Replacing a series of sharp bends at Kilderry on the old N70 road, the €11m project which was completed on time and on budget by contractors, Sorensen Civil Engineering Limited, provides improved access on the main route from Tralee and north Kerry to the Ring of Kerry and southwest Kerry. Planning approval for the scheme was granted in January 2014 and the Compulsory Purchase Order for the required lands was completed in June 2016. The scheme was developed by the Kerry National Roads Office based in Castleisland.

CYCLE AGAINST SUICIDE DEPARTS FROM KILLARNEY

A sea of cyclists departed from Killarney Community College yesterday morning as the Cycle Against Suicide passed through Killarney on its annual main cycle.

Cycle Against Suicide is national awareness charity that sets out to change culture and create a society that openly talks about suicide to allow people to speak up and see help.

When an individual is vulnerable enough to consider taking their own life, silence is read as indifference. With hundreds of people dying by suicide we all have a role to play to collectively address the challenges that suicide presents.

Each year, Cycle Against Suicide brings together cyclists with different backgrounds and stories to help break the cycle of suicide in Ireland. This is a community-wide awarenessraising campaign to mobilise all sectors of society to work together to change negative attitude. In doing so, Cycle Against Suicide hopes to enable those who with mental ill health to seek help.

The cycle was welcomed into Killarney on Wednesday, May 1st with the first cyclists arriving at the Killarney Community College at 4.30pm.

On Thursday morning there was an hour long presentation focusing on the topic of mental health and wellbeing in the school for students and around 150 cyclists intending to cycle the next leg to Cork.

The school showcased a video they prepared to raise awareness about mental health, there was a number of guest speakers and the school choir performed a selection of songs including Kodaline's 'Head Held High'.

"There is a strong emphasis now being placed on mental health and well being by the Department of Education.", Killarney Community College Principal Stella Loughnane told the Kilarney Outlook.

Four hundred hours of wellbeing have been allocated to all junior cycle students entering secondary school. We are delighted with the opportunity to host such an important and worthwhile event that raises awareness about such a sensitive subject and whose central message highlights the fact that it's ok to not be ok.

Hopefully students will realise that there is always help available to them with regards to their emotional needs", she added.

The power of the cycle and its message is something that brings families, communities, organisations, schools, individuals and cyclists of all abilities together with a common purpose of ending the cycle of suicide. Each year, Cycle Against Suicide aims to engage more and more communities to begin a conversation about mental health; about looking after ourselves and reaching out to each other.

Kerry farmer Kevin Curran who lost his wife Eileen to cancer in 2009 is preparing for a 1,400km journey on his vintage tractor to raise crucial funds for the Irish Cancer Society's cancer research. Kevin, from Waterville, lost his wife Eileen to cancer in 2009. Ever since he has ploughed his efforts into raising over \in 75,000 for cancer research through a number of tractor runs, including one across Route 66 in 2012.

The 75-year-old decided it was time to take 'Betsy', a 50 year old vintage tractor, out of retirement this year. Together with a small support group of friends they will tackle a route the length of Great Britain, from John O'Groats to Lands End in the UK.

Kevin said, "We are raising the money for cancer research so that one day we can stop this terrible disease. My wife Eileen died from cancer ten years ago, and more people are being diagnosed with it every year so it's something that I'm passionate about.

"We think it will take us about five days to complete the journey, if we manage to clock up 200 miles each day. There will be a team of five altogether and we all take turns with the driving, starting from about 9am until well after dark. We will be out there whatever the weather – rain won't stop us!"

Betsy, which was named by Eileen before she died, is being serviced at present before being shipped to the UK for to start the journey on May 1st.

People from 90 countries from around the world were formally made Irish Citizens at a cermeony in the INEC on Monday last.

The Minister for Justice and Equality, Charlie Flanagan TD, ws on hand to congratulate 2,400 new Irish citizens across three citizenship ceremonies

Citizenship ceremonies were first introduced in 2011 in order to mark the occasion of the granting of citizenship in a dignified and solemn manner. Monday's ceremonies bring the total number of ceremonies held since then to 141 where people from over 180 countries will have received their certificates of naturalisation. Including minors, over 122,000 people will have received Irish citizenship since 2011 following the ceremonies.

The ceremonies continue to see significant numbers of those originating from the United Kingdom granted Irish citizenship. At today's ceremonies, 309 people from the UK will receive their certificates of Irish citizenship.

The majority of these new citizens come from Poland (406), with people from the UK (309), Romania (218), India (186), and Nigeria (99) Latvia (98) Philippines (86) Brazil (72) United States Of America (68) and finally China (Including Hong Kong) (61).

Tuesday's racing – a flat card – will also be an evening meeting with the first race timed for 5.20pm and it has been designated as a special night at the track for those involved in the hospitality industry with special discounts available for all hard working hospitality staff. HOW TO TREAT **EYE ALLERGIES**

Allergic conjunctivitis is commonly caused by sensitivity to grass and tree pollen, dust mites or animals. It is far more common in those with a history of allergies or those who have a family history of allergies.

SYMPTOMS

Allergic conjunctivitis usually causes pink or red itchy eyes. The eyes are normally watery and other allergy symptoms such as sneezing and a runny nose may be present.

The seasonal type of allergic conjunctivitis will vary with the time of year and weather conditions. Those with more general allergies, such as an allergy to dust mites, will most likely have symptoms throughout the year.

TREATMENT

You can treat allergic conjunctivitis by: · Avoiding the cause of the allergy (if possible)

- Using cold compresses (such as clean cotton wool balls soaked in cold water) to soothe the eyes
- Avoiding rubbing your eyes as this
- will make the symptoms worse. There is also a range of medicines that may help. Some are available over the counter at the pharmacy and other stronger medicines need a prescription.



Mast-cell stabiliser eye drops such as sodium cromoglicate (Opticrom) do not work straight away. Instead, they take a few days to start to work. These drops are good if you know when you are likely to develop an allergy and so you can use them to prevent symptoms Antihistamine eye drops such as antazoline sulphate (Otrivine-Antistin) provide a more immediate effect. They won't prevent an allergic reaction, but instead treat the symptoms once the allergy has started.

Antihistamine tablets work in the same way as the eye drops, but will also treat other allergy symptoms such as a runny nose and sneezing that is caused by the allergy.

You should not wear contact lenses if your symptoms are severe or if you have been told that your cornea is affected. Do not put drops in your eyes while wearing contact lenses.

REMEMBER:

•Avoid rubbing your eyes, as this may make your symptoms worse

•Use a cold compress to soothe your eves

•Wearing glasses or sunglasses may help to shield your eyes from pollen

Gardening with Killarney Outlook

FOCUS ON HANGING BASKETS

Using containers, pots and baskets full of summer bedding plants can give you brilliant colour from now right through the summer to early autumn. There are a wide range of different types of hanging baskets but the main thing to go for is the size because the larger the basket, the more compost you can fit into it, giving the flowers more compost to grow in thus prolonging their lives. When filling a hanging basket the first thing to do is to place a liner at the base of the basket. Then place your basket on top of a pot as this will give you a steady base when planting. Half fill the basket with compost and a slow release fertilizer. Then plant some bedding plants at the base and sides of the basket such as trailing lobelia, pansies and nasturium. All you have to do is to push the root of the plant through the square in the basket, push it through the liner and into the compost. Then fill the basket almost to the top with compost, place your remaining plants around your chosen centerpiece plant such as a geranium or fuchsia. Pick three good trailing plants, like trailing petunia, geranium or fuchsia. Fill in between with other bedding plants such as begonias, busy lizzys or pansies. Some of the plants at the bottom of the basket may look a bit shook after planting but when watered in well they will look perfect in a few hours. Don't hang your basket out in its position for a couple of days after planting and water regularly.

Citizens Information

Know Your Rights:

QUESTION

I am returning to Ireland from Australia where I have been working and living for the last 10 years. I received my degree from the University of Melbourne. I want to do a Masters in Ireland on my return. Can I use my foreign degree to apply for a place in a third level course?

ANSWER

You should first check with the admissions office of your chosen 3rd level institution to see if they will accept your degree for admission to the Masters.

NARIC Ireland also provides free advice on the academic recognition of foreign qualifications in Ireland. The service compares a foreign qualification to an Irish qualification of a similar type and level on the Irish National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ). The NARIC Ireland foreign qualifications database has details of over 1100 qualifications from over 140 countries. You can download a Comparability Statement which compares your qualifications to an award type and level in the context of the Irish National Framework of Qualifications. If your qualification is not currently listed you can request recognition advice for your foreign award by emailing them directly. Visit www.naric.ie for more information.

Make sure you have original copies of your degree (parchment) and exam transcripts before leaving Australia, as you will have to submit these with your application to the college and/or the NARIC.

TAPIRS COULD BE KEY IN HELPING DEGRADED RAINFORESTS BOUNCE BACK

A new study has found that lowland tapirs spend more time in degraded forests than in pristine Amazon rainforest. They also defecate and deposit three times more seeds in these degraded areas.

"The role that tapirs play in seeding degraded forests is another good reason for conserving this last representative of the megafauna of South America," Lucas Paolucci, the paper's first author and an ecologist at Brazil's Federal University of Lavras and the Amazon Environmental Research Institute, said in a statement.

Related to horses and rhinos and about the size of large pigs, Brazil's lowland tapir (Tapirus terrestris), also known as the Brazilian tapir, is listed as vulnerable by the IUCN. The slow-reproducing animal doesn't rebound well from intensive hunting, and its forest habitat is dwindling.

But because it's big, stretching to 2.2 meters (7 feet) long and weighing in at 250 kilograms (550 pounds) it can ferry around many different types of seeds, which it then deposits in the forest with its dung. Many of these large seeds eventually become large trees, that contribute indirectly to maintaining forest carbon stocks More than 99% of the nearly 130,000 seeds that the researchers found in the tapirs' dung made it through unscathed, meaning they at least had the potential to germinate. And the seeds came from 24 different plant species, suggesting that tapirs contribute to the diversity of species growing in a given area.



THE ARKANSAS BLACK APPLE

Arkansas established an economy around apple production and growers first discovered and cultivated this breed thought to be a descendant of the Winesap apple in 1870, at an orchard in the county seat of Bentonville. During the 1920s, 15 to 20% of the state's yield was from the Arkansas black variety, but moth infestations that necessitated costly management and the onset of the Great Depression were a fatal blow to its commercial production.

Families maintained Arkansas Black apples trees in their gardens, despite the fact if you try to eat it picked straight from the tree it's a rock-hard, sour piece of fruit that tastes terrible and the supply was relegated to home cooking including baking the long-lasting fruit into pies and pastries after having aged it in cold storage for a few months.

Today, the species make up between 3 and 5% of the state's apple production and recently local chefs have taken to the fruit with renewed interest, using the heritage crop to add a unique element to meat accompaniments, pie fillings, and cheese pairings.

THIS MAN HAS TO BE ADMIRED DESPITE HIS UPPER CLASS BEGINNINGS

His Imperial and Royal Highness Archduke Stefan of Austria, Prince of Hungary, Bohemia and Tuscany was born August 15, 1932, in the suburban community of Modling, Vienna. He was the eldest son of Archduke Anton of Austria and Princess Ileana of Romania. The family moved a number of times during his youth, including to Romania in 1942 in the midst of World War II. There, they lived for a period in Bran Castle, made famous by its similarities to Count Dracula's castle. In 1947, the family fled the Communist takeover of Romania, living for a time in both Switzerland and Argentina before ending up in the United States.

Archduke Stefan graduated from Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), came to Michigan to work for General Motors, and in 1961 became a citizen of the United States. He passed away on November 12, 1998, and is buried beside his wife, Mary Jerrine Soper, in St. Wenceslaus Cemetery in remote Northern Michigan.

GEORGE H. W. BUSH'S SERVICE DOG WILL BRING JOY TO VETERANS

Sully the Golden Labrador was photographed lying down in front of the American flagdraped casket of his favourite former president, but that doesn't mean he's finished serving his country just yet.

Following the death of his owner, George H. W. Bush, in a heart-melting video that was livestreamed by the Walter Reed National Military Medical Centre in Bethesda, Maryland, a serviceman can be seen respectfully facing Sully and asking if he vows to take a specialised oath of service to faithfully discharge the duties of providing joy, love and nurturing for our soldiers, sailors, airmen, Marines, and sailors and their families?"

Not only did Sully accept, he offered up his paw for a shake of confirmation.

The 2-year-old dog was prepared for such occasions as these through America's VetDogs,

a charity that trains and pairs service dogs with veterans and service members coping with various health problems.

Sully, who was named after the pilot famous for landing a plane on the Hudson River 10 years ago, was paired with George H. W. Bush in June of last year and stayed with him until his funeral in December.

Nepal's Army worked with government and non-government organisations over the course of 5 days to collect all of the rubbish and debris left behind by climbers.

The crew flew in over 2.5 tons of tools and resources to facilitate the cleanup. All of the biodegradable debris that was collected from the mountain – which amounted to roughly one tonne of refuse – was transported to Kathmandu for disposal by the Blue Waste to Value group. The other tonne of nonbiodegradable rubbish was being disinfected for treatment.

The initiative was part of the 24th annual Wildlife Week, which is organised by the regional Sagarmatha National Park Office.

The cleanup will continue throughout the Himalayan mountain range until May 19th, according to a Nepali Army press release.

MEMORIALS | NOVENAS



Last week we looked at the many ways we can raise our self-esteem and begin to feel better about ourselves. We also identified how these patterns of low self-esteem can start very early in life – and thus it makes sense that we think about developing and promoting self-esteem in childhood. Parents and caregivers can promote positive self-esteem in their children by encouraging their children and making sure they feel loved, secure and competent.

Children who are scared to try new things and speak negatively about themselves may have low self-esteem. They tend to give up easily or wait for someone else to do the task for them. They can also be overly critical and easily disappointed in themselves. They tend to view temporary problems as permanent and can be pessimistic. In contrast, children with healthy self-esteem are comfortable in social settings and enjoy interacting with others. They enjoy working independently as well as interacting in groups. They work towards finding a solution when faced with a challenge and don't put themselves down. They are generally more optimistic and know their strengths and weaknesses.

To help build your child's confidence, encourage your child to take healthy risks. Allow them to take (age-appropriate) chances, make choices and take responsibility for them. When children make their own age-appropriate choices this empowers them- and gives them a sense of control over their bodies.

Children also need opportunities to demonstrate their competence and feel that they make a valuable contribution. This can mean asking them to help out at home – by setting the table or dusting. Encouraging them to take on tasks that they show particular interest in is a great way to boost their confidence. Teach your child to set goals and take pride in their accomplishments. It is important to ensure that their goals are within reach and at an appropriate level for their ability. However, if your child tries and doesn't succeed, this is a fantastic opportunity for you as parent to help build their self-esteem. Let them know that no matter what the result, your love is unconditional. Encourage them to try and try again.

Overly praising a child is not the way to develop their selfesteem and confidence. Confidence comes from them trying, failing and trying again. If we tell them they are doing a 'terrific job' whatever they do, this confuses children and they fearn not to trust their own instincts. However when praise is appropriate, specific and earned it is a valuable self-esteem builder.

Welcome back dear reader continuing on the bread and the cup of Communion and how it is a symbol put in place by Jesus by which we part-take in His sacrifice and enter into the New Covenant. Communion is the key to the entire message of the Gospel because it's the vehicle Jesus left us with to remember Him by. In 1st Corinthians 11:23-31 Paul teaches the church about the significance of the Lord's Supper, and warns that if we eat the bread or drink the cup in an unworthy manner we are sinning against the body and blood of Jesus. He goes on to say that we must examine our lives before eating the bread and drinking the cup so as not to bring judgement upon ourselves, and indicates that this is why many in the church are weak and sick and many die prematurely. Jesus shared the Passover meal with His disciples on the night He was betrayed by Judas (who was at the table eating with Him). He gave thanks and broke the bread and gave some to each of them saying 'this is My body which is given for you' (Luke 21:19), knowing well the Scriptures in Isaiah chapter 53 that His body was about to be whipped, beaten and torn apart for the Salvation and physical and mental healing of every person who would turn from their sins back to God and accept Him as Messiah - the Lamb of God. Jesus actually BECAME sin for us on the Cross. He blood doesn't just cover our sins like the yearly Passover lamb had done for the people up to His coming. He bore them upon Himself and carried them away never again to be remembered (Hebrews 8:8-12). This permitted the New Covenant to be enacted by God because of the sinless blood that Jesus shed for us (Hebrews chapter 10). He did not deserve to die - yet He chose to lay down His life for you and I so that we could be forgiven of our sins and reconciled back to the Father as if we had never sinned, and healed from every sickness and mental torment as well. True repentance and turning from our sins before part-taking in the bread and cup, and understanding fully what Jesus did for us brings healing and reconciliation - but it is to be a true lifestyle change and not an empty ritual.
