







GOOCH TO LAUNCH HIS AUTOBIOGRAPHY

The much anticipated autobiograph - Gooch by Colm Cooper will be launched on Thursday next October 5th at The Gleneagle Hotel with RTE's Michael Lester doing the honours as MC.

When Colm Cooper retired from inter-county football in 2017, he left behind a remarkable legacy. The holder of five All-Ireland medals and eight All-Stars, he was Kerry's stand-out forward for fifteen years. From a family steeped in Gaelic football, and a core member of the Dr Crokes team, Colm was still in his teens when he first played for Kerry at senior level. Overcoming struggles with injury and personal tragedy, Cooper became one of the GAA's most recognizable and best-loved figures at a time of tumultuous change in the game.

But the man known nationally as 'Gooch' is also an intensely private figure who has never courted publicity and his personal story remains largely untold. Now Gooch – The Autobiography unlocks a previously unopened door, tracing a compelling path through the



life beyond the headlines. This is the story of an ordinary man who became an extraordinary footballer.

The Kerry Deer Society wish to advise people going into the mountains or lowlands to observe deer during the "Deer Rut", that it can be dangerous to approach deer at this time of the year. Stags can be quite aggressive and may attack people and dogs. For your safety please stay back from deer and use binoculars. When driving

on public roads, drive with care. Deer wander.

DRIVING NEAR DEER -DO'S AND DON'TS

Drivers who ignore deer warning signs or drive at speed along rural roads at this time of year make themselves an endangered species, warns the AA. "Their best bet is to heed the warning signs,

put up where accidents have happened or animals are known to cross, and to always drive at a speed that gives you time to react to what may suddenly appear in the road.

Drivers need to understand a little about deer, to think about how they can change their driving to avoid them, and to understand what to do if they do hit and injure one."

If you understand a little about deer then you can think about how you can change your driving to avoid them and know what to do if you hit and injure one.

Accidents involving deer peak in May, October and November.

Worst times of day are around sunrise and between sunset and midnight.

Some areas have bigger problems than others including Killarney National Park.

'Deer' or 'wild animal' signs warn you that deer accidents happen in

A deer can appear almost instantly - nature makes them hard to see and they don't follow the green cross code!

Use high beam head-lights when it's dark, but dip them if you see a deer, otherwise it may freeze in your path. Don't dazzle other drivers though. If a deer appears suddenly it's safer to continue on your normal track rather than swerve or brake hard to try to avoid it. Sudden manoeuvres can result in a loss of control and increase the risk of hitting a tree or another vehicle. If you do hit a deer, try to stop somewhere safe. If you can't then do your best to ensure that your accident isn't hit by other vehicles. Report the accident to the police who will contact someone who can help the injured deer. Bear in mind that if you miss the deer (or any other animal), but hit something else, it will be very hard to prove that the deer ever existed.

JACK'S TRACTOR SAFE LOCK WINS AWARD AT THE PLOUGHING

A young Killorglin student who invented Tractor Safe Lock, a device that automatically engages the handbrake in a tractor when the operator leaves the seat, has been awarded the Innovation Arena's People's Choice Award in association with Enterprise Ireland, the National Ploughing Association and the Irish Farmers Journal.

The Co. Kerry based company,

founded by student Jack Nagle (16), is one of 69 companies exhibiting at the 2017 Innovation Arena and entered into this year's awards. The People's Choice Award is voted for by the general public via the Irish Farmers Journal website and app. The number of votes received totalled 3,000 with Tractor Safe Lock receiving over two-thirds (67 per cent) of the overall vote.

The winning device, Tractor Safe Lock, is activated as soon as the operator takes the machine out of gear through a pressure switch on the seat, pushing up the handbrake of the tractor to safely stop the vehicle from rolling.

A visiting group from Belgium led by the Mayor of Ypres were met by the Mayor of Killarney Cllr. Niall Kelleher in Killarney last Thursday afternoon.

The group visited many places in the South of Ireland where monuments were erected in memory of those from this country who took part in World War One (WWI).

It was a trip to see where they came from and to hear some of their history as passed down by families. Also in the group were directors of "In Flanders Fields" WWI Museum which is the largest WWI Museum in the world. They included the President of the Museum Committee. They were addressed at the Killarnev Monument (Celtic Cross 1914-1918) on Killarney's and Kerry's participation in those years by Noel Grimes and Thomas Dillon. "They were very impressed by the site and with the list of names compiled in Killarney's " Book of Rememberance" of WWI", Noel Grimes told the Killarney Outlook. "During their visit they were informed of a direct connection between Killarney and Belgium that goes back to the 1860s when

two Franciscan Friars arrived in Killarney from Belgium and started building The Friary in Killarney, and that the altars and railings of the church were made in Belgium and that the statue of St Joesph on the main altar, is the Patron Saint

of Belgium", Noel added.

"They were eagerly looking forward to visiting the Friary the next morning before they left Killarney very pleased with their visit", Noel concluded.

TRUSTEES OF MUCKROSS HOUSE PURCHASE YEATS PAINTING

The Trustees of Muckross House and the National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) of the Department of Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht, were successful in their bid to purchase a painting by John Butler Yeats, which is of historic significance to Muckross House.

The painting, 'Mrs Herbert of Muckross with a Maltese Terrier' is by John Butler Yeats (JBY). This was the artist's first big commission which he received in 1872 and completed in 1873.

Mrs Herbert is painted, seated, in a richly coloured and patterned gown, with her terrier on her lap. It was painted in front of the wallpaper that is still perfectly preserved in Muckross House.

She was born Emily Julia Charlotte Keane in January 1848 and married Major Henry Arthur Herbert (known as Harry) in October 1866. It is said that, shortly after the painting was completed, Mrs Herbert left Muckross and never returned. Consequently, her husband refused to accept the portrait and it ended up in the room of JBY's friend Edward Dowden, at Trinity College.

Following the death of Dowden, the painting was returned to the Yeats family where it since remained. Emily and Harry were divorced in 1882. She died in 1911. Geraldine Rosney, Chairperson of the Trustees of Muckross House, said that the Trustees were pleased to be in a position to fund the acquisition of the portrait for the benefit of Muckross House and they are happy to welcome it to its rightful place. "It is very important that the collections at Muckross are maintained and enhanced with further additions. The Trustees strive to enrich the visitors' experience of



Muckross House. She added: "The acquisition of such a significant painting is a further example of this commitment on the part of the Board of Trustees. I'd like to thank the Department of Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht

who assisted us in making this purchase and without whose help it would not have been possible." The Trustees are looking forward to unveiling the painting in the very near future.

NEW CAMPAIGN WARNS OF DANGERS OF DRINK DRIVING THE 'MORNING AFTER'

The Road Safety Authority (RSA) and An Garda Síochána have launched a public information campaign to educate drivers about the dangers of driving the morning after drinking alcohol.

The RSA's decision to create a campaign to highlight the dangers of driving the morning after drinking alcohol was prompted by stark statistics from recent research. The RSA analysed An Garda Síochána Forensic Collision Investigation reports for fatal collisions that occurred on Irish roads between 2008 and 2012. Specifically, in relation to alcohol related crashes the morning after the report found that:

11% of the 222 fatal collisions

in which a driver had consumed alcohol, occurred between the hours of 7am and 11am.

RSA's Commenting on the campaign, Minister for Transport, Tourism and Sport, Shane Ross T.D said: "Drivers need to be aware that they may not be safe to drive the morning after a night out, as they may still have alcohol in their system. As such, it is critical that drivers take measures to ensure their safety and the safety of others and this means leaving the car at home and making alternative arrangements for the morning after if they need to get somewhere. The morning after is a danger zone for alcohol related fatal crashes. It's just not worth the

chance if you are still over the legal limit. This campaign by the RSA is an important reminder to anyone who has been out the night before that they may be unfit to drive because they still have alcohol in their system, and may even be over the drink drive limit the following morning."

The new campaign includes two new radio advertisements, aimed at making people aware that they may not be fit to drive the morning after a night out, and will be broadcast on all national and regional radio stations over the next three weeks. It's also being supported by outdoor advertising and social media. As of Thursday 21 October 2017, 112 people have



been killed on Irish roads. This represents a decline of 26 deaths compared to the same date last year. Up to end of July 2017 a total of 5,175 drivers have been arrested on suspicion of driving under the influence of an intoxicant (DUI) compared to 4,513 arrests up to the same period in 2016. This represents a 15% increase in DUI arrests.



An Bord Pleanala has this week upheld the Planning permission granted by Kerry County Council earlier this year to allow the construction of "Liam's Lodge" a new respite centre for children with complex needs, genetic, rare & life limiting disorders in Curragraigue, Blennerville, Co Kerry.

The respite centre will cost over €14m to build and fit out and will create an estimated 117 new jobs locally when it opens. It is anticipated that the facility will be up and running by 2021 and will cater for over 1,000 families a year. It will provide national respite, and palliative care supports for children primarily from the west coast and Munster areas.

The facility, the first of its kind in Ireland, which is being spearheaded by the Saoirse Foundation, will include eight three bed family residential lodges, fourteen two bed residential family lodges, a reception area, four therapy rooms, two sensory rooms, five physiotherapy suites,

three offices with meeting rooms, a playroom, a cafeteria and staff facilities.

Speaking week, this Tony Heffernan the CEO of the Saoirse Foundation the charity behind the Liam's Lodge initiative said: "We are thrilled that planning permission for Liam's Lodge has finally been granted. We are really eager now to get this facility up and running as quickly as we can because we know just much a facility like this is needed. We aim to staff Liam's lodge with loving care givers who will provide the best of care to our special guests allowing Mom and Dad and healthy siblings to take a break, relax and spend some quality time with their family in a guiet, nurturing environment. We have personal experience of the challenges that caring for a seriously ill child with complex needs can pose for the whole family and we know how much this kind of respite care is really needed."

Also speaking today Mary Heffernan said; "In recent years



Tony and I lost both our children Saoirse and Liam to Battens disease when they were just five years old. We understand only too well how families caring for seriously ill children could do with a place to go to recharge their batteries and allow their whole family time to relax and be looked after by people who understand their situation and needs. That's what Liam's Lodge will be. We're now going to go full throttle at fundraising to get this facility up and running as quickly as we can." The good news of the An Bord

Pleanala decision, is the perfect end to a great week for the Heffernan's personally, who just a few days ago, renewed their wedding vows after 16 years of marriage. Speaking today Tony Heffernan said; "Three years ago our son Liam passed away on our 13th wedding anniversary and since then we've been hoping for a "happy" day to mark in the calendar. This news from An Bord Pleanala is the perfect news to cap off a brilliant week."

PAYE MODERNISATION

Revenue has announced that they are planning a major overhaul of the PAYE system and are working towards rolling out a new real time system by 1st January 2019. This real time system will enable Revenue to ensure that employees are receiving their correct cut-offs and credits. To that end the incidences of year end over or under payments for employees should

The main changes to the current system will be:

- Employees will be able to log on to their Revenue account and view the information that employers have submitted for them
- · Payroll software will automatically submit the periodic file to Revenue without the need to physically upload the file on the ROS website.
- · Payroll software will automatically update for changes to P2C files regarding tax credits and cutoff
- The correct treatment of illness benefit will be facilitated in the system
- P60's, P45's, P30's and P35 forms will no longer be required.

Payroll will have to be updated every week or month as the file will be automatically uploaded to Revenue. Therefore in the event of an error in the payroll, the file will have to be corrected and resent to Revenue. Continuous errors or late submissions may cause Revenue interventions

For most businesses that have a good payroll department or bookkeeper the new system will lead to greater efficiencies. However for businesses who do things after the fact, i.e. pay staff first and put the payment through payroll software at a later date the changes may be problematic. Those employers need to plan ahead to ensure that they are ready for the





EDUCATION OUTLOOK

Exciting changes on stream for incoming second level students

Incoming first year students to second level education will spend a few weeks adjusting to a new environment and the major changes associated with the move. Post-primary schools are exam focussed and provide a curriculum with a comprehensive range of subjects and complimentary activities to cater for the rounded development of their students.

First year students are arriving at second level at a time when the Junior Cert is being replaced by the Junior Cycle Profile of Achievement (JCPA). Six new grade descriptors - Distinction, Higher Merit, Merit, Achieved, Partially Achieved and Not Graded – are replacing the old ABC

grades in all subjects between now and 2021. The JCPA will also record, under a separate heading, student achievements in class room based assessments under five descriptors – exceptional, above expectations, in line with expectations, yet to meet expectations and not reported. The JCPA will also be used to record other achievement in areas such as sport and debating.

Students are usually more excited than anxious about moving into second level and adapt seamlessly to the transition. Having enjoyed senior status in primary school, they now start again on the first rung of the ladder as new first years. They arrive into a big school, with a large student population, from the familiar primary school where they were secure and comfortable. They must adjust to a subject specialist teaching system where not only the subject and teacher changes, but where movement to different classrooms is involved.

A significant change is the loss of a single class teacher to which primary school children are accustomed. At second level, students are taught by nine or ten different teachers, each with a different style and personality. Students, who have been in the same class in primary school, often find themselves in different classes in first year. They initially miss the companionship of their close friends and look forward to meeting them at mid-morning break, at lunch time and at extra-curricular activities. While the separation does inevitable cause concern for some students, most of them take it in their stride and enjoy making new friends.

By now, new students will have had an Induction Day when they were given a tour of the facilities and a chance to find their bearings. The rules and timetable were clarified. Many schools also have an excellent mentoring



system where a senior student assists a first year student.

First years quickly come to terms with the demands of secondary education. They adapt to the class period system, the array of new subjects, the formal house exams and the sheer size of population and physical infrastructure. The long busy school day causes fatigue during the initial weeks and students look forward to the home comforts in the evening. Many students have to travel longer distances to school. That means an early start and a late return in the evening. Homework then has to be completed for the following day's classes. The weekend brings welcome respite.

First year is one for developing time management and study skills. The ROCAR system works well in first year. Establish a daily ROUTINE for doing your study at home. ORGANISE your books and materials, your study room and the time you allocate for study. CONCENTRATE when you are studying by removing any distractions such as mobile phone. APPLICATION means devoting two and a half hours per night on the five week nights to your study. REVISION is a vital skill for doing well in exams. Basically, it means regularly going back over material which you have covered earlier in the year.

Parents play a key role in their child's move into second level, which coincides with the teenage years. Accept your child as s/he is, warts and all, not for what you'd like her/him to be. Apply fair, firm and consistent house rules. Be flexible and democratic in allowing your child to express her/his point of view. Provide a secure home environment with plenty of psychological and emotional support. Invest time in your child and be there when you're needed. Let your child know that s/he is loved and valued irrespective of her/his shortcomings. Give your child lots of encouragement and set realistic targets that s/he can reach. Avoid insidious

comparisons with siblings, cousins or neighbours' children. Take interest in your own child's work and praise the effort not just the performance!

On a functional level, provide good study facilities for your child. Check her/his homework diary from time to time to confirm that the allocated work is done. Help out where you can but under no circumstances, should you do your child's homework. Keep the channels of communication with your child open. Dialogue and an occasional expression of interest maintain a good relationship.

Attend the various parental events at the school, such as parent/teacher meetings and information meetings. Most school have a parents association, which organises activities to support the school. Join up, get involved and make a contribution. With the school, the parents and the student working in harmony, transition from Primary to Post-Primary can be very smooth indeed!

On a recent five day-trip to Guatemala, Surgicorps performed more than 100 free surgeries, executive director Linda Esposto said.

WOMAN SPEAKING WELSH IN WALES TOLD TO STOP TALKING 'FOREIGN MUCK'

Elin Jones says she was told to stop speaking "foreign muck" in a shop while talking Welsh to her daughter Elena in Lampeter, mid-Wales recently. FREE SOLAR PANELS TO BE **INSTALLED ON 800K LOW-**INCOME BRITISH HOUSEHOLDS

Over 800,000 low-income houses in England and Wales are to have free solar panels installed on their rooves over the course of the next five vears.

The £160 million initiative, which is being financed by the Dutch firm Maas Capital, is expected to save the residents an average of £240 (€270) on their energy bills every year.

British firm Solarplicity will be partnering with over 40 landlords and social housing representatives in order to properly coordinate the panels' installation; the initiative will create 1,000 new jobs.

This is just one in 2,200 foreign investments that have been made in Great Britain, which has resulted in a record-breaking year of expenditure. 87 of these projects alone were in the renewable energy sector, creating over 3,000 new jobs.

NEW TWIST FOR ILLEGAL DRUG TESTING AT FESTIVAL

In a first for Australia festival-goers at this year's Spilt Milk Music Food and Art Festival which will take place in Canberra on the 25th of November drug users will be allowed to test any illegal drugs they plan on taking.

Pills brought to the testing service will be examined by emergency consultant Dr David Caldicott and a team of chemists from the Australian National University who will then be able to inform the festival-goer of the drug's makeup, an amnesty bin would be provided for people to dispose of drugs they no longer wished to take.

In 2015, six ecstasy-related deaths were reported at Australian music festivals, with recent statistics estimating that approximately four Australians die of an overdose every day. A similar illegal drug testing service exists in the Netherlands since the 1990s.

8-YEAR-OLD DONATED BELOVED **DOLL WITH HEARTWARMING** NOTE TO HELP CHILD AFFECTED BY HURRICANE

After their experience with surviving Hurricane Katrina in 2005, parents E.J. and Melissa Bice were discussing a trip to Houston to help with efforts being made to bring relief to the areas affected by Hurricane Harvey. Their 8-year-old daughter, Lilly Bice, overheard and decided that she too wanted to help.

Lilly went to her room and gathered a bag of her own toys to brighten the day of the children down in Southern Texas. Included in this bag was one of her favourite dolls with a note attached which said "Dear Little Girl, I hope you like my new doll and her things. Take good care of her and have fun. She was a good friend to me and will be an incredible friend to you". The note was then signed with an adorable heart and her name. Along with the note, Lilly also included an adoption paper for the new owner of the doll to fill out. She explained, "I left the name blank because I wanted the little girl to be able to name her".

"She understands more than an 8 year old normally does," explained the proud mom. "She's always been a giving child. She's really into presents and making things for people to make them happy."

PRIMARY SCHOOL RAISED MORE THAN AU\$200,000 THANKS TO CRITICISM FROM POLITICIAN

The pupils at South Australia's Craigburn Primary School initially set a goal of helping three girls in a Developing Country by asking both male and female staff and students to help raise AU\$900 by wearing a dress for sponsorship.

An Australian Conservatives senator publically labelled the "Do it in a Dress" fundraiser "absurd" and "gender morphing" but his criticism backfired and instead gave it enormous publicity.

The money will now go towards helping more than 674 girls in developing countries gain access to an education after making \$201,520 above their goal

A COFFEE SHOP OWNER HAS BANNED CHILDREN FROM HIS PLACE BUT ALLOWS DOGS

Bob Higginson, the owner of a small cafe in town of Brixham, Devon County is standing by his decision to ban children under 12 from entering his establishment, but allow dogs, despite the controversy it has caused in his community and online.

A sign on the door politely requests that patrons with children under the age of 12 find somewhere else to drink their coffee. It may sound harsh, but Higginson says he has a reasonable explanation for it. "Primarily we wanted to create a nice, relaxed atmosphere for our client base, there are nice and expensive artefacts around and we've had things broken by children in the past" he said. According to local legislation, he's within his rights to do so. Reactions to the restrictive policy have ranged from encouragement to outright offense. One local resident has called for a boycott of the cafe, which she deems "discriminatory." The majority, however, don't seem to mind the idea of a little escape from the chaos that often follows with young children but a heated Internet debate is still in progress.

RECYCLING AND REUSING IS **CERTAINLY NOTHING NEW**

The Museum of London's latest display of curious objects, Junk, reveals some ingenious alternative uses and the creative repairs to be found in everything from Roman pots mended with lead, iron wires and adhesive made from tree bark and resin to the 18th century porcelain plates fixed together with great iron staples.

Among the 16th century solutions for the inevitable problem of broken drinking glasses was 'an excellent cement' of wax and aqua vitae and another combination of lime, flour and egg white. 17th century methods included moulding lead or gilt-wire braces to your glass. Decorative 18th century plates show repairs with ugly rivets, a sure sign that people were prepared to tolerate an awkward-looking item if it meant prolonging its life.



Holes in mediaeval pots were filled with molten lead plugs; and early 18th century women's shoes were made entirely from re-used materials - with fabric from 100 years before and all elements worked and tailored to reflect the style of the day.

In 18th and 19th century London, dustmen were similarly busy – sorting and removing anything that could possibly see a profit, including coal dust for making bricks, and, in turn, brick dust made into a cleaning agent for cleaning the doorstep and scouring the pots and pans. Mudlarks of the nineteenth century picked up hemp, cord, bits of metal for recycling from the foreshore - anything they could find that they could sell on for profit. Recycling was endemic because of the poverty of people in the past.

FISHERMAN THOUGHT STORM HAD TAKEN HIS BELOVED DOG'S

A fisherman and his Jack Russell, named Jack, were out at sea on a regular fishing trip off the coast of Victoria, Australia. They had done this many times before, but this time a particularly bad storm overtook his little boat.

The man was unable to prevent his boat from capsizing but was able to hang on to the side, but there was no sign of his dog, which he believed had no doubt fallen overboard into the waves.

The man searched the waves, but to no avail. He was eventually rescued by a water police and ferried to the shore.

There the grief-stricken fisherman waited on a dock for his boat and when the police arrived with his boat, he could hardly believe his eyes. Jack was alive, and had managed to stay in the boat the whole time.

The fisherman was filmed jumping up and down with joy upon realising his dog was alive and then he held his small dog close as he started to cry with relief and thankfulness.

FAMILY HEIRLOOM DRAMATICALLY CHANGED STRUGGLING MAN'S LIFE

When LT from Southern California lost his leg in a car accident, his disability payments barely covered his bills, one night to pass the time he was watching an Antique show on TV when he saw a Navajo Chief's "First Phase" blanket being appraised, LT realized that an old blanket he owned looked very similar to the rare and

valuable cloth. He didn't know much about the blanket other than it had been handed down in his family and that it was "Navajo" but decided to take it to be appraised.

The appraiser agreed that it was Navajo, but was also a very rare Chief's blanket - a Navajo-Ute First Phase Chief's Blanket and he could hardly believe the amazing condition the 150-year-plus blanket was in.

The blanket was sold to an anonymous buyer for \$1.8 million who then gave it to the Detroit Institute of Arts, where it's on display for a few months of the year.

Today, it's estimated that less than 50 of these first-phase blankets, made until roughly 1865, survive.

GENEVA **TOILETS** WERE **BLOCKED BY CASH**

Toilets in Geneva were blocked by €100,000 in high-denomination euro banknotes earlier this year - the first blockage occurred in the vault at UBS bank in Geneva's financial district and a few days later, three nearby bistros were found with 500-euro notes stuffed down the toilets.

Vincent Derouand, from the Geneva prosecutor's office, said that throwing money away is not a crime, nor is blocking a toilet but they wanted to be sure of the origin of the money.

It cost many thousands of Euros to unblock the pipes and an agreement has been reached to compensate the restaurants, which have withdrawn an earlier complaint.

It is unclear who will get the cash which was confiscated during the investigation, if it is found to be lawful.

CHARITY WORKER RESCUED 300 PETS FROM THE VIRGIN **ISLANDS**

Sali Gear, the co-founder of Virginia Beach's Island Dog Rescue, had been working on plans to evacuate all the pets from all three of the U.S. Virgin Islands St. Thomas, St. John and St. Croix after Hurricane Irma devastated the area. To make this happen, she initially aimed to fly 20 animals to the continental U.S. every day for one week, but when Hurricane Maria swirled into the picture, she had to make some drastic changes to her mission.

She offered to fly pet owners' animals off the islands free of charge and gathered pets that had been abandoned or were in shelters, Ms. Gear chartered a private jet to take the animals all at once back to Norfolk, Virginia, where they were taken to Ms Gear's farm or sent into the care of volunteers and rescue groups across the country.



When Jesus healed the sick and raised the dead He said that He did nothing of Himself - He only did what He saw the Father doing, and the words He spoke were not His words rather the Holy Spirit told Him what to say (John 5:16-30). Claiming to be a Christian does not make one to be a Christian - we need to be taught to know and understand the message Jesus brought down from Heaven to guide us so that we may do it. It is not enough to hear the Word but to be a doer of it (James 1:22). When I was saved in 1984 I was shocked to realise that I knew nothing about Scripture or the way I should go. I thought I did because I was religious, but Jesus didn't bring religion to us, He brought relationship. Every day since I was first saved through reading the Bible and being with other people of the same mindset, I grew spiritually and began to see that through my ignorance I was being robbed of the benefits that I should have been enjoying such as prosperity, good health and freedom from fears and anxiety. "My people perish from lack of knowledge" (Hosea 4:6). Now in the beginning like most people I resisted the Word that was being spoken, but when I saw ordinary folk laying hands on sick people (Mark 16:18) and blind eyes and deaf ears opening, cripples walking, and terminally ill patients restored to full health I quickly changed my mind and knew I had found something of great value - and it's for everyone who has an ear to hear!
