"A TEAM" RETURN HOME AFTER ANTHONY'S US TREATMENT

"I am not telling you it is going to be easy, I am telling you it is going to be worth it" was the mantra that got Anthony Morris through nine months of horrendous treatment for chronic lymes disease in America.

This week, a happy and "freakishly well" Anthony was back at his family home in Pinewood Estate where he invited Killarney Outlook editor Aisling Crosbie and photographer Marie Carroll O'Sullivan for tea and a chat.

The Killarney man and former Kerry footballer has spent the last 9 months in a private clinic in America undergoing antibiotic treatment for chronic Lyme Disease.

Anthony was accompanied by his partner Margaret McCormack and their daughter Roisin during his stay in America – a visit that was funded by numerous events, mostly organised by Anthony's brother Jim.

"I was very sick when we arrived in Arlington in Virginia and my biggest concern was that we lived in a very safe place, a well policied area as Margaret would be going out and about on her own with Roisin", Anthony told the Killarney Outlook.

"We were very lucky as Roisin got into a very good school – the schools in Arlington are excellent as Northern Virginia have some of the highest tax rates with all the government offices in the vicinity - which means that the public schools are really good" Margaret said.

The move was a big change for Roisin (9) who was a pupil of Lissivigeen National School before her move to the States – she had to learn lock down drills and earthquake drills but took it all in her stride and settled in quickly and made new friends.

Roisin joined a local soccer team, Arlington Strikers and Margaret soon became a soccer mom. "I was a defender with the team as I have a long kick that I learned when I played with Dr. Crokes" Roisin said.

Twice a week and on Saturdays– the family would take a taxi and Anthony would go to training with Roisin even though he was suffering the side effects of his heavy course of treatment.

"Before I knew it I was helping out the dads in charge at the sideline – and even though I was exhausted, it was great to get out and see Roisin train", Anthony said.

Anthony went through a rigorous course of intravenous and oral antibiotics for nine months at the Jemsek Speciality Clinic in Washington DC and the plan going forward is that he will continue on oral medication, have a phone consultation every three months and attend the clinic once a year.

Much to the delight of the couple, who are both Civil Engineers, Anthony has exceeded expectations in terms of how well he has responded to treatment and every day is feeling better and getting stronger.

"I didn't walk unaided for the whole nine months and there was sometimes when I was in bed I would wouldn't be able to move my arms or legs and Margaret would come in and shake me to see if I was okay - I was horrendously sick

", Anthony said.

"Every medicine he took had side effects so if you are taking aggressive IV medication you are going to have aggressive side effects" Margaret added.

Margaret has been trained by the clinic to administer IV medication and all the funding raised here in Killarney went towards the costs of the medical costs.

"We were absolutely amazed by all the fundraisers and by all the work that Jim did. He would keep us up to speed through facebook. "I would be lying down, concentrating on breathing and staying alive, and then Margaret would show me all the pictures of the fundraising, and I used to think wouldn't I love to be there – the craic the lads are having" , Anthony said.

The whole time the family spent in Arlington was centered on Anthony, making sure he was taking his medication and resting and eating.

Lyme bacteria is surrounded by a hard shell and Anthony had to take certain medication to break down the shell to get to the bacteria – this was called the "kill week" and then the second week is called the "scrub week" and according to Anthony he was literally counting down the hours until it was over.

One week alone he took 40 IV's which took over 50 hours to administrator.

"After each protocol I would start coming around - and sick as I would be I would try to do something with Roisin - it would kill me afterwards but it was very important for me to spend time with her as she has never seen me well in her 9 years.

Doctors were always looking for blue sky days – these were days when Anthony would feel a little better. They knew if he got two in a row, that treatment was working. "Lyme disease is like a cork screw – it targets weak areas – especially areas where you would have sports injuries or things like that" Anthony added.

"The last two protocols were the same and the first one nearly killed me – they were very hard on the system. I used to watch TV shows to distract me while the IV's were going in"

"When I finished my last round, the following day I couldn't stand, on day two I could barely walk, day three I was coming around and then on the fourth day – bang - 6am I woke right up and and I was fresh as a daisy. I got up, made breakfast and walked Roisin to school. I felt so good, I was looking around for some fella to kick a ball with – I had no pain – no nothing. I saw a bike and said to myself - I am going to take this for a spin and I hopped up on it and did a short cycle around the block." Anthony said beaming.

"I just couldn't believe it as for the past nine years I spent my time being told that all the symptoms were in my head – I didn't trust it. I was freakishly well".

When they attended the clinic before they left for Killarney, Anthony and Margaret were told that he had been hit with everything they had – and everytime he hit the milestone – he came back and took it every single time – "we never saw someone so determined and bloodyminded to beat this thing" Dr. Jensen said to the couple which they named the "A Team".

Just before they left Arlington, the couple donated all their furniture from their apartment, which they had bought second hand to three families from Honduras who had recently moved to the area.

€244,000 FOR KILLARNEY PROJECTS FROM COMMUNITY FUND

Funding for almost 80 projects in the Killarney Municipal District has been awarded from the Kerry Community Fund

Kerry County Council have awarded €169,500 to the Killarney Municipal Area from this year's allocation of Kerry Community Funding which sees 79 of the 104 applicants within the area receive amounts between €100 up to €60,000 for individual projects.

A further €50,000 has been set aside for projects and initiatives deemed to have the potential for co-funding with other sources such as the Leader Programme and which have a wider strategic aim.

In addition, €24,500 is being provided for projects and events which have been funded on an annual basis in recent years such as

Christmas lighting in a number of areas and projects and events which were historically supported financially by Killarney Town Council.

At a special meeting of the Municipal Authority that was held at the Killarney Library on Wednesday, Killarney Municipal District Mayor Brendan Cronin welcomed the funding and went to say "This is one of those days, that it's great to be able to say to people we are giving you something back. I know the amounts range and vary as do the projects but it's all a help to each of them and it will enhance and support these groups in some small way"

Of the 79 approved projects, €109,000 went to the Killarney Area and that news was welcomed by Cllr Michael Gleeson, who said the money

"was a recognition of the great work that small community groups do and every often it was the small amount that helped local people achieve great things within the community" Cllr Niall Kelleher also welcomed the money that was coming into the area but felt it was important for people to know that not all councillors were behind the setting up of the fund in the first place. "This is great news for small groups but if some had their way, the fund would not exist and none of these groups would have got funding."

TOURISTS NAME RING OF KERRY AS BEST ATTRACTION IN KERRY



Europcar Ireland have revealed findings of 2016 Europcar Tourism Index and it shows the Ring of Kerry has come out on top. Research was conducted among more than 6,000 tourists last year, who named the Ring of Kerry as

the best attraction in Co Kerry. More than one third of tourists visited Ireland for the first time in 2016, but over half have holidayed in Ireland more than once. The best tourist attraction in Kerry is the Ring Kerry according to over a third (36%) of tourists. The Ring of Kerry topped the Dingle Peninsula and Killarney National Park, which came in second and third place respectively. The top three European countries tourists hail from are ranked as the UK (23%), Germany (5%) and France (4%). Outside of Europe, a large number of tourists (17%) are visiting from the US, with 6% from Australia. According to the research, word of the Wild Atlantic Way and it's beauty is widespread in other countries with 51% of tourists having heard of the region before their visit. Almost two thirds (65%) drive part of the Wild Atlantic Way during their time in Ireland and most (62%) were so impressed with their experience that they would like to return. Results show that tasting Guinness is high on to-do lists among tourists, with more than three quarters (77%) tasting it during their trip and 43% enjoy traditional Irish stew before returning home. It seems staycations are becoming more popular as 18% of Irish car renters organised a staycation in Ireland . Cork and Kerry were the most popular regions for 32% of staycationers to visit . Overall 2016 has been another positive year for the tourism sector with an increase of 11.6% in overseas visitors to Ireland for the first ten months of 2016, with that being said 2017 looks set to be another great year for tourism in Kerry.

Shameful waste of quality timber in Killarney National Park

While Council's squander thousands of euro's of tax payers money on poorly designed and badly constructed street furniture for towns and villages across the county, thousands of euro's worth of quality timber lies rotting in Killarney National Park.

We fully recognise and appreciate the importance of leaving 'tree litter' and some 'fallen' trees/branches to rot for biological reasons in our forests and woodlands, however, it is totally unnecessary and wasteful to leave high-grade, quality hard/softwood trunks like oak, yew, scot's pine and beech to rot when it could be converted into usable timber for local construction/craft needs. Imported street furniture made from tropical timber costing thousands of euros have been removed from the streets of Killarney in recent weeks by Kerry County Council staff. A number of imported tree planters as well as some street seating made from tropical timber of dubious origin have been taken in for "refurbishment".

Health to deal with this crisis. Life will never be the same without Dad. He deserved so much more, another 15 to 20 years of his life. We feel that he should have received a kidney two years ago when he was able. It took me, his son, to offer to check if I was a possible match. I was. But Dad would not let me suffer. Considering this furniture is only in situ for less than a year it is totally unacceptable that the Council should continue to purchase such poorly designed and poorly made made items and at such exorbitant cost. "Opportunities to produce good quality street furniture made from locally-sourced timber should be given to suitably qualified local small and medium enterprises (SME's) as a means of supporting local jobs as a matter of urgency.", according to Just Forests founder, Tom Roche. Roche goes on to say that, "it is not good enough that thousands of euros of quality timber lies rotting in our National Park." Ireland has the largest percapita usage of tropical timber in the EU. It is used in places that is totally unnecessary when Irish-grown timber would do the same job and provide much needed economic incentive for local timber sawmills. Towards the end of January 2017, An Taoiseach, Enda Kenny TD, and the Minister for Arts, Heritage, Regional, Rural and Gaeltacht Affairs, Heather Humphreys TD, launched 'Realising our Rural Potential: The Action Plan for Rural Development. According to Minister Humphreys, who also happens to Denis Breen

have responsibility for the National Parks and Wildlife Service, "The plan places a focus on creating sustainable rural communities. This means we will implement strategies which will support and empower citizens in local towns, villages and their environs to build on their strengths."

Just Forests are now calling on Minister Humphreys and the National Parks and Wildlife Service to collect all fallen trees into a stockpile and hold an annual auction where local sawmills can bid on the logs. The income from such activity will help generate funds to pay professional contractors to eradicate the rhododendron and deal with this major ecological catastrophe taking place under our noses. The Plan contains a number of actions which if implemented will support sustainable communities through enterprise and employment opportunities, rural tourism and recreation as well as fostering a sense of culture, connectivity and creativity in rural communities.

Things you need to know about tax if you're an **Airbnb host in Ireland**

1. Airbnb income does not qualify for rent-a-room relief

If you have any Airbnb income then you need to declare this to Revenue without exception as it doesn't qualify for rent-a-room relief. Revenue's guidelines on the subject confirm that providing accommodation to occasional visitors does not qualify for tax exemption and is subject to Income Tax (along with PRSI & USC) as a trade. It doesn't matter if you're an Irish resident or not – you still have to pay tax on income arising from all Irish properties rented out using Airbnb.

2. Allowable Expenses can reduce your tax liability

When filing your tax return, it's important to include any expenses you've incurred as these can reduce your tax bill. According to Revenue: 'expenses that have been incurred directly in the provision of the accommodation' can be deducted when calculating the taxable profits. Such expenses include: Cleaning, Food, Laundry, Commission to Airbnb, Additional insurance purchased, Electricity, Gas and Heating. In addition to the deductible expenses listed above you can also claim mortgage interest relief and wear and tear on household furniture & fittings. It's important to note that proportional amounts of utility costs can be considered i.e. the amounts of electricity and gas that are used as a result of your hosting activity.

3. Your Airbnb income should be declared annually

You can declare the income by filing an annual tax return – either a Form 11 or Form 12 - depending on your individual circumstances and other sources of income you may have.

LANDOWNERS IT IS NOW ILLEGAL TO BURN VEGETATION ON UNCULTIVATED GROUND

the burning of furze, ferns, heather or other vegetation on uncultivated land is illegal between March 1st and August 31st.

Farmers can be hit hard in the pocket as vegetation on land which is found to have been burned outside of the legal season can be considered ineligible for payment under Department schemes.

In addition to the safety issues, there are also severe penalties in place for those who cause damage to nesting and wildlife habitats as a result of burning, which extend to large fines and potential imprisonment.

The Air Pollution Act sets out certain restrictions around smoke and pollution which would affect those in proximity of the fires.

There are a number of obvious risks with burning, for example damage to homes, farm lands and setting fire to nearby valuable plantations of forestry. Potentially it can also endanger lives, with the added pressure on our already stretched emergency services.

In the cases of fires started deliberately, where they cannot be associated with controlled burning such an action would be described as arson. The rigors of criminal law could apply including potentially lengthy imprisonment and severe financial penalties.

SHROVE TUESDAY FELL ON FEBRUARY 28TH – AND YOU MIGHT LIKE TO KNOW A FEW OLD WEDDING TRADITIONS AND SUPERSTITIONS

The day immediately preceding Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent in the Christian churches of the West, is known in English as Shrove Tuesday. The day takes its name from "shriving"—the pre-Lenten confession and absolution of the faithful as a preparation for Lent that was common in the European Middle Ages. Feasting on foods initially prohibited during Lent, such as meat, eggs, and milk products, was integral to Shrove Tuesday observance.

Shrove Tuesday was also known as "Pancake Day" in England. After the Reformation, the Shriving Bell, which had hitherto called parishioners to be shriven, signalled the commencement of revelry and pancake-making. In parts of Wales children formerly collected pancake ingredients, while in the Isle of Man, pancake-making has apparently replaced the older custom of serving oatmeal and gravy for midday dinner and meat and pancakes in the evening.

In Scotland, beef was eaten on Shrove Tuesday (also called "Fastern's E'en") to ensure household prosperity. Oatmeal bannocks enriched with eggs and milk were baked, and, together with



the beef broth, were used in marriage divination by the inclusion of a ring to betoken marriage, or other items to indicate the rank or occupation of the future marriage partner. The identity of the beloved might be revealed in dreams induced by placing a bannock under the pillow.

In Ireland, Shrove Tuesday weddings were formerly popular, a custom connected to the canonical prohibition on the solemn celebration of the sacrament of matrimony during Lent.

*According to Greek culture, sugar in the Brides glove will sweeten the union.

*The English believe a spider found in a wedding dress means good luck, they also believe Wednesday the "best day" to marry, although Monday is for wealth and Tuesday is for health.

*The groom carries the bride across the threshold to bravely protect her from evil spirits lurking below.

*Rain on your wedding day is actually considered good luck, according to Hindu tradition.

*For good luck, Egyptian women pinch the bride on her wedding day.

*Middle Eastern brides paint henna on their hands and feet to protect themselves from the evil eye.

*Peas are thrown at Czech newlyweds instead of rice or confetti.

*A Swedish bride used put a silver coin from her father and a gold coin from her mother in each shoe to ensure that she'll never do without.

GARDENING UTLOOK

FOCUS ON TREES

Trees are beautiful in any garden and their long life makes them a wonderful garden feature. A tree should be the first thing you plant in your garden after the hedging – they can be underplanted afterwards with bulbs and shrubs. Trees are interesting in all four seasons with attractive unfolding of leaves in Spring, full foliage in Summer, good Autumn colour followed by decorative bark in the Winter. The first and most important thing you need to know when buying a tree is what's the height and spread going to be when it is mature. There are many varieties of trees to choose from and there is a tree suitable for most areas. Trees can be planted all year round but as with hedging, trees can be planted when they are dormant between Novemeber and March.

With these bare-rooted trees you will still have a few weeks left to plant them. If you plant beofre the end of March, it will give the tree a better chance of rooting into the ground that bit quicker. When planting your bare rooted tree, dig the hole big enough, that you can spread out the roots all around the hole. Then drive your stake into the hole roughly about 6 to 8 inches below the bottom of the hole, place your tree and spread the roots out well. If possible place your stake on the side of the prevailing winds as this will ensure that the tree is blown up against the stake when the wind is high. Fill in the soil mixed with compost around the roots and firm in with the heel of your foot. Lastly, place your tree ties on - one near the top and one at the bottom with a spacer in between to stop the bark being damaged by the stake.
