, first saw the patchy-haired black lab named Adam, she knew she had to try and help him. She and her staff had success treating dogs with skin conditions in the past, so she suspected that all the young dog needed was someone patient enough to find the cause of the problem.

"For the most part, it's just a matter of feeding them good food and giving them a stress-free environment," Ms. Herman said. "They usually heal up pretty quickly.

The rescue centre staff fed the dog a clean diet and gave him frequent medicated baths, but even after six weeks of special treatment, his skin condition failed to improve. Meanwhile, Adam had to live full-time wearing a cone, or else he'd bite and scratch at his irritated skin until it was raw and bloody.

Ms. Herman and her staff were at a loss, though undeterred in their commitment to find a solution. That's when Adam's veterinarian recommended that a blood test be done to see if there might be something in the environment that was causing an allergic reaction.

When the results came back, Ms. Herman could hardly believe it. As it turns out, Adam did have an allergy — to people.

"I laughed. I thought the vet was kidding. The vet said she wasn't and explained that just like people can be allergic to dog dander, dogs can be allergic to human dander. She was surprised too. She'd never seen it before" Ms. Herman

To those who'd tried so long to make Adam better, it suddenly made sense. All the time and attention they'd devoted to trying to care for him had actually been making him sick. But now that they know what is wrong, they have a better idea of how to treat him.

Adam will soon start treatment with blood serum created just for him which will hopefully help his body build up a tolerance to the human dander allergy. Both Ms. Herman and her vet are optimistic that he'll get better better enough to live a normal life with a family that loves him as much as they do.

"We just want to make him comfortable, so he doesn't have to live in a cone. Once we get there, God willing, we'll find him a home, he's sweet and funny and a very special little dog.

FOCUS ON DIVIDING HERBACEOUS PERENNIALS

If you divide your herbaceous Perennials regularly it will ensure healthy, vigorous plants that will look good and should perform year after year. It also gives you the opportunity to multiply your plants.

Every two to three years should be enough to divide most perennials to maintain good vigor and healthy plants but if you want to divide them for the purpose of propagation, it can be done more regularly.

The best time to divide herbaceous Perennials is when the plants are dormant, so anytime from November to mid March. A lot of spring flowering plants such as Irises, are best divided in Summer after flowering when they produce new shoots.

When you have divided your plant and you have either planted some in the border or in pots, remember to keep well watered until established.

Know Your Rights:

DEBT RELIEF NOTICE

QUESTION

I am unemployed, getting social welfare and living in rented accommodation. I have large credit card debts and a credit union loan of €13,300. I can't make my repayments and the only asset I have is a car worth €1,200, which I need to take my son to school. Is there anything I can do to reduce my debts?

You may qualify for a Debt Relief Notice (DRN). This is one of three debt resolution mechanisms introduced under the Personal Insolvency Act 2012 for people who cannot afford to pay their personal debts. In general, you can qualify for a DRN if your net monthly income after deductions for reasonable living expenses is under €60 and your total assets are valued at €400 or less. There are some exceptions. You are allowed, for example, to own a motor vehicle valued at €2,000 or less. You may qualify for a DRN if all your qualifying debts are below €20,000, excluding certain "non-permitted"

You must apply for a DRN through an Approved Intermediary (AI). You must disclose all details of your financial affairs to the AI, who will then advise you whether or not you meet the conditions for a DRN, the consequences, any alternative options, and the fee that you may have to pay to the Insolvency Service of Ireland (ISI). The AI service is free.

The DRN provides you with protection from creditors for three years. If your circumstances do not change and you meet all the conditions of your DRN, at the end of the threeyear period the money you owe to the creditors named on the DRN will be written off.

You can choose an AI from the Register of Approved Intermediaries published by the ISI. Several Money Advice and Budgeting Service (MABS) companies have been authorised to act as Als. If you are thinking of applying for a DRN through MABS, you will first need to answer some questions to check if you meet the eligibility criteria. You will need to gather all relevant information about your debts, assets, income and circumstances.
