

#### The first ever National Make Way Day kicked off this week on September 26th and Killarney was one of the towns involved.

Local authorities and The Disability Federation of Ireland came together to call on the public to be more aware of how our actions impact those with disabilities. 'Make Way Day' stickers were placed on obstacles around the country as a friendly

reminder that cars or vans pulled up on footpaths can often mean the end of the road for a person in a wheelchair.13 per cent of the Irish population have a disability and many face barriers to living an independent life due to access and public transport. Cars parked on footpaths, bicycles/motorbikes chained to lampposts, illegally placed sandwich boards and forgotten bins all obstruct

## PORT OF CORK AWARDS CONTRACT TO LIEBHERR CONTAINER CRANES

The Port of Cork this week signed a contract with Liebherr Container Cranes to supply two post panamax size ship to shore (STS) container gantry cranes to the Port of Cork for the new Cork Container Terminal in Ringaskiddy. Following an open tender process Liebherr Container Cranes were awarded the contract. The cranes will be designed and built in Killarney and are due to be delivered to the Port of Cork in Q1 2020. Liebherr Container Cranes LTD. are part of the Liebherr group and supply container handling equipment to ports and rail terminals worldwide.

Director of Liebherr Container Cranes LTD. Pat O'Leary commented, "We are delighted to have received this order and to continue our longstanding relationship with the Port of Cork. In the 1970's, Liebherr Container Cranes supplied the first ship to shore container cranes to the port. Since that time we have supplied further cranes, including two grab cranes, two STS cranes in 1991 and 1999 as well as a rubber tyre gantry crane, all of which continue to be key elements of the port's infrastructure. Today, the signing of a contract for the supply of two new state-of-the-art STS cranes will help drive port productivity and boost business, not only in Cork, but also throughout Ireland. We look forward to adding these cranes to new Cork Container Terminal where no doubt, they will make a significant contribution to the port's business activities for many years to come.

Construction on the Cork Container Terminal got underway in June of this year and is due to be open for business in 2020. The overall €80 million project encompasses a new state of the art container terminal, a new public marine leisure amenity at Paddy's Point and also includes a €1 million community gain fund for the Ringaskiddy area.

here was much celebration in Killarney this week when news broke that the town had retained its Gold Medal and had gained a massive six points in the 2018 Tidy Towns Results.

None of these results would have been achieved were it not for the hard work of the Tidy Towns Committee, Killarney Municipal District and the countless volunteers who give of their time week after week to ensure Killarney is looking its best.

#### The following is the report of the second round adjudicator...

I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate all involved in this year's submission and for the time and effort to achieve such high level results on the ground. The recently completed repaving and landscaping improvements at Main Street are very successful and the external usage space, now provided for various businesses, has an attractive cosmopolitan flavour here. John M. Reidy, The Medical Hall and opposite The Irish Pub, J. O'Leary (surely a preservation building) and Sheahans Pharmacy have wonderfully imaginative presentations. This attractive theme is continued along High Street where a variety of shop fronts, with good quality lettering and signage, provide a fine visual presentation. Work was ongoing at the Killarney Carpet and Furniture Centre and the new painting scheme has the added benefit of obliterating graffiti from the wall of the adjoining arched entrance. The nearby window displays of your various awards, achievement trophies and certificates looks great. Opposite Bricíns, Foley's and the Speakeasy have an attractive array of wellproportioned hanging signs expressed with gold leaf lettering. Floral displays here were a highlight. The educational quarter stretching along New Road, Mission Road and Cathedral Place again continues this high standard and the presentation of individual schools was admired.

Public buildings, including the Garda Station, Library and Government Buildings, all looked well. However there was some graffiti on the walls on the external ramp to the back of Government building and the planted boundary area was in need of refreshing. Improvements and enhancements at New Market Lane and old Market Lane look charming and considerably add to the enjoyment of the town centre trail. In the outer town, approach roads have a welcoming  $at mosphere \, particularly \, on \, the \, Tralee \, approach$ where a reorganisation of signage and a nicely presented picnic area was noted. Both the O'Shea roundabout with its colourful Begonia appearance and the Ballydowney roundabout planted to portray Kerry's landscapes looked

spectacular. Congratulations to all concerned with these efforts.


Kenmare Place was a hive of activity. The nicely considered service building in the centre looks excellent, designed around mature trees and its entrance area is cleverly expressed with a box hedge feature.

The town has an abundant series of incidental open spaces planted with great imagination. The move to more sustainable planting in recent years is lauded and you are commended on receiving appropriate advice on your general programme. A visit to Killarney House was inspiring and this beautifully presented complex is a credit to all concerned. The original house restoration and the recent contemporary interpretive complex integrate very well and all were brightly painted. The views from the house to the mountains beyond are breath-taking as is the planted

terrace walk. The town has a large number of housing estates and the standard is generally good. You appear to work well with the various resident groups and have forward plans for on-going improvement works. Well done on this successful programme. I fully endorse the comments and report of this year's first round adjudicator and congratulate your committee on your partnership approach. Killarney continue to be high achievers in the competition and their high position is very well merited.

## MOTORISTS URGED TO BE VIGILANT **DURING DEER RUTTING SEASON**

It's autumn and in our forests and across our mountains, tensions are rising as the rutting season gets under way, the time of the year when male deer are driven by an urge to reproduce. From late September until early November the clash of antlers will be heard as males show off their virility to potential mates and, like gladiators entering an arena, they parade around showing off their armoury of antlers.

While the rut is an amazing experience to witness it is also a time when there is an increased incident of road traffic accidents involving deer as male deer go in search of females and younger males are ousted by dominant males forcing deer to cross roads and motorways. The Wild Deer Association of


Ireland are calling on motorists to be vigilant at dawn and dusk, when deer are most active, particularly in high risk areas such as woodlands and mountains.

#### What should drivers do in high risk areas?

Reduce speed where they see a warning sign and stay alert. Prepare to stop, never swerve as you could hit another obstacle or oncoming vehicle. When you see a deer "dip your headlights" as the fullbeam may cause the deer to freeze. If a deer has crossed in front of your vehicle, be aware that others may follow. Do not approach an injured deer. If you are involved in a Deer RTA or come across a deer

that has been involved in a RTA, immediately contact the local Gardaí.

In a show of strength and county-wide unity all seven Chamber's of Commerce in County Kerry have come together to sign an agreement which will see them represent the entire county on Regional and National issues, as well as supporting each other on local business issues.

# First-ever Community Air Ambulance Arrives in Kerry

#### Community Air Ambulance Service To Begin Next Month

ives are to be saved – as Ireland's first-ever Charity
Air Ambulance service touched down at Kerry
Airport on Friday last.

The Helicopter Emergency Medical Service (HEMS) will enter full-time daylight hours service next month and on Friday last it flew from Wales to Kerry Airport.

Irish Community Rapid Response (ICRR) – a charity dedicated to pre-hospital care – is running the service in co-operation with the HSE National Ambulance Service.

The Air Ambulance is expected to respond up to 500 calls per year, and bring the population of a 10,000 square mile area within 20 minutes of critical medical care.

It will be tasked through the National Ambulance Service 999 / 112 call system and is supported by the HSE and Department of Health.

The helicopter will be based in Cork county, but available for missions nationwide and coordinate with the existing Athlone based Emergency Aeromedical Service.

During the next month the ICRR Air Ambulance will be touring the communities it will service to help raise awareness and support fundraising. The service will cost €2million to run annually – and is to be funded through community and donor contributions.

Wales, a country of similar size and population, has a well-established fleet of four community Air Ambulances which respond to approximately 2,000

incidents a year. Examples of incidents which the Air Ambulance is expected to respond to include: Retrieval & Transfer: The airlift of a seriously ill patient from remote and rural medical hubs or accident scenes to specialist hospital care.



Irish Cancer Society urges women in Kerry to be breast aware this October – breast cancer awareness month

The Irish Cancer Society is calling on all women in Kerry to become aware of the signs and symptoms of breast cancer during breast cancer awareness month this October. The five year survival rate for breast cancer patients in Ireland is currently at 85% and the Society says early detection of the disease is a key factor in this.

Early detection greatly increases the chances for successful treatment and according to National Cancer Registry of Ireland (NCRI) statistics most breast cancers in Ireland are detected at an early stage. Over 40 per cent of invasive breast cancers are diagnosed at Stage two, while over 30 per cent are diagnosed at Stage one.

Breast cancer is the most common form of invasive cancer affecting women in Ireland. The vast majority of women diagnosed with breast cancer are aged 50 to 64 (41 per cent), but younger women are also affected, with 23 per cent of diagnoses occurring in women under 50.

The Society is urging all women in Kerry to be aware of the following signs and symptoms of breast cancer:

- A change in size or shape such as one breast becoming larger than the other
- A change in the skin such as puckering or dimpling (like orange peel) or redness
- A change in the direction or shape of your nipple, especially if it sinks into your breast or becomes irregular in shape
- An unusual discharge (liquid) from one or both of your nipples
- A change on or around the nipple such as a rash or flaky or crusted skin
- Swelling in your armpit or around your collarbone
- · A lump or thickening in your breast
- Constant pain in one part of your breast or armoit

Naomi Fitzgibbon, Cancer Nurseline Manager, Irish Cancer Society said, "It is important that every woman is breast aware. This means knowing what is normal for you so that if any unusual change occurs, you will recognise it. The sooner you notice a change the better, because if cancer is found early, treatment is more likely to be successful. Get into the habit of looking at and feeling your breasts regularly, a good time to do this is in the shower or bath. If you notice something abnormal for you talk to your doctor without delay. Remember most changes won't turn out to be breast cancer. But if they are, the sooner this is diagnosed the more effective treatment will be."

There are also a number of ways to reduce

your risk of breast cancer, including being a healthy weight, being active for 30 minutes a day at least five days a week, limiting alcohol intake, breastfeeding your baby, not smoking and by attending Breastcheck when called. All women aged 50 to 69 are invited to have a free mammogram every two years, see www. breastcheck.ie for more info.



The Irish Cancer Society relies almost entirely on voluntary donations made by the public and companies to fund free services for breast cancer patients. Money raised through Cups against cancer coffee mornings will help provide advice and support to breast cancer patients in Kerry, when they need it most, through the Freephone Cancer Nurseline and 13 Daffodil Centres around the country. These services provide support to women when they are looking for answers or just need to turn to someone who understands their diagnosis. It will also funds transportation for chemotherapy patients through the Volunteer Driver Service which is vital for women who have no other way of getting to lifesaving treatment, and nursing care at home for end of life patients through the Night Nursing Service.

## Supports in Kerry

- Over the course of 2017 the Society's Night Nursing service provided 21 nights of care to 7 breast cancer patients in Kerry. Night Nurses provide up to 10 nights of care for cancer patients who are at the end of their cancer journey, in their own home, during the last days of their life.
- Our Cancer Nurses on the Freephone Cancer Nurseline **1800 200 700** and Daffodil Centres answered 33 enquiries from breast cancer patients in Kerry in 2017. Members of the public can speak to a Cancer Nurse about any aspect of cancer by calling Freephone 1800 200 700 or by calling into one of the 13 Daffodil Centres nationwide.
- Volunteer Drivers transported 8 breast cancer patients from Kerry to their chemotherapy treatment last year.
- The Society helps to fund counselling services in our affiliated cancer support centres around the country. Last year we funded counselling sessions for 37 breast cancer patients from Kerry to help them cope with their cancer diagnosis.

## CONCERN EXPRESSED AT TII INTENTION

At the September 2018 monthly meeting of Kerry County Council, Councillor Michael Gleeson asked that the Council would express grave concern at the expressed intention of the TII to eliminate Deceleration Lanes for left turning traffic, as that decision, if implemented, will most likely result in many tail-ending accidents.



Kerry County Council replied that Transport Infrastructure Ireland has issued revised standards for junction design. The provision of Deceleration Lanes for left turning traffic on single carriageway roads has been removed because of safety issues identified with such junctions. The Council is obliged to comply with this new directive when designing a new junction or working on an existing one.


Councillor Gleeson expressed his deep concern at this proposal as he believes that it will result in many accidents when vehicles intending to turn left slow down, sometimes suddenly due to lack of local knowledge. Such accidents may have serious well-being consequences for people.

R.I.P and are often spoke of remembered fondly", Eileen Moynihan, Secretary of the group told the Killanrey Outlook.



## All aboard for Legion's Club Day Out







#### **Driver Distraction**

Driver distraction is a diversion of attention away from activities critical for safe driving toward a competing activity. A distraction can often occur simultaneously - at times resulting in a complete loss of control. Distraction can be visual, manual and cognitive.

Based on international evidence it is estimated that driver distraction could play a role in 20-30% of all road collisions in this country. This means that driver distraction could be a contributory factor in over 1,400 fatal and injury collisions annually.

CHILD DISTRACTION: The two biggest distractions for drivers in Ireland are the mobile and children. But did you know that child distraction could be the more lethal? According to researchers at Monash University in Australia they are 12 times more distracting to a driver than talking on a mobile.

The study also found that on average a parent takes their eyes off the road for three minutes and 22 seconds during a 16-minute trip. The most common types of distractions that children cause include the driver turning to look at the child or watching the goings on in the back seat in the rear-view mirror, engaging in conversation with the child, leaning into the back to help or pacify the child and even playing with the child.

This is the subject of the first of two new ads from of the RSA on the subject of driver distraction over the Summer of 2015. The first ad which was aired on Monday 15th ad deals with child distraction and is entitled 'Looking Back' [insert link]. (A second ad will follow later in the summer and deals with the issue of mobile phone distraction).

In the 40 second ad we see a woman looking back, over the duration of her entire life. She's looking back with regret at something that happened many years ago. By the end of the advertisement, we see what this event was. The moment she looked back in a very concrete sense - looking back to her child while she was driving. We cut before she crashes into an oncoming car and loses this child forever.

- We end with the message: Don't lose a lifetime looking back.
- Never let a child take your focus off the road. Pull over if you have to.
- The cost is too high to take your focus off the road to look at your child for even one second.
- We're asking drivers to give the road all of their focus, and if they need to, to pull over.

**BEING A GOOD PARENT MEANS BEING A** 



GOOD DRIVER: When it comes to children in the car, parents are resigned to the distraction they cause and sceptical of finding a permanent solution. That's why we need to educate parents about the risks of focusing on their children rather than the road.

The RSA undertook research in this area in 2014 to understand what was going on in the car with parents and young children. We asked parents to keep a diary and what they had to say was very revealing.

- It found that parents are conflicted. They are trying to be a good driver and a good parent at the same time. They are torn between looking after the child, and they struggle to put the child's more immediate needs behind the task of safely driving the car.
- · A good parent wouldn't ignore their kid screaming in the back seat without at least trying to intervene. Yet the very act of attempting to attend to their children's needs, makes them bad drivers and puts their children in mortal danger.
- · Parents of young children are busier than most and see their car as an extension of the home and a necessary place to multi-task. For parents, driving with children on board, can be an experience filled with anxiety, guilt, frustration and irritation.
- In the RSA study we asked parents to gain a fresh perspective. Parents consciously took a trip without children and asked to note any differences. It was a revelation for some when it came to their driving and they realised they needed to do something.
- The aim of this new campaign is to educate parents on the risks that children pose as a distraction in the car. We want parents to understand that the things going on outside the vehicle need their attention much more than the things inside it.

TIPS FOR PARENTS: The best advice is to give serious thought to your children's needs before you all jump into the car. One solution in reducing driver distraction, according to the Monash University report, is the correct restraint of children in their car seats.

• The RSA sees it regularly at its Check it Fits child car seat service. Think how you would feel on a trip in the car sitting in a seat that's incorrectly fitted, wearing layers of padded clothing and the straps not adjusted correctly so they're cutting into your shoulders? It certainly explains some of the constant crying and trying to get out of the seat behaviour of some children. The Australian researchers found the children in their study were in the incorrect position for over 70 per cent of the journey time. Three quarters of child car seats we examine here in Ireland are incorrectly fitted. Ensuring your child is properly restrained in the correct car seat could eliminate a big cause of distraction while driving for parents.

If they do start acting up once the car is in motion, keep your attention on the road. If you feel you absolutely have to intervene, find a safe place to pull over in order to do so, but under no circumstances on the hard shoulder of a motorway. Otherwise stay focused on the driving. Everything and everyone else can wait. You have spent every waking moment working hard to protect your children, don't jeopardise this because you didn't make in car safety yo

#### What are you creating?



## **TAX MATTERS**

#### TAX FOR SELF-EMPLOYED PEOPLE

As a self-employed person you pay income tax under the self-assessment system. You pay Preliminary Tax (an estimate of tax due for your current trading year) on or before 31 October each year and make a tax return for the previous year not later than 31 October.

For example, if your accounting year is from 1 January to 31 December each year, you pay Preliminary Tax for 2018 by 31 October 2018, based on an estimate of your liability for the full year. At the same time, you make a tax return for 2017 and pay any taxes outstanding for that year. If you file your tax return online using the Revenue Online Service (ROS), the due date is 14 November 2018. You are entitled to the normal income tax credits and reliefs. For 2018, you may claim an Earned Income Tax Credit of €1,150 (increased from €550 in 2016 and €950 in 2017). However, if you also qualify for the Employee Tax Credit (formerly known as the PAYE tax credit), the combined value of these 2 tax credits cannot exceed €1,650.

You must keep proper records which include:

- · All purchases and sales of goods and services and
- · All amounts received and all amounts paid out

You must keep supporting records (for example, invoices, bank and building society statements, cheque stubs and receipts). You can claim certain business expenses against tax, such as purchase of goods for re-sale, wages, rent, rates, repairs, lighting and heating, running costs of vehicles or machinery used in the business, accountancy fees, interest paid on business loans, leasing payments on vehicles or machinery used in the business as well as contributions to your personal pension (up to certain limits).

If you are working from home you may be able to claim a proportion of household bills such as telephone, heating, lighting etc.

#### Universal Social Charge, PRSI and VAT

USC: Everyone is liable to pay the Universal Social Charge (USC) if their gross income is over €13,000 in a year.

PRSI: Self-employed people pay Class S PRSI on their income.

#### Value Added Tax (VAT)

You must register for Value Added Tax (VAT) if your annual turnover is more than or is likely to be more than €75,000 for supply of goods or €37,500 for supply of service. As a trader you pay VAT on goods and services acquired for the business and charge VAT on goods and services supplied by the business.

#### OUESTION

I would like to make a will. Do I need to go to a solicitor or can I draw up the will myself?

#### ANSWER

It is important for you to make a will because, if you do not, the law on intestacy decides what happens to your property in the event of your death.

distributed in the way you wish after your death (subject You can draw up a will yourself or you can hire a solicitor to help you. All of the following legal requirements apply:

- •The will must be in writing.
- •You must be of sound mind.
- signature or mark in the presence of two witnesses.
- •Your two witnesses must sign the will in your presence.
- •Your two witnesses cannot be people who will gain from your will and they must be present with you at the same time for their attestation to be valid. The witnesses' spouses or civil partners also cannot gain from your will.
- •Your witnesses must see you sign the will but they do not have to see what is written in it.
- •The signature or mark must be at the end of the will. legally valid. If you want to change your will after you make it, you can add a codicil (amendment or change) to your will. This codicil must meet the requirements set out above. You should keep an updated list of your assets. You can use a form to record where your possessions are kept. This makes it easier to identify and trace your assets after you die. You should keep the list in a safe place.




High-Maintenance Cat has found a perfect home:

Frequently we sabotage ourselves by feeling that we don't deserve success or happiness. Fear of failure can prevent us from moving towards a desired goal. However, this is often to do with our sense of not being enough - more than loss of money or time or reputation. If you have a fear of failure you may be holding some negative belief about yourself which is repressing you. To understand what your barrier may be, fill in the following blank for yourself: "If I try and don't succeed, everyone will know I'm ...

Another helpful way to identify our blocks to success is to write down, without censoring, the specific thoughts and feelings you have that hold you back. This will help you to identify child-like or vulnerable feelings that may be unconsciously controlling your behaviour. In the same way that a parent might reassure (and not ridicule) a scared child, learn to parent yourself - and assure the vulnerable part of you that you'll take charge and that you have their back.

Perfectionism can hinder our success, leading us to focus more on avoiding failure than accomplishing our goals. Begin to see mistakes as opportunities for learning and not reasons to beat yourself up about something. If you don't get the result you wanted, this doesn't make you a failure. Look at the event as a learning experience and ask what you can take from the situation. Assess if it could have been prevented and ask what you can do differently next time. It is also vital that we not take things too personally and separate what we do from our overall sense of identity. Shifting our focus in this way can be difficult - and is a practice that we can perfect over time. Self-limiting thoughts or beliefs can be particularly damaging as they limit the possibilities for change and success. If you find yourself thinking a limiting thought - turn it into a question. Rather than thinking "I can't do this - It's impossible", ask "How can I do this" or "How is this possible". Simply changing the statement to a question opens us up to finding new possibilities and sounds more hopeful.

Getting to where you want to be takes many small steps. It is important to begin by firmly establishing in your mind what you want to achieve. Write this down and believe with certainty that it can be accomplished. It can also help to visualise yourself attaining this goal. Continue to take meaningful steps towards your destination until you have reached your goal.



SOWING HARDY ANNUALS

It may seem a long time away, but sowing some hardy annuals now will

give you a very impressive display in early spring. Most hardy annuals can

be sown in autumn and will overwinter quite well. Hardy annuals are

plants that will grow and flower for one year only. When sowing your

seeds, dig the soil over well, to about a spades depth, then rake it over and firm it down, and make sure it is weed free. A good idea before

sowing your seed is to mark it out by sprinkling some sand on the on the

area you're going to sow the seed on. Also don't sow the seed into soil

that is too rich, as this will only encourage too much leafy growth and not enough flowers. If the soil is rich there is no need to use fertilizers. You

can also scatter the seed over the whole bed, and try and leave about a

1/4 of an inch between them and cover them lightly with some compost

and water well, but make sure there is a fine rose on your watering can.
