

Open Day at Clonakilty Agricultural College



The spring education open day is set to take place in Clonakilty Agricultural College on Friday, 8th March,

This past September has seen the revised education programme for Level 5/6 courses implemented in Clonakilty Agricultural College based in Darrara just outside the town of Clonakilty. For students attending these courses there is a greater emphasis on farm safety, grassland management and sustainability.

People coming to see the college and what's on offer will be brought through the different programmes that lead to qualifications from Level 5 up to Level 8. For students starting at Level 5 next September, there are a couple of changes to the programme which should help with the learning experience. In 1st year, students will go on short 4-week placement early in the course, in October, and return to that farm again in the following spring. During their time in the college between

September and May they'll get the foundation training in areas of livestock husbandry, grassland management, farm business and more specific training in areas such as pesticide application.

In 2nd year which starts the following September the course specialises in either Drystock (Cattle and Sheep) or the longer-established Dairy Herd Management course. Both courses would have longer periods of on-farm training incorporating the calving/lambing periods on farms but also the breeding season on cattle and dairy farms

Graduates of Clonakilty's Level 6 programme have many routes of progression after the two years with us. The Level 6 in its own right is required for applying for jobs with the Department of Agriculture. By 2020 there will be an apprenticeship route in place with a Level 7 qualification. This will be an important extension to the current programmes as there is an ever-increasing demand from farmers in the region to have enthusiastic, forward-thinking young people looking to manage the farms of the next decade. In this respect it is one area of the rural economy where it is a sellers' market.

The higher education routes still exist and continue to expand with graduates of Darrara able to gain "advanced entry" to degree courses in agriculture in all of the Institutes of Technology in Munster; including Cork, Tralee and Waterford.

For people who have a non-agricultural qualification there is the option of gaining a Teagasc Green Cert (the Specific Purpose Certificate in Farming) through a part-time route. The Open Day starts at 11am on the morning of March 8th and all are welcome to explore their options in agricultural education and job prospects that can arise from coming to Darrara in 2019.

bar will be the venue each wek and we will announce the details across our social media platforms. Draws will generally take place on Sunday evenings and will be shown live on Facebook.




The Garden Restaurant is a popular and busy diner and Kerry Hospice Killarney Branch members

First years learn life saving skills

First responder and Killarney Community College Spanish teacher Edwina Duggan along with fellow teacher Ms O' Sullivan recently attended the 'CPR 4 schools' course and received a kit with 10 manikins from Irish Heart Foundation. Local Killarney man and fellow first responder Leo O' Connor came to the school last week and worked with a group of first years lucky enough to learn many important first aid skills that may some day save the life of someone they know.

Ms. Duggan stated that "our students learned an incredible life skill today. Hopefully they will never have to use these techniques. The availability and accessibility of our own manikins provides a huge advantage in upskilling our students with these life saving skill"

Mr. O Connor showed the group the basic technique involved in administrating CPR effectively which the students practised on the schools newly acquired manikins. Mr O Connor also enlightened them about the importance of using

an EIRCODE when contacting the emergancy services and knowing where the schools debif was situated as well as the locations of the towns closest devices. Students were delighted to receive a certificate which was presented by the towns first responder at the end of the work shop. The College hope to train every student and teacher in the administration of CPR in the school by the end of the year.







Micheal to take the wheel in Rally of the Lakes







DRIVING & VISION

It is important that you can see clearly to be able to drive safely. Conditions that may affect your visual field and driving include strokes and brain tumours, as well as eye conditions such as diabetic retinopathy and glaucoma (if you have them in both eyes).

Make sure you have regular sight tests and if your optometrist tells you that you must not drive, you must stop all driving immediately. Driving when you are medically unfit to do so is a criminal offence, and you may be prosecuted if you are involved in an accident.

Driving glasses

If you have been advised to wear glasses for driving, make sure you wear them, even for short trips and keep a spare pair in the car. Choose glasses with thinner sides for driving as they won't block your side vision as much as thicker ones. If you wear contact lenses, keep a pair of glasses in the car in case you need to take your lenses out. Even if you don't need to wear glasses all the time, you will probably find they are particularly helpful when the lighting is poor, and for driving at night. Headlights of oncoming traffic can be dazzling when you are driving at night or in poor weather conditions. Special driving lenses designed with a specially-developed glare filter and a contrast-enhancing filter can help reduce reflections and uncomfortable glare from oncoming traffic.

If glare is an ongoing problem for you, make sure your windscreen and headlights are thoroughly cleaned and free from grime and dirt. If you wear glasses, and don't forget to keep them clean too. If you find that problems with glare at night persist, make an appointment to have a sight test. Sunshine can be dazzling too, particularly when the sun is low in the sky. If you wear glasses, you may find it helpful to have a pair of



Annual Congress

A motion giving the GAA Central Council the power to open up county grounds to non-GAA sports was passed overwhelmingly at Congress in Wexford last weekend with 91 per cent of delegates backing it. Another significant motion that was passed will see representatives from the Ladies Gaelic Football and Camogie Associations become non-voting members of the GAA's management committee. Other motions passed means U-20 footballers on senior inter-county panels will now also be able to play for their county U-20 team after their senior inter-county team exits the championship, while the All-Ireland SFC Qualifiers, All-Ireland SHC preliminary quarterfinals, and Joe McDonagh matches are now all 'winner on the day' fixtures. Two of the most significant motions to be defeated included the Donegal motion which sought to prevent teams naming Croke Park as their home venue for All-Ireland SFC quarter-finals as well as Valentia's motion that Rule 6.17 be amended by the addition of the following paragraph to "Adult Age" qualification sentence: "A County may have a Bye Law whereby a player who shall have celebrated his 16th birthday prior to January 1st of the championship year may play non-championship games with his club where such club is graded as Junior Championship status with one adult team".

GAA President, John Horan announced at congress that he intends to set up a working group to research how best to structure a Tier Two All-Ireland Senior Football Championship. Their findings will then likely be presented at a Special Congress later this year. President Horan

believes the competitive nature of the Allianz Leagues is something that can be replicated by a two-tier Championship. In his address he said "the reality is that for many counties the Allianz Leagues represent their best chance at success and progress, the reason for this is that teams are competing on a more even footing than they do later in the season. The Championship is a different matter where a handful of strong teams are dominant. There is now a growing sense that the competitiveness of the leagues needs to be replicated in the Championship. What is now required is a proper, thorough investigation into how any proposed Tier 2 Championship would work and it requires the input of all stakeholders among the counties it would be designed to benefit. This needs to be a competition of status, represented as such by its place in the calendar and the playing of its final at Croke Park".

IT was a tough road trip for Scotts Lakers who were outgunned by league leaders DBS Eanna in Dublin last Saturday night. Despite enjoying a ten point advantage at one stage in the first half, the Lakers suffered another disastrous third quarter performance just like the recent loss to Dublin Lions. Eanna completely took over this game in a dominant third quarter scoring 33 points to Lakers 14 point return. HEALTH EXPENSES

You can claim relief on the cost of health expenses. These can be your own health expenses, those of a family member or any individual's, as long as you paid for them. You cannot claim relief for any amounts that you have already received, or will receive from:

- · any policy of insurance
- a public or local authority, for example, the Health Service Executive (HSE)
- any other source, such as a compensation payment.

You generally receive tax relief for health expenses at your standard rate of tax (20%). Nursing home expenses are given at your highest rate of tax (up to 40%).

How do you claim health expenses?

You can claim relief on health expenses after the year has ended. You should wait for your P60 statement to arrive before claiming. You must also wait for the P60 statement from your spouse or civil partner if you are jointly assessed.

You can only claim for expenses that you have receipts for. You can claim relief on the last four year's health expenses.

How to claim if you are a PAYE taxpayer

The quickest and easiest way is using our online service myAccount to complete a Form 12. You can do this by following these steps:

- sign into myAccount
- click on 'Review your tax' link in PAYE Services
- select the Form 12 for the year you wish to claim for
- in the 'Tax Credits & Reliefs' page select 'Health Expenses' and add it as a tax credit. If you are jointly assessed, it is the assessable spouse or nominated civil partner who needs to apply.

How to claim if you are self-assessed

You can complete the health expenses section on your annual Form 11.

DID YOU KNOW?

That in 2018 Irish Coast Guard volunteer units conducted over 1,100 missions and saved more than 400 lives? The service is responsible for handling maritime emergencies and is called to reports of people in the water, falls on coastal areas as well as other incidents.

The three rescue co-ordination centres managed 2,650 incidents last year. The helicopter services flew in excess of 670 missions including 119 on behalf of the HSE, more than 100 medical missions from the islands to the mainland and eight long range medical evacuations. Coast Guard vehicles are often used by volunteers who are assisting with these medical missions.

'GHOST APPLES' IN A MICHIGAN ORCHARD



On Wednesday, February 6th icy conditions in Michigan created a strange phenomenon when freezing rain coated some apples in ice and 'ghost apples" were left hanging from tree branches, completely devoid of the fruit's

typical peel or core.

The freezing rain coated the apples, creating a solid, icy shell around them. But because apples have a lower freezing point than water, it was warm enough that the rotting apple inside turned to mush which slipped out of the bottom of the ice casing leaving ice perfectly shaped like the fruit, hanging from the branches of the apple trees.

Freezing rain will turn anything it touches into a glaze of pure ice according to a meteorologist. The orchard is located in the Fruit Ridge area of Kent County, Michigan, the ridge is a topographical land feature located northwest of Grand Rapids, and is considered to be an agricultural Mecca. The area supplies 60% of Michigan's apples.

AUSTRALIAN RODENT MARKS FIRST HUMAN INDUCED CLIMATE CHANGE EXTINCTION, SCIENTISTS SAY

An Australian rodent that lived near the Great Barrier Reef has been officially declared extinct,

making it the first known mammal killed off by climate change caused by humans, according to researchers.

The Bramble Cay Melomys, a rat-like rodent known to have lived on a small northern island at the edge of the Torres Strait Islands in Queensland, was relocated from the government's "endangered" list to its "extinct" list, the Australian Department of the Environment and Energy announced recently. Researchers, in a 2016 report released on the animal, said they confirmed that Melomys on Bramble Cay were extinct after a "survey in March 2014 failed to detect the species." Fishermen who visited the area suggested to scientists that the last known sighting of the animal was in late 2009.

The main factor responsible in the mammal's extinction "was almost certainly ocean inundation of the low-lying cay, very likely on multiple occasions, during the last decade, causing dramatic habitat loss and perhaps also direct mortality of individuals," researchers said. The "fastest rates of sea level rise" in Australia are in the north, where Bramble Cay is located, according to the government's Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority. Officials said that because land around the reef is low-lying, "small changes in sea level will mean greater erosion and land inundation."

The Torres Strait region where Bramble Cay is located has seen "extreme high water levels and damaging storm surges and these weather events are the "root cause" of the extinction of the Bramble Cay Melomys, which "points to human-induced climate change," scientists said.

AMATEUR CYCLIST COMPLETED THE TOUGHEST STAGE OF TOUR DE FRANCE WITHOUT A SEAT ON HIS BIKE

52-year-old Englishman, Rob Holden from Teddington, Surrey on a carbon-fibre road bike managed to climb roughly 13 miles (21.5 kilometres) up Mont Ventoux – the notorious stage in the world's most famous cycling race – in an impressive two hours, despite not being able to sit down the entire way.

"There's debate in the cycling community as to whether it's better to sit or to stand when cycling uphill," Mr. Holden said. "I had the conversation with my friends and we couldn't settle on an answer, so we decided to test it out", and take on the challenge in order to raise money for several prostate cancer charities.

The original plan was for Rob to cycle down again, because freewheeling all the way down is the fun bit, but he was so tired that he didn't want to said his two friends and fellow cyclists Matt Winstone and filmmaker lan Laurie. "It was a lovely day at the bottom – around 25 degrees Celsius, but at the top it was only about seven degrees. It was really cold and I was absolutely drained. It was definitely the toughest challenge I've ever done Mr. Holden told journalists.

Whilst we may often think of grief resulting from the death of a loved one, any loss can cause grief. These losses may include divorce or the break up of a relationship, a miscarriage, loss of a pet, loss of our health, a job, a cherished dream, a friendship, financial security, or selling the family

Grieving is a highly individual and personal experience and the way in which we grieve can depend on many different elements. These include our personality, our life experiences, our faith, the nature of the loss, our resilience and coping style. Grief can be like a roller coaster - with ups and downs. Powerful feelings can come unexpectedly some more intense and longer lasting than others. Feelings can range from shock and disbelief, to guilt, sadness, anger, fear and frustration. Physical symptoms are also common such as weight loss/gain, insomnia, fatigue, nausea, aches and pains. Forgetfulness and poor concentration are also symptoms of grief. All of these feelings are perfectly normal and there is no right or wrong way to feel. Sometimes people can feel guilty about their anger - but it is okay to

It is important not to go through this alone and to talk and share your feelings. This may be with family and friends or you may prefer the support of a counsellor. Counselling can offer the space and time to talk through your feelings and overcome obstacles to your grieving. Allowing yourself time to experience your feelings is very important even if, at times, they are difficult. For many people their faith, prayer, meditation or going to church can be a great solace in times of loss. Support groups where you can share your sorrow with others who have experienced similar losses can be also be of tremendous help.

It is vitally important that you take care of yourself when you are grieving. You are coming to terms with a major upheaval in your life so give yourself permission to take things a bit easier. Your energy may be low, so do not place too many demands on yourself and make sure you get enough rest and sleep. It is important to look after your physical health by eating healthily and getting some exercise each day. Don't rush things and put off making major decisions such as moving home or changing jobs for at least six months to a year.

Jesus rose from the dead and defeated death on our behalf because we could never overcome the devil by ourselves (Hebrews 2:14-15).
