
ST. BRENDAN'S VIE FOR ALL IRELAND TITLE

The buses are booked, the kit bags are packed and the adrenaline is flowing in anticipation of tomorrow's Hogan Cup final in Croke Park in which St. Brendan's College Killarney are hoping to bridge a 24 year gap by winning the prestigious trophy.

Under the watchful eye of trainers Gary McGrath and Arthur Fitzgerald the squad have put in huge work to get to the ultimate stage of the competition. "This is a culmination of five years of hard work by the squad" Hugh Rudden from St. Brendan's told the Killarney Outlook.

"They have a tough task ahead but have been playing fantastic football all season", he added. St. Brendan's last won the Hogan Cup in 1992 and reached the final in both 2008 and 2010. "A lot of this years squad reached the All Ireland Under 16.5 final last year so it would be fantastic if they went all the way this year", he said.



ELECTRONIC PASSPORT NOW A REQUIREMENT FOR US TRAVEL

The Irish Travel Agents Association (ITAA) is reminding all Irish passport holders that a valid electronic passport is required if they wish to visit America under the Visa Waiver Program (VWP). As of this Friday, 1st April, all Irish people who are able to travel to the US via the VWP need this type of passport.

The Visa Waiver Program (VWP) enables Irish citizens to travel to the US for tourism or business for stays of 90 days or less without first obtaining a visa. Travellers must have a valid Electronic System for Travel Authorization (ESTA) approval prior to travel. Any traveller who does not have a valid electronic passport is still eligible to travel to the United States with a valid non-immigrant visa issued by a US embassy or consulate but will be required to appear for an interview and obtain a visa in their passports at a U.S. embassy or consulate before travelling.

What Gardasil is and what it is used for ?
 Gardasil is a vaccine. Vaccination with Gardasil is intended to protect against diseases caused by Human Papilloma virus (HPV) types 6, 11, 16, and 18.

These diseases include pre-cancerous lesions of the female genitals (cervix, vulva, and vagina); pre-cancerous lesions of the anus and genital warts in males and females; cervical and anal cancers. HPV types 16 and 18 are responsible for approximately 70% of cervical cancer cases, 75-80% of anal cancer cases; 70% of HPV-related pre-cancerous lesions of the vulva and vagina, 75% of HPV related precancerous lesions of the anus. HPV types 6 and 11 are responsible for approximately 90% of genital wart cases.

Gardasil is intended to prevent these diseases. The vaccine is not used to treat HPV related diseases. Gardasil does not have any effect in individuals who already have a persistent infection or disease associated with any of the HPV types in the vaccine.

However, in individuals who are already infected with one or more of the vaccine HPV types, Gardasil can still protect against diseases associated with the other HPV types in the vaccine.

Gardasil cannot cause the diseases it protects against.

Gardasil produces type-specific antibodies and has been shown in clinical trials to prevent HPV 6-, 11-, 16-, and 18-related diseases in women 16-45 years of age and in men 16-26 years of age. The vaccine also produces type-specific antibodies in 9- to 15-year-old children and adolescents.

What you need to know before you receive Gardasil Do not receive Gardasil if:

- You or your child is allergic (hypersensitive) to any of the active substances or any of the other ingredients of Gardasil (listed under "other ingredients" - see section 6).
- You or your child developed an allergic reaction after receiving a dose of Gardasil.
- You or your child suffer from an illness with high fever. However, a mild fever or upper respiratory infection (for example cold) itself is not a reason to delay vaccination.

Warnings and precautions

- Talk to your doctor, pharmacist or nurse before vaccination if you or your child
- Has a bleeding disorder (a disease that makes you bleed more than normal), for example haemophilia
- Has a weakened immune system, for example due to a genetic defect, HIV infection or medicines that affect the immune system.

Fainting, sometimes accompanied by falling, can occur (mostly in adolescents) following any needle injection. Therefore tell the doctor or nurse if you fainted with a previous injection.

As with any vaccine, Gardasil may not fully protect 100% of those who get the vaccine.

Gardasil will not protect against every type of Human Papillomavirus. Therefore appropriate precautions against sexually transmitted disease should continue to be used.

Gardasil will not protect against other diseases that are not caused by Human Papillomavirus.

Vaccination is not a substitute for routine cervical screening. You should continue to follow your doctor's advice on cervical smear/Pap tests and preventative and protective measures.

What other important information should you or your child know about Gardasil?

The duration of protection is currently unknown. Longer term follow-up studies are on-going to determine whether a booster dose is needed.

POSSIBLE SIDE EFFECTS



Like all vaccines and medicines, Gardasil can cause side effects, although not everybody gets them.

The following side effects can be seen after the use of Gardasil:

Very commonly (more than 1 in 10 patients), side effects found at the injection site include: pain, swelling and redness. Headache was also seen.

Commonly (more than 1 in 100 patients), side effects found at the injection site include: bruising, itching, pain in extremity. Fever and nausea have also been reported.

Rarely (less than 1 in 1000 patients): hives (urticaria). Very rarely (less than 1 in 10,000 patients), difficulty breathing (bronchospasm) has been reported.

When Gardasil was given with a combined diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis [acellular, component] and poliomyelitis [inactivated] booster vaccine during the same visit, there was more headache and injection-site swelling.

Side effects that have been reported during marketed use include:

Fainting, sometimes accompanied by shaking or stiffening, has been reported. Although fainting episodes are uncommon, patients should be observed for 15 minutes after they receive HPV vaccine.

Allergic reactions that may include difficulty breathing, wheezing (bronchospasm), hives and rash have been reported. Some of these reactions have been severe.

As with other vaccines, side effects that have been reported during general use include: swollen glands (neck, armpit, or groin); muscle weakness, abnormal sensations, tingling in the arms, legs and upper body, or confusion (Guillain-Barré Syndrome, Acute disseminated encephalomyelitis); dizziness, vomiting, joint pain, aching muscles, unusual tiredness or weakness, chills, generally feeling unwell, bleeding or bruising more easily than normal and skin infection at the injection site.

to continue their education and training by paying college fees as well as travel and subsistence allowances. To date the project has helped students to obtain training in Childcare, Computing, Journalism and Social Work which is a major boost to their families in their dream of obtaining a job to ease the financial burden on their families.

Last year a 35 year old man Charles, who is visually impaired, living in the slum, with no means of an income was supported to attend a special school for the blind for the next two years hopefully to give him some skills to enable him to live independently and gain some employment.

The project continues to support sporting activities in the school and village by providing playing gear, footballs and training equipment

A retired Killarney teacher who has dedicated much of his life to the Kenya Education Project will hold a table quiz next Thursday night, April 7th in the Castlerosse hotel at 8.30 pm.

Eddie Sheehy from Fossa founded the project which helps young people in a poor slum village of Embulbul, Nairobi. At present 50 young people are sponsored to complete their secondary education as their own family circumstances make it very difficult to meet the cost of books uniform and fees.

Some past pupils of the school are also helped

The official launch to the Cartell.ie International Rally of the Lakes took place on Easter bank holiday Monday at Scotts Hotel Killarney. The crews will arrive back to the finishing ramp at the Rally Head Quarters - The Gleneagle Hotel at 17.45 for Celebrations and Champagne.



KERRY HOUSE PRICES RISE

The price of the average three-bed semi detached house in Kerry has increased by 3.11% to €182,500 in the last three months, a nationwide property survey has found.

The REA Average House Price Survey concentrates on the sale price of Ireland's typical stock home, the three-bed semi, giving

an up-to-date picture of the property market in towns and cities countrywide to the end of Q1 this week.

The average house in Kerry now takes five weeks to sell, down from eight weeks last year. According to Donal Culloty from REA Coyne & Culloty in Killarney, the market is quite slow in

the town due to a lack of supply.

"Lack of supply of suitable housing is the paramount issue nationwide, and while we have had rises in many areas, they are primarily driven by buyer competition for the lowest supply we have seen in years."

CHANNEL SWIM BECKONS FOR EILISH

A young woman from Ballydesmond whose father underwent a kidney transplant last year, thanks to his donor sister, plans to swim the English Channel in a 4 person relay team on the 9th July. The amateur swimmers who met through an initiative by RED FM to do the Lee swim in Cork four years ago have committed to undertake this challenge to raise funds for the Irish Kidney Association and the Marymount Hospice in Cork. They call themselves the Myrtle Turtles, and have set up a Facebook page to raise awareness and encourage donations for charity. The captain of the team Anne Sheehy from Ballinlough who celebrates a big birthday this year and is doing the swim in support of the Marymount Hospice where her late sister-in-law Mel passed away two years ago. Eilish Leader, a 30 year old public health nurse from Ballydesmond, Cork will be fundraising for the Irish Kidney Association and hopes that through this challenge she will help raise awareness about the importance of organ donation.

Supporting their two friends and taking part in the 40km distance relay are Caitriona Kehily from Newcestown, Bandon and Eoin Lowry from Glanmire.

Eilish's father Pdraig Leader has suffered kidney failure as a consequence of a rare auto immune disease called pachymeningitis which he has endured for most of his adult life. Since he underwent a life changing kidney transplant thanks to his donor sister Maura, who also lives in Ballydesmond, he has been enjoying renewed health. She recalls her father, an engineer officer with ESB, being unwell for most of her childhood and him being particularly sick when she, the oldest of 4 children, was studying for her Junior Cert. Eilish said "the kidney transplant has made a huge difference to his quality of life as he is no longer tied to dialysis treatment which he was undergoing for almost 3 years".

"My father was the perfect patient, he never complained and always maintained a positive outlook. However, dialysis was a challenge

for him complicated by sight loss in one eye, and he tried three different types of dialysis treatment options. The hospital dialysis which he underwent for three months was particularly difficult for him as he had to face a long journey to Cork University Hospital four times a week sharing a bus taxi with other patients which left him exhausted by the time he returned home almost ten hours later. My mother Mary has been a huge support to him all along and was trained to help him undergo a form of home haemodialysis. Our house was like a hospital taken over by the dialysis equipment and storage of frequent deliveries of supplies for his treatment. My aunt Maura was a very willing donor wanting to bring a better quality of life not just for my father but my mother also. The process of her becoming a donor was very swift taking not more than two months from the time she started to be screened for suitability which involved rigorous medical and psychological assessment. The transplant took place in Beaumont Hospital last July. They both had returned home within a week of the successful transplant taking place. At the time of the transplant, both of our families availed of free accommodation at the Irish Kidney Association's Renal Support Centre located on the grounds of Beaumont Hospital. This is an amazing facility which is funded through voluntary donations. I would encourage everyone to carry a donor card and have the discussion about organ donation with their loved ones. My father was fortunate to that my aunt Maura was a suitable donor and we will be forever grateful to her for her selflessness and giving him renewed life. There are many people in organ failure who are entirely dependent on the goodwill of the public to donate. Organ donation transforms the lives of the transplant recipients as well as their family members." Eilish can be contacted on **087 9669993**.

UNDERSTANDING FOOD ALLERGY - PART TWO

Dr. Conlon explained that the diagnosis of food allergy uses the clinical history to guide the selection of tests to identify immune system sensitisation to foods. These sensitisation tests include skin prick tests and laboratory assessment of immunoglobulin-e (IgE) immediate antibodies produced by the immune system in response to foods. Sensitisation testing supports the clinical diagnosis and aids the clinician in making a decision about whether it is necessary to progress to a 'real' allergy test such as a food or medication challenge. A challenge test involves exposing the patient to the suspected food and assessing the clinical response in a specialist controlled setting.

tests for food intolerance. Whilst many local healthcare practitioners advocate food specific IgG testing, supportive evidence is lacking. Food specific IgG is part of the normal physiological response and is not disease defining. Other approaches including kinesiology, vega testing, hair analysis and leucocytotoxic testing lack both biological plausibility and an evidence base.

"This does not mean that dietary modification in food intolerance is incorrect. It must, however, be based on a careful assessment of diet and response to specific or non-specific exclusion diets in the correct clinical setting," said Dr. Conlon.

"Despite being time and resource intensive challenge testing is the gold standard in allergy diagnostics. For most healthcare professionals 'screening' for allergies is unwise and can cause harm," said Dr. Conlon.



Know Your Rights:

BEREAVEMENT AT WORK

QUESTION

My father has had a stroke and is critically ill. The doctors say that he has very little time left. Am I entitled to leave from work to be with him?

ANSWER

If you have a family crisis, the Parental Leave Acts 1998 and 2006 give an employee a limited right to leave from work. This is known as force majeure leave. You can take force majeure leave where, for urgent family reasons, your immediate presence is necessary because a close family member is ill or has been injured.

The definition of a close family member includes a child or adopted child, a spouse or partner and a parent or grandparent.

The maximum amount of leave is three days in any 12-month period or five days in a 36-month period. You are entitled to be paid while you are on force majeure leave. Your employer may grant you further leave.

However force majeure leave does not give any entitlement to leave following the death of a close family member. If your father dies following his illness, you don't have a statutory right to leave after his death. You may be entitled to compassionate leave under your contract of employment or custom and practice in your workplace. Alternatively, you may be given some bereavement leave at your employer's discretion.



DONAGHY THE STAR MAN AS KINGDOM IMPRESS

KERRY O'SHEA REPORTS FROM ST TIERNACH'S PARK CLONES

KERRY 1-17 MONAGHAN 1-9

Last Sunday's crucial Allianz NFL penultimate round game between Monaghan and Kerry. It was the first occasion since 1988 that a Monaghan-Kerry game took place at St Tiernach's Park, the headquarters of Ulster GAA.

Going into the weekend fixtures, Kerry were in third place on the league table behind Dublin and Roscommon.

The Kingdom travelled Northwards knowing that a win would copper-fasten a semi-final place and also propel them into second-place on the table, while Monaghan, who stunned Kerry in the corresponding game between the sides at Tralee's Austin Stack Park last year, needed the win themselves for different reasons as another loss would place them close to the drop zone with only one series of fixtures remaining.

The identity of Kerry's semi-final opponents will not be decided until next weekend when the final round of matches takes place.

A win or a draw over Cork and a Dublin win over Roscommon would almost certainly guarantee second place on the table, something many supporters would not have foreseen following the defeats at the hands of Dublin and Roscommon in the opening rounds.

A sizeable Kerry contingent travelled to Clones for the game, augmented by two busloads of the Kerry Supporters Club who stayed overnight in Monaghan Town and thoroughly enjoyed their weekend away.

Monaghan's cause wasn't helped by the late withdrawals of Ryan McAnespie and Daniel McKenna who were replaced by Vinny Corey, better known as a defender and Kieran Hughes respectively.

In the absence of injured Kingdom skipper Bryan Sheehan, it was Rathmore's Aidan O'Mahony who had the honour of leading Kerry to victory in this crucial outing.

O'Mahony and full-back Mark Griffin both put in decent shifts while Kerins O'Rahilly's David Moran was making his first start of the current league campaign and showed no ill-effects from the hand injury which sidelined him for several weeks.

However, when all was said and done, it was the performance of Kieran Donaghy that had the fans talking.

In truth this was Kieran Donaghy's hour. The big man bossed the midfield exchanges in a man of the match performance and scored two fantastic points as well.

Donaghy is supremely fit at the moment and his move to midfield has certainly given

manager Eamon Fitzmaurice plenty of food for thought ahead of the championship campaign.

The first-half introduction of Alan Fitzgerald for an out-of-sorts Stephen O'Brien also brought some much-needed pace to the Kerry attack. Fitzgerald used his height and strength to good effect in the forward line and posted four fine points.

Alan Fitzgerald's latest performance will certainly mark the Castlegregory man down as one to watch.

Kerry were totally dominant in the second half, scoring a whopping

1-12 during this period including a golden spell of six unanswered points in a glorious nine-minute spell at the start of the half that effectively sealed the deal for the Kingdom.

Monaghan, who finished the game with 14 men when wing-back Dessie Mone was dismissed on a second yellow card, troubled Kerry in the first half with their pace and short kick-outs and could consider themselves unlucky not to have been ahead at the interval.

The Northerners also adapted a very defence-minded approach, often dropping extra bodies back in an attempt to frustrate Kerry, which they succeeded in more ways than one during the first-half.

They missed a great goal chance just before the break but Kieran Donaghy's timely interception from deep in his own full-back line, ably assisted by Aidan O'Mahony, prevented almost certain disaster.

Kerry had claims for a penalty in the first-half when Colm Cooper was fouled, waved away by referee David Coldrick.

At half-time it was 0-6 apiece, with Kerry's scores coming from Colm Cooper (4), Darran O'Sullivan and Alan Fitzgerald, while Monaghan had replies from wing-backs Dessie Mone, who opened the scoring, Karl O'Connell and Conor McManus (4), whose accuracy from play and dead balls was a joy to watch.

As was the case against Mayo in the previous round, Kerry took over completely in the third quarter and with Donaghy and David Moran now dominating the midfield exchanges and scores from the outstanding Paul Murphy,

Colm Cooper (2), Alan Fitzgerald (2) and Kieran Donaghy (2) moved into a 0-13 to 0-7 lead with 50 minutes gone on the stopwatch.

Monaghan hit back with a much-needed goal from Darren Hughes in the 58th minute but Kerry responded emphatically, reeling off a further 1-2, the goal from a David Moran penalty won by Paul Murphy (Murphy was hauled down by Monaghan keeper Rory Beggan who was very fortunate not to escape sanction) and points from Donnchadh Walsh and sub Barry John Keane to further increase their lead and effectively put the game to bed. RSA LAUNCHES NEW SERIES OF INFORMATION VIDEOS ON DRIVEWAY SAFETY

The Road Safety Authority (RSA) has launched a series of videos focusing on child safety on or near driveways and in housing estates. With brighter evenings and better weather also on the horizon the purpose of the videos is to give parents the tools to help keep their children safe.

Between 2010 and 2015 38 children aged 14 years and under were killed on Irish roads. The most recent 'Child Casualty Report'* found that 41% of all child fatalities occurred in built-up areas while in the same period, half of road-related serious injuries among children occurred as a result of a collision in a built-up area.

These videos will provide parents and guardians with practical advice on how to help keep children safe when playing in these areas and tips on how we can all share the road safely. The videos give step by step guidance on the different checks and routines drivers can employ when traveling with children or in areas where children often are such as driveways, housing estates and near schools.

Ms Moyagh Murdock, Chief Executive of the Road Safety Authority said:

"Children are the most vulnerable of our road-users so it is really important that we as adults take responsibility for their safety. The aim of these videos is to provide all of us with tools to do this. These videos provide clear steps that each of us can take to protect our children whether in a car, driveway or out on housing estate roads."

"We cannot expect children to take responsibility for their own safety. It's up to us to make road safety part of their everyday routine and teach them how to share the road safely."

The RSA have the following advice for parents and drivers:

- Place your child in an appropriate child restraint. It's the law and failure to do so incurs 3 penalty points and a fixed charge notice.
- Always supervise children at play and hold their hand when walking on or near driveways and roads.
- Where possible, reverse your vehicle into the driveway or parking space. This makes it much safer for driving out again. If your view is obstructed always ask another adult to help guide you out of a driveway or parking space.
- Keep garage doors and side gates locked and always keep your car keys out of children's reach.
- Talk to your children about road safety. Show them where the danger is and what they can do to keep safe on the roads.
- Child proof your car. Before you begin your journey engage the child locks on your car doors and remove any objects that could potentially harm a child, for example small objects that a child could choke on.

- Develop a short series of steps for checking that an area is safe before you get into the car. Check all around your car and check that gates and entrances are closed or locked. Then check outside the garden and driveway areas to make sure there are no children there.
- Carry out a basic 'Cockpit Drill' each time you get behind the wheel. Check the doors are properly secured; ensure your seat is in a comfortable position; check your handbrake or parking brake is fully on; and make sure the gear lever is in neutral. Next, make sure your mirrors are correctly adjusted; and your seatbelt, and that of any passengers, is properly fitted. Finally check your fuel gauge and make sure all system warning lights go out as expected.
- Remember, children do not have the same understanding or awareness of dangers that you have, so you need to modify your behaviour in any area where you think there may be children at play. Slow down, respect your environment and always, expect the unexpected.

SELF-ACCEPTANCE



One of my favourite Oscar Wilde quotes says 'Be yourself, everyone else is taken'. So why is it so difficult for us to do just that? Liking ourselves and being ourselves has to do with self-acceptance. Self-acceptance refers to our ability to embrace all facets of ourselves and not just the positive, acceptable parts. Whilst we may recognize our limitations and weaknesses – accepting ourselves fully means we accept these aspects of ourselves too. We stop judging ourselves and being so hard on ourselves.

Research shows that before the age of eight we are unable to form a sense of ourselves separate from that which was transmitted to us by those who care for us. So often I hear clients say to me that their parents were unable or unwilling to communicate the message to them that they were totally okay and acceptable. In addition to this we may have received much disapproval and criticism from teachers, siblings, other relatives and/or our peers. Is it any wonder then that we come to see ourselves as inadequate in many ways? A consequence of this is that we may go on to regard many aspects of ourselves negatively. We 'beat ourselves up' often telling ourselves the very same thing that an overly critical parent or teacher may have said.

So how then do we become more self-accepting?

Developing self-acceptance requires that we develop more self-compassion for ourselves. The Buddhist teacher Pema Chodron says that "Compassion isn't some kind of self-improvement project or ideal that we're trying to live up to. Having compassion starts and ends with having compassion for all those unwanted parts of ourselves, all those imperfections that we don't even want to look at".

However learning to be self-compassionate and kind to ourselves can seem like quite a new idea and represents a deep change in our attitude and way of being. In order to ensure our survival our brains have been designed in such a way as to give attention to the negative stuff. Self-criticism has in fact played an important role for us. However, this criticism needs to be tempered with kindness and not allowed to be a habit based response formed from patterns laid down in our early childhood. Whenever we criticise ourselves we are triggering the same threat and protection systems in the body and brain that get activated when threatened by other people.

By cultivating more self-compassion we come to like ourselves more and to view ourselves as deserving of love and respect. This in turn can lead us to showing not just more kindness and goodwill toward ourselves but towards others as well.

Next week we will look further at developing and cultivating self acceptance.

RENTAL INCOME – ALLOWABLE INTEREST

Currently, landlords can only claim 75% of interest on borrowing to purchase, repair or improve a residential rental property as a deduction against their rental income.

Changes to the Finance Act 2015 provides that if a landlord lets a premises for 3 years to a tenant who qualifies for rent supplement or where a house is let to a housing authority for social housing purposes, then the 25% disallowed interest deduction will be granted in full in the year after the 3 year period.

The new provisions apply to lettings commencing on or after 1 January 2016. They can apply to lettings which started before that date but in such cases the 3 year period for which the property must be let is counted from 1 January 2016. If a tenancy ceases during the 3 year period then provided the property is let again under another qualifying lease, the intervening period will count as part of the 3 year qualifying period.

In order to qualify, a declaration to the PRTB must be made at the same time as the tenancy is being registered with the PRTB.

TOMORROW IS WORLD AUTISM AWARENESS DAY:

Being a lifelong developmental disability that manifests itself during the first three years of life, Autism has a tremendous impact on children, their families, communities and societies.

World Autism Awareness Day is April 2 and it is a time for organisations around the world to mark the day with awareness-raising events to help improve the lives of children and adults who suffer from this disorder.

Autism and other forms of disability are part of the human experience that contributes to

human diversity. As such, the United Nations has emphasized the need to mainstream disability in the Organization's development agenda. Mainstreaming disability requires an integral approach in the design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of policies and programmes in all political, economic and societal spheres, so that inequality is not perpetuated.

THE IRISH WERE THE LARGEST GROUP OF SLAVES IN THE BRITISH COLONIES IN THE 17TH CENTURY:

From the Tudor re-conquest of Ireland until Irish Independence in 1921, the English puzzled over the problem of what to do with all those Irish people.

They were the wrong religion. They spoke the wrong language. But the big problem was that there were just too many of them.

Most people have heard of the Potatoe Famine, which reduced the population of Ireland by around 25%.

That pales in comparison to the disaster that England inflicted upon Ireland between 1641 and 1652, when the population of Ireland fell from 1,466,000 to 616,000.

The English had been practicing a slow genocide against the Irish since Queen Elizabeth, but the Irish bred too fast and were tough to kill. On the other side of the Atlantic, there was a chronic labour shortage (because the local natives tended to die out too quickly in slavery conditions).

Putting two and two together, King James I started sending Irish slaves to the new world.

The first recorded sale of Irish slaves was to a settlement in the Amazon in 1612, seven years before the first African slaves arrived in Jamestown.

The Proclamation of 1625 by James II made it official policy that all Irish political prisoners be transported to the West Indies and sold to English planters. Soon Irish slaves were the majority of slaves in the English colonies.

In 1629 a large group of Irish men and women were sent to Guiana, and by 1632, Irish were the main slaves sold to Antigua and Montserrat in the West Indies. By 1637 a census showed that 69% of the total population of Montserrat were Irish slaves, which records show was a cause of concern to the English planters. But there were not enough political prisoners to supply the demand, so every petty infraction carried a sentence of transporting, and slaver gangs combed the country sides to kidnap enough people to fill out their quotas.

The slavers were so full of zest that they sometimes grabbed non-Irishmen. On March 25, 1659, a petition was received in London claiming that 72 Englishmen were wrongly sold as slaves in Barbados, along with 200 Frenchmen, 7-8,000 Scots and between 12,000 and 60,000 Irish.

THERE'S A BACHELOR CRISIS IN CHINA:

Soon, experts warn, it will leave nearly 30 million men unable to find female partners. It's a consequence of China's long standing "one child policy," which has now been revoked, that caused such an immense overpopulation of men.

In many families, especially in rural areas of China, girls are believed to drain their family's resources whereas boys are viewed as assets. Because of this, sharp spikes in sex-selected abortions and even infanticides took place around China since the policy began.

Yet there is an even darker reality to this issue of too many men, and that involves the trafficking of women into China.

In Vietnam women are often sold by family members or local gangs to Chinese brokers, who in turn sell them to desperate bachelors. In places like Burma it's more common for women to be drugged on buses or in restaurants and taken to illicit transit centres along the border. Women who managed to escape have taken refuge in women shelters, now becoming more common throughout the region. However, a staggering number of women from these villages simply disappear and are never heard from again.

Illegal "matchmaking" tourist schemes have also popped up, where men from China pay a 'tour guide' a fee and then travel to the surrounding countries to evaluate different women for marriage.

UNICEF speculates that nearly 22,000 Vietnamese women have been sold into marriage in China alone. They also say although these are the official stats, realistically the numbers are much higher despite China's strict laws against trafficking.

BELIEVE IT OR NOT:

*The vampire squid is a soft-bodied, passive creature, about the size and shape of a football. Its name comes from its resemblance to a vampire, owing to its dark red body and cloaklike web that stretches among its eight arms. It inhabits the deep waters, where there is almost no oxygen and relatively few predators exist, and is considered a living fossil because it has changed very little over the past hundreds of millions of years.

*There are more than 500 million domestic cats in the world, with approximately 40 recognized breeds.

*In Norway, they have bike escalators, to help cyclists with sharp inclines.

*A Baby Jumping Competition takes place in the Spanish Village of Castrillo de Murcia every year. The concept is pretty simple - place a number of babies on the floor and local men wearing bright clothes will hurdle over them.



walk only 10 minutes a day to a water trough. A lucky cow on the street will have a little circuit she navigates, almost the same pattern repeating day after day. She'll stroll down to a friendly neighbour's house where she knows she'll find two chapattis (flat bread) which were left just for her precisely five minutes before her arrival. She'll amble to the front gate of another home to a carefully installed cement water trough and she'll take a few long draughts of fresh water. Next stop is the vegetable man on the corner who cuts off the stalks of cauliflowers and throws them into a heap, just for her. She'll stand and bask in the sun for a half hour after this tasty morsel.

But then, like so much in India, the silver lining has a cloud. Often cows are caught in traffic jams or hit by motorists on the chaotic streets of busy cities. On most days, the Animal Aid rescue team of 55 treat about 50 cows and bulls, plastering fractures from hoof to hip, snugly wrapping puncture wounds and gashes in fresh bandages, and pushing back prolapsed uteruses to safety inside.

However, even more, serious than cars are plastic piles that are often mistaken for food. Cows will often wander into the rubbish piles that sweepers have created where there might be some remnants of a wedding party amidst hundreds of plastic bags, and plastic plates coated with tasty sauces and which, tragically, they mistake for food and swallows.

Often the cows and bulls they rescue come with stomachs filled with 40, 60 or even 80 pounds of plastic (18.7Kg - 36.28Kg). In fact, many cows are pulled off the street by government cow-catchers who drop them off at a facility where they make their way to a garbage dump.

By the time someone calls Animal Aid to rescue them on the road, they are usually already starving. They are skin and bones and often appear pregnant because of the plastic in their stomachs.

Visitors and volunteers at the rescue see cows grazing on hay with bandages and splints; cows and bulls resting in the shade of trees, and sometimes, lying down on mattresses, their stomachs bloated from plastic, unable to stand. Because it is illegal to euthanize cows in Rajasthan, the rescue team sorrowfully know that this is where some of the sedated animals, will spend their remaining few days.

The removal of this plastic is virtually impossible. Rumenotomy - the evacuation of the contents of the stomachs or rumens - is a surgery with a high mortality rate because the

delicate peristalsis (motion) of the intestinal undulations and enzyme secretions necessary to move even good food along through her four stomachs is easily frozen when traumatised by surgery.

Animal Aid Unlimited's role is to treat cows for pain and suffering and to make it easy for people to visit so that through contact with cows and bulls they are better able to understand their intelligence, curiosity, naughtiness, affection and experience cows as the wonders they are.

DID YOU KNOW?

New research shows that European leaders have the power to save Europe's most threatened seabird -- the Balearic shearwater -- by making one simple switch: setting the fishing lines at night when the critically endangered Balearic shearwater doesn't dive for food. If the fishing lines are set at night, then Europe's most endangered seabird doesn't run the risk of being entangled by the nets -- a driving force that has the seabird "on the road to extinction" with fewer than 30,000 birds left in the wild (and 3,200 breeding pairs) declining roughly 14% a year. If politicians do nothing, then, at the current rate, the Balearic shearwater will go extinct in 60 years.






