
OPT OUT ORGAN DONATION

Deputy Michael Healy-Rae asked the Minister for Health questions regarding Ireland's forth coming opt-out organ donation, and the Minister assured the Deputy that the General Scheme of a Human Tissue Bill is being finalised at present and will submitted to government shortly. According to the HSE, at the end of December 2017 there were 587 people still waiting for an organ. This bill will hopefully increase the number of available organs that are acceptable for transplant and be given to these people.

FOR THE KENYA EDUCATION PROJECT

Eddie Sheehy will hold his annual table quiz in aid of the Kenya Education Project on Thursday night April 4th in the Castlerosse hotel at 8 30 pm.

The project helps young people in the slum village of Embulbul, Nairobi. At present 100 young people are sponsored to complete their primary and secondary education as their own family circumstances make it very difficult to meet the cost of books, uniform and fees. This is the highest number ever of students sponsored by the Kenya Education Project.

Some past pupils of the school are also helped to continue their education and training by paying college fees as well as travel and subsistence allowences. To date the project has helped students to obtain training in Childcare, Secretarial, Computing, Journalism and Social Work which is a major boost to their families in their dream of obtaining a job to ease the financial burden on their families. In recent years the Project has increased its work with families in the village through





the local branch of S.V.D.P. Needy families have received beds, blankets and household utensils to help ease the burden of poverty.

The village feeding programme provides a hot meal each weekday evening for 100 needy children from the village. The Kenya Project helps to offset some of the costs of these monthly food bills for the parish. It costs 650 euro per month to finance the feeding programme.

The Kenya Education Project is increasing its support of this programme.

The project continues to support sporting activities in the school and village by providing playing gear, footballs and training equipment to those involved in soccer, basketball and volleyball.

The support the Project continues to receive each year from the people of Killarney is encouraging and heartening and enables many young people to be helped and supported.



Killarney Credit Union Launches New Agri Loan Product

Early milking was the order of the day on Wednesday March 20th as Six Credit Unions in the Kerry/Cork region joined forces to launch a new Agri Loan product called Cultivate. The launch held in The Gleneagle Hotel, Killarney was supported by farmers and industry experts

The Credit Unions involved are Ballincollig, Bantry and Kanturk in Cork and on the Kerry side of the border Cara, Killarnev and Listowel.

The new Credit Union farm lending offering is branded under the name "Cultivate" and was officially launched by IFA National Chairman - Farm Business, Martin Stapleton. MC for the night was Pat Spillane, Rural Ambassador and Former Kerry GAA star and guest speaker was Darragh Mc Cullough from RTE's 'Ear to the Ground'. 

EYES IN THE SUN

Too much sun can damage the eyes. As with skin damage, it is the ultraviolet (UV) radiation from the sun which causes problems. There are two types of UV rays: UV-A and UV-B.

Over time, the effects of UV rays may help cause a number of eye problems.

UV-A

can hurt your central vision. It can damage the macula, a part of the retina at the back of your eye.

UV-B

The front part of your eye (the cornea and the lens) absorbs most UV-B rays, but these rays may cause even more damage to your eyes than UV-A rays.

What Eye Problems Can UV Rays Cause?

Macular Degeneration

UV rays may lead to macular degeneration, a leading cause of vision loss for older people.

Cataract

UV rays, especially UV-B rays, may also cause some kinds of cataracts. A cataract is a clouding of the eye's natural lens, the part of the eye that focuses the light we see.

Pterygium

Another UV-related problem is a growth called pterygium. This growth begins on the white of the eye and may involve the cornea. Eventually,



the growth may block vision. It is more common in people who work outside in the sun and wind.

Skin Cancer

Skin cancer around the eyelids is also linked to prolonged UV exposure.

Corneal Sunburn

Corneal sunburn, called photokeratitis, is the result of high short-term exposure to UV-B rays. Long hours at the beach or skiing without proper eye protection can cause this problem. It can be very painful and may cause temporary vision loss.

Protecting your eyes from the sun

If you are spending time outdoors, especially in the summer or on holidays abroad, make sure that you and your children have good quality, dark sunglasses with UV protection. Look for the British Standard (BS EN ISO 12312-1:2013) or the CE mark, which is the manufacturer's assurance that the sunglasses have been made to the appropriate safety standards. You can also protect your eyes by making sure to wear a hat with a brim or a sun visor in bright sunlight.







Secondary School admission policy adding undue stress to Mid-Kerry families

Cllr. Brendan Cronin has highlighted the undue stress caused by the secondary school admission policy in mid-Kerry.

"Within the past few months, it has been brought to my attention that some secondary school admission policies in Mid-Kerry are causing unwarranted stress and upset for families", Cllr. Cronin told the Killarney Outlook. "An onus of responsibility remains with each board of management of secondary schools to ensure that pupils within their catchment area are catered for adequately within the school's admission policy. I have been contacted by several distressed parents concerned with the very same issue whereby their children are being denied the right to go to their 'local' secondary school with their friends, neighbours and teammates in the Mid Kerry area. I am a firm believer that any admission policy must prioritise the pupils within that school's catchment area. A pupil living in a catchment area should not be denied the right to attend a secondary school based on decisions taken by their siblings' or by their

parents' or in many circumstances where families are new to a community having moved into the area recently.

I am a strong believer in community, which is defined by 'a group of people living in the same place or having a particular characteristic in common'. I am shocked and saddened to think that in 2019, pupils living in the same location, attending the same primary school and playing sports with their local clubs together will now be forced to part ways as a result of an admissions policy which clearly fails to recognise the importance of community and clearly is not striving to achieve a sense of community in the greater Mid-Kerry area. I intend to write to the Minister for Education, Joe McHugh seeking a full review of secondary school admissions policies which will ensure that those living within a catchment area will be given a fair and just opportunity of attending the school of their choice", Cllr Brendan Cronin concluded.

MINIMUM WAGE IN IRELAND 2019

The Minimum Wage in Ireland was increased on January 1st 2019. It went up by 25 cent per hour, from €9.55 to €9.80.

New laws were introduced on March 4th 2019 - which mean that minimum wage rates are now based purely on age and not on previous work experience or training. These are the Minimum Wage Rates that apply in Ireland from 4th March 2019.

- Aged under 18 €6.86 per hour
- Aged 18 €7.84 per hour
- Aged 19 €8.82 per hour
- Aged 20 or more €9.80 per hour

New rules also mean that if a casual/part time employee is called to work and sent home without receiving the hours expected, the employee is entitled to a minimum payment of three times the national minimum wage.

These are the minimum wage rates that applied from Jan 1st 2019 to March 3rd 2019

- Experienced adult worker €9.80 per hour
- Over 19 and more than 1 but less than 2 years since began first job €8.82 per hour. (90%)
- Over 18 and less than 1 year since began first job €7.84 per hour. (80%)
- Aged under 18 €6.86 per hour (70%)

(An experienced adult worker - for the purposes of the National Minimum Wage Act is an employee who has an employment of any kind in any 2 years over the age of 18.)



DEMOGRAPHICS PILOT STUDY

Counties: Kerry, Roscommon, Tyrone & Westmeath

The GAA is now operating in an environment where 71% of the population of Ireland is resident in two provinces - Leinster 39% and Ulster 32%. In fact the imbalance in population is even greater as Dublin's population is over 50% the Leinster total and is greater than the population of either of the other two provinces - Munster or Connacht. This on-going demographic change is having a direct impact on GAA operations at every level. Cognisant of significant demographic changes on the island of Ireland, The National Committee on Community Development, Urban & Rural aims to deliver on the objectives of the GAA's Strategic Plan 2018-2021, in relation to protecting and growing the Association, by undertaking a Pilot Study in four selected Counties. In order to interconnect a wide range of issues, a county from each province has been selected, notably; Kerry, Roscommon, Tyrone & Westmeath. The Pilot Study will examine how the Association can best measure the impact of demographic change. Over the next couple of weeks, representatives from the county working group will be in contact with your club to gather the necessary data. Engagement and support from the clubs will be critical to the success of the pilot and the committee will require your valued inputs in order to successfully complete the Pilot. A range of data inputs will be required from each club, including; Number of teams (incl. family of games, ladies, camogie etc.) Participation - number of players at each age group, Ouantify school links and Facilities Assessment. The initial pilot projects will seek to increase the awareness amongst all Clubs of the demographic challenges within their catchment areas and to encourage all Clubs in the catchment area, working with the County Board, to collaborate and cooperate in an integrated manner to take ownership for tackling the specific problems within their area.


Scotts Lakers really stepped it up in the second quarter. Hersisia continued to dominate and Dailian Mason knocked down a brace of





Know Your Rights:

OUESTION

My son is exempted from studying Irish. Can he still go on to study at third level?

ANSWER

Students must have the academic entry requirements (also called matriculation want to take. You can get detailed information on these requirements directly from the universities, technological universities, institutes of technology and colleges of education.

If a certain mark in the Irish Leaving Certificate exam is a matriculation requirement, students who had an exemption from the study of Irish may also be exempted from this requirement.

Exemptions from Irish matriculation requirements may be granted, for example, to a student who was born outside Ireland, was educated wholly or partly outside Ireland or who has a specific learning disability. This is a matter for each individual college.

All students applying for a third-level course through the Central Applications Office (CAO) should send a copy of their exemption certificate with their CAO application form.

The college may also ask the student to complete a separate exemption application form and to submit supporting documentation. You should check with the individual college for details on how to apply for an exemption.

EARTH HOUR IS THIS SATURDAY

Starting as a symbolic lights out event in Sydney in 2007, on Saturday March 29th 2008, 35 countries and over 370 cities switched off lights during Earth Hour for the first time. Now millions of people, businesses and landmarks set aside an hour to host events, switch off their lights and support the Earth Hour movement. This year, they want to celebrate the diversity of life on Earth, and they want to invite your friends and family to celebrate with them!

Please switch off all unnecessary electric lights and electrical gadgets in solidarity with global efforts to secure nature and our home on this Saturday March 30th from 8:30pm until 9.30pm.

SUMMER TIME THIS WEEKEND

Remember to reset your watches, alarms, timers etc by putting the time forward by one hour before you go to bed this Saturday night. Sunrise and sunset will be about one hour later on Sunday, March 31, 2019 than the day before, resulting in more daylight in the evening.

In a public survey in the EU Countries last year, more than 80% of 4.6 million people voted to put an end to seasonal clock changes altogether, but some MEP's decided an April 1st, 2019 deadline was too ambitious. In a compromise, this deadline has been pushed two years ahead, to April 1st, 2021.



A FEW QUICK CHECKS CAN TAKE YOUR DOG THROUGH THE BRIGHTER EVENINGS SAFE AND SOUND

Check leashes, collars, harnesses, etc. for any wear and tear, and verify that they still fit appropriately. Make sure your dog's ID tags are current and still legible, and have your vet scan their microchip to confirm that it still works and make sure the winter months didn't damage any fencing that could lead to your dog escaping.

*Many common garden plants are toxic to dogs, including lilies, daffodils, tulips, Rhododenron begonias etc.

*Fleas, lice etc like warm, humid climates and pets will pick them up from the environment or other infested animals. They can cause severe skin issues, transmit diseases and even trigger anaemia in the host. It's critical to identify fleas quickly and use appropriate treatment. Ticks typically live in wooded areas, brush, shrubs and wild undergrowth; they also transmit some very serious diseases, so prevention is extremely

important. *Try to prevent your dog from stepping on lawns around your neighbourhood as they might be treated with toxic chemicals. Likewise, don't let your dog drink out of puddles from those April showers, as they too might contain chemicals or dangerous pathogens.

*After several months inside and inactive, your dog may have gained weight, lost muscle tone and be a little stiff in the joints, reintroduce him slowly to his favourite outdoor activities by starting with short runs and hikes or gentle games of fetch and Frisbee until he's used to an increased level of activity.

*Make sure the winter months didn't damage any fencing that could lead to your dog escaping. And pick up debris, sticks and rocks that could pose hazards.

*Just like humans, many dogs experience allergies with plants and pollen being common triggers. In dogs, environmental allergies frequently present as itchy skin, as well as secondary skin and ear infections. If you notice your dog excessively itching or licking their paws, it's important to get them to the vet for a diagnosis and treatment.

CALIFORNIA IS FINALLY DROUGHT-FREE AFTER 7 YEARS

According to recent reports from the U.S. National Drought Mitigation Centre, California has been experiencing some form of drought since December 20th, 2011 but had an abundance of rain and snowfall during the past winter season.

WORKERS WORKED OVERTIME SO THAT THEIR COLLEAGUE COULD TAKE CARE OF HIS SICK SON

36-year-old Andreas Graf, a worker from Marburg, Germany had a terrible period in his life. His wife had died and his son was diagnosed with leukaemia. As his hands were tied, the man wrote a dismissal application to look after the child. Instead, a staff member from the human resources department shared Andrea's story with his colleagues, persuading them to help. They decided to share Andreas' shifts among themselves, so that he would not have to resign. His colleagues had worked overtime for 3,264 hours - about 400 working days, enabling him to be compensated for as paid leave.

HAVE YOU EVER TASTED WILD COFFEE?

According to a 2017 study, nearly 60% of the world's wild coffee is under threat of extinction and Ethiopia is home to some of these last remaining wild arabica plants.

Amongst the many gems within Bale Mountains National Park is the Mountain Nyala, an endangered species of antelope and the Harenna rainforest which lies about 250 miles southeast of Addis Ababa and hides a tangle of flora beneath the shroud of an often-present, low-lying cloud. Tucked among this dense greenery is some of the world's last wild coffee which farmers living in the area depend on for income and approximately 3,000 individuals gather the bright red coffee cherries from the wild arabica plants by hand each year. After collection, no processing or cleaning is required; farmers simply leave their yield to dry in suspended nets or beneath the sun.

Residents of Manyate established a community group known as the Sankate Association to better develop the forest's small-scale industries including Sankate's coffee village which offers tourists an opportunity to pluck their own ripened wild coffee cherries during the harvest season.

MUSLIM DOCTORS USE OHIO MOSQUE TO OPEN FIRST FREE CLINIC IN THE REGION

The Cleveland Ibn Sina Clinic is located inside the spare rooms of the Islamic Centre of Cleveland in Parma, Ohio. The facility which is open at weekends is being run by 20 different Muslim doctors volunteering their skills on a rotating basis and its doors will be open to uninsured patients from all religions and walks of life.

In addition to offering primary care services, the clinic will also offer treatment for sleep disorders, asthma, allergies, respiratory medicine, and mental health conditions.

All of the clinic's services will be free of charge and the only thing that patients will have to worry about is the cost of prescriptions as the facility will be financing their operations through monthly fundraisers and donations from amongst the Muslim community.

Welcome back dear reader, we mentioned how circumstances are subject to change previously and I would like to give a personal testimony. Things had gone wrong in our business and we were in a very bad place financially and emotionally. We were completely stressed and didn't know how we would make it through. Everything had fallen apart due to the recession and we had lost everything, and still had to face those we owed money to. One Sunday morning at Word of Victory Christian Fellowship the worship song 'Because He Lives' was sung. Tears rolled down my cheeks uncontrollably as I sang....'Because He lives, I can face tomorrow, because He lives all fear is gone. Because I know He holds the future, and life is worth the living just because He lives' - it's a simple song with powerfully anointed lyrics that no matter what is going on Jesus will bring us through. I cried all through that service because tomorrow we were meeting a creditor and we did not have the money to pay them. My baby was on my lap, and my older child had taken my Bible and a little notebook and was drawing and practising her writing. I paid little attention to what she was at - I was just glad she was keeping quiet! I couldn't tell you what was preached that day because all I could think of was what is going to happen tomorrow. Afterwards my daughter came up to me and said 'Mommy look what I did!' and she showed me her notebook. I couldn't believe my eyes when I read what she had written. She had copied a Scripture from my Bible as the Lord used her to speak His promise to me. In her precious 7 year old handwriting she wrote "Give your burdens to the Lord, and He will take care of you. He will not permit the godly to slip and fall." This Scripture is from Psalm 55:22 and of all the Scriptures in the Bible this was the one she copied out. I know it was no coincidence. It was a Word from God that He was with us and He would bring us through. And He did. Our circumstances have changed completely since that time and to God be the glory for His love and faithfulness. I still have that notebook and read it often; I will post a picture of it on this post on our website - Be encouraged friend His promises are for you too!



One of my favourite Oscar Wilde quotes says 'Be yourself, everyone else is taken'. So why is it so difficult for us to do just that? Liking ourselves and being ourselves has to do with self-acceptance. Self-acceptance refers to our ability to embrace all facets of ourselves and not just the positive, acceptable parts. Whilst we may recognize our limitations and weaknesses - accepting ourselves fully means we accept these aspects of ourselves too. We stop judging ourselves and being so hard on ourselves.

Research shows that before the age of eight we are unable to form a sense of ourselves separate from that which was transmitted to us by those who care for us. So often I hear clients say to me that their parents were unable or unwilling to communicate the message to them that they were totally okay and acceptable. In addition to this we may have received much disapproval and criticism from teachers, siblings, other relatives and/or our peers. Is it any wonder then that we come to see ourselves as inadequate in many ways? A consequence of this is that we may go on to regard many aspects of ourselves negatively. We 'beat ourselves up' often telling ourselves the very same thing that an overly critical parent or teacher may have said.

So how then do we become more self-accepting?

Developing self-acceptance requires that we develop more self-compassion for ourselves. The Buddhist teacher Pema Chodron says that "Compassion isn't some kind of self-improvement project or ideal that we're trying to live up to. Having compassion starts and ends with having compassion for all those unwanted parts of ourselves, all those imperfections that we don't even want to look at"

However learning to be self-compassionate and kind to ourselves can seem like quite a new idea and represents a deep change in our attitude and way of being. In order to ensure our survival our brains have been designed in such a way as to give attention to the negative stuff. Self-criticism has in fact played an important role for us. However, this criticism needs to be tempered with kindness and not allowed to be a habit based response formed from patterns laid down in our early childhood. Whenever we criticise ourselves we are triggering the same threat and protection systems in the body and brain that get activated when threatened by other people

By cultivating more self-compassion we come to like ourselves more and to view ourselves as deserving of love and respect. This in turn can lead us to showing not just more kindness and goodwill toward ourselves but towards others as well

Next week we will look further at developing and cultivating self acceptance.
