## RONAN'S PLIGHT HIGHLIGHTED IN THE DÁIL

"Please remember Ronan Foley Dungeel Killorglin – he has a 90 degree curve in his spine and he is in agony his is waiting for 20 months for an operation", these were the words spoken by Michael Healy Rae, TD at the first sitting of the new Dail at the Convention Centre in Dublin on Saturday last.

Deputy Healy-Rae was addressing the gathering of the members of the new coalition government when he specifically spoke to the new Minister for Health, Stephen Donnelly.

"Minister Donnelly, and I respectively say this to you, if you can start off by looking into this case and trying to get this young man his operation I will be forever indebted to you for doing that", Deputy Healy-Rae said.

Speaking to the Killarney Outlook this week, Michael Healy-Rae said that he had hardly sat down on his seat after his speech when he got a text message from Minister for Health Stephen Donnelly to send him all the details of the case of the young Killorglin man. "I was delighted with the quick response from the new Minister and hope that he will do everything in his power to get the operation sorted as soon as possible for Ronan", Deputy Healy Rae added. The new Taoiseach Micheál Martin also contacted the Kerry TD in regard to the case following the Dail plea. Ronan is a student of the Special Education Unit at St. Olivers National Ballycasheen and is awaiting surgery at Crumlin Children's Hospital for scolosis for the last 20 months.

Speaking to Killarney Outlook this week, Ronan's teacher Josephine Doncell gave us some insight into Ronan's school life.

"Ronan is a 14 year boy with Quadriplegic Cerebral Palsy who has a curvature in his spine. That curve was 42° in March of 2018 and Ronan was living a pretty normal life. Coming to school each day (rarely missing a day of school) having fun with his friends in class and in the yard and working hard at his schoolwork. Even when the curvature progressed to 79° in October 2018 he was actually becoming more independent throughout the school in his motorised wheelchair, going from class to class on his own. He even did the Dublin City Marathon at the end of that month with his dad Tony who pushed him around the course with a group of staff from St Oliver's where they raised over €4,000 for the school.

That October the family were told that the curve in his spine needed surgical intervention and that it would happen within the next 4 months. Ronan continued to do all the things he loved in school and at home while we waited for the operation. He played the starring role of a monster truck driver in our Christmas play that year!

Unfortunately no news on a date for the operation was forthcoming and the months passed. When Roaan got back to school in September 2019 he had stretched as a young teenager but his body looked twisted in comparison to the relatively straight body he had before. He became uncomfortable much more easily in his wheelchair and needed breaks on mats on the floor of the classroom to stretch once or twice a day. Eating became a little more difficult because he felt full more quickly due to the pressure of the twist of his spine on his stomach. And boy, did he always love his food. One thing that hadn't changed was his quick wit and wicked sense of humour. He made us laugh, and guffawed at any funny comments we made. We had so much fun but we could see him finding sitting in his wheelchair doing his work so difficult. He never complained and his SNA Catherine Sheahan would have to guess when he was in pain and ask him if he was. We got quite a shock when he came

back after Christmas in January of this year because he was in pain from early in the morning through most of the day. We found ourselves taking him out of the wheelchair and putting him on mats and eventually on beanbags to try and make him comfortable, We moved the whole class around so that he was included in the middle of the group all day but no matter what we did we always felt he was never fully comfortable. Mercy Clifford, an SNA working with Ronan, organised many of us to lobby the politicians before the general election and there seemed to be a push at many levels to get the operation done. We had great hope that the operation would finally be done in February

or March but it kept being put back and then the country went into lockdown. He worked with us during the lockdown and did lots of schoolwork at home but he found sitting and doing the work very difficult. Our Zoom lessons were difficult if they went over 45 minutes because he was in pain. He now needs to be lying down as much as he can during the day. He is either in his bed or on a beanbag. Therefore the independence he had is gone. His back and chest are even more twisted now than they were in March.

This is not the way a 14 year old boy should be living. He never complains about his condition. We had to teach him to tell us if he was not feeling great because he did not want to bother anyone. He wants to have fun with all his other friends, like all 14 year olds, but now cannot spend time sitting in the wheelchair which used to give him his freedom.

Ronan's parents do everything to make sure he wants for nothing but they have come up against a brick wall trying to get him this operation. It's time for Ronan's operation now.

## From Norway to Kerry... The Eagles have Landed

A specially chartered flight brought the group of young birds from Norway to Kerry Airport as part of the latest phase of the reintroduction of the species in Ireland.

The National Parks and Wildlife Service will release White-tailed Eagles in Munster to bolster the existing population.

The White-tailed Eagles are being released again in Munster by the Department of Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht's National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) as part of a Phase Two project to bolster the small existing breeding population in Ireland. The new release phase aims to build on the successful re-establishment of this once extinct species over a three-year period (2020-2022) by releasing young eagles at three sites, including Lough Derg, the lower Shannon estuary and Killarney National Park. The mission involved moving the young eagles – who had been monitored for a number of months – from Norway. They were taken to a waiting chartered flight at Trondheim Airport, for transport to Kerry Airport on a journey of four hours 20 minutes, and arrived this afternoon.

Former Minister of Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht Josepha Madigan, TD, welcomed the new arrivals: "This latest operation, under Phase Two of the conservation project, was an incredible team effort between the wildlife personnel both here and in Norway.

"Thanks to their logistical work, bringing the latest influx of White-tailed Eagles to these shores, the future is positive for the eagle, which had been extinct in Ireland for over a century.

The latest conservation intervention cements the work already done in bringing these graceful birds back to our skies, and I would like to express my appreciation for all involved in lending this hand to nature."

In 2020 it is planned to release 10 young eagles collected this summer in Norway split between the three Irish sites. These birds from this second release phase will provide an additional boost to the small Irish breeding population when they reach maturity.

Previously, 100 young White-tailed Eagles were released in Killarney National Park in County Kerry between 2007 and 2011. Birds from these releases subsequently dispersed widely throughout Ireland with first breeding in 2012 on Lough Derg, County Clare.

Since then a small breeding population of eight to ten pairs have successfully fledged 26 chicks with an additional six chicks likely to fledged into the wild in Munster in the next few weeks.

#### **INCREASE IN PROPERTY ENQUIRIES IN KILLARNEY** FOLLOWING COVID-19

While, the average price of a three-bedroomed semi-detached house in Kerry fell by 0.7% over the past three months, since reopening, agents in Killarney are reporting a sudden jump in enquiries from people in large cities who feel that they can now work remotely and are seeking higher end properties in one of Ireland's beauty spots.

In Killarney prices of the average three-bed sem saw a drop of 1.8% to  $\leq 265,000$  in the past three months while time taken to sell increased this quarter from 8 weeks to 10.

"While there has been a slowdown in the number of viewers due to Covid-19, all of our good properties are under offer," said Donal Culloty of REA Coyne and Culloty, Killarney. "We have received a lot of inquiries from people



who may be able to move from the large cities to work remotely and are now looking at the higher end market.

"We find that the people who are making these inquiries want to move for a better quality of life and more space." "Changes in the world of work are having an immediate effect on the second-hand housing market with a nationwide trend emerging of buyers looking to move 15 minutes outside of their urban location where they can get more space for the same money", said REA spokesperson Barry McDonald.

"We are finding that people are looking for three things – more space, gardens and a guarantee of better broadband, where transport was previously the highest priority.

"While the current outlook is positive, and there seems to be a lot of pent-up demand, it may be Q3 before we see the effect of Covid-19 on the market and on the outcome of mortgage approvals granted before the lockdown", he added.

National Broadband Ireland (NBI), the company working with Government to deliver the National Broadband Plan (NBP) is currently on the ground in Killarney with areas including Muckross, Fossa, Kilcummin, Lissivigeen, Ballycasheen, Faha, Firies and Ballyhar.

This involves physically walking the routes and documenting images, notes and measurements of the poles, cables and underground ducts in each area. This will enable design solutions for the provision of a fibre network to every premises in the Intervention Area – a map of almost 537,000 premises nationwide identified by the Department of Communications, Climate Action and Environment (DCCAE) as not being served with adequate broadband services.

NBI contractors have been on the ground since January surveying townlands in counties including Cork, Galway, Cavan and Limerick. In Kerry NBI have also been surveying in Tralee, Curraheen, Abbeydorney, Kilflynn, Firies, Castlemaine, and Ardfert.

#### High Street Traders issue plea to the council

A group of over 20 traders on High Street were joined by politicans Cllr. Maura Healy Rae and Cllr. Niall "Botty" O'Callaghan on Monday evening to discuss the decision by the Killarney Municipal District Office to remove

15 parking spaces on High Street to facilitate the widening of footpaths to accommodate social distancing. The traders are concerned that they will lose business by this move and and have issued a plea to the council

to rethink the plan.

"We are not against the widening of footpaths or making the town safe but we are concerned about our businesses" Pat Duggan from Eagers Newsagents told the Killarney Outlook.

"Removing the parking spaces and narrowing the carriage way of the street will make it very difficult for deliveries to take place", he added, "High Street is the exit for two major routes into the town, Muckross Road coming onto Main Street and Beech Road coming onto New Street, so all traffic from these routes will have to exit the town through High Street, which already sees traffic congestion", Pat added. As it is, all trucks that deliver to businesses in the town have to drive through High Street.

The group are looking for cooperation from the council in managing the parking and have suggested parking spaces with a 15 minute parking zone in place. "This will enable you to park your car, pop into a shop, make a purchase and return within the 15 minutes, ensuring a constant flow of traffic and parking on the street", Pat added.

The traders also have no objection to the placement of seating on the pavement outside pubs and restaurants after 6pm. "This is something we would encourage as High Street has some great bars and restaurants, along with being a central hub for business in Killarney", he added.

## **RE-OPENING** OF PUBLIC COUNTERS AT COUNCIL OFFICES



Kerry County Council public counters and offices around the county have re-opened to the public from Monday last, 29 June 2020. This includes all customer service desks at County Buildings and all of the council's Area Service Centres (in Tralee, Killarney, Listowel, Cahersiveen, Castleisland, Dingle, Kenmare and Killorglin) as well as the Environment Department at Maine Street, Tralee and the Motor Tax Office at Princes' Quay, Tralee.

Customers will be able to make applications and payments for services at all offices. Enhanced safety measures are in place, including hand sanitisation and recommended social distancing signage. There will be limits on the number of customers that can be accommodated in reception areas and a queue management system will be in place in the busier offices. Kerry County Council asks that

customers comply with these requirements and any directions given by staff in the interest of public safety.

In keeping with national public health guidelines, access within Council buildings will be restricted to customer service desk areas.

The Council is asking members of the public to continue, where possible, to use telephone, e-mail and online facilities to engage with the Council to minimise personal interaction and ensure social distancing.

w important are our Health Care workers and how would we ever have coped over the last four months without them. When Covid 19 hit locking us down to a 2km radius of our homes, advising us to stay home where possible, as scary as it was for us, our Health Care Workers continued to serve the community and do what they do best in caring for others.

I'd been following Mary Theresa Moriarty's instagram throughout, just love her two boys Timmy & Charlie J. Charlie J was full of questions about what I was writing down and how the heck it got from my note pad into the Killarney Outlook. "We are here to talk about your Mum, a very important member of our community" I told Charlie J. "We're not here to talk about Prince Charles you know Charlie?" Timmy added. "Marie, I call him Prince Charles because I have to wait on him hand and foot". We all laughed including Charlie J a preschooler at Bellview Woods Childcare. "Hi to DD & Samantha!! Can you write that down Marie"?

Mary Theresa is a Health Care Assistant out in the community. "So tell me about what life has been like as a HCA in Covid times Mary Theresa"? "Well, I kept all my clients which was so good for me to see them doing well daily. At the beginning of the pandemic one of my clients passed (non covid related) and it broke my heart not to attend the funeral" Mary Theresa told me. "Tell Marie about having to stay in your room Mom" Charlie J asked. "I felt ill" Mary Theresa said, "I was fearful I had Covid19 but the most worrying part was if I had, had I passed it on my my clients". Timmy interrupted to say "Yeah



Mom you remember the day we came back from a walk and you were jumping around outside and we were going crazy because you came out of your room". We laughed and Mary Theresa told me she had so much gratitude from her Line Managers & Occupational Health, as she was she was tested immediately and had the results were back within 24 hours. "Thankfully it was negative. You'd think 24 hours is a short space of time, not the case when you're looking at the same four walls, full of worry and FaceTiming the boys from upstairs. You have no idea of the relief and lift of anxiety I felt that day, more so for my clients than for myself. And I have to say I am so grateful to my sister Aileen who has helped me out no end through it all" Mary Theresa told me. "And Nana" Charlie J reminded his Mom. "Yes Charlie J but we only got to see her again a few weeks ago". "Oh yes, we used to do drive by's to Nana's Marie" Charlie J told me "and I'd chase her around trying to give her a hug and she'd shout No No I can't give you a hug Charlie J" and he burst out laughing, we all did. "Aileen & lan and baby Noah (9months) have been great to us" Timmy told me "And they're due another baby in December". What wonderful news. Permission to 'write that down' was granted. From a family of 5 girls (& 1 boy), the Moriarty sisters have all boys (so far) and nearing the point of a full 7 aside team in the coming years!!

Before I left I asked the boys what was their favourite thing about lockdown "doing the silage with Padraig Healy, that was my favourite thing because I would have been in Kilcummin NS with my teacher Mr Murphy otherwise" Timmy told me. How productive Timmy! "And what was your favourite thing Charlie J"? "Definitely my new iPad. I love it" he said. The mind blowing task of a 1000km run is something that Ultra Runner and charity fundraiser Kevin Leahy of the Black Sheep Hostel, Killarney, has set himself.

Stretching from the wilds of the Iveragh Peninsula to the frozen ice of Yukon Canada, in aid of Downs Syndrome Kerry (DSK), Kevin has decided to do the run for a charity very close to his heart. Kevin is no stranger to harsh conditions and demands, last year inspired the greatest Kerryman - Arctic explorer, Tom Crean, Kevin made world headlines by winning the famous Yukon 160 km Arctic Ultramarathon!

Speaking about the enormity of the event Kevin remarked "This time I will be setting my sights on the mammoth Yukon Arctic 700km ultramarathon to date, this will be by far my biggest running endeavour, requiring months of training, along with a tank load of mental and physical grit to get me across

## PARISHIONERS RETURN TO MASS

I t is a source of great joy for many people that from last Monday 29th June congregations were able to return again in our churches. Praying together as a community and gathering for Mass is something that many Killarney people love to do and this week as restrictions were lifted, many were able to return to their place of worship.

"With the major restrictions of the past months it is wonderful how creative so many parishes have been: Mass and other liturgies broadcast on Parish Radio, Streaming over the internet, Facebook and YouTube; prayers and reflection pieces on the diocesan and parish websites; Sunday Mass on Radio Kerry, daily Mass on RTE news-now; support for the Grow in Love program for school children; phone contact with the sick and their carers, and with those confined to their homes", Bishop Ray Browne said in a statement this week.

"We all need to be calm, careful, and patient as we begin to gather again around the altar. Limited congregations due to the demands of social distancing could mean that not all will be able to enter the church for a particular Mass. What is the maximum number permitted in your local church?

#### The following are practical points to keep in mind as we return to Mass:

Because the Sunday Mass obligation will continue to be dispensed for some time yet, why not join in a weekday Mass rather than Sunday?

Some people may decide to wait until things settle down before coming out to Mass.

Volunteers will be working to ensure matters work smoothly and in safety. Give a smile and full cooperation.

As those over 70, or even 60 need to be very careful, maybe their children or grandchildren can volunteer.

For safety from the virus, most important of all is that each of us takes personal responsibility for:

hand-washing on leaving home and returning hand-sanitizing on entry to church and exit social distancing at all times in church wearing a face cover if appropriate

# MUCKROSS ROWING CLUB

This week saw the commencement of Phase 3 of the government roadmap including permission for all sporting activity to resume. For rowing, the key change has been the restart of crew rowing while we still implement measures in relation to hygiene, sanitisation of equipment and distancing. Rowing Ireland has also provided an updated protocol for Phase 3 and club activities will continue to be aligned with these guidelines. Access to our indoor facilities will continue to be restricted. Despite some mixed weather this week, it was great to see the return of our larger boats and we look forward to lots of rowing over the remainder of the summer.

# **KILLARNEY REGATTA**

Last Sunday, June 28, the rowing clubs of Killarney were due to assemble for the 235th staging of the historic Killarney Regatta. As with all large events, the fixture could not proceed amid the ongoing fight against COVID-19 and it remains to be seen if a rescheduled fixture will be possible in 2020. There was a break in the staging of the regatta from 1963 to 1966 however the regatta has run annually in each of the 53 years since.

# SPORT IRELAND GUIDANCE ON RETURN TO SPORT IN PHASE 3

Sport Ireland has today issued guidance on the return to sport in Phase 3 of the Government's Roadmap for Reopening Society and Business, which applies to all sports from Monday, June 29th.

The guidance, agreed by the Expert Group on Return to Sport, encourages a gradual and inclusive approach to the resumption of sporting activity.

# **RETURN TO SPORT**

Announced on June 19, the amended Roadmap for the Reopening of Society and Business in phase 3 presents a significant acceleration of sport in its return. Previous restrictions on travel will no longer be in place from June 29th.

While phase 3 allows for the return of all sport, National Governing Bodies of Sport are encouraged to continue to adopt a gradual and inclusive approach, catering for all levels and abilities in equal measure.

### **COMPETITION AND TRAINING**

The return to training and competition should be on an opt-in basis, with participants taking personal responsibility to decide whether they are happy to return.

It is important that athletes are not be penalised if they wish to opt-out of training at this stage in the Roadmap. They should be encouraged to communicate their concerns to their club and/or National Governing Body so that they can be addressed.

The return to competition should be slow with consideration for the period of training completed prior to any scheduled matches/ competitions. Individuals, especially high performance and professional athletes, may have maintained a level of fitness throughout the restriction, however the risk of injury will

be increased. Those leading the delivery of their sport will need to account for this risk and tailor

training accordingly. Minimising the spread of Covid-19 and the occurrence of injury will be critical. Contact permitted, should be limited to training and competition only. Strict physical distancing protocols should be in place outside the field and adhered to at all times.

Covid-19 measures should be incorporated into all competition/procedure documents to form a normal part of the sport's delivery. This should include the appointment of a Covid-19 Safety Officer, to ensure public health guidelines are adhered to, and appropriate mechanisms to assist with contact tracing.

# ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS FOR PARTICIPATION IN SPORT BY PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES OR OLDER PEOPLE

Whilst mitigating the risk of Covid-19 is more challenging for those who require assistance in their sport participation, steps should be taken including:

Consider DATE (distance, activity, time, environment)

Ensure daily symptom checks

Limit the number of participants

Limit the duration of the activity

Consider the contact (proximity, direct touch, equipment sharing) and minimise where possible.

### Train outdoors

Consider the use of PPE for assisting the participant (for example, if they require assistance getting onto a bike). It is accepted that the use of PPE during sporting activities is not generally advised, however its use is promoted outside of field of play, where guidelines suggest.

# Avoid slipstreams where possible

# **SUMMER CAMPS**

The Expert Group on Return to Sport has issued three key points for clarification in relation to the operation of summer camps

### from June 29: NUMBERS

The restriction on numbers ('15') is lifted. However, caution is advised, as additional personnel will be required to monitor risk arising from Covid-19. Additional consideration should be given to the safeguarding recommendation (under 12s ratio 1:8, 12s and over ratio 1:10). The availability of space will be a factor in the numbers of participants.

# OUTDOOR/INDOOR

Summer camps should be based outdoors with limited access to indoors in case of weather or the need for diverse activity. Indoor activity must be done under strict protocol and acknowledging the extra risk associated with indoor activity. The numbers accommodated for outdoor activity should give consideration for the necessity to move indoors at some point during the day (weather dependent).

Contact: Summer camps may allow a certain degree of contact in their activity in the sporting context. Organisers should observe good contact protocols off the field of play and be aware of the intensity, duration and nature of the activity that involves contact.

The Health Protection Surveillance Centre (HSPC) has issued specific guidance on the return to sports activities for children and adolescents. That guidance can be downloaded here.

### SUPPORTING CLUBS AND GOVERNING BODIES

The Covid-19 restrictions have meant organisations across all sectors have not been in a position to offer their usual range of activities and programmes. This has resulted in many National Governing Bodies of Sport, provincial associations, clubs and groups taking a financial hit due to reduced commercial income, membership fees, gate receipts etc.

# LIVERPOOL ARE CHAMPIONS

I'm not a Liverpool supporter, but no-one could (or, in fairness, has attempted) to begrudge them finally ending a 30 year drought to claim their 19th league and first Premiership title. They are the first team to hold the Premiership, European, and Club World titles at the same time. I won't go through how it was won – I'm sure most of you know by now – but suffice to say that it was done in style all the way. Instead, I've mused over Liverpool's historical and emotional connection to Ireland. Liverpool was always the most Irish of English cities.

### Liverpool FC - Irish Connections

In the 17th century, the likes of Galway was one of the biggest ports in European trade. But the expansion of colonisation, especially towards South and Middle America, and the rise to imperial prominence of England's navy saw the likes of Liverpool and Portsmouth expand hugely. The Industrial (and simultaneously, agricultural) Revolution of the early 19th century saw a huge increase in shipping. Like Constantinople before it and New York after it, you could hear any accent, any language, eat any cuisine on Liverpool's bustling streets. Unlike Ireland, there was plenty of work, and Irishmen could reach that work. Before the Great Famine, Liverpool's Irish population was already estimated at 17%. Liverpool was the first stop along the way of most of the Irish who emigrated at that time. Many went on to the States, but not all. Ulster Road, Belfast Road, Killarney Road and Donegal Road still exist in Liverpool. After World War II Liverpool had been bombed more than anywhere except London and it needed rebuilding. Ireland had almost no economy or employment for young people, who flocked to the city. The 2008 crash saw emigration to Britain rise again by a whopping 20%. Nowadays an estimated 60 - 65% of Liverpudlians have Irish ancestry. Dr. Michael Holmes of Liverpool Hope University has called for Liverpool to become an Irish county (70% of the city refuted Brexit).

The famous 'scouse' dialect is believed to be a combined polyglot of mostly Irish accents. 'Scouse' itself was a reference to lobscouse stew, made mainly of hard tack and bully beef, that originated in Scandinavia but was hugely consumed by sailors. On the Liverpool docks, you ate lobscouse and were a 'scouser' or you went hungry.

Not all who came were poor. In 1860 Robert Samuel Graves emigrated from New Ross in Wexford to Liverpool to run the family's shipping company. In 1861 he became Mayor and in 1865 he became MP and put through a proposal to develop a sportfield outside the city. Robert had grown up beside 'Anne's Field' in New Ross near Rosbercon Castle (its name was actually the 'abhainn' field, i.e. nearest the river) and chose

the name for this new development. Anfield Lane.

Right from the start, there was a very, very good soccer team there. Everton Athletic. They were among the best sides in England. Following a rent dispute in 1892, they purchased and developed Goodison. This left Liverpool businessman and Lord Mayor John Houlding holding a now worthless lease. Undaunted, Houlding set up a team to play in Anfield called Liverpool FC after the local rugby team (who are now St. Helens). They wore blue and white until 1896. The iconic Liver Bird was added to their badge in 1901. Their first Director of Football, John McKenna, was Irish. So was their first manager, William Edward Barclay, who had been Everton's manager, but stayed on at Anfield to manage the new team. In their very first season they beat a team called Newton Heath 2-0 -Newton Heath later became Manchester United. In 1963, their second season back in England's top flight, Gerry Marsden of Gerry and the Pacemakers presented a copy of his forthcoming cover of Oscar Hammerstein's 'Singing in the Rain' from the 1945 musical 'Carousel'. It was played on the team bus on an away tour and the likes of Tommy Smith loved it. By the 1965 FA Cup Final, fans were singing it in the stands. Celtic played Liverpool that year and brought the song back to Parkhead.

The list of Irish players at Liverpool goes all the way back to Elisha Scott (the keeper made 468 appearances over twenty years; it would have been more but for World War 1) and Billy Lacey (the Everton transfer became a huge fan favourite). A 1923 match report about him said "As for kicking Lacey as a hobby, I can assure you it's a waste of time, the boy is made from Solid Rock. Dynamite could not shift him off the ball." Irish players have donned the red jersey right from the start up to the present day, including Steve Heighway, Mark Lawrenson, Ronnie Whelan, Michael Robinson, Kevin Sheedy, John

Aldridge, Steve Staunton, Ray Houghton, Phil Babb, Jason McAteer, Darren Potter, Ritchie Partridge, Steve Finnan, Robbie Keane..... goalkeeper Caoimhín Kelliher is the latest Irish wunderkind at Liverpool.

# SENIOR COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIP

East Kerry are reigning champions, have an incredible minor and U21 pedigree behind them, and will be further bolstered by the addition of a formidable Rathmore side. In the circumstances, an away draw to Feale Rangers should be comfortably managed – I am unabashedly among those who feel that the two North Kerry teams should amalgamate. Together they would form very formidable opposition, but it would be a huge surprise to see either on their own reach the latter stages.

That's not the tie to savour, of course. No, the tie of the round is unquestionably the Black and Amber derby. Crokes would have had the better of Stacks for most of their recent clashes, but it has always been a close run thing. Both sides have bucket loads of experience and have produced brilliant minors in recent times

Killarney Legion and Kerins O'Rahillys is another tricky one, but I think Legion have that little bit more depth, with some great young players coming onstream.

Kilcummin will be away to a Mid Kerry outfit whose reality has not lived up to their potential in recent years. Kilcummin will have to defy the odds, given that they narrowly escaped relegation last year, but Kilcummin are past masters at that art.

Kenmare, who are now an East Kerry club, at home to Shannon Rangers? What's the young lad's name again? Sean O'Shea? Is he any good? Look, this really should be Kenmare fairly comfortably. St. Kierans will be a big, strong team with some real cutting forwards,

but despite serious struggles with population decline (very, very serious, unfortunately, clubs are struggling more and more to field underage teams and fill senior panels), South Kerry are genuine dark horses for the championship, in my opinion. St. Brendans are another team that I would be keeping a very close eye on - Na Gaeil have been an absolute revelation in recent years (their league relegation had more to do with unavailability of county players than anything else) and Ardfert are emerging from a transition period with some young talent starting to blossom.

The game will again be played in Pairc Uí Caíomh. Cork came back to give us a good fright after Kerry got a blistering start in last year's All Ireland Final, highlighting a tendency to cough up goals too easily. This time around Cork are the reigning minor and U20 champions and will be even more potent. Kerry will have the advantage of tough league games against Monaghan and Donegal coming into it, while Cork should have comfortable enough wins in Division Three. That may not be the disadvantage to Cork that people think - professional soccer has seen a big increase in injuries on the return to competitive action and intensity, never absent from GAA games, may be more costly than ever, especially with players obviously torn between club and county duties. That's been a nettle that the GAA have been terrified to grasp in any meaningful way for a long time, and the announcement that they won't be punishing county teams for training breaches is, well....not courageous, to be nice about.

The GAA have also said that they rejected the idea of an open draw (I would absolutely love it!) because it would lead to some very onesided games. Unlike, for example, that nailbiter between Dublin and Westmeath in the Leinster quarter-final. I'll buck the trend and say that Dublin could come through that one with a bit of luck....

Dublin's Jack McCaffrey joined the senior panel in 2013 and hasn't lost a championship game since (he took a year out in 2016 to travel). McCaffrey has opted for this year, and the flying doctor at wingback will be a huge loss for Dublin. Personally, I like to see a player with the maturity to see past the trees of competitive football to the forest of real life (the amateur game demands an unhealthy labour and pressure nowadays, in my opinion) and wish him the best of luck.

# Jack McCaffrey. Referee David Gough is also opting out of this

year's championship. The joke is going around that it means that Dublin are missing two key players for the championship, McCaffrey and Gough. There's a bit of wit in it, but it's a bit cringy as well - we lost games in recent years to Dublin because they are simply an incredible football team and a credit to themselves and to the game, not because of David Gough or any other referee. To me, claiming otherwise demeans the Kerry jersey.

Should Kerry win Munster, they will face the Connaught champions in the All Ireland semifinal. In short, it's very much like the old days when we were kings - Kerry could win the All Ireland in just four games. Mind you, Cork being Cork, we could also be out after just one...

Kerry had a superbly talented team last year and, without begrudging champions Cork or semi-final victors Galway, were just caught on one of those days. To be truthful, I'm glad that the long winning sequence came to an end; I felt that it was becoming a burden on very young shoulders. I for one would much prefer a reversion to the U18 age group at the grade. I also think that the change of underage grades from even (U16, U14, U12) ages to odd (U17, U15, U11) ages will see young players turn to other codes (U11 is non-competitive, while the fact that girls aren't allowed to play past U12 on mixed teams, leaves a number of Kerry clubs struggling to field at the age group). I also think that the drop-out rate for non-elite 18 and 19 year olds, already far too high, is going to increase. Motion 31, which essentially meant that counties would have to follow Central Council policy on age guidelines, got through Congress with just a 68% majority, that's with Croke Park putting all its formidable weight and votes behind it. It had been proposed and rejected repeatedly at ground level several times in recent years, including in Kerry.

James Costelloe and his players have put in a colossal amount of work, even in isolation, and I'll tempt fate by saying that Kerry should have enough to get past what will be a formidable Cork side and go on to win Munster.

# **MUNSTER** MINOR HURLING CHAMPIONSHIP

This is Kerry's first time putting in a minor hurling team into the Munster Championship since 2014. Kerry had been well out of their depth at that level for several years beforehand. I remember the hurlers well that year - Crokes were very strong in minor hurling at the time but football commitments meant that only Aaron Murphy was on the panel. Kerry had a good team at the time, the likes of Jack Goulding, Jordan Conway, Michael O'Leary, Brandon Barrett, Fionan Mackessy...Darragh Shanahan is now a Dublin hurler and club All Ireland winner. Kerry manger lan Brick (now Kerry Camogie Manager) confided privately to me beforehand (he has always been a gentleman to deal with) that he didn't expect to win against Cork but that, given the talent his squad had and the work that they had put in, he was hoping to stay within ten points of them. Kerry were absolutely hammered that night by 5-26 to 0-9, with Iniscarra's big Sean O'Donoghue giving a phenomenal display. Clare dismissed us in the subsequent play-off by 6-25 to 0-11. I can see Cork edging a tight Munster Championship this year, giving the improvement at schools and Rebel Óg level in the county, but Tipperary will be right up there. To be honest, the gulf between Minor B and Minor A championship is the difference between Mangerton Mountain and Mount Everest. Fingers crossed and the best of luck to Kerry...

# FAI CLUB MARK FOR KILLARNEY ATHLETIC

✓ illarney Athletic has become the latest club K to win the FAI Club Mark. This award is given to grassroots clubs based on best practice in the governance, management and administration. Killarney Athletic was the first soccer club in the East Kerry region. It was founded away back in 1965 by Garda Don Harrington, a young Guard from Cork City who was stationed in Killarney. This came about after Don observed youngsters from various parts of town playing soccer on the streets of Killarney. Don has overseen the growth of the club from its humble beginnings to the community enterprise it has become and is an annual visitor to this day.

The first underage Academy was set up in 1992 for children from U10 upwards. The club organised the first ever FAI Soccer Clinic in Kerry in 1992, which was held in the hallowed grounds of the "Áras" pitch. Irish Internationals Paul McGrath, Mick McCarthy and Alan McLoughlin (scorer of the vital goal against Northern Ireland that qualified Ireland for the 1994 World Cup) visited the ground at the time to add their support of the event. In 1993, the club moved to Woodlawn where facilities have been developed and improved on an ongoing basis ever since. The modern clubhouse and two grass pitches have been augmented with the opening of an All WeatherTraining Pitch. The Club won its first ever league title in 50 years in 2017 and completed a league and cup double that year.

As well as their senior team, Killarney Athletic also has a senior B Team, Youths and U.17 competing in the leagues and cups.

The club's underage section is particularly strong. During the past season, 2019/2020, Killarney Athletic had 17 teams competing in the Kerry School Boys & Girls League Divisions as follows : U.10 – 2 teams U.11 – 2 teams U.12 - 2 teams

U.13 - 3 teams U.14 - 2 teams U.15 – 2 teams U.16 – 1 team

The Girls teams compete in the ...U11 - 2 Teams and U17 leagues.

Due to the "Covid-19 pandemic and subsequent lockdown", it resulted in the early finish of the 2019/2020 season. However, the U12 Premier and U13 Premier teams both won their respective Divisions as did the U14 Division 1 team. The U.15 team were runners-up in Division 1.

We have enjoyed a lot of success over the years especially last season

2018/2019, where the juvenile teams competed in six Cup competitions, winning three of them. They were the U12 Cup and U.12 Shield and U13 Cup champions. The U13s & U14s also won their respective Leagues that year.

The U.11 team reached the Final of the Bernardo's Cup in June 2019 and this team went onto further success when they became the first team from outside Dublin to win the DB Sports Cup in August 2019, which is a highly rated and prestigious Cup competition played in Dublin with competing teams from all over Ireland.

Within the juvenile section, there is an Academy which caters for children up to 10 years of age. They receive coaching from gualified coaches, several of whom have UEFA Coaching Badges.

Killarney Athletic has a very dedicated number of committed coaches, some of whom were former players within the club and who are now passing on their vast experience to these young players. The Academy has grown substantially in the recent past and caters for large numbers of children who enjoy the superb facilities with both grass pitches and the recent addition of the Astro training pitch in 2018.

The Club have had some juvenile players attend Irish Squad training in Dublin over the past few seasons and this is testament to the calibre

# of coaching. The club also had representation on the Kerry teams in the national U13 and U15

league of Ireland over the past two seasons.

Some notable achievements by former Killarney Athletic Academy players include the following....

Michael Moloney who captained Ireland in U.16 teams on five occasions

in 2003/2004.

Diarmuid O'Carroll who signed for Celtic FC in Scotland in 2003.

Brendan Moloney who signed for Nottingham Forest in 2005. Brendan has now returned to Killarney Athletic to pass on his experience and skills as a Coach.

There have also been some notable achievements by the U17 Players on the Kerry District League U17 team who were part of the squad who got to the final of the All Ireland Mark Farren Cup and the final of the SS Airtricity U17 Shield.

Club chairperson Geraldine Nagle and her fellow officers put a huge amount of work into winning the FAI Club Mark, but she stresses that it wasn't about her or them. "While obviously it didn't suit anyone, the lockdown actually gave us an opportunity to work on our application for the club mark. My daughter Tara worked very hard with me all through to complete the application. There was a lot of work involved and we are lucky that so many people pitched in. My fellow officers Martin Muldoon, Mike O'Shea, Diarmuid O'Mahony and Basil Scheerin as always were fantastic. I simply couldn't name all the great people who have been involved in this, it's a huge list. I've been involved with Killarnev Athletic for over twenty years, I just took over as Chair last June 12 months, and these are the best people I have ever worked with. We have always said that there is no rank in Killarney Athletic, we are all equals here. Unity is strength....where there is teamwork and collaboration, wonderful things can be achieved. I have always said that we are an ordinary club with extraordinary volunteers."

The FAI Club Mark is a testament to all the hard work, dedication and commitment by everyone involved in Killarney Athletic where we will continue to develop and strive for excellence.

# AN EMPLOYER'S GUIDE: FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

 Can I reduce the salaries of my staff? Yes, but the employee must consent in writing to this, verbal agreements do not suffice.

What if the employee refuses a wage cut? The employer can consider making the role redundant.

Did workers accrue holidays whilst on temporary lay-off? No, holiday hours are accrued through working hours.

4. What if employees were on employers wage subsidy scheme during lay-off? Are they entitled to holidays? Still no.

Can I insist an employee works from home? Yes, but there needs to be written agreement of the terms and conditions surrounding this between the employer and employee.

6. Did probationary periods lapse whilst certain new employees were on lay-off? Probationary periods would have been suspended during lay-off periods once stipulated in contracts or staff handbooks – if it was not stipulated then the original probationary period will stand.

 If working hours have changed because of Covid-19, what should I do? Review your employment contracts and ensure that any changes are addressed and agreed in writing.

What if we do not have employment contracts? Get them in place ASAP as it is illegal to not provide written terms & conditions of employment.

Can I request employees to use up holidays at a time convenient to the business? Yes, but a clear & transparent annual leave policy will help manage the unusual holiday dilemma caused by Covid-19 and ensure team morale is not impacted.

10. Can I refuse holiday requests? Yes, but again an employer needs to be careful that they have put in place the suggestions in answer 9 above and the employee is still entitled to avail of their annual leave entitlement at one point or another.

11. What if an employee refuses to attend training or adhere to guidelines? Again, all necessary training for business operational purposes should be referenced to in employment contracts & company handbooks; this would make it a lot easier to deal with such scenarios.

Once the Black and Tans were introduced into Ireland in 1920, the IRA used any means necessary to obtain weapons from their British counterparts. Due to their lack of access to additional funding or supplies they resorted to Guerrilla Warfare tactics, including ambushes, attacks and raids. This approach was used widely throughout the entire country, including East Kerry.

After the Kerry No. 2 Brigade staged two successful ambushes in the first half of 1921, the Headford ambush in March and the Bog Road ambush in May, the Volunteers planned two more ambushes in Castleisland and Killorglin in late June 1921. The first ambush in Castleisland was the first of the two ambushes to take place. The IRA had expected the British Army to pass through a side road from Brosna to Castleisland. Over eighty men occupied a carefully selected spot along the road and waited for their orders to attack the incoming British Army. One half of the group had shotguns and the other half held rifles. It soon emerged that as the British Army neared the ambush site they were informed of the IRA's presence. They took a different route to Castleisland and the ambush did not go ahead.

A second ambush took place in Castleisland on the eve of the Truce, 10 July 1921. The Volunteers received information regarding the British Army and their plans to take over the library in Castleisland. The Volunteer's took the decision to burn the building. The Column took up their positions on the main street as valuables were removed from the library. Shooting ensued on both sides and the fighting continued for forty minutes. The British Army suffered four fatalities with three injuries while the IRA lost five of their men.

Ambushes were effective for the Volunteers. Staging a successful ambush required strategic planning and strong leadership which can be seen in many ambushes that took place, however unexpected ambushes also benefited the IRA and boosted their morale during the War of Independence.

# HYDRANGEAS

Hydrangeas are a very popular garden shrub with delicate heads of flowers that come in shades of white, pink or blue and they flower from late Spring to Autumn. The mophead or lace cap Hydrangeas are well known for the ability to change colour in different soils.

Hydrangeas thrive in moist but well drained soil, in the cool, semi shady part of the garden. Try to avoid dry sunny situations and east facing areas. Feeding your Hydrangeas once in late Winter and early Spring is probably enough for the year as too much feeding will only encourage too much soft leafy growth and this will lead to the Hydrangeas not developing a lot of flower buds.

Proping your Hydrangeas is usually done in late Winter or early Spring, authorigh the climbing Hydrangeas should be pruned after flowening in Sommer.

# UNHEALTHY RELATIONSHIP PATTERNS

o you find yourself repeating similar patterns in different relationships or in a particular relationship over time? Perhaps you often feel lonely or jealous in your relationships. Maybe you try to earn the other person's attention by being overly nice or giving without paying heed to your own needs or desires. Do you fear rejection or being abandoned? Could it be that you choose partners who are distant and can make your feel and/or believe that you're not good enough. Do you focus so much on your partner that they feel stifled? Often these patterns can reflect our inner experiences and our beliefs about ourselves and our emotional availability to others.

Psychologist John Bowlby defined attachment as a 'lasting psychological connectedness between human beings' and attachment theory can help us to understand the ways in which we connect with others – particularly those who are emotionally significant to us. We develop our attachment style in childhood – and the way in which our parents and/or caregivers responded to us will impact on our relationships. For example, a child who believed that the only way he/she could be loved was when they were doing something for others, may grow up believing that they need to earn the attention and love of others. Adults who believe they are inadequate and unworthy of love may have learned this in their early years – which will inevitably lead to difficulties in their relationships. They may believe that the other will leave them or that they are going to disappoint the other – leading to them clinging to the relationship and/or getting jealous easily.

However, the good news is that with awareness we can discover our own attachment style and learn to cultivate healthier relationships. Some of the ways in which we can bring more awareness to our relationship patterns include the following:

 Bring your awareness to your bodily sensations. How do you feel in your body? Being aware of this can help you to understand how you are feeling and/or thinking.

2. What thoughts are you thinking about you/ the other? How do these thoughts impact on your feelings and emotions?

Which emotions do you struggle with - how do these emotions affect your thoughts and beliefs about yoursel?

4. Are you overly self-critical? Can you show yourself some selfcompassion, support and care the way you might a close friend or a small child?

 Learn to communicate more directly about your thoughts, feelings and needs. Once you become aware of what these are – then you can express them more fully to others.

Next week we will focus on the importance of communication and how counselling can help us to find our own voice, and become more confident as we make ourselves known to another person.

# A Word of Victory

Welcome back dear reader "pleasant words are like honeycomb, sweetness to the soul and health to the bones" (Proverbs 16:24). Everyone needs to be encouraged in life. Basically the Lord is telling us here that our words have the power in them to build up and sweeten a person's life in such a way as will strengthen and sustain them, and reproduce fruit for generations bringing health to the very innermost parts of them. It's easy to see the effects of praise and people respond to encouragement. No one likes to be spoken down to, but many people are callous with their words and they don't even hear themselves. It's important to note: we are not talking about flattery here. Flattery is a dangerous trap and often comes forth from people's mouths that are smiling at your face, but driving daggers into your back. Be careful of those who flatter because there is another agenda going on there (Psalm 5; Proverbs 26:24-28).
