# THREE IS THE MAGIC NUMBER AS FLIGHTS INCREASE FROM KERRY AIRPORT

THREE is the magic number for sun worshippers flying from Kerry Airport with the introduction of additional flights to Alicante from 27th March 2023.

Flights to the popular Spanish holiday destination will operate three times a week for the summer season on Tuesdays, Fridays and Sundays until the end of October.

The route to Faro in Portugal's Algarve will also return twice weekly on Wednesdays and Sundays from 28th March.

The Kerry-Manchester route is to increase from two to three days a week, operating on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 26th March onwards.

The summer schedule of Ryanair flight details comes after a great year for Kerry Airport in 2021 with a 309% increase on 2021 and almost 97% of 2019 numbers before the pandemic curtailed the aviation industry. Overall, 356,141 passengers travelled through Kerry Airport in 2022.

The CEO of Kerry Airport, John Mulhern, said, "Recovery is well under way and it is our intention to grow those passenger numbers in the near to medium term. The loss of the publicly supported Dublin Stobart service was a painful blow, however credit must go to Ryanair for taking on the route on a commercial basis to support Kerry's connection to Dublin, a major hub for international travel in and out of the county. In fact Ryanair have increased passenger traffic on the route by 50% in comparison to



2019, which in itself was a record year."

The 2022 passenger numbers were achieved despite the loss of the connection to Berlin which was understood to have become commercially non-viable due to airport charges in Berlin.

Now that recovery is fully underway, Kerry Airport will commit every effort to continue the renewed growth while being mindful of the challenge of procuring new routes from small regional airports, especially during these difficult times.

In announcing the strong passenger numbers for 2022 and the summer schedule for 2023, John Mulhern added, "I want to thank most sincerely our remarkable team here at the airport who have laboured with such great determination these past few years and are deserving of much praise."

Kerry Airport is ideally located for anyone wishing to travel for business or pleasure with direct flights to London-Stansted, London-Luton, Frankfurt-Hahn, Manchester, Dublin, Alicante (summer 2023) & Faro (summer 2023) with Ryanair.

As part of the project, being delivered by Coffey Construction on behalf of Uisce Éireann and Kerry County Council, road closures on Killarney Road and Kilcummin Road are required for the duration of the pipeline works however local and emergency access will be maintained at all times. It is anticipated that the closures will be in place for the following durations:

Kilcummin Road, from Lower Coolcorcoran Road to Upper Coolcorcoran Road from 3 January to 31 March.

Killarney Road, from Coolcorcoran Cross to Kilcummin Village from 3 January to 8

#### September.

Diversion routes are signposted on approach and Uisce Éireann will endeavour to minimise delays/disruptions to local traffic.

It is necessary to close Kilcummin Road until the end of March, a one-way system cannot be accommodated due to the nature of the works, the current width of the road, and the need to ensure the safety of the construction workers and road users. The Kilcummin Sewerage Scheme is a long awaited and significant project for the area, Uisce Éireann is mindful of the disruption during the construction works and will continue to mitigate the impact as much as possible on the local community.

Once complete, the scheme will provide a new sewer collection system for Kilcummin village, that will ensure wastewater from the village is treated appropriately.

Once operational, the new sewerage scheme

will connect into the sewer network in Killarney town, where it will be collected and transferred to Killarney Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) for appropriate treatment.

Speaking about the works, David Shalloo, Infrastructure Delivery Programme Manager with Uisce Éireann, said,

"We are now commencing the next phase of this vital project that will accommodate future population growth in Kilcummin and will enhance the local environment. The scheme will ensure compliance with wastewater discharge regulations. It will also improve water quality in the River Deenagh and Lough Leane and protect recreational waters for swimming, fishing, boating and sightseeing.

"This phase will require a lengthy traffic management plan, particularly on Killarney Road. However, this is necessary for us to safely deliver this essential project. We would like to thank the people of Kilcummin who have worked with us throughout this project and thank them for their patience as we progress into this phase".

The new sewerage infrastructure to be constructed as part of this scheme will include a sewer network for Kilcummin village, a pumping station, and approximately 6kms of sewers.

Works on the project commenced in late 2022, with the entirety of the project due for completion in 2024.

Uisce Éireann and Kerry County Council will continue to update the local community in Kilcummin as works progress.

# Time to look up - to the gutters and the eaves



An interesting contact from a regular reader re Tidy Towns and the IBAL report: why are our blocked eaves, gutters and shoots no longer regularly cleaned? Killarney is freefalling in the clean from litter stakes because of discarded litter on the ground. But water pouring out of overgrown shoots and dirt coming down with the water is now a regular feature of our once lovely clean town and this is taking from its appearance, the reader rightly points out.

I have seen for myself the state of the gutters and not just in the town centre now that I have been alerted to raise my eyes.

If you look up you will find plenty of grass and material in the shoots, eaves, gutters and downpipe casings on our main streets. Does anyone remember the days when the ladders would be out on High Street and New Street and the shoot cleaners would regularly be employed by businesses especially in November when there was not much external painting and window cleaning that could be done, the reader asked?

It is time for Killarney to look up in more ways than one, perhaps. By the way, one of the great pleasures of being a journalist is tips such as this. When the traditional media goes to the wall, which with the way it is being attacked now from certain political parties to social media moguls seems likely, with it will go the voice of the astute observer using the local journalist to alert higher authorities to matters staring us all in the face.

"The Tidy Towns crowd must all be visiting on very dry days to say they haven't noticed the shoots!" is what he said.

By the way, Ennis in the same category and up there and above Killarney pays particular attention to its eaves, I notice from the latest reports by Tidy Towns.

#### Good ideas at poorly attended hospital protest in Tralee

Around a dozen people staged a protest outside University Hospital Kerry in Tralee on Saturday lunchtime - when there should have been "one thousand" the protestors said. The 300-bed Tralee hospital which is one of seven acute hospitals managed by the South/Southwest Hospital Group serves Kerry along with north Cork and west Limerick.

UHK Tralee has consistently among the highest on trolleys.

It is no longer able to cope with the rise in population or the fact that most conditions now, from a suspected break in a bone to a chest infection, have to be referred to UHK by GPs in Killarney and elsewhere, the protestors said.

Reopening medical assistance units in community hospitals in Killarney and Dingle along with a specialist emergency emergency hospital is needed for Kerry's rising population and currently large numbers of refugees.

In 1981 when we had district hospitals in each town, the population was 122,770 - in 2022 it is 155,250 and we have only one central hospital.

These were sensible ideas. The health services in Kerry were over stretched, Sonny Foran, Aontú representative for Kerry said.

Qualified doctors and nurses were emigrating as soon as they qualified and they should be obliged to remain in the country which trained them for a period after they qualified. A range of commonsense solutions including step down facilities for patients being discharged was required and the protesters were disappointed staff as well as more of the public had not joined in the protest.

"There should be 1,000 people here today," Mr Foran said as passing motorists hooted in support.

Mary Fitzgibbon, a lecturer in nursing and health at the Munster Technological University who has been on a trolley in UHK said staff were under huge stress.

The switch in 2002 from apprenticeship to degrees in nursing had impacted on nurse numbers in wards and on ratios and a new layer of health assistants had to be created but nurses were still few and far between in the wards. In 2011 a lot of experienced nurses had left under incentives for early retirement for nursing, teaching and the gardai and the public service as a whole and this too had had an adverse effect, she strongly believed. Young nurses were leaving the profession when they finally got to experience the conditions in wards and nurses were burnt out from the stress.

However the most important thing was "the huge increase in the population" and this was not due to birth rate, but to immigration and other factors, Ms Fitzgibbon and fellow protestors said.

Ms Fitzgibbon called for a separate A&E hospital in Kerry. Covid and the 'flu did not lead to the crisis, she said.

"We have been beyond crisis for over a decade or more. A whole hospital (A&E) is needed, a whole other acute service," Ms Fitzgibbon said.

GPS and others were under stress. Everyone was being referred from people with chest infections along with people with injuries and other conditions.

"There is a responsibility on planners to provide for those they invite in. There has to be matching services for the numbers being invited," Risteárd O'Fóráin said of the increase in population nationally.

It was also unfair to focus on an "aging population" and elderly people when the facts were the population had hugely increased and health services had actually decreased.

"Who is not ageing ?" one lady, a former HSE administrator said.

Those protestors were spot on: they should all have been 1,000 outside the hospital on Saturday.

#### Housing never off agenda as Killarney falls further behind

Housing for Killarney is never off the agenda. But the dire lack of houses for persons with disabilities in Killarney - already falling well behind Tralee in all housing provision - is emerging also. Marie Moloney, Labour councillor, drew a commitment from the senior housing figures - but little else as no houses are being provided for disabled in the town.

The people in Killarney with a disability are at disadvantage, she said Most houses, private or social, should be fitted with wider doors and be adaptable for ramps and hoists to allow lifelong living, is also the thinking.

Maura Healy-Rae, Independent, drew a very interesting response too to her query on homelessness: there is not a single contract providing for homeless persons in Killarney was the astonishing reply.

"Kerry County Council does not have any contracts for the provision of emergency accommodation in Killarney at present," she was told. There was accommodation to be sourced outside the Killarney MD, she was told. But with no housing being built or to be affordably bought the bottom line is this:

service industry and other workers made homeless Killarney in through evictions from their rental properties will have to move from the town! This is highly unacceptable.

Go online at www.cao.ie and click on "Apply" to open your CAO Account. Enter your personal details. Tick the qualifications and assessment section(s) that are relevant to you. Enter your payment option – Credit/Debit card or Fee Payment Form. If you are paying by credit/ debit card you will be redirected to a payment screen. Create your own account password. Click on "Proceed with application" to obtain your CAO application number and your application details will appear on screen.

Log into "My Application" by entering your CAO application number, date of birth and password. Provide the additional personal information. If you are applying on the basis of Leaving Cert (1985-2023) results enter the name and address of your second level school(s) and the years attended. If you are a mature applicant, click on 'Mature Application Form' to update your mature application form.

If you wish to disclose a Disability/Specific Learning Difficulty (SLD) and to apply to the Disability Access Route to Education (DARE) click the "Modify Disability, Dyslexia/ significant literary difficulties or Dyscalculia/ significant numeracy difficulties (and DARE Application) Status" button and follow the instructions provided. If you wish to apply for the Higher Education Access Route (HEAR), a third level alternative admissions scheme for school leavers from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds who are resident in the Republic of Ireland, click the "HEAR Application" button and follow the instructions provided.

## CALL FOR FULL REVIEW OF ALL OPERATIONS AT UHK

## Fáil Councillor, Michael Cahill raised the matter at this month's meeting of the Local Authority.

"The length of time patients have to spend on trolleys awaiting treatment or admission is appalling in a modern world service" stated Councillor Cahill. "Handover times for patients from ambulances appears to also have increased dramatically and is having a negative effect on the availability of crews on an ongoing basis" said the Rossbeigh based Councillor. "We are all fully aware of horrific stories in our main Hospital involving all age groups and especially our senior citizens" said Councillor Cahill. "Staff in these services are working under extreme pressure and must be supported in every way possible" stated the Fianna Fáil man. "I have spoken with Doctors, Nurses and Consultants in UHK and they have informed me that the best solution is a fully staffed new 50 bed unit and I am again calling on the Minister and the Department of Health to provide such a facility for the people of Kerry at the earliest possible date" added Councillor Cahill.

Councillor Cahill's motion received unanimous support and it was agreed to write to the Minister and the Department on the matter.

## Minister Foley welcomes confirmation of over €250,000 in funding for MTU students struggling with the cost of living

Minister for Education and Kerry T.D Norma Foley, welcomes confirmation of €253,764.00 in funding to assist students attending MTU with the cost of living.

This one-off-funding will be provided through the Student Assistance Fund, which assists students with the costs of books and class materials, rent, childcare and transport, among other things.

## IRELAND'S PREMIER TOURIST ROUTE, A DISGRACE AND EMBARRASSING

#### A Kerry County Councillor has recently described a section of Ireland's Premier Tourist Route as "A Disgrace and Embarrassing".

Local Fianna Fáil Councillor, Michael Cahill raised the matter at the January meeting of the Council where he called and pleaded for Transport Infrastructure Ireland and Kerry County Council to expedite a major "pavement improvement scheme" on the Ring of Kerry road between Cahersiveen and Waterville. "I am speaking about Ireland's Premier Tourist Route road and in particular the section between Ohermong Cross and Kenneigh X which undoubtedly is now the worst section of national secondary road in the entire country" stated Councillor Cahill. "Numerous recent cosmetic repairs have been carried out to no avail. I have consistently raised the condition of this road inside here and the matter of hedge cutting on the Ring of Kerry. As I have stated on many occasions, " the Ring of Kerry road is as important to tourism in Kerry and in Ireland as the M50 is to Dublin" said the Rossbeigh based Councillor. "The current shocking condition of this road which attracts hundreds of thousands of visitors to our country on an annual basis "beggars belief" stated an obviously angry Councillor Cahill.

"Many local residents tell me that vehicles are regularly being damaged and tyres burst because this section of roadway requires a total rebuild. To look at, it is totally misleading, but it is riddled with lags, subsidence and potholes. Drivers are fooled into thinking they can continue at normal speed" stated Councillor Cahill.

"Traffic accidents are a regular occurrence because of the condition of the roadway and I am now calling for major works to be brought forward in the interest of the safety of all road users in the area. This is a busy local and tourist route and the roadway needs to be totally rebuilt at the earliest possible date" added the Fianna Fáil man.

In response to Councillor Cahill, Kerry County Council and Transport Infrastructure Ireland stated that have identified the road between N70 Creamery Cross and Kenneigh for a significant pavement improvement project and in this regard have completed advance surveys and are currently progressing the design.

Kerry County Council is also aware that this section of road has deteriorated significantly during the recent period of inclement weather and in advance of the significant pavement project are continuing with an ongoing maintenance programme of the road, identifying and addressing defects as they arise.

# **DRIVING AND VISION**

It is important that you can see clearly to be able to drive safely. Conditions that may affect your visual field and driving include strokes and brain tumours, as well as eye conditions such as diabetic retinopathy and glaucoma (if you have them in both eyes).

Make sure you have regular sight tests and if your optometrist tells you that you must not drive, you must stop all driving immediately. Driving when you are medically unfit to do so is a criminal offence, and you may be prosecuted if you are involved in an accident.

#### Driving glasses

If you have been advised to wear glasses for driving, make sure you wear them, even for short trips – and keep a spare pair in the car. Choose glasses with thinner sides for driving as they won't block your side vision as much as thicker ones. If you wear contact lenses, keep a pair of glasses in the car in case you need to take your lenses out. Even if you don't need to wear glasses all the time, you will probably find they are particularly helpful when the lighting is poor, and for driving at night.

Headlights of oncoming traffic can be dazzling when you

are driving at night or in poor weather conditions. Special driving lenses designed with a specially-developed glare filter and a contrast-enhancing filter can help reduce reflections and uncomfortable glare from oncoming traffic.

If glare is an ongoing problem for you, make sure your windscreen and headlights are thoroughly cleaned and free from grime and dirt. If you wear glasses, and don't forget to keep them clean too. If you find that problems with glare at night persist, make an appointment to have a sight test. Sunshine can be dazzling too, particularly when the sun is low in the sky. If you wear glasses, you may find it helpful to have a pair of prescription sunglasses in the car, or to wear clip-on sunglasses over your prescription glasses. Polarised sunglasses are great for driving in bright conditions. Polarised lenses are lenses with a special built in filter to reduce glare and improve vision in bright conditions

# Don't use NCT delays as an excuse to neglect car maintenance says tyre company expert

The National Car Testing Service (NCTS) is one of the many bodies that has seen serious disruption to its service as a result of the pandemic, which created a huge backlog of vehicles to be tested. All through 2022 and into 2023, the service has also been struggling to find sufficient staff to help it deal with the backlog. The consequent delays brought about by this perfect storm mean that many motorists are facing a wait of weeks – and in many cases, months – in order to get an appointment to renew their NCT certificate. This has major implications for road safety.

Tyre manufacturer, Continental Tyres, is advising motorists in Ireland not to use the delay in securing an NCT test appointment as an excuse to forget about the proper maintenance of their car.

Tom Dennigan of Continental Tyres Ireland commented: "The NCT was introduced in Ireland in 2000 and since then, it has done a great job in ensuring the vast majority of cars on Irish roads are roadworthy and safe to drive. However, we know from surveys and feedback from tyre dealers across the country that many Irish motorists don't give a second thought to the roadworthiness of their cars once they pass the NCT. In light of the recent long delays in NCT testing, some motorists might be dicing with danger in neglecting the upkeep of their car, in particular, if they received an advisory notice in relation to the functioning of their car when they last presented it for a test.

"For road safety reasons, as well as keeping your car in good running order so as to avoid a breakdown, there are a number of simple checks that motorists should regularly carry out on their vehicle. For example, with your car's tyres, the vehicle's only contact with the road, a tyre check can be done very simply and quickly by checking the tread depth and tyre pressures as well as keeping an eye out for any bumps or bulges in the tyre. As tyres are consistently in the top five reasons for a failure in the NCT, motorists should get into the habit of performing these simple checks at least every two weeks and certainly before a long journey".

# Other items that a motorist should regularly check on their vehicle include:

Brakes and brake fluid levels – proper functioning brakes are essential for your vehicle, if in doubt, have them checked by a professional

Lights: a two-person job as one person needs to walk around the car while the lights are tested

Windscreen wipers (not forgetting the rear windscreen!): a crucial piece of kit on your car that you could not do without in the event of a downpour – also, check the level of your windscreen wash at the same time

Coolant and antifreeze: consult your vehicle handbook on how to check and ensure these are both at correct levels

Oil: in particular for older vehicles that may use up oil quicker than more efficient newer models

Dennigan concluded: "The onus is on all motorists to proactively take responsibility for the roadworthiness of their vehicle, there is too much at stake to neglect the proper upkeep of the vehicle and motorists who only think of this at NCT time are really pushing the risk to the limit given the recent excessive delays in securing an NCT test date".

# LOCAL DERBY THIS WEEKEND SCOTTS LAKERS ST PAULS VS KILLARNEY COUGARS KILLARNEY SPORTS AND LEISURE CENTRE SATURDAY JANUARY 28TH 7.30PM

Three wins in the last four games has seen Scotts Lakers St Pauls build up a head of steam and they will be keen to keep that momentum going with the visit of local rivals Killarney Cougars . A pre Christmas win over Waterford Vikings and January wins over the Cougars and SETU Carlow has raised the spirits of Jarlath Lee side and with a February Tour of Ireland pending ,another win will put enough fuel in the tank before they take to the road. Early Spring trips to Limerick, Dublin(twice) and Drogheda will require a full squad effort and recent victories have shown the benefits of having a full deck.

Last time out against SETU Carlow Aron Walker gave his best offensive display of the season, highlighted by his buzzer-beating winning basket and he will be looking to penetrate inside against the Cougars defence. Rui Saravia has also shown his dexterity under the basket and the Lakers will be looking to use that double threat a little more than they did in that last outing in the Presentation Gym. Of course the talismanic Jack Ferguson was the star turn in that early January encounter, hitting 37 points including eight three pointers in a sensational shooting display. Paul Clarke has looked really sharp in recent weeks and his game intelligence is a huge buffer for the younger talents of Jack O Sullivan, Mark Sheehan, Eoin Carroll, Jack O Sullivan, Oisin Spring and Senan O Leary. This sextet represents the future of National League basketball in the Club and the more time and experience they gain the better for them in the long run. Having missed the Carlow victory, Marko Bencic will be looking to tap into his Cougars performance, he hit 14 points, and the returns of both Mark O Shea and David Gleeson aren't too far away. But games are played on the hardwood, not on paper, and Coach Fleming will be hammering home that point to his side ahead of tip off.

# DAVID MORAN RETIRES

Michael Murphy, Lee Keegan....now David Moran has announced his retirement from inter-county football. Three of the best footballers of a generation, no guestion in the world about that. To be honest, David's retirement came as a surprise to me. Despite being hampered by injury ever since his brief and ill-fated experience in the 2021 County Final, David was playing as well as ever - and when you are talking about the standards that the big Rahillys man set, that's no small thing to say. He was easily the best player on the pitch against Kilmacud Crokes I was certain he had at least another year in him, and possibly more. He was playing U16 for Rahillys the first time I saw him - I'd say he was only fourteen at the time. He was pointed out to me as Ogie's son and one to watch. The funny thing was that although Tommy Walsh was much bigger than his father, you could see the style of Seán Walsh in his football. That wasn't true of David - he was as good as Ogie (and Ogie was arguably the best footballer on a team of superstars), but he had a completely different style. Ogie had uncanny balance and the ball was almost glued to his feet as he jinked remorselessly past the likes of Seán Doherty. David wasn't an evasive player in any way, David would go up into the sky with anyone and invariably come down with the ball. You were never going to outfield him or outmuscle him. He was old school in his style; he'd have been quite comfortable playing alongside Mick O'Connell or his great clubmates Denis O'Shea and Denis O'Sullivan in the fifties and sixties. Like Darragh O'Shea before him, he was masterful at long kickpassing into a forward's chest and he was better than Darragh when it came to picking off a few scores himself.

His inter-county career started when he was selected for the Kerry minors. Kerry, with the twin terrors of David and Tommy Walsh prominent, could and probably should have beaten Roscommon in the All Ireland Final, but David Power's team held their nerve to take it to a replay and we simply left too many chances behind us in the replay. David's marker was already laid down, though; we all knew that this lad was going to play for the Kerry seniors. He somewhat surprisingly had to wait until 2014 to win an All Star, and I suspect that had as much to do with Kerry winning the All Ireland as David's own form that year. He won another in 2019 after we took Dublin to a replay but couldn't land a knockout blow. I am on the record at the time as saying that I genuinely believe that he should have won another in 2021 - even in the game where Kerry hopes crashed on an immutable Tyrone half back line, Davidf was easily the dominant midfielder on view.

David always and ever had perfect discipline you simply couldn't goad him into any foolish retaliating; he cared too much about the jersey for that kind of foolishness. For 14 years, he gave it everything he had, and he always did it with that quiet gentleman's smile on his face - in that, he is very much his father's son. His absence will leave a definite void in the Kerry team, especially with Joe O'Connor and Diarmuid O'Connor carrying injuries at the moment. Barry Dan O'Sullivabnis probably in pole position for that jersey, but I expect Ronan Buckley and Mark Ryan to come very strongly into the reckoning. None of that is David's problem, he owes us absolutely nothing. All the debts are on the other side of that particular ledaer.

#### Statement from David Moran

After a lot of thought, I have decided to retire from Inter-County football. It's not a decision I have taken lightly. Playing with Kerry fulfilled all my boyhood dreams, however, with an aging body, a young family and a demanding work life I feel I can no longer give the commitment required to perform and compete at the top level.

I'd like to thank Sinead and my family for their unwavering support. I'd like to thank the various Kerry management, backroom and medical teams and County Board officers I've worked with over the last 15 years. I'd also like to thank my colleagues at Casey Stephenson Accountants and McElligott's garage for all their support and assistance. I want to acknowledge the support I received from the Kerry supporters through the highs and lows of my career, it's something I will always be grateful for. I look forward to playing with my club and supporting Kerry from the stands in 2023 and beyond.

#### Statement from Patrick O' Sullivan – Chairman of Kerry County Board:

David Moran's retirement today brings to an end an outstanding career in the green and gold jersey for the Kerins O'Rahilly's clubman. Since he first made his championship debut against Cork in 2008, David has been one of the stand-out midfielders of his generation and he exemplified this as late as a couple of short weeks ago when he gave a tremendous exhibition of fielding for his Club in what was to be a fitting finale to his career on the hallowed turf of Croke Park.

David always gave of his best when representing his county just like his father Ogie before him and his inspirational playing style more often than not brought the best out of his colleagues while at the same time endearing himself to the loyal Kerry supporters. The winner of 3 All Ireland medals and 2 All Stars, he played 53 Championship games and 58 League games for the Kingdom overcoming serious injuries to once again climb the steps of the Hogan Stand last July.

David was a gentleman both on and off the field and words cannot adequately capture the contribution that he has made to our County.

On behalf of all Kerry people I wish to thank David for everything he has done and I wish him, Sinead, Eli and his family all the very best in his retirement.

There really isn't a lot to say about the game itself. We started well enough, but you could see that Limerick were only taking ranging shots. Sure enough, Limerick picked off the next eight points on the trot, without ever really putting the pedal to the metal. # FOGUS ON EARLY SPRING FLOWERING SHRUBS

Now is a good time if you are planning a new garden or trying to add some colour to an established garden to plant some early flowering spring shrubs. One of the best places at the moment. The Camellia is a very valuable shrub in the garden as it can give a focal point to any shrubbery all year round with its glossy green leaves and showy blooms from early spring. A lot of people think that Camellias are a difficult shrub to grow, but in fact they are no more difficult than Rhododendrons or azaleas, and most varieties on sale now are hardy. When choosing the spot to plant your Camellia, make sure it is sheltered from cold winds as they can damage the flowering buds as can frost. When planting your Camellia make sure to mix plenty of moss peat with the earth, rather than on its own around the plant, as it will tend to root out guicker. Camellias are also ideal for growing in containers. Remember if you are planting your Camellia in the ground, that it might be small initially but most will grow to the size of a small tree, so allow plenty of room around it. There is very little maintenance with Camellias only to prune out old dead wood, clean up the old blooms that fall to the ground, and to mulch around the base of the plants every spring with some moss peat. There are a lot of other good spring flowering shrubs. here is a list of just a few: Forsythia, Cythisus, Corylus, Berberis, Darwunnii, Ribes and
