

Forever 16.... Legion to honour Niall's love of football

Kerry manager Peter Keane joined the McGillycuddy family and members of Legion GAA club on the balcony of The International Hotel yesterday, Thursday, to launch a football tournament to honour, Niall McGillicuddy a former player with Legion underage Academy who sadly passed away last year.

The event which will be a celebration of Niall's love of football will take place on Saturday 17th August at the club in Dereen.

Speaking to the Killarney Outlook this week, Pat Moynihan, organiser of the tournament said that the club were honoured to be doing this. "Last October the McGillicuddy family suffered an incalculable and devastating loss with the untimely passing of their much loved son and brother Niall.The entire community of Killarney and beyond was overwhelmed with sadness and disbelief when this earth-shattering news broke", Pat said.

"Nowhere outside of the family, was this loss more keenly felt than in Killarney Legion GAA club. Niall had been a constant presence in Derreen since a very young boy and we had all watched him develop into a talented and dedicated Gaelic footballer, but more importantly into a hugely popular, kind and considerate young man. We were all looking forward to sharing in what was destined to be an honour laden and successful future both on and off the field of play.

"As family friends and club colleagues of Daithi, Sheila, Ellen and Jane we all wished there was something we could do to in any small way, ease the Pain of their unspeakable loss, in truth of course there really isn't much one can do except offer friendship and companionship which comes naturally in the GAA where club truly is family", Pat added.

When the family indicated that they might like to do something to commemorate Niall's memory they didn't have to ask again. A small committee was set up initially to explore various options, but really it was always going to be football and following consultation with the family the Niall McGillicuddy Memorial cup was conceived. This is an under 16 competition, the age Niall will always be now, and is a one day competition taking place on August 17th. Niall had friends in many clubs through his involvement in school teams, divisional sides and development squads and it was these friendships and indeed great rivalries which dictated the teams to be invited this year. The whole club is involved in the organisation of the event and we are confident that the tournament will be a fitting tribute to a very special and much missed son, brother and friend.

The first Parkrun in Killarney at the weekend was a fantastic success with 146 people running, jogging or walking the flat 3 lap course on wide well-surfaced paths.

Organisers were delighted with the fact that the number equalled the first ever Killarney parkrun.

In perfect weather conditions, the organisers of Parkrun welcomed representatives of 17 different clubs with an impressive 15 Tralee parkrunners on Tour supporting the new course. There were also runners from as far afield as Stockport and London, from Limerick, Listowel, Bere Island, Vicarstown, Ballincollig, Bere Island, Cabinteely, Castle Demesne, Tymon, Hilly Fields and lots more.



61 houses for Killarney as Minister visits town

Minister for Housing Eoin Murphy, was in Killarney last week to view the next generation of sustainable social housing as Kerry based Thermohouse are currently buinging the first of its kind development with Clúid Housing, in partnership with Kerry County Council.

Announcing the commencement of the

second stage of construction at the site, Thermohouse is delivering turnkey, rapid-build, energy efficient houses at the Sruthán na Sailí development in Derreen, Killarney. Due for completion in early 2020, this is one of Clúid's largest new build developments currently under construction.

The Derreen development, which commenced in January 2019, consists of 61 two and threebed dwellings, built using Thermohouse's unique low energy building system. As well as being up to 60% faster than traditional construction, the houses have superior levels of airtightness, considerably reducing their heating costs. These houses are 'nearly Zero-Energy Building' (nZEB) compliant as mandated by the EU energy directive for new builds completed after 31 December 2020.

"We are delighted to welcome Minister Murphy to the development here in Killarney, as it enters the second stage of construction. An innovative social housing project in Ireland, it not only addresses the need for rapid-build homes but also creates greener, more energy efficient buildings, with lower fuel bills. Partnering with Kerry County Council, Rebuilding Ireland and Thermohouse, who deliver residential projects across Ireland and the UK, has allowed us to meet our goal of providing high quality housing for those who need it, here in Kerry", James O'Halloran, New Business Manager of Clúid said.

Thermohouse structures not only meet the EU's nZEB requirements, they consistently exceed them, and being locally manufactured, they offer a lower carbon footprint for delivery in Ireland."

Cllr Michael Gleeson requests council to consider footpath



At the July 2019 monthly meeting of Kerry County Council, Council Michael Gleeson requested:

That Kerry County Council would commence the process towards developing a footpath along Loreto Road from Coolclogher as far as Scoil Bhríde

(Loreto School). This residential and very busy through road needs such a basic safety measure".

Kerry County Council replied that is is their

policy where required to provide a public infrastructure such as footpaths and public lights within the speed limits of an urban area. The estimated cost of this proposal, excluding land acquisition and accommodation works, is approximately estimated at euro 600,000. Unfortunately, there are currently no funds for the development of a footpath as this location but the proposal will be considered as part of a future footpath programme.

Councillor Gleeson stated that this a very narrow and heavily trafficked road and is unsafe for pedestrians. He said that walking to school once a week has become a widespread health activity. A footpath would allow this to be safely done by pupils of the local school. Councillor Gleeson urged the Council to prioritise the project.

KCC offer Free mattress disposal

Kerry County Council is providing householders in the county wishing to dispose of old mattresses with the opportunity to do so on Saturday 10th August.

Clean, dry mattresses will be accepted at the North Kerry Landfill at Muingnaminane near Tralee between 9am and 3pm and for no charge. Deposits from commercial customers will not be accepted and a maximum of three mattresses per household is permitted.

The initiative is supported by Kerry County Council's Anti-Dumping Initiative 2019 in conjunction with the Southern Waste Enforcement Regional Lead Authority.

Mattresses collected will be disposed by a specialist recycling contractor.





Summer Gardening



Hedges



Good hedges make good neighbours, but a hedge does much more than mark boundaries. It creates a shelter belt to protect everything in the garden and far more efficiently than walls or fences. It also provides a habitat for wildlife. Choice of plant will depend on the hedge's intended purpose: as an impenetrable barrier, a formal screen for privacy or an informal, ornamental feature. There are over a score of suitable species, both evergreen and deciduous. A number of garden centres keep 'avenues' of mature specimens to aid you in your choice.

The Deciduous Hedge

In maturity, beech (Fagus) makes a magnificent hedge and is an excellent choice for a virgin plot. Kept clipped, it retains its russet leaves through winter. Hornbeam (Carpinus) is similar in appearance and faster growing than beech, but loses its leaves in winter. To give architectural structure, consider the long term project of training a row of pleached hornbeams to provide an 'upstairs' hedge. Most beneficial to wildlife is the native hawthorn (Crataegus) with its frothy, white blossom in spring and autumn berries. Hawthorn is relatively fast-growing but it can take many years to establish and achieve density. The most economical way to plant is to buy two to three year old bare whips and plant five to a metre in a zigzag double row. The time to plant is between November and March provided the ground is neither frozen nor waterlogged.

The Evergreen Hedge

Where dense, windproof screening is required year round, evergreens and conifers are the wise choice. Yew (Taxus baccata) is the noblest of all but it will take six to ten years to establish. Poisonous to cattle, it should not be planted in rural gardens where cows could graze on it. Holly (Ilex) is slow growing like yew, but has the added attraction of winter berries. To be sure of fruits, both male and female plants of a named variety, must be planted. The cheapest option is privet (Ligustrum), a plant that lends itself well to topiary. Fastest growing is the infamous Cupressus Leylandii, cause of more litigation than any other garden plant due to its light-blocking, phenomenal growth (4ft a year) and dull appearance. If you are bent on having it, choose cultivars of contrasting colours to counteract its drabness. Chamaecyparis lawsonia 'Allumii' is similar in appearance but of less rampant habit.

The Ornamental Hedge


A tapestry hedge is one of the most attractive ways to achieve a boundary. It combines compatible species of similar growth rates and can comprise both evergreen and deciduous cultivars, such as yew, holly and beech. For a low growing, ornamental hedge, rosemary and lavender are aromatic options. Informal hedge plants with berries include pyracantha and cotoneaster. In a sunny situation roses can make a splendid, if uneven, hedge. Essential requirements are found in a number of varieties such as Rosa rugosa which is hardy, disease resistant, repeat flowering and thorny.

The Bamboo Hedge


For a hedge with a difference, there are several types of bamboo that are ideal for the purpose, particularly in areas where soil moisture is high. Although native to every continent except Europe, most in cultivation hail from the Orient. They were fi rst introduced to Europe in the mid nineteenth century since when some species have become naturalised in Ireland. Members of the grass family, they range from dwarf (10 cm high) to giant (15 metres high). Hardy and evergreen, they can be grown in most soil types. Varieties recommended as hedging include the wind resistant Pseudosasa japonica with olive green culms and deep green, glossy leaves; Fargesia murieliae 'Jumbo' with green canes and delicate green foliage; the dense, fast growing Phyllostachys bissettii with shiny green culms and dark green leaves and the tall, hardy Semiarundinaria fastuosa. For a tiny garden, Fargesia murieliae 'Bimbo' rarely grows taller than a metre and is happy in both sun and light shade.

Care of your Hedge

Most hedges are planted bare rooted November to March, with planting technique similar to that for trees and shrubs. Prepare the ground by working in compost or well-rotted manure to a trench wide enough to take the spread of the roots. For a dense hedge, plant a double, staggered row with plants 30–60cm apart. They should be soaked for 30 minutes before planting. In the case of containerised specimens, if the roots have become compacted they should be gently teased out before planting.

They were joined by 20 Irish Sanctuary Runners and it was wonderful to receive as much support and encouragement as we did. "We were thrilled with the generosity shown



by the people of Kerry from the large donations of running gear. This kind of support goes a long way in encouraging runners from direct provision to get involved. It fosters friendship, positivity and respect while bringing greater awareness to the system in which asylum seekers live."

Oliver Kirwan, Race Director told the Outlook "What an amazing day we had at Run Killarney, next year will be our tenth year and it's fantastic to see this event is still so popular with local people and visitors alike. We are privileged to be able to run this event in such a spectacular setting. Well done to everyone who took part in the event, whether they broke their PB or walked at a leisurely pace"







Last week we looked at various strategies to reduce workplace stress. These focused primarily on the one thing we have control over in our lives i.e. ourselves. This week we will look at more key ways to deal with stress in our lives. Knowing we are stressed when we are stressed is important. Each person is different - so know your own 'stress busters'.

The following are some tips:

- 1. Taking Responsibility for our own physical and emotional well-
- 2. Avoid knee-jerk reactions and falling into old habits
- 3. Learn to communicate better which can improve relationships
- 4. Recognise your own emotions and know how to control your emotions and behaviour. If you ignore your emotions you will be unable to fully understand your own needs and find it difficult to communicate with others.
- 5. Delegate responsibility- let go of the need to control every little
- 6. Be willing to compromise finding a middle ground with a coworker can help reduce stress levels for everyone.
- 7. Balance your daily schedule as all work and no play leads to burnout. Balance your time between work, daily responsibilities, family life and social activities - ensuring you get some downtime.
- 8. Avoid over-scheduling your time by trying to fit too much into one day. If you have a lot on - distinguish between the 'shoulds' and the 'musts' and drop any task that isn't completely necessary to the bottom of the list or delete them entirely.
- 9. Give yourself time getting up or leaving home ten minutes earlier can decrease stress levels and avoid that frantic rush to get to work on time.
- 10. Take a quick stroll during the day to clear your mind.
- 11. There is no better way to alleviate stress than a good laughwatching a comedy or meeting up with friends and sharing a joke can all help to reduce stress.
- 12. Don't try to seek perfectionism this will only add to unnecessary stress. When you set unrealistic goals you set yourself up for failure. Aim to do your best.
- 13. Watch your thoughts. Negative thinking can drain our energy and motivation - so try to stay positive and avoid negative people as much as possible.
- 14. Don't try to control the uncontrollable. Many things in life are beyond our control - especially the behaviour of other people. Rather than focusing on the things we can't control, we give our attention to that which we can control - i.e. how we react to the problem.

IF YOU WISH TO APPLY FOR IRISH CITIZENSHIP PLEASE NOTE -

The High Court has ruled that nobody can be granted Irish citizenship if they have spent a single day outside the country in the past year and the unexpected judgment could affect thousands of people applying for Irish citizenship on the basis of residence in the Republic of Ireland.

Under the Irish Nationality and Citizenship Act 1956, foreign nationals wishing to naturalise as Irish have to be legally resident in the State for at least five years out of the last nine (or three out of the last five if married to an Irish citizen). This includes one year of "continuous residence" in the 12 months up to the date of application but that law on residence has never been interpreted so strictly before.

Immigration lawyer Aoife Gillespie said the effect of the decision is that "an applicant must literally never leave the State in those 12 months. Not even for one day regardless of how exceptional or unavoidable the circumstances are. Not even to enter Northern Ireland.

Ms. Gillespie said that foreign citizens resident in Ireland should not now apply for citizenship if they have been out of the country even once in the past 12 months – at least until the legal position is resolved.

Barrister Cathal Malone a specialist in immigration and asylum law said "the decision will likely bring the entire Citizenship Division to a grinding halt until it's resolved on appeal and the ruling could even raise questions about past grants of Irish citizenship, since the six-week rule has, in the High Court's view, been unlawful all along and that there may need to be emergency legislation to amend the 1956 Act.

The decision does not affect those applying for Irish passports on the basis that they have an Irish parent or grandparent. There is no residence requirement for citizenship by descent.

CHINESE STARTUP IS TRACKING LOST DOGS USING THEIR NOSE PRINTS

Megvii, a Chinese AI startup that supplies facial recognition software for the Chinese government's surveillance program, is expanding its technology beyond humans to recognize different faces of pets.

Using the Megvii app, the company says it can register your dog simply by scanning the snout through your phone's camera. Just like how a phone registers your fingerprint for biometric unlocks, the app asks you to take photos of your dog's nose from multiple angles. Megvii says it has an accuracy rate of 95 percent and has reunited 15,000 pets with their owners through the app.

However Megvii says its app will be used for more than just reuniting owners with their lost pets. With its existing relationship with the government, it says its app can also be used to monitor "uncivilized dog keeping" to fine civilians who don't pick up after their dogs or allow them to walk without leases in public spaces.

THE GOOD OLD DAYS?

Did you know that on this week in 1851 the Window Tax in the United Kingdom was finally abolished. The tax imposed in 1696 was a banded tax, so that the more windows a house boasted, the more its owner would pay in tax. To reduce the cost the rich built new houses with the minimum number of windows, while the poor in their tenement housing simply bricked up the windows, making their cramped, dark dwellings even more gloomy. In the darkened tenements and countryside hovels the bricked-up windows came to be known as "Pitt's Pictures" - a scathing reference to Conservative Prime Minister William Pitt the Younger, who enthusiastically supported and extended the Window Tax.

Its abolition came on July 24th after campaigners successfully argued that it was a "tax on health" and a "tax on light and air." The medical profession in particular argued that the lack of windows tended to create dark, damp homes that were a source of disease and ill-health.

In its place came The Glass Tax which amounted to more than three hundred per cent on the glass's value. This was introduced in 1746 and lasted 100 years until once again; protests led by doctors caused its abolition.

In 1662 there was the Hearth Tax, which was a levy on "every Fire Hearth and Stove within every House, Edifice, Chambers and Lodging" in England and Wales, but as this really only affected the rich, the powers that were decided it was too difficult to assess as officials had to enter homes and count the number of fireplaces and it was scrapped about 20 years later and then came the Wallpaper Tax, which was introduced in 1712 and abolished in 1836 which again did not really affect the poor living in hovels in towns and shacks in the countryside throughout Ireland, England, Scotland and Wales.

DUTCH BUS STOPS ARE GETTING GREEN ROOFS COVERED IN PLANTS AS A GIFT FOR HONEYBEES

Hundreds of Dutch bus stops are getting ecofriendly makeovers so they can be transformed into lush green sanctuaries for honeybees and humans alike.

To begin with all 316 bus stops in the city of Utrecht are receiving green rooftops covered in sedum plants. Not only are the succulents good for improving air quality, they are also good for helping to support dwindling pollinator populations. Succulents are also good for storing rain water, capturing dust particulates from the air, and providing a cooling environment in the summertime, also over the course of the next few years. Utrecht will be installing solar panels on every single one of their bus stops and will be replacing their current transit vehicles with a new fleet of electric buses. Regional officials are aiming to employ an entirely carbon-neutral transit fleet before 2028.
