With his sights now on the Dublin City Marathon, Patrick Eviston completed the Cork City Marathon with his running partner and friend Marcin Szczurek.

"We are delighted that Patrick chose us to benefit from his third marathon" Breda Dyland, Service Manager, Kerry Cancer Support Group - Healthlink Transport told Killarney Outlook.

"We are not part of a national organisation and don't receive statutory funding so are dependent on local support. These funds will go directly into our Healthlink transport services which are becoming busier every day especially now with the fuel prices rising all the time. Individuals just can't afford to drive themselves so that's where we come in. Our fuel costs have doubled since the start of the year and Patrick's fundraiser came at a very welcome time. We are very thankful to him and to all of those who supported him", Breda added.

Field of Dreams.... KILLARNEY VALLEY AC ARENA IS OFFICIALLY OPENED

Hundreds attended the The official opening ceremony of the Killarney Valley AC Arena on Saturday last 27th of August.

The arena is situated in the grounds of St. Brendan's College in the heart of the school area of Killarney'

Cathaoirleach of Killarney Municipal Area Niall Kelliher spoke glowingly of the "field of dreams" initiative and his long held support for the project. Minister Norma Foley delivered a motivating speech thanking Killarney Valley AC, it's friends and the Diocese of Kerry for such an initiative to be located, in the centre of the school area. She spoke of her support for the club's encouragement of female participation in, where two thirds of the club members are female and with a special mention for those with disabilities. Role models like Sarah Leahy, Ciara Kennelly, Maddie Wilson Walker and Jordan Lee all help to encourage inclusion and break the stigma for those from an early age and demonstrate a pathway to elite competition on a level playing field for all.

Jeremiah Griffin outlined the history, the present and the future and thanked the volunteers, sponsors, SKDP, Department of sport and Kerry county council aid from the community strategic support fund. Jeremiah also thanked Clan Credo for the loan to cover the balance of finance required during construction, in order for full completion. This amounts to €80,000 and efforts are constant as the group works to keep it on track. Principal of St. Brendan's, Sean Coffey spoke of his delight at the decision to finally locate the facility on the grounds of St. Brendan's college by the St. Brendan's Trust. John Hickey of Hickey design, Leonard Moran and associates QS, Tom Collins of Moloney contracts, FDC accountants



Killarney and Maurice Coffey solicitor were also acknowledged on the day for a job well done and for their services.

Bishop Ray Browne blessed the facility and spoke warmly of the reasons for the St.Brendan's Trust support. Minister Norma Foley cut the ribbon to laud applause and fan fair. From there like the First Olympics in Athens the exhibition events begun. Tomas Griffin introduced the CEO of athletics Ireland Hamish Adams who spoke of his support for the club and it's ambitions and in a well choreographed event, everybody were then enthralled.

Long Jumpers exceeded 23ft, high jumpers clearing 6ft, Sarah Leahy racing to over 35km per hour, Conor Gammell to 38km km per hour. Jason O'Reilly sprinted an exhibition 300m, Oisin Lynch and Jack O'Leary racing a 1km race on 2 mins 34 seconds with plenty in the tank. To put the 1km in perspective at that pace it would guarantee a final place in a 5,000m Olympic Games running low 13 minutes.

The public were hosted to Tea and Coffee provided on the day by Nave coffee and the classic 1982 Toyota starlet was on show by Tom Leslie of the Killarney valley and classic vintage club which is being raffled in support of the the facility amongst other beneficiaries.

A great day was had by all with the future looking bright from a brave team of pioneers, whom started the discussion over forty years ago with honorary Killarney valley ac president Mrs. Eileen Switzer and her late husband Mr. Frank Switzer and most recently from the team in 2013 up to the present.

BATTY OR WHAT: Bat commuting home is more important than a human home

From now on, don't overlook the bats is my suggestion. Particularly if you want to preserve your residential area and don't want to wake up one morning surrounded, overshadowed and in an even worse queue for traffic.

I am partly summarizing the concerns of fifty submissions to the 228 unit development in the infill site 100 metres opposite the Demesne in what was Killarney's first fast-track planning application. This Strategic Housing Development legislation was to address the chronic housing situation that even the Tanaiste and the president acknowledge now is a disaster in this so-called Republic.

Killarney's dire need for housing is reflected on how most young people now are migrating to satellite towns like Barraduff and Milltown and Rathmore because of the dire shortage. Hotels can't attract staff because they have nowhere to stay.

But the answer surely is not to over-pack Killarney sites either.

And density - in this case higher than what is allowed in the town plan - was of major and indeed natural concern to residents in their submissions to the Port/Margaret Road proposal.

However the inspector who compiled the report considered by the Board found no grounds there - there was efficient use of land, he said.

He also had little truck with natural concerns about overlooking. It was understandable there may be "perceived overlooking but that is harder to quantify than actual overlooking," is what he said rather philosophically.

But at the end of the day it was a "commuting bat" that did for what most people would agree was much needed but perhaps a bit too dense housing for Killarney, all within reach of schools, shops and park.

The Lesser Horseshoe Bat (let's give him the status of capitals) has "greater" needs than the human in planning decisions in contemporary

Ireland. When he commutes home by the Deenagh he does not want to be disturbed by too much artificial light. The irony is the strong advice to refuse this housing application on the single grounds of the commuting bat came from the heritage section of the Department of Housing! You would hardly believe it. But I have been forwarded the document and I quote:

The Department (Housing, Local Government and Heritage) recommends that An Bord Pleanála refuses to grant permission for the proposed development for the heritagerelated reasons outlined below" it said going on to list the Lesser Horseshoe Bat (Rhinolophus hipposideros).

"This species, which has a significant roost nearby, uses the candidate SAC woodland to the west of the Deenagh River for commuting and foraging, and is susceptible to disturbance by lighting," the Department said.

Badger disturbance was also listed as a reason for refusal.

Interestingly, the Department of Housing was also worried about the increased footfall on the Demesne.

"Although there are several sporting facilities nearby, which would satisfy recreational needs of some of the residents in the proposed development, nevertheless, the likely increased recreational pressure from this development on Killarney National Park needs to be assessed in the Ecological Impact Assessment (EcIA)," it said.

And case you run out of bats, the following bat species have been recorded within the 10 km square, I have learned:

• Brown long-eared bat • Daubenton's bat • Leisler's bat • Lesser horseshoe bat • Natterer's bat • Common pipistrelle • Soprano pipistrelle • Whiskered bat.

The second great irony is Lesser Horseshoe Bat populations are increasing, significantly; but there is no admission of this anywhere. As for housing needs for Killarney people, an entirely new application under entirely new legislation is required now.

According to a spokeswoman for An Bord Pleanala:

"This SHD application was refused permission on 22nd August, 2022. The Board are no longer receiving direct applications under the Strategic Housing Legislation. However, it is open to the applicant to make a new planning application if they so wish directly to the planning authority under Large Scale Development (LRD) legislation. Any such application may address the reasons for refusal by An Bord Pleanála in relation to the proposed development."

Is it time we got realistic about Irish and the teaching of Irish? After on average 13 years of daily lessons, people emerge from the education system with barely being able to say Cad is ainm duit? Are we codding ourselves? Now we see where the language enthusiasts and unions are up in arms over the very sensible proposal by Education Minister, Kerry's own Norma Foley, to bring Irish Paper One forward by a year. This is to take some of the pressure off Leaving Certs. What possible difference can a year make when the whole mission is hopeless and going nowhere anyway?

Let me explain, I have a degree in Irish and I am interested in the language but since my early 20s I have held the view that what we should be teaching in our schools is Irish studies, not the very artificial language that passes for Leaving Cert and school Irish. It really is no language at all. Instead of all this Tuiseal Ginideach, if we had a bit of the language, a bit of the literature, the music, history and such we could ignite a real interest.

Never more so is this needed than now when about a quarter of the population is non native Irish. There is also the central persuasive fact of how often have you heard Irish in Killarney? You are far more likely to hear Polish, Russian, Ukrainian or Urdu than Irish on the streets and in the shops of Killarney. Three weeks ago and for the first time ever I heard a woman shopper speaking Irish to her children in Tescos and I actually turned around and said it to her, I was so surprised.

We need to find a better solution and our bright young people deserve better than preserving a bad curriculum.

BOOST FOR KILLARNEY as early opening of bypass being predicted

The likelihood of the Macroom bypass opening this October is great news. According to some reports An Taoiseach Micheal Martin, a regular visitor to Killarney, is anxious to open it before he steps down as Taoiseach. Regardless of who opens it, the bypass will be tremendous. We have had a long wait and the real credit has to go to Kerry politicians especially Fine Gael's Brendan Griffin who as a junior minister made it a priority.

The journey to Cork will take under an hour now which will bring airport and port as well as colleges and jobs into easy commuting reach for the human population not just for Killarney but all of Kenmare and south Kerry.

A of insurers now include breakdown rescue or recovery on their private car insurance policies. It is important to check your own terms, as there could be limitations as to the age of vehicle that can

get this cover. Also some insurers only give breakdown with "comprehensive cover".

Usually the following kinds of breakdown would be covered:

Mechanical breakdown, fire, theft or attempted

theft, malicious damage, punctures that need help to fix or to replace a wheel, lost keys, stolen keys and keys broken in the lock or keys locked into the car.

Cover applies in the 32 counties of Ireland and in England, Scotland and Wales. There may be restrictions to cover for finishing your journey if it's outside Ireland.

The following benefits are normally included • Roadside assistance: The insurer will send a competent repairer to help you at the scene and usually provide 1 hour's labour.

• Towing: Cover is provided to tow the car to the nearest motor garage or to your own garage.

• Finishing the journey: Transport can be

arranged to reach the final destination. There are also benefits such as accommodation while you are waiting for repairs to be finished.

• Theft of your car: A replacement car can be provided if your car has been stolen and not recovered within 24 hours.

A claim under the breakdown section will not affect your no claims bonus.

It is crucial to check your own breakdown policy wording as some insurers will only cover breakdown away from your private residence. Some insurers impose maximum ages for vehicles that can benefit from breakdown cover.

MARY JO CURRAN ACKNOWLEDGED AT THE GPA LEGENDS LUNCH

The Gaelic Players Association Legends Lunch in association with Cliona's Foundation was held in Croke Park on Friday last. This Lunch was held to honour Mary Jo Curran, Angela Downey, Babs Keating and Jimmy Keaveney. Kerry's Mary Jo Curran and Kilkenny's Angela Downey are the first female players to be recognised in this way by the GPA who have now merged with the WGPA.

The event was hosted by Cliona's Foundation patron and RTÉ star Miriam O'Callaghan along with her RTÉ colleague and Gaelic games presenter Damian Lawlor. They were joined by a number of special guests at this Lunch. Mary Jo Curran is one of the all-time greats of Gaelic football. In total she won 10 All-Ireland titles as a player, including being part of 9 All-Ireland wins in-a-row in a golden age for the Kingdom. She also won 10 All-Stars in that time.

Angela Downey is considered by many as camogie's best of all-time. In a career that spanned 25 seasons with Kilkenny, she

amassed 12 All-Ireland titles, 13 Leinster titles and 8 National League titles. She was

also named on the Camogie Team of the Century chosen at left corner-forward.

Michael 'Babs' Keating is an iconic

name in the hurling world but it should not be forgotten he also lined out for the Tipperary senior footballers. However, it

was with the hurlers where he enjoyed more success winning 2 All-Irelands medals as a player and being named on the inaugural All Star team of 1971. He was also the

Texaco Hurler of the Year in that year. As a manager he also led Tipp to 2 All-Ireland titles.

Jimmy Keaveney enjoys legendary status among, not alone Dublin supporters, but supporters across the country. A 3-time All-Ireland winner, he was a key component of the Dublin team that won

Sam Maguire in 1974, 1976 and 1977. Jimmy won the Texaco Footballer of the Year in

both of those latter two All-Ireland winning years.

The GPA Legends Lunch was organised in association with Limerick based, national charity Cliona's Foundation (clionas.ie). Cliona's Foundation provides financial assistance to families with children who have life limiting conditions to help them with the significant non-medical costs of caring for their child while in hospital or at home. KERRY STUDENTS SHOULD CELEBRATE EXCELLENT LEAVING CERT RESULTS BUT MUST **KEEP A CLOSE EYE ON A FAST-MOVING TIMELINE**

The 2022 Leaving Cert cohort exhaled a collective sigh of relief today, Friday, 2nd September, when the exam results were finally issued at 10am by the State Examinations Commission (SEC) directly to candidates through the Candidate Self Service Portal (CSSP). Leaving Cert results were simultaneously issued to candidates' schools at 10am.

EXCELLENT

The early indications are that Leaving Cert results in Kerry are excellent. When it comes to achievement in the Leaving Cert and securing places in Higher Education, Kerry students are top of the Class. While success should be celebrated, it's important to consider your options during the next few days and to keep a very close eye on the fast-moving timeline. CAO offers will flood into Kerry when Round One is released at 14.00 on the 8th September and important decisions will have to be made about your next step.

REASONS

For a number of reasons, the issue of the results this year is later than would normally be the case. There was a deferred sitting of the Leaving Cert exam in July for students unable to sit exams in June due to serious accident, injury or illness, close family bereavement or Covid-19. With the number of candidates taking the Leaving Cert exam this year increased to 63,383 from 61,265 in 2021, more examiners were needed and the SEC found it difficult to recruit a sufficient number of examiners this year. 1,979 candidates from Kerry applied for the 2022 Leaving Cert exam compared to 1,806 who took the exam in 2021. The Government has also given a commitment that the 2022 Leaving Cert exam results will, on aggregate, be no lower than the 2021 results. The SEC said that this extra time was needed to ensure that the results were adjusted accordingly.

MARKS

Candidates can see their marks, including marks for each component on the CSSP from 12.00 on Tuesday, 6th September. Candidates can apply on the CSSP to view their scripts online from 17.00 on Tues, 6th Sept. until 20.00 on Wed., 7th Sept. It's well worth viewing your marked scripts before deciding to appeal any subject(s) results.

VIEWING

Both scripts marked manually and scripts marked online will be available to candidates for viewing. In the case of the former, each candidate will be assigned one of three sessions on Sat., 10th Sept. Session One is from 9.00 to 11.00, Session Two is from 12.00 to 14.00 and Session Three takes place from 15.00 to 17.00. Online access to view scripts that were marked online will also be available from 9.00 on Sat., 10th Sept. to 12.00 on Sunday, 11th September.

APPEAL

Any candidate who wishes to submit an appeal application against an awarded grade - commonly called 'applying for a recheck' can do so on the CSSP between 9.00 on Sat., 10th Sept. and 12.00 on Mon., 12th Sept. Until such time as the number of appeals is known, the SEC won't commit to a specific date for publishing the appeal results.

TIMELINE

This year's timelines for candidates to apply to view scripts and to lodge their appeal applications are very tight. The SEC maintains that these timelines are essential to ensure that the remaining stages of the appeal process can be completed as guickly as possible.

CAO OFFER

Latest CAO data confirms a final figure of 83,803 applicants, down slightly from 84,526 in 2021. 76,896 have applied for an honours bachelor degree (Level 8) while 42,785 have applied for an ordinary bachelor degree/ higher certificate (Level 7/6). 2,505 applicants have applied to CAO from County Kerry. That's a 3% increase on the 2021 figure of 2,424. The blue riband courses are again in high demand and will require high points to secure a course offer. However, with over 50,000 places on offer this year, applicants can be very hopeful of a college offer.

TRYING TO LOSE WEIGHT? NOT SEEING PROGRESS?

FLASHES AND FLOATERS

When should you be concerned : about flashes and floaters? Tiny spots, lines, flashes or shapes in your vision are known as flashes and floaters. Lots of people experience them and they usually aren't cause for alarm.

What are flashes?

Sometimes the jelly inside your eye shrinks a little and tugs on the retina (the light-sensitive layer) at the back of your eye. This can cause flashes of light at the edge of your vision. This is different from the disturbance of vision that can happen with a migraine. What are floaters?

Often, people who have healthy eyes see floaters. They appear as spots, lines or cobweb effects, usually when you look at a plain surface such as a white wall, screen or a clear blue sky. They are usually caused by cells clumping together in the clear jelly in the main part of your eye and casting shadows on your retina. The sudden appearance of new floaters is different and may be caused by the jelly shrinking and can sometimes mean there is a tear in the retina.

When should I be concerned? If you suddenly notice a shower

of new floaters, or floaters along with flashes or a dark shadow or a 'curtain' in your vision, you should take urgent action. What will happen if the retina

tears? The retina is the light-sensitive layer at the back of your eye which receives images and sends them to your brain. If the retina tears, it may come away from the back of the eye and can lead to a retinal detachment which can result in you losing part or all of your vision.

How is retinal detachment treated?

A tear may be treated by using a laser. If treated quickly you may have a better chance of full recovery. However, if your retina has become detached, you will need surgery. The operation may restore most of your vision. What to do if your symptoms

change Look out for the following:

• Flashes or floaters getting worse

- A black shadow in your vision
- A sudden cloud of spots
- A curtain or veil over your vision • Any change in vision
- If you notice any of these symptoms seek immediate professional care.

This was following the announcements today that Planning Permission has been granted for the construction of a new bypass at Adare Co Limerick, close to the Kerry border. Meanwhile, work on a bypass at Macroom is progressing well, with one section nearing completion.

"This is fantastic news for commuters, haulage firms, visitors, anyone why travels by road in and out of Kerry. Our students attending both UL and UCC are for years getting held up in both locations attending and returning from college" said Councillor Cahill. "This will increase safety on our roads, while also giving a boost to business interests. This is a massive step in the right direction for all three counties involved" added the Rossbeigh based Councillor.

Templence 0-14 Dingle 0-10 Dingle were already missing Conor Geaney and the loss of Dylan Geaney to a red card for an off the ball incident in the very first play really robbed their attack of teeth. Dingle actually dominated the first quarter, with Barry Dan O'Sullivan outstanding, but relied heavily on long kicks down on the Templence square – keeper Mark Looney was superbly assured. By half-time Templence had nudged into a 0-8 to 0-5 lead. Dingle twice worked it back down to two, but each time Templence pulled away again. County colleagues Jack Savage and Dan O'Donoghue were gone by now after getting a second card each Rahillys always had the edge in injury-time and Barry John Keane could put a second penalty over the bar knowing that it would be enough ...

INTERMEDIATE QUARTER-FINALS

Killarney Legion 1-13 Kilcummin 0-8

Kilcummin have great young players like Cian Foley, Dara O'Callaghan, and Mark O'Shea

coming through, but Kevin McCarthy is a colossal loss and they just didn't have the penetration. Kieran Murphy and Noel Dugan were their main threats. James O'Donoghue was talismanic as always with five points, one from the side-line a masterclass, but Legion's real strength is their panel depth, as Tomas Moriarty and Will Shine showed by sparkling off the bench. Legion, relegated last year, were always going to be favourites for the competition outright, and nobody's going to change their minds after this powerful display.

Beaufort 1-16 Glenflesk 1-12

Both sides eschewed blanket defences and went for it, relying on skill rather than numbers, and it made for a fantastically entertaining game of football. Ronan Murphy and Seán O'Brien gave Beaufort the edge at midfield and Kieran Dennehy, who has been one of the standout players in this competition, put it on the scoreboard – he would finish with 0-6. Beaufort had a number of goal chances turned away in the first half, including a brilliant save by Marc Kelliher to deny Ciaran Kennedy at close range (Seán Coffey did likewise to deny Tommy Bowler) but Darragh Dennehy cut in on the end-line and found the net. Beaufort led by 1-7 to 0-7 at half-time. Glenflesk, with Patrick D'Arcy outstanding, got it back to a single point. Just before the three quarter mark, Beaufort nailed four points in six minutes. Darragh Roche gave an exhibition in the last quarter, scoring a point and a goal that were stunning to behold, but Beaufort were in control by then.

Rathmore 3-11 Laune Rangers 0-16

Laune Rangers are not the force of old, but there have been real signs of resurgence in recent years, with some superb players coming through the ranks, and they nearly pulled off a surprise here. In fact, they led by much of this game. They were eight points up early on, but Rathmore had whittled the deficit back to 0-9 to 0-5 at half-time. They still led by 0-13 to 0-9 at the three quarter mark but Rathmore have an admirable resilience and dug deep. Kerry keeper Shane Ryan is a superb target-man and goals by him, his brother Cathal, and Mark Reen pulled it out of the fire. Close run thing, though!

An Ghaeltacht 1-14 Gneeveguilla 2-8

Gaeltacht struggled in the county league because of their big concession of goals, but they have narrowed that gate. It was very tight in the first half, a goal by sharpshooter Sean O'Keeffe nudguing Gneeveguilla ahead by 1-3 to 0-5 at half-time. Conor Herlihy, again outstanding, added another on the restart but Gaeltacht quickly drew level in an absorbing contest. It was point for point from then on, with Dara Ó Sé managing a late free for An Ghaeltacht to take it to extra-time. County star Brian Ó Beaglaíoch scored a cracking goal that ultimately saw the home side through after a cracker.

Ballydonoghue 1-12 Glenbeigh/Glencar 2-7 Ballydonoghue led by 1-7 to 0-5 at half-time. The introduction of Gavan O'Grady in the second half helped steady the ship, and a fisted Colin McGillicuddy goal saw them cut the gap back to two points before O'Grady neatly finished great move to put Glenbeigh 2-7 to 0-9 in front. It was level pegging with five minutes left by Ballydonoghue got the vital late scores to secure their status.

St. Marys 1-13 Dromid Pearses 1-11

These two have served up some incredible games in recent years, and this was another one. Bryan Sheehan – I'd call it a toss-up between himself and Dr. Crokes' Brian Looney for the best club player of the past fifteen years – isn't playing this year, but St. Marys always have a strong base to draw from in the town. Dromid less so – their playing numbers were dangerously thin at one stage – but they are back with a bang. They were level as the game headed into injury time but ended up losing to two points from Aidan Walsh and Seán Cournane and will face Glenbeigh/Glencar in the relegation final Semi-Finals Beaufort v Rathmore, An Ghaeltacht v Killarney Legion

JUNIOR PREMIER QUARTER-FINALS Fossa 1-15 Annascaul 1-11

Fossa have two of the best forwards in the country, and I've been bemused but unsurprised at how their games and David's tallies have received mentions in national despatches – I suspect that some journalists are struggling with the split season. I've wondered about Fossa's strength in depth, but this win answers a lot of questions – Annascaul are a serious team - the Hickson brothers are proven players as well and they have provided some superb minors like Killian Falvey to the county in recent years. Fossa led by 1-6 to 0-3 at halftime and in truth, were always in control.

Listry 3-14 Ballyduff 3-6

Ballyduff set the tone with an early Michael Slattery goal. Listry had that bit more scoring power though and a multi-faceted midfield engine, with the returned Ronan Buckley in phenomenal form. They led by 1-7 to 1-2 at half-time, Aaron O'Shea with the goal and added Buckley another goal five minutes into the second half. Ballyduff responded instantly with a goal of their own from Jack Sullivan.... only for Listry to sweep down and Aaron O'Shea rattle the net again! Ballyduff made them work hard for it, including notching a third goal themselves from Kevin Goulding, but Listry always had a bit in hand from then on.

Ardfert 1-18 Skellig Rangers 0-9

Ardfert have been dancing on the edge of relegation rather than promotion in recent years, but seem to have turned the tide with an infusion of hurlers (the availability of hurlers is one of the narratives of these championships) and young players coming through. It was veteran Daithí Griffin, himself a great dual player, who led the way. He had 1-3 on board himself by half-time, at which stage Ardfert led by 1-8 to 0-3. Skellig Rangers produced one of the greatest comebacks in Kerry football last year in the semi-final against Listry, but on this occasion it wasn't to be as Ardfert ran out comfortable winners.

Ballymac 6-10 St. Senans 0-10

Hard to read too much from this one given the disparity in league status. Baallymac went down from Division One this year but, significantly, they lost a lot of games by small margins and certainly weren't out of their depth. They are very much a unit rather than a collection of stars, but you'd have to note the return of Aidan Breen to the playing field; he would be an addition to any team.

Semi-Finals Listry v Ballymac, Ardfert v Fossa

RELEGATION SEMI-FINALS Castlegregory 0-13 Waterville 0-9

Waterville Frank Caseys have more heart than numbers. It isn't that long ago that the likes of

the Cliffords and the Dwyers were ploughing their trade in Division One. Castlegregory have brought through lads like Thomas O'Donnell, Maurice O'Connell, and Caolan Ó Conaill. It's a hard and inescapable truth that numbers count, and Castlegregory had the numbers.

St. Pats Blennerville 0-18 St. Michaels/Foilmore 1-11

St. Michaels/Foilmore is one of the most famous amalgamatiosn in Kerry football – brokered by none other than Sean Kelly – and they graced Croke Park and Kerry's Division One with equal aplomb. Again the conversation is about playing numbers rather than quality – the loss of the likes of the O'Connor brothers (playing with Milltown/Castlemaine this year) was understandable, but a blow. To South Kerry teams will contest relegation

JUNIOR QUARTER-FINALS Knocknagoshel 0-17 Sneem/Derrynane 1-12

A cracking contest. Darragh O'Sullivan's early goal helped Sneem/Derrynane into an early lead but the Walsh brothers Edmund and James, as always, starting to stand out. Knocknagoshel led by just a single point at half-time, 0-11 to 1-7. The second half was a real seesaw battle all through, point for point, but with the sides deadlocked in the final minutes it was Edmund Walsh who stepped up to put Knocknagoshel in front and into a semi-final.

Cordal 4-12 Finuge

Finuge scored the first three points of the game – and then had Cordal hit back for 3-4, two goals from Seán Brosnan and another from Eamonn Nolan, to effectively put it to bed. Pat Corridan and Ricky Heffernan led a brave resistance, but Eamonn Nolan added a second goal and with Philip O'Connor as always splitting the posts, Cordal were always in control here.

Firies 3-14 Scartaglin 3-11

This one went all the way to the wire. The name of Mike Allen of Firies will be a familiar one to all Kerry GAA followers, and indeed plenty of supporters in other counties. Mike is a GAA institution in his own right and an expert on the game. I will assume that the Mike Allen whose two goals were finally enough to see off neighbours Scartaglin after extra-time is another scion of the clan. Mind you, they got absolutely nothing easy. Firies were actually four clear when Seán Horan goaled late on and a monster free from his twin Eddie (great to see him back in action, although the talented Shay Walsh wasn't able to line out) took it into extratime. Jack Sherwood had to withdraw from action then and a Flor McCarthy goal had Scart a point in front, but Mike Allen's second goal finally settled great contest.

Tarbert 2-13 Reenard 0-15

Reenard took a 0-6 to 0-0 with three points from the outstanding Seán Teahan (son of Kerry hurling legend John) kicking three. Tarbert, with Cillian Langan to the fore, got it back to 0-7 to 0-4 at half-time but looked in trouble. Reenard's Breece O'Sullivan was blocked shooting for goal after a great run and a minute later Cillian Langan had the ball in the net at the other end - a real turnaround. With time almost up, Shane Enright won a free and Langan took it into extra-time. Reenard saw a penalty come off the post and Tarbert's greater reserves in the energy-sapping extra-time told with a memorable victory.

Semi-finals Cordal v Tarbert, Knocknagoshel v Firies

NORTH KERRY CLAIM FIRST SILVERWARE County Minor Final: North Kerry 1-16 Mid Kerry 1-11

Last week's drawn game was an all-time cracker. This was genuinely up there with Kerry's games against Dublin and Galway or that cracker between Galway and Armagh this year. It was adrenaline-packed from the very first go and the performances of the likes of the two Healys for North Kerry and Josh Coffey and Darragh O'Connor for Mid Kerry were phenomenal. This one didn't hit those heights. Like before, North Kerry made the better start, but this time they were able to put it on the scoreboard, with Oisín Healy not just repeating but actually surpassing his excellence from the previous game. He had four points on board to help North Kerry into a 0-7 to 0-1 lead, with Jerh,. Brosnan, Darragh O'Keeffe, and Aaron Carey also on target. Mid Kerry's opening score came, inevitably, from the boot of Darragh O'Connor - he always impressed off the bench for the Kerry minors, but he and Healy have been in a class of their own in this championship. Mid Kery settled better into the game and Tony Óg Duffy's fisted goal after a pass from O'Connor gave them a big lifeline with the score now 0-12 to 1-7. Dara Hogan rattled the North Kerry crossbar but Oisín Healy's seventh point meant that North Kerry by 0-13 to 1-7 at the break. They really should have put it to bed in the first

ten minutes of the second half - Healy had a surprising miss from a close range free and Aaron Carey's goal-bound effort was brilliantly taken off the line by Mid Kerry's Liam O'Neill. They did get points from Healy and Jack Enright, but Marc Murphy, Dara Hogan, and Jim Dempsey were very much keeping Mid Kerry in touch. The tempo had definitely dropped by now, though. There was just one point in it by now, but scoring dried up completely for thirteen minutes - was the occasion getting to the players after a week to dwell on last week's heroics and might-have-beens? Evan Boyle, rock solid in midfield all evening, sold an exquisite dummy and split the posts from distance. Mid Kerry never once gave up, the impressive Dara Hogan making an impressive run at goal late on, but he was caught for overcarrying and Luke Rochford's long ball carved open the Mid Kerry defence as they pressed forward, with the ball falling to Oisín Healy. The Asdee man gave the keeper no chance.

This is the first silverware to go to the new underage amalgamation of Feale Rangers and Shannon Rangers. It's a bit of a hot topic, but I'm hugely in favour of this amalgamation. There is of course an argument that when

a squad is being picked from eleven clubs, there will be too many good players getting no chance. True enough - I'm not in favour of big amalgamations in general – I guite like East Kerry and Eoghan Ruadh being separate teams and both can hold their own at underage. But Shannon Rangers and, to a lesser extent, Feale Rangers have been struggling at all levels for a long time now. Their clubs are playing in the lower county league divisions and tight for numbers in many areas - I'm talking at all age groups, not just senior. The introduction of North Kerry at underage means that there are kids this week who watched the Frank King Cup being paraded through their area for the first time. Think that's a small thing? Those kids will be hunting a ball next week and looking forward to training and hoping that they get to wear that black and white jersey themselves. That's very far from a small thing.

It will be interesting to see how Feale Rangers and Shannon Rangers get on in this year's Senior County Championship. To be honest, I don't see either side really making the final stages (I know, that's a big hostage to fortune to put on paper!).

Meanwhile, Kenmare Shamrocks are playing Austin Stacks in the Club Relegation Final (barring reaching the County Championship Final). If Stacks lose, they could simply join St. Brendans, effectively replacing Na Gaeil. But if Kenmare lose, where do they go? Kilgarvan and Tuosist are part of East Kerry, but in all fairness that's a hand that doesn't need to be strengthened. The County Board did say at the time of the dissolution of Kenmare District that it was not a permanent move by any means. What odds on Feale Rangers and Shannon Rangers lining out together in next year's Senior County Championship as North Kerry, with the divisional place being taken up by a rejuvenated Kenmare District? It would be that rarest of Irish solutions, one that has simplicity and elegance as well as pragmatism at its core.

Colin O'Riordan was fifteen years old when he first broke onto the Tipperary minors as a wing back. O'Riordan is one of the best players I ever saw at underage - yes, I include the likes of David Clifford (although David had everything plus size), Declan Quill, Galway's Michael Meehan, Cork's Brian O'Driscoll (he played centre forward – and should have been left there), Paul Cribben of Kildare (he might have lost the 2009 Hogan to Jack O'Connor's Coláiste na Sceilge - but you can ask Jack O'Connor about him)...look, I'd be a long but enjoyable day compiling a list. Dingle's Jack Ferriter and Rathmore's Jerry Murphy would be on it. Laura Rogers of Austin Stacks - any of ye who think I'm being patronising or showcasing my feminist credentials never saw her play. She wasn't just lightning fast; she could make the ball dance while she did it.

Colin O'Riordan was in that kind of company and deserved that famous 2011 All Ireland minor win over Dublin (let us whisper it – two great Tipperary goals, but they were against the run of play). Arrah, I was a lot more glad for Tipperary than sorry for Dublin. They had

come from well behind at half-time to beat Kerry in the second half of the Munster semifinal- Cillian Fitzgerald and Pádraig Óg Ó Sé were excellent for Kerry but we were well and fairly beaten. I do remember a lot of criticism beforehand of manager Pat O'Driscoll's decision to switcha young wing forward back into defence – it turned out that Tadhg Morley was no bad defender at all. I know Dublin missed out on a minor medal, but I still don't feel sorry for.....Robbie McDaid, Eric Lowndes, John Small, Jack McCaffrey, Emmett Ó Conghaile, Cormac Costello, Ciarán Kilkenny, Paul Mannion, Davy Byrne, Niall Scully.....those acorns kept growing!

That was a brilliant Tipperary minor team, but unfortunately very few of them made it to senior afterwards apart from Michael Quinlivan. The lure of the small ball is as strong in the Premier as the big one is in the Kingdom. Colin O'Riordan was gone early, one of the new breed drawn to the professional sport in Australia. The reason I mention all of this while taking the saunter down my own memory lane is because O'Riordan has announced his retirement after recurrent injuries. The very best of luck to him.

Tyrone's Conor McKenna is returning to AFL – and unusual pathway, to say the least. I suspect McKenna felt underused by Tyrone in last year's successful campaign – I certainly thought he looked very dangerous every time he came on – he certainly showed it against us!

Our own Mark O'Connor has done his business quietly and efficiently, signing a new two year contract. If Jim Stynes is the most successful GAA/AFL transplant ever, then our own Tadhg Kennelly is just a fraction behind him and Mark must be right up there as well. Pretty much everyone remembers that great PS Chorca Dhuibhne team with four Corn Uí Mhuirís and two Hogans and the role that Mark (a grand-nephew of Tom 'Gega' O'Connor on his father's side and a cousin of Tommy and John Doyle of Annascaul on his mother's) played in those triumphs. What I remember is cold but entertaining County Minor Finals in Austin Stack Park under lights between Dingle and Dr. Crokes. Great games and great craic, with Dingle having a slight edge.

In the week that Meath's hugely successful Eamonn Murray steps down, the conversation in Ladies' football is turning more and more to AFLW. The fact is that the Irish players are absolutely thriving over there and their playing experience is proving invaluable. Cora Staunton – and there's a name to conjure with! – scored her 50th AFLW goal this week. Not bad going – not exactly a surprise either, though, given who we are talking about.

MARY JO HONOURED AS GPA LEGEND

I doubt if anyone reading this needs to be told who Mary Jo Coffey is – there aren't too many Kerry people walking around with ten senior All Irelands. She was in illustrious company at her well-deserved award, and somewhat unusual company in that it included four legends from the four major strands of gaelic games.

Jimmy Keaveney was there for mens' football. Jimmy was the scoring linchpin of Heffo's Dubs and twice Footballer of the Year. We've all heard the legend. Retired early from playing, frustrated at the lack of preparation by Dublin – they were a joke to big guns like Meath and Offaly, let alone outside the province. Dublin brought Heffo in for his second stint in charge while languishing in Division Two. Mickey Whelan introduced new training methods and they worked non-stop, but Heffo didn't quite trust the likes of Leslie Deegan. He needed a shooter. Next thing, up pipes a neighbour's child from the back of the car – "I've never seen Jimmy Keaveney miss".

Yes, a Vincents' man, the most famously partisan of them all, had to be told about another Vincents' man. I'll take my time believing that particular tale!

Angela Downey. If there was Dublin granite about the team that Keaveney played on, there was Kilkenny flint in Angela Downey. The greatest camogie player ever (my respects to Eileen O'Duffy O'Mahony, but Downey takes my vote). I'm open to correction; I'm pretty sure she won an even dozen All Irelands, some of them close on single-handedly. Mind you, her sister Ann was phenomenal as well – I suspect that they honed each others' edges in sibling tussles in the back garden, and it did neither of them any harm!

You say 'Michael Keating' and it sounds like an ordinary enough name. Didn't some-one like that play Batman in a truly terrible movie? But when you say 'Babs', every GAA person on the planet is nodding their heads. Babs is legendary. I wouldn't mind, but it's mostly for moments that are out of character – I haven't met him but I know plenty who have and they all say that Babs is a quiet-spoken man. He's probably most famous for his "sheep in a heap" comment – the sheep went on to win the All Ireland. Or for throwing his boots off in an All Ireland before basically single-handedly winning it. Arrah, there are a lot of hurling

stories about Babs.

Just to point out, there should be a lot of football ones as well. In 1972 Munster hadn't seen a Railway Cup since 1949, a fair while to be waiting! There was a fierce hunger to put that to bed - the Railway Cup really was a huge deal in its day. Kerry were two years after winning the All Ireland and Cork were one away from winning one.Kerry were the National League champions. Cork also had a phenomenal run of minor success and were clearly poised to take over. You had names to conjure with. Donie O'Sullivan, Tom Prendergast, Mick O'Dwyer, young John O'Keeffe, Seamus Mac Gearailt, Eamonn O'Donoghue. Billy Morgan, the hugely under-rated Kevin Jer O'Sullivan, Denis Coughlan (I'd argue a dual player as good as any of them), Donal Hunt, big Ray Cummins (their answer to the Bomber Liston - and with the same warm and engaging personality), Mick Scannell. And, of course, Mick O'Connell. In fact, legend has it that O'Connell was just about beaten – and beaten very cleanly – in the air by the great Willie Bryan. Not harassed or crowded out of it – some teams used to resort to that when they couldn't live with O'Connell in the sky, and in case anyone thinks I'm whinging, I'll point out that Kerry unabashedly did the same thing to Antrim in the forties – it was a day that Willie Bryan just got that fraction higher. There have only been a tiny handful of men who could ever say it - not that the famously modest Bryan ever would. Resentment was never a part of O'Connell's make-up, the pair became great friends after,

But one of the most unusual figures in the dressing room was Tipperary dual player Michael Keating. A natural leader, even in that room. Not all that tall, but burly as they come. The ball would stick to him, and he always and ever had an uncanny instinct for a goal.

GAA Legends all four of them. But Babs in particular....there was always a kind of a twinkle about Babs' stories, I'd say he gets a small laugh out of them often enough himself.

€3.20 per day not enough in current environment to cover or incentivise remote working.

With just four weeks to go to Budget 2023, Founder & CEO of HR Buddy, Damien McCarthy has called on the Government to implement a measure in the Budget that will increase the \in 3.20 per day that is currently being offered to remote workers.

Since January 2022, employees can claim remote working relief for 30% of the cost of heating, electricity and broadband for days spent working from home.

Mr. McCarthy believes that the Government must consider at least doubling the \in 3.20 per day in this year's budget and also believes that there needs to be an alignment between what the employer can pay tax-free and what the employee can claim tax-free.

"It is a really good opportunity which will coincide with the new "right to request remote working" legislation in the Autumn and an opportunity for the Government to put the money where its mouth is in this regard", Damien McCarthy said.

The cost-of-living crisis and stretched labour market are currently putting a lot of pressure on both workers and their employers. There are increased wage demands, a competitive war on talent, the cost of running remote working for both employers and employees, which make for serious considerations.

€3.20 per day is outdated and the difference between what the employer and the employee are entitled to makes no sense in the first place. The current allowance will have no impact in making positive moves towards counteracting the expensive costs of setting up remote working and enticing employers towards helping their employees counteract against energy costs, childcare costs and in particular fuel costs for workers that are commuting. Counteracting commuter costs has a doublewin because this could also have a positive impact on CO2 emissions."

As it stands, if employers pay a working from home allowance towards these expenses, employees can get up to \in 3.20 per day without paying any tax, PRSI or USC on it. If employers pay more than \in 3.20 per day to cover expenses, employees pay tax, PRSI and USC as normal on the amount above \in 3.20. Employers are not legally obliged to make this payment to their employees. If employers don't pay allowances for expenses, employees can make a claim for tax relief at the end of the year.

Mr. McCarthy is of the view that unless a worker can be provided with \in 2,000 tax free per annum, the new right to request remote working will be a piece of legislation with very

little long-term impact and will be of very little benefit.

"A tax-free allowance of €2,000 per annum towards remote working would help employers implement remote-working and continue to make it sustainable. It would also act as a help from an environmental factor and act as an ease to rising inflation and wage demands"

"DINGLE LEADS BY EXAMPLE IN CLIMATE TRANSITION"

MEP for Ireland South, Seán Kelly, visited Dingle recently to see the progress made in the Corca Dhuibhne/Dingle Peninsula 2030 initiative. The Dingle Hub supports community projects in the transition to a low carbon society and digital infrastructure. The initiative works closely with the local community, state agencies, public bodies and higher education institutes to identify, fund and deliver these projects.

"With the energy crisis and increased cost of living, it is important to show that there is a way forward that increases quality of life and utilises the resources we have available in a sustainable manner, whilst allowing the local economy to thrive. We are much more connected now and the energy system is fundamentally changing, opportunities will be presented for rural areas, but they will not be ceased without buy-in from the local community. The Dingle Hub paves the way in this regard and sets a real example of what can achieved", said Kelly.

"I've been blown away by the amount of positive activity at Dingle Hub. Particularly the engagement with the local community, the positive spin-offs for people in these communities and above all the contributions towards emissions reduction and our national climate targets", he added.

Ireland has competitive advantages in producing renewable energy due to its geographical position for wind generation, especially floating offshore turbines on the west coast facing the Atlantic. ESB Networks will be at the forefront of connect renewable energy to the electricity system and will significantly increase in the amount of

renewable generation across the country.

"Ireland can be a leader in both renewable energy generation and grid integration, but we will need to significantly ramp up deployment along with enabling technologies like solar PV panels, Heat Pumps and batteries. This is why the Dingle hub is such an exciting project, it provides best practice examples that can be up-scaled across the country", the Ireland South MEP continued.

"I was particularly impressed by the work done by farmer Dinny Galvin who has integrated a Solar PV System, Air Source Heat Pumps and a Smart EV charger for his electric vehicle on to his farm. This is in addition to a heat exchange in his dairy parlour, which helps significantly with energy efficiency. It just goes to show how much more farmers can contribute to climate action if given the tools to do so, notably through biogas production.

"Ireland, with our large agriculture sector, is considered to have the highest potential to exploit biogas in the EU. Biomethane is produced in Anerobic Digestors, which break down organic matter, and are well suited to increasing domestic supply of biomethane due to the ample supplies of slurry for feedstock coming from the beef and dairy sectors.

"I have mentioned this for many years, but biogas in Ireland remains an untapped resource. We need to drastically reduce our carbon reliance in agriculture by encouraging new business models for carbon farming, anaerobic digesters are major part of this equation and we must work to develop proper network", Kelly concluded.

AN BÓRD PLEANÁLA'S DECISION CONDEMNED

A Kerry County Councillor has Strongly condemned An Bórd Pleanála following the Board's refusal of a major Housing application in Killarney.

"What is going on inside An Bórd Pleanála or are all it's members living in another planet or what" asks Fianna Fáil Councillor, Michael Cahill.

This was Councillor Cahill's response to the recent announcement by An Bord Pleanála that they had refused planning for 228 houses on the Port Road in Killarney as the artificial lighting would interfere with the flight path of the Greater Horseshoe Bat.

"This major Housing application in Killarney which also included a Childcare facility and a large green area had the support of Kerry County Council Planners" stated Councillor Cahill.

"I am totally at a loss to understand the thinking behind this latest outrageous decision by An Bord Pleanála. We are in the middle of a massive Housing crisis. Killarney is a Rent Pressure Zone and Kerry as a whole is crying out for more housing" stated the Rossbeigh based Councillor.

"I have warned before that An Bórd Pleanála is not fit for purpose and I am now calling on the Minister for Justice and the Minister for Housing to disband An Bórd Pleanála immediately and review this decision on behalf of the people of Kerry and ensure fair play for all. This Housing Crisis will never be solved if we are to be ruled by people who do not understand the needs of their fellow human beings" added a clearly angry Councillor Cahill.



RESCUE SERVICES NEED FUNDING - CAHILL

Our Rescue Services come to the aid of many people who find themselves in serious trouble and there should be no limit to funding these operations, according to Kerry Fianna Fáil Councillor, Michael Cahill.

"Whether you are talking about the Community Air Ambulance, Rescue 115, Inshore Lifeboat or the RNLI, etc, and the service they provide, often putting their own lives at risk, should get full funding from the Exchequer, as you cannot put a price on human life" stated Councillor Cahill.

"The more we embrace the outdoor pursuits of hiking, swimming, mountain climbing, particularly in a beautiful summer like this, the higher the probability of situations occurring that will require one or more of these services to be deployed. The best way we can show our appreciation and gratitude is to ensure they are well funded and not dependent on voluntary contributions" stated the Rossbeigh based Councillor.

"Kerry Mountain Rescue for instance, is staffed by volunteers and is a credit to all involved, providing a service that has saved many lives. Operations like these must be fully supported. None of us know when we will be the next one in serious trouble and in need of rescue" added Councillor Cahill.

- Preheat the oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. - Line a 12-hole muffin tin with paper cases.

- Measure the butter, eggs, caster sugar, flour, baking powder, milk, bananas and vanilla into a bowl and beat together until combined and smooth. Mix in the chocolate chips.

The picture being portrayed may give one peaceful feelings, but it's a lie that it will bring true inner peace.

You can transform every nook and cranny of your home – punish your body by exercise and dieting – work on your relationships with therapy and exciting pursuits, but you will find that tomorrow the house will still get messy; tomorrow you might regain the flab if you stop the healthy eating and exercise; tomorrow someone you love can say or do something that will devastate you. Tomorrow the doctor may give a negative report bringing a death sentence and where is the peace then? If our peace is founded upon anything that we can do ourselves or that others do for us, it is a false sense of peace. And when that peace is shattered we have to find peace again somewhere else. This is what drives addictions and affairs, and affects mental health. Looking unto ourselves, dependency upon others, relying upon formulas, or the perfect decor, cars, or careers to bring us fulfilment is a never ending, exhausting drama. The void inside of each one of us is filled ONLY by a relationship with the God Who created us and knows us better than we know ourselves – yet He loves us, warts and all. God is the author of order not chaos. And He is the Original Transformer! (Romans 12:2)

God made a way for us to be transformed to right standing with Him by giving His Son Jesus to die upon the cross so that we could be forgiven of our sins, and reconciled back to God in a Covenant of Peace, paid for with the Blood of Jesus. Then God raised Him from the dead because He defeated death and hell and the curse that results from sin. Jesus is The Prince of Peace – and His Peace surpasses all human understanding (Isaiah 9:6-7; Philippians 4:6-7). If you are looking for peace, come to Jesus (Matthew 11:28). He gives us freely all things to enjoy. God wants you to be filled with His joy and live in peace. Jesus said "I AM leaving you with a gift – peace of mind and heart. And the peace I give is a gift the world cannot give. So don't be troubled or afraid" (John 14:27 NLT).
