



Double whammy for hard hit tourism trade

major gathering of tourism : will take stock and plot how best Aindustry professionals in Killarnev will be told that hotels, restaurants and hospitality businesses will really feel the brunt of the 4.5% hike in tourism VAT imposed in the Budget as potential customers will stay away because of sharply rising costs.

International tourism analyst, Noel Sweeney, said it will lead to a "double whammy" for already hard hit businesses who are also facing into the uncertainty of Brexit and the likely impact it will have on their trade.

"It will be very difficult for those relying on the British market which has already been declining in the last 18 months. In terms of our value for money rating, we are facing into a very uncertain 2019 as Sterling won't buy as much in Ireland," Mr Sweeney said.

He will be one of the keynote speakers at the third annual Let's Talk Tourism forum in Killarney on November 9 at which the industry

to overcome the blow of the 4.5% VAT increase.

As CEO of Tourism and Transport Consult, Mr Sweeney has advised public and private sector clients worldwide on policy and strategic issues and he is firmly of the opinion that the VAT increase will make life particularly difficult for businesses outside of Dublin and in tourism hotspots like Kerry.


"Before the minister made that decision he should have had a look at areas during the months of February or November. The VAT rise is going to hit hard – it's a very significant blow," he insisted.

The respected tourism analyst said businesses like small hotels that might have been planning to invest €500,000 in an extension to their property will more than likely abandon those plans in the wake of the Budget and that will have a knock-on impact.

"Even if a couple cuts back on the number of meals they have out, because of rising costs, the VAT

intake for the Government won't increase. It was very short-sighted," Mr Sweeney said.

He said it was "a false argument" to complain that hotels in Dublin were over-priced as it's all about supply and demand.

"There's a shortage of bednights in the city and, compared to other European cities, it's by no means the most expensive. Dublin was probably under-priced for years," Mr Sweeney stated.

Other issues down for discussion at the Let's Talk Tourism forum include the impact of Brexit, learning from other markets, strategies for sustainable growth and the opportunities presented by the

China market.



"I married my best friend and soulmate and we celebrated the 'most special' day of our lives in The Killarney Avenue Hotel. Less that 6 years later on 27th October 2018 in the same function room of the hotel with my little girl and my husbands family, we held a coffee morning event in aid of pieta house in my husbands memory after tragically losing him to suicide", Sandra told the Killarney Outlook.

" Although it was difficult and upsetting for us remembering such happy times in that room just a short time previous, we also knew that what we were doing would help others who suffer with hopelessness and depression", she added.

Within the 3 short hours of 9am to 12pm, the coffee morning raised over €10,300. On the Friday 26th October in Fexco, Killorglin where I work a similar event raised €7,000. Along with online donations and cheques received, a massive €32,600 has been raised to date to date in the past 7 weeks since setting up the Pieta tribute page.

"My husband John was an amazing person who did so much for charity. He was a kind, caring person who always put everyone else before himself. He was a fantastic husband and a proud father to our beautiful little girl Grace and I know he would so happy seeing what we have done to help others who struggle like he did", Sandra said.

"Crowds queued all morning at the doors to join us in helping to raise funds and it was an amazing turn out. People we never met before came to support the event after reading about the beautiful person we lost who constantly helped others during his time here with us. From start to finish everything exceeded our expectations and shows us the effect my husband had on others and we will be eternally grateful to everyone involved", she said.

A PAST HERO REMEMBERED AND TODAY'S HEROES CELEBRATED

At the end of this month fifty-five years Ago, at the relatively young age of 65, Monsignor Hugh O'Flaherty - The Vatican Pimpernel, passed away peacefully at his sister Brid's home in Cahersiveen. In many places around the world, his passing was mourned and noted by such iconic journals as The New York Times. Remarkably, the national media and indeed political establishment in Ireland did not mark his passing in any notable way.

Seventy-five years ago, in Nazi occupied Rome, also at the end of this month on the steps of St Peter's under the Arco delle Campane (The Arch of the Bells), Monsignor Hugh met POW escapee Lt Col Sam Derry, and so began the short but dramatic story of the Rome Escape Line.

Together and with the help of many other brave people like Henrietta Chevalier, John May and Delia Murphy (Famous Irish singer and wife of the Dr T J Kiernan Irish Ambassador to the Holy See), they ensured the safety of over 6000 people until Rome was liberated less than 8 months later in June 1944. On that day as incredible as it may seem, the Rome Escape Line was still successfully hiding almost 4000 POWs throughout Rome - under the noses of the Gestapo.

On the evening of Saturday November 3rd at 8.00.p.m., in the beautifully restored Killarney House, as part of the 11th Hugh O'Flaherty

Memorial Weekend, we will be remembering Monsignor Hugh and, in his name, celebrating the bravery and humanitarianism of modernday heroes represented by the Irish Coast Guard, Kerry Mountain Rescue and the RNLI. The original nomination read:

"Be it windswept high mountains, dangerous shorelines or stormy seas, when called upon, at a moment's notice and without regard for the race or creed of those in need, they put their lives on the line to help others. Over the years, members of these rescue organisations have lost their lives while attempting to save others".

The Mayor of Killarney Municipal District, Cllr John Sheahan will present them with Humanitarian Award Citation Scrolls on behalf of the people of Killarney. From representatives of the O'Flaherty Family and Memorial Society they will receive the Hugh O'Flaherty Humanitarian Medal and as with last year the Schools of Killarney Parish have come together to generate a Schools Bursary for the Award Recipients.

The Award Ceremony will commence with the official launch of a new novel for young readers titled "Leo's War". Based on Monsignor Hugh's wartime activities, it's author Patricia Murphy has written and published several historically based children's novels, including the best-selling 1916 novel "Molly's Diary". Patricia will talk about the importance of getting children to "buy-in" to history through reading historically based works of fiction.

The Award Ceremony is open to the public and admission is free but seating will be limited so early arrival is advised. The Hugh O'Flaherty Memorial Society gratefully acknowledges the support it receives from Killarney Chamber of Tourism & Commerce and from the Community Support Fund of Kerry County Council.

RDS EXHIBIT FOR Killarney Artist



A Kerry ultra runner who portrays her abundant energy through her work will exhibit at Ireland's premier art fair Art Source, which will be held at the RDS from November 9-11.

Tina Reed (52) from Killarney completed an iron man last year and regularly runs distances of up to 100 miles, saying that age is only a number, not an excuse.

"I'm passionate about the outdoors and I'm passionate about painting and it's a pure joy to me that I can combine the two," she said.

"I paint from nature, autumn woodland scenes and florals, hill runners, galloping horses, swooping birds and crashing seas.

"I am really energetic in all I do and try and translate that into my paintings by use of a palette knife, which allows me to work quickly and to express movement and direction.

"My paintings are vibrant and colourful and the paint is layered and textured to build a bold impasto."

Tina, who is a member of Visual Arts Ireland, just finished a 5m by 2m exterior mural of Fionn MacCumhaill, commissioned by Killarney Town Council.

"I was lucky that the weather was so dry this summer but the heat meant that the paint was drying almost too fast on me," she laughed. Irish art lovers have the chance to get their hands on 100 pieces of original artwork for $\in 100 - as$ well as unique works by Andy Warhol – at the RDS.

Over 15,000 people are expected to view exhibits from artists across all genres at the biggest art event of the year which features over 175 contemporary artists and galleries over two floors showcasing painting, sculpture, photography, illustration, prints and ceramic art.



Call for Resurfacing on Ross Road

At the next Killarney Municipal Meeting of Kerry County Coucil, Cllr. John Sheahan is calling on KCC to address the health and safety issue regarding the dangerous condition of Ross Road. "Many people have brought this issue to y attention as the road is severely worn down and is in urgent need of resurfacing", Cllr Sheahan told the Killarney Outlook.



Aldi has received planning permission from Kerry County Council to build a new Project Fresh store in Killarney.

The new store will be located at Ardshanavooly, adjacent to Aldi's current Killarney store which has operated in the town for over 12 years bringing greater competition, choice and value for money to Killarney. When complete, the new larger store will replace Aldi's existing Killarney outlet.

Welcoming Kerry County Council's decision, Colm Foley, Aldi Killarney's Assistant Store Manager said, "The whole Aldi Killarney team is delighted with Kerry County Council's decision to grant planning permission for our new state-of-the-art store. Introducing the Project Fresh format will provide an even better shopping experience to our customers, while its environmentally friendly design will contribute positively to the fabric of the town."

With a shop floor measuring 1,254m², the new store will be almost 50% larger than Aldi's existing premises. It will boast more chillers, a wide selection of fresh food at the front of the store, hi-spec fixtures and fittings and new signage that provides a more efficient and hassle-free shopping experience. There will also be 113 free car parking spaces available.

The development will also be professionally and comprehensively landscaped, provide vehicular and pedestrian access from Artubus Drive and Park Road and all of this will be considered as part of the Traffic Impact Assessment.

Aldi plans to finish construction of the new store by 2020. The development will see a substantial investment into the local area as well as the creation of new permanent jobs once the store opens, along with many more during the construction phase. Aldi's existing store will remain fully open during the entire construction phase to serve customers. Once the new store is completed, the current store will be returned to the landlord.

Since first opening its Killarney store in December 2006, Aldi has become an established part of the town's retail landscape. The store participates in Aldi's national partnership with FoodCloud, donating surplus food to local charities daily including Killarney Community Services and Kerry Parents Killarney. The store has donated over 50,000 meals to charity to date. 

Is Your Vehicle Ready for Winter?

Check for wear and tear on wiper blades and replace them as soon as they start to smear rather than clean windows.

✓ Keep tyre pressure at the manufacturer's recommended level and check you have at least 3 millimetres of tread depth.

Check that your spare wheel is in good condition and is fully inflated. Some cars may have an inflation repair kit instead of a spare wheel. Make sure that you know how to use it.

✓ Make sure all vehicle lights are working and clean and top up

Be Seen to Be Safe!

When out cycling or walking, especially in rural areas, high visibility reflective clothing and lights are the only way to stay safe when out

✓ A vehicle has a greater chance of seeing you during dark winter days and nights if you wear something reflective and carry a torch. In turn cyclists should make sure their bikes are fitted with front and rear lights.



WHAT IS GLAUCOMA?

Glaucoma is the name given to a group of eye conditions where the optic nerve at the back of the eye is damaged. It is often linked with raised pressure within the eye, although the eye pressure can sometimes be normal. When the nerve is damaged, it can start to cause problems with the peripheral vision (side vision) and, if left untreated, can cause permanent damage. With early treatment, further damage to vision can be prevented. Glaucoma may not have symptoms and this is why it is very important to have regular sight tests.

RISK FACTORS

Age is the biggest risk factor for glaucoma. However, your risk also increases if you have family members with glaucoma

SYMPTOMS The danger with open-angle or chronic

glaucoma (slow onset) is that, in the early stages, your eyesight may seem perfectly normal. There is no pain, but your peripheral vision (side vision) is being damaged. Eventually your central vision can be affected. This can be described as tunnel vision because it feels like looking down a long tube. It's important to have regular sight tests as open-angle glaucoma often does not have symptoms.

TREATMENT

Open-angle glaucoma is usually treated with eye drops which reduce the pressure in the eye. You will need to use these daily. Occasionally people with open-angle glaucoma need surgery to control the pressure.




November is good for our mental health!



Gavin White's all-important goal on the hour mark was the eventual clincher as it moved the Pat O'Shea's side into a commanding advantage, something they had not enjoyed throughout the game as they were pressed all the way by a very game Dingle side who were certainly up for the challenge.

The exchanges were keenly fought and tough but on the balance of play Crokes were worthy winners as they had class performers all over the field.

Johnny Buckley and Daithi Casey dominated the midfield exchanges while yet again and as he has done so throughout this championship, David Shaw underlined his class as a player of the future with four wonderful points from play.

Dingle had to finish the game with 14 men following the dismissal of their captain and corner-back Padraig O'Connor for a second yellow card offence and they too had heroes the outstanding Tom O'Sullivan, Matthew Flaherty and Mikey Geaney, who was a workhrse throughout.

Crokes too negatived the threat of Paul Geaney by placing two defenders on the Kerry marksan who finished the hour with just one point from play.

Despite being tightly marked, Geaney did have a great chance to put Dingle into the lead early in the second half but his effort was stopped by his Kerry colleague Shane Murphy.

Dingle began the game very brightly and had two points on the board from Paul Geaney by the fifth minute but Crokes soon got into the groove. They hit seven points in a row to move into a commanding 0-8 to 0-2 lead and at this stage Dingle's challenge was about to hit choppy waters.

But the Westerners were not done yet and thanks to two raking points

from Tom O'Sullivan, easily their player of the championship, the challengers retired 0-8 to 0-6 behind at the break.

Things were beginning to look ominous for Dr Crokes when Matthew Flaherty cut the gap to one within minutes of the resumption but this was the closest Dingle were to get to Crokes on the afternoon.


Despite maintaining a slight advantage on the scoreboard, Crokes could never really press home their advantage until Gavin White's late goal eventually decided the issue.



Know Your Rights:

QUESTION

I heard that there is a new grant scheme for installing solar panels in your home. How does the scheme work and do I qualify?

ANSWER

The Solar PV scheme gives grants to install solar photovoltaic (PV) panels and a battery energy storage system at your home. This means you can generate and use renewable electricity in your home and reduce your electricity costs. The Solar PV scheme is a pilot scheme administered by the Sustainable Energy Authority of Ireland (SEAI).

To qualify for a grant you must:

•Be the owner of a home built and occupied before 2011 (or a home constructed after 2011 that was built to the 2008 Building Regulations)

•Use new materials and products that were not already covered under another grant programme

•Use a registered contractor from the SEAI's Renewable Installers Register for Solar PV

•Have the electrical work completed by a Safe Electric Ireland electrician

•Apply to be connected to the electricity distribution system using the ESB Networks NC6 form (pdf)

•Have a Building Energy Rating (BER) carried out after the work is completed

•Agree to participate in SEAI research about the scheme The grant covers materials and labour, unless you are a contractor doing the work in your own home. In this case only the cost of the materials is covered.

When the SEAI payment system opens (in October 2018) you can claim your grant online and it will be paid directly into your bank account.

WHEN A RELATIONSHIP BREAKS UP

The ending of a relationship can be a very painful time - whether you are the one who has ended the relationship or not. It may have come as a great shock - which can be very upsetting. Even if it had been coming for a while, the grief that accompanies a break up can be devastating. Following a break up we may feel overwhelmed with feelings of loss, grief, anxiety, loneliness, guilt and sadness and it may feel as if our lives will never be the same again. We may find that we have one good day, only to feel flooded with sorrow the next. This is very natural and part of the grieving process. If we were the one to end the relationship we may experience feelings of guilt, loneliness, sadness and/or relief. Whatever you are feeling, it is important to allow yourself time to grieve. Healthy grieving means experiencing our feelings, whatever they may be. Gradually we come to accept the loss and re-adjust to a life without that person. It can be difficult to move that person from being at the centre of your life to somewhere peripheral. This is made all the more challenging if you have children together or work in the same office. Minimal contact however tough - is advisable.

At times grief can feel like a physical pain – so working with our body can help to release the sadness. Gentle movements such as stretching, walking dancing, yoga, massage or tai chi can all help our mind and body to express our grief.

Although your grief may feel very intense it will change over time. It is important to remind yourself that the heartbreak will heal. Gradually you will begin to notice that you're not checking your phone as much anymore, you have a night out where the sadness isn't present or you're not crying all the time. It is vital to notice these changes – as no matter how small they may seem – they signal change and heraid a new beginning.

Grief can be a very isolating experience, so it is important to seek support and reach out to others. You may choose to talk to friends or consider speaking to a counsellor to help you through this time. Remember you don't have to go through this alone. Other great sources of support include spending time with family, walks in nature, pets, reading a good book, watching a movie or going to the gym.



UNIVERSAL SOCIAL CHARGE (USC)

You pay the USC if your gross income is more than €13,000 per year. Once your income is over this limit, you pay the relevant rate of USC on all of your income.

Budget 2019: changes to USC The 4.75% rate of USC will reduce to 4.5%.

The ceiling of the 2% band will increase from €19,372 to €19,874, so that the salary of a full-time worker on the minimum wage will remain outside the higher rates of USC. Incomes of €13,000 or less will continue to be exempt from USC in 2019. Once your income is over this limit, the following rates will apply (from 1 January 2019):

- €0 to €12,012 @ 0.5%
- €12,012 to €19,874 @ 2%
- €19.874 to €70.044 @ 4.5%
- €70,044+@8%
- Self-employed income over €100,000: 3% surcharge

Income liable for the USC

The Universal Social Charge is payable on gross income, including notional pay (notional pay is the value of a non-cash benefit, such as benefit-in-kind), after any relief for certain capital allowances. The Universal Social Charge is payable on pension contributions. Income exempt from the USC

You do not pay the Universal Social Charge if your total income for a year is €13,000 or less.

All Department of Employment Affairs and Social Protection payments, including Maternity Benefit, Paternity Benefit and State pensions, are exempt from the Universal Social Charge. Similar payments, such as payments made as part of Community Employment schemes or the Back to Education Allowance, are exempt. Social welfare or similar payments made from abroad are exempt. Student grants and scholarships are also exempt.

Income where DIRT (Deposit Interest Retention Tax) has already been paid is exempt from the USC.

THE GRAVE FARTHEST FROM EARTH

No human has ever flown closer to Pluto than Clyde Tombaugh did in 2015, 18 years after his death. That's fitting, because he was also the first person to lay eyes on it.

When he first glimpsed Planet X, which would go on to be christened Pluto, he was just barely 24 and largely self-taught. A farmers son from Streator, Illinois, he had once rigged up a backyard telescope made out of parts from a cream separator and a 1910 Buick. He was awarded a place at the Lowell Observatory, in Flagstaff, Arizona, on the strength of his independent studies and spent months sifting through images of the night sky, looking for changes in the orbits of Uranus and Neptune and a planet that hadn't yet been identified. Mr. Tombaugh died in 1997. Nearly two decades later, one ounce of his cremated remains journeyed to the outer edge of our solar system inside an aluminium capsule aboard the New Horizons spacecraft. The capsule's inscription eulogises Mr. Tombaugh as a husband, father, astronomer, teacher, punster, and friend.

The capsule zoomed within 7,800 miles of Pluto in July 2015, whizzing by at a speed exceeding 30,000 miles per hour and is still hurtling through space, on its way out of our solar system. It's currently more than four billion miles from Earth. Since then roughly 450 people have been "buried" in space—though this often means that only a gram or so of their cremated remains took a brief journey to the stars before either returning to Earth on the same craft, or burning up during reentry. A number of space-burial companies, are banking on big growth in the sector, where prices have fallen to be just a few thousand dollars more than the average terrestrial entombment in North America.



Sin brings darkness, but the Love of God displayed through Jesus His Son, has quenched the darkness of sins' power, because "His life brought Light to everyone. The Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness can never extinguish it" (John 1:4-5). I really enjoyed that TV programme recently about the Lighthouses of Ireland - what a feat of engineering and human effort they are. Lighthouses remind me of the Lord so much - no matter how bad the storms of life are raging, no matter how dark things may seem in life, when that Light penetrates the darkness out into the sea, it brings hope to weary sailors. Land is ahoy! But that light also serves as a warning - Beware! There are rocks here - care is needed so you don't get shipwrecked! Jesus, as the Light of the world is the beacon drawing us into safe harbour, and His Word penetrates the darkness that the devil has douded lives with, especially in relation to sin patterns and wrong attitudes. When we study His Word we find help for the circumstances we are enduring, and hope for a brighter future, but also direction and instruction warning us how to navigate the dangerous snares in the darkness.
