This year's Ireland BikeFest 2017 which takes place this weekend is set to welcome a record number of woman bikers from all over the world.

EMMA WINS NATIONAL ESSAY WRITING COMPETITION

A Killarney student who won a national essaywriting competition was surprised on the double when legendary Kerry footballer Mick O'Connell turned up to present the award and Martin Luther King's niece Alveda King sent a video message to congratulate her.

Emma Dineen, a 6th year pupil at St Brigid's Presentation Secondary School, took first place in the 2017 Life Advocate Awards.

The annual essay-writing competition aims to encourage research and critical-thinking on human rights and right to life issues. This year students were asked to discuss the words of Dr Martin Luther King Jnr who said: "Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about the things that matter". Emma's essay drew from science, history and world politics to make a case for speaking up for the right to life of the unborn. It was these qualities that made her the 2017 winner.

Emma is an avid footballer who plays for Kerry. During the school's annual awards ceremony Mick O'Connell surprised staff and students at St Brigid's when he arrived to present with her

Life Advocate Award. In his address to over 500 students and staff Mick said Emma had written about a subject in her essay that is very close to his heart. "I myself have a boy with Down Syndrome. In various countries at the present time in England and Wales, for example, over 90% of children who could be born with the prospect of Down Syndrome are aborted prior to going to full-term. In Denmark they are aiming that no Down Syndrome child will ever be born in that country again. Currently in Iceland a child with Down Syndrome is not to be seen. "My Down Syndrome boy Diarmuid was born in the 1970s and has been the greatest gift that has ever happened to me. He has brought wonderful delight to my life, even the very thought of him brings happiness to me." A personal video message of congratulations from Dr Martin Luther King Jnr's niece, Dr Alveda King, was also played for Emma during the presentation.

King said Emma was a worthy winner and a clear advocate for life She said: "Her essay was inspiring. I hope she will continue demonstrating her passion and understanding of the importance of the right to life. I wish to congratulate Emma and the staff at St Brigid's Secondary School for their courage and commitment to the cause of human rights".



The rainy morning didn't dampen spirits as cyclists embarked on a challenging 110km or 140km route which encompassed the magnificent mountains, valleys and the rugged coastline of the Beara peninsula.

Cyclists passed through picturesque and quaint towns, including Ardgroom, Eyeries, Castletownbere, Adrigole and Glengarriff. SADDLE UP FOR STEPHANIE

This year will be the 6th year of Stephanie O'Sullivan's Memorial Cycle which will take place this Sunday June 4th 2017 Stephanie tragically lost her life at the age of 20 years while attending the ITTralee in November 2011. The loss of this beautiful young and vibrant lady left a devastating shock and heartache to all who had the pleasure of knowing her. The O'Sullivan family have created an annual charity cycle in aid of suicide prevention to save another family from going through the turmoil of losing a loved one to suicide.

The cycle starts and finishes at The Nagle Centre in Milltown. Cyclists can register is on the day. The cycle starts at 10am sharp on Sunday the 4th of June and the entry fee is $\in 20$.

The cycle incorporates two distances of 40km and 80km. It offers a wonderful opportunity for novice cyclists and for cyclists training for the Ring of Kerry. Last year's cycle saw over 600 people taking part and the event is growing in popularity every year. However, it's no mean feat staging such an event as over 70 stewards will put their shoulders to the wheel, putting up signs and ensuring the route is clearly mapped for cyclists. All cyclists and volunteers will enjoy a barbecue and live music afterwards, making sure it's well worth the spin. "There's a lot of work goes into the cycle that no one sees and all the effort and support is greatly appreciated as the proceeds are in aid of two worthy charities The Samaritans and Killorglin Mental Health Association," Dan Joe O'Sullivan told the Killarney Outlook. The family would like to send heartfelt thanks to all the cyclists, sponsors and volunteers who assist to make Stephanie's Memorial cycle a continued success.

CONCERNS OVER JAPANESE KNOTWEED



At the May 2017 meeting of Kerry County Council, Councillor Michael Gleeson asked: "What measures are Kerry County Council taking to publicly identify sites where Japanese Knotweed is growing and thereafter to eliminate this scourge that continues to spread?" Kerry County Council replied that is has an ongoing public awareness programme in order to ensure that the public can recognise the plant and refrain from cutting, flailing or breaking it.

There is a treatment programme along the national road network and there is involvement with local communities on pilot projects.

There is a special emphasis on the training of council staff and of hedge cutting contractors to ensure that they can recognise Japanese Knotweed and refrain from cutting it. The erection of signage is an ongoing feature of the public education programme and 5,000 information leaflets have been issued to landowners.

Councillor Gleeson welcomed the positive steps being taken but he stressed that there is a need to become involved with landowners in whose land the Japanese Knotweed is growing, as there is a strong possibility that it entered the land from a roadside stand of the plant. He stressed the importance of a united and concerted effort by all interested parties as the only way in which the Knotweed invasion can be tackled and hopefully overcome.

NEAT STREETS ALL THE WAY FOR SEM BOYS

St. Brendan's College, Killarney recently was awarded the Neat Streets certification from An Taisce for their efforts in an anti-litter and waste management campaign run within the school during the academic year. The Neat Streets programme is designed to facilitate and develop leadership, project management, citizenship and communication skills among students, through the design and implementation of an anti-litter and waste campaign.





together to promote positive mental health. I congratulate all involved in the creation of this plan." Minister McEntee concluded, "This Kerry suicide prevention plan sets out a roadmap to address suicide and self-harm. It is important that we all continue to work together, at all levels, to identify people at risk and to ensure that appropriate services are in place to provide the help and support needed. If we do this, I believe that we will achieve our goal of fewer lives lost to suicide."

National League Mens Basketball will return to Killarney for the 2017-18 season following an absence of almost a decade. Basketball reland confirmed on Monday that the St. Paul's Basketball Club application for a place in the Division One Mens league has been accepted. St. Vincent's competed in the national league until 1987. St Paul's Basketball Club (founded in 1985) first entered the national league in 1993 and competed at Superleague level until 2008.

Gardai in Killarney are advising that The National Crime Prevention Campaign of 2017 entitled 'Summertime Home Security' will commence in June 2017.

This initiative will coincide with the June Bank Holiday weekend and promotional events will run from 1st to 8th June 2017.

The primary aim of the 'Summertime Home Security' campaign will be to engage with and raise awareness amongst the community on ways to prevent home burglaries this summer. This includes general home security advice and advice on securing vacant homes during the holiday period.

This campaign is designed to facilitate the delivery of a tailored crime prevention programme to the community.

ADVICE FROM AN GARDA SIOCHANA Home Security

1. Whether at home or going out, turn on some lights, use timer switches

2. Lock all doors and windows, almost 1 in 4 Summer time burglaries involve entry through an unsecured access point

3. Use your house alarm

4. Store keys safely; away from windows and letterboxes

5. Record details of valuables and don't keep large cash amounts at home

Vacant Houses

If your home is going to be vacant during the summer period;

1. Ask a trusted neighbour or family member to conduct frequent checks of the property at different times of the day to note any signs of



trespassing or interference

2. Ensure the house alarm is set

3. Check all doors and windows are secure. (Use deadbolt locks if property is to be vacant for long periods)

4. Install timers on internal lights and motion detectors on external lights to make the

house appear occupied and offer natural surveillance of the property

 Ensure that the building doesn't look neglected. Cut the grass, trim hedges etc.
 Ask a neighbour to collect post or if you are going to be away for longer periods arrange a 'mail minder' service with An Post to retain post for collection and place a 'No Junk

Mail' sign on letter-box 7. Inform the local Garda station about the premises being vacant to afford passing attention on patrols Social Media

If you are going on holiday and your home is going to be vacant, be mindful of what you post

on social media. Even if you have enabled strict privacy settings, your holiday plans could be shared with unscrupulous people.

1. Don't post status updates about your holidays while you're still away

2. Don't post pictures while you're away

3. Respect other people's privacy, don't tag others while you and they are on holidays

4. Avoid posting upcoming travel plans

5. Consider turning off the location sharing setting of your phone's camera app

Garden/ Landscaping

1. Don't help the burglar; safely store away ladders, tools etc

2. Use quality locks on Garden sheds, chain valuable property, tools, bikes, etc within

3. Property mark and photograph valuable possessions

4. Tidy up gardens and shrubbery, this improves visibility and creates the illusion of an occupied home

5. Consider defensive planting, e.g. thorny plants around the perimeter, for extra security A barrier of prickly hedge along your boundary or underneath a window will help deter thieves. Hedges and shrubs in the front garden should be kept to a height of no more than 3 feet in order to avoid giving a burglar a screen behind which he can conceal himself.



FOCUS ON HERBACEOUS PERENNIALS

Now is the time of the year when Herbaceous Perennials come into their own having flourished in a short space of time. Herbaceous Perennials are excellent plants for your garden as they flower from early spring right through to late autumn. Herbaceous plants can suit many different locations from shade to dry shade to full sun. They are also an excellent plant to be used as ground cover. One of the most popular are geraniums, which come in a wide range of colours – an excellent one would be called Johnson's Blue. Another good choice would be a plant called Anthemis, which has white or yellow daisy like flowers. Even if the flowers fade in Herbaceous plants, don't be afraid to cut the dead flowers back or in some cases, cut the plant back- as it will grow quite quickly again. Don't forget to stake taller herbaceous plants to keep them from falling out onto the lawns and pathways and finally, a good tip for herbaceous plants is to plant them in groups rather than singly as this will give you a striking display of colour.





Because fact is that if those muscles are already tight and you go pounding on them more with exercise and no flexility they are just going to tighten up more and more and cause massive problems later on in your joints and poor ole back. Simply put, If one muscle group is tight, it's going to cause another group to become weak. This will cause joint mobility problems and eventual pain. So my first step would be to lengthen the tight muscles and getting the joints to move freely, and then get the body moving better by strengthening weakened muscles and keeping those over worked ones stretched and behaving !!!



EDUCATION OUTLOOK The waiting is over. It's time to give a sterling performance at the State Exams



(By Billy Ryle)

The state exams begin next Wednesday, 7th June for about 120,000 candidates, so this is the final weekend for major revision. Stick to your study plan on Saturday and Sunday while concentrating on subjects being examined during the first week. As the exams run into the second and third weeks, the optional subjects are nicely spaced out allowing free days for study.

Leaving Cert candidates should prioritise last minute work in English, Home Economics, Engineering, Geography and Mathematics Paper One and

get it done by Sunday night. Likewise Junior Cert candidates should do the same in English, CSPE, Irish, Geography and Maths Paper One. On Monday, concentrate on the tips and predictions that have been made for subjects being examined on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Don't cram on the days before the exam as this may cause confusion and is physically tiring.

Spent an hour or two on Tuesday skimming over your notes for Wednesday's exams and leave it at that. A period of relaxed leisure will be more beneficial than spending the day cramming material that you may not recall anyway. Your most important asset going into the exam is a clear and alert mind. Remember that exams test not only your knowledge but also your staying power.

On the evening before each paper spend an hour or so looking over your notes so that the important concepts and ideas are fresh in your mind. Heavy study sessions on the night prior to any paper are not a good idea as you will be exhausted the following morning. Instead, relax and get a good night's rest. Put all thoughts of the following day's exam out of your mind. If you find it difficult to sleep try a little non-academic reading for a short while.

Over the next few days check your equipment and assemble your exam materials – biros, pencils, ruler, eraser, drawing instruments, calculator and so on. Always have at least two biros or fountain pens in case one runs out of ink or doesn't work properly. It's time, too, to organise your personal needs such as a watch and tissues.

A few nerves are normal on the first day.



You might feel a little tense so be prepared to deal with it. Perhaps a relaxation exercise or maybe a shower to freshen up will do the trick. Eat a nutritious breakfast as you'll need the extra reserves of energy. Finally, go through your equipment checklist before you leave home.

On Wednesday morning arrive at the exam centre at least a half hour before the exam begins. For all subsequent exams be present about fifteen minutes before the appointed time. Spend the few minutes before entering the exam centre on your own in peace and quiet. At all costs, avoid groups which are involved in last minute revision. If you need to, use the bathroom before you enter the exam centre. Be in your seat a few moments before the exam is due to begin. Synchronise your watch with the clock on the wall and use your watch to help you pace your work. Check your seat and desk for firmness and stability. A shaky desk will torment you and distract you during the exam. When the answer book is distributed, fill in your exam number and the other required details. Read the directions on the back cover. This will help you relax and focus your mind on the task in hand. When you receive your question paper read the instructions carefully in case there is any change of format. Don't be put off by your first glance at the paper. It's new and it will look unfamiliar at first. Once the exam begins, keep to your prepared answering plan and address the questions which are asked.

If you finish a paper before the time is up, do not leave the exam centre. Recheck your work and extra information may come to you. Attempt an extra question only when you have thoroughly answered the previous questions. Once an exam is over, spend as little time as possible on a post-mortem. Focus on the next paper and when the entire exam is over forget about it and enjoy your summer. There is no advantage in dwelling on what might have been. Every candidate, no matter how brilliant, will feel that s/he could have done better if only s/he had done this or that. Be happy and satisfied that you have done your best. Good luck to all candidates starting exams next week.

WORKERS CAN ACCRUE ANNUAL LEAVE WHILE **ON LONG-TERM SICK LEAVE**

The Government in 2014 approved amendments to Sections 19, 20 and 23 of the Organisation of Working Time Act 1997 to bring the Act into line with rulings of the Court of Justice of the European Union in relation to the accrual of annual leave entitlement during sick leave.

These provisions of the Workplace Relations Act have commenced as of August 1, 2015.

The amendments to the 1997 Act provide as follows:

- Annual leave entitlement accrues during a period of certified sick leave.
- An annual leave carryover period of 15 months after a leave year will apply to those employees who could not, due to illness, take annual leave during the relevant leave year or during the normal carryover period of 6 months.

 On termination of employment, payment in lieu of untaken annual leave will apply to leave which was untaken as a result of illness in circumstances where the employee leaves the employment within a period of 15 months following the end of the leave year during which the leave entitlement arose

If an employee has been on sick leave before 1 August 2015 then they will not accrue annual leave over that time.



For the past five years there has been an awareness campaign to change minds around mental health. There are many campaigns with different coloured ribbons across the globe. This green ribbon campaign is aimed at starting the conversation around the stigma attached to Mental Health issues. What do we mean by stigma? It is when we hold an attitude or feeling that is judgemental about a circumstance or a quality or a person. In fact a definition actually uses Menatl Health as an example of stigma, so we know that it is really an issue so close to people's lived experience of how they have felt judged or hurt by having any mental health issues. Otherwise why would there need to be a campaign to counter-act the judgements people have about someone who may be dealing with mental health problems.

As a counselling centre we are witness to some

clients often struggling with other peoples view or judgements around them seeking help for mental health issues. It has often taken great courage to ask for help, and it becomes really important for the person's extended family to support without judgement.

The Green Ribbon campaign, along with others like "it's Ok to not be OK' have really begun to change attitudes to asking for help and reducinh Stigma with Mental Health. If you would like more information the http://www.greenribbon.ie/about-the-greenribbon website has more information.

Some guidelines from the website are

You don't need to be an expert to start talking about mental health or have all the answers. Sometimes the most helpful thing you can do is to let someone know that you are there for him or her and simply listen.

• Talk, but listen too: Simply being there will mean a lot.

• Take your lead from the person: As a first step, ask them how best you can help.

• Avoid the clichés: Phrases like 'Cheer up', 'I'm sure it'll pass' and 'Pull yourself together' definitely won't help - Being open minded, non-judgemental and listening will.

• Keep in touch: There are lots of small ways of showing support - Send a text or just ask someone how they are doing.

So in the this month of Spring moving towards a green summer, grab a ribbon and 'Start the conversation'. Every single person can make a difference by changing attitudes to mental health in the same way as we would to someone having any medical issue, we would have empathy, concern and support. Not judgement or stigma. Asking for help shows courage, not weakness. We need to value help-seeking behaviour, especially for men and boys.

TIPS FOR TRAVELING WITH YOUR PET

* Always make sure your dog or cat has proper identification before leaving for your destination! A sturdy collar with an ID tag containing the pet's name and the owner's phone number is a must. Also, it's a good idea to bring a spare leash just in case something happens to your main one.

* Your pet's emotions can easily be affected by yours, so no matter the situation, you should strive to stay calm. No loud voices, fighting or screaming. Pets can pick up on all of that. Difficult situations may arise while traveling, which is why it's important to remember to stay mindful—your pet is traveling with you too.

* A lot of pets don't mind car rides, but unfortunately some do. Depending on the length of the car trip, there are different types of medications you can get from your Vet to give your pet to make the drive less anxiety-ridden for him or her. There are medications to make your pet sleepy and relaxed, as well as meds to help with nausea.

Many dogs get car sick and throw up, which is why it's always good to have a towel on the seat underneath the dog to prevent a messy and expensive cleanup! Cats should always be contained in a carrier or crate, no matter what distance you are going. They may not like it, though. And when cats are not pleased, the meowing never ends. With that being said, soothing voices telling your kitty it will be OK, and low music, help to calm them. * Make sure the car windows are only about one quarter open so your dog cannot jump out and never leave your pet unattended in a vehicle, no matter how short of a time you might be gone.

* Almost all pets have a special toy or blanket that they sleep with or carry around. Like small children, it is comforting for your pet to have access to his or her toy/blanket at all times when traveling. A small toy that you can stick in your pet's carrier with him or her could totally make the trip more bearable. This would ease your pet's stress—and make it a more enjoyable process for you!

* Water needs to always be available for your pet, make frequent stops offering your pet some hydration.

* Bring food, treats, a bowl, leashes, first aid, medication (if needed), plastic bags and favoured toys when traveling. You don't need to go all out and overpack, but a smallish kit that is able to fit all of the necessities for your pet would work well.

TEACHERS WRITE ENCOURAGING LETTER TO STUDENTS BEFORE EXAMS

In 1999 Mary Ginley, a teacher at Buckton Vale Primary School in England, expressed these encouraging sentiments to her students, and her letter has become something of a model for other teachers letters around the world for all the right reasons. I have simply removed the name of the tests to make it more suitable for students of all ages in Ireland.

"Dearest Students,

Next week you will take your exams, I know how hard you have worked, but there is something very important you must know.

The exams do not assess all of what makes you special and unique. The people who create these tests and score them do not know each of you like I do, and certainly not the way your families do.

They do not know that some of you speak two languages, or that you love to sing or draw. They have not seen your natural talent for dancing. They do not know that your friends count on you to be there for them, that you laughter can brighten the darkest day, or that your face turns red when you feel shy. They do not know that you participate in sports, wonder about the future, or sometimes you help with your little brother or little sister after school. They do not know that you are kind, trustworthy, and thoughtful... and every day you try your very best.

The scores you will get from these tests will tell you something, but they will not tell you everything. These tests do not define you. There are many ways of being smart. YOU are smart! You are enough! You are the light that brightens my day and the reason I am happy to come to work each day. So, in the midst of all of these tests, remember that there is no way to "test" all of the amazing and awesome things that make you, YOU.

All I ask is that you do your personal best and do not give up. You have been working for this since infants and are ready! I believe in you!"

STANDARD DRINK MEASURE CUP INTRODUCED IN IRELAND TO ENCOURAGE RESPONSIBLE DRINKING AT HOME

Drinkaware has introduced a standard drink measure cup in Ireland in an attempt to encourage responsible drinking at home.

The introduction of the drink measure cup is part of a Drinkaware campaign calling on people to carefully monitor their alcohol consumption following on from some worrying findings in a Behaviour and Attitudes study of Irish attitudes towards alcohol.

The study revealed, for example, that one in two people believe that drinking to excess is 'no big deal' and 73% of Irish people believe that drinking to excess is just a part of Irish culture.

The cup enables those drinking at home to accurately measure spirits, wine and beer in line with standard drinks measures. Common examples of standard drinks measures are a glass of beer, a pub measure of spirits and a small (100ml) glass of wine; all based on average strength drinks.

The cup is intended to help people make healthier lifestyle choices around alcohol consumption and drink within the HSE guidelines, which are 11 standard drinks (110g pure alcohol) spread out over the week for women and 17 standard drinks (170g pure alcohol) for men.

Drinking above these guidelines and in particular, binge drinking (consuming six or more standard drinks in one sitting), further increases the risks already associated with alcohol.

SAUDI WOMAN DEFIED DRIVING BAN TO SAVE MAN'S LIFE

Saudi Arabia is the only country where women are not allowed to drive – but that didn't stop 20-year-old Ashwaq al-Shamri from getting behind the wheel to save her bus driver's life.

Ashwaq and her female friends were being transported home from university when the driver said that he felt dizzy. When he suddenly pulled over, the girls leapt into action, helping him off of the bus and running to a nearby store to get him cold water.

Because the nearest hospital was miles away, Ashwaq drove the man to his house where his family were able to transport him the rest of the way.

The student said that her father taught her how to drive when she was a youngster so she could help out on their farm. Her father, upon hearing the news of her rescue, was extraordinarily proud of his daughter.

7-YEAR-OLD GIRL TORMENTED BY BULLY FOR MONTHS.

Social media today is one of the biggest influences for people, businesses, and organisations. A simple photograph or bout of words has the power to reach millions all over the world, gaining immense viral attention. And even though there are several negative connotations to this notion, there is also an equal amount of positive things that can arise from the use of social media.

A young girl named Ashley, only 7 years old, admitted to her mother, Christine, that she was being bullied by an 11-year-old boy in her neighbourhood, and that it had been going on for several months. Her mother, hoping to make a difference, set up a Facebook page so that awareness could be brought to the subject of bullying.

A group of bikers became aware of the situation, gathered together and decided that they would visit Christine and Ashley's home with their bikes in order to show solidarity and support.




