

Native Red Stag to adorn Killarney junction

hose of you who were wondering exactly what is happening on the junction between New Road and Port Road need wonder no further.

Talented chainsaw sculptor Will Fogarty is using his immense talents to sculpt a Native Red Deer Stag from the ancient Spanish Chestnut that is a landmark in the town.

Will, who is based in Limerick is part of a group of Irish artists who create bespoke pieces called Le Cheile.

"A chainsaw carving is a work of art and carries huge concentration", Will told the Killarney Outlook. "If you make a mistake - you can't rectify it", he added.

"I have come across three 6 inch nails so far - relics of election posters from times past, you never know what you will come across", he added The Red Deer is synonymous with Killarney and are the largest and the only native species to Ireland.

They are believed to have a continuous presence here since the end of the last Ice Age 10,000BC so therefore it is a fitting tribute to the noble animal that it should grace one of the main thoroughfares of the town. The sculpture, when completed will be a major asset to the town - which is basking in glorious sunshine this week.

5,500 VOLUNTEERS... 8,000 BAGS OF LITTER... **ALL ADDS UP TO A CLEAN COUNTY**

he numbers certainly added up at this year's KerryCounty Clean Up with a record 5,500 volunteers taking part and a massive 8,000 bags of litter collected, the highest ever tally in the seven years in which the environmental and community initiative has existed. KWD Recycling and Kerry County Council have completed an analysis of the litter collected which revealed that singleuse drinking containers were the most common item of litter retrieved from locations across the county, followed by sweet/chocolate wrappers.

This year's County Clean Up took place on Saturday, 14 April, and the largest ever number of volunteers took part, as Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr John Sheahan explained: 'The growing success of the initiative since it was established in 2012 is evident in the huge voluntary effort all over Kerry and the volume of litter retrieved is indicative of the larger numbers taking part.'

'We need to continue to harness this voluntary spirit and ensure that more people take part in clean ups like this in their areas more often. Tidy Towns groups are always looking for volunteers or there may be potential for a new group like that in your area. I would like to thank the many volunteers who led

The Cathaoirleach paid tribute particularly to Kerry GAA, Kerry IFA and Kerry ICMSA and Chamber Alliances who mobilised their members all over Kerry to come out on the day and lend a hand.

Noel O'Reilly of KWD Recycling said there was a strong commitment to the clean up all over Kerry with many individuals and groups getting involved for the first time. 'Far more areas and roadsides were covered than usually which contributed to the large increase in the number of bags of litter.

We are sending certificates to all the groups that registered and sincere thanks to them for making such a wonderful effort.'

Move Over Meghan There's a New Royal in Town!

he royal wedding of Prince Harry and Meghan Markle has captivated the world over the past week, but for the people of Killorglin, it was a very different royal affair that caught their attention! The event in question was the crowning of a local schoolgirl as Queen of the annual Puck Fair festival.

The famous 3-day event, which runs annually on the 10th, 11th and 12th of August, is Ireland's oldest gathering festival and revolves around the crowning of a wild mountain goat as King Puck and overseer of the town. The festival's ancient traditions date back to 1603, but over four centuries later the popularity of this unique event shows no sign of waning, with visitors from all over the globe flocking to Killorglin every August to witness the pomp and circumstance with their own eyes. 

Cycle in memory of Stephanie this weekend



THREE YEAR TAX EXEMPTION FOR NEW START-UP COMPANIES

The three year relief for start-up companies, identified as highly important among entrepreneurs, is at present available until the end of 2018.

This relief reduces corporation tax on the profits of a new trade and gains on disposal of any assets used for the purposes of the new trade by the amount of PRSI paid for each employee, subject to a maximum of ϵ 5,000 per employee and an overall limit of ϵ 40,000 in the first 3 years of trading.


A "qualifying trade" is a new trade set up and commenced by the company and does not include a trade:

- which was previously carried on by another person;
- which, if carried on by an associated company, would form part of a trade carried on by that associated company;
- which involves dealing in or developing land;
- which involves the exploration and extraction of natural resources;
- which involves the carrying on of a profession or the provision of a professional service;
- which involves the holding of an office or employment;

You've done the hard work so 'play a blinder' in the State Exams

Wednesday for about 120,000 candidates, this is the final weekend for major revision. Stick to your study plan on Saturday and Sunday. Concentrate on subjects being examined during the first week. As the exams run into the second and third weeks, the optional subjects are nicely spaced out allowing for study days.

Leaving Cert candidates should prioritise last minute work in English, Home Economics, Engineering, Geography and Mathematics Paper One and get it done by Sunday night. Likewise Junior Cert candidates should do the same in English, CSPE, Irish, Geography and Maths Paper One. On Monday, concentrate on the tips and predictions for subjects being examined the first week. Don't cram on the days before the exam as this may cause confusion and fatique.

Spent an hour or two on Tuesday skimming over your notes for Wednesday's exams and leave it at that. Some relaxed leisure will be more beneficial than spending the day cramming material that you may not recall anyway. You need a clear and alert mind going into the exams.

On the evening before each paper spend an hour or so looking over your notes so that the important concepts and ideas are fresh in your mind. Heavy study sessions on the night prior to any paper are not a good idea as you will be exhausted the following morning. Instead, relax and get a good night's rest.

Put all thoughts of the following day's exam out of your mind. If you find it difficult to sleep try a little non-academic reading for a short while.

Over the next few days check your equipment and assemble your exam materials – biros, pencils, ruler, eraser, drawing instruments, calculator and so on. Have at least two biros or fountain pens in case one doesn't work properly. It's time, too, to organise your personal

needs such as a watch and tissues.

A few nerves are normal on the first day so be prepared to deal with it. A relaxation exercise or maybe a shower to freshen up will do the trick. Eat a nutritious breakfast as you'll need the extra reserves of energy.

Finally, go through your equipment checklist before leaving home.

On Wednesday morning arrive at the exam centre at least a half hour before the exam begins. For all subsequent exams be present about fifteen minutes before the appointed time. Spend the few minutes before entering the exam centre on your own in peace and quiet.

At all costs, avoid groups that are involved in last minute revision. If you need to, use the bathroom before you enter the exam centre. Be in your seat a few moments before the exam is due to begin. Synchronise your watch with the clock on the wall and use your watch or the clock to help you pace your work.

Check your seat and desk for firmness and stability. A shaky desk will torment you and distract you during the exam. When the answer book is distributed, fill in the required details and read the directions.

When you receive your question paper read the instructions carefully in case there is any change of format. Don't be put off by your first glance at the paper. It's new and it will look unfamiliar at first. Once the exam begins, keep to your prepared answering plan and address the questions which are asked.

If you finish a paper before the time is up, do not leave the exam centre. Recheck your work and extra information may come to you. Attempt an extra question only when you have thoroughly answered the previous questions. Once an exam is over, spend as little time as possible on a post-mortem.

Focus on the next paper and when the entire exam is over forget about it and enjoy your summer.

There is no advantage in dwelling on what might have been. Be happy and satisfied that you have done your best. Good luck to all candidates starting exams next week.

- ✔Once an exam is over avoid protracted post-mortems

For the past five years there has been an awareness campaign to change minds around mental health. There are many campaigns with different coloured ribbons across the globe. This green ribbon campaign is aimed at starting the conversation around the stigma attached to Mental Health issues. What do we mean by stigma? It is when we hold an attitude or feeling that is judgemental about a circumstance or a quality or a person. In fact a definition actually uses Menatl Health as an example of stigma, so we know that it is really an issue so close to people's lived experience of how they have felt judged or hurt by having any mental health issues. Otherwise why would there need to be a campaign to counter-act the judgements people have about someone who may be dealing with mental health problems.

As a counselling centre we are witness to some

clients often struggling with other peoples view or judgements around them seeking help for mental health issues. It has often taken great courage to ask for help, and it becomes really important for the person's extended family to support without judgement.

The Green Ribbon campaign, along with others like "it's Ok to not be OK' have really begun to change attitudes to asking for help and reducinh Stigma with Mental Health. If you would like more information the http://www.greenribbon.ie/about-the-green-ribbon website has more information.

Some guidelines from the website are

You don't need to be an expert to start talking about mental health or have all the answers. Sometimes the most helpful thing you can do is to let someone know that you are there for him or her and simply

- •Talk, but listen too: Simply being there will mean a lot.
- •Take your lead from the person: As a first step, ask them how best you can help.
- •Avoid the clichés: Phrases like 'Cheer up', 'I'm sure it'll pass' and 'Pull yourself together' definitely won't help - Being open minded, non-judgemental and listening will.
- •Keep in touch: There are lots of small ways of showing support Send a text or just ask someone how they are doing.

So in the this month of Spring moving towards a green summer, grab a ribbon and 'Start the conversation'. Every single person can make a difference by changing attitudes to mental health in the same way as we would to someone having any medical issue, we would have empathy, concern and support. Not judgement or stigma. Asking for help shows courage, not weakness. We need to value help-seeking behaviour, especially for men and boys.


