

The sense of grief was palpable in the town this week as Killarney said goodbye to an inspirational little girl.

Amy O'Connor passed away in the early hours of Sunday morning after a two year battle with cancer. The daughter of Brendan and Triona and sister of Cian, Amy caught the heart of the nation when she held the Andy Merrigan Cup with Dr. Crokes captain Johnny Buckley when the club won the All Ireland Club final on St. Patrick's Day last year.

On a facebook post two weeks before Amy passed away her Dad Brendan posted a video that was made almost a year ago for a group of inspirational people who made a little girl's dream come true.

Brendan spoke of the tough and emotional couple of years that Amy had been through.

"An unfair fight from the beginning, a fight she never deserved, Amy has been an inspiration to us all." He spoke of what Amy has been through and the terrible pain the she suffered with such grace, beauty and bravery.

He spoke of the fun, laughter and hope Amy gave to everyone and the strength they needed for this journey.

Amy was a player and huge supporter of Dr. Crokes GAA Club and at her removal a signed team jersey adorned a huge teddy that Amy owned.

In a poignant tribute to the club,

Brendan said:

"Somewhere behind the football players you've all become, and the hours of practice you put in, and the coaches and backroom staff who have pushed you, is a little girl who fell in love with the game and never looked back, thank you".

Amy achieved much in her short life, making the journey to Croke Park to cheer on her team, Dr. Crokes on St. Patrick's and help lift the Andy Merrigan cup, she was the official starter of the 2017 Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle and climbed Strickeen Mountain with her family on her dad Brendan's shoulders on a club day out with Dr. Crokes.

Ironically, Amy had donated her hair to the Rapunzel foundation just week's before her diagnosis.

Numerous events, including, walks, cycles and a Stenson's & Stillettos Show were held to raise funds and Amy and her family handed over thousands of euros to the Oncology Unit at Crumlin Children's Hosptial where Amy was a patient. A pupil at Gaelscoil Faithleann, Amy will be missed by her many friends and her loving family.

Amy passed away surrounded by her parents Brendan and Triona and brother Cian at her home in Whitebridge Manor in Killarney. Her removal took place on Tuesday evening and following Requiem Mass on Wednesday morning, Amy was laid to rest in Aghadoe Cemetery.

The loss is immeasurable but so is the love left behind.



n amazing €46,038.80 was presented to Christy Lehane on behalf of the Irish Motor Neurone Disease Association (IMNDA) following events which were held in Killarney and Caherdaniel over Christmas. Those involved gathered at the Torc Hotel in Killarney and Caherdaniel Parish Hall as John O'Donoghue presented Christy Lehane on behalf of the Irish Motor Neurone Disease Association (IMNDA) with an incredible cheque of €46,038.80! John raised this incredible sum by organising a Reindeer Run on the 23rd of December because he was recently diagnosed

with Motor Neurone Disease (MND). John held three fantastic runs in three different locations. There was a 5K, 10K and a half marathon held on the Flaggy Shore in Co. Clare. Alongside this, runs also took place in Caherdaniel and Killarney in Co. Kerry.

"Two years ago if someone would have said to me that I would have raised over €46,000 for the IMNDA, I would have asked them what they did. But when I was diagnosed with MND the IMNDA were there. They offered me counselling and the counsellor was fantastic. They saved my life in a way. They put me on

the right track. I wouldn't have been able to do it on my own," said John.

The IMNDA would just like to extend a heartfelt thanks to everyone for supporting John and the Reindeer Run. Thanks to the hard work and dedication of so many wonderful people, the vital funds raised will go a long way to help those living with MND. MND is a progressive neurological condition that attacks the motor neurones, or nerves, in the brain and spinal cord. This means messages gradually stop reaching muscles, which leads to weakness and wasting. MND can affect how you walk, talk, eat, drink and breathe. However, not all symptoms necessarily happen to everyone and it is unlikely they will all develop at the same time, or in any specific order.

The IMNDA is the only organisation of its kind in this country. It was set up in May 1985 to provide care and support to people with Motor Neurone Disease, their carers, families and friends. MND is often referred to as the 1,000 day disease as most people die within 1,000 days of being diagnosed. There

are currently over 370 people living with MND in Ireland, 13 of which are in Kerry.

The IMNDA provides specialised services for people affected by this debilitating disease such as equipment on loan, financial assistance towards home help, advice and home visits by their 3 MND Nurses. In order to provide these vital services the IMNDA depends heavily on the generosity of the public and supporters of the association who generate over 82% of its income.

Kerry County Council announces details of Community Support Fund

Kerry County Council has announced details of the allocation of €750,000 in funding support for community groups and projects across the county under the Community Support Fund for 2018. A total of 255 groups and projects received grant aid worth €320,000 this year while a proportion of the fund, totalling €430,000, is being retained to leverage funding for strategic projects at Municipal District level and to support projects previously supported by the Town Councils.

The fund, which is in its fourth year, has now supported over 1,250 projects since 2015 to the value of €3m since its establishment. As occurred in 2017, some of the Community Support Fund will be used this year to target strategic projects in the four municipal districts and to co-fund projects which are in receipt of grants from other sources. Councillors in the four Municipal Districts met on Monday to decide on the allocations and unanimously welcomed the provision of support recipeents. Councillors to the congratulated all the community groups and acknowledged the tremendous voluntary work that these groups do. Full details of the allocations in each of the four Municipal Districts are attached.

In 2017, almost €1m was leveraged from other grant sources such as Town and Village Renewal and the Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Fund as a result of the strategic allocation of resources under the Community Support Fund. For 2018, the fund was refocussed to target funding under five categories of support:

Growing and Sustaining Communities

Community Tidy Towns Initiatives and Amenity Projects

Community Sport and Physical **Activity Programmes**

Community Economic Innovation Community Based Tourism, Festivals and Events

The new minimum grant payable in 2018 is €500.

Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr John Sheahan, said: 'Since the Community Support Fund was established in 2015, a very significant sum of €3m has been invested by Kerry County Council in community projects and initiatives



around the county. This is indicative of the council's support for the work being done by community and voluntary organisations all over the county to build vibrant, sustainable communities and the value of that work in Kerry.

'The Community Support Fund has targeted funding towards a very wide range of community-based projects and has provided support to community councils, chamber alliances, tidy towns groups and other organisations in a very progressive and structured way. The retention of part of the fund to help to leverage funding from other sources and to co-fund projects with other funding streams has proven to be an enormous success in recent years and will be successful again, I hope, in 2018.'







ALLIANZ NATIONAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE ROUND 4 GALWAY CLAIM FIRST WIN ON KERRY SOIL IN 17 YEARS

KERRY O'SHEA REPORTS FROM AUSTIN STACK PARK TRALEE WHERE KERRY WERE DEFEATED BY GALWAY

KERRY 0-14 GALWAY 1-14

Galway's footballers recorded their first win over Kerry in 15 years and their first on Kerry soil in 17 years when they consigned Eamonn Fitzmaurice's side to their second loss of the campaign at a bitterly cold Austin stack Park on Sunday afternoon and ensured that Eamonn Fitzmaurice's unwanted record of never having won a home League game in February since he assumed the Kerry post in 2012 continues for another season.

The excited Kerry fans who were in the majority of the 8,000 plus attendance, went home disappointed as Kerry had to give second best to a superbly motivated and well-prepared Galway outfit.

This result means that Kerry will have an uphill battle to retain their league title. Galway, meanwhile, picked up their their fourth win of the campaign and with Monaghan and Dublin to face at home in their remaining three games, they are in a very good position.

Galway's well-organised defence made it extremely difficult for Kerry's forwards to make any sort of breakthrough and much of the play was concentrated around the midfield area.

Galway's match-winner was wing-forward Eamonn Brannigan who scored a terrific solo goal just after half-time when he won possession and soloed unimpeeded through the Kerry defence before hammering the ball past the recalled Brian Kelly in the Kerry goal. Galway can thank their extrovert keeper Ruairi Lavelle too for a double save from David Cliford and Stephen O'Brien deep into stoppage time

which kept their lead intact and ensured the Kingdom went away empty-handed.

Twice in the second half Lavelle was allowed

solo past his own 45 metre line without being challenged by Kerry players. There is a new trend in Gaelic football where goalkeepers leave their own goal and solo up the field but are untouched by the opposing side. We saw it in Inniskeen last week with Monaghan's Rory Beggan and again last Sunday with Ruairi Lavelle, who was lucky he wasn't blackcarded at a vital juncture deep into stoppage time.

Galway's ace freetaker Barry McHugh, turned in an impeccable performance, finishing with a tally of 0-8, including five frees and two

sweetly-struck 45's.

Kevin Walsh's side, playing with the aid of the strong wind, eased into a 0-5 to 0-1 lead by the 14th minute thanks to scores from McHugh (2), Patrick Sweeney (2) and Eamonn Brannigan, Kerry's opening score coming from Seanie O'Shea in the 6th minute.

Paul Murphy landed Kerry's second point in the 15th minute and Seanie O'Shea followed with his second before Barry McHugh replied for Galway. David Clifford, who was playing his best game since joining the senior setup even though he was again the subject of some unair jostling, from a free and McHugh swapped frees before Clifford and Shane Walsh exchanged scores to leave it 0-9 to 0-5 to Galway at half-time.

Barry McHugh opened Galway's account in the second half before Kerry, with the breeze to their backs for the second-half hit back with scores from David Cliford and Seanie O'Shea. Brannigan then struck for Galway's suckerpunch of a goal to place the Tribesmen in a 40 minutes gone on the stopwatch. Kerry responded and four points in a row from Peter Crowley, sub Tom O'Sullivan, David Clifford and Stephen O'Brien cut the gap to two, 1-10 to 0-11 after 57 minutes. Having already lost defender

very strong position at 1-10 to 0-7 with

Cathal Sweeney to a black card in the 8th minute of the first half, Galway lost defenders Sean Andy O'Ceallaigh and Johnny Heaney to black cards following a skirmish but Kerry failed to capitalise. The westerners responded with a pair of points from the outstanding Barry McHugh (2) to lift the siege emphatically. Brannigan added his third of the game put Galway 1-14 to 0-12 clear before David Clifford and Daithi Casey added points for the Kingdom. With one minute of added time still to

be played, Kerry surged forward only for David Clifford and Stephen O'Brien to see goalbound efforts saved by Ruairi Lavelle. That was that as Galway headed back West celebrating a famous win on Kerry soil.

Kerry head to Dublin next Saturday evening to face the Metropolitans in Croke Park weather permitting, while Galway entertain Monagahan in Pearse Stadium on Sunday afternoon.



forced to give up Chloe: her beloved canine companion.

When the girl was 14 years old, her father began a job outside the home and since Chloe was suddenly alone for long periods, she would bark all day long. The Grimes family were forced to consider the neighbours' complaints about the young noisy pup, and had to give her up for adoption at a local shelter.

"I felt like I won the lottery," Nicole said. "I never thought I'd see her again."

Now, the little family will be giving Chloe all the love and kisses that Nicole missed out on since she was a young girl.

THE WORLD'S OLDEST GRAPE-PRODUCING VINE HAS ITS OWN ANTHEM

A grape vine in Maribor, Slovenia, clings to the outside of a building in the city centre. When in season, Žametovka grapes dangle from the plant like ornaments.

The Vine is officially classed as the oldest grapeproducing vine in the world. It was planted more than 400 years ago to make wine when the Turks invaded the city. Centuries later, it's a beloved resident of Maribor and even has its own anthem, which many locals will proudly sing, glass of wine in hand.

Though the building it stretches across was once a wall that shielded the city from invaders, the vine escaped from many siege attempts intact. It somehow managed to thrive despite the fires that blazed within the wooden structures that once surrounded the space and later endured a parasite that plagued nearby vines in the 19th century and outlasted the Allied bombing that destroyed nearby buildings during World War II.

Now, the vine wraps around the outside of its very own museum. After admiring the old plant from the outside, you can enter its resident building to learn about the city's wine heritage and sample some drinks in the wine tasting room. There's also an annual festival to celebrate the vine's ceremonial grape harvest, which yields upwards of 120 pounds of fruit. Only 100 bottles of wine are produced from its grapes each year.

EMPLOYER END OF YEAR RETURN (P35)

You must make an end of year return for every person employed at any time during the year. End of year returns must be submitted even if no tax or Universal Social Charge (USC) was deducted from an employee.

If you are registered for Revenue Online Service (ROS) you can file your P35 return electronically.

Form P35 - This is your annual declaration and certificate for Pay As You Earn (PAYE), Pay Related Social Insurance (PRSI), Universal Social Charge (USC) and Local Property Tax (LPT) for each employee.

Form P35L - This is the form on which you record PAYE, PRSI, USC and LPT details for each employee.

P35L/T - This is the form on which you record PAYE, PRSI and USC details for any employee who does not have a Personal Public Service Number (PPSN). Form P35LF - This is the form you use to record taxable benefits.

The deadline for filing your P35 return is 23 February if you file online using ROS.

A P60 template is available on the ROS online and offline application, and through Payroll Software providers. You should not give a P60 to an employee who was not in employment on 31 December.

If an employee was in employment and ceased that employment on 31 December you should give them a form P45 and a form P60.



FOCUS ON ROSES

Every garden should leave a space for roses. The colour and scent will provide plenty of interest in your garden from early summer to late autumn. There are a lot of different classes of roses to choose from but most of the time it is the hybrid tea or floribunda roses that are usually used. A hybrid tea rose produces the showiest blooms of all roses. There is a huge range of hybrid team roses to choose from so take your time as not all hybrid tea roses are as good as each other. For example some blooms are affected by wet weather and some can be more vigorous than others so if you are going to have a mixed rose bed make sure that they are all going to grow to about the same size.

Floribunda roses: There are lots of good reasons to plant a floribunda rose even though the blooms lack the size and fragrance of the hybrid rose. The advantages of the floribundas would be the continuity of its flowering. Most floribunda roses will flower from early summer till late autumn and the flowers usually provide a much larger splash of colour than the hybrid tea rose.

Planting roses: When planting a rose, the most important thing to do is prepare the soil well as all roses are very hungry plants. Incorporate a lot of well rotted farm yard manure "horse manure" if possible before planting. When your roses are planted make sure you firm them in well with your heel as this will avoid any root disturbance later.

Pruning your roses: In early spring, cut out any old wood and any stems which are damaged. The pruned surface should be white if it is brown, prune back futher. Remove any stems which rub against another so you will end up with an open centre. You can now prune about a third of the stems that are left. In the autumn you can remove dead flowers and tidy up the rose. Make sure to feed your roses throughout the growing season. Next week I will focus on Confers.

Last week we highlighted our tendency to be self-critical and extremely hard on ourselves. Self-acceptance on the other hand means accepting ourselves just as we are whilst acknowledging that there is always room for improvement. This can be very difficult however and requires a change in how we view and what we tell ourselves. By developing a 'self-accepting' voice we focus on validating ourselves rather than paying heed to the automatic negative thoughts. Instead of listening to the thought that says 'I'm not good enough' or 'I'll never get it right' we validate ourselves (much as a parent might a child) saying something like 'I know your feeling useless right now. It's Ok. This is challenging and difficult and frustrating. But you are capable. How about taking a break and coming back to it later" Despite the feelings of guilt, self-criticism and negative put downs, we can start by telling ourselves, that we've done the best we could do.

We need to look at what is it within ourselves that we don't accept – and begin to bring more compassion and understanding to those aspects of ourselves. Perhaps there is a part of us that we are rejecting based on the internal programming (and not the actual reality) that we received as a child. Sometimes our lack of self-acceptance is due to our unwillingness to feel or experience uncomfortable emotions. At other times unrealistic expectations can lead to lack of self-acceptance. When we are unable to forgive ourselves for our 'humanness' then it is very difficult to develop self-acceptance.

Practicing mindfulness can be a great way to begin to become aware of the negative, self-judging thoughts we continuously tell ourselves. It becomes like watching a movie – where you are having these thoughts but these thoughts are not who you are.

Self-acceptance isn't about fixing anything in ourselves. Instead it is affirming who we are (warts and all) at this point in time. It's not that we ignore our faults or weaknesses – we just view them as not relevant to our overall sense of acceptability. We accept ourselves today, just as we are, regardless of our shortcomings. Whilst we can commit to make changes in the future that will enrich our lives - it's about being Okay right now. The only thing we need to change at this moment in time is the way we view ourselves.
