Representatives from from all business sectors in Killarney gathered in the Killarney Avenue Hotel on Monday night last for the Killarney Chamber of Commerce and Tourism annual business meeting.

Those present heard that low off-season hotel occupancy is a challenge for its members but one that can transformed into an opportunity if the right solutions are put in place.

Addressing members at the final phase of a consultation process for the Killarney Tourism Economic Impact Review (TEIR 1) report, which is being compiled by W2 Consulting, Chamber President Paul O'Neill said that the one of the most surprising aspects of the initial findings was that Killarney trails the national and even regional average in terms of offseason occupancy.

Over 100 members attended the event in the Killarney Avenue Hotel, which finished members giving their recommendations for growing the economy through tourism and industry generally in

"We will be publishing full details of the report in the very near future but suffice to say that our event was a very positive engagement. The key findings were relayed to members and this led to a very positive discussion around how we can take Kerry forward. We've not had a report like this done on Killarney before and that was very much evidenced by the energy in the room", Paul O'Neill said.

"With regard to the report itself, while we knew we had off-season challenges, we didn't quite realise that occupancy rates compared in the way they do with national and regional averages.

"Now that we know where we are, there's only one thing for us to do but treat this an opportunity. Clearly the status quo isn't working and we've already set about addressing it with innovative ways of bringing people in. These include festivals such as the Christmas Festival just gone and the recently announced Killarney Mountain Festival, which takes place on 9th, 10th and 11th of March", he added.

"But there's also an opportunity here for us to challenge central government and various agencies involved in tourism and industrial promotion to look again at Killarney and match our determination to ensure that the economy of this town and county grows in the shoulder periods of the year."

Conor Hennigan, Development Manager with Killarney Chamber said that there are many assuring aspects from the findings, not least that the report had confirmed tourists' satisfaction rating with the Killarney experience.

"Ultimately, the research conducted this report, for including interviews with tourists, delivered huge approval ratings in terms of visitor satisfaction levels. So we clearly have the product, the service and the capacity. The issues we have are effectively seasonality and regionality and our meeting tonight was about getting the opinion of our members as to what the solutions may. We got some very interesting insights and they will now become part of the report."

ABDOMINAL AORTIC ANEURYSMS (AAA)

Definition

An aneurysm is a permanent and irreversible dilatation of a blood vessel by at least 50% of the normal diameter. It is caused by weakness of the wall of the aorta. The aorta is the large blood vessel arising from the heart travelling down the centre of your body that supplies blood to your organs. The aorta is usually 2cm wide. If it has expanded above 3cm you have an aneurysm. The dilated portion of the aorta becomes weaker and is at risk of rupture. Rupture is an acute life threatening event which many do not survive.

Risk factors

Male sex, smoking, blood pressure and increasing age all increase your risk. Family history plays a big role - about 15% of first degree relatives of a patient with an AAA will go on to develop one themselves. COPD(Smoking related lung disease) is another risk factor due to loss of elasticity of tissues.

Symptoms

Most have no symptoms at all and an AAA may only be found by accident. Ultrasound can be performed for males over 65 or if someone has a family history to check for one.

Symptoms can include back pain due to pressure on other organs or a cold pale leg where blood flow to the limbs is affected.

Uncomplicated aneurysms of <5cm are generally monitored annually, or more frequently if close to 5cm. Larger ones of 5.5cm or greater shall be considered for surgery. This can be done as an 'open' operation or more recently endovascularly which allows an easier

Strict blood pressure control, smoking cessation and possibly some blood thinners may be advised.


Prognosis

Elective repair has a mortality rate of 2.4% approximately but the mortality rate per year without surgery for an AAA >5cm can be up to 80% due to rupture.

25% of aneurysms greater than 6cm will rupture every year.

The Killarney branch of Friends of the Children of Chernobyl will have their annual coffee morning in the Killarney Golf & Fishing Club this coming Thursday 8th Febraury from 10.30am-12.30pm.

Killarney is involved with 2 schools in the Pinsk area, Pleshehitsky and Lastitsk, which is in the Brest region of Belarus. These are both country schools with approximately 200 children in Lastitsk and approximately 400 children in Pleshehitsky. Both schools are about 20 miles from the Ukraine borders and 45 miles away from the Chernobyl disaster area. All children from these schools now go to camps three times a year with the funds raised in Killarney. At the camps the children have three meals a day, are medically assessed and enjoy games and sports.

All funds raised in the Killarney area are used to improve conditions in schools, furniture, computer equipment, heated and sanitary facilities. Funds are also used to look after over 60 people with special needs in the area. This helps them with their personal and medical needs. All of these people, many of whom suffer with serious to profound physical and mental disabilities live at home with extended families under poor conditions. 
Killarney remembers those who have passed

Killarney people gathered at St. Mary's Cathedral on Monday night last for a special memorial mass remembering and praying for all those who died in the Killarney parish in 2017.







The Ladies Senior Cup Team, managed by Mary Geaney, won the Senior Cup for the very first time beating Royal Portrush in the final at Royal Curragh. It is the first time ever in the history of the ILGU that any club has won two All-Ireland Titles in the same year.

The "Mocks" are a useful trial run but the exam that counts begins on 6th June

The "Mocks" or "Practice Exams" are usually held in schools during February. They have nothing to do with the State Examination Commission (SEC) and the exam papers are provided and corrected independent educational groups. It's worth doing the "Mocks" for the experience but don't let them distract you from the big price in June. Don't burn yourself out at this early stage by overestimating the "Mocks." Famonn Fitzmaurice, Kerry's astute senior football manager and gifted secondary teacher, maintains that peak match fitness is best reached for the All-Ireland series in Croke Park rather than the Munster Final in Killarney. How right he is!

"Mocks" provide The opportunity to work on your presentation, timing, answering techniques and current knowledge. They are usually marked externally so they provide you with an impartial assessment of your readiness for the State Exams. It's an opportunity to see if you can deliver a neatly presented script on an A4 booklet. Number your questions and work your way down the page in a neat and orderly manner. Write legibly and keep your answers well spread out for easy reading. Leave some blank space after each question to which you can add more information later in the exam. Enhance your answers with sketches and illustrations, as appropriate.

Avail of the "Mocks" to become familiar with the logistics and technicalities of each exam paper. The quality of your answering is the core of any exam so learn from the "Mocks" how to approach each paper. Keep the content of your answer relevant to the question asked. Read each question carefully before deciding which ones to answer. You may prefer to tackle a good question first to settle you down. Be concise, accurate and relevant. Be familiar with the format of each paper well before each exam session. Know how the paper is presented. What topics are examined? How many questions must be answered? What styles of question can you expect on any exam paper? Be familiar with the choices available on the paper. Is one or more questions compulsory? Be particularly careful about a paper, which is subdivided into subsections. Without prior knowledge of such a paper you could very easily fail to address the relevant number of questions.

Use the "Mocks" to test your allocation of time. Doing well in any exam involves not just knowing the course material but in presenting your answers within the time allowed. The "Mocks" are a great time trial. Go into the "Mocks" determined to attempt the required number of guestions. Work out in advance the approximate time you have for each question. The allocation of time to each question should be proportionate to the marks available for that question. Let me

reemphasis that if you attempt the required number of questions you will maximise your grade in that

When your "Mock" exam paper is handed to you read the instructions carefully. Spend a few minutes reading the entire paper. Keep to your pre-prepared answering plan and once you have made your choice of questions, start with a question you can answer well. When you have finished each question, reread it to ensure that you haven't omitted any part. Allow a few minutes at the end of the exam to read back over your answers and to check your numbering and presentation. Stay in the exam hall until the time is up even if you are finished early as some extra information may come to you. Every mark counts so don't leave any after you!

When your marked "Mock" papers are returned, go over them to identify your strengths and weaknesses as outlined above. The old maxim of making your mistakes in the "Mocks" and getting things right in the State Exams next June is as true as ever. As the saying goes, practice makes perfect and the "Mocks" are the perfect practice!

St. Brendan's are All Ireland colleges senior basketball champions


30 years ago this week on January 31st 1988 St. Brendan's College Killarney defeated North Mon 84-78 in the All Ireland Colleges Senior 'A' Basketball Championship final at St.Declan's College, Cabra, Dublin. The glory trail that culminated in a first and only All-Ireland Senior A title for The Sem started out with victory in the Dawn Dairies Kerry Schoolboys Basketball Blitz which featured wins against Mercy Kanturk, Tralee CBS, Colaiste Padraig, Castleisland and Killarney Community College.

An 83-58 points Munster semi-final victory over Crosshaven followed and although St Brendan's lost narrowly after overtime to North Mon of Cork in the provincial decider, they had still done enough to secure a place in the All-Ireland Championship top eight.

The long journey to St Declan's College in Cabra, Dublin followed with the top two teams from each province going to battle. Spirited victories over Leinster champions Patrician of Newbridge, St Mary's of Galway and La Salle of Belfast saw St Brendan's win their group and they went on to score a 88-75 points victory over St Joseph's of Galway in the semi-final.

The dream final saw Tim Regan's side pitched once again against their provincial rivals North Mon of Cork and although the Killarney boys trailed 41-38 at half time, they gradually got on top in the second half and eventually won the game - and the All-

These were an U16 National Cup in 2005, a First Year title in 2006 followed by a Second Year title in 2007.

Following the All Ireland victory for St. Brendan's in 1988 various celebratory events took place. Upon arriving home at Killarney Railway Station on the Sunday night of the final, family, friends and fellow

students gave the winning team a rousing reception and they were paraded through the streets of Killarney.

The late Killarney UDC Cllr Sean O'Keeffe proposed a special vote of congratulations for the team at the town council meeting on Monday February 1st and it was adopted unanimously by all councillors. The late Bishop of Kerry Diarmuid O'Suilleabhain and St. Brendan's College President Fr Dan O'Riordan hosted a special reception for the team at the school on Tuesday February 2nd 1988.

Killarney coach enjoys National success

Killarney basketball coach James Fleming enjoyed tremendous success at the National Basketball Arena in Dublin last Sunday afternoon when his Fr Mathews ladies team stormed home to their first ever Women's National Cup title with a 55-45 point win over Meteors Dublin in the the Senior Women's Cup final.

Citizens Information

Know Your Rights: ONLINE DISPUTE RESOLUTION

OUESTION

What can I do if I have a problem with an item I've bought online?

ANSWER

If you are not happy with an item you have bought online, you should always contact the trader first to make a complaint. If you are not satisfied with their response, you may be able to get help.

If your complaint is against a trader here in Ireland, you can contact the Competition and Consumer Protection Commission for advice.

If the trader is in another EU member state, you can contact the European Consumer Centre Ireland (ECC Ireland). ECC Ireland may contact the trader and try to resolve your dispute. If this is not successful, ECC Ireland can advise you on other options.

You can also use the Online Dispute Resolution (ODR) platform. The ODR platform is operated by the European Commission for use by consumers living in the EU. It aims to help consumers and traders settle online disputes without the need to go to court. You use the platform to find a neutral third party (called a dispute resolution body) to handle your dispute.

You don't have to pay when you submit a complaint using the ODR platform. However, a dispute resolution body may ask you to pay a fee if it agrees to handle your case. When a dispute resolution body agrees to handle your case it will tell you what the rules are, including how much you have to pay.

The outcome can depend on the type of dispute resolution body and their rules and procedures. Some decisions may not be binding on the trader. If you disagree with the outcome you might be able to appeal the outcome or take your case to court.

In a thrilling finale, Donegal's Darach O'Connor struck for their third goal in the 71st t minute. You sensed that Kerry supporters feared the worst but the young Kerry starlets did not know the meaning of defeat and the deficit was overcome with points from debutant Sean O'Se and Daithi Casey who landed the coup de gras.

Following the game, Eamon Fitzmaurice expressed his satisfaction with his young charges. Fitzmaurice said that Jack Barry, who was a late withdrawal prior the game because of injury should be ready for the Mayo battle ahead in Castlebar next Saturday as should James O'Donoghue.

In front of an attendance of 10,977, Kerry supporters can take plenty of positives from this gutsy performance. The Kerry management must look at the backline which followed the ball, resulting in three leaked goals, leaving debutant goalkeeper Shane Murphy isolated at times. Murphy, who was skipper on the day showed superb positional play and made one or two great saves as well. The decision to name David Clifford on the first 15 certainly grabbed the national and local headlines during the week but it was the performance of another debutant, Kenamre's Sean O'Se that had supporters talking following the game.

The 2016 All-Ireland Minor-winning captain finished the game with a personal haul of 0-7, which included four points from play in a superb return.

David Clifford who received unwarranted attention from the Donegal defence, scored a pointed free and had a direct hand in 1-2 of Kerry's first-half total before being replaced by James O'Donoghue 14 minutes into the second-half.

The Fossa youngster will certainly remember his senior debut day which certainly was a baptism of fire and did very well to last 49 minutes.

Donegal finished the game with 13 men following the dismissal of midfielder Nathan Mullins, a son of former Dublin legend Brian Mullins and Leo McLoone who was dismissed on a 2nd yellow along with Kerry centre-back

Donegal stunned the Kingdom on the restart when Tony McClenaghan struck for the first of their three goals from the throw-in.

The Kingdom regrouped and were awarded a penalty with 53 minutes gone when the outstanding Paul Murphy was fouled, but Paul Geaney's shot went high and over the bar, Sean O'Se followed suit with another point but disaster struck again as Donegal's Odhran McNiallais finished a superbly-executed

The game was now in injury-time and there was a further twist to the tale as Darach O'Connor gave Donegal the initiative again with their third major but Kerry were not

ready to give up yet and that late late show from Sean O'Se and Daithi Casey snatched a memorable win. Kerry head to Mayo next weekend.

SOME ESSENTIAL OILS ARE HARMFUL TO CATS

Researchers have found that 2 types of components, phenols and monoterpene hydrocarbons, commonly found in essential oils can be fatally toxic to our feline friends in high doses. This is because unlike humans, cats' livers lack an enzyme called glucuronyl tranferase, and are unable to break down these toxic chemicals as a result.

*Any residual oil that accumulates on your hands and skin can end up getting stuck to your cat's fur, which they'll end up ingesting when they decide to clean themselves. This is why it's important to thoroughly wash your hands after applying essential oils. You should also keep the skin that you applied the oils on covered up for a while, just in case your beloved cat decides to rub up against you.

*If you diffuse oils into the air, then your cat will undoubtedly end up inhaling the oil, which could be very harmful to them in certain cases. If you really must use essential oils via inhalation, a safer way to do so is to add a few drops to a bowl of steaming hot water, cover the bowl and your head with a towel, and then breathe the vapour in. Make sure that your cat is in another room when doing this.

*Using essential oils as cleaners will leave a residue on the surface, which could easily be ingested by cats that lick it or rub themselves against it.

*Since cats are such mischievous and curious creatures, it's very important to keep essential oils well out of their reach. Even if jars of oil are tightly sealed, there will probably be some residue on the outside which could still end up harming your cat. That's why it's best to store all of your essential oils in a closed drawer or cabinet that your cat will never be able to break

*If you want to minimise the risk that accidental exposure presents to your cat, then use essential oils that are as diluted as possible. In this way, if your cat ends up accidentally ingesting or inhaling some toxic components, the damage done to them would be less likely to cause a toxic buildup.

*For anyone who loves to cook with essential oils, it is of the utmost importance to clean these dishes and put them away immediately after using them. This is because there are very few cats in the world that won't go and sniff or lick your dirty dishes when you're not around.

The owner of the fitness centre was so moved by the boy's picture; he tracked Muhammet down and offered him a free lifetime pass to the fitness gym.

With its U.S. rating of N95, the generously sized scarf is capable of blocking 99.75% of all particles 0.1 microns in size or larger—and 95% of all non-oil based airborne particles measuring 0.3 microns.

SEAMSTRESS USED HER EXPERT MENDING SKILLS TO REPAIR A **MONARCH'S WING**

Romy McCloskey is the proud owner of a garden full of monarchs and she is also a costume designer who put her needleworking abilities to the test when she rescued a 3-dayold monarch butterfly from certain death by fixing its shredded wing.

While monarch butterflies usually have a lifespan of 2 to 6 weeks, this newborn insect had suffered a deformity while it was pupating in the chrysalis.

Upon determining that the mutation wasn't due to a parasite, Ms. McCloskey took the injured insect into her "operating room" and grabbed her surgical supplies: a towel, a coat hanger, contact cement, a toothpick, tweezers, a cotton swab, scissors, talc powder, and an extra butterfly wing from one of her other recently deceased backyard bugs.

The designer used the coat hanger to secure the body of the butterfly against the towel so it would not struggle while she was attaching the wing. She then cut away the ragged part of its wing to make way for the replacement (and if you're worried about the butterfly at this point, Ms. McCloskey assures her reader that cutting butterfly wings is the equivalent of trimming hair or fingernails). She then attached the extra butterfly wing to her young patient so that it was virtually good as new.

Ms. McCloskey posted photos of the healthy butterfly to Facebook with the caption reading:



"You can see that the black lines on his upper right wing don't match up 100%, and if you look at his lower right wing, it is missing the black dot that indicates male gender. Oh, and the white on his wing is the talc used to make sure any stray glue doesn't make the wings stick together."

Just to make sure that her patient had made a healthy recovery, she let it rest for a day before giving it some homemade nectar and taking it into the backyard for a little joy ride on its new wing – and judging by the butterfly's exuberant first flight, the surgery was a huge success.

"A quick spin around the backyard, then a little rest on one of the bushes... then... like the down of a thistle... off he flew! My heart soared with him, for sure!" said Ms. McCloskey.

GEOLOGISTS BELIEVE THAT A REMOTE REGION OF AUSTRALIA WAS ONCE CONNECTED TO CANADA

North America and Australia are practically on opposite sides of the world today, but about 1.7 billion years ago, they may have been joined. The revelation came after geologists discovered extremely old rocks in northeast Australia with signatures that have a striking resemblance to similarly-aged rocks found in Canada today. The find represents mounting evidence that these two distant lands were once connected. Earth's continents are constantly on the move due to plate tectonics, but even when geologists trace back the paths of Australia and North America to the last time all of the continents were connected as part of the supercontinent Pangea, these landmasses



Canada ever did share a border, it had to have been even longer ago — far further back in history than Pangea.

And that is exactly what scientists now believe. About 2.5 to 1.5 billion years ago, the planet's continents were also arranged as a supercontinent known as Nuna. It was at this time that a chunk of modern-day North Queensland, Australia, was bumped up against Canada's Hudson Bay region.

ASIX-FOOTPAIROFSOCKSONCEHUNG FROM A DRAWER OF THE WORLD'S **LARGEST CHEST OF DRAWERS:**

Thanks to its century-long run as a major manufacturing hub, the town of High Point, North Carolina, earned the nickname of "the furniture capital of the world".

High Point's astronomical bureau followed the tradition of home furnishing stores using oversized pieces of furniture as roadside advertisements. The High Point dresser was first built in 1926 and at the time was known as the "Bureau of Information."

It was restored in 1996 as a 19th-century Queen Anne-style piece, with four wide drawers and silver handles. Out of the centre drawer hung a mismatched pair of neon-coloured socks, each six feet long to also remind passers-by of the town's hosiery industry. At nearly 40 feet tall, the colossal chest was roughly the size of a large house or small building, which in fact is precisely what it was, as the bureau was actually the facade of an office space.

THINKING ABOUT FEELINGS

When someone comes along to counselling and begins to talk about what is troubling them, one of the

difficulties that sometimes emerges is their sense of having feelings that are 'bad' or 'wrong'. Perhaps they have been experiencing feelings of anger, or frustration, or maybe sadness, or regret. They may see such feelings as negative or self-pitying, and not compatible with being a good and kind and positive person. They wish these feelings would just go away. But, however much they try to wish them away, the feelings stubbornly persist. So then they experience shame and anxiety about having what they see as such negative feelings, and this shame and anxiety gets added to the mix, and just makes everything worse.

Counselling can offer us time and space in which we can talk about, and think about, all the different aspects of our emotional life, without using labels like positive or negative, right or wrong, good or bad. Instead, the counsellor provides a non-judgemental relationship, in which all aspects of our emotional experience can be heard and thought about. If we can slow things down a bit, begin to make sense of our feelings, and see them as an unsurprising response to aspects of our life experience, they are much less likely to cause us anxiety.

Gradually, we become more able to manage our feelings and get on with our lives, instead of our feelings managing us, perhaps by making us anxious or irritable or unconfident or withdrawn. We learn to accept that, if we face difficult and challenging situations in the future then, naturally, we are bound to experience difficult and challenging feelings within ourselves. And when we have to bear particularly difficult circumstances or events in our lives, there is no shame in seeking support to work through our feelings about them.


A counsellor is able to sustain an open and accepting attitude to another person's feelings, without anxiety getting in the way, because, through their own training and personal development, they accept that having emotional responses to life's events is a part of what it is to be human. Perhaps then, the more accepting and tolerant we can be towards our own emotional life, the more kindly and accepting we are able to be towards the feelings of others.

If you are a member of an approved private health insurance scheme, you may get a tax credit. This tax credit is generally granted directly by the insurance company. Your premium will be reduced by the amount of the tax credit so you will probably not even notice that you have got a tax credit. This is known as Tax Relief at Source (TRS). However, in some limited situations TRS does not apply, for example, where an employer pays the medical insurance premiums on behalf of an employee. This is treated as a Benefit in Kind and PAYE, PRSI and USC are due on the total amount. This means that the employee does not benefit from the TRS on the medical insurance premium and can make a claim directly to Revenue.

The relief is limited to the cost of the policy up to a maximum of €1,000 per adult and €500 per child. A child is considered to be a person under 21 years of age, whether or not they are in full-time education as long as a child premium has been paid for them. For individuals 21 years of age and over, you can now claim relief at the amount set for adults, even if they are getting a child premium.

The relief is given at the standard rate of 20%.

GARDENING **JTLOOK**

FOCUS ON EARLY SPRING FLOWERING SHRUBS

Now is a good time if you are planning a new garden or trying to add some colour to an established garden to plant some early flowering spring shrubs. One of the best known shrubs is the Camellia and these popular shrubs are starting to flower in most places at the moment. The Camellia is a very valuable shrub in the garden as it can give a focal point to any shrubbery all year round with its glossy green leaves and showy blooms from early spring. A lot of people think that Camellias are a difficult shrub to grow, but in fact they are no more difficult than Rhododendrons or azaleas, and most varieties on sale now are hardy. When choosing the spot to plant your Camellia, make sure it is sheltered from cold winds as they can damage the flowering buds as can frost. When planting your Camellia make sure to mix plenty of moss peat with the earth, rather than on its own around the plant, as it will tend to root out quicker. Camellias are also ideal for growing in containers. Remember if you are planting your Camellia in the ground, that it might be small initially but most will grow to the size of a small tree, so allow plenty of room around it. There is very little maintenance with Camellias only to prune out old dead wood, clean up the old blooms that fall to the ground, and to mulch around the base of the plants every spring with some moss peat. There are a lot of other good spring flowering shrubs, here is a list of just a few: Forsythia, Cythisus, Corylus, Berberis, Darwunnii, Ribes and Skimmia. Next week I will focus on hedging.
