# **COLM COOPER SELECTED AS KERRY** PERSON OF THE YEAR



COLM COOPER, GAA PUNDIT, LEGENDARY KERRY FOOTBALLER, WINNER OF FIVE ALL IRELAND MEDALS, EIGHT ALL STARS AND EVERY MAJOR HONOUR IN THE GAME HAS BEEN NAMED AS THE KERRY PERSON OF THE YEAR FOR 2018 BY THE KERRY ASSOCIATION IN DUBLIN. PIC JULIEN BEHAL PHOTOGRAPHY.

Cooper, GAA pundit, legendary Kerry Footballer, winner of five all Ireland Medals, eight All Stars and every major honour in the game has been named as the Kerry Person of the Year for 2018 by the Kerry Association in Dublin. Colm will be joined on the awards night by The Special Olympics Clubs of Kerry who have been selected to receive the Laochra Chiarral award which recognises exemplary leadership community activity in the county. The announcements were made at a reception in the Shelbourne Hotel, St. Stephen's Green on 18 January 2017 by Keelin Kissane, Cathaoirleach of the Kerry Association in Dublin.

The awards will be presented at the Association's annual Oiche Chiarraí which will be held at the Ballsbridge Hotel in Dublin on Friday, 2 March 2018.

The Kerry Person of the Year award, now in its thirty ninth year, recognises an individual who has shown leadership, brought honour to the county, and performed services for the county to such an extent that could be described as being beyond the norm of everyday life.

During her tribute to Colm Cooper, a native of Killarney, the Cathaoirleach said this award is presented in recognition of the enormous contribution he has made to Kerry and for the joy, honour and pride that he has

brought to Kerry by his exceptional ability and humility and good grace on and off the field.

She noted that he is one of the most admired figures in the history of the GAA and has provided us with many moments of magic.

We are delighted to honour Colm for all that he has done for the people of Kerry - we hope that this recognition by his own will go some small way to show how much we have admired and appreciated his achievements and all that he has given to the game and to the people of Kerry for many, many years.

# **Health Matters...**

#### HAND FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE

Hand foot and mouth disease is caused by the Coxsackie virus and is a very common viral illness of young children, typically before 10 years of age although infected persons may be older. It is spread usually from person to person by infected secretions from the nose or mouth. Very rarely it can be contracted by drinking contaminated swimming pool water. It is never spread from animals or pets. It usually takes 3-5 days to develop symptoms after being exposed. (incubation period)

#### Symptom:

It usually starts with a fever, reduced appetite, sore throat and feeling unwell. One or two days later painful sores can develop in the mouth, especially at the back on the soft palate. These can develop into ulcers or blisters. A skin rash with red spots and sometimes blisters can develop on the palms and soles but also around the knees, elbows, buttocks or genital area. Some people can get dehydrated if they are not able to swallow due to the pain.

#### **Treatment**


There is no specific treatment. Pain relief should be given as needed and manage temperatures. Optimise fluid intake. Strict handwashing will help prevent spread and children should also be kept out of school while they are unwell but once they feel well enough they can return to school.

There is no vaccine available.

#### **Complications**

Typically HFMD is a very minor self-limiting illness. Very rarely persons affected can develop a viral meningitis or encephalitis that require hospital care but this is almost unheard of. Likewise a viral infection around the heart is also an exceedingly rare complication.

Occasionally people report peeling of the skin of the hands and feet, or nail loss from the hands and feet but this grows back without long term issues.
















# KILLARNEY SCHOOL-KIDS BECOME **ECO RANGERS**

# COLLEGE APPLICANTS SHOULD KEEP MICK O CONNELL'S THESIS ON "WORK" IN MIND



Some years ago, I attended a seminar on "The future of work," where the great Mick O Connell, one of Kerry's finest ever Gaelic footballers was a keynote speaker. Mick spoke passionately and eloquently about the "work ethic" and the dignity of paid employment. I interpreted his views to mean that those of us who are able to work have a patriotic duty and moral obligation to do so. Not only that, but we should also do our jobs with enthusiasm, willingly and to the best of our ability.

As the CAO deadline approaches, college applicants are being bombarded with career advice from all angles. However, in selecting their course choices, college applicants would do well to keep Mick O Connell's views in mind. With national unemployment now as low as 6.5% and youth unemployment decreasing rapidly, the profound words of Mick O Connell are more relevant today than ever before. Opportunities were never better for those with a strong work ethic, an enthusiasm for their qualification and a skill set necessary for a modern work environment.

The jobs market is never far from CAO applicants' minds. Applicants are focussing on courses which offer good job prospects in the current buoyant economy. Because of the vulnerability of the Irish economy to unpredictable variables such as "Brexit" and America's protectionist economic policy, change is the only constant. When 2018 CAO applicants graduate onto the jobs market the skills and qualifications needed in the economy may have changed. Nevertheless, the courses that surged in popularity last year, due to a growing confidence in the economy, are very much in demand this year. CAO applicants base their choices on a number of considerations. Some applicants construct their course choices on their favourite school subjects. Others apply for courses, which suit their interests and personalities. A surprisingly large number of students prefer to attend a particular college than to do a particular course. Many applicants, despite their tender years and the pressures of Leaving Cert year, objectively analysis their personal career profiles, based on such variables as ability, achievement, application, aptitude, ambition, values, interest and personality (5AVIP). Career profiling isn't an exact science, but it's a useful exercise in appropriate course selection.

Current applicants are applying in large numbers for science and computer courses, which they see as employment friendly. The Government's effective promotion of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) courses as essential for the expanding "smart economy" is bearing fruit. Science is riding the crest of a wave with attractive jobs available in specialist science sub-disciplines like pharmaceuticals and biotechnology. Computing courses will retain their popularity as there is huge demand for people with computer science skills. The majority of courses in health sciences will require well 500 plus points. Courses in agrifood science, horticulture and agri-business will retain huge appeal.

The economic recovery has revived interest in "build environment" courses, which will again be popular this year. Demand for courses in civil, environmental and structural engineering, architecture, quantity surveying, valuation surveying, property management and auctioneering is back to prerecession levels. HASS (Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences) courses will be listed by about 25% of all CAO applicants in 2018. However, because of unfavourable working conditions and reduced pay scales in the public sector, courses in nursing, teaching, public administration, social science and child care are attracting less attention from applicants.

Business courses will again be very popular in 2018 offering opportunities in financial services and treasury, taxation, accounting, corporate law and business information services. Degree courses in law, tourism and hospitality, which declined in popularity during the recession, are becoming more competitive in a thriving economy.

With so much emphasis in the jobs market on skilled and well-qualified personnel, each CAO applicant is aware that her/his chances of employment are considerably increased by a competitive qualification. But remember, a strong work ethic and a passion for your qualification will make you employable when you arrive on the jobs market.



# TOP 10 TIPS FOR SAFER DRIVING



Taking a number of simple precautions can ensure safety on Irish roads during winter.

Don't get caught out if severe weather hits, make the necessary checks on your vehicle now.

There are a number of simple precautions the RSA advises for driving over the winter months:

- 1. **Check your tyres...** they are your only contact with the road. Tyres should be at least the minimum legal thread depth of 1.6mm but need to be changed before they get this worn. Tyres need to be to the correct tyre pressure to give the motorist the best chance in extreme conditions.
- 2. **Use your lights.** As we come into the winter months, motorists are advised to use dipped head lights during the day so you are easily seen. Headlights and taillights should be in working order.
- 3. **Understand your brakes.** Check your car manual and find out if your vehicle has safety

assist technology such as Electronic Stability Control (ESC) or Anti-Lock Braking System (ABS). Learn how these technologies can assist your driving in harsh weather conditions.

- 4. **Safe Distance.** It takes longer to stop a car during the winter weather so slow down and allow extra distance between you and the car in front.
- 5. **Make sure you can clearly see.** All too often motorists do not de-fog or de-ice windows and mirrors which can compromise visibility. This winter ensure windows and mirrors are clear, and carry a de-icer and screen scraper. Do not use boiling water as this can crack the windscreen.
- 6. **Beware of "Black Ice".** Black Ice is one of winter's biggest hazards as it is difficult to see. Watch out for sheltered/ shaded areas on roads, under trees and near high walls.
- 7. **Be prepared.** During these winter months it is advised that motorists carry a number of

essentials in the boot of their car.

- 1) High visibility vest
- 2) Spare fuel
- 3) Appropriate footwear in case you need to leave your vehicle e.g. boots
- 4) A hazard warning triangle
- 5) Spare wheel (Check that your spare wheel is in good condition and is fully inflated. Some cars may have an inflation repair kit instead of a spare wheel. Make sure that you know how to use it.)
- 6) Tow Rope
- 7) A shovel
- 8) De-icing equipment (for glass and door locks)
- 9) Spare bulbs
- 10) First aid kit
- 11) A fire extinguisher
- 12) A working torch
- 13) A car blanket, additional clothing & some food and water
- 8. In the event of a breakdown. Drivers need to ensure their vehicle is well in off the road so as not to obstruct other vehicles. The driver should also put on their hazard warning lights. If the vehicle breaks down on the motorway pull in as far as you can, alerting traffic behind you with hazard lights. The driver should leave their vehicle, get behind the barrier (on the embankment) and call the Gardaí, on their mobile phone or roadside telephone.
- 9. **Keep up to date.** Listen to local weather and traffic reports. Pay heed to the weather warnings alerting drivers of unsafe and dangerous driving conditions.
- 10. Check out the RSA's publication 'Severe Weather Advice for Road Users' for more detailed advice on what to do if severe weather strikes!

# IS YOUR VEHICLE READY FOR BAD WEATHER?

Bad weather such as torrential rain, severe winds, fog, ice and snow can strike suddenly catching road users off guard.

**IF SEVERE WEATHER STRIKES!** Before setting off on a journey check to see if there are any problems on your intended route.

# IS YOUR JOURNEY ABSOLUTELY NECESSARY?

In extreme weather conditions you should ask yourself if making a journey by road is absolutely necessary? If it is not you might consider delaying your trip until the weather and road conditions improve. If using the roads

in such conditions is unavoidable be prepared. The golden rule is to drive, cycle or walk with care and caution and expect the unexpected.

# IS YOUR VEHICLE READY FOR BAD WEATHER?

As the saying goes 'Prevention is better than cure', so take some time to prepare both your vehicle and yourself for the challenges of winter driving. Don't get caught out when severe weather strikes.

Your first step should be to get your vehicle serviced to ensure it is fit and safe for winter driving. Secondly you should carry out regular checks on the vehicle.

#### **YOU SHOULD**

Check for wear and tear on wiper blades and replace them as soon as they start to smear rather than clean windows.

keep tyre pressure at the manufacturer's recommended level and check you have at least 3 millimetres of tread depth.

check that your spare wheel is in good condition and is fully inflated. Some cars may have an inflation repair kit instead of a spare wheel. Make sure that you know how to use it. Make sure all vehicle lights are working and clean and top up with anti-freeze and screen wash.





### **DRY JANUARY?**







# **Know Your Rights:**

# TREATMENT ABROAD SCHEME

#### **OUESTION**

I know that medical treatments available in Ireland can be accessed in other EU countries instead. What if I need a treatment that is not available in Ireland?

#### **ANSWER**

If you are entitled to public health services that are available in Ireland, you can access these services in the European Economic Area (EEA) and be repaid the cost under the Cross-Border Healthcare Directive.

If you are a public patient and need treatment that is not available to you in Ireland, you may be able to use the Treatment Abroad Scheme to get the treatment in another country in the EEA, or in Switzerland. The Scheme may provide help with your travel fare and, in some cases, the fare for a travelling companion.

You must be referred for treatment abroad by an Irish-based consultant who is treating you as a public patient. You cannot refer yourself or be referred by a GP.

You and the consultant complete an application form and include a copy of your referral letter. Your application must be approved by the Health Service Executive (HSE) before you travel or start treatment abroad. You usually get a decision on your application within 15 to 20 working days. If your application is approved, the HSE will issue a form called E112. This authorises treatment abroad so that you do not have to make any payment to the healthcare provider. The treatment you have abroad must be in public healthcare under a registered medical practitioner. It must be in a recognised hospital or other institution that accepts the form E112. If you don't have the form when you attend at your appointment, you may be charged and not be refunded. Any treatments or consultations that are not preapproved will not be covered.

The Ombudsman has produced a report that suggests improvements to the application and appeals process. It recommends that, by the end of February 2018, the HSE produce a plan and schedule for making the suggested changes.

To apply for the scheme, contact the Treatment Abroad Scheme Office for an application form. You can get the contact details for your area by calling the HSE Infoline on the Callsave number 1850 24 1850 or online at hse.ie/treatmentabroad. # GARDENING UTLOOK

#### FOCUS ON HERBACEOUS PERENNIALS

What we mean when we call a plant an Herbaceous Perennial is that in most of the them the stems are soft, succulent and green as opposed to being brown and woody. With most Herbaceous Perennial they will sprout growth from ground level in Spring and will grow and flower right through the Summer and into the Autumn. With most Herbaceous Perennials in late Autumn and early Winter they start to look a bit ragged. But depending on the severity of the Winter some will hold on until the first real cold snap. The maintenance for most Herbaceous Perennials isn't a lot really. During late Autumn early Winter cut the majority of them down to ground level and mulch over with some compost. Some Herbaceous Perennials such as Lupins and semi hardy Fuchsias will have woody stems because of the milder climate here so when pruning back cut right back to just a couple of inches above ground level.

Herbaceous Perennials are a valuable plant in the garden for a number of reasons.

Because of the length of time they flower for.

2. Because of the short length of time it takes them to grow to the maximum height and spread.

When planting a Herbaceous Border always remember to plant the taller ones to the back or middle and the smaller growing ones. to the front. When choosing your plants pick one plant that you can repeatedly plant in the border to create a sense of continuity to the planting scheme. Herbaceous Perennials flower from April until October/November so you have a wide range of flowering times and colour to choose from. The secret to having a good flowering Herbaceous Border is every few years in the Winter to lift and divide the plants that are suitable for this. Next week I will focus on Roses.

#### CHANGES TO STATE PENSION (CONTRIBUTORY)

The Minister for Employment Affairs and Social Protection has announced changes to how the State Pension (Contributory) is calculated. The changes aim to ensure that all of a person's social insurance contributions, rather than when they were paid, are taken into account when assessing their entitlement to a pension.

The new Total Contributions Approach (TCA) will include a new HomeCaring credit. This will provide credited contributions for up to 20 years of homemaking and caring duties. The changes will particularly benefit women, who spent time outside the paid workplace, while raising families or in caring roles.


The TCA will come into effect on 30 March 2018. It will also be available to anyone who reached pension age after 1 September 2012, when the revised rate bands took effect. As a result the Department will invite over 40,000 current pensioners to have their pensions recalculated under TCA. Invitations are expected to be sent out in late 2018.

Pensioners do not need to contact the Department or do anything else until they get a letter from the Department nearer the end of 2018.

The first payments will be made in early 2019, with payment backdated to 30 March 2018.

# CAN ONIONS ABSORB BACTERIA, VIRUSES AND FLU?

Ayurvedic medicine has been using an onion poultice for the chest or feet to cure coughs, fevers and flus for centuries. They also use the onion poultice to reduce pain and inflammation in the joints. Homeopathic doctors also use the healing power of onions to heal from viruses and illness. Amongst the North American Hutterite community, a pacifist community whose traditions date back to the 16th century, it is common practice to place onions in their homes during winter flu season and to use cut onions in the room of an ill person to relieve their symptoms quickly and naturally.

The onions need to be peeled if left around the home as a preventive measure against flu and viruses. If placed around the home for prevention, the onions should be replaced whenever they begin to go rotten.

If someone falls ill with a cough, flu, cold or fever, immediately place a peeled white onion cut in half in a bowl in their room. The onion needs to be cut in half in order to expose the most amount of 'healing power' from its pungent odour.

The Sock Onion is a 'modern-day' version of the Ayurvedic poultice, and involves cutting the white onion in half and placing one half on the bottom of each foot so that the cut onion is against the skin. Place a sock on top of the onion so it stays secure in place and leave the 'Onion Sock' on overnight. This is especially good for flus and fevers.

Warning - If you ever need it, you have nothing to lose in the very early stages by giving the onion theory a try, but if symptoms persist please contact your Doctor.

That stunning event will lead to the moon turning a deep, rich red, a sight that has led to it being christened the "blood moon".

The Lunar Eclipse though will only be visible to some parts of the world, since it depends on the alignment of the moon, sun and the earth and unfortunately for Ireland the moon will be hiding around the other side of the world - but the event will be streamed live and recorded for TV viewing etc.

So keep up the New Year resolution of keeping a Diary or Journal and enter the date of January 31st in order to remind yourself to go outside if the weather is suitable and view in reality an event that will certainly never again happen in your lifetime.

# "HELLO" WAS A PHONE GREETING **BEFORE IT WAS COMMONLY USED IN**

When the telephone was still a new invention a debate raged about what people should say when they picked up this newfangled gadget. Alexander Graham Bell, who patented his design for the telephone in 1876, expected people to say "Ahoy!" when they picked up the phone. That was a bit too nautical for most early adopters, and it never caught on. In 1877 Thomas Edison suggested the word that finally stuck, but at the time "hello" (or "hullo") didn't yet mean "hi". It was more of an exclamation used to attract attention, like, "Hello! Over here!" Once the first phonebooks standardized the usage in their "how-to" sections, "hello" caught on as a standard greeting, on and off the phone.

Internationally, the word "hello" is so closely associated with answering the phone that many languages use a derivative of it. And the first phonebooks recommend people end their telephone conversations with a simple, "That is all."

# **NEW ILLINOIS DIVORCE LAW LETS** JUDGES DECIDE BEST OWNER FOR

In most U.S. states, when a couple divorces, their pets are considered as objects, no different than furniture or automobiles. If there's a dispute over who gets custody of the pets, the legal owner usually wins. The legal owner isn't necessarily the person who takes care of the pet and has the strongest emotional attachment, but the person whose name is on the adoption certificate or sales contract.

Last year, Alaska became the first state to require courts to consider the well-being of pets and to allow judges to assign joint custody of these family members.

A year later, Illinois has enacted a similar law. Passed last August and in effect as of Jan. 1, SB1261 amends the Illinois Marriage and Dissolution of Marriage Act by allowing judges to award custody to the person who spent the most time with the pet. Previously, pets were divided between the divorcing couple as part of the estate.

Divorcing couples can now present their cases to Illinois judges, explaining why one person or the other would be the best pet parent. The new law only applies to companion animals, not service animals.

"The parties to a dissolution proceeding may file a joint petition for simplified dissolution if they have, among other conditions, executed a written agreement allocating ownership and responsibility for any domestic animals owned by the parties," the law states. It provides that in issuing an order concerning the allocation of ownership of or responsibility for a pet, the court must take the pet's well-being into consideration.

"Who does the day-to-day stuff? Who buys the pet food? Who stays on top of vaccinations?", Chicago-based divorce attorney and animal rights advocate Erika Wyatt explained. "Anything that happens in the normal care for



the pet is going to become relevant now. The court is now required to consider the pet's 'wellbeing, which is a significant departure from the way all other property is treated under the law".

#### 9-YEAR-OLD GAVE UP A \$300 XBOX TO BUY BLANKETS FOR HOMELESS SO MICROSOFT SENT HIM ONE FOR FREE

Mikah Frye is a 9 year old from Beachwood, Ohio who knows what poverty feels like. About three years ago, his family fell on hard times when they lost their home and were forced to live in a shelter. Every night, Mikah would get a blanket, and every morning, the shelter would have to take it back.

Now that his family was doing better, he knew he would be getting a \$300 Xbox for Christmas. He figured that, at \$10 a blanket, he could buy 30 blankets instead of getting an Xbox — so instead of accepting the game system, he chose to buy the blankets instead. He then gave away each one to a homeless person in need.

News of Mikah's good deed spread guickly. catching the attention of Xbox manufacturer, Microsoft. The company decided to surprise Mikah with a new console that was the same model as the one he had traded for the blankets. Employees led Mikah to the back of a store selected by his family where Santa had bags full of ordinary gifts, including the coveted Xbox held especially for him. Mikah gueued with all the other boys and girls and when it was his turn, he burst into tears of delight when he was presented with his surprise.

#### **HOW OLD ARE YOUR CHRISTMAS TREE** LIGHTS?

38-year-old Ross Shaddick who lives in Plymouth, England, says his mother bought the lights he still uses ten years before he was born. She bought the fairy lights for £3 in 1969 which was a massive price at the time (the equivalent of around €50 today) and although the lights came with a spare set of bulbs, he said he's never needed to replace a single one, though in recent years he only has them on when he is in the room with them in order to keep an eye on them and as they years went on he increased his safety checks.

As he would like the lights to celebrate their 50th anniversary of use, he takes special care of them by storing them on a plastic tree yearround so he doesn't have to keep winding and unwinding the flex in case the plastic around the wire begins to deteriorate. "They are a very stable component in my life and it's nice to keep the tradition going" he said.

# LONELINESS IN OLDER ADULTS



At SouthWest Counselling Centre we are meeting more and more elderly people who are feeling isolated and alone. What strikes me is that whilst there is a lot of emphasis on help and support for younger people there is less awareness of the availability of supports for older people. As we all know, life is an on-going journey that can present challenges at any stage along the way. Bereavement, loneliness, declining health, fear of crime and loss of loved ones through emigration are issues that many older people are dealing with. Counselling can provide a clear space to do this and offers support and gives us a fresh perspective on things.

Many older people are feeling lonely and isolated due to a lack of social contact and connection. Social isolation has been shown to have a detrimental effect on health and well-being. It is vital therefore that we stay connected, and whenever possible reach out to others and remain actively involved in life. As social beings, most of us feel the need for social contact and relationships. Therefore I would encourage someone who is feeing lonely to establish what opportunities for social connection already exist in their community. It doesn't matter initially whether they get anything out of the actual activity, as they may meet someone of like mind and it is a great opportunity for social connection. There are many activities in which they can join. Adult education classes can be a great way to meet like-minded people whilst also acquiring new skills. They can also help to boost our confidence and make social interaction more pleasurable. Getting involved in Community Action Groups, Local History Groups or Sporting Activities can all be very enjoyable. Participating in local church activities, organised outings or book clubs can also help to feel more connected to others. Treating ourselves to massage or reflexology can also help to relieve loneliness. Another useful activity is letter writing, perhaps for a worthy cause - such as Amnesty International. Technology forums such as the internet may provide relief from boredom and loneliness. Perhaps you could enlist the help of a young person to learn these skills. If you are feeling lonely, reach out and talk to someone today.






