PUBLIC CONSULTATION ON IMPROVEMENT WORKS IN RATHMORE

Kerry County Council is inviting submissions on proposed improvement works in Rathmore. Plans for traffic calming measures and enhanced pedestrian facilities on N72 road will be on public display from 1 August until 12 September The proposed works include:

Traffic calming on the Killarney approach to Rathmore (N72) A reduction in the width of the roadway to 6.5m for the entire length of the scheme

Realignment of the junction from local and regional roads on to the N72

The installation of two controlled pedestrian crossings to be provided at the community centre/playground and at the service station at the eastern end of the village for a 150m area between O'Keeffe's hardware store and the community centre the following additional works are proposed:

Formalised parking areas both perpendicular and parallel to be provided adjacent to the local post office, public houses and community centre

New off-line bus stops to be provided either side of the road The monument currently positioned directly across from the junction with Station Road is to be repositioned in front of the playground and community centre

Under the Planning and Development Acts, submissions can be made on the proposed works, details of which are available on the Kerry County Council website and Kerry County Council offices in the Killarney Municipal District and at County Buildings in Tralee.

Killarney Credit Union urges parents to shun moneylenders at back-to-school time

A new, national survey has identified a rise in the number of parents in debt due to backto-school related costs. Well over a third of parents in Ireland (36%) now say they are getting into debt trying to cope with costs at back-to-school time. This compares with 29% who reported being in debt last year. The worrying findings were revealed in the study commissioned by the Irish League of Credit Unions.

More than two thirds of parents in the study also said that they found back-toschool costs a financial burden. Nearly half (46%) said meeting costs was their biggest back-to-school related worry. Close to one third of parents said they would be forced to deny their children certain school items this year because they could not afford them. Extracurricular activities and new school shoes were amongst the items to be cut from the budget this year.

Reacting to the findings, Helen Courtney Power, Business Development Officer of Killarney Credit Union said that the credit union is all too aware of the struggle for parents this time of year. "We do see parents approaching us around this time of year requesting assistance with either budgeting and saving for the back-to-school spend, or with taking out a loan to see them through. It's understandable that backto-school costs are seen as a financial burden for so many when parents are



paying out €999 for every primary school child, and over €1,300 for every secondary school child in their household. At XX Credit Union, we offer a special Back to School loan with an affordable APR rate of $6.2\%^*$. The loan is typically approved within 48 hours and there are no hidden transaction fees or charges. As always, we are happy to work with parents to structure repayments in a way that suits their individual circumstances."

Of concern for the credit union was the finding that, of those parents who said they were getting into debt, more than a quarter (27%) said they had turned to a moneylender in an effort to cope with back-to-school costs. This was a noticeable increase on the 20% last year who had opted for a moneylender.

Commenting on this finding, Helen said, "I would really encourage these

parents to reconsider approaching a moneylender, some of whom charge APR rates as high as 188%**. This can lead to a recurring cycle of unnecessary debt and panic borrowing. We offer a service called the Personal Micro-Credit Scheme or 'It Makes Sense' which was specifically designed to assist social welfare recipients who feel they have no option but to borrow from a moneylender. Our welcoming staff are always on-hand to answer any queries in relation to this loan.

Griffin urges Men's Sheds in Kerry to apply for funding

Kerrv Men's Sheds are encouraged to apply to a national funding pot of half a million euro to support their good work, according to Minister for State for Tourism and Sport, Brendan Griffin.

This capital funding provides small grants to individual Men's Sheds in order to enable them to purchase equipment or carry out minor works to improve their shed. As part of this measure, Minister Ring has made provision for €17,391 to be provided to the 12 Men's Sheds in Kerry, pending successful applications by the individual Men's Sheds.

Minister Griffin said: "Men's Sheds are a worldwide movement which encourages men to talk about their feelings in order to improve mental health and wellbeing. "Local Men's Sheds here in Kerry create a space where men can discuss health issues and emotions while engaging in purposeful activities.

"The sheds are in urban and rural areas across the country and promote the health and wellbeing of members by combating issues such as loneliness and isolation, while creating a culture



where men can discuss their thoughts and feelings without stigma.

"They are a great example of a positive community based organisation that promotes good citizenship through good works. "There are currently 12 Men's Sheds in Kerry and they are encouraged to apply for the funding of €17,391 which has been allocated to Kerry County Council.

"It is essential that the individual local sheds apply for this funding. Applications will have to be made to the Kerry Local Community Development Committee

(LCDC) by 31st August 2018."

Minister for Rural & Community Development, Michael Ring said: "In recent years, Men's Sheds have become a fixture of life in towns and villages throughout Ireland. There are now approximately 350 around the country and they offer a safe, comfortable and inclusive environment where men of all ages can share skills, work on meaningful projects and connect with their communities.

"They are great at rolling their sleeves up and getting stuck in to many and various community initiatives.

"I have decided to introduce this funding in recognition of the wonderful that Men's Sheds do. The funding is being provided following discussions with the Irish Men's Shed Association. I have asked them to provide details to their members over the coming period on how to apply. "I encourage all Men's Sheds to avail of the support and I wish the Irish Men's Shed Association every success as it grows and develops," the Fine Gael Minister said.



"If you stick with it then you will get results" could well be the motto for a new local enterprise being set up by local artist and craftsperson Denis Butler who has just launched a website for his business An Bata Cam (The Crooked Stick). For some years now Denis has been making handmade walking sticks from native, sustainably harvested hardwood timbers and sending them around the world as presents for friends. Denis Butler, who is originally from Blennerville, says that he is very excited about the prospect of finally having his products available for people to buy worldwide. Until now his sticks have only been available to buy in some local gift shops.

"I think that this is a great opportunity to showcase the best of what we have to offer here in the kingdom of Kerry. I am also really pleased that started out as a hobby is going fully professional. I honestly just started like a lot of people, I like to walk a lot and I found that every time I'd go out walking I'd pick up a random piece of wood to use as a walking stick, I never really liked those aluminium poles that I'd see people using. I wanted something unique and wood just feels better in your hand. Before I knew it I had a collection of sticks in my shed and gradually I put more and more work into enhancing the natural beauty of the wood. Then friends and family began to ask if I'd make walking sticks for them. Eventually I heard that a stick I'd given as a present ended up as a display piece in a friends house in America. This made me realise the potential and I really took things seriously. I see each individual piece I make now as a work of art as well as a usable item."

Denis has teamed up with a local design and branding company from Kenmare called Hello Kate to achieve what he thinks is a great looking design but for his products branding and website, that is also likely to bring a smile to your face.

"Obviously the most important thing for me in everything I do is to get the quality right first and foremost but after this, and given my other life, I think that it's important to have fun with it and to put my own unique Kerry stamp on everything I do" Denis says "I was lucky enough to be able to work with the super talented Kate and she not only designed and built a website that looked great, but she also was able to make some of the stranger and more unique ideas that I have work"

Saturday 28th July saw runners from all over Ireland and the world take on the Gleneagle Hotel Run Killarney 2018. More than 2600 runners took on either the halfmarathon or 10k. This year's event welcomed the Kerry Sanctuary runners on their first ever outing. The Sanctuary Runners is a nonprofit group, founded by journalist Graham Clifford from Kerry, which enables people to run alongside, and in solidarity with, those in direct provision, at runs across Ireland.

"Thanks to the generous support of the Run Killarney organisers we had ten runners from direct provision centres in Kerry and Cork running in the 10k race. They were joined by Irish Sanctuary Runners and it was wonderful to receive as much support and encouragement as we did. Graham Clifford said.

"It has been wonderful to run in Killarney with our Sanctuary Runner friends", he added. Half-marathon participants started their event in Molls Gap, with a route that encompassed Ladies View, the National Park, Muckross House and Abbey. Competitors enjoyed stunning views of the Lakes of Killarney and the unspoiled beauty of the Park. In the half-marathon, the first male was Mike Carmody, of An Bru Athletics Club, Limerick, coming in at a time of 1hr 8m 1sec. In 2nd place was Michael Morgan, St.Finbarr's

A/C, Cork (1hr 10mins 12sec) and 3rd place went to Gareth Murran, Sportsworld, Dublin (1hr 12mins 35sec). The first female home in the half marathon was Killarney native Sineid Tangney coming home in 1hr 23mins 01sec followed by another Killarney woman Helen Healy in 1hr 25mins 35sec and in third place, Kealey Tideswell, Clonmel A/C, in 1hr 26min 04sec. The 10k race got underway from the Gleneagle Hotel at 9.30am. First across the line in the 10K was another An Bru runner, Niall Shanahan in 32mins 24sec, first female to come in was Nerissa O'Donnell at 38mins 32sec. Other category wins in the 10k included Ger Daly who won the overall male wheelchair category in a time of 1hr 28mins 36sec and Ross Gallagher in the visually impaired category in 1hr 1min 18 sec. Full results for both races are available here. The Gleneagle Hotel was the centre of activity where competitors were treated to Japanese hot tubs, custom made medals and hot food at the finish line. Spectators and participants basked in the summer sunshine amidst a shower or too and soaked up the post-event atmosphere at the finish area. Now in its 9th year the event, which is also sponsored by O'Sullivan's Outdoor Store, Killarney, saw competitors from all over Ireland and more than 160 international athletes from 21 countries,

CHANGING JOB

Whenever you leave a job you should get a P45 certificate from your employer. Your P45 is a statement from your employer that shows your pay, tax, Universal Social Charge (USC), and PRSI details for the year up to the date you leave. When you begin work at your new job, you will need this P45 to give to your new employer. Your new employer then takes some details from your P45 and then sends your P45 to the tax office on your behalf. This is to notify the tax office that you have now commenced working for a new employer and ensures that they are deducting tax appropriately. When you give the P45 to your new employer, they will:

 Operate PAYE in accordance with the tax credits and standard cut off point details shown on the P45 until they receives a tax credit certificate from the tax office.

 Notify the tax office that you have changed jobs so that a tax credit certificate can be issued for your new job.

If you do not give your new employer a P45 certificate, emergency tax will be deducted.

Emergency tax

If your employer has not received either a:

Certificate of tax credits from the tax office or,

•P45 certificate (parts 2 and 3) from you, in respect of your previous employment, your employer will be obliged to deduct tax on an emergency basis when paying your employee's wages or salary. This means that they will give you a temporary tax credit for the first month of employment but tax deductions are increased progressively from the second month onwards. The effect of emergency basis is that after 4 weeks, no tax credits are given and tax is paid at the higher rate from week 9, regardless of the level of pay.





10 Summer Driving Hazards to Avoid

Summer driving has its own set of challenges whether you're on home ground or not. High temperatures, increased stress levels, and extra demands on your car are all par for the course, so make sure you read our advice to stay safe on the road.

WET OR LOST KEY FOBS: It's easy to lose your car keys in the sand, or ruin your remote control with water by accidentally taking the fob for a swim.

Keep your keys safe and dry and check your handbook – on most cars, there's an alternative way to open the doors that you can use if the remote stopped working.

If you do need a replacement car key or key fob, call AA Keycare on 0818 646 004. Our specialist service means you'll have access to a nationwide network of locksmiths.

PUNCTURES: If your tyres are already damaged or they're at the wrong pressure, the higher temperatures of summer will increase the risk of a blowout.

Make sure you check tyres regularly – for condition and pressures – and increase pressures to suit extra loads, as advised in your handbook.

Check caravan tyres too, and replace those that show any signs of cracking in the sidewall or tread grooves..

SUMMER DRIVING

OVERHEATING: When driving in hot climates, high temperatures can aggravate cooling system problems too. It's important to check the coolant and cooling system regularly to avoid overheating.

GLARE: Dazzle from the sun causes lots of accidents but you can reduce the effect by keeping your windscreen nice and clean, and by replacing worn or damaged windscreen wipers.

It pays to keep a clean pair of sunglasses in your car year-round but avoid lenses that darken in strong sunlight.

DRIVING TIRED: If you feel tired, stop and take a short nap (up to 15 minutes) or drink two cups of strong coffee. It's best to avoid getting tired in the first place if you can.

These tips can help:

• Include a 20-minute break in journeys of more than 3 hours

• On longer trips, take a break every couple of hours

• You're better off taking several short (at least 20 minutes) stops than one long one

• Don't drink alcohol or eat a heavy meal before driving

Don't stop for a nap on the hard shoulder, and

make sure you check parking restrictions before putting your head down at a motorway service area as you could get a ticket for overstaying your welcome.

HAYFEVER: If your hayfever is particularly bad, it's best to get someone else to drive if you can. *Also*:

• Make sure any medication you're taking doesn't cause drowsiness

• Close windows and air vents to reduce pollen grains in the car

Clean mats and carpets regularly to get rid of dust

Keep tissues close to hand

• Wear sunglasses to block out bright sunlight LOOSE CHIPPINGS: Roads repaired with tar and loose chippings are a common sight in the summer but they can cause cracked headlamps and windscreens, and damage paintwork if you're not careful. Stick to any temporary speed limit that's been put in place and keep your distance from the car in front.

FIRE: If you're a smoker, don't just throw your cigarette out of the window when you've finished it. Verges and embankments can become bone-dry and a smouldering cigarette may be enough to ignite roadside grass.

TRACTORS: The driver of that slow-moving tractor in front of you may have a soundproofed cab or could be wearing ear protectors, so may not be able to hear approaching cars.

Be aware that tractors only have to have brake or indicator lights if driving at night, so they may stop or turn suddenly and without warning in daylight hours.

WHEN YOU'RE DRIVING IN THE COUNTRYSIDE:

• Keep plenty of distance behind a tractor

Remember that a tractor may be longer than it appears – there could be a loader on the front
Before overtaking, make sure you have plenty of room to get past

AVOID A BREAKDOWN THIS SUMMER

• Slow down if you come across a spillage – if you hit a bale of straw at speed you will damage your car

• Don't park in a gateway or passing place – they are farmers' field access points

• Drive extra carefully after rain, which can turn dry mud into a skid pan

MARGARET'S RAMBLINGS

NEW ZEALAND IS THE FIRST COUNTRY IN THE WORLD TO INTRODUCE PAID LEAVE TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE VICTIMS

Any worker who is subjected to domestic violence is eligible for 10 days paid leave so they can take the necessary actions to separate from their partner, protect their family, move locations, or take legal action. The victim is not required to show any proof of the violence, and the legislation will also require employers to offer additional workplace safety measures, such as changing work locations or contact information.

The legislation, which was approved by 63 votes to 57, will go into full effect in April.

Green MP Jan Logie, who has spent the last seven years working on the measure, worked in a women's shelter before she became a politician – and as representatives cheered for the bill, she was reportedly seen with tears in her eyes.

Legislators hope that the initiative will be the first of many steps taken to help domestic violence victims in New Zealand, which currently experiences the highest rates of domestic violence of any other developed country.

5,000 INDIAN FISHERMEN NOW COLLECT OCEAN PLASTIC:

A group of 5,000 fishermen who rely on the "Mother Sea" to survive have taken it upon themselves to clean up the oceans – and use the piles of waste to repair their roads and create jobs. Whenever Xavier Peters casts his nets, he often comes up with more plastic than fish and for a while himself and his fellow fishermen had simply tossed all the trash back into the water, but later, realising the futility, began hauling it back to land. So far, they have collected 65 metric tonnes worth of trash and after urging a few of their local government agencies to help, they managed to facilitate the creation of a new recycling centre – the first in the region.

The Department for Women's Empowerment, created to help women find employment, then hired an all-female crew to run the facility and sort through the plethora of assorted plastics. The most damaged plastic is then shredded into a fine confetti which is sold to local construction crews. These workers then use it to strengthen the asphalt used in the creation of new roads.

The innovative solution has now spread to other seaside communities in the area, and the fishermen have adopted a leading role in helping them convert the plastic into cash. The clam divers of Kerala and numerous other communities have now successfully raised funds for their own recycling plants.

BRUSSELS TO END EXPERIMENTS ON ANIMALS:

The government of Brussels-Capital Region is putting an end to experiments on dogs, cats, and primates! Starting January 1st, 2020, experiments on these animals will be forbidden, significantly reducing the number of living beings used for testing in the region. Five years later, starting



January 1st, 2025, animal experiments will also be prohibited in education and in safety tests, except for where no alternatives are available and tests are completely necessary.

The new measure was pushed forward thanks to the diligent campaigning of the Belgian animal protection organisation GAIA, one of the European organisations working to end animal testing, and Cruelty Free International (CFI). The law is fantastic and life-saving news for animals used in experiments and was welcomed by the campaigners as "a good start."

According to data collected by CFI, at least 115 million animals may be used in experiments worldwide each year. The most striking fact is a great part of the animal testing carried out globally is not at all necessary and not even as reliable as we are made to imagine - quite the opposite. The use of animals in testing is often entirely ineffective since their bodies and physical responses are different from those of humans. It has been found that 90% of drugs that showed promising results in animal testing fail in human trials, and out of 93 dangerous side effects of drugs, just 19% could have been predicted by animal tests. Testing on animals is also inextricably connected with great suffering which, as it turns out, is so often completely needless.

A CITY HAS INSTALLED PLAQUES THAT ALLOW BLIND PEOPLE TO 'SEE' THE ART MURALS:

As a means of making art more inclusive and available to everyone, Chile's capital city of Santiago has installed tactile plaques that allow blind people to "see" the many murals decorating the streets.

The installations feature raised reliefs of the street art, as well as braille descriptions of the work. A downloadable app that corresponds with the plaques has audio descriptions of the artworks.

The miniature artworks will benefit the 2.8 million Chileans who have been diagnosed with some sort of visual impairment, which is about 16.7% of the population.

Though braille and tactile touch panels are often featured in museums, this is the first time that such measures have been taken with street art.

361 GOLDEN RETRIEVERS MET UP IN SCOTLAND TO CELEBRATE THEIR BREED'S BIRTHDAY:

Golden Retrievers from all over the world met up at the Guisachan Estate in Tomich, Scotland recently to celebrate the 150th anniversary of their breed's birth. The gathering was orchestrated by the Golden Retriever Club of Scotland.

Dudley Majoribanks, also known as Lord Tweedmouth, bred the first litter of Golden Retrievers on July 19th, 1868 when he crossed a wavy-coated retriever with a tweed water spaniel. The Scottish lord had reportedly been trying to breed a dog that could swim longer distances to retrieve water foul.

STRESS PART 2

Last week we looked at various strategies to reduce workplace stress. These focused primarily on the one thing we have control over in our lives i.e. ourselves. This week we will look at more key ways to deal with stress in our lives. Knowing we are stressed when we are stressed is important. Each person is different -

so know your own 'stress busters'.

The following are some tips:

1. Taking Responsibility for our own physical and emotional well-being

2. Avoid knee-jerk reactions and falling into old habits

3. Learn to communicate better - which can improve relationships with coworkers

4. Recognise your own emotions and know how to control your emotions and behaviour. If you ignore your emotions you will be unable to fully understand your own needs and find it difficult to communicate with others.

5. Delegate responsibility- let go of the need to control every little step.

6. Be willing to compromise - finding a middle ground with a coworker can help reduce stress levels for everyone.

7. Balance your daily schedule - as all work and no play leads to burnout. Balance your time between work, daily responsibilities, family life and social activities - ensuring you get some downtime.

8. Avoid over-scheduling your time by trying to fit too much into one day. If you have a lot on - distinguish between the 'shoulds' and the 'musts' and drop any task that isn't completely necessary to the bottom of the list or delete them entirely.

9. Give yourself time - getting up or leaving home ten minutes earlier can decrease stress levels and avoid that frantic rush to get to work on time.

10. Take a quick stroll during the day to clear your mind.

11. There is no better way to alleviate stress than a good laughwatching a comedy or meeting up with friends and sharing a joke can all help to reduce stress.

12. Don't try to seek perfectionism - this will only add to unnecessary stress. When you set unrealistic goals you set yourself up for failure. Aim to do your best.

13.Watch your thoughts - Negative thinking can drain our energy and motivation - so try to stay positive and avoid negative people as much as possible.

14. Don't try to control the uncontrollable - Many things in life are beyond our control - especially the behaviour of other people. Rather than focusing on the things we can't control, we give our attention to that which we can control - i.e how we react to the problem.


