

KILLARNEY ALLIANCE AGAINST WILD FIRES CONTACT MINISTER

A group of concerned citizens have written to Ms Heather Humphreys TD, Dept of Arts, Heritage & the Gaeltacht regarding their concerns about the wild fires which destroyed thousands of acres of land in Killarney earlier this year.

Members of the Killarney Alliance Against Wild Fires includes Frank Lewis - Secretary, along with Cllr John Joe Culloty and representatives from Kerry Branch of the ICMSA, Killarney Branch of the IFA, Killarney Chamber of Tourism & Commerce, Killarney National Park Liaison Committee, Muckross Community Association and the Trustees of Muckross House

In an detailed submission the group have outlined their views on how to control wild fires through a managed process.

This process includes the following:

Planned burning is essential and dates for burning must be

sensible - allow burning until mid April -

• flexible - where weather does not allow burning by mid April and there is an urgent need to burn - this should be readily allowed.

• a practical approach from the Department of Agriculture on land eligability

• sensitive lands should be monitored in dry weather between mid February and Mid May. Monitoring staff should be capable of dealing with fires that are in the early stages.

• fire lines/breaks are essential within the National Park and on neighbouring commonage and mountains and the development of these need to be state funded.

• it should not be necessary to apply for a permit to burn protective lines adjoining inflammable areas

This was the management process operated by Coillte in the Killarney area for over seventeen years (1972 to 1989) and pre 1960. Because this process has not been in operation for 26 years there is now a highly dangerous situation with much mountain and commonage so overgrown. It is now necessary to put in place a strategy to bring these areas back to a condition where they can be managed. Our advice is that this is likely to take five years and will need special assistance. The only scientific research done on wild fires in Ireland would appear to be the records kept on those 20 years of Coillte management which found

• there was a significant number of wild fires in or near Killarney national Park every year.

• In an analysis of the wild fires over those 20 years a pattern repeated every year

• 60%/70% of fires were malicious - the fires were started by people who had no vested interest in burning

• 20/30% were landowners clearing their own land

10% were accidental

• the analysis of twenty years also found that where there was a firebreak along by a road the incidence of wild fires in that area dropped dramatically - maverick pyrophiles did not want to risk being seen

Planned burning, sensible and flexible dates, a practical approach on land eligability, monitoring sensitive lands at sensitive times, fire breaks, burning protective lines adjoining inflammable areas when necessary. That was historic practice. It was further validated in the Coillte practice in Killarney from 1972 to 1989 and pre 1960. The current consultative practice has clearly indicated that it is the only realistic way forward. A five year emergency strategy is necessary to get land to a condition where it is possible to implement this management approach

The group are most anxious that the Minister sees the situation on the ground in Killarney to ensure that historic practice and scientific research form the basis for this consultative process.

KILLARNEY OUTLOOK'S WEEKLY COLUMNIST DR. MICHAEL MOLONEY ADVISES RING OF KERRY CYCLISTS ON THEIR LAST MINUTE PREPARATIONS... RING OF KERRY PREPARATION TIPS



For seasoned and novice cyclists it is important to remember these few tips.

• **PREPARATION:** Anyone with a medical condition should discuss with their GP regarding their ability to race on the day.

• DAY BEFORE: Pre fuelling muscles with energy is very important the day before endurance exercise. I normally suggest meals with large amounts of carbohydrates (pasta, rice, bread and potatoes). Sugary drinks including sports drinks are an easy and good way to get large amounts of sugars into the blood stream. This sugar is then stored in the muscle in the form of glycogen. It is important to remember not to eat or drink anything which may make you feel sick. Meals with large amounts of protein (meat) are best avoided on this day.

I would also suggest drinking plenty in order to make sure your urine is clear in colour. Avoid drinking excessive amounts before bed as this will interfere with sleep.

Get a good night's sleep! (Try and avoid the festivities until after the event!)

• **MORNING OF THE CYCLE:** I would suggest a light breakfast on the morning of the cycle which again is predominantly carbohydrate based. Porridge with honey or sugar is a perfect meal.

• HYDRATION: The easiest thing to do and the easiest to forget! Staying hydrated on long cycles is very important. The key to adequate hydration is consistent sipping of fluids. Ideally two bottles (one with water and one with sports drink or juice) would be carried. When exercising for over an hour the body begins to deplete of important salts used to activate your muscles. Many sports drinks (or dioralyte sachets) contain the correct balance of salts required during exercise. Again it is very important that any drinks being used are not new to the cyclist to avoid getting sick on the day. These salts can be received from gummy bears or wine gums and I would suggest grazing on a couple of packets of these throughout the day also.

At any water station remember to top up your bottles!

• NUTRITION: All the preloading the days

before the cycle will only get you so far. Ideally for endurance events you should consume



amount of calories per hour as you are burning during exercise. During a cycle such as this it would not be unusual to burn 800-1000 calories per hour! (Average daily calorie intake is normally 3000 for a man and 2500 for a woman). From this you can see that it is important to eat large amounts during the cycle but not enough to make you sick!

I normally suggest easy to digest foods such as dried fruit. Couple this with sports drinks and wine gums in order to boost your calorie intake without having a huge volume of food in your stomach!

SUN EXPOSURE: If it is a sunny day wear total sunblock and a hat to prevent sun stroke.
 AFTER THE RACE: Repair first and celebrate after! Make sure to rehydrate and eat a meal with protein after the race. Ideally avoid alcohol as this can further dehydrate your body. Have a good night's sleep and congratulate yourself on finishing the race.

The aim of the initiative is to encourage and support a culture of entrepreneurship among young people in Ireland, to promote entrepreneurship as a career choice, and to encourage the establishment and development of new innovative businesses by Ireland's young entrepreneurs. This is hugely important for job-creation as two thirds of all new jobs are generated by businesses in the first five years of existence – more start-ups and a thriving entrepreneurial culture will lead to more jobs being created.

This project is an integral part of the Action Plan for Jobs 2014 and is supported by the Department of Jobs, Enterprise and Innovation through the Local Enterprise Offices.







You can be **SUN-SAFE** and still enjoy the sun as you only need to be getting 10-15 minutes of casual sun exposure per day, as this is all that is required to get the adequate amount of vitamin D3.

It is important to use a suitable sun-care product that will protect you from both UVA & UVB rays from the sun.

SUMMER DRIVING ADVICE BEING A GOOD PARENT MEANS BEING A GOOD DRIVER

When it comes to children in the car, parents are resigned to the distraction they cause and sceptical of finding a permanent solution. That's why we need to educate parents about the risks of focusing on their children rather than the road.

TIPS FOR PARENTS

The best advice is to give serious thought to your children's needs before you all jump into the car. One solution in reducing driver distraction, is the correct restraint of children in their car seats.

The RSA sees it regularly at its Check it Fits child car seat service. Think how you would feel on a trip in the car sitting in a seat that's incorrectly fitted, wearing layers of padded clothing and the straps not adjusted correctly so they're cutting into your shoulders? It certainly explains some of the constant crying and trying to get out of the seat behaviour of some children. Australian researchers found the children in their study were in the incorrect position for over 70 per cent of the journey time. Three quarters of child car seats we examine here in Ireland are incorrectly fitted. Ensuring your child is properly restrained in the correct car seat could eliminate a big cause of distraction while driving for parents.

If they do start acting up once the car is in motion, keep your attention on the road. If you feel you absolutely have to intervene, find a safe place to pull over in order to do so, but under no circumstances on the hard shoulder of a motorway. Otherwise stay focused on the driving. Everything and everyone else can wait.

You have spent every waking moment working hard to protect your children, don't jeopardise this because you didn't make in car safety your single-minded priority. If you want to be a good parent in the car, focus on being a good driver.

TRACTORS ON THE ROAD

Tractor drivers often have sound-proofed cabs or wear ear protectors, so they may not hear approaching cars.

Tractors don't have to be fitted with brake or indicator lights unless used at night so in daylight be prepared for them to stop or turn without warning.

Our country road code

• Keep plenty of distance behind a tractor, in case it stops suddenly – remember the 2-second rule

• A tractor may be longer than it appears - there may be a loader on the front. Make sure you have plenty of room to get past before overtaking

• Slow down if you come across a spillage – a bale of straw hit at speed will cause considerable damage to your car

• Don't park in a gateway or passing place – they are farmers' field access points

• Drive carefully after rain – dry mud can turn roads into a skidpan after a downpour

GLARE

• Sun glare causes many accidents, particularly under clear skies at dawn or dusk.

- Keep a clean and unscratched pair of sunglasses handy
- Avoid lenses which darken in strong sunlight the windscreen filters out UV light so the glasses will change only slowly.
- Clean the windscreen regularly, inside and out, to remove smears, which will catch sunlight and impair vision.

• Renew worn or damaged wiper blades will also help to improve vision





ROWING TO RIO The Monika Dukarska Blog. The story of a Professional Athlete



Another week has gone by and I am a step closer to my next competition. The last few days I have spent working on my rhythm and positioning at the catch. The catch means a point in time at which the blade enters the water and the rowers changes the direction of movement from stern to the bow (back of the boat). If this is timed correctly, the rower can utilise the already moving boat in result making the stroke more powerful and injecting speed into the stroke. As a stroke person in the boat, I am responsible for timing and rate. I have to 'listen' to the boat and move at the right speed in order to take the full advantage of the already moving boat. It is not easy, as I have to coordinate my lower body that is legs and especially feet to arrive at a specific time simultaneously preparing my upper body to place the oar into the water. This has to be done in a perfect synchronicity so that the flow of the boat is not disturbed. Hence, I cannot be late nor too early at the catch position. It sounds complicated but it is even harder to do in practice. Technical training sessions are used to practice parts of the stroke, which will hopefully lead to a better understanding, and feeling of the boat.

Mechanical changes in the boat require a lot of focus, which make me mentally fatigued. I have to concentrate very hard to move in a particular way. This way is verbalised by our coach and I have to make sense of it, transfer words into a movement and a feeling. Unfortunately, it takes time, patience and practice, as practice makes it permanent.

With all those technical pointers in mind, I am tackling long mileage sessions and already seeing some improvements in speed, which is encouraging and motivates me to work harder. Good weather also makes being on the water more pleasurable. The 20 kilometers outings are great for getting some farmers tan also :-) That rowing suit (the pale part of my body) will never come off; I genuinely think some parts of my body will never tan again. On that note, I had better go back to thinking about that catch positioning.

FARMING OUTLOOK



May milk cheques have arrived, confirming the price drop we were all anticipating. A base price well below 30 cents/litre is not comfortable reading for any farmer but for a significant number it carries them below the water line. The breakeven price for any individual is dependant on several factors, ranging from farm system to fragmentation to soil type but it is also dependant on the farmer's willingness to react and adapt to price fluctuation. In the brave new world, dominated by global market forces, understanding your cost base is crucial and questioning all costs is a necessity. It is a skill most of us learn as we go, turning away from the exercise is a costly mistake.

Rabobank are well placed to offer an overview on the global dairy market and it is not pleasant reading. We are still producing more than the market requires, China has not re entered the market and the Russian ban remains. The good news is that demand from other Asian markets continues to grow strongly and that low international commodity prices serve some benefit in product promotion. The cracks are appearing in production among our European counterparts and the saying that "the answer to low prices is low prices", will ultimately prove true. The biggest losers from the downturn in milk price are our New Zealand peers, twenty years ago they were the benchmark to which we all gravitated and we learned much from their management expertise. The rise in world markets has done many of them little favour, it would appear that they took their eye off the ball. They have certainly spent the last few months blaming everyone they can for the current trauma, everyone but themselves.

Twenty years ago New Zealand farmers produced milk at half the cost of their US competitors, today they do so at the same price. It is a lesson we would do well to remember. Undoubtedly some of that increase is due to currency fluctuations but most is due to bad advice and poor planning. Ever before the milk price started falling an assessment of farms showed that those that had not changed their system had made more money over the previous decade, substantially more. However the majority had increased stocking rates and imported feed and machinery, greatly increasing their output of milk. The rising price of milk had masked the lower level of profitability. Now in 2015 the mask is gone and reality can be a harsh teacher. Milk price is halved and may fall another 10%, many high output farms are leveraged to capacity, in cases to 100% and the cost base is non negotiable. There will be

blood before this slump ends. Synlait is a small processor of milk on the south island of New Zealand, it is only eight years old but it has grown rapidly to supply babyfood and niche products like A2 milk and melatonin rich milk to a growing international market. Its latest contract is a step farther down the road of sustainable natural foods, baby formula from grass fed cows. The demand for natural product continues to grow and cows grazing pasture is as natural as it gets. The health benefits include higher levels of CLA in milk produced from pasture. Their partner in the venture is a US company called Munchkin, a young innovative company in its own right. Opportunities always present themselves to those who are looking.

PROPER EQUIPMENT FOR AN EFFICIENT WATER SYSTEM

Water is very important on any Farm and its distribution in most farms is far from satisfactory. The most common pipe six used are 1/2", 3 / 4", and sometimes 1"pipe. Some farmers fit bigger pumps and increase the operating pressure to improve the flow to the troughs; usually this has little effect as you are still stuck with the flow restriction due to the smallbore pipe. What is important is how fast you can fill your trough and not how big your trough is.

Know Your Rights: EIRCODES

JULY 2015

QUESTION

What is the new Eircode?

ANSWER

In 2015 all residential and business addresses in Ireland will be given a unique new Eircode. Residential addresses include every address where post is delivered. Individual Eircodes will be given to each house on a street, each flat in an apartment block, both units in a duplex unit and each house in a rural townland. Eircodes will also be given to commercial addresses such as office buildings, shops, bars, hospitals and public buildings and each unit in a shopping centre or business park.

An Eircode is a unique seven-character alpha numeric code. Each Eircode will consist of a three-digit Routing Key which will identify the area and a four-character Unique Identifier for each address. For example: A65 F4E2

The Routing Key is the first three digits of an Eircode. The first character will always be a letter, followed by two numbers (except for D6W). The letters are not linked to a county or city name – except for postal districts in Dublin which will have their current post codes transferred into a Routing Key format such as D03, D12, D15, D22. The same Routing Key will be shared by several towns and townlands.

The Unique Identifier is a group of four digits and comes after the Routing Key. Each Unique Identifier is different and unique to your home or premises. They are not in sequence. This is to avoid the situation where a new building is created between two existing ones, and the code sequence would be broken, requiring all Eircodes in the area to be changed.


You do not need to change your address, an Eircode is simply added to the end of your address. The use of Eircode is not mandatory, however, it is likely that organisations will ask you for your Eircode, especially those delivering goods or services to your address.

You will be sent a letter in July 2015 informing you of the Eircode for your address and how to use it. Following the launch of Eircode in early July, you can also find or check an Eircode using the Eircode Finder which will be available at eircode.ie.

We now know that young people are first viewing pornography as early as 11 years of age and exposure to this material at a young age can be a confusing and disturbing experience for a child. We also know from research that parents, when given the skills, are the best people to impart sex education to their children. However, most would also say that they need assistance in their role as sex educators. Parents might find the following facts useful in addressing the issue of internet pornography with their teenager.

• In REALITY Internet pornography is highly highly addictive. It is known as the 'crack cocaine' of sex addiction

• The more one watches porn, the more the brain will wire itself to associate with that activity – in REALITY you will want what you see on the screen in front of you!

• The REALITY is that we now have younger men presenting with sexual dysfunction due to over use of pornography.

• It's important to remember that porn is a movie; it is fantasy; it is not REALITY. Many young lads are worried about living up to what they are viewing!

• Boys and girls often express a dissatisfaction and anxiety with their physical appearance because of pornography. A lot of surgical enhancement goes on in the porn industry and in REALITY our bodies are very different!

• 99.9% of pornography is made by men for men. Some young people tell us that they 'get ideas' about sexual experimentation from pornography!

• We hear first-hand about the confusion young people have around consent – e.g. '.. well a person might say no and not really mean it...'. In REALITY 'NO' means 'NO'.

• Women are objectified in pornography. In REALITY women are people with feelings and with boundaries!

• There is no intimacy or love in pornography. In fact pornography is about disconnection. In REALITY relationships are about connection and start hours, days or weeks before sex. Sex is not purely a physical activity happening in an emotional vaccum as we see in pornography!.

Gardai are concerned about the prolific use of pornographic sites on the internet and the ease at which they can be accessed by young people. They highlight the increase in sex crimes in Ireland – stating that "Each time a young fella looks at these sites he sees all kinds of sexual activity and expects that this is what's going to happen with girls. Girls are also being groomed into this behaviour'

This is worrying information for any parent – next week we will discuss how you can approach this topic with your teen?

RISK FACTORS FOR BREAST CANCER

Although breast cancer can develop for no reason, there are certain risk factors which can increase the chance of cancer developing.

Increased age, a past or family history of breast cancer, increased alcohol consumption, periods starting at an early age and menopause at a late age all increase the risk of breast cancer. Taking HRT for many years in women over 50 can slightly increase the risk. About 1 in 20 cases of breast cancer are felt to be genetic in origin. If you feel that you have a significant family history of breast or ovarian cancer then discuss this with your GP who may refer you for genetic testing. Breast feeding your babies lowers the risk of breast cancer. Regular exercise and keeping your weight normal has also been shown to be protective against breast cancer.

WHAT SHOULD YOU LOOK OUT FOR?

As mentioned earlier your breast consistency and size may change from time to time so it is important to know what is normal for you. The usual first thing that is noted is a painless lump in the breast. It is important to know that most breast lumps are **NOT** cancer. Other symptoms which may be notes are changes is breast shape or size. Dimpling of the skin. Nipple changes including discharge may also indicate underlying breast disease. Painful breasts are normally not a sign of early cancer but should still be discussed with your GP. It is important when examining the breast to examine the armpits for lumps.

THE NEXT STEP?

Depending on your breast complaint your GP may refer you to a specialist centre for further evaluation. There is normally no charge for this specialist centre.

The specialist centre may organise a mammogram or another scan (Ultrasound or MRI) of the breast. If there is a lump present a biopsy may be taken. This is a small sample of tissue which can be further evaluated under a microscope.

If you are diagnosed with breast cancer it is important to establish the exact type of breast cancer and the extent of the spread. Awaiting the results of these tests is a very frustrating time for all involved. It is important to get things right at this stage in order to tailor the best treatment plan for you.



BASIC FOODS ARE "A RIGHT WOMAN **WHO** RESCUED **DOG FROM TRAIN TRACKS OF ALL PEOPLE**"

Tackling financial market speculation on the price of essential food products is necessary if global hunger is to be overcome, Pope Francis said on June 11th.

Speaking to delegates from more than 120 countries at the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO), he emphasised the damage that can be created when speculators drive up basic commodity prices on foods such as grains, rice, and soybeans purely for their own economic interests. The pope added that this is among the major concerns that must be addressed in dealing with food insecurity, hunger and related issues that plague the globe.

"Climate change" is rightly an issue of significant concern in tackling world hunger but "financial speculation must not be forgotten" either, the Pontiff said stressing the importance of food security, good nutrition and reducing food waste adding that the Rome-based UN food agency must work hard to "convince us that the products of the earth have a worth that can be considered 'sacred',. Pope Francis also reminded the FAO, at its 39th biannual conference, that its job is to combat hunger and not just compile statistics, and must not "neglect the obligation to weaken hunger and prevent malnutrition" throughout the world.

Pope Francis reminded delegates of the role of individuals in changing their lifestyles to better protect and use food and water assets. "We must begin with our daily lives if we want to change lifestyles, aware that our small gestures can guarantee sustainability and the future of the human family, the Church with its institutions and its initiatives, walks with you, knowing that the earth's resources are limited and their sustainable use is an urgent need for agricultural development and food security".

MIGHT BE SUED

A woman in Lima, Peru who recently jumped onto train tracks, in order to save a loose dog from being killed, might face a lawsuit for her heroic good deed. The frightening incident took place when another woman's dog escaped from her grasp and fell onto the train tracks.

The good Samaritan could see that the dog was not able to jump back up to the platform, so she jumped down and picked the dog up herself. Soon, both were safely out of harm's way. Though most people have hailed the woman's brave act as heroic and courageous, Metro officials see it as a violation of the law and they may pursue fines or a lawsuit against her because she broke the rules to save the dog. Officials claim that they had stopped all train traffic and the dog was not in danger they have stated that the woman should have trusted that they would have saved the dog themselves. The lady that rescued the dog says that in the panic of the moment her first though was to save the dog as she was not aware that the train traffic had been halted.

FREE GIFTS/TICKET SCAMS CONTINUE **TO** FLOOD FACEBOOK

Everyone loves to get something free, but those kinds of contests and giveaways don't happen all the time. Unfortunately, many on Facebook are trying to scam people into believing that they could win a free vacation, gift etc and people just won't stop believing it. You may see a lot of your friends on Facebook sharing posts that state you can win something by sharing, liking, and commenting. What they don't realise is that most of the time; this isn't really the Company putting on these socalled contests. These pages are looking for you to share their posts so they can get access to you, your friends, and your family's information. On the scam pages, they will tell you they're giving away bags like those you see above or have so many free tickets

to give away. The thing with these Facebook scams is that they're actually very hard to search for on the site. They rely on one person finding it, sharing it, and then having others share it too. With more attention coming their way, they're more likely to show up in everyone's news feeds. At this point, they get more and more people on to their page and can rely on clicks to spread malware and other information-stealing programs. Here are some things to look for on Facebook to figure out if the contest is legit or not. Simply look at the name of the company — Chances are that a hyphen or period or exclamation point or some other type of punctuation that shouldn't be there has been added in.

Check the actual name of the page and the URL - Usually there are misspellings or added punctuation since they are not "official." Look at the date founded for the page. Typically, it's within the last couple of days. Look to see if the page has actually posted anything else at all. If they haven't, it's a fake. Check to see the contest rules. If they don't have any, it's a fake. The Facebook scam pages know they can't use the actual name, but they will steal some of the profile pics and cover photos from the official pages to make them seem more believable. Don't blindly share something on Facebook just because you think that you'll possibly win a prize. These Facebook scams are all over the place and more pop up daily. Don't fall for them and don't let others fall for them either.

*It is believed that strawberries have grown in temperate climates all around the world since ancient times. The wild strawberry was known to the ancient Greeks and Romans. Two of the earliest records of the strawberry are found in writings of Roman poets, Ovid and Virgil. The strawberry was included in a first century encyclopedia of nature written by a Roman scholar named Pliny. During the first centuries, the wild strawberry was utilized not only for food, but also as an ornamental flower and as medicine. The leaf, root, and berry were used to alleviate symptoms of depression, bad breath, fever, throat infections, and diseases of blood, liver, and spleen. It is also know that the strawberry was being cultivated by the peoples of the Americas prior to the arrival of the early European explorers and colonists. There are records also of a strawberry plant that produced yellow flowers native to India. The discovery of the modern strawberry's

heritage was due to the work of French and English botanists. The French botanist, Antoine Nicholas Duchesne (1747-1827) is recognized for his research in the genus of strawberries, his conclusions remain generally valid today. He began his work at the age of seventeen when he used the pollen of the musky strawberry with the Chilean berry; the result was a fruiting F. chiloensis. This was a very rare specimen, since there were no males of the F. chiloensis variety in Europe. He was the first to recognize the separation of sexes in some varieties of strawberries such as the F. chiloensis. During the late 1700's and 1800's the English involvement in the breeding of strawberries led to the development of many new varieties. One man who largely influenced this movement was Thomas Andrew Knight (late 1700's-1838). He is credited for developing basic breeding techniques used today. He made the first scientific attempt at strawberry breeding on a large scale; two of his most well known

varieties are the Downton strawberry and the Elton. Another Englishmen who influenced the progress of the modern strawberry was grower named Michael Keens. He was the first to raise and market a large-fruit strawberry he had developed known as the Keen Seedling. This variety is used in practically all of the more than 100 varieties today.

HOWTOKEEPYOURGLASSES IN GOOD CONDITION

A good pair of glasses can keep your eyes healthier, prevent headaches and generally make life easier. Here are 7 essential tips to keep your glasses scratch-free and in good condition for a long time.

1. Always use both hands when taking them off or putting them on. While it doesn't look as cool as taking them off with one hand, it will keep the frame from bending and losing its shape.

2. Avoid cleaners with Ammonia or Alcohol. Your lenses have a special coating and the harsh chemicals can damage it. It is better to use a solution of water and diluted soap instead. To dry the lenses, only use a microfiber cloth specifically designed for that purpose as other types can scratch the lenses.

3. At the beach? Don't be tempted to clean sand off your glasses in the water. The salt in the water will damage your lenses and speed up the corrosion on the joints. Instead - use bottled water to rinse them.

4. Don't leave your glasses in very hot places (like your car) – The frames are made by pouring hot melted plastic into a mould and the heat can melt the plastic frames and bend them out of shape or ruin them completely.

5. Avoid putting them on your head – the hair contains natural oils that stain the lenses and the angle causes the frame to stretch. Instead either put them down (preferably in a case), or hang them off of your shirt.

6. Stop your glasses from slipping off your nose: Use Wedgees or Nerdwax to keep them where they need to be. "Wedgees" are these small foamy bits you put on the edge of the glasses to make the sit more snugly. "Nerdwax" is a special wax you apply directly to the nose-guard to prevent them from slipping. Remember - glasses that slip can fall and break...

7. Never leave your glasses with the lens-side down – they WILL get scratched. Consider getting a hard case for them.

WHAT NOT TO DO WHEN YOU BRING YOUR DOG TO THE BEACH

Being a responsible dog owner at the beach can be a bit of a challenge at times, but by knowing a few simple things not to do, it can also be rewarding and, yes, fun! When it comes to bringing your dog to the beach, dogs are either allowed on leash, dogs are allowed off leash, or dogs are not permitted at all. Look for signs near the entryway if you're unsure what the policy is or search online to find out, because it's your job to know the rules and it's up to you and your dog to follow them. This goes without saying, but if a beach does permit dogs to roam off leash, that doesn't mean your supervisory responsibilities sail away. With everything going on at the beach - children at play, other dogs, picnics - the beach can be sensory overload for your pooch, so it's important to constantly monitor him. Not to mention, there are potential dangers. So stay alert out there. At some beaches there are roped off areas where dogs (and humans) are not permitted, and clear signs marking them, when it comes to 'off limits' signs at the beach, please abide by them, because it's best for the environment, as well as your dog's safety. The beach is a sensitive, dynamic environment that provides habitat for a variety of plants and animals. Excessive use of the beach can lead to the gradual degradation of habitat." So unless your dog can read, it's up to you to heed your local beach signs to make sure you and your dog remain on the right path. It is important to remember your dog's paws feel heat extremes, too. To prevent burns and blisters, avoid walking your dog on hot pavement or sand.


It's not just your dog's paws that you have to watch out for when it comes to beach sun. Sunburn can appear as red skin or even hair loss in dogs, and can lead to skin cancer.

DROWNING IS A CONCERN: some dogs seem to be natural swimmers, while others have a harder time staying afloat. Never leave your dog unsupervised in or even near the water. When it's time to go for a swim, it's always best to steer your pet toward calmer waters. Scan the area for possible danger spots, or ask a lifeguard for advice on water conditions.

When playing fetch, throw his ball or frisbee near the water, not in it, leaving the decision about whether to go for a dip up to your dog, and he is not pressured to swim out farther than he is comfortable going just to please you, play it safe and don't underestimate the power of water.

DON'T LET YOUR DOG DRINK THE SEAWATER: If you're spending hours at the beach, your dog is apt to get thirsty, especially on hot days, and you don't want him or her slurping up seawater. It can irritate its tummy and cause vomiting or diarrhoea and thus dehydration, so remember to bring a water dish and keep the fresh water flowing to avoid temptation.


